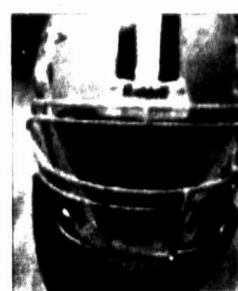

## Bound for the Big Apple

**BSHS band set to play in Carnegie Hall**

Carnegie Hall, here they come.

When the Big Spring High School Band leaves for New York early Sunday morning, members will leave behind memories of more than a year of frantic fundraising, and will look forward to four days of memories that will last a lifetime.

The band, director Rocky Harris and a bevy of sponsors, will leave the BSHS parking lot at 1 a.m. Sunday and bus to Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport, where they will board four flights bound for the "Big Apple."

It's been more than a year since the band was invited to perform as part of the hall's Debut Series of concerts featuring youth musical groups from across the country.

And though the trip has taken up so much effort and thought and prepara-

tion on the part of those concerned, the reality is only now starting to hit people.

"I think when we get to the airport is when it will

really hit me," said junior oboe player Meagan Smith. "It's like it's been so far away, and now it's right here. It's a weird feeling.... This is my first

time to go to New York, so I'm stoked."

While in New York, band members will enjoy many of the traditional tourist sights, including

an evening atop the Empire State Building.

"I think that will be the absolute coolest thing."

## Chorus for Pops to begin sessions

**Fundraising continues for annual event**

With rehearsals for the Big Spring Symphony Chorus performance at Pops in the Park set to begin Monday, members of the Big Spring Fourth of July Foundation, the event's organizers, are hard at work raising the approximate \$35,000 needed to stage the Hansen show.



With just a month left this year's "Pops in the Park" concert and fireworks display at the Comanche Trail Park Amphitheater, organizers have raised just less than half the money needed a little more than \$17,000.

Letters have been mailed to former donors and prospective contributors, according to new Foundation President Jan Hansen, who said she was somewhat pleased with the rate at which the community has responded to the call for donations.

"Actually, we're a little ahead of where we were at this time last year when it comes to total contributions," Hansen said. "Of course, last year the money the committee needed didn't come in until very late in the process. We still have a long way to go before we reach our goal, so we still need the community to come through for us."

Meanwhile, Dr. Keith Graumann, the symphony and chorus' director, has scheduled the chorus' first rehearsal for 7 p.m. to 8:45 p.m. Monday in Garrett Hall in the First United Methodist Church.

"We've got another fun and exciting patriotic program planned this

## Legends and Legacies planned as 'premiere' night of fun for museum

And then, there's that quilt. A full-scale, over the top extravaganza of food, frivolity, history and dancing is planned to usher in Heritage Museum's annual Legends and Legacies event June 20.

"We are making this our big, annual fundraiser. We hope participation will be huge, because we want to make this a premiere event with lots of fun, incredible food and a variety of activities," said Nancy Raney, museum director.

To begin the fund-raising, a pineapple quilt handcrafted by Katie Cathey will be given away. The quilt will be placed on display at Big Spring Banking Center Monday. Tickets are \$5, with a limited number available.

"We are only selling 1,500 tickets, making it a very exclusive opportunity," Raney said.

King-sized, the quilt features soft, muted colors in every hue of blue, green, yellow and rose, complete with a rose stitched in the center of each square.

"This quilt took about six months to create. It is made of a zillion little strips," Cathey said.

The quilt also has a label identifying Cathey with "1999" stitched, when she created it.

"It is just beautiful,"

Raney said.

Tickets are also available at the museum and the quilt will be on display in other locations until June 20, when the winner will be selected at Legends and

said senior flute player Meredith Fillingim.

Other events include an evening on Broadway watching "The Phantom of the Opera," a trip to Ground Zero, visits to Radio City Music Hall, museums, the Statue of Liberty and various other attractions, as well as an evening cruise of New York Harbor.

But the undeniable, unarguable highlight of the trip will be the band's Tuesday night concert in Carnegie Hall.

"It's psyching me out," said sophomore bassoon player Simon Hilario. "To actually play where so many famous musicians have played is exciting."

"I've got that picture in my mind, and I'm thinking, 'I'm going to be on that stage. I'm going to be on that stage,'" Smith said.

"For most musicians, that's their life-long dream," Fillingim said, "and it's something very few of them can say they've done... Most people, if they do get to play there, are not 14-to-18-year-olds. Being that age and playing at Carnegie is a major, major accomplishment."

The one taking the most low-key approach to the concert is Harris, but that's only because he hasn't dwelled too much on the fact.

"I'm sure it'll be a moment to reflect on where I've been, where I am and where I'm going," he said. "But it's something I probably won't think

about much until I get back ... obviously, looking at it from the kids' viewpoints, Carnegie is the pinnacle."

But that doesn't mean that Harris, who visited New York as a college student, isn't happy about a return trip.

"I'm looking forward to spending some time on the streets of Manhattan," Harris said. "It really is the defining metropolis of America."

Raising the money for the trip — an estimated \$200,000 — was a major undertaking for the band, parents and other boosters.

To secure that money, a year-long series of fundraisers were held. Simply put, if they could sell it or wash it, band members probably did.

Ask 10 different band members their favorite fund-raising activity, and you'll probably get 10 different answers. But there was a strong consensus as to the *least* favorite activity.

"From the band's perspective, probably it was the car washes. That was the most work," Fillingim said. "My father usually washes my car, so I'm blessed that way."

"I enjoyed most of (the fundraisers), but the car washes weren't great," Hilario said.

Smith didn't care for washing cars either, but was philosophical about all that time spent washing and rinsing other people's vehicles.

"My passion is the band," she said. "So there's never been a moment when I didn't think it was worth it."

year," Graumann noted. "We'll be introducing several new arrangements this year and will also be performing some of the traditional standards."

Graumann stressed that everyone is welcome to join the Symphony Chorus for the July 3 Pops in the Park show.

"If you have thought about singing with the chorus before, but didn't feel like you could commit the time required, this is a great opportunity," Graumann said. "We only have four weeks of rehearsals rather than several months."

"I would like to encourage any interested singers in giving the chorus a try," he continued. "We work on some challenging music, but most of all we have a good time doing it. And it is especially meaningful to perform magnificent music from this great country which is our own."

Crowds have packed the amphitheater each year with between 10,000 and 12,000 attending the concert and fireworks program on July 3. Both Hansen and Graumann said the committee expects as big a crowd or even larger this year.

"The committee has managed to expand the show ... making it bigger and better every year," Hansen noted. "And over the years, the crowd has also continued to grow. We're planning on having a great fireworks show, and since we're planning

on having a very good local band playing before the symphony takes the stage, I expect we'll have an excellent audience. Hopefully it will be the biggest we've ever had."

Before that can happen, however, the organizing committee must raise the money it needs.

Donations making the concert and fireworks show possible come from local businesses and individuals, as well as corporate sponsorships. What's more, they make it possible for the organizing committee to open the gates for all comers free of charge.

"It is the entire community's celebration, that's something we always want to stress," Hansen said. "It's a chance to gather with friends and family at the park and join our neighbors in celebrating the fact that we live in the greatest country on earth."

"But to make that possible, we really need the community's help," she added. "The people and businesses in this community always come through, but the committee was a little disappointed when it realized it hadn't raised as much money last year as it had the year before."

"So, we'll be redoubling our efforts this time around," Hansen continued. "After all, we really believe that nobody celebrates the Fourth of July holiday like Big Spring does. In fact, the show brings visitors from outside our community and we think it's important to make sure we continue to

have a quality show for everyone to enjoy."

Presenters of the event include the *Big Spring Herald*, Big Spring Area Chamber of Commerce, the city of Big Spring, the Convention and Visitors Bureau, the Big Spring Symphony, KBYG and KBST — each providing donations of \$5,000 or more in funding or in-kind services.

For those unable to serve as "Presenters," Hansen noted that the committee is also seeking support at different levels.

"Star" sponsors that donate \$3,000 or more, and "Rocket" sponsors, donating \$1,000 or more. Last year H-E-B was the sole Star sponsor for the show, while Alon USA, Paradigm Physical Therapy, Robinson Drilling, Scenic Mountain Medical Center and the Worthy Company were

Rocket sponsors.

"We really want to thank those who support us, no matter how they are able to contribute," Hansen said.

While committee members begin their fund-raising effort, Becky Crane, who is co-chairing the organizing committee with Hansen, is coordinating the list of businesses and organizations wanting to operate vendor's booths during the show. Vendor packets are already available at the Big Spring Area Chamber of Commerce offices.

In addition, members of the committee are seeking help from military personnel from the area that will be home during the show, by asking them to help by being flag bear-

ers during the parade of flags that annually opens the show.

The bottom line, however, is that something very, very special exists in Coahoma.

After all, it has become almost a rite of spring. The Bulldogettes begin their season taking on the best Class 3A, 4A and 5A teams willing to play them. Almost always, they win more of those games than they lose.

Yes, there are other storied programs in the state — like Class 1A Shiner, Class 2A Weimer, and Class 5A powerhouses Smithson Valley and Keller — that joined the Bulldogettes at the tournament last week. But none of them have been to Austin eight times. The closest any of them come in that category are Shiner and Keller with six state tournament appearances each.

So today, I'd like to offer my congratulations to the Bulldogettes on yet another outstanding season.

Ladies, you made all of us here in Howard County extremely proud. So did your coaches and the entire Coahoma community.

Keep setting the bar high. We should all aspire to do as well in everything we attempt.

