



## Plenty of fun, food and music planned at Funtastic Fourth

For many area residents, the Funtastic Fourth Festival in the Heart of the City Park will be a time to relax and enjoy the sites, sounds and foods the annual event brings to downtown Big Spring.

For a handful of musicians, however, July 4 will be anything but a vacation.

Touting its Battle of the Bands since its inception, the Funtastic Fourth Festival will

offer music from several different genres, including Tejano, rock, country and gospel — and a healthy dose of competition.

First-place bands in each category will receive \$2,500. Second place will receive \$250 and third place will receive \$150.

"The Battle of the Bands is always exciting," said DRA President John Bryans. "We always look forward to it."

Also looking forward to the July Fourth celebration are Tejano bands Titan and LaFormula of San Angelo and

Xtremo of Big Spring, which will be competing.

Xtremo will perform at 11 a.m., with La Formula set to go on at 11:50 a.m. and Titan taking the stage at 12:40 p.m.

In the country category, Guy Will Zant and Texas Pride of Big Spring and Nikki Lee of Lamesa will perform during the evening hours.

Nikki Lee is set to play at 1:30 p.m., with Texas Pride going on stage at 2:20 p.m. and the Guy Will Zant Band performing at 3 p.m.



### DON'T BOTHER TO DUCK

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A huge asteroid will have a close encounter with Earth this weekend, but astronomers say there is no danger of an impact.

The asteroid, known as 2004 XP14, will whiz by about 269,000 miles from the Earth, slightly farther away than the moon.

The ringside seat to the cosmic spectacle will be in North America, where amateur sky watchers with good telescopes should be able to see the asteroid as a small moving dot in the sky. Europe can also view the flyby, but the asteroid will appear much fainter. The closest approach will occur on the U.S. West Coast at about 9:25 p.m. PDT Sunday.



were inadvertently lowered, effectively cutting the parade in half for a few minutes. But the guardrails soon lifted up and the parade was back in business.

The special honorees of this year's event were William H. King, Carl Dale Reid and Earnest Richters, three World

War II veterans who served as parade grand marshals.

King, who proudly claims to be the first Mitchell County resident to enlist in the Army after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, was captured by the Germans in North Africa in 1942. Later in the war, he was wounded when the truck he was traveling in hit a land mine near Bastogne, Belgium.

After the war, the Loraine native moved first to Roscoe, then Coahoma, where he has lived the last 47 years.

He said he was proud to have been named a grand marshal at this year's Freedom Parade.

"This is pretty good," King said. "It seems like the parade gets a little bit smaller each year, but it's still a great thing."

Parade organizer Quail Dobbs said a car and trac-

tor show followed the parade at Coahoma's city park. A people's choice award, along with prizes for the top three vehicles, were presented.

Spring Symphony and Chorus, followed by a fireworks show that is coordinated with the symphony's patriotic music.

The show will be opened by a local band, as Los Greengos — made up of Donnie Green, Keith McGuire, Ben Kilgore and Adrian Calvio — takes the stage at 6 p.m.

## Physicians remove 119 nails from woman

HANOI, Vietnam (AP) — Physicians removed 119 nails — many of them rusty — from a woman's stomach months after she apparently swallowed them, a doctor said.

The 43-year-old woman arrived Wednesday at Hospital No. 121 in the southern city of Can Tho City, complaining of a severe stomachache, Dr. Tran Van Nam said Friday.

"After having her stomach X-rayed and scanned, we found a stack of strange objects and decided to operate as soon as possible," he said.

During surgery, doctors removed 119 nails, each about 3 inches long. Many were rusty, indicating they could have been in her stomach for months, Nam said.

The woman's stomach was scratched by the

nails, but she did not suffer any major injuries, he said.

"Her life is not at risk now, and she is recovering," Nam said, adding that the patient was expected to be discharged soon.

# Sheehan, protesters sue county over camping ban

WACO (AP) — Cindy Sheehan and four other war protesters on Friday sued McLennan County over roadside camping and parking bans near President Bush's Crawford ranch, saying they want to return to what became an "international symbol of protest against the Iraq war."

Sheehan, who lives in Berkeley, Calif., was in Waco on Friday to file the suit, which also names the sheriff, county commissioners and county judge individually. The suit filed in state district court asks that the ordinances not be enforced during protests in August and ultimately be declared void.

