How do you pay for a jail?

Commissioners expected to discuss the issue Monday

After several weeks of fruitless attempts to nail down how to finance a multi-million dollar jail facility, Howard County commissioners are once again poised to address the issue Monday morning.

County Judge Ben Lockhart is expected to entertain discussions concerning funding for the construction of a proposed jail facility, currently to be located near the intersection of U.S. Highway 87 and Interstate Highway 20.

Whether the county will opt to hold a bond election or issue certificates of obligation to fund the construction has yet to be addressed by the court; however, some commissioners say they have already formed opinions on the matter.

"As far as I'm concerned, this matter will come down to a bond election," said Commissioner Jerry Kilgore following the court's last meeting. "There has been some talk about certificates of obligation, but I really don't know if I could go that route. It's going to take a lot to change my mind on this issue."

"I think the people want to vote on this, and

because we've had so much conflict on this, we owe it to the citizens. I hope they will realize this is something we have to have, and I hope we've done a good job on selecting and give them a choice as to how to finance this."

While the idea of using certificates of obligation — which would not require the county to put the matter up for a public vote — has met a great deal of resistance from citizens attending recent commissioners court meetings, Lockhart said there is more work to be done before commissioners reach the financial stage of the project.

"We really need a figure of what it's going to cost before we can really decide how we're going to finance a new jail," said

Response great say college officials

Waiting hours to register for college courses has now gone the way of rotary phones and penny postcards.

Howard College officials are pleased with reactions to their recently unveiled online registration services.

Donna Myrick, registrar for the college, said the service was recently unveiled and has been a big hit with both students and campus officials alike.

"It has been just great, and the students just love it," Myrick said. "We're very excited about it."

Myrick was able to gauge student reaction almost instantaneously. Officials tallied more than 200 "hits" on the college's Web site within 20 minutes of the service's debut at midnight April 24.

"It took us about six weeks of 12-to-14-hour days to get it up and running, but it's definitely been worth it," she said.

To access the service, students must first meet with an academic advisor at the college and fill out the requisite paperwork. But once they receive an identification number and PIN, they're ready to

Model enthusiasts enjoy honing their skills at local fly-in

The fly-in and swap meet continues from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday.

Just as there's different types of aircraft, there's different types of model airplanes.

And it takes a different set of skills to fly those model aircraft, just like with their larger brethren.

At this weekend's Fly-In and Swap Meet at Buzbee Field, hosted by the Big Spring Model Aircraft Association, most of the planes zipping through the sky are radio-controlled craft, diving and

banking at the command of the pilot's joystick.

Other enthusiasts, however, prefer a more direct approach. They are "control line" pilots, who fly craft through commands transmitted via long cables.

While this form might seem, at first glance, more boring — flying in continuous circles instead of the more free-form approach of radio-controlled planes — it's not without its challenges and attractions.

For starters, control-line flying requires a bit more stamina, as the pilot is continually fighting against the forces generated by the aircraft.

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Cameron Evans suits up in superhero garb as part of his job, but he may never have guessed that his alter ego, "Luke Pie-Rocker," would save someone's day.

Teresa Skarman was walking home Tuesday night when a purse snatcher grabbed her red leather bag.

The 55-year-old grocery store bagger screamed for help and Evans — sporting orange tights, black boots and cape — chased the mugger. A delivery man for Galactic Pizza, Evans tailed the robber for blocks, until two bystanders helped corner the crook in an alley. They ended up letting him go in exchange for the purse.

Evans, 26, a student at Minneapolis Community and Technical College, said he wasn't worried about his safety, hoping others would help.

Skarman said she admires Evans' bravery. "I'm so thankful," she said, clutching her red purse. "He's my hero."

U.S. RAIDS AIM TO STOP NETWORK

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — Flush with intelligence, the U.S. military moved quickly to take advantage of the power vacuum left by the death of Abu Musab al-Zarqawi, carrying out nearly 40 raids in an effort to stop his terror network from regrouping.

A U.S. military search of the destroyed safehouse where the al-Qaida in Iraq leader was killed Wednesday yielded documents and information storage devices that are being assessed for potential use against his followers, a military officer said.

An M-16 rifle, grenades and AK-47 rifles also were found, according to the officer, who spoke on condition of anonymity because results from the search have not been announced. The U.S.-made M-16 was fitted with special optics.

They also found documents and unspecified "media," which the officer indicated normally means information storage devices such as computer hard drives and digital cameras or other data storage devices.

Grave-seekers flock to cemetery to learn age-old art of dowsing

VICTOR (AP) — The cemetery of this abandoned Erath County community came alive recently with grave-seekers.

People slowly shuffled through the rural cemetery with a metal divining rod in each hand, waiting to see if the rods crossed to indicate a body buried below. Neon orange rectangles were spray-painted in empty patches to mark suspected graves of all sizes — larger ones for adults, smaller ones for children.

The search at the cemetery seven miles north of De Leon exhilarated some people, while puzzling others.

"You may find graves, you may not," said Ruby Pair, secretary-treasurer of the Victor Cemetery Association. Pair, 79, didn't think it was too funny when her children sprayed an orange rectangle on the spot where she is supposed to be buried.

Divining rods or "witching sticks" have been used since ancient times to find underground water or minerals. Some people are using dowsing, as it is also called, as an inexpensive, easy way to find lost graves.

Dowsing experts claim the rods can even deter-

mine the sex and position of the person buried.

How it works is something of a mystery. Some say the secret is magnetism or gases from decaying bodies, although it works on living people lying down.

While Pair and her husband, Fayne, 81, are skeptical about dowsing for graves, their children and grandchildren are not.

Their daughter, Elayne Pair Gibbons of Phoenix, turned the family onto dowsing four years ago. She persuaded her parents to look for lost graves in Victor Cemetery, where relatives are buried, after Fayne Pair told her he remembered graves marked with wooden crosses on a hill — crosses that are no longer there. Graves once marked by small rocks had also been lost.

The oldest marked grave is that of young boy who died in 1875. But the most famous grave belongs to Winston Lee Moore, better known as singer-songwriter and Abilene broadcaster Slim Willet ("Don't Let the Stars Get in Your Eyes").

Gibbons, 54, figures more than 100 lost graves have been "found" at Victor Cemetery. But she

believes there could be as many as 500 unmarked burials.

"No one can even count them there's so many out there," she said.

And that's uncovered a problem. As the family began "finding" graves, their divining rods pointed to spots reserved by people for their burials.

The family decided they needed to map each grave in the cemetery, using dowsing to find unmarked burials. To aid in the search and educate others about dowsing, the family offered free lessons in the technique.

From dawn to noon, the family gathered at the cemetery along Highway 16. A steady stream of curious visitors arrived.

Pat Spence and her cousin, Nancy Jewell, drove from Comanche to learn about dowsing.

Jewell hoped the technique would help her find unmarked graves at another cemetery she is associated with so occupied spaces wouldn't be resold. But she didn't get consistent results with the divining rods.

Her cousin's divining rods pointed all over the place. Not only did Spence find graves, she could simply say the

name of someone buried nearby and the rods would spin around and point in that direction. She held them perfectly still, not manipulating them in any way.

"It's absolutely fascinating," Spence said, adding she felt spiritual forces were moving the rods.

She plans to use dowsing at another cemetery to find her grandfather's burial spot, which is unmarked because someone snatched his gravestone, and other markers, to prop up a house.

Although Elayne Gibbons and her family have found many supposedly lost graves, identifying them may prove impossible. The cemetery association has incomplete records, and practically nothing is left of the old farming community of Victor.

A gravedigger brought in later to check to see if one of the spots marked by an orange rectangle actually held a grave found nothing.

"It's definitely not for someone who's weak," said Don McKinney of the local model airplane club.

Lockhart. "We currently have the money to purchase the property, but anything beyond that is going to either call for a bond election or certificates of obligation."

As of yet, architects working on the project have not calculated a solid figure when it comes to the cost of the facility, which is expected to house 144 beds.

And while Commissioner Gary Simer has continued to question the need for a 144-bed facility during recent meetings, Kilgore said there's no question it will be a necessity over the next several decades.

"It's not something we really want to spend the money on, but it's come down to a time when we have to do it," said Kilgore. "We've gotten more than 50 years out of our old jail, and if we're successful in getting this new one done, I hope it lasts us another 50 years, or more. We've tried to make sure we don't put up something cheap. We want something that's going to last and serve our needs, and I really think this will do it."

Also on Monday's agen-

da, County Auditor Jackie Olson will present the commissioners with invoices and purchase requests, as well as a budget workshop and amendments to the county's existing budget.

County Treasurer Teresa Thomas is expected to present commissioners with personnel considerations, as well as a payroll report.

County Road and Bridge Administrator Eddy Jameson will present the court with pipeline crossings and a report on county road maintenance, including the possible purchase of a asphalt zipper for the maintenance department.

Early voting in runoff election starts Monday

Voters in Big Spring City Council District 2 have another chance to stand up and be counted. Early voting in the runoff election for the District 2 council seat will get under way Monday, with Donna Gamboa and Manuel Ramirez Jr. facing off for a second time this.

Gamboa and Ramirez Jr. were the top candidates in extremely light polling during the May 13 council election.

Only 3.2 percent of the district's registered voters cast ballots May 13th. Gamboa received 25 votes to Ramirez's 16, with the race's third candidate, Cindy Lopez, claiming 14 votes.

Since none of the candidates received a majority, the top two vote getters — Gamboa and Ramirez — advanced to a June 24 runoff.

Early voting will continue through Tuesday, June 20, and will be held at the Howard County Courthouse from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m.

There will be two 12-hour early voting days, according to Sandra Bloom, Howard County's election administrator. Early voting will be held from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on June 15 and June 20. Bloom said that should help people who find it tough to get to the polls between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. still take advantage of the early voting period.

The polling place on June 24 will be the Dorothy Garrett Coliseum. Voters will be able to cast ballots from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

According to Bloom, District 2 runs from the northeast part of the city of Big Spring through the center of town south of the 1600 blocks of Lancaster east to State Street, with several blocks zig-zagging in the area, including the area surrounding Big Spring High School and Big Spring Junior High.

Anyone not sure about what voting district they are in should either check their voter registration card — city council district is located on the right side in the box labeled "city" — or contact the election office at 264-2273.

According to Sandra Bloom, election administrator for Howard County, she and her staff are preparing for the runoff.

As we've stressed before, there are many reasons for voting early, not the least of which is the unpredictability of West Texas weather, although it looks like we're in for a long stretch of hot, dry days.

But another reason to cast your ballot now is because the longer you put things off, the more difficult they are to get accomplished. If you wait until June 24, too many things can happen to prevent us from getting to the polls.

The important thing, however, is for the residents of District 2 to go to the polls and vote in this runoff. The winner of this election will be their representative on a council that greatly affects their lives.

But don't put it off. Your voice needs to be heard.

A judge by any other name...

How does a bagel store owner beat a judge with 20 years experience for a position on the bench?

How does one candidate who is rated "not qualified" manage to defeat another who is rated "exceptionally well qualified"?

And what does it say about democracy when that happens?

The position was a Superior Court judgeship. The place was Los Angeles, last Tuesday. Money was only part of the explanation. The rest was the name.

Lynn Olson practiced commercial law for four years after graduating from law school, then let her license lapse and opened a bagel place in a beach town south of Los Angeles 14 years ago. Great ginger snaps, reportedly.

Last year, she paid up on the license and decided to run for judge. The bar rated her unqualified, but that didn't stop her. Her husband is a local city councilor, so they knew how the game was played, outpacing the incumbent two-to-one on mailers and e-mails directed to registered Democrats.

According to Olson and her husband, they chose her opponent based on her Republican registra-

tion, not her name. Maybe so, but Dzintra Janavs was not the only Republican judge whose term was up — she was the only Latvian, with a strange name, and most observers think that's what cost her.

Read her bio, and Dzintra Janavs is everything Lynn Olson isn't. She is a legal success story, one of those people whose lives is an American dream come true. She fled Latvia with her parents during World War II. Both her parents were lawyers in their home country, but they worked as a gardener and a housekeeper in this country to support Dzintra, who was one of the first women to attend Berkeley's Boalt Hall Law School.

Janavs has served on the bench for 20 years, and was one of only two judges out of 28 evaluated to receive the highest rating from the Los Angeles County Bar Association. She is highly regarded by her colleagues, and had the endorsements of everyone.

What's in a name? Did the fact that her name sounded foreign cost a talented judge her seat?

It certainly looks like it contributed to it.

This is the other side, the ugly side, of the anti-immigrant feeling that is being encouraged by the brick senders and the anti-amnesty demagogues. It's not simply a question of holding on to

Randy "Duke" Cunningham's seat, which is as close as Republicans

had to cause for celebration this week. The problem is that you can't necessarily confine a wave to a certain side of the line.