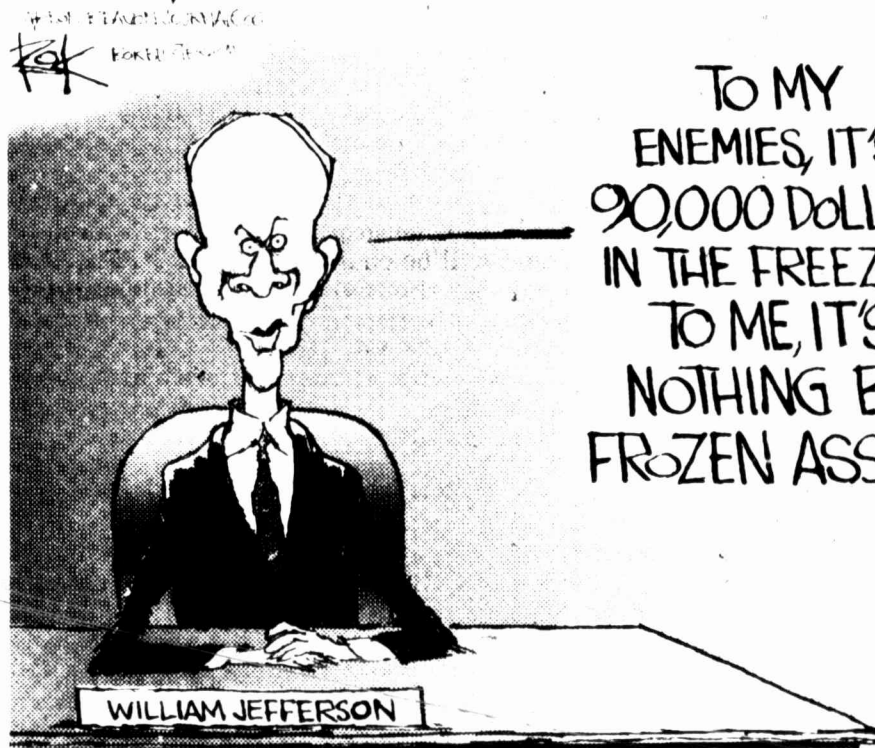

# CASA: In the interest of a child

Big Spring native Jane Jones heard the cry for help on a local morning radio show. CASA of West Texas needed volunteers to serve in the Howard County office.

"Because it seemed like the right thing to do," Jones said of becoming a volunteer. "The children are the most vulnerable of our people and most of them have been hurt," she said. "I just feel that it's important to help them to know that there are people that care about them."

The mission of court appointed special advocates (CASA) of West Texas is to promote and support quality volunteers who speak for the best interest of abused and neglected children in court in an effort to find each child a safe, nurturing permanent home. Established in 1990, CASA

of West Texas has served an estimated 1,700 children, newborn to 18 in foster care, authorities said.

Jones became a volunteer three years ago, but today, the need remains for more volunteers in Howard County, which has between six to 11 children more in care each month, said Tonya Eckert, volunteer coordinator for CASA of West Texas.

According to records, Howard County has nine active CASA of West Texas volunteers. Gaines and Martin counties, two others the non-profit serves, have no active volunteers, according to records.

CASA of West Texas also serves Midland County, which has 30 active volunteers, and Dawson County, whose volunteers began participating last year. Dawson County has two active volunteers with two more in training.

Andrews County, also served by the organization, has two active volunteers. CASA of West Texas also serves Glasscock County, which currently does not have any children to serve, Eckert said.

Volunteers "are the organization," Eckert said. "The thing about a CASA volunteer is you don't have to be a professional. You're a member

of the community that has a loving heart towards children."

Volunteers can also develop a rapport with the children's families because of their interaction with the child, Eckert said. Volunteers receive free training and ongoing support from the organization.

Learning about the need for volunteers motivated John Mulkey of Big Spring to become one. Mulkey said it is a challenge knowing how much child abuse goes on in the community and not having enough people to help.

"Children are the future and how they're raised and taken care of is the future," said Mulkey, a volunteer for two years now. "There's so many families headed in the wrong direction and they have children and they (the children) need a little help from time to time. We're not perfect, but yet, if we can help, we need

to." Volunteering does not require much of one's time, added Mulkey, who challenges Big Spring residents to become volunteers. "It's their neighborhood that these things go on and it needs help in those areas. If nobody

does anything, then later on down the road, the neighborhood may be empty," he said.

"You may consider your family as family, but your town is also your family. What goes around comes around, and that's what makes a community."

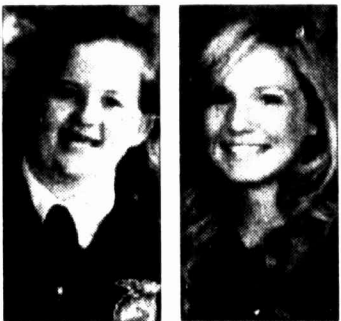
## Coahoma FFA members win Area, District offices



**Former principal sentenced to probation**

ODESSA (AP) — A junior high school principal who admitted to accidentally firing a gun in his office has been sentenced to two years of probation.

Former Crockett Junior High School principal Olen Vanburen Grady was sentenced Friday to two years of probation with deferred adjudication on a felony charge of possession of a weapon in a prohibited area.

Grady, 57, admitted to accidentally firing the .40-caliber Glock handgun in his office on Feb. 24. He initially blamed the noise on firecrackers but later told officials he mistakenly brought the gun into his office in a gym bag, accidentally firing it when he reached to retrieve cough medicine.

The bullet traveled through a wall and into a hallway, but no one was injured.

Grady submitted a letter of resignation March 28 to school officials in Ector County, where he had worked for 27 years.

As part of his sentence, Grady was ordered to resign from ECISD and to turn over his teaching certificate to the Texas Education Agency.

**Teen accused of putting rat poison in father's juice**

LUBBOCK (AP) — A 13-year-old girl was being held in a juvenile justice center Friday after she was accused of putting rat poison in her father's juice.

She was detained after her father noticed green particles floating in the juice May 26, according to police reports. Her father didn't drink the juice, and when he asked what was in his juice his daughter told him she had poisoned the drink, police said.

The father told police he'd instructed his daughter to do chores before the incident but she refused.

The girl was taken into custody on suspicion of aggravated assault May 27. She was ordered detained for 10 days, and her next detention hearing is June 13, Lubbock County Juvenile Detention Center director Les Brown said.

The girl's attorney, Kelly Clark, did not immediately return a call seeking comment Friday.

**Group of Afghan soldiers finish flight training for drug missions**

FORT BLISS (AP) — Sixteen Afghan soldiers graduated Friday from a new training program at Fort Bliss where they learned to fly Russian-made helicopters in anti-drug missions over their war-torn country.

The men now will make their final preparations to head back to Afghanistan, where they are expected to immediately embark on a mission to try to halt the ongoing and lucrative drug trade.

At their graduation ceremony, Afghan Embassy official Ashraf Haidari called the aviators "Afghanistan's heroes" and thanked them for their service.

He said they will also help fight terrorism for the

U.S. and other coalition nations fighting in the dangerous country.

"Thirty years of war left the country in ruins and fueled the drug trade," Haidari said. "Your graduation is a testament to the long-term commitment of the United States to Afghanistan."

Shirzia, an Afghan Army Air Corps soldier who asked to be identified only by his first name for security reasons, said earlier in the day that he was proud to take on the dangerous work.

"Because we went through a lot of hard times we want our children to grow up in a safe world," Shirzia said through a translator. "We want our kids to respect humanity."

Shirzia and his comrades, who were all Air Corps soldiers before being selected for the training program, spent about half of their time learning to use night vision equipment, a technology new to Afghanistan's fledgling military.

**Bush backs federal marriage amendment**

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush Saturday backed a resolution to amend the Constitution to define marriage as a union between a man and a woman even though the idea has little chance of being passed in the Senate.

"Ages of experience have taught us that the commitment of a husband and a wife to love and to serve one another promotes the welfare of children and the stability of society," Bush said in his Saturday radio address. "Marriage cannot be cut off from its cultural, religious and natural roots without weakening this good influence on society."

Democrats say Senate floor time is being wasted on the issue, and accuse Republicans of making a pre-emptive election appeal to social conservatives whose votes were key to Bush's re-election.

This November, initiatives banning same-sex marriages are expected to be on the ballot in Idaho, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Virginia and Wisconsin.

The amendment would prohibit states from recognizing same-sex marriages. To become law, the proposal would need two-thirds support in the Senate and House, and then would have to be ratified by at least 38 state legislatures.

**JetBlue wins air-ground wireless license**

NEW YORK (AP) — JetBlue Airways Corp. won a government auction for wireless spectrum that could be used to provide in-flight telephone, Internet, or entertainment services.

The winning bid Friday of \$7.02 million was placed through New York-based JetBlue's entertainment subsidiary, LiveTV LLC, which provides DirecTV service on JetBlue flights.

The 1-megahertz frequency band sold by the Federal Communications Commission is nationwide and not

limited to JetBlue aircraft, opening the possibility that LiveTV will offer the service to other airlines.

Because of FCC rules, auction participants have been unable to reveal their plans for the spectrum. JetBlue representatives did not immediately return calls Friday.

A larger swath of spectrum, 3 megahertz of bandwidth, was won by AirCell Inc. of Louisville, Colo., with backing by Ripplewood Holdings LLC, a New York-based private equity firm. That part of the auction was decided last week, when the other bidders for that band dropped out. The winning bid was \$31.3 million.


**Woman claims Flynt's dog attacked her**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A woman is suing Hustler magazine publisher Larry Flynt and his wife, Elizabeth, alleging their dog "viciously attacked" her as she jogged in front of the couple's Hollywood Hills home.

In court documents filed Thursday in Los Angeles Superior Court, Cynthia Tribull claimed she suffered injuries and "severe shock fright, humiliation and emotional distress" after being bitten by the Schnauzer.

Flynt declined comment, said spokeswoman Kim Dower.

The lawsuit accuses the Flynts of failing to restrain their dog or post a warning sign to pedestrians. It claims liability and negligence and seeks an unspecified amount of money for medical bills and other damages.