Sheehan, whose oldest son Casey was killed in Iraq in 2004, reinvigorated the anti-war movement last summer with her peace vigil — dubbed "Camp Casey" — that started in ditches off the winding, two-

lane road leading to Bush's ranch. As it grew, the group also set up "Camp Casey II" on a private, one-acre lot closer to the ranch.

But after neighbors complained of traffic congestion from the August rally that drew thousands to the 700-resident rural town, commissioners took action a month later. The new ordinances ban parking on parts of 14 roads near the ranch — roughly a 5-mile radius —

and prohibit camping in any county ditch.

One of the county commissioners, Lester Gibson, had not seen the suit and would not comment, said his assistant, Pat Chisolm. Others named in the suit did not immediately return phone calls to The Associated Press.

The four other plaintiffs — former U.S. diplomat Ann Wright, Daniel Ellsberg, Tamara Rosenleaf and

Charlie Anderson — were among 12 protesters arrested in November after setting up camp at Sheehan's original site. They were charged with two misdemeanors.

"We do not need a free-speech zone. America is a free-speech zone," Rosenleaf said. "We're no threat to the president. And other than being a threat to the president, there is no reason to have created that no-speech zone."

### Police arrest Mansfield woman in toddler's drowning

(AP) — MANSFIELD — A 32-year-old Mansfield woman accused of drowning her 1-year-old son in a hot tub is expected to face a charge of capital murder.

Valeria Maxon was arrested Friday evening and is expected to be arraigned Saturday, said Danny Baas, a spokesman for the Mansfield Police Department, said.

The boy's father called 911 around 4:45 p.m. Friday. The toddler was pronounced dead at the scene shortly after, Baas said.

The child's father left the house for about one hour Friday afternoon and found the boy dead when he returned. No charges were pending against the father late Friday, Baas said.

Child Protective Services had never investigated the family, said agency spokeswoman Marissa Gonzales.

### Woman pleads guilty to sneaking on airplane

AUSTIN (AP) — A Chicago woman who hid on a flight to attend the South by Southwest Festival pleaded guilty in federal court Friday to stowing away on an aircraft.

Catherine "Cat" Chow, a 33-year-old artist, was on a standby list for a March 18 flight from St. Louis to Austin. When she found out the American Airlines flight was full, Chow sneaked onto the plane and hid in the bathroom.

She stayed there until a man knocked

on the door. Chow took the man's seat but was forced to move to another seat. A flight attendant discovered her after Chow was again forced to change seats, according to court documents.

Chow could face up to a year in jail and a \$100,000 fine for the misdemeanor. A sentencing hearing is scheduled for Sept. 18.

"She realizes she made a bad mistake," her lawyer, Sam Bassett, told the Austin American-Statesman for Saturday editions. "It was just a bad, impulsive decision."

Chow also faces misdemeanor charges for possession of marijuana and six antidepressant tablets without a prescription. Police say they found the drugs on Chow when she was arrested at the airport.

### Border Patrol agent charged in smuggling case

HOUSTON (AP) — A U.S. Border Patrol agent charged with accepting a \$5,000 payoff to help drug smugglers was accused by federal authorities Friday of also helping illegal immigrants enter the country.

David Duque Jr. is charged with helping a vehicle haul nearly five kilos of cocaine through the Falfurrias checkpoint June 14. An FBI agent testified at a hearing Friday that Duque also assisted in immigrant smuggling and sold identification documents he acquired while working, the U.S. Attorney's Office said in a statement.

Duque was released after the hearing

on a \$50,000 bond. If convicted, he faces up to 15 years in prison.

Duque has been suspended indefinitely, said Border Patrol spokesman Roy Cervantes.

### HIV-positive woman alleges caseworker harassment

FORT WORTH (AP) — An HIV-positive woman alleges a caseworker coerced her to have sex by threatening to take away her benefits and report her to Child Protective Services.

The 26-year-old woman filed a lawsuit against AIDS Outreach Center of Greater Tarrant County, where she met the caseworker after seeking help in early 2005.

"It's a pretty nasty deal," said the woman's attorney, Todd Turner. "I wouldn't have filed this type of case if I didn't feel we had a strong case."

The center's executive director, Dara Austin, wouldn't discuss the allegations or say whether the caseworker was still employed there.

The woman still receives services from the agency, Turner said.

In court filings, the woman alleges she felt forced to have sex with the caseworker after he threatened to cut off her some of her benefits, including housing and utility help. The caseworker also told her if she didn't have sex with him, he would tell Child Protective Services she wasn't providing her three children with adequate housing.