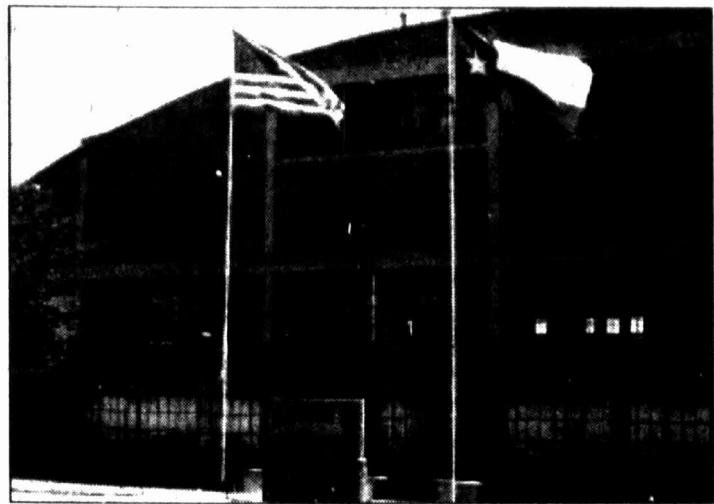
The legal community is professing shock at what happened at the election between Olson and Janavs. But why should we be shocked? What do you expect when you play with fire?

Judge elections are inherently dangerous because they are low visibility — so they can be bought for relatively low sums. Olson spent twice as much as her opponent, but she was still able to "buy" a six figure job for a relatively efficient \$100,000 investment.

More importantly, because they are low visibility, judicial elections are also vulnerable to the injection of demagoguery. Vote against the woman with the funny name, Olson told voters, without ever saying those words. So what if she's more qualified? And they did. It shouldn't be that easy. But it was.

So now when they come to court, instead of a seasoned judge, they get a bagel store owner. Laughs on them. Not so fast. Seeing how easily we fall into the trap of nativism should lead us to walk carefully, not only in selecting judges, but in evaluating immigration policy. There will no laughing, in the end.

The past always matters

The best thing about my job at Hangar 25 comes from the daily reminders of the impact the past has on the present. For a historian seeing history as a still-living entity is exciting.

I think it is noteworthy to the public to mention the impact that Big Spring Bombardier School and Webb AFB still have on humanity. The museum staff and volunteers have been blessed with holding in their hands the memories of more than 20,000 individuals who trained or instructed here, and that number only grows if you add the families of these individuals and then even more if you add the businesses of Big Spring and citizens who were impacted by these people.

Humanity, or better yet the essence of humanity, gets lost in the shuffle of day-to-day activities as we eagerly try to get through the day and simply mind our own business. People become merely a name or number or an association to something else. We see faces and that is exactly all we see, not taking the time to find what lies beneath, or what stories can be found in the eyes of the person next to us. It's a sad loss for humankind to see one another, to interact daily and yet not really see anything at all.

Before you get caught up in the day, take some time to really notice, to really hear what is around you. Remember the two stories I'm about to share and somewhere in the mix of it all realize we are not really that different. Human emotion can touch us all; we all have memories that have shaped our identity and at the base of it all, family and friends — whether they be from the past or from now — bring out who we are.

In May, Hangar 25 was blessed to share two very special reunions of very different sorts. Men from the 78th Service Engineering Squadron of Webb AFB returned to make a visit to a place they had once called home. Although they themselves had aged and most of Webb AFB is gone, the men found a reflection of who they were in the walls of the museum.

With pride, they were excited as they found their squadron plaque on the wall, and with even greater pride paused for a photo holding it. The smiles on their faces and the love in their wives' eyes didn't lie. This type of emotion, the recognition that their service was not forgotten, that their lives had and still mean something, is perhaps the most powerful

emotion one can find. But the story doesn't end with the men. One of the wives spent some time reliving memories lost in the pages of the yearbooks. She found a picture of a major whose wife had taught her piano whom she had not seen in 50 years. After going home and using a computer search, she found the major and his wife. Within a few short moments she was on the phone and a few days later a 50-year reunion occurred.

Reconnecting with old friends and finding the people who impacted our lives is a special thing and Hangar 25 is so pleased to be a part of something so powerful.

Later in the month, a Big Spring Bombardier School instructor returned for the first time. His goal was to remember the days of World War II before his Alzheimers took away too many of his memories. He also met with the children and grandchildren of the pilot, co-pilot and navigator who served with him during the war. Although these men have long since perished, their memories have remained strong by family who never had the chance to meet them. This man, this instructor from BSBS, remains a final connection between their service to our country and the family left behind.

The emotion on the face of the son who lost his dad in combat at two months touched my heart as he heard stories and learned things he never knew about his father. The human connection makes all things worth it at the end of the day. Seeing the magnitude of love, pride and friendship reminds us that the past always makes a difference in the present and well into the future.

Many squeezes come ready-made, but in some deals declarer must do some advance preparation to create the required position.

Here is a typical case. West leads the king of diamonds and shifts to the king of spades, taken by South with the ace. At first glance, it seems declarer must sooner or later lose a heart trick and go down one. But actually, given the bidding, he is a

strong favorite to make the slam.

West almost surely has five spades for his overall, and all declarer needs in addition is for West to have the king of hearts. In that case, with proper play a squeeze is certain to develop against him later on.

Accordingly, at trick three declarer leads a trump to dummy's eight, ruffs a spade, then plays a trump to the nine and ruffs another spade. The purpose of the spade ruffs is to exhaust East of spades and so place the burden of guarding against dummy's nine solely on West.

Declarer then plays four more rounds of trumps to bring about this position:

North
♦ 9
♥ A 8

West
♦ Q
♥ K 6

South
♥ Q 7
♦ 7

East
♥ J 10 9

South now leads his last trump, and West is helpless. If he discards a spade, declarer discards a heart from dummy; if West discards a heart, declarer discards a spade from dummy. Either way, South scores the last two tricks and makes the slam.

Parents, encourage and nurture your children

I was reading some works by Oliver Wendell Holmes the other day and came across this statement, "What lies behind us and what lies before us are tiny matters compared to what lies within us."

As these words continued to come across my mind I thought of the importance of self-esteem, our thoughts of what lies inside us.

Psychologists have researched this subject quite thoroughly and have found that success in life depends largely upon what an individual thinks of himself and of his abilities. If you ask a kindergarten teacher what kind of student succeeds best in school, chances are she will say, "A child who believes he can learn and one who is eager to get started."

A child needs to develop a positive attitude, build self-esteem and independence. A few suggestions to assist parents in developing these traits are as follows:

Expect your child to succeed in school. Research has found that children whose parents have high expectations will usually work hard to try to achieve those expectations. When parents expect less, children do less.

Give your child challenges he can master and be successful. Success builds confidence and self-esteem. Then praise him for his success. Always be sincere and truthful. Every success, no matter how small, is a building block for more success.

Let your child make choices. Give children the opportunity to develop choice making skills.

Start small and guide the choice making process. With young children, such choices may be: Would you like eggs or cereal for breakfast, or a sandwich cut in triangles or squares, or choose which you would like to do first, take a bath or pick up your toys. When you offer your child a choice you are letting him

know you have confidence in him and you are assisting him in building an important skill.

Hug your child and tell him you love him. Each child needs to know he is loved. He needs to hear you say you love him. He needs the physical contact of your hug. Research has shown that the foundation of a child's success

in school is the feeling of security, self worth, self-respect and competence that comes from knowing that he is lovable and loved by his parents. Your love will give him the confidence to go out into a world and succeed. Give him words of praise. Everyone needs to hear

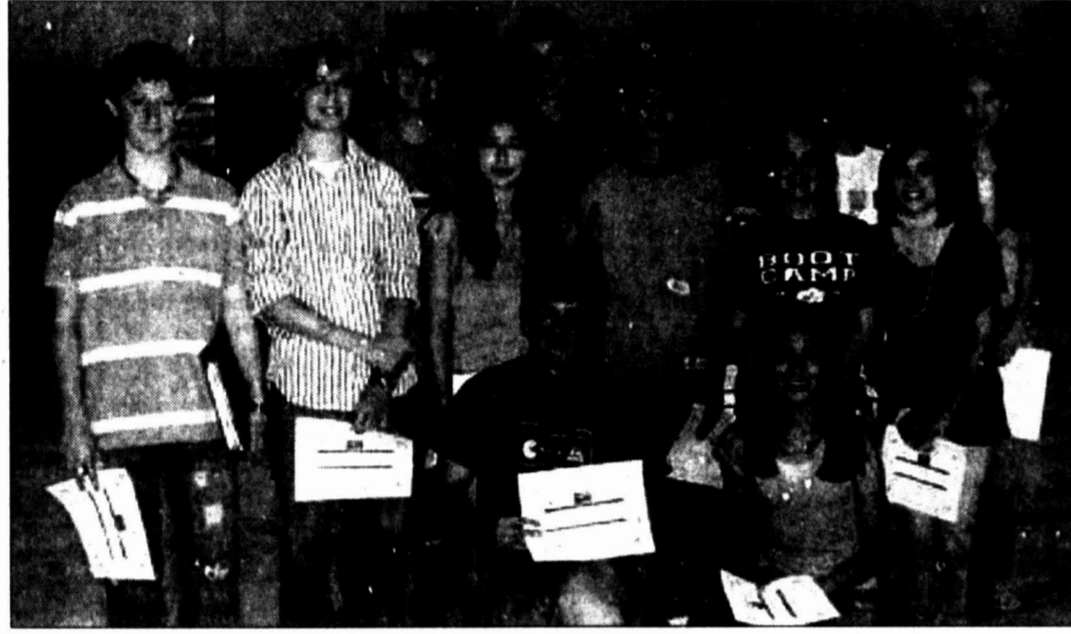



Fire-ravaged town rebuilds, proceeds with author event

CROSS PLAINS — Along Main Street near a feed store and senior citizens' center emerges Conan the Barbarian, his dark hair flowing past his broad shoulders and his muscular arms clutching a sword dripping with blood.

It's certainly an unexpected sight in a rural Central Texas community, but the library building mural symbolizes the town's claim to fame: native son Robert E. Howard, the character's creator.

Every June for the past 20 years or so, people from around the world have trekked here to attend lectures about Howard. They also tour the white clapboard house where he sat at a small wooden desk, peered out of the window at the peaceful Central Texas prairie and on his Underwood typewriter spun tales of sword-wielding heroes in faraway places and centuries.

For this year, what would have been Howard's 100th birthday, organizers had been planning to expand the celebration to three days in hopes of attracting up to 300 fans, triple the attendance of recent years.

But nearly six months ago a wildfire ravaged this rural community, killing two women and destroying a church, 90 homes and thousands of acres. The flames also came within 3 feet of the Howard home's front steps.

As Cross Plains started rebuilding, folks decided to forge ahead with the festival plans — not only to help the town get back to normal but also to give it a much-needed financial boost.

"I had no doubt that the Howard Days would go on," said Rusty Burke, a member of the Robert E. Howard United Press Association, which studies the author's life and works. "I knew people would want to come, and thought, 'We need to do what we can to keep the money in Cross Plains.'"

The event helps the local economy, although some Howard fans spend the night elsewhere because the town doesn't have many hotel rooms. Still, Burke said, he nixed plans for a banquet in a nearby city with bigger facilities because he wanted all activities in Cross Plains.

Now, green grass and new houses have sprouted up all over town. The only reminders of the Dec. 27 tragedy are a few empty parcels, neat and void of debris, and the First United Methodist Church brick sign on a large vacant lot.

Although the Howard house was spared in the blaze, a fire truck plowed through part of its white picket fence as firefighters rushed to help a neighbor douse the building to protect it. The fence was repaired in time for Robert E. Howard Days, which started Thursday, and fresh grass has grown over the once-blackened lawn.

"It looks like it's really bounced back," said Rob Roehm, a high school English teacher from Lancaster, Calif., attending his first Howard Days. "I came because it's the centennial and I expect to meet a lot of people I wouldn't meet without traveling all over the country."

Cross Plains hasn't always embraced its most famous native son, who

some called "crazy" for his wild tales, talking to himself and sometimes pretending to box while walking down the street. Those negative feelings intensified for some after he committed suicide at age 30 after learning that his ailing mother would not awaken from her coma.