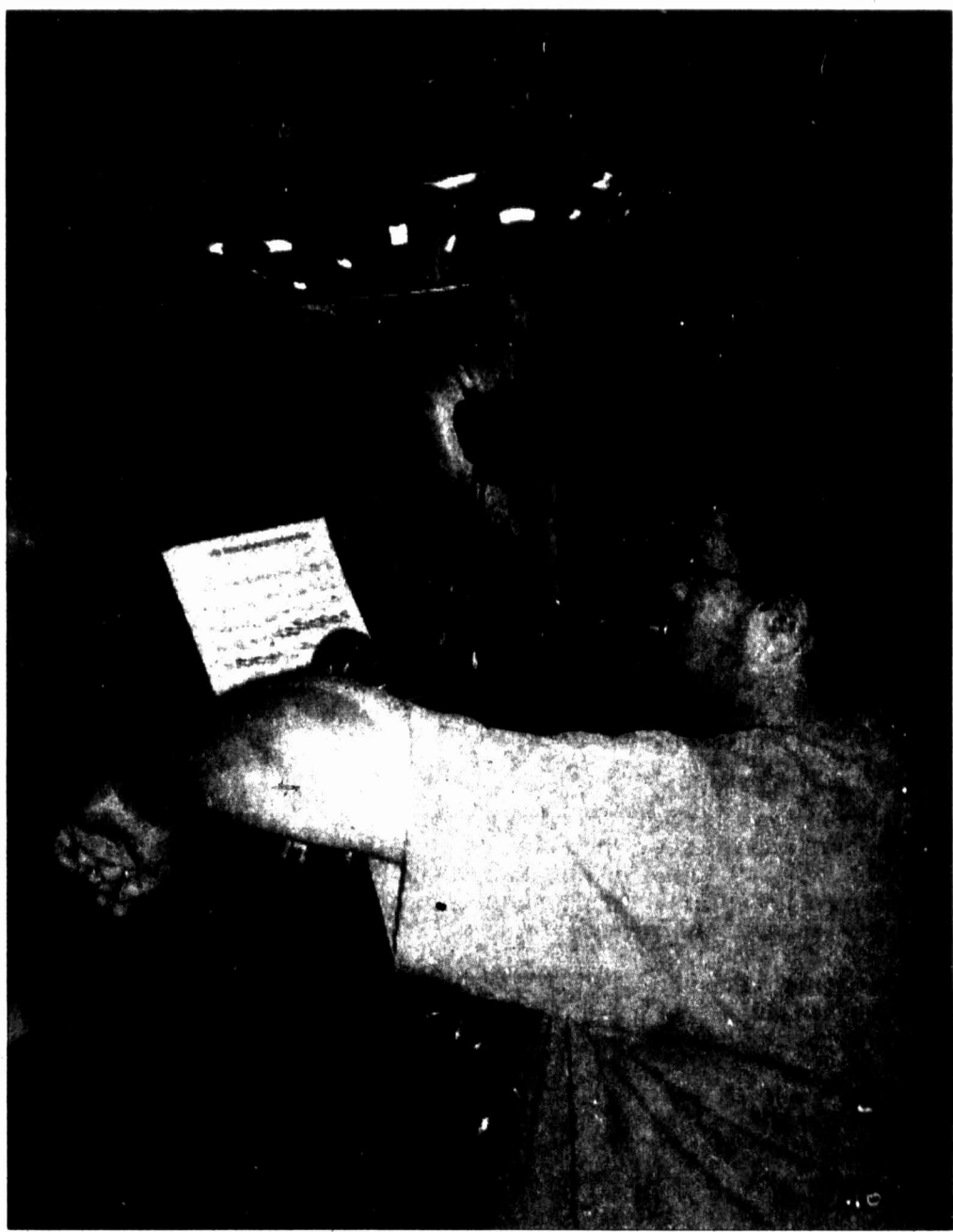

# HC's Murphy injured after shooting

Howard College basketball player Phil Murphy is in critical condition after suffering two gunshot wounds in his home state of New York last week.

Murphy, who started for the Hawks last season and helped them reach the NJCAA National Tournament, was shot in the hand and buttocks after an altercation at a 7-Eleven in Middletown, N.Y., at 5:30 a.m., May 28. According to Howard

assistant coach Jason Sautter, Murphy and three friends got into an argument on two different occasions with another group of people and the unidentified group drove by the 7-Eleven and opened fire on Murphy and his friends. Multiple shots were fired, but Murphy was the only one hit.

According to an article in the *Times Herald-Record* out of New York, Sgt. Gerald Mishk, who heads the detective unit in Middletown (N.Y.), said the victim was shot

in the buttocks and the bullet apparently exited through his stomach. Murphy, 19, is still at the hospital after the bullets caused serious internal injuries. No one from the Howard College men's basketball team has spoken with the 6-6 forward at this time, but they are in contact with Murphy's father.

"We don't want to spec-

ulate on the seriousness of the injury just yet but it will be hard for Phil to play basketball this upcoming season and maybe the year after that," said Sautter. "We want to help him in any way we can. We haven't spoken to Phil and aren't really sure when he will be in a condition to do so."

One of Murphy's friends — Justin Van Dycke — was also injured in the incident. One of the suspects got out of the car and broke Van Dycke's jaw.

Police arrested Shumare Davis, 20, in connection with the assault, but not the shooting.

Davis is a reputed member of a Middletown gang that went by the initials NLD.

Davis was charged with first-degree assault and first-degree robbery, both felonies, in the assault.

Howard head men's coach and Athletic Director Mark Adams could not be reached for comment by the *Herald* before press time.

## Heat slam Pistons, advance to finals

MIAMI — As if getting to the NBA Finals wasn't reward enough, Dwyane Wade found another reason to take delight.

Not only did his Miami Heat silence a season of doubt by getting there, they did it at Detroit's expense — ending the Pistons' two-year reign atop the Eastern Conference.

Shaquille O'Neal had 28 points and 16 rebounds and Jason Williams, one of Miami's prized and numerous offseason additions, came up huge with 21 points on 10-for-12 shooting as the Heat won their first East title with a 95-78 victory over Detroit Friday night.

Wade — who spent seven hours in a hospital Friday, battling dehydration and other flu-like symptoms — had 10 of his 14 points in the

third quarter, when the Heat put the game away.

"Beating the Pistons makes it real," Wade said. "If it was any other match-up in the Eastern Conference finals, it wouldn't have been the same."

The historic triumph sent Heat coach Pat Riley to the Finals with his third franchise, put O'Neal in position for his fourth ring — and moved Wade four wins from being coated in the champagne reserved for champions.

And while the Heat celebrated, the Pistons — the NBA's best team all season, a 64-win juggernaut that even Riley tagged as the heavy favorite to win their second title since 2004 — left frustrated. Richard Hamilton had 33 points in Game 6, but Detroit shot only 33 percent, spelling its doom.

"At the end of the day, if you don't win that ring, all what you did all

season don't mean nothing," Hamilton said.

How much did this mean to the Heat?

Plenty. They'll get nearly a full week off, not playing again until facing Phoenix or Dallas when the NBA Finals open Thursday at the home of the Western Conference champions.

"Our guys came tonight and put the hammer down," Riley said. "Period."

After an offseason of often-criticized changes Riley made to surround his superstars with more talent — gone went Eddie Jones and Damon Jones, in came Williams, Antoine Walker, Gary Payton and James Posey — the Heat broke through to new heights and have no intention to stop climbing now.

"The job," O'Neal said, "is not done."

He and the Pistons met in the playoffs for the

third straight year — and for the first time, O'Neal won.

"I think we had a great year," Pistons coach Flip Saunders said. "But ultimately every team that comes in when you start October 3rd have one goal in mind. And ultimately there's failure for 29 teams and success for one team, and that's pretty much how you judge it."

Wade missed the morning shootaround practice, then missed the first 2 1/2 minutes of the second half while more IVs were administered to keep him hydrated.

He was clearly struggling, shooting 1-for-6 in the first half with four points. But O'Neal and Williams more than carried the early scoring load, helping stake Miami to an 47-36 lead at intermission.

O'Neal was 9-for-11

## Cowboys introduce Owens at veterans' mini-camp

IRVING — Terrell Owens returned Friday to his two favorite places: the football field and the spotlight.

Entering the locker room before his first formal workout with the Dallas Cowboys, Owens smiled wide when he saw the throng of cameras and reporters waiting for him. He excused himself to get some lip balm, smeared it on, then kept grinning throughout a 15-minute chat that might still be going on if a team official hadn't ended it.

"I'm here with a great coach, a great team, a great owner," Owens said. "I'm looking forward to the opportunity that I can make to help this team win. That's why they brought me in here."

Then he went about trying to prove it.

Wearing the star logo he once trashed, his fast-selling No. 81 jersey and blue tights that made him easily identifiable, Owens caught every pass thrown his way except one in a nearly two-hour practice — his first full-squad workout since being banished by the Philadelphia Eagles almost exactly seven months before.

Owens repeatedly beat cornerback Anthony Henry, who ironically was signed last offseason to cover bigger receivers like Owens. Owens even snagged one pass after slipping during his route.

The only ball he didn't catch came on one of the final plays. Cornerback Terence Newman intercepted it and ran to the end zone amid shouts of joy from safety Keith Davis.

Coach Bill Parcells presumably was impressed by his new receiver, but didn't say. He's refusing to answer any questions about Owens, even saying, "Who?" to an innocuous one after reminding reporters the subject was off limits until training camp.

Owens, meanwhile, answered every question. Why not? This starts his honeymoon phase in Dallas, with teammates unanimously saying how happy they are to have someone so talented on their side and everyone vowing to give him a clean slate.

Akinori Otsuka pitched the ninth for his 10th save in 11 opportunities.

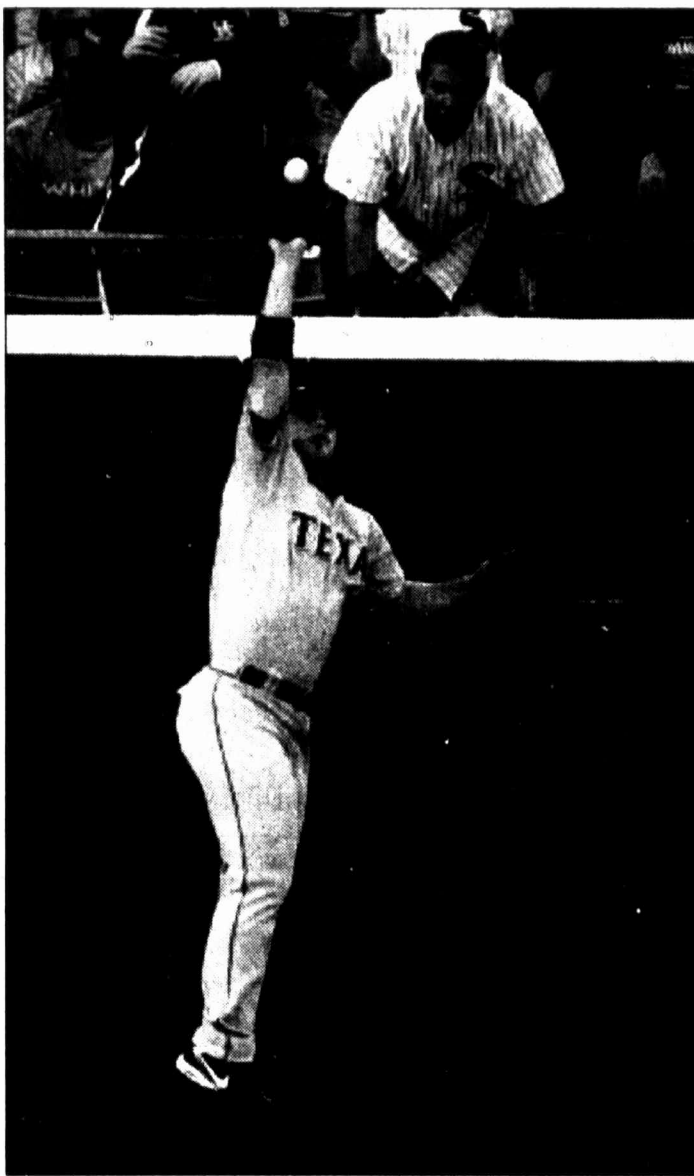

But manager Ozzie Guillen was "pretty sure" the slugger would start Saturday.