The lawsuit also says the caseworker sent the woman "extremely sexually

suggestive and harassing" text messages and made threatening telephone calls.

After the woman reported the caseworker to superiors, the agency investigated, but its insurance carrier declined to reach a settlement, Turner said.

The woman hasn't ruled out lodging a criminal complaint with police, he said.

### Mexican national pleads guilty to smuggling immigrants

BROWNSVILLE (AP) — A Mexican national pleaded guilty Friday for his role in a ring suspected of using luxury charter boats to ferry illegal immigrants past Border Patrol checkpoints.

Luis Alberto Gutierrez-Zapien stated in his plea agreement that the alleged ring made \$55,500 in 10 smuggling trips. The Brownsville Herald reported in its Saturday editions.

Gutierrez-Zapien admitted in federal court to driving six immigrants in May to boat docks in Port Isabel. From there, a cruise owner agreed to transport them to Corpus Christi on his boat, Gutierrez-Zapien said.

Breakaway Cruises owner Mack Daniel Bryant was arrested by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Also arrested were Bryant's manager, Robert Milton Moore, charter boat captain Norman Michael Walker and deckhand Baldemar Valdez Jr.

Gutierrez-Zapien, who pleaded guilty to felony conspiracy, is scheduled to be sentenced Aug. 25. His charge is punishable by up to five years in prison.

## Corzine signs order closing N.J. government

TRENTON, N.J. (AP) — Gov. Jon S. Corzine closed the state government Saturday amid a bitter dispute with fellow Democrats in the Assembly over his plan to increase the sales tax, threatening to shutter beaches, parks and possibly casinos in the coming days.

The state lottery and road construction were among the first state services expected to be closed.

After Saturday's constitutional deadline to adopt a new balanced budget passed without agreement, Corzine signed an executive order just after 9:30 a.m., a grim climax to weeks of budget squabbling among Democrats who control state government but haven't been able to

agree on a budget bill. Services such as state police, prisons, mental hospitals and child welfare would keep operating.

The casinos could be forced to close because they require state monitoring, though the casino industry is challenging a possible closure in court.

The dispute centers on Corzine's determination to raise the state sales tax from 6 percent to 7 percent to help close a \$4.5 billion budget deficit.

Corzine sees the increase as a vital step toward providing reliable annual revenue, but most Democrats in the Assembly — the lower house of the state Legislature — and several Senate Democrats say the plan is unnecessary.

# Lawmakers concerned over why Christian film received PG rating

Associated Press Writer WASHINGTON (AP) — A Christian-themed movie about a football coach's faith in God is finding an audience in Congress — not so much for its inspirational message, but for the PG rating it received.

House Majority Whip Roy Blunt, R-Mo., and other lawmakers are demanding explanations after hearing complaints that the movie "Facing the Giants" was rated PG instead of G due to religious content.

The Motion Picture Association of America claims the controversy arose from a miscommunication with the filmmakers. It says religion was not the reason for the rating.

"This incident raises the disquieting possibility that the MPAA considers exposure to Christian themes more dangerous for children than exposure to gratuitous sex and violence," Blunt said in a letter to MPAA Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Dan Glickman.

After meeting with MPAA officials, Blunt and a handful of other House members said they remain concerned about the subjective nature of the ratings process.

"I'm not satisfied," said Rep. Marsha Blackburn, R-Tenn., who attended the meeting with Blunt. "We probably will want to revisit this ratings process to have some

commonality in the standards that exist for movies, videos and video games."

Blackburn said she wants the House Energy and Commerce Committee to hold hearings on the issue later this year.

Blunt also brought up a recent study by the Harvard School of Public Health that found that the MPAA standards on sex and violence in movies have been getting weaker.

"Mr. Blunt does continue to have questions about the process by which 'Facing the Giants'

was rated and what that says about ratings creep in general," spokeswoman Burson Taylor said Friday.

An MPAA spokesman did not return calls seeking comment. But in a letter to Blunt earlier this month, the MPAA's Glickman insisted the rating for "Facing the Giants" was not based on religious content.

"Any strong or mature discussion of any subject matter results in at least a PG rating," Glickman said. "This movie had a mature discussion about pregnancy, for example.

It also had other mature discussions that some parents might want to be aware of before taking their kids to see this movie."

A PG rating means parental guidance is suggested because the MPAA believes some material may not be suitable for children. A G rating means the MPAA has found the movie acceptable for all audiences.