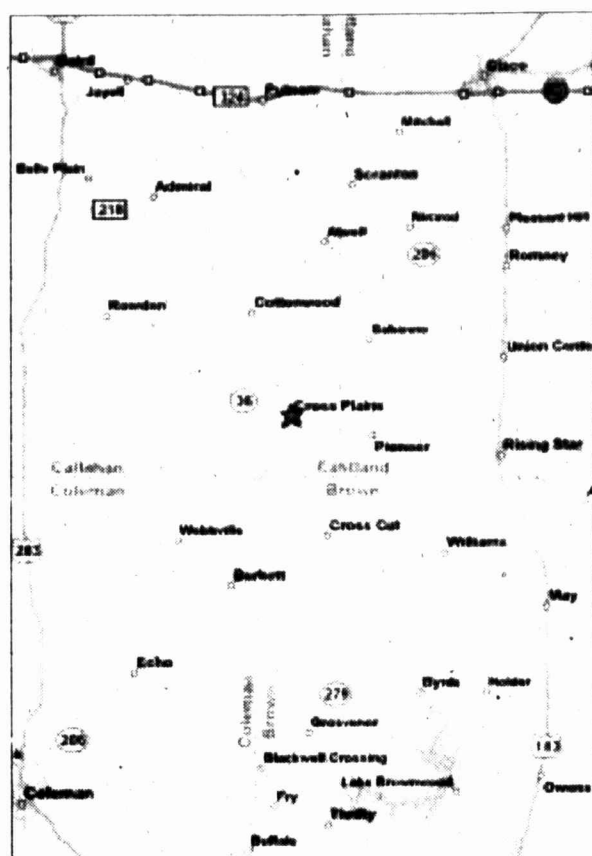
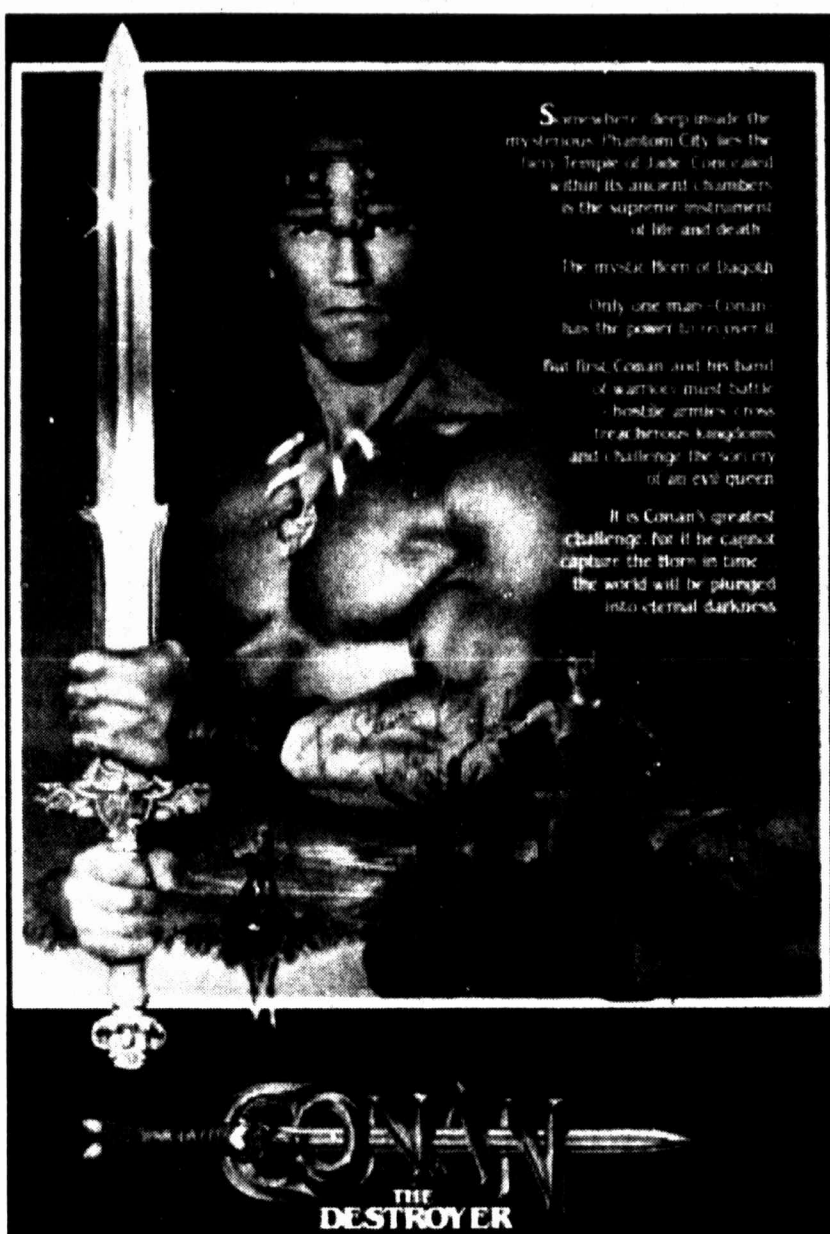
Although many assume Howard was distraught because he was too close to his mother, signs indicate he had been considering suicide — although he had several close friends — and shot himself in the head when he no longer had to tend to his mother, Burke said. She died the next day.

But his popularity grew as his works were published in paperbacks in the 1960s. Then his Conan character — a thief, mercenary and pirate who slayed dragons, winged apes and savage tribes on his way to becoming a king thousands of years before recorded history — was featured in comic books in the 1970s. They inspired the 1982 movie "Conan the Barbarian" starring Arnold Schwarzenegger.

While the movie plot differed from Howard's tales — which, like his stories about other characters, had been published only in "Weird Tales" and other magazines before his death — it widened the audience and made Conan part of pop culture.

Through the years fans went to Cross Plains expecting to tour Howard's house, and when they were turned away by the annoyed homeowners, a few visitors tore off pieces of the fence as souvenirs.

Seeing an opportunity for historic preservation and tourism, a newly formed community group called Project Pride bought Howard's rundown former house in 1989. The volunteer members pooled their money

people who like adventure get into his writing," said Burke, an aptitude testing organization director in Washington, D.C. "Fans like to see where a writer worked. The first time I came here, there were no exotic jungles, and I thought how little he had to work with, but now I've come to see how he took certain things and used his imagination."

for the downpayment, then held bake and garage sales and sought donations from out-of-town Howard fans.

But the \$10,000 mortgage wasn't the only expense. Much work — including removing the carpet and paneling installed by latter residents — was involved in restoring the house to its 1930s appearance.

The first Howard Days was in 1986, the 50th anniversary of Howard's death, a year after Burke and some friends first visited Cross Plains. The next event was in 1989 and has been held every year since with help from Project Pride, and attendance has grown from a dozen to nearly 100 people.

At first, the farming community mostly of retirees didn't know what to make of the self-proclaimed "sci-fi geeks and fantasy fans," some with long hair and tattoos. But the town realized how much the event helped the economy and now welcomes the guests — who include teachers, doctors and businessmen.

"It's kind of like a family reunion," said Susan McNeel, a life-long Cross Plains resident and Project Pride secretary. "It's fun for the local people to see people they haven't seen in a year or a few years."

Organizers and fans say they are glad Cross Plains, about 115 miles west of Fort Worth, has recovered and the celebration was able to proceed this year. "Howard was a very prolific, vivid writer, and

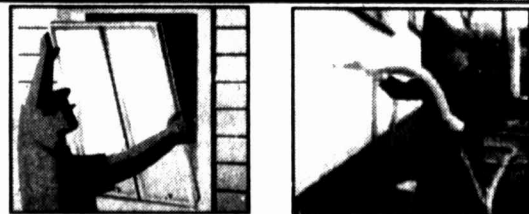



\$700,000 donated to fix up House speaker's Capitol apartment

AUSTIN (AP) — Businessmen, a lobbyist and a major corporate foundation have donated almost \$700,000 in the past eight days to pay for the renovation of Texas House Speaker Tom Craddick's apartment inside the Capitol, according to documents obtained Friday by The Associated Press.

The nearly 2,000-square-foot apartment is the only residence inside a state Capitol anywhere in the country. Speakers, along with their families, have access to the two-bedroom home while presiding over the Texas House.

Craddick spokeswoman Alexis DeLee said the speaker and his wife don't think it would be appropriate to use public money for the renovation project, which is expected to include redoing the apartment's kitchen and two bathrooms and tearing down a loft over the living room.

But watchdog groups are aghast at the fundraising effort, saying people and businesses that could benefit from future legislation shouldn't be allowed to spruce up the taxpayer-provided home of the man who controls the destiny of proposed state laws.

"Special interests shouldn't be lined up to give the Craddicks a personal gift of a new apartment," said Craig McDonald, director of Texans for Public Justice. "If it's in need of repair or if it's in need of renovation, then it should be paid for by the people of Texas."

DeLee said contributors are regular Craddick donors and people who simply are interested in historic preservation. She said the fundraising is modeled after the Friends

of the Governor's Mansion, a nonprofit organization that raised money to refurbish that residence.

Asked if donors could expect any favors in exchange for their contribution, she said: "Absolutely not ... That's just not the way it's going to happen."

Because the donations are considered a gift to the state and the checks are being sent to the State Preservation Board, which maintains the Capitol, they are not subject to campaign finance laws.

But Alex Winslow, executive director of the consumer advocate group Texas Watch, said the way the project is being handled "creates a sense of impropriety."

"Perhaps this should be an impetus for the Legislature to create a system ... to pay for renovations if and when they're needed without

having to turn to special interests," he said.

The donations so far include \$250,000 from the AT&T Foundation and another \$250,000 from billionaire investor Harold Simmons and his companies, according to records the AP obtained from the State Preservation Board under the Texas Public Information Act.

A \$100,000 donation came from Briscoe Ranch, whose chairman is former Democratic Gov. Dolph Briscoe. The Wholesale Beer Distributors of Texas donated \$10,000, while \$25,000 came from Tom Loeffler, a former congressman who founded and chairs the lobbying firm The Loeffler Group.

Through DeLee, the Craddicks declined to speak with the AP about the project or allow a tour of the home. The apartment is not included in the public Capitol tour, and only people invited

by the speaker may enter, she said.

The Craddicks extended an exclusive tour invitation to their hometown newspaper, The Midland Reporter-Telegram, which quoted Nadine Craddick as saying she wanted to bring the apartment "back to the same level of elegance as the rest of the Capitol building."

The apartment was extensively renovated in the mid-1990s during a sweeping \$187 million Capitol restoration project. And three years ago, the Craddicks spent at least \$25,000 in private donations refurbishing the unit.

The Craddicks and others involved in the project are trying to determine how much will be spent on the renovations and what will be done, DeLee said.

She said the kitchen is too small for the cooking

that must be done to serve the House members. And a draft project overview released by the State Preservation Board said "current finishes such as flooring, cabinets, countertops, fixtures and appliances in the kitchen and two bathrooms are extremely worn."

The carpets in the apartment and the speaker's office also are being replaced with carpets made of 100 percent New Zealand wool at a cost of nearly \$37,000. While the State Preservation Board already has paid a deposit of \$18,400, DeLee said the Craddicks plan to reimburse the state if enough money is raised.

Renovations are expected to begin within the next two weeks and should be finished by early January, when the Legislature opens its 2007 regular session, DeLee said.

Two jailed on charges of misappropriating money from wool company

SAN ANGELO (AP) — A former Ozona citizen of the year is among two Wool Growers Central Storage Co. officials accused of misappropriating millions of dollars from the business.

The company's general manager, Donnie Laughlin, and bookkeeper Tanya Stalcup remained in Crockett County Jail Friday, a week after they were arrested on one felony charge each of misappropriating more than \$200,000 in fiduciary property.

Laughlin's bond is \$500,000. A judge recently denied a motion to reduce Stalcup's \$250,000 bond.

The charges carry maximum sentences of life in prison.

Wool Growers ran warehouses in Ozona and Sanderson. Producers stored their wool and mohair and

arranged for others to purchase it. The company sold the products, kept part of the proceeds, then paid producers the rest.

In affidavits filed in Crockett County Justice Court, Texas Ranger Brooks Long accuses Laughlin and Stalcup of selling the product and improperly transferring more than \$2 million in proceeds to the Wool Growers checking account, instead of paying the producers who supplied the wool. The activity reaches at least as far back as September 2001, authorities allege.

The accusations first became known after suspicious producers alerted the Wool Growers board of directors, Long said in Saturday editions of the *San Angelo Standard-Times*. Hundreds of pro-

ducers have been impacted.

According to the affidavit, Laughlin told Wool Growers board Chairman George Bunger in the first week of April that he had transferred proceeds from wool and mohair sales to the company's general checking account and "approved the writing of checks from the regular business account to cover routine business expenses."

The board fired Laughlin, and the company filed for bankruptcy.

Laughlin was named Citizen of the Year by the Ozona Chamber of Commerce in 2004.

"Everybody's just shocked about all this," said Crockett County Commissioner Randy Branch, a friend of Laughlin's. "He was a friend of a lot of people here."

Teacher sentenced
to probation in sex abuse case

TYLER (AP) — Jurors who sentenced a former high school biology teacher to five years probation and ordered him to register as a sex offender for having a relationship with a 16-year-old girl meant to impose a much harsher sentence, a prosecutor said.

Donald Dudley, 44, was accused of having sex with a teenage student while he taught at Brownsboro High School.

Jurors found him guilty of sexual assault of a child, the *Tyler Morning Telegraph* reported.

Smith County District Attorney Matt Bingham said jurors were confused and believed they were sentencing Dudley on Friday to 10 years in prison plus five years of probation.

They apparently misread the sentencing form.

Prosecutors say they will try to appeal the probation sentence.

The student testified that she initiated the relationship by telling Dudley she thought he was attractive. They communicated through text messages, phone calls, e-mails and instant messenger daily before the relationship became sexual, she said.

Former Bexar County bailiff
charged in ticket scam

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — A former Bexar County Sheriff's deputy and a former Southwest Airlines employee have been indicted on federal charges of selling \$1.8 million in stolen tickets to clients that included the district attorney.

James Jackson, 41, his wife, Althea Jackson, 34, and five others were accused of operating a ring that conspired to sell more than 5,000 stolen tickets that Southwest normally provides free to inconvenienced customers and vendors. The Jacksons' are each charged with fraud and conspiracy.