"I'll be surprised if anything happens. I really will," said quarterback Drew Bledsoe, the likeliest target of any Owens fits based on his history. "He's been welcomed here and will continue to be as long as he's the guy he has been in the past, in terms of his work ethic, his professionalism on the field."

Tight end Jason Witten said: "All I can do is judge him on what I see. So far, he's been great, works really hard."

Guard Marco Rivera put it this way: "That guy, you put him on your team and you're in contention. Look what he did for Philly."

Look what he did for Philly, indeed.

After ending a troubled stay in San Francisco, Owens was a pass-catching monster in his first season with the Eagles, helping them win 13 of 14 games before breaking a bone in his leg. He recovered far sooner than anyone expected and played great in a Super Bowl loss to New England. Then came more trouble.

His relationship with quarterback Donovan McNabb, coach Andy Reid and the rest of the organization dissolved within months. His final practice there was Nov. 4. The next day, he was suspended for the rest of the season.

Owens didn't want to discuss his Philadelphia tenure, probably because he wants people to pay \$25 to read all about it in a book being released right before training camp.

"It's as close to the truth as I can tell," Owens said.

The Eagles released him March 14. Four days later, the Cowboys gave him a three-year, \$25 million contract that includes a \$5 million bonus and \$5 million salary this season.

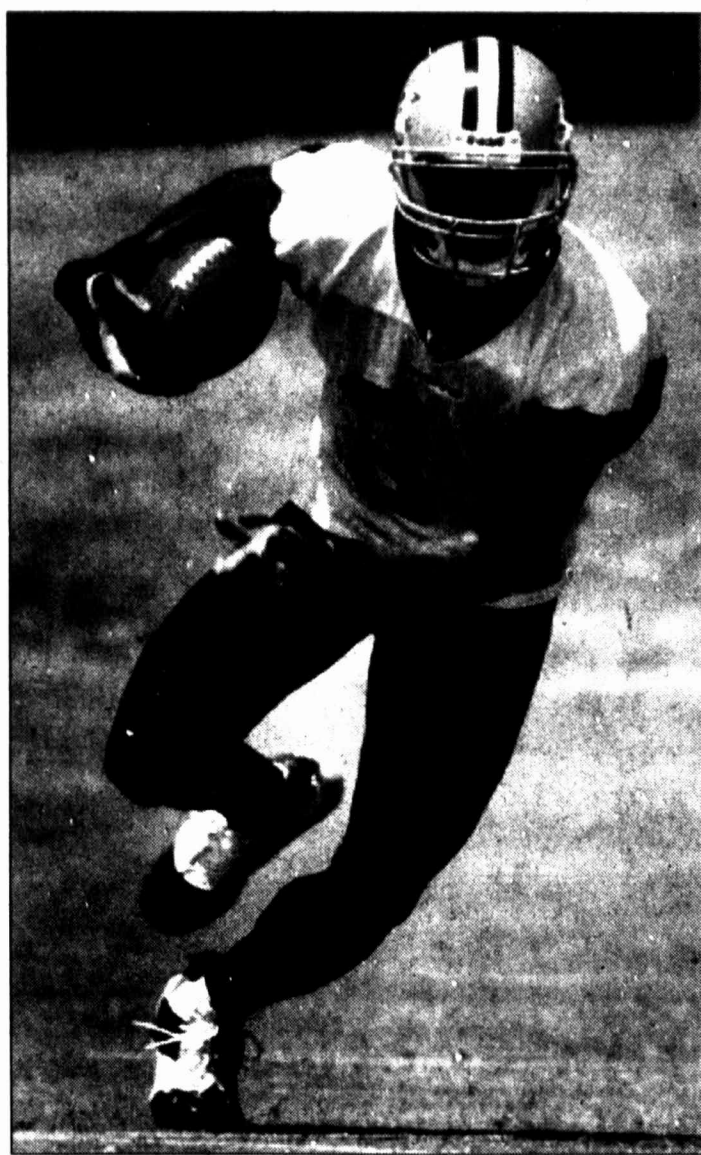
Soon after, Owens heard reports that he'd angered Parcells by missing off-season workouts "and (that) I'm back to my old stuff again." He was eager to address that Friday.

"He told me when to be here and what he expected of me," Owens said. "And that's when I was there."

While Owens seemed offended at the notion he was causing problems, he realizes most observers consider him always on the verge of creating another controversy.

"I am who I am and I can't change that and I can't allow people to change who I am," he said. "I think I've been successful on the football field being who I am. So, I don't care...."

"You kind of grow and you learn from your mistakes and I think I've done that. I've had a long time to sit back and think about a lot of things that have transpired over the last year or so. So I'm tak-

ing a different approach."

How? Well, he wouldn't give any specifics, although he did mention "anybody can be humbled."

Parcells is good at doing the humbling, too. His authority is among the reasons players cited

most about why they expect things to work out with Owens.

"He's going to be zero tolerant," Witten said of Parcells. "He's here to win games and he doesn't have time to mess around. That's what he told us yesterday."

**Cincinnati's offense comes alive in win over rival Houston**

**• Encarnacion, Kearns combine for eight RBIs, Phillips homers in win**

HOUSTON — Edwin Encarnacion and Austin Kearns each had four RBIs and the Cincinnati Reds scored nine runs over the first three innings in a 14-3 victory over the Houston Astros Friday night.

Brandon Phillips homered and Ken Griffey Jr. had two hits and scored two runs as the Reds beat the Astros in Houston for just the third time in the last 17 meetings.

Lance Berkman and Preston Wilson homered for the Astros, who have lost eight of their last 10 and two straight since Roger Clemens rejoined them on Wednesday.

The seven-time Cy Young Award winner is working out with the Astros' Class-A affiliate in Lexington, Ky., but dozens of fans in Houston wore Clemens jerseys, wishing he was already here.

Once the game started, they missed him even more.

The first seven Reds reached base against starter Wandy Rodriguez (6-3), who was yanked by manager Phil Garner after just 1 1/3 innings. The Astros trailed 7-0 when the 27-year-old left-hander gave way to right-hander Chris Sampson, who was called up from Triple-A Round Rock earlier Friday.

Sampson gave up a sacrifice fly to Encarnacion in the second and a solo

homer to Phillips to open the third.

Reds starter Aaron Harang (6-4) came in with an NL-best 1.23 ERA on the road. He allowed two runs and five hits with five strikeouts in six innings, beating Houston for the second time this season.

Sampson, 7-1 with a 2.64 ERA in 10 starts in the minors this season, pitched 5 1/3 innings in his major league debut. He got a standing ovation when he left in the seventh.

Phillips led off the game with a single to right, the first of seven hits off Rodriguez. Phillips stole second and went to third when catcher Eric Munson's throw sailed into center field — the first of three errors for the Astros in the first two innings.

Felipe Lopez walked before Griffey blooped a single to score Phillips. Griffey's 15th RBI in his last 12 games.

Rich Aurilia doubled and Adam Dunn walked to load the bases. Rodriguez got a full count on Kearns, then walked him to make it 3-0. Encarnacion then ripped a double to the gap in right center, scoring two more.

Riley and owner Micky Arison stood arm-in-arm as they awaited the presentation of the Eastern Conference championship trophy from NBA vice president Stu Jackson. Alonzo Mourning — the face of this franchise for so long — stood behind them, nodding and holding a finger aloft.

Then Riley lifted the silver trophy, as a sea of players' hands reached in for a touch — with one notable exception.

"I only celebrate it," O'Neal said, "when it's really over."

Riley is taking his third team to the Finals, after the "Showtime" Lakers of the 1980s and the blue-collar Knicks of the mid-1990s. He came here a decade ago, envisioning a parade down Biscayne Boulevard.

Henin-Hardenne advances at French Open

PARIS — Fighting off flashbacks, Justine Henin-Hardenne avenged a 2004 upset defeat, winning the final nine games Saturday to defeat Tathiana Garbin 6-4, 6-0 at the French Open.

Henin-Hardenne was ranked No. 1 when Garbin beat her the last time they met, in the second round of the 2004 tournament.

Seeded fifth, defending champion Henin-Hardenne is bidding to win the title for the third time in four years. Her opponent Sunday will be 2004 winner Anastasia Myskina, who beat No. 19 Ana Ivanovic 6-2, 6-3.

Henin-Hardenne has won six of eight meetings against Myskina. That includes their most recent match at the 2004 Olympics, when Myskina squandered a 5-1 lead in

the third set.

In men's play, No. 14 Lleyton Hewitt eliminated No. 22 Dominik Hrbaty 7-6 (5), 6-2, 6-2.

Dulko's opponent Sunday will be No. 13 Anna-Lena Groenefeld, who reached the fourth round at a major event for the first time by beating No. 20 Maria Kirilenko 6-2, 7-6 (2). No. 15 Daniela Hantuchova eliminated No. 21 Nathalie Dechy 6-3, 3-6, 10-8.

Myskina held every service game against Ivanovic, benefiting from her young opponent's 37 unforced errors. Following the victory, the Moscow native received courtside congratulations from a beaming Boris Yeltsin and autographed a straw hat for the former Russian president.