Glickman said the movie's producers agreed with the rating and never appealed it.

The film's producers claim ratings officials changed their story after the controversy began.

"The first communication from the MPAA was that religion was a factor in the ratings," said Kris Fuhr, vice president of marketing at Provident Films, which is owned by Sony Pictures. "Since then, the MPAA has revised those factors to no longer include religion."

Fuhr says she is now satisfied with the rating and wants to move beyond the controversy to focus on marketing the film, billed as an inspirational drama about a high school football coach who relies on faith to battle fear and failure.

"He dares to challenge his players to believe God for the impossible on and off the field," the movie's Web site says.

## Cheney's pacemaker working properly, heart condition stable

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Dick Cheney's pacemaker is working properly and his overall heart condition is stable, according to results from his annual physical Saturday.

The 65-year-old Cheney, who has a long history of heart ailments, had an electrocardiogram and high-tech imaging to check on repaired aneurysms on the back of his knees, his spokeswoman said.

Doctors also checked the condition of a high-tech pacemaker that was placed in his chest in

June 2001. Cheney has had four attacks; the first in 1978, when he was 37, and the fourth Nov. 22, 2000, after the election that made George W. Bush president.

"The vice president's cardiac status remains stable, his ICD is functioning properly and has not treated any arrhythmia," or irregular heartbeat, according to a statement from his spokeswoman, Lea Anne McBride.

Cheney is scheduled to have a stress test on a treadmill in the fall.

# 2,500 National Guard troops in border states

## But only 483 have actually made it to the border so far

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — On the deadline to have 2,500 troops along the Mexican border, the National Guard said Friday that only 483 were in position and working with the U.S. Border Patrol as the Bush administration had directed.

But Guard officials said more than 2,000 others were somewhere inside the four southwestern border states, training or helping plan the deployment. Bush administration officials argued Friday that the presence of troops in those states spelled success in the first stage of the mission.

Lt. Gen. H. Steven Blum, chief of the National Guard Bureau, an arm of the Pentagon, had promised June 1 that by the end of the month 2,500 Guard troops would be working "on the border."

"As defined by the operation, the National Guard has met and exceeded its goal of deploying 2,500 soldiers and airmen to the four Southwest border states," said White House spokesman Blain Rethmeier. "Progress to date is real and the Guard's efforts are making a positive difference in this national effort."

As evidence, he said the early arrival of troops had allowed the Border Patrol to send 125 agents "back to the front lines," and helped the Border Patrol catch nearly 200 illegal immigrants, seize 123 pounds of marijuana, 18 pounds of cocaine and seven vehicles.

Through initial pay requests filed with the Air Guard and orders filed with the Army Guard, the Guard bureau

verified 2,547 troops were in the four border states for the mission, said Daniel Donohue, a spokesman for the National Guard Bureau.

Only 483 were physically on the border, he conceded.

The remaining forces — 1,816 — are in training somewhere in the four states, with some at bases as far away as Sacramento — 600 miles from the border. Donohue said 248 are assigned to headquarters and planning roles.

Asked to clarify, Blum spokesman Mark Allen responded by e-mail that the general had never specifically promised to deliver troops to a "geographically defined latitude and longitude."

Still, there were signs the deployment was picking up speed.

Texas Gov. Rick Perry said 1,000 Army and Air National Guardsmen were either on the border

or "on their way," adding 500 to totals released Thursday. But his office said the additional troops didn't actually reach the border, but were considered deployed when they left Friday for two weeks of training.

Several states whose Guard leaders and governors had been contacted by the National Guard Bureau in the last 48 hours also made announcements Friday that they would send troops.

Gov. Mike Easley of North Carolina said he would reluctantly deploy 300 troops to the border in mid-July.

"I would prefer not to have any of the North Carolina National Guard deployed to other states at this time," he said. "However, the Guard units in the western states are spread thin as they battle raging wildfires. We must all step up and do our part to keep our country safe."

Kentucky announced it would send up to 650 National Guard troops. Arkansas also said it

would send 200. New Jersey also said it would send up to 650 for three-week assignments.

Damon Foreman, senior patrol agent and spokesman for the Border Patrol in San Diego, said agents there eagerly await the Guard's help.

"We would welcome all the help we could get. We could absorb them as fast as we could give them instructions on what to do," Foreman said,

adding that the delayed deployment, however, had not affected operations.

"We've been doing a considerably effective job for a long time now, we'll keep doing our job whether the whole number of Guard show up tomorrow, a week from tomorrow, or a month from now."