James Jackson was serving as a county bailiff when he resigned in December after being named a target of the investigation.

Althea Jackson is a former Southwest employee whose job included handing out free tickets. She and her husband turned themselves in Friday and were released on \$50,000 bond each, Assistant U.S. Attorney Bill Baumann said.

An attorney for the Jacksons didn't immediately return a phone call seeking comment.

Bexar County District Attorney Susan Reed and Assistant District Attorney

Cliff Herberg were among those who bought tickets but are not expected to be charged. Herberg said he and Reed got the tickets through Reed's chief of security and bodyguard Mark Gudanowski, a former bailiff.

"There's nothing criminal by their actions — my client, (Susan) Reed or Cliff Herberg," said Gudanowski's attorney, Mike McCrum. "They had no idea the tickets were stolen. They just assumed James Jackson had access to legitimate discount tickets through his wife."

The tickets were stolen from the airline over the past three to four years, officials said. Althea Jackson worked at Southwest from January 2001 to September 2005.

Former Lubbock pastor charged
with demanding sex from woman

LEVELLAND (AP) — A 54-year-old former Lubbock pastor has been indicted on charges of compelling prostitution after he allegedly demanded sex from an African woman he brought to the U.S. with the promise of a college education.

James Cornell Clark was indicted Thursday by a Hockley County grand jury. He remained in the Hockley County Jail on Friday on \$150,000 bond.

He does not yet have an attorney, said Shannon Geihlsler, an attorney who has done pro bono work for Clark in the past.

"I've always found him to be very honest and a very benevolent person," she said.

Clark allegedly approached the 21-year-old woman last August while on a trip to Kenya and offered to bring her to the U.S. so she could attend college. He enrolled the woman at South Plains College in Levelland, where officials said she hoped to pursue a nursing degree.

But when she arrived in the U.S. in January, Clark allegedly demanded the woman repay the "loan" he made to her by performing sexual favors, according to court documents. When the woman refused, he threatened to have her deported to Kenya.

Clark was arrested in early April after the woman reported Clark to campus police, Hockley County District Attorney Gary Goff said.

Clark, who was hired by Mt. Vernon Church in 2004, was fired April 6 after officials there learned about the charges against him.

Investigations showed that Clark falsified personal information to pass a back-

ground check before being hired as pastor, said Jimmy Nunn, Lubbock district superintendent for the United Methodist Church.

If convicted of the second-degree felony, Clark could face two to 20 years in prison and fines up to \$10,000.

Appeals court backs
Bush on wiretaps

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal appeals court sided with the Bush administration Friday on an electronic surveillance issue, making it easier to tap into Internet phone calls and broadband transmissions.

The court ruled 2-1 in favor of the Federal Communications Commission, which says equipment using the new technologies must be able to accommodate police wiretaps under the 1994 Communications Assistance for Law Enforcement Act, known as CALEA.

Judge David Sentelle called the agency's reading of the law a reasonable interpretation. In dissent, Judge Harry Edwards said the FCC gutted an exemption for information services that he said covered the Internet and broadband.

The FCC "apparently forgot to read the words of the statute," Edwards wrote.

FCC chairman Kevin Martin said the decision ensures that law enforcement's ability to conduct court-ordered electronic surveillance will keep pace with new technology.

'MySpace' teen returns
from Middle East

DETROIT (AP) — A 16-year-old girl who tricked her parents into getting her a passport and then flew to the Mideast to be with a man she met on MySpace.com has returned to Michigan.

U.S. officials in Jordan persuaded Katherine R. Lester to turn around and go home before she reached the West Bank. Lester arrived at Bishop International Airport in Flint late Friday and was taken to a private area to be reunited with her family.

She disappeared Monday after talking her parents into getting her a passport by saying she was going to Canada with friends, sheriff's officials said.

She apparently planned to visit a man whose MySpace account describes him as a 25-year-old from Jericho, Undersheriff James Jashinske said.

MySpace.com is a social networking Web site with more than 72 million members that lets users post photos, blogs and journals. There have been

scattered accounts of sexual predators targeting minors they met through the site.

More BASE-jumping
laws unlikely in Idaho

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — The jumpers leaping from the Perrine Bridge in Twin Falls free-fall for three seconds before releasing their parachutes during a 486-foot descent.

The bridge is the only manmade location in the United States where so-called BASE jumpers — short for the buildings, antennae, spans and earth from which participants leap — aren't required to get a special permit for year-round jumps.

It also was the scene of four accidents in as many days last month, including one that killed a 34-year-old California woman. Still, officials say they do not have any plans to increase local regulation of the sport.

"We spend more time out on lost snow-mobilers than we ever do on BASE jumping," said Nancy Howell, spokeswoman for the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department. "We're not reassessing anything."

Unlike skydiving, where people jumping out of an airplane have several thousand feet to pull their parachutes, the margin for error in BASE jumping is much narrower. Once they jump, they have only a few seconds to deploy parachutes packed specially to fill with air quickly.

Jack the cat chases bear up tree

WEST MILFORD, N.J. (AP) — A black bear picked the wrong yard for a jaunt, running into a territorial tabby who ran the furry beast up a tree — twice.

Jack, a 15-pound orange and white cat, keeps a close vigil on his property, often chasing small animals, but his owners and neighbors say his latest escapade was surprising.

"We used to joke, 'Jack's on duty,' never knowing he'd go after a bear," owner Donna Dickey told *The Star-Ledger* of Newark for Friday's editions.

Neighbor Suzanne Giovanetti first spotted Jack's accomplishment after her husband saw a bear climb a tree on the edge of their northern New Jersey property on Sunday. Giovanetti thought Jack was simply looking up at the bear, but soon realized the much larger animal was afraid of the hissing cat.

After about 15 minutes, the bear descended and tried to run away, but Jack chased it up another tree.

HARRISON, N.Y. — Vijay Singh was still hard at work on the driving as the sun — yes, the sun — dipped below the trees at soggy Westchester Country Club.

Henin-Hardenne powers past Kuznetsova for 3rd French title

PARIS — Justine Henin-Hardenne stuck to her winning routine in the French Open final. She glided gracefully across the clay, unleashed her picturesque backhand, pumped her fist, shouted "Allez!" and, in the end, claimed another championship.

Henin-Hardenne won her fifth Grand Slam title and her third at Roland Garros, beating Svetlana Kuznetsova 6-4, 6-4 Saturday.

Seeded fifth, the Belgian became the first woman to win consecutive titles at Roland Garros since Steffi Graf in 1995-96, and the first to win three French Open titles in four years since Graf in 1993-96.

Henin-Hardenne also became the first woman to win the title without losing a set since Arantxa Sanchez Vicario in 1994. But the victory didn't come easily.

On the warmest day of the tournament, with temperatures in the 80s under a cloudless sky, the match almost became an endurance contest. Henin-Hardenne looked tired early in the second set and applied a bag of ice to the back of her neck during changeovers.

But she summoned some of her best

tennis in the final few games.

To strengthen the argument that Roger Federer will be remembered as the greatest player ever, he needs to win a French Open title and show he can beat Rafael Nadal.

Federer has a chance to do both Sunday.

"I have created a fabulous opportunity for myself, so we'll see if I can make it good," he said.

The top-ranked Federer earned his first berth in a Roland Garros final Friday, leaving him one win shy of his fourth consecutive Grand Slam title. Advancing a few hours later was Nadal, ranked second and the defending champion.

It shapes up as the match of the year and a collision of streaks. Federer has won 27 consecutive Grand Slam matches, and Nadal has won a record 59 matches in a row on clay.

"It's a nice match, No. 1 and No. 2," Nadal said. "He's one of the best of the history. He's a superstar of the world — not just in tennis, in all sports."

With seven major titles, Federer is well on his way to being ranked with

Terry's value soaring after big Game 1 for Mavs

DALLAS — Jason Terry offered up one heck of a marketing pitch in Game 1 of the NBA finals.

Yes, marketing. See, Terry is a free agent after this season and a performance similar to the one he had in the opener can only help draw more bidders and higher bids.

Terry scored 32 points for the Dallas Mavericks in their 90-80 victory over the Miami Heat on Thursday night, propping up the offense in the first half, then taking over again in the fourth quarter.

He made 13 of 18 shots on a night when Dirk Nowitzki and Josh Howard, Dallas' two leading scorers, were a combined 7-for-28.

"If he's not going to be the hottest free agent, he's going to be one of them," his agent, Dan Fegan, said Friday. "I'm very confident that Jason is going to be in high demand on July 1."

Other big names on the market will include Detroit's Ben Wallace, Sacramento's Bonzi Wells and Atlanta's Al Harrington. Indiana's Peja Stojakovic and Toronto's Mike James have options to become free agents, while Cleveland's Drew Gooden and Denver's Nene will be among the top restricted free agents.

Only Terry, however, can bring the most-recent finals experience — and, if things go as he hopes, some championship buzz.

His looming status rarely has been discussed in Dallas this postseason, either because folks are so certain he'll re-sign or because they're nervous after what happened the

last time the team had a star point guard listening to all suitors.

Steve Nash wound up in Phoenix, swept away by a contract offer he couldn't refuse and one that Mavs owner Mark Cuban wouldn't match. That's what led Dallas to rescue Terry from Atlanta two years ago.

After a bumpy first season, Terry has settled in nicely under the tough love and guidance of coach Avery Johnson.

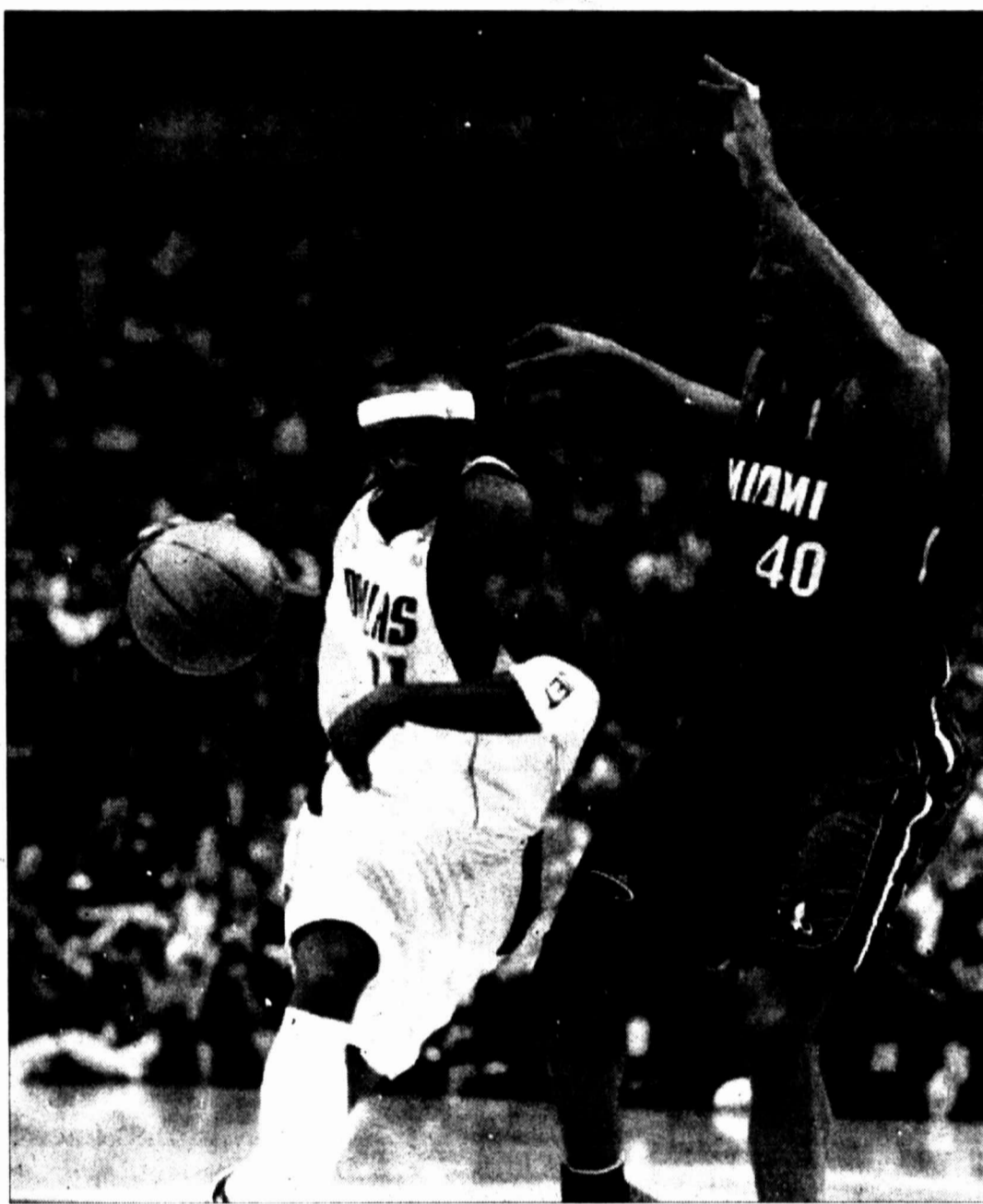
Told to be a scorer first and passer second, Terry was second only to Nowitzki in scoring during the regular season. He'd slipped behind Howard for the postseason, until his strong Game 1 and a poor one by Howard flipped them in the standings. Terry is up to 18.6 points per game in the playoffs, up 1.5 from his regular-season average.