"He said I play really nice and good," said Myskina, seeded 10th. "When he watched before,

I never lose a match so far. So I hope he's going to stay here."

Henin-Hardenne took charge against Garbin by playing aggressively after a slow start.

She won 11 of 13 points at the net in the second set, when she totaled 17 winners to three for Garbin.

One bad game forced Roger Federer to work overtime. Serving for the match in the third set Friday, he was broken at love, then lost the ensuing tiebreaker. That meant another 46 minutes

of tense tennis before he beat Nicolas Massu 6-1, 6-2, 6-7 (4), 7-5.

That kept Federer on course for a much-anticipated showdown against defending champion Rafael Nadal in the final.

Nadal extended his record clay-court winning streak to 55 matches when he eliminated Kevin Kim 6-2, 6-1, 6-4.

Rain on Thursday created a backlog in the schedule, and sunny, mild weather allowed the tournament to catch up Friday.

The bidding: South West North East

Opening lead: ten of diamonds.

One of the foremost characteristics of a winning player is his steadfast refusal to concede defeat regardless of how bleak the outlook might be. This never-say-die attitude enabled South to bring home a seemingly hopeless slam in today's deal.

**Declarer won the diamond lead** with the queen and cashed the ace of spades, hoping the king would fall. When it didn't, the slam appeared doomed, since a club loser seemed inevitable.

But South was not the type to give up easily. He could see that if the opponent who held the spade king was short in clubs, he might still make the contract with careful play.

Accordingly, at trick three declarer led a heart to the ace and ruffed a heart. He then overtook the diamond jack with the king and ruffed dummy's last heart. Next he cashed the ace of diamonds and A-K of clubs.

At this point, having stripped both his own hand and dummy of hearts and diamonds, South was in position to make the contract if it could be made. And so, at trick 10, holding snice trumps and a losing club in each hand, he exited with a trump, fingers firmly crossed.

As he had hoped, the opponent with the high trump — West in this case — had started with only two clubs. After winning the trick, he was forced to return a diamond or a heart, allowing South to discard a club from one hand while he ruffed in the other, and the slam was home.

Note that if declarer had not gone to the trouble of setting up the ruff-and-discard position in the slender hope that the clubs would be favorably divided, the slam would have failed, and South would have been 1,730 points poorer.

### Stompers gather to honor their 'Fearless Leader'

A sense of family reunion filled the dining hall of the Spring City Senior Center when about 12 former Spring City Stompers gathered to honor their "Fearless Leader."

They savored line dancing photographs saved in scrapbooks and shared tall tales of their heyday, when line dancing was a favorite activity in Big Spring.

And one common thread wove through their conversations — respect, love and now, longing for Dorothy Kennemur.

"You would just be fascinated with Dorothy. She was one of the most active people I have ever known and she lived every minute of her life. I was always bowled over by Dorothy because every single thing she started was successful. She was a natural born leader and very, very organized," said Margie Myers, a former member of the Spring City Stompers.

Myers chose to show her appreciation for her friend, who passed away peacefully in May, by donating a plaque dedicated to Dorothy to the Spring City Senior Center, where they spent so much of her time.

Shirley Bodin, another member of the line dancing troupe Dorothy founded, said she recalled the last time she saw Dorothy, in the parking lot of a local grocery store.

"I think she was a great lady and I so admired her. Even after her illness, she was never down, always up, even if she was having a bad day. She would just say it was a bad day and carry on, never complaining," Bodin said. (Dorothy's cancer was in remission when she died.)

The scrapbooks, which Dorothy's daughter, Nancy Hale brought from Dorothy's house in the Elbow Community, spanned back to 1995, when line dancing was a favorite activity for nearly 75 individuals in Howard County.

Dorothy had these line dancing festivals that she organized where sometimes 200 or 300 people would attend. Troupes came from all around — Pecos, Odessa, Midland, Abilene, San Angelo, Snyder, Seminole, Lubbock, Brownwood and towns in between, to line dance here at the center," said Jo Wyatt, another Spring City Stomper.

Wyatt recalled that Dorothy was active in the community before the Stompers as well. She started the VITA or volunteer tax program at the center that is free for seniors and continues today, operated by Gloria Hopkins.

And she also taught the first computer classes to seniors at the center, and many of those attending

the plaque dedication said they attended those classes.

"She taught me until I could use my own computer. She also taught kids. Everything she started flourishes and lasts, everything," said Mary Ann Fincher of Colorado City, who traveled to Big Spring to be a Stomper.

At the height of the group activities, about 1998-2001, the groups met three times each week. Several splinter groups formed also.

"The way this all started is that Dorothy went on a cruise and somebody had a line dancing group on ship. When she got back to Big Spring, she was encouraged to form a group and teach us how to line dance," said B.D. Mason, longtime close friend of Dorothy's and the proclaimed "Sultan" of the Spring City Stompers.

"B.D. was the only man we had in the group, and we called him our Sultan and Dorothy we named "Our Fearless Leader," Myers said.

The plaque placed at the center is engraved with "In Loving Memory Our Fearless Leader Dorothy Kennemur 2006 Spring City Stompers."

Lura Perry of Lake Thomas said it would take a book to record all the memories and feelings she has of Dorothy.

"She was wonderful, capable, talented; a friend and a lovely lady," Perry said.

Another of Dorothy's ideas that is still popular with increasing attendance is the Encourager's Support Group that meets the first and third Monday each month.

Designed as a support group for widows and widowers, the members meet once at a restaurant and again at the First Presbyterian Church.

And as the friends continued to discuss their memories of Dorothy around the table, others who were at the center to have lunch came to share, including one woman who had worked with her in the accounting department of Webb Air Force Base.

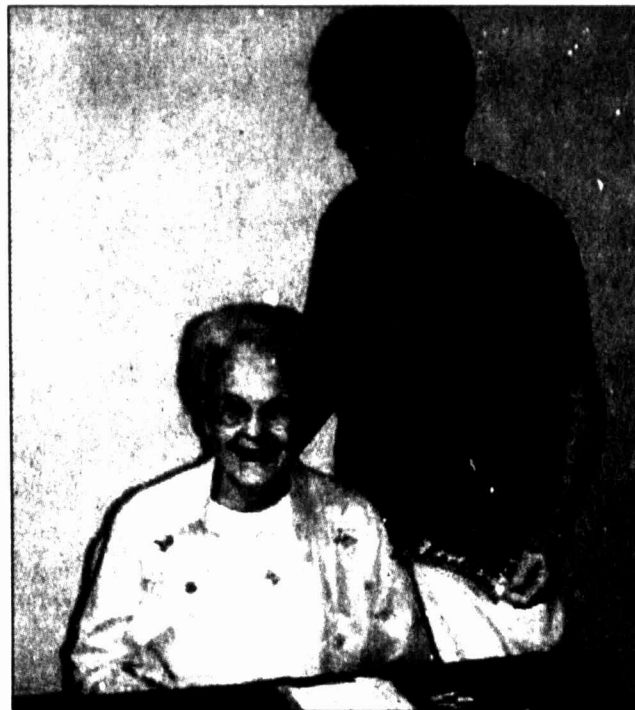
Others attending the dedication included Anna Lou Bradberry, Faye Horton, Zelda Abbe and Sarah Kelley.

The friends discussed the fate of other members of the Stompers, those who have died or taken ill. And they are considering continuing to meet at the center, perhaps once each month, to visit and catch up on each other's lives.

"I was secretary of the church she attended, so we go way back. She was very special and I am proud to have known her," Wyatt said.

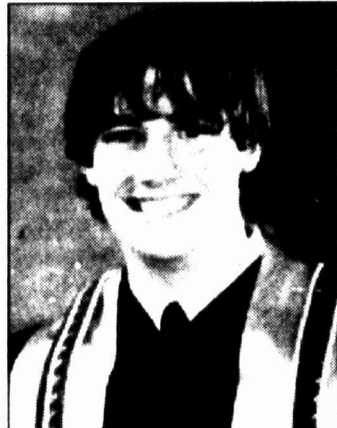



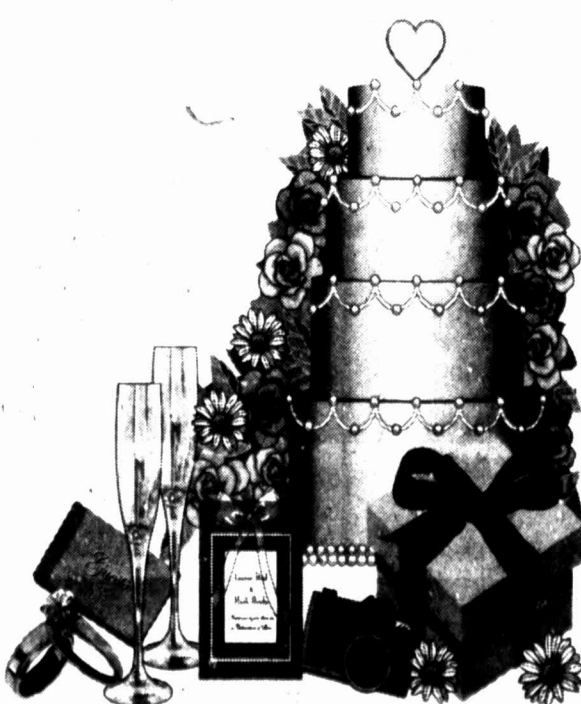

## Bread is making a comeback

DALLAS — Bulbous-headed restaurant mascots and TV advertisements proclaim the news: Bread is back.

With the Atkins low-carb craze of 2003-04 a cruste-over memory for many, restaurateurs are pushing past the bread dread and heavily promoting artisan offerings, whole grain loaves and other yeasty treats.

And consumers are eating it up.

"Because of the low-carb craze, people came back to bread with a vengeance," said Tammy Bailey, vice president

for menu marketing and promotions with San Diego-based Jack in the Box Inc. The fast-food company has reported better-than-expected earnings as high-

er-end items such as ciabatta bread sandwiches boosted sales.

"They really love their bread now," she said.