President Bush's plan for stemming illegal immigration by using

National Guardsmen in a support role called for 2,500 troops to be on the border by June 30, and 6,000 by the end of July.

Bush had said the mission would free up thousands of officers now on other duties to actively patrol the border. Guardsmen are expected to build fences, conduct routine surveillance and take care of other administrative duties for the border patrol.

## Agassi falls to Nadal in final Wimbledon match

WIMBLEDON, England — Andre Agassi bowed out of Wimbledon for the final time Saturday, beaten in straight sets by Rafael Nadal.

Playing in his 14th Wimbledon before retirement later this year, the 36-year-old American couldn't keep up with the relentless power hitting of the 20-year-old

Spaniard and fell 7-6 (5), 6-2, 6-4.

Nadal, the two-time French Open champion, transferred his clay-court baseline game to the grass of Centre Court to reach the fourth round of Wimbledon for the first time.

It marked the changing of the guard, with the popular American leaving the All England Club stage for good and Nadal making his breakthrough on the fast surface.

Nadal had just turned 6 when Agassi won the first of his eight Grand Slam titles at Wimbledon in 1992.

For one last time, Agassi stood in the middle of the court after the match and blew kisses and bowed to all corners of the arena.

Then, in a break with Wimbledon tradition, he addressed the crowd by microphone to say goodbye.

"It's been a lot of incredible

years here," Agassi said, wiping away tears.

"I'll never be able to repay you for how you've embraced me over the years and I thank you for that. ... You guys are awesome tennis fans, you have shown me so much love."

Then Agassi took his bag, stopped to sign a few autographs and gave a final wave as he walked off the most famous court in tennis.

## Rangers tag Astros, 3-1

### Teixeira gets out of slump

ARLINGTON — Mark Teixeira finally got a hit to fall, with no questions about whether it was fair or foul.

Teixeira ended an 0-for-17 slump with a leadoff double in the seventh inning, then scored the go-ahead run for the Texas Rangers in their 3-1 victory over the Houston Astros on Friday night that snapped a season-worst five-game losing streak.

"It felt great to break out of it and get a win," said Teixeira, hitless the previous four games.

The only time Teixeira went five straight games without a hit was in April 2003, in his first five games in the major leagues.

Teixeira thought he had a bases-clearing double in the ninth inning Tuesday night in San Francisco, but it was ruled foul even though the ball appeared to land on the line and kick up chalk. After Teixeira argued and was ejected, his pinch hitter flied out and the Rangers lost.

Against the Astros and Roy Oswalt (6-4), Teixeira hit a flare that dropped between center fielder Willy Taveras and second baseman Chris Burke, who collided and were shaken up on the play. Neither left the game.

"A lot of guys get a little woe is me and Cadillac down the line. Not many people would have been on second base there," manager Buck Showalter said.

"I knew it had a chance to fall. I wanted to make sure I got to second," Teixeira said. "I didn't want to take it for granted."

Kinsler also homered for the Rangers, just off a

Taveras was coming in and made a sliding attempt and Burke was going out when his left foot slammed into the outfielder's inner thigh and Burke tumbled hard to the ground. Both players remained down for several minutes while being tended to, but remained in the game.

Manager Phil Garner said Burke had a sore big toe and Taveras was spiked in the thigh, but that both players seemed to be OK.

Kevin Mench was intentionally walked with one out in the seventh before Ian Kinsler singled. Brad Wilkerson walked on a full-count pitch with the bases loaded, forcing home Teixeira for a 2-1 lead.

Kinsler also homered for the Rangers, just off a

1-5 road trip. Mark DeRosa and Michael Young had consecutive doubles in the eighth for another run.

Vicente Padilla (7-5), who was hit on the shoulder while throwing Thursday, allowed four hits over eight innings with five strikeouts and a walk. Akinori Otsuka worked the ninth for his 16th save in 18 chances.

"The key to Vicente is his fastball. When he is on and he is locating, he can be very tough," catcher Rod Barajas said. "Tonight, he located it, whether up or down or on both sides of the plate."

Padilla threw 79 of his 111 pitches for strikes.

"Oswalt was tough," Showalter said. "Our guy was a little tougher tonight."

Oswalt allowed three runs and nine hits in his first complete game this season, with five strikeouts and two walks, one intentional. He is 1-2 his last eight starts despite a 2.93 ERA in that span.