His other big number this season was his salary, around \$7.5 million. With all the offers he might get, there probably won't be a hometown discount for Dallas, but he might consider giving the Mavericks first dibs.

"I love it here," Terry said Friday. "This has been home for me now for two years. It's a great system, great coaching staff, great nucleus, great city."

"Jet," which is both his initials and his nickname, is popular among fans because of his easy smile and quirky routines such as wearing five pairs of socks in every game and sleeping in the opposing team's shorts.

Teammates love him, too. They were unanimous with their support when he was suspended from Game 6 of the San Antonio series for a low blow on Michael Finley. Terry's clutch shooting

and work ethic have earned the respect of the two key figures in the Dallas locker room: Nowitzki and Johnson. At times, their praise is so high that it could be mistaken for a recruiting pitch.

The front office loves him, too. Team president of basketball operations Donnie Nelson called Terry "invaluable" in the team's transition from the

Nash-led offensive era to Johnson's new style, which is capable of winning with scoring or defense.

"We have every intention to continue to make him part of what we and he have built here over the last few years," Nelson said Friday. "Look at the kind of shoes he had to fill, and the fact he did it in his own way. He's taken that challenge

and taken it to new heights and new levels. That's really a testament to the kind of player and person he is."

Nelson laughed at the notion that Terry made a few extra million dollars with his performance Thursday night.

"When you make a decision, you look at the entire body of work," Nelson said. "But it certainly doesn't hurt."

Jason Terry's 32 points carried the Mavs, but many of their flaws were centered on Nowitzki, who scored just 16 points — none in the fourth quarter — in his finals debut. Dallas encountered this problem earlier in the playoffs: Though Nowitzki raised his star to an elite level in the postseason, he also disappeared on occasion.

The Mavericks didn't have trouble getting the ball to Nowitzki, but he lacked the offensive aggression of his best games — and his beautiful jumper wasn't falling. With too few easy baskets, Dallas couldn't force a quicker tempo on the Heat, instead adapting its game to match its opponent for the fourth time in this postseason.

So the Heat shut down Nowitzki, played at their

own tempo, got 28 points from an ailing Wade and became the first team to outscore Dallas in the playoffs — and still lost. Like Wade's legs, they faltered in the fourth quarter, never raising their games to a level befitting the finals.

"We've got more to give than that," said guard Gary Payton, among Miami's three reserves who combined for just two points. "We don't panic. We made mistakes that we won't make again."

Miami's struggles were exacerbated by the lowest free-throw percentage in finals history — although that statistic really just highlights Miami's passive offense, not the Heat's season-long struggles at the line.

O'Neal, who had 17 points, was even worse

DALLAS (AP) — Dwyane Wade is used to the spotlight by now, of course. He's an All-Star, has starred in a number of commercials, been selected to People Magazine's 50 Most Beautiful, and so on.

But nothing, he said, really prepared him for the spectacle that was Game 1 of the NBA finals.

"Leading up to it, before the game, it felt like an All-Star Game, you know, with everything going on," Wade said. "You know, you're being introduced out on like a stage kind of. But when the ball went up for tip, it was a regular game. It felt like a regular game to us from that point."

Wade wasn't alone in his sentiment of happiness that now the teams — with plenty of finals rookies on either side — know what to expect from the pregame craziness.

Mavs forward Dirk Nowitzki felt exactly the same way, even making the same All-Star atmosphere analogy that Wade used.

"We're all happy it's behind us," Nowitzki said. "Nobody was really on such a big stage yet in his career. ... So I think it's good to get the first one out of the way."

Hard to believe — because at that precise moment, his nation's soc-

guy anyway."

The Miami Heat drew first blood when O'Neal opened Stackhouse's cut with a hard foul, but the Mavericks recovered for a sloppy 90-80 victory that left both teams frustrated, disappointed and desperate to play better. In their franchises' first trips to the finals, they both had hoped for something more memorable from their opener.

But with two days off before Game 2 on Sunday night, Miami coach Pat Riley and Dallas' Avery Johnson seemed confident they've got time to manage the mountain of mistakes and mangled game plans left from the opener.

For starters, both coach-

ers are determined to get starring efforts from their star players — because Dirk Nowitzki, O'Neal and Dwyane Wade all left ample room for improvement after Game 1.

"The key is not to have two games like that in a row," said O'Neal, who also left Nowitzki holding an aching jaw thanks to an errant elbow. "So I'll be hard on myself these next two days, and then hopefully on Sunday, I could play a little bit better."


The game was no classic, but fans still tuned in: After improved ratings throughout the first three playoff rounds, early numbers for Game 1 were up from last year's opener between Detroit and San Antonio.

While cooling down after a light practice at their arena, the

Mavericks acknowledged they felt the pressure of the sellout crowd and a generation of long-suffering Dallas fans anticipating this first shot at a title. Of course, they're always aware of high expectations when their boss, owner Mark Cuban, is sitting near them, peering into the huddle — and now blogging about their play during the game.

"I think they've gotten it out of their system now," Johnson said. "We had some jitters ... and they know we didn't play a perfect game. We obviously have a lot of room for improvement. We didn't meet our goals offensively and defensively."

"I'm glad they didn't have much of a bounce in their step (Friday). We had a pretty lengthy film session and had a chance to look at some stuff."

Delasin gets gallery, LPGA Championship clubhouse lead

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md. — Dorothy Delasin is a four-time winner on the LPGA Tour, so she knows what it's like to play before a gallery. She hasn't won in nearly three years, so she has played rounds that feel like Saturday morning at municipal course.

She prefers the crowd — even if it's not there for her.

Playing the first two days with Michelle Wie, Delasin surged into a big lead with five birdies over a six-hole stretch before stumbling over the final

four holes for a 1-under 71 that made her the clubhouse leader in the rain-delayed LPGA Championship.

"I never played with her before," said Delasin, who was at 6-under 138. "The crowd was fine. I love playing in crowds. When I was winning, leading tournaments, the crowds were the same, so it wasn't a big deal. I like having people watching, whether they're watching me or Michelle or anybody."

Having Delasin around paid off for Wie, too.

She came to the conclusion that putts really do go in the

hole every now and then, and Wie started making enough of her own to post a 4-under 68 to finish one shot behind Delasin, along with three other players.

Where that leaves them at the end of the second round remains to be seen.

Blue skies gave way to dark clouds, the rumble of thunder and heavy rain that caused a five-hour delay Friday, meaning Annika Sorenstam and 69 other players were to return at 8 a.m. Saturday to finish the second round.

Sorenstam was at 3 under through eight holes and ready to get some rest, facing 28 holes

on Saturday.

Pat Hurst was at 8 under through 10 holes when play was stopped, while Christina Kim was at 6 under and facing an 8-foot par putt on the ninth hole when they resume.

"So far, so good," Hurst said.

It could have been better for Delasin. Her string of birdies pushed her to 10 under par, leading by as many as four shots. But she hooked her tee shot into the woods at No. 6, couldn't get back to the fairway and took double bogey. On the par-5 eighth, she chunked a chip from a sodded divot and wound up making bogey on one

of the easiest holes at Bulle Rock.

She had to settle for a one-shot lead among those who finished, but few complaints.

"Just hit a few bad swings," Delasin said.

Wie still didn't get much out of another superb game from the tee box and fairways. She was poised to get into the lead when she hit a knockdown 6-iron up the hill and into a stiff breeze into 10 feet, but missed the birdie putt. And she was 30 feet away, pin-high and just off the green on the par-5 eighth, until hitting a pedestrian chip and missing the 6-foot birdie.

Bodine passes Skinner on last lap to claim Sam's Town 400

FORT WORTH — Mike Skinner still hasn't finished out front in Texas.

Skinner started on the pole at Texas for the fourth straight time, a NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series record, and led 113 laps. But Todd Bodine led the only one that mattered — the last one, passing Skinner for his only lead and the victory Friday night.

Bodine made the winning pass on what was an extra lap at the Sam's Town 400 because of a late caution that erased the 4 1/2-second lead Skinner had built. The final margin was .116 seconds, the closest finish for a Texas truck race.

"All the circumstances fell the way they had to for us to pull this off,"

Bodine said. "When the caution came out at the end, I knew we had a chance then."

It was Bodine's 10th career victory and third this season in his Toyota. Bodine has won three of the last four Texas races, also beating Skinner last November.

Skinner dominated the Friday race scheduled for 167 laps, leading four times. He put his Toyota in front for the last time when he drove past Rick Crawford on the backstretch of the 113th lap, then built what seemed to be an insurmountable lead over Crawford and Bodine.

"I was in pretty good shape," Skinner said. "I'm pretty disappointed."

Then Jack Sprague spun out on lap 162 and brought out the seventh caution. By time the race

restarted, it was a green-white-checker finish and Bodine had fresher tires than Skinner.

Skinner maintained his lead on lap 167, but right after crossing the start-finish line, Bodine went around the outside for the lead and was able to hold on out of the final turn.

"I got that run and never checked up," Bodine said.

"If he can pass me on the outside, he deserves this thing. We were wide open," Skinner said. "That's all we had with our Tundra tonight. He just had a little more grip with a couple to go."

Bodine, who won with an average speed of 132.129 mph, had been a lap down before the race's fifth caution. Bodine got back on the lead lap after Kerry Earnhardt's accident on lap 101.

cer team was in a World Cup game.

When the Dallas Mavericks opened their public practice, the World Cup opener between Germany and Costa Rica was in the 76th minute, the host nation — Nowitzki's homeland — clinging to a 3-2 lead before 66,000 anxious fans in Munich.

Nowitzki, unaware of the game situation, coolly went through his routine of short jumpers and interacting with teammates. But soon, the Germans would finish off a 4-2 win — and Nowitzki, upon getting that news from a messenger in the hallway behind the game court, clapped repeatedly and pumped his fist.

"Obviously, a big and a great start for us, especially at home, get the crowd going," Nowitzki said. "But I didn't hear about it until I got to the gym. It wasn't like I couldn't sleep, or the first thing I woke up I had to check e-mail or anything like that, but I was happy to hear that we won."

It's obviously been a good two days for Nowitzki; his Mavericks beat the Miami Heat 90-80 in Game 1 of the NBA finals Thursday night, finishing that game only a few hours before his German countrymen opened World Cup play halfway around the globe.

It wasn't because his team is trailing the Dallas Mavericks 1-0 in the best-of-seven NBA finals, which resume Sunday. Haslem said he simply stopped

He did say, though, that he was receiving plenty of calls and text messages from well-wishers, commemorating his big day.

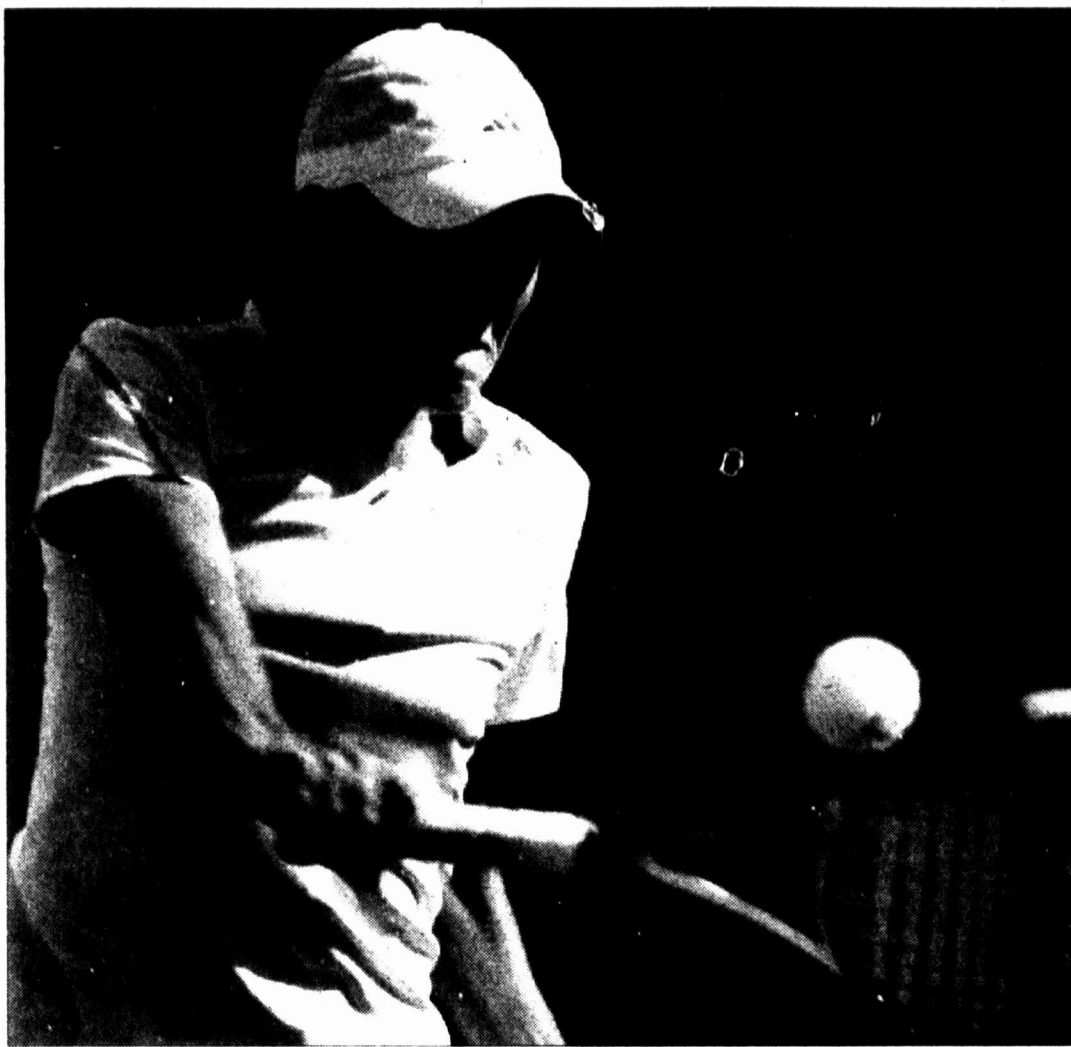

the game's greats. Achieving a career Slam would elevate his status, because only five other players have done it.