And with the introduction of more whole grain options,

bread has moved off the "guilty pleasures" list, where it lingered during the height of the

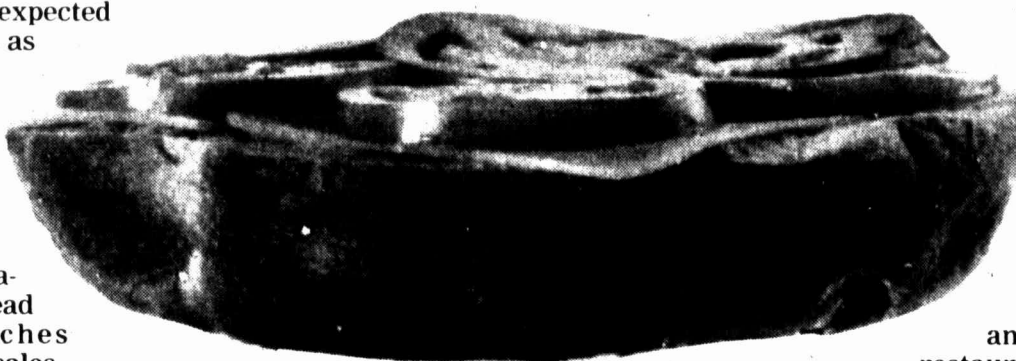
grocery stores fell 2 percent to \$5.9 billion, according to ACNielsen. Since then, sales are up 3 percent to \$6.1 billion.

But that has changed, too.

U.S. sales at the top 25 sandwich and bakery concepts were \$16.7 billion in 2005. That's up 13 percent from 2004, according to a new report from Chicago-based Technomic Information Services. By comparison, sales grew 8.8 percent in 2003.

Restaurant industry experts say the major chains were able to avoid a big fallout from the carb craze because they were quick to respond with wraps, salads and other low-carb options.

The proportion of adults who say they adhere to a low-carb diet is down from about 16 per-

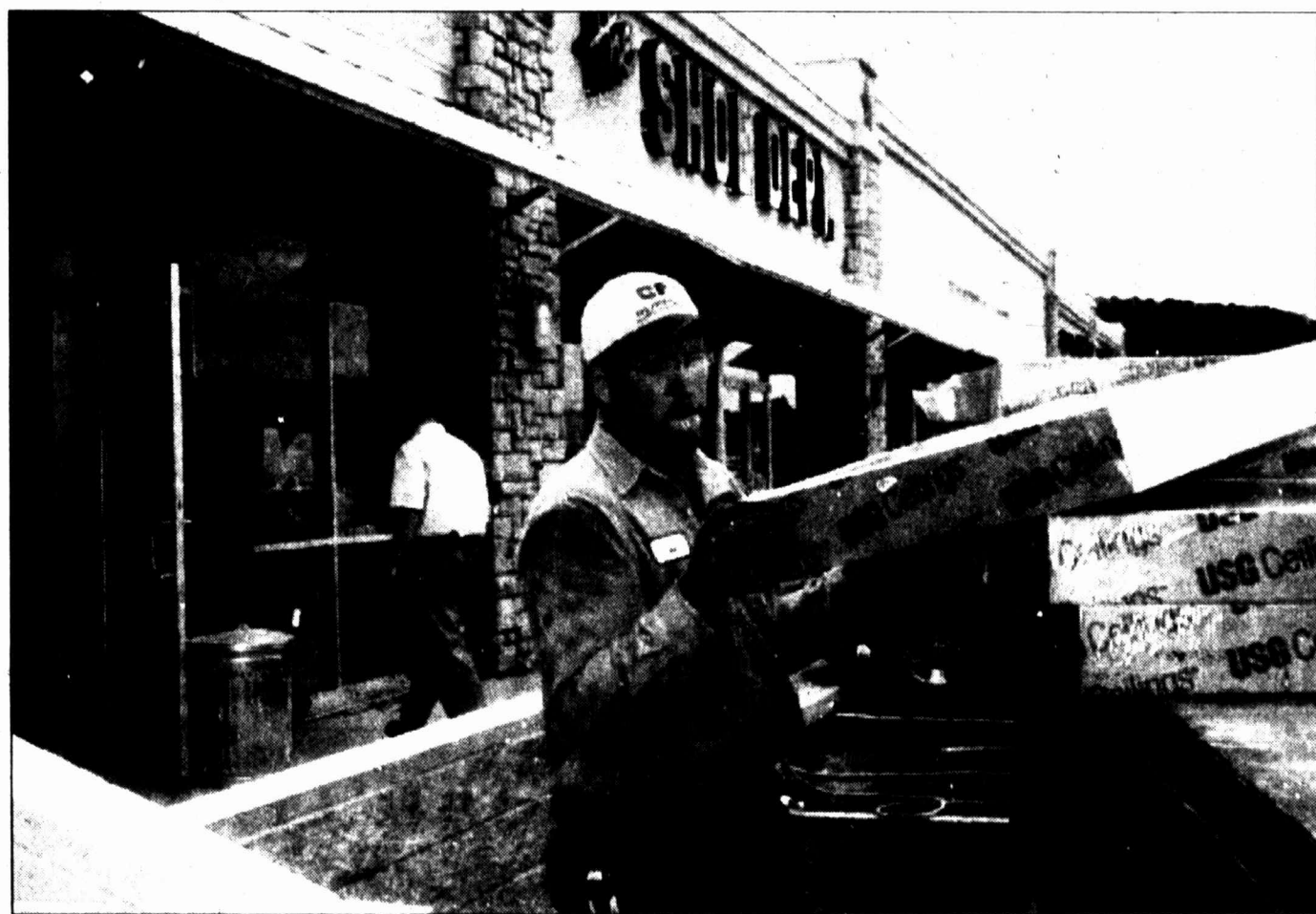


Sandwich and bakery restaurants —

whose bread and butter is bread and meat — saw sales growth slow slightly as carb-conscious dieters pulled back.

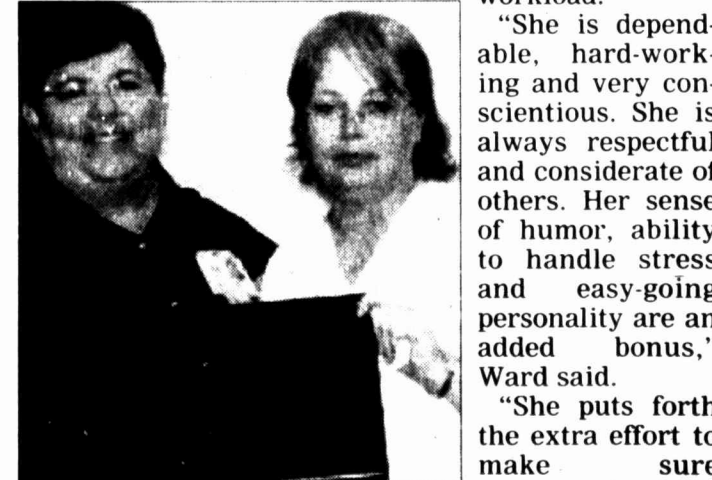

cent in early 2005 to 10 percent this year, said Lawrence Shiman, vice president of Cambridge-based Opinion Dynamics Corp., which specializes in food-service market research.

With the coast largely clear, restaurateurs are being just as quick to unabashedly roll out breads.

In April, Ohio-based Wendy's International Inc. reported a "favorable response from consumers" to its new Frescata deli sandwiches. The line launched earlier in the month, backed by a national advertising campaign.

The highly publicized "Bread is Back" promotion by Jack in the Box — complete with its own breadisback.com Web site and a commercial featuring the company's round-headed pitchman — has helped plump up sales of its ciabatta sandwiches since the campaign launched last year.

Bailey declined to give sales figures but said the sandwiches were "doing much better than we ever expected."

The bread-boosting campaign was "our little way of poking fun at the craze," she said.

Not to be outdone by the burgermeisters, traditional sandwich players are also lengthening their bread lines.

Using the same "bread is back" tag line, Atlanta-based Blimpie International Inc. also launched a line of ciabatta sandwiches last year featuring "premium meats and freshly baked artisan bread."

"They have done phenomenally well," said Mark Mears, chief marketing officer for Blimpie, adding that the new sandwiches on average account for 15 percent of sales and can be as much as 30 percent in some markets.

At its peak, the chain's carb counter menu amounted to only 10 percent of sales and is no

**WELL-BRED BREADS**

Here's a primer on some the latest bread-related terms:

- Artisan bread (ART-uh-zn)**  
—"Artisan" involves the extensive use of hand shaping and limited use of machines. The breads are often round, with a crunchy, shell-like crust and spongy, porous insides.
- Ciabatta (chyah-BAH-tah)**  
—A relatively flat bread with a fine crisp, firm crust, with large holes inside and a light texture. Can be artisan if not mass-produced. Ciabatta is the Italian word for "slipper."
- Focaccia (foh-KAH-chyah)**  
—A large Italian flat bread seasoned with oil and herbs and often topped. The Latin translation is "fireplace floor bread."

longer available nationally.

"Restaurants have done an about-face," said Joel Cohen, owner of the Cohen Marketing Group in Raleigh, N.C. "But it's not one done with any embarrassment."

"I see this as a way to market to a broader audience. Also, it's a way to get an edge on the competition."

And it's a way to boost the size of the average check because chains generally charge top dollar for specialty sandwiches.

"Consumers are willing to pay a bit of a premium because it's artisan bread," said Bailey of Jack in the Box, which counts Texas as its second-largest market. "It's not mass-produced — it's more handmade."

That may be, but with prices close to \$6 for offerings such as the chipotle chicken ciabatta sandwich, some consumers balk at forking over that much dough.

"I'm trying to eat cheap," said 22-year

Dennis Daoust, finishing up a less expensive sourdough burger at a Jack in the Box on Greenville Avenue in Dallas this week. "That's the whole point of eating at these places, for me."

Restaurateurs are counting on consumers' desire to "trade up" to a higher-quality product, albeit with a higher price tag. "Going from peanut butter and jelly's white bread to an (artisan bread), it feels good," said Aaron Allen, founder and chief executive of the Quantified Marketing Group, a Heathrow, Fla.-based restaurant marketing firm. "It's an easy indulgence that you can afford."

And the new breads, especially the whole-grain versions, offer sandwich restaurants a chance to market their offerings as healthier than the fare at the burger joint next door.