"We're not playing ball. That's the bottom line," Oswalt said. "If we keep playing the way we are now, we'll be out of it by August. ... We're not playing together right now. We're not having fun. Everybody is worrying about losing."

The Astros (38-42) are 1-6 on their road trip with four straight losses. The defending NL champions finally scored for the first time in three games.

Shut out its last two games during a sweep in Detroit, Houston snapped

## Stiles leads Buick

CROMWELL, Conn. — Darron Stiles has been in this position before — and not that long ago.

Stiles made a 10-foot birdie putt on his final hole Friday to top the crowded leaderboard in the Buick Championship at 8-under 132.

In the hunt for his first PGA Tour since joining the tour in 2003, Stiles also was the 36-hole leader in Memphis last month, but faded to tie for 22nd.

"I think in Memphis I got ahead of myself and my brain," Stiles said. "And since then I've realized that you really can't do that."

There's nothing wrong with his timing this week.

Stiles shot his second straight 4-under 66 on Friday to take a one-stroke lead over Peter Lonard, with 25 players within four strokes of the lead — including three who have won on the TPC at River Highlands.

A four-time winner on the Nationwide Tour, Stiles has split his time between tours this season, playing seven event on each before this week. He's making his third appearance in Hartford. His best finish with a tie for 9th last year.

"From the day I stepped on the course back in 2003, I felt very comfortable here," Stiles said. "Just something clicks when I get here."

Lonard followed his opening 65 with a 68, while former Hartford champions Stewart Cink (65) and Notah Begay III (66) were 6 under along with Scott Verplank (69) and Todd Fischer (68).

## Knicks know how to throw good money after bad

The competition is over. You knew there would never be a better example of throwing good money after bad the second these words left Isiah Thomas' mouth:

"I'd rather bet on myself."

Thomas made that brave pronouncement Monday, when he should have been fired as president of the New York Knicks, but was hired as their latest coach instead. Being the NBA's worst executive may not sound like much of a job recommendation, but it was enough for Knicks boss James Dolan.

"This is his team. He made this bed," Dolan said. "There's nobody better than him to make this thing go forward."

A few guys who owned teams in the Continental Basketball Association bet on Thomas' ac-

men once, making him the commissioner, and all that remains of that investment turns up in sports memorabilia auctions on eBay. Owners of NBA teams in Toronto and Indiana did, too, and the only souvenirs Thomas left behind were forwarding addresses.

When he landed in New York, it seemed impossible anyone could run the franchise worse than Scott Layden had. But credit Thomas with exceeding expectations at least once in his managerial career.

He turned over the entire roster within two seasons, then turned it over some more. He paid too much for fading talents and bad actors — beginning with dual qualifier Stephon Marbury — and paid too little attention to such niceties as the salary cap, luxury tax or how all those mismatched pieces were going to fit together. In

between, he submarined three coaches.

All Thomas had to show for it by the end of last season were the NBA's highest payroll and its second-worst record. But that's why casinos stay open 24/7, so guys like Dolan and Thomas can double down. What makes the wager even more interesting is that only one of them can afford to lose.

"At this time next year Isiah will be with us if we can all sit here and say that this team has made significant progress towards its goal of eventually becoming an NBA championship team. If we can't say that," Dolan added, "then Isiah will not be here."

Already gone, but not yet bought off, is Larry Brown. He might have been the most ill-fitting piece that Thomas collected, but he's forgotten more about coaching than his former

boss will ever learn. Besides, overhauling programs was Brown's specialty. Before New York, he performed his magic act in nine locales, won both an NCAA and NBA title, and left each place with a winning record.

But now, Dolan is trying to get out from under the remaining four years and \$40 million owed Brown by claiming the organization's rules bar the coach from stating the obvious; namely, that the team Thomas handed him needs overhauling yet again.

"We couldn't get Larry to focus on his job," Dolan said. "He wanted to focus on Isiah's job."

"We wanted this to work and we were willing to do anything," Thomas said. "To sit here and have to perform, to be

# Cuban, Mavs hope to avoid Nash scenario with Terry

DALLAS — Jason Terry has been saying for weeks that his goal in free agency is to stay in Dallas. Thing is, wary Mavericks fans remember Steve Nash saying the same things two years ago — until he signed with Phoenix.

Mavs owner Mark Cuban vows things will be different this time.

Cuban plans to make Terry an offer as soon as free agency begins at 12:01 a.m. EDT Saturday. A quick resolution would enable club officials to get on with the next phase of their offseason plans: signing Dirk Nowitzki and Josh Howard to contract extensions.