He would also become only the third man to hold all four Grand Slam titles at the same time, joining Don Budge and Rod Laver.

"If I win the tournament, it will be something special, because I'll be winning two things at the same time," Federer said.

He's 7-0 in Grand Slam finals, but this is the first time the opponent has been his nemesis, Nadal. The Spaniard leads their rivalry 5-1 and has won four in a row, including their meeting in the semifinals at Roland Garros a year ago.

Federer is 0-3 against Nadal this year and 44-0 against everyone else. Nadal shrugged when asked the key to his success against the world's No. 1 player.

"I don't know," he said. "I only play my 100 percent. If I don't play my best, I'm going to lose, for sure."

Nadal's game matches up well against Federer in part because he's a left-hander who hits with heavy topspin. That allows him to hit crosscourt forehands that bounce high and cause problems for Federer, the shot sometimes overpowering his one-handed backhand.

But Federer has been tweaking his tactics and closing the gap. The last time

they met was in the Rome final on clay last month, when Federer held two match points before losing a fifth-set tiebreaker. The match lasted more than five hours.

"I'm feeling good enough and knowing that I'm playing well," Federer said. "I've got to play like I did in Rome. That seemed that was the way to go at it."

Federer will need to play better than he did Friday, when he lost the first set against No. 3-seeded David Nalbandian and trailed 3-0 in the second. Federer rallied and led 3-6, 6-4, 5-2 when Nalbandian retired with an injured abdominal muscle.

Nadal defeated No. 4 Ivan Ljubicic to seal the marquee matchup. The last time Nos. 1 and 2 met for the men's title at Roland Garros was in 1984, when Ivan Lendl beat top-ranked John McEnroe.

"Not only are we No. 1 and No. 2 in the world, but also, let's say, the best two on clay right now," Federer said.

While it's the first time they've met in a Grand Slam final, it's likely not the last. Nadal's hard court game is still evolving, but he beat Federer on the surface at Dubai in March and will pose a threat at the U.S. Open.

"A number of persons are saying that he can only play on clay, but they have absolutely no idea of tennis," Federer said. "Those also who say I can't play on clay, they don't understand tennis either."

He can show them Sunday.

is winless in 21 starts since the Buick Open last July.

He does have six top-nine finishes this year, including a playoff loss to Stuart Appleby in the Mercedes Championships, and is in position for his third Westchester victory as he prepares for the U.S. Open next week at nearby Winged Foot.

"This golf course has given me a lot of things in the past," said Singh, the 1993 and 1995 champion on the hilly, tree-lined course. "Hopefully, this is the start of my comeback, you might say. I don't know what it is, but it's a good feeling to come back here and play well."

Singh made a 45-foot eagle putt on the par-5 ninth and birdied the short, par-4 10th to tie for the lead at 6 under. He also birdied No. 14 and took the outright lead at 8 under with a 6-foot birdie putt on the par-5 18th.

"The eagle on No. 9 really relaxed me and just gave me a really good mood to go out there and play relaxed golf on the back nine," Singh said.

Howell followed his opening 66 with a 68 to match Singh at 8 under. "I like the course and I'm playing well," said Howell, the English star who tops the European tour money list and Ryder Cup standings. "The best preparation for the U.S. Open is to have your game in shape and I'm doing that this week."

Fredrik Jacobson shot a 68 to finish at 7 under, and 1991 winner Billy Andrade (70) and Joey Sindelar (68) were another stroke back.

First-round leader Adam Scott had a 72 to drop into a tie for sixth at 5 under with Luke Donald (65), Brett Quigley (66), Geoff Ogilvy (68), Frank Lickliter (67), Arron Oberholser (69), Kevin Sutherland (67) and Ben Crane (66).

Because of the wet conditions after nearly 5 inches of rain in a week, the players were allowed to lift, clean and

place their balls in the fairways.

"We saw the sun," Andrade said. "I think that's the first thing that was pretty neat when we got here this morning, that it was going to be a nice day. The wind was blowing a little bit, but playing the ball up again was an advantage."

Masters champion Phil Mickelson was 2 under after his second straight 70.

"I'm trying to play a similar way to what I would play at the U.S. Open and not miss balls in spots where you can't get up and down," Mickelson said. "I played a lot better today than I did yesterday, even though the scores were the same. If I can just get a couple of putts to fall, I think tomorrow is going to be a good round."

Many of the pins were set on high spots because of the possibility of more rain.

"It's tricky," Ogilvy said. "Back pins are very awkward here with short irons because the ball spins so much and the greens slope so much back to front."

More rain fell Friday night, a few minutes after Singh wrapped up his twilight practice session.

Divots: Sergio Garcia, the 2001 and 2004 winner, withdrew after nine holes, citing a back injury. He was 3 over for 27 holes. "I hope to rest and be at or near 100 percent next week at the U.S. Open," Garcia said. ... 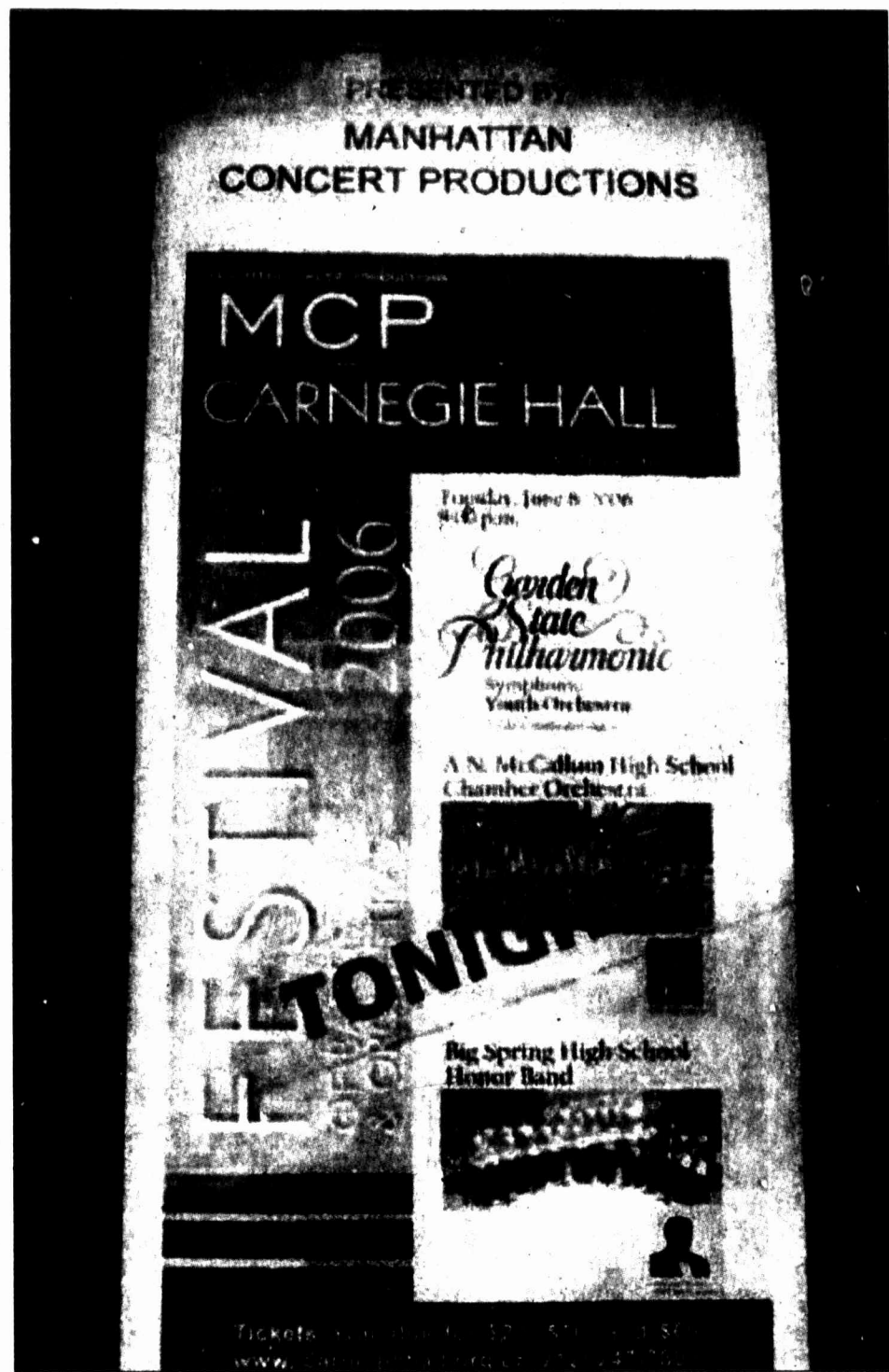

It's a man's world no longer

Women flock to do-it-herself home projects

Catherine Reynolds makes needlepoint pillows and a mean cherry pie. She can also gut a kitchen, knock out a wall and build a patio.

"Some projects are difficult," the 38-year-old schoolteacher said, "but it's not rocket science."

Reynolds — who is remodeling her fourth home — and other women are strapping on tool belts, plugging in power saws and tackling projects head-on. It's not just because men are bonding with their Barcaloungers. In many American homes, the man of the house doesn't exist.

Single women bought 21 percent of all homes sold last year, or 1.76 million properties, according to the National Association of Realtors. That's up from 14 percent a decade ago. (Single men, by comparison, accounted for 9 percent of the market last year.)

It's a noteworthy change, given that as recently as the early 1970s, it was tough for a single woman to secure a mortgage.

Start-up entrepreneurs and big businesses alike — including Home Depot, Ace Hardware and Lowe's

— have taken notice and are working to tap that buying power with enticements such as "do-it-herself" workshops and tools made for smaller hands. One industry group found that women account for more than 40 percent of home improvement product sales.

Reynolds' tool collection was skimpy when she started buying property in 1996: pliers, screwdrivers and her grandfather's hammer, which she kept tucked away in a closet. Her first home, in Denver, was a "surface remodel" — changing flooring, window coverings and countertops.

Her second Denver home, which she bought for \$132,000, was a challenge. She ripped out walls, replaced the wood floor and gutted the kitchen. It sold for \$210,000 after 2 1/2 days on the market.

Reynolds, who is single and has since moved to Austin, Texas, says she feels free to buy and remodel at will. Her students are learning from her example.

"When I go to school with paint under my fingernails or chalk in my hair, they understand," she said.

So would a lot of other women. Divorce pitched Allegra

Bennett into the world of home improvement 15 years ago.

When her husband moved out, it was their house that had "a breakdown," Bennett said. Although the Baltimore resident considered herself a "home repair ignoramus," she couldn't stomach paying handymen \$75 "just to show up." So she became a "serial fixer."

Now she is the publisher of *Renovating Woman*, a do-it-herself magazine.

Nonetheless, Bennett was stunned at the response to her first home

improvement workshop, which she held in April. She was expecting 160 women, but 300 showed up.

"Our jaws dropped, as did the jaws of the sponsor, who thought it was a 'cute idea' but didn't really understand the pent-up need," she said.

It wasn't a cutesy crowd. The women wanted to know how to reset a toilet and replace a faucet. And when does a basin wrench come in handy?

"It was like giving them the secret handshake" to a mysterious society,

Bennett said.

Certainly, men led the charge in the nation's do-it-yourself frenzy, which boosted spending on home improvement products to \$215 billion in 2005, according to the Home Improvement Research Institute in Tampa, Fla. The industry is expected to grow 5 percent this year. In 2003, when the group last tracked sales by gender, women accounted for about 43 percent of the market.

The craze dates to the 1980s, when "This Old House" on television

struck a chord with viewers, said Renae Bredin, a women's studies professor at California State University, Fullerton. Although the PBS program was aimed at men, women watched too. Then, Martha Stewart began helping women "reimagine" their involvement with their homes.