Experts say that as baby boomers age, the focus on eating healthier will

grow.

Sandwich chains in general are already picking up a healthy glow as Subway Restaurants, the nation's most populous restaurant chain, continues to market itself as a healthy fast-food alternative.

"Sandwich chains tend to do well on the health measure," said Jeff Davis, president of Sandleman & Associates, a San Clemente, Calif.-based firm that tracks food-service trends. Having whole grain breads "certainly does add to that" perception, he said from his Dallas office.

"awards of excellence" report, three sandwich chains — Subway, Missouri-based Panera Bread Co. and San Diego-based Submarina Inc. — ranked first, second and third when consumers were asked about the availability of healthy, nutritious food at fast-food restaurants. "People are turning away from traditional fast-food restaurants," said restaurateur Gary Davis, who was developing a new sandwich concept during the low-carb heyday. Davis is chief executive of Orlando, Fla.-based Earl of Sandwich

LLC, a partnership that includes John Montague, the 11th Earl of Sandwich. The first restaurant in the chain opened in 2004, and the first unit outside of Florida — a Houston store — opened Monday. Despite the steady stream of "bread is dead" headlines that appeared during the chain's formative stages, Davis said he was never too worried about the impact of low-carb diets, convinced that the appeal of freshly baked bread and specially roasted meats would win out. The company does offer salads, he said, "but the majority of people come in for a sandwich."

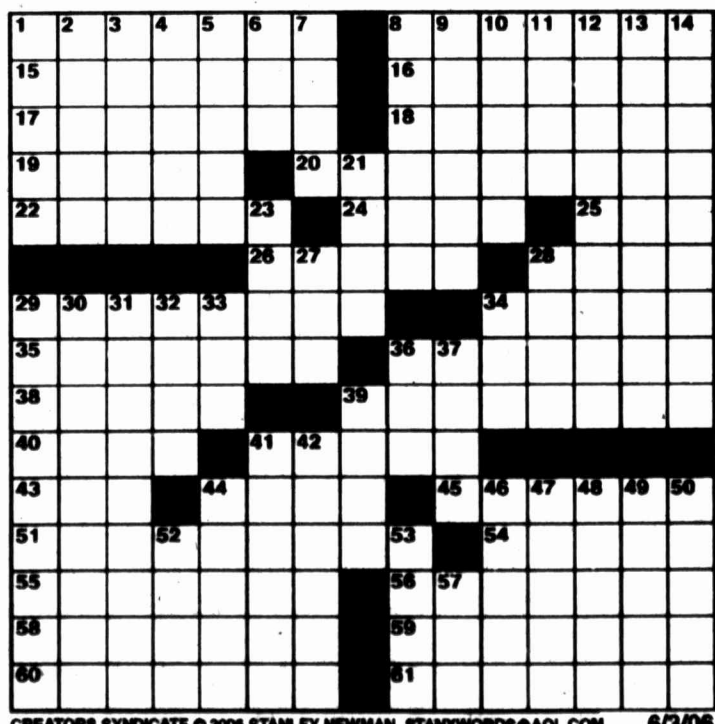

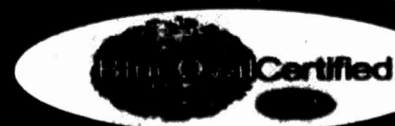

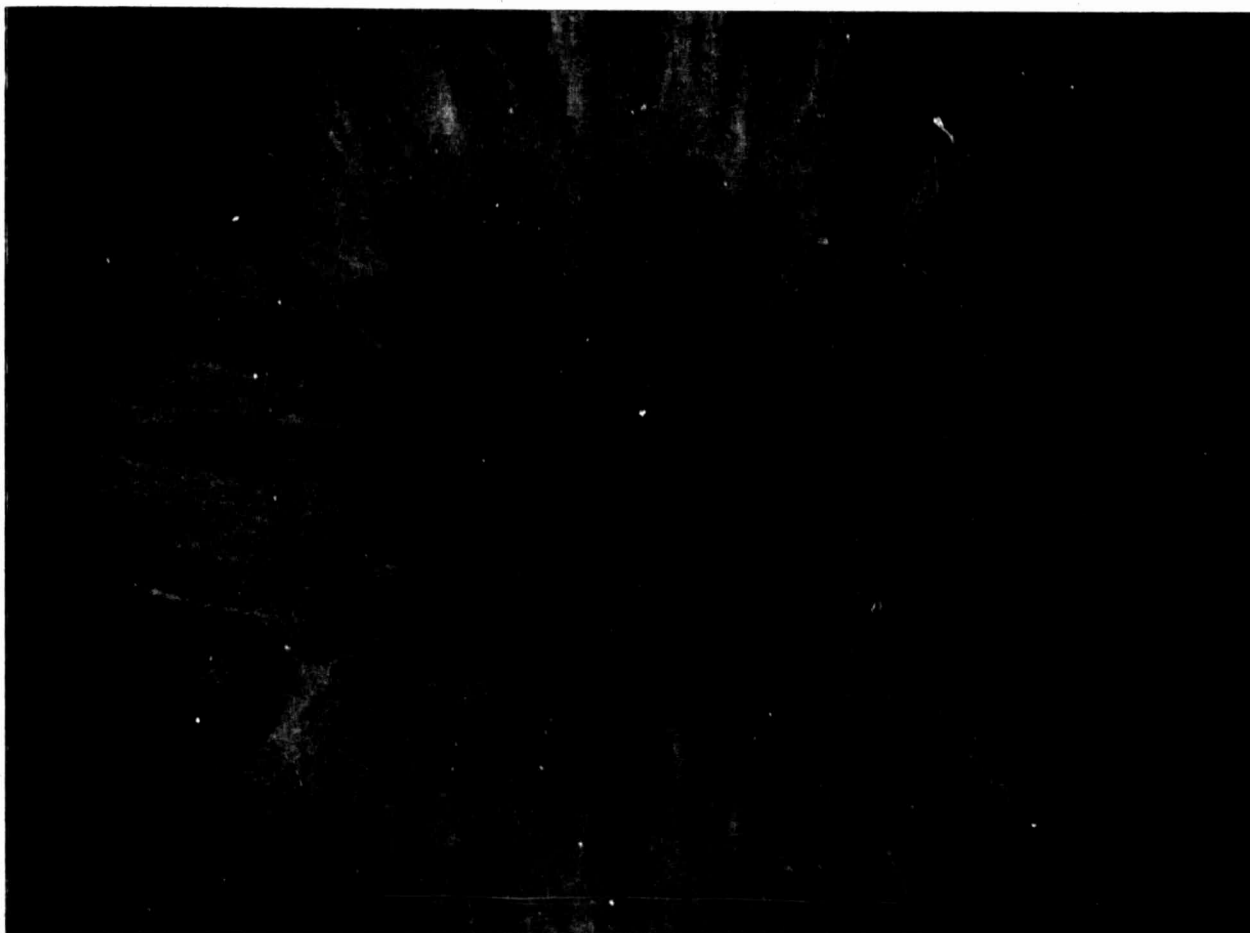

# Munich:

*A tremendous work of both art and film*

**H**istory is a funny thing. It isn't just that the victors write the history books but that after a while, certain events lose their immediacy and impact as the years pass and are eventually relegated to textbooks where they may die silent deaths.

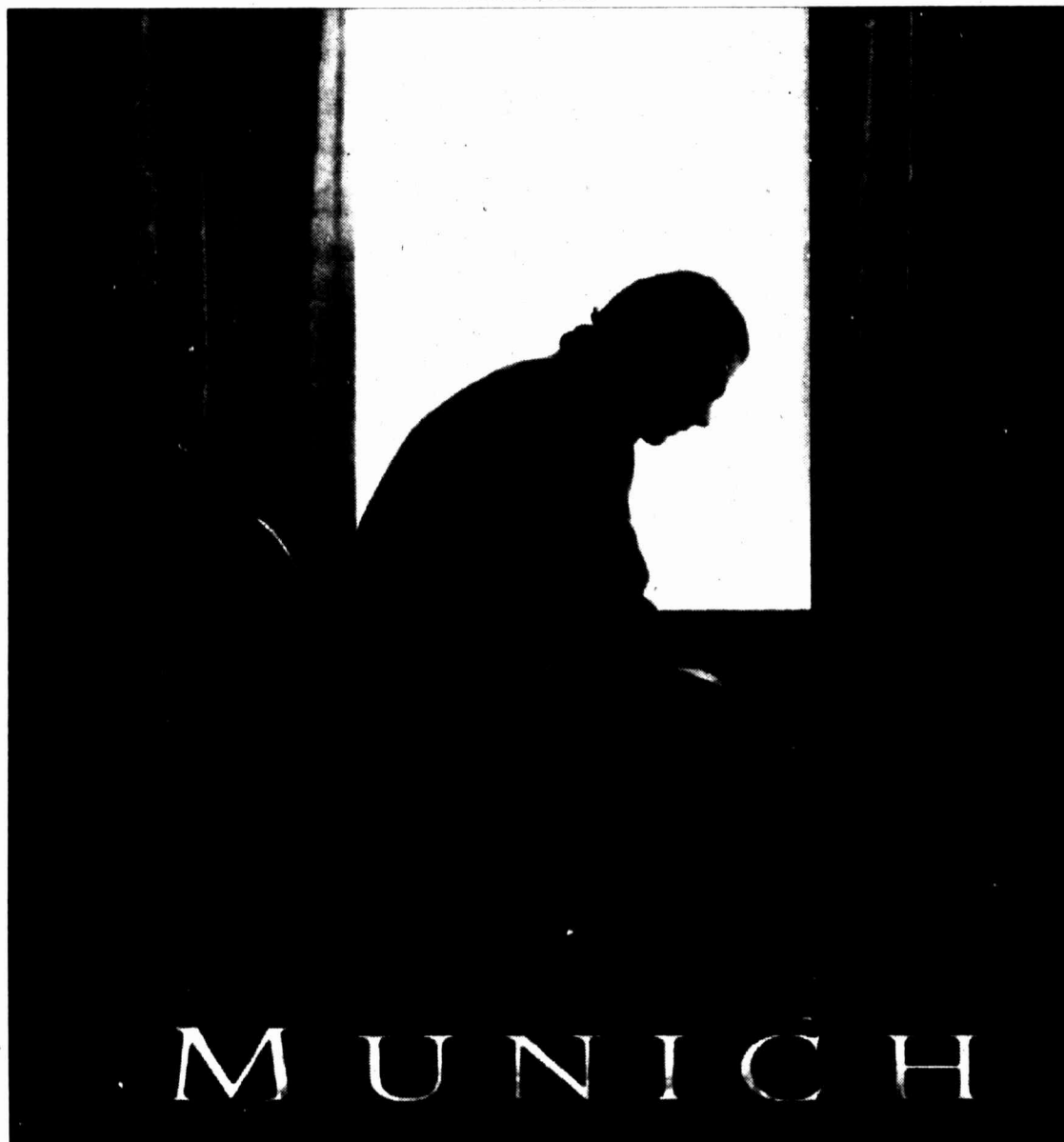
The great things about movies are that events like the Olympic hostage crisis and eventual tragedy in Munich in 1972 can be remembered and brought back to us so we don't forget them so easily. However, a movie isn't always the best place to start for the truth.