"Our priority is our own free agents," Cuban said. "I'm pretty sure we should be able to (keep them). We haven't been able to get into the details yet, but they've given us pretty much every indication that they want to stay, so that's good to know."

If all three pieces fall into place, Dallas likely would have the top three players from its Western Conference championship squad locked up through the 2010-11 season. Howard is 26, Nowitzki turned 28 last week and Terry turns 29 in September.


Keith Van Horn, Adrian Griffin, D.J. Mbenga and Darrell Armstrong are Dallas' other free agents. Armstrong is the most likely of them to return.

The Mavs might also look around for a backup to Nowitzki and a veteran point guard. While deals can be reached now, nothing can be signed before July 12.

Dallas is over the salary cap, but still has the midlevel exception. Beyond a payday, the Mavericks can offer players a spot on a team coming off a finals appearance and Cuban's reputation for taking care of players.

Terry would be among the top free agents on the market this summer if not for his off-state desire to remain with the Mavericks. He's still likely to get a high-dollar offer, perhaps in the range of \$40 million over five years.

When Nash went into free agency, Cuban didn't make an offer, instead hoping to match the best one Nash could get. Then the Suns offered more years and a lot more money than Cuban ever expected and he let Nash walk. The fact he's been MVP each of his two sea-

sions in Phoenix hurts the Mavs less now that they're coming off their first appearance in the NBA finals.

Cuban bristled at comparing the free agency cases of Terry and Nash, calling them "different scenarios, different play-

ers, different environments, different agents — different everything."

But then he added: "I guess in some respects you can say it was a lesson learned because I'd always said to Steve to go

Bad contracts sometimes produce good drama, as seen in this deal where declarer got to six notrump missing the A-K of hearts. There is no way West could have known to lead a heart — which would have spoiled a good story — and he instead made the more prosaic lead of a spade.

It might seem that declarer should still have gone down one since the diamonds were divided 4-2 instead of 3-3, but South managed the affair exceptionally well and brought the slam home.

He won the spade lead with the ace, cashed the king of clubs, returned to his hand with a spade and played the A-Q-J-10 of clubs, discarding three hearts and a diamond from dummy to produce this position:

When he next led a spade to the king, West had no choice but to discard a heart, and when declarer then cashed the A-K of diamonds, then East's jack, the crucial point of the play was reached.

Assessing the situation perfectly, South led the jack of hearts from dummy, sounding the death knell for the defense. East could not afford to rise with the ace, so he ducked. West won with the king and was forced to return a diamond from the 10-8 to dummy's Q-9, whereupon declarer finessed the nine to put the final touch on a very well-played hand.



Another former champ, Brent Geiberger (68), was in a group of six at 5 under.

"I'm not playing those guys. I'm playing the golf course," Stiles said. "Whoever beats the golf course the best over those 36 holes is going to win."

One off the lead to begin the round Friday, Stiles was even through nine holes then birdied the first three holes after the turn.

He tied Lonard at 7 under with a birdie on the par-4, 429-yard fourth hole, his 12th after starting on the back nine. Stiles hit his approach from 147 yards to 6 inches and tapped in for birdie.

Lonard was even on his first five holes, and made his only bogey on the par-5, sixth hole. Until then, the Australian said he thought he was cruising

along.

"I was thinking, 'You beauty, it's going in the hole,'" Lonard said. "The next thing I'm removing it from a fold-up chair. Outside of that shot I was really happy."

Cink had a bogey-free round. His win here in 1997 was his first on tour he's picked up three more since then. Although the course hasn't changed much since Cink's win, his game and the game in general has. So has the payday. Cink earned \$270,000 for the win. Sunday's winner will pocket \$792,000.

It took Thomas awhile to screw up the courage behind that "I'd rather bet on myself" remark. But once he did the math — Brown went 23-59 last season — the task didn't seem quite as daunting.

Especially since Dolan never mentioned making the playoffs as a requirement for keeping the job and refused to be pinned down on how many more wins would represent "significant progress."

"I've been in pressure situations before," Thomas said. "All my life has basically been about pressure and about having to get it done. Just because you say it publicly does not make me afraid of it or shy away from it."

Then again, Thomas inherited the volatile mix he dumped in Brown's lap — too many me-first shooting guards, too few tradable commodities and hardly a draft choice in sight — and the players know he's likely to be shown the door before they will. More useful than bravado right about now would be a plan.