"If Martha could build her own chicken coop, I could do it too," Bredin said. "I think what we're seeing now is the next step in the progression."

But some women say See **JANES**, Page 6C

Many Americans headed for money struggles in retirement

WASHINGTON — Almost one in two American families are headed toward years of financial struggle in retirement, according to a new report that says workers are unprepared for cuts in pension and Social Security income.

The Boston College study presumes that most people need to replace 65 percent to 85 percent of their annual income in their working years to stay secure in retirement. But 43 percent of U.S. households will fall at least 10 percent short of that range, the study found, using what it said were conservative projections.

The percentage of households at risk of an insecure retirement rises to 66 percent under a less rosy set of assumptions — for example, if workers retire at age 63, instead of at 65.

"Unless Americans

change their ways, many will struggle in retirement," said Alicia H. Munnell, director of the study and a former mem-

ber of the White House Council of Economic Advisers. "There is no silver bullet," she added. "The answer is saving more and working longer."

Saying it hoped to draw attention to the issue, Boston College unveiled a new National Retirement

Risk Index based on survey data from 4,500 households in the Federal Reserve's 2004 Survey of Consumer Finances. Researchers calculated that the risk index has risen from 31 percent in 1983 to 43 percent in 2004.

Baby boomers born between 1946 and 1964 are generally in better shape than members of Generation X, born between 1965 and 1972, the report said. That's primarily because these younger workers face the prospect of diminished Social Security income, and fewer of them will have pensions.

"Americans weaned on post-war affluence have come to expect an extended period of leisure at the end of their work life," the report noted. "And, indeed, the majority of today's retirees are able to afford a decent retirement. However, this group is living in a 'golden age' that will fade as

it's still tough getting the guys in the hardware store to take them seriously. In fact, it remains largely a "hairy-knuckle industry," said Pam Melton, president of the networking group Women in the Hardware Industry. Edén Jarrin and Heidi Baker know something about the shortcomings of the business — and its promise. They co-founded Be Jane, a Burbank, Calif.-based media firm that encourages women to "be Janes of all trades" by tackling home improvement projects.

"We hear this all the time: 'Oh, honey, you can't do that, you need to hire someone,'" said Baker, 37. Be Jane is growing. In addition to operating its Web site, www.bejane.com, the company produces magazine articles, videos, interactive CDs and other merchandise, all geared to the female homeowner. In 2004, Be Jane scraped in only \$12,000. This year the firm anticipates revenue of several million dollars, said Jarrin, who is 30. Lynda Lyday of Los Angeles is pushing a line of tools designed to fit smaller hands. But breaking into the big leagues is tough for small players, especially as the competi-

tion in this niche intensifies. "I could have gotten a plane off the ground faster," she said. Even the industry big boys are hustling to keep pace. Lowe's Cos., the Mooresville, N.C.-based home improvement retailer, said it has brightened its stores and installed lower shelving, motivated by research saying that about 95 percent of female homeowners consider themselves do-it-yourselfers. Ace Hardware Corp. launched an "Elements of Style" program in February, after polling showed that its female customers, on average, spent twice as much as men. "The husband's coming in for the nails and plunger, but his wife is on the other side of the

store saying, 'We need to pick up more hardware or faucets,' and suddenly it's into a whole room remodel," said Hilary Bloch, who buys decorative plumbing for the Oakbrook, Ill.-based chain. Atlanta-based Home Depot Inc. presents "Do It Herself" workshops that have attracted 280,000 women to its stores in three years. Some women believe the big chains still have plenty to learn. Shannon Tucker calls Home Depot "Home Don't Know" to express her dissatisfaction with its customer service. The 46-year-old paralegal renovated her Atlanta condo a step at a time, building confidence

as she worked her way up to the kitchen, where she installed countertops, laid tile and put a window over the sink. Tucker figures she saved as much as \$7,000. "I feel I could do just about anything now," she said. Stories such as Tucker's inspired Jarrin and Baker to write their book, "Be Jane's Guide to Home Empowerment," which they say will be available in December. Knocking down a wall, it seems, opens up all kinds of possibilities. Suddenly, Jarrin said, women start asking: "What else in my life can I take on that I didn't think was possible?"

tic information is readily accessible. By combining four markers of cardiovascular disease in one test panel, the 15-minute diagnostic test is intended to provide physicians

with a fast and convenient means of assessing chest pain patients for a variety of conditions in order to potentially enable earlier therapeutic intervention or disease rule-out. An estimated six million Americans visit hospital emergency rooms each year with chest pain, but all patients with chest pain are not having heart attacks.

Conversely, some patients experience heart attacks without having the typical clinical presentation of chest pain. The addition of cardiac marker testing can play a critical role in helping physicians diagnose heart attacks, allowing appropriate treatment to be started in a timely manner and improving outcomes for patients.

Baby Boomers and Generation Xers reach traditional retirement ages in the coming decades. The study is the latest addition to a growing body of research that suggests households headed by working-age adults are poorly prepared to meet their financial needs of retirement. In April, the Employee Benefit Research Institute cautioned that many Americans "have accumulated only modest retirement savings, under-estimate the share of their pre-retirement income they are likely to need in retirement, and have made no estimate of how much they will need to live comfortably once they retire." The institute said that people's expectations for retirement are "like a piece of Swiss cheese — full of holes." The Boston College report said the grim outlook is being driven by a variety of factors, including: — Social Security will replace a smaller share of people's pre-retirement income in the future. The reasons include increased taxation of benefits and higher Medicare premiums. In addition, the retirement age for full benefits will increase to 67 for people born after 1959, up

from 65 now. — Companies have abandoned costly traditional pensions, which guarantee monthly income for life, in favor of contributions to individual 401(k) plans overseen by the employees themselves. In 2004, the typical older worker nearing retirement had just \$60,000 in 401(k) and individual retirement accounts, a sum that would yield less than \$400 per month in retirement, according to the researchers. — People save too little. "Most of the working age population saves virtually nothing outside of their employer-sponsored pension plan," according to the report. — Retirement lasts longer as longevity increases. The price tag of retirement goes up with its increased duration, particularly for health-care expenses. At the same time, future retirees may find it difficult to make their nest eggs grow through investing, the researchers said. On the hopeful side, the picture can change significantly by working longer and saving more. For example, retiring at 67 instead of 65 reduces a household's risk by 11 percentage points, the report found. Saving more also can help a person's long-term outlook, particularly if the added savings start when a worker is young. "If workers consistently set aside 6 percent of their paychecks (with a

3 percent employer match) invest prudently, and leave the money alone, they should have enough," the report said. At the same time, a recent report by consulting firm McKinsey & Co. found that four out of 10 workers are forced to retire earlier than they intended, usually because of health issues or loss of their job. Meanwhile, those employees still lucky enough to have pensions may get less than they expected. In a separate report issued Tuesday, financial rating company Standard & Poor's said federal employee programs are short roughly \$4.5 trillion of the money they need to make good on their pension promises. In addition, companies in the Standard & Poor's 500 stock index have about \$140.4 billion less set aside than the amount they're expected to need, S&P said. That's an improvement over 2004, when pension plans were \$164.3 billion short. However, corporations have fallen further behind in funding so-called "other post retirement benefits" which include retiree health care programs. These programs are now \$320.9 billion short of what they need to back promises made to retirees, senior analyst Howard Silverblatt said. That's likely to lead to cutbacks and caps that retirees may not have planned for, he said.

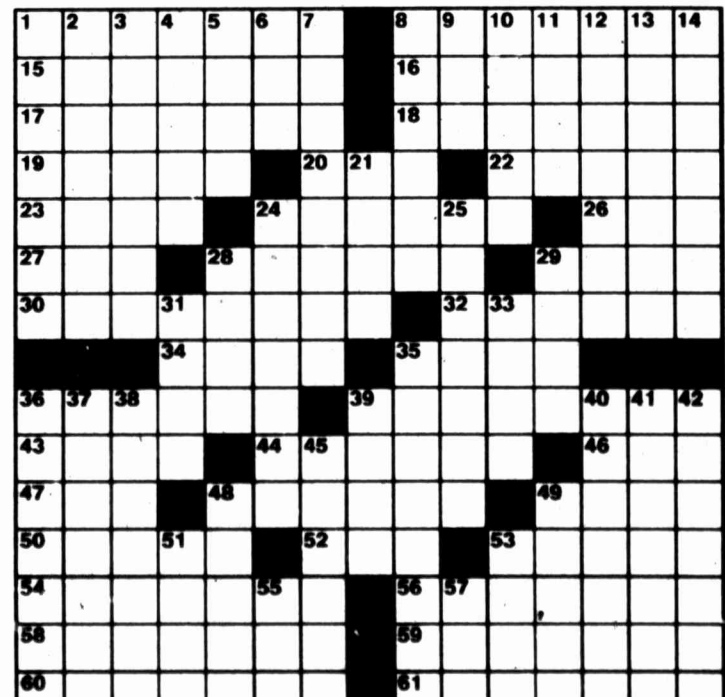

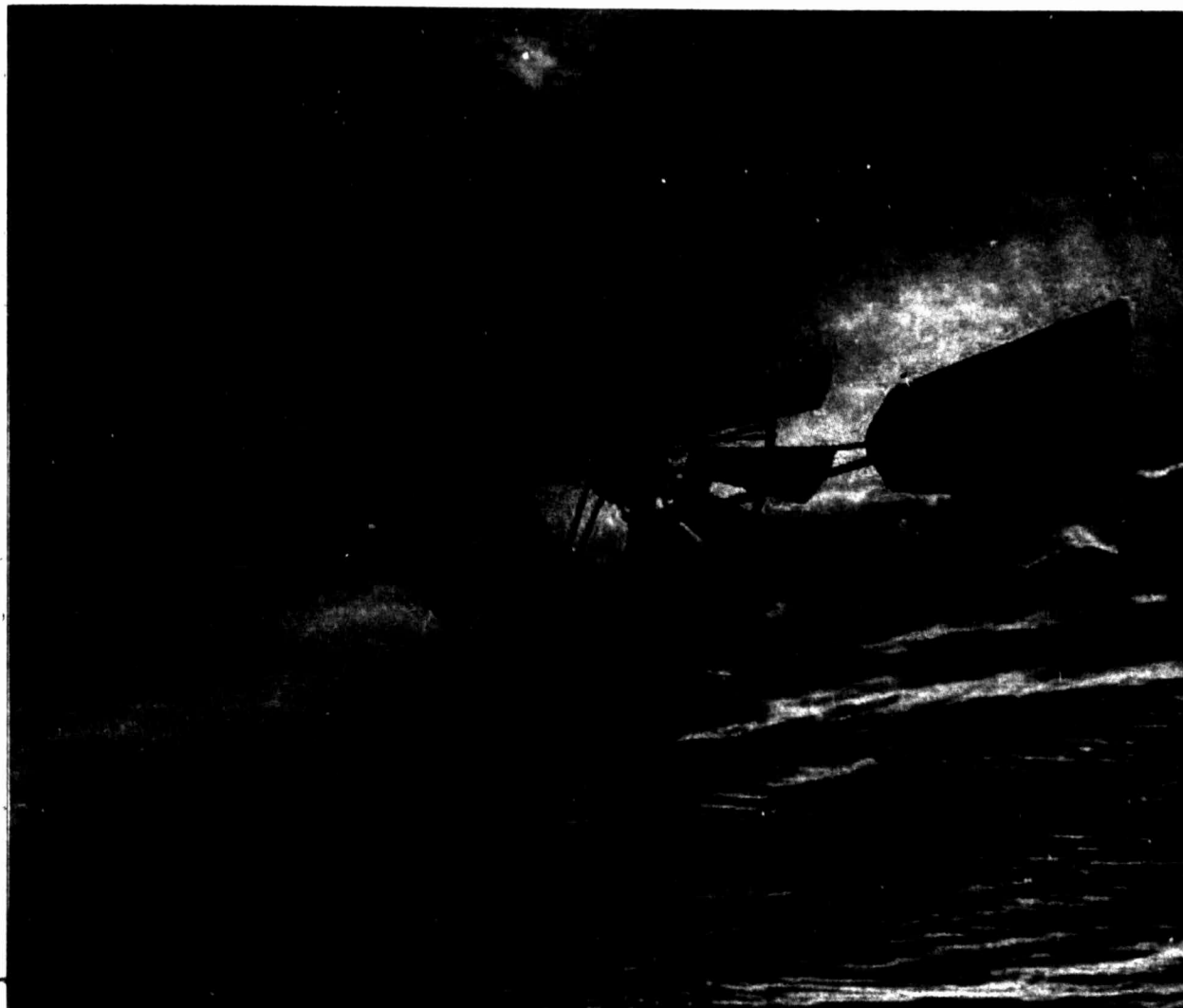

Kind of scary, but not why you might suspect

Not since Salman Rushdie's religious opus "Satanic Verses" stirred the inky waters of the literary community have I seen as many people up in arms as there are now — all ready to denounce and throw down "The Da Vinci Code" by Dan Brown.

With more than 50 million copies sold across the globe, the book that began as nothing more than a quiet murmur among religious scholars and historians has exploded into a world of controversy and finger pointing.