Movies aren't made to teach us history, they are made to tell us stories, and as such, this is a hell of a story, but whether or not this is true... well, it's for books, teachers, and talking heads to say, certainly not me.

Munich begins with the 1972 Olympics where 11 Israeli athletes and trainers were taken hostage by the Palestinian terrorist group Black September in the hopes of bringing the attention of the world to the struggle for a Palestinian state. When the hostage crisis ends in the worst of ways the Israeli government decides it's time to fight back and to send the world a message that the Jews will not be targets any longer.

A married man on the verge of fatherhood — Avner, portrayed by Eric Bana ("The Hulk," "Blackhawk Down") is pulled away from his job in an elite police arm and is given a devil's bargain — will he leave his family, country and safety to pursue the men that perpetrated this horror on Israel?

He will leave his career, his pension, and his security behind and will be essentially dead to the government until the mission is completed. He will be



paid, yes, but only after the mission is complete.

This mission consists of 11 names and 11 lives that must be taken by this man and a team of four that shall be assembled for him. The man, the son of an Israeli hero, feels compelled to take the mission as this is not simply revenge but is a warning to the world that such crimes will not go unpunished.

Avner, a simple policeman on the verge of a family, takes this mission, and in many ways sells his soul to his nation. What he and the men chosen to be his team — all of them men with businesses and lives but who serve Israel as it asks and all of them bound to become friends — learn is the path of vengeance is one wrought with peril and terror, and one upon which it is easy to lose

your mind.

Director Steven Spielberg does an excellent job with Bana and his four compatriots, Steve (Daniel Craig, "Road to Perdition," "Lara Croft: Tomb Raider"), Carl (Ciaran Hinds, "Rome," "The Phantom of the Opera"), Robert (Mathieu Kassovitz, "The Fifth Element") and Hans (Hanns Zischler, "Gate to Heaven").

Things begin easy enough, with the men responsible for the terrorist strike not taking care to hide from the world, but as each body falls the stakes rise higher, the danger grows, and the risks increase tenfold.

For these five men, however, the real monster is not stalking them from the shadows, but from within, as they slowly realize what this mission is making them into.

Hinds has quite possibly the most profound line in the entire movie, when he simply says, "It's strange,

to think of one's self as an assassin."

Another great line comes from Robert, the toy-maker turned demolitions expert, when he tells Avner, "We are supposed to be righteous. That's a beautiful thing. And we're losing it. If I lose that, that's everything. That's my soul."

The unfortunate thing about Munich is that it will be seen by far too many as a reflection on the truth of what really happened, and I can see that. When you present a factual event — the Munich massacre — but then surround it by events that go well beyond the known facts it's hard to know where the truth ends and the story begins. However, never once does Spielberg present this as utter fact. The film states clearly as it begins that this was inspired by real events.

What I would hope is that this film would spark resurgence in the discussion of this event and how it relates to the world today, and perhaps shed new light on what may have happened. More than that though I'd like us to look long and hard at the notion of revenge. A notion that stands today, that revenge can eventually lead to peace.

Perhaps it can, but perhaps it cannot, and this is not a question the film dares to answer, but asks of us quite clearly.

Bana is superb in the lead role and truly shines here. I have followed his career since "Chopper" and knew then he was very talented, but hopefully this film and an Oscar nod will show the world what many of us already knew.

This is filmed in a similarly gritty style as "Saving Private Ryan" but doesn't have that film's horror, where moments of peace would be shattered with death and loss. In Munich there is never a sense of peace, never a sense of safety or rest. These men have walked into Hell and shall not return until they are allowed to return, if at all.

The brilliance in the filmmaking is that we never even quite see what happens to the hostages, though we are told of their fate, until the end of the film. Just like the men in the film we are asked to believe what happened before we are shown it be-

cause that's how these things work. You do what you are asked and are told what you need.

Another great aspect of this film is that Spielberg makes it a point not to show anyone as a pure monster. The terrorists are family men, men with hobbies, men who were like anyone else save for their blind love of an ideal. The men sent to hunt them are the same. There is even an assassin that looks like anything but one, and who doesn't seem necessarily better for their trade, but who is in it nonetheless.

This is not a world of black and white but of degrees of gray where no one is innocent and truth is in the eye of the beholder.

There are tremendous performances throughout the film and it's a testament to the quality of the production that you believe each actor is their

character. You believe in this film, and in your belief, you find horror.

This film will never make a lot of money for Spielberg but this is easily one of his greatest efforts. In the top three, if not top two. It is not as emotionally resonant as "Saving Private Ryan" but it's a better film. The great thing about this filmmaker is that he's learned how to balance his desire to make big, popular 'blockbusters' but also has found a way to tell these harder, darker stories that need to be told.

I would never say that this is the truth, but there is truth in this film, and for that reason alone it earns a viewing. A tremendous work of art and film.

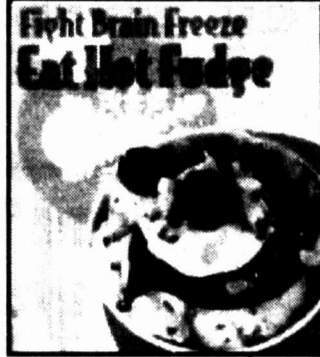

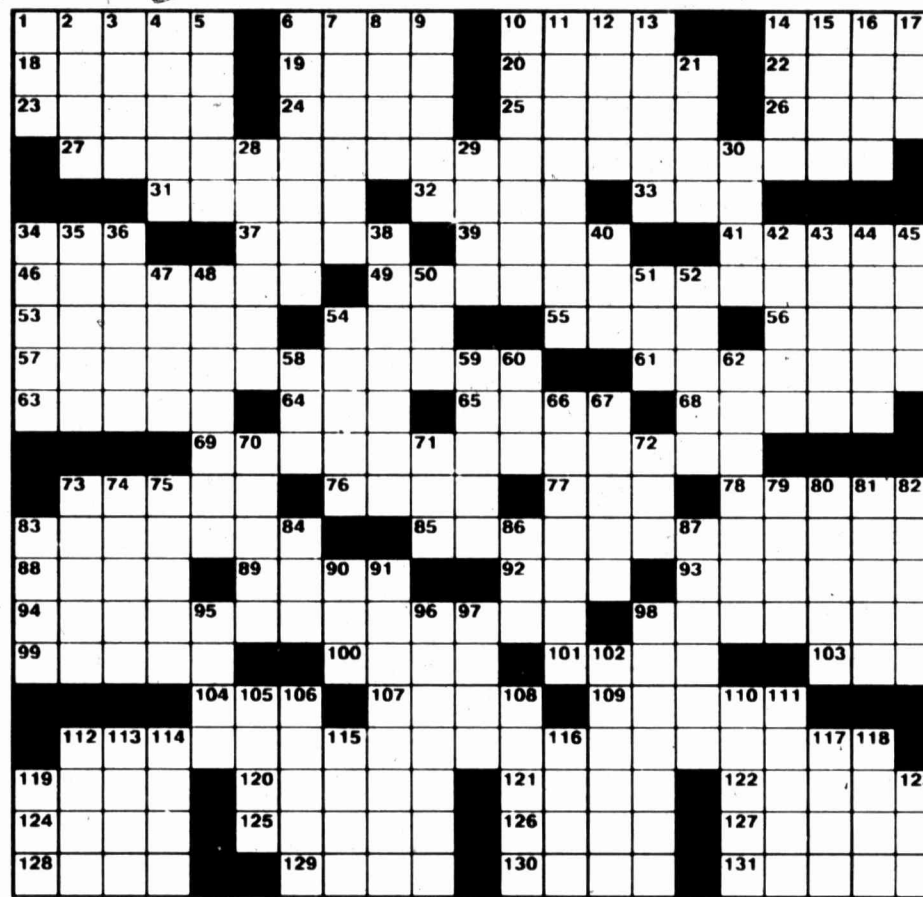

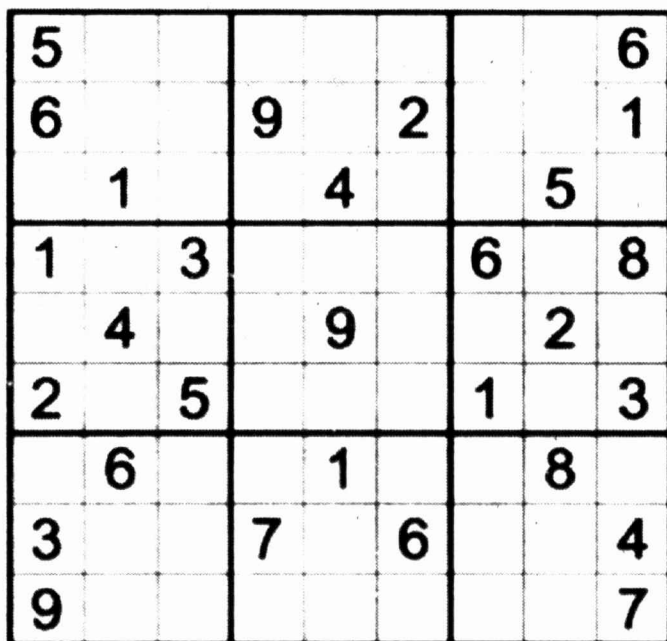