Backed by a movie starring Tom Hanks — who is as likely a candidate for the book's lead character, Robert Langdon, as Elmer Fudd — the buzz and debate is everywhere we turn.

Water cooler questions that used to center around television shows like "Nip Tuck" and "The OC" now debate whether Jesus was a creation of divinity or a mortal man with an amazing message.

Of course, I doubt people were getting things — namely punches — thrown at them while discussing "Nip Tuck."

First, let's talk a little about the book itself.

The search for the Holy Grail is one of the most intriguing enigmas of history, art and fiction. Speculation as to its location, its meaning, even its existence have fueled the imaginations of artists, writers, rulers and clerics for centuries.

Dan Brown's "The Da Vinci Code" is a stunning thriller that presents a new slant on the meaning of the very nature of this vessel, which was purported to hold the blood of Christ.

That's right. The book everyone has been debating and losing their minds

over is a work of fiction. You know ... make believe. A story.

Harvard symbologist Robert Langdon is in Paris on business when he receives an urgent midnight call at his hotel from the Paris Judicial Police. The man he had planned to meet with the next day, a curator of the Louvre, has

been found murdered in the Grand Gallery of the world's most famous art museum. Langdon has been summoned apparently because of his connection to the victim and his knowledge of ancient symbols.

He is rushed to the scene to find Jacques Sauniere's body lying spread eagled and naked with a pentagram painted on his torso. He is told that Sauniere apparently painted the symbol on his own chest and arranged his body in the bizarre position before he died of a gunshot wound to the abdomen.

Langdon's expertise in symbology and his acquaintance with the curator are called upon to help decipher the motive and

help police find the killer. Now, I really hate to spoil a great literary surprise or mystery for my readers, so if you haven't already

was married — to Mary Magdalene, no less — who bore him a child following his crucifixion.

Of course, the whole premise is pretty hard for most Christians to swallow. And, honestly, I can't say I blame anyone for taking a step back

when it comes to these theories, especially after a life time of reading Holy scripture.

So, how does Leonardo Da Vinci fit into this whole mystery?

A prankster and genius, Da Vinci is widely believed to have hidden secret messages within much of his artwork. Most scholars agree that even Da Vinci's most famous pieces — works like The Mona Lisa, The Last Supper and Madonna of the Rocks — contain startling anomalies that all seem to be whispering the same cryptic message... a message that hints at a shocking historical secret which allegedly has been guarded since 1099 by a European secret society known as

the Priory of Sion.

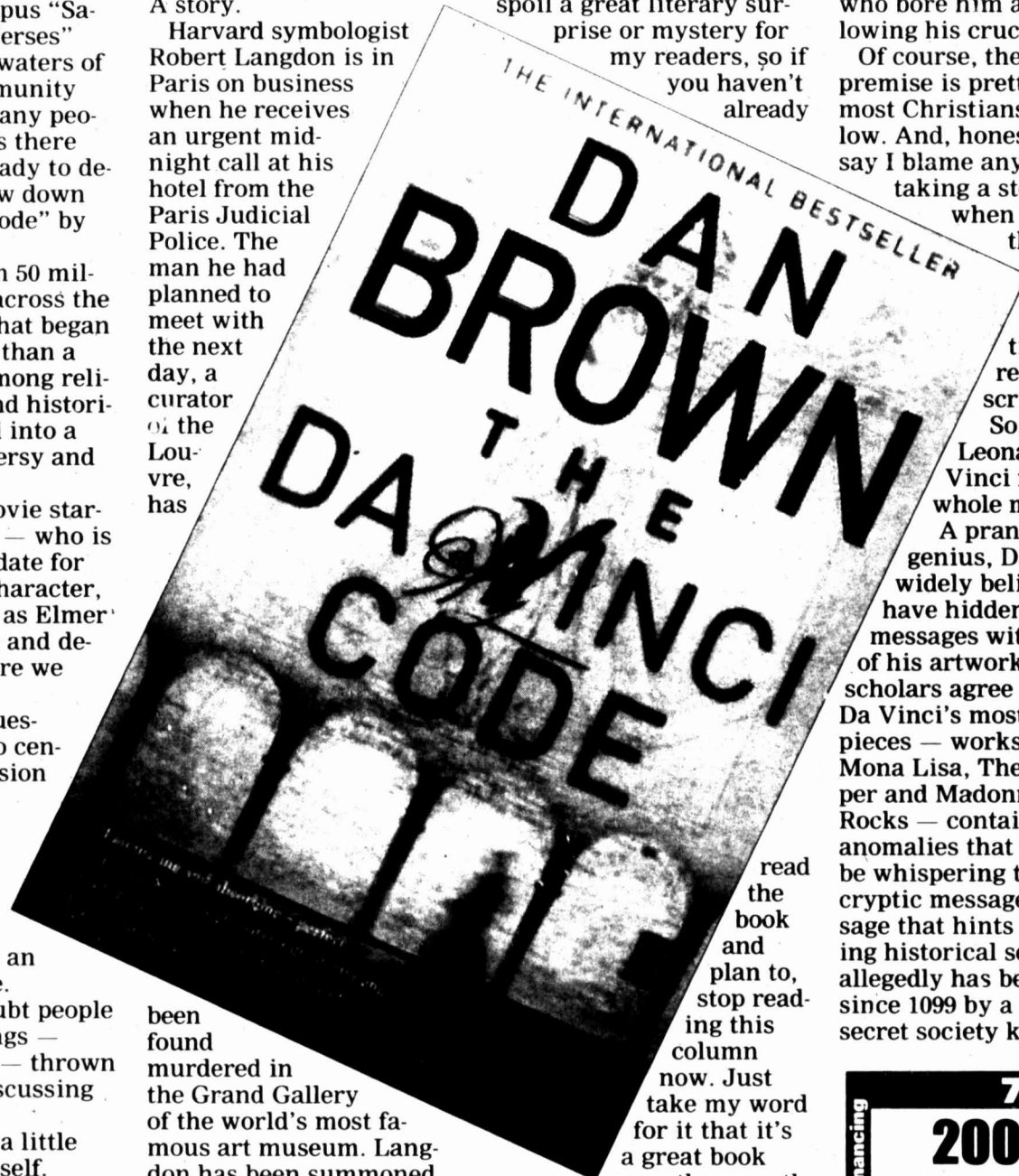
In 1975, Paris's Bibliothèque Nationale discovered parchments known as Les Dossiers Secrets, identifying numerous members of the Priory of Sion, including Sir Isaac Newton, Victor Hugo, Botticelli, and Leonardo Da Vinci.

Da Vinci's original commission for his famous Madonna of the Rocks came from an organization known as the Confraternity of the Immaculate Conception, which needed a painting for the centerpiece of an altar triptych in their church of San Francesco Grand in Milan.

The nuns gave Leonardo specific dimensions and a desired theme — the Virgin Mary, baby John The Baptist, Uriel, and Baby Jesus sheltering in a cave. Although Da Vinci did as they requested, when he delivered the work, the group reacted with horror.

The painting contained several disturbing "un-Christian" anomalies, which seemed to convey a hidden message and alternative meaning. Da Vinci eventually mollified the confraternity by painting them a second version of

Review: 'Cars'

There are no human characters in "Cars," but few movies this year will have more humanity. As in the "Toy Story" movies, and "Finding Nemo," "Cars" demonstrates Pixar Animation Studios' ability to invest rag dolls and tow trucks with deeply human traits. "Cars" cast of characters has a selfish race car named Lightning (voiced by Owen Wilson); Doc, an older speedster who's melancholy about life passing him by (Paul Newman); Sally, a Porsche who chose life in the slow lane (Bon-

Madonna of the Rocks, which now hangs in London's National Gallery under the name Virgin of the Rocks. Da Vinci's original hangs at the Louvre in Paris.

Also drawn into Brown's tale is a chapel in Great Britain that contains a ceiling from which hundreds of stone blocks protrude, jutting down to form a bizarre multi-faceted surface. Each block is carved with a symbol, seemingly at random, creating a cipher of unfathomable proportion.

Modern cryptographers have never been able to break this code, and a generous reward is offered to anyone who can decipher the baffling message.

"Cars" is rated G, and there's nothing racier than some mild auto erotica between Lightning and two fans, but it strikes me as the most adult-oriented of all the Pixar films. Its themes — respect for the past, the simple pleasures that can be appreciated if you slow down once in a while, the importance of thinking about others and of keeping your word — are the kinds of things that tend to make kids scramble for their PSPs when Grand-

So, having read the book and done several hours of research on the matter myself, what is the real truth of the matter?

The truth is this. It's a book, people. A well-written book that theorizes on an ancient idea. A *fictional* book that bases much of its research and scenery in hard fact — Da Vinci's art, hidden chambers in famous chapels, the Dead Sea Scrolls — all in an effort to entertain the reader.

If man has anything to fear from this book or the subsequent film, it's that women will get hold of it and see the big picture the story presents, that women got the short end of the stick when man wrote the Bible and began shaping society as we know it today.

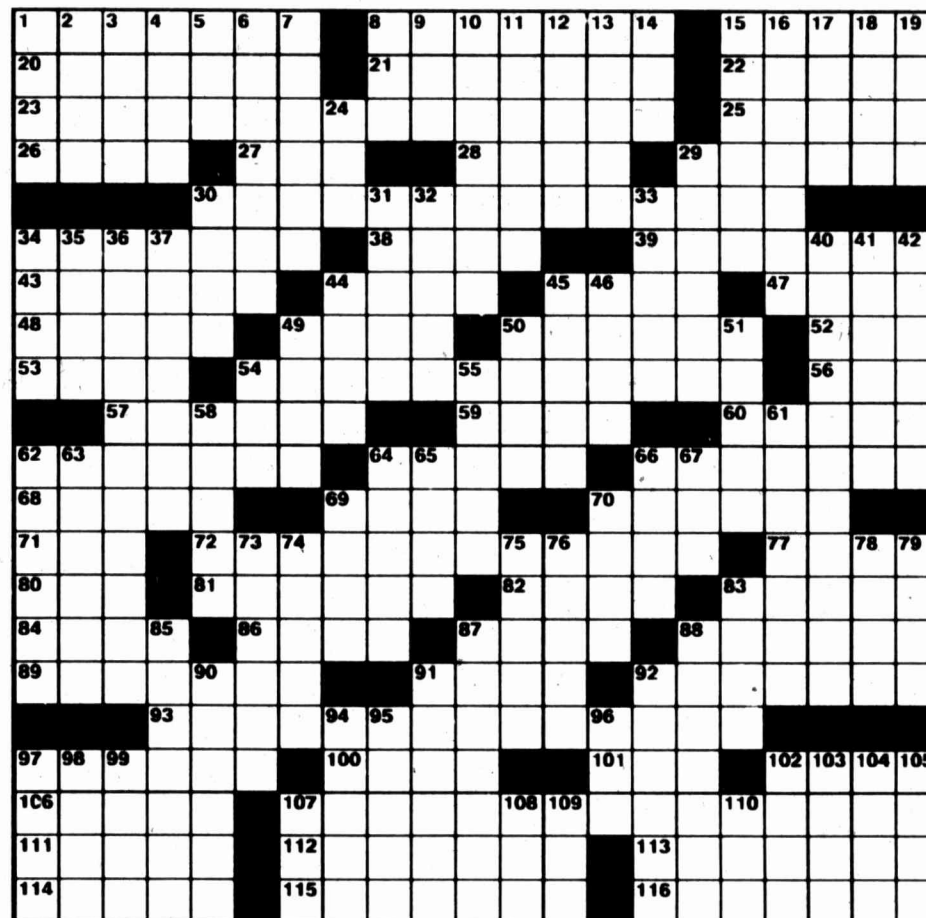

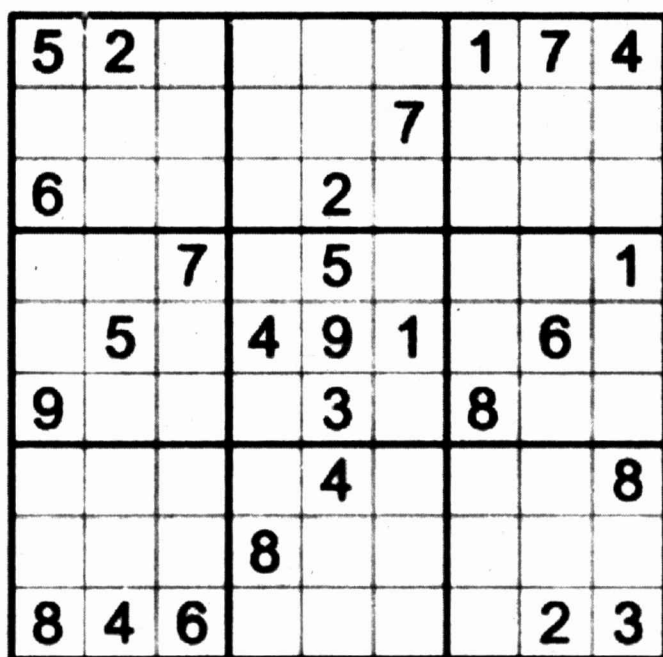