If Thomas has one, he's done a good job of keeping it secret. The one detail that may have leaked out, mentioned in a sexual harassment lawsuit filed by former employee Anucha Browne Sanders in January, was to push the league to schedule more Knicks home games at noon on Sundays. According to Sanders, Thomas wanted to funnel opposing players to New York nightspots with the idea that enough of them would be hung over the next day and unable to make a difference.

It's not much, but considering the Knicks lost three of their five Sunday home games last season, it's a start.



# Hushovd wins prologue at scandal-plagued Tour de France

STRASBOURG, France — Norway's Thor Hushovd began the post-Lance Armstrong era of the Tour de France by winning the prologue Saturday, a day after two favorites were swept away in a doping scandal that has shaken the sport.

Hushovd, a powerful sprinter, becomes the first rider to take the leader's yellow jersey. He narrowly beat George Hincapie, an American who once rode with Armstrong. Another American, David Zabriskie, was third over the 4.4-mile time-trial course through this eastern French city.

Hincapie is one of the new favorites to succeed Armstrong, the seven-time Tour champion, after top riders Ivan Basso and Jan Ullrich

were barred from the race Friday for suspected doping.

Hushovd is not a contender for the overall title because he tends to struggle in the high mountains that come later in the three-week race. But he is aiming to win sprint stages in the first week and defend the green jersey he won last year as the Tour's best sprinter.

The Tour de France began Saturday a day after cycling's showcase event was jolted by a major doping scandal that swept two favorites from the race.

The 4.4-mile time gave a first indication on how the three-week ride around France will develop now that seven-time champion Lance Armstrong is in retirement and Basso and Ullrich on Friday were among those ousted from

the competition.

France's Cedric Coutouly set off first among the 176 riders.

The first Tour of the post-Armstrong era had already offered a chance for new stars to step forward — even before Basso and Ullrich and seven other riders were banned because of the Spanish doping investigation.

Fans, riders and team officials were abuzz over the chaotic developments and wondering which cyclists would rise to the moment.

French riders were among the most pleased. They have long voiced suspicions that their weakness in recent Tours may have been because riders from other countries face less stringent doping controls.

"For us, it's really great news," said Carlos Da Cruz, of the Francaise des

Jeux team. "They shouldn't be just removed from the race, they should be removed from the sport and their licenses torn up."

In May, police in Spain carried out arrests and raids, seizing drugs and frozen blood believed to have been prepared for banned, performance-enhancing transfusions.

Since then, the names of riders said to have had contacts with Eufemiano Fuentes, a doctor among those arrested, have been leaked to the Spanish media.

The Spanish dossier showed that Rudy Pevenage, director of Ullrich's T-Mobile team, had sent messages and made phone calls to Fuentes, team spokesman Christian Frommert said Saturday.

Ullrich's teammate Oscar Sevilla, who was

also ousted, had also made phone calls to Fuentes.

Pevenage appeared to have cryptically referred to Ullrich in communications with the doctor, but the German rider had not appeared to call Fuentes himself. Pevenage also has been excluded by his team.

The Spanish report linked Ullrich to substances including blood, growth hormones and testosterone patches, French sports daily L'Equipe reported Saturday, citing parts the Spanish dossier that was provided to Tour organizers on Thursday. Basso, under the pseudonym "Birillo," was connected with blood samples, the

report said.

As reports of the scandal emerged, T-Mobile riders had signed a statement affirming they had not had any contact with Fuentes.

"Why did they lie?" said Frommert, referring to Ullrich and Sevilla.

Under the sport's ethical charter, riders may be barred from racing while they under investigation for doping, but they are presumed innocent until proven guilty.

The extent of Basso's implication was not immediately clear. His Team CSC said he insisted he was innocent, but it added that suspicion would have made his participation in the Tour difficult.

# Sorenstam, Pak atop U.S. Women's Open leaderboard

NEWPORT, R.I. — The rain washed away the fog, the wind blew away the rain, and Annika Sorenstam found herself on the ninth hole at the Newport Country Club wondering what the weather had in store for her next.

On the elevated but sheltered tee, the air was calm. But the fairway was exposed to the Atlantic breeze, and behind the green, which was also elevated, the American flags were stiff.

"You stand way up there for your tee shot. You can't feel the wind but you know it's left to right. It's very tough to hit that fairway, and then it's soaking wet," Sorenstam said Friday. "When you're out there, you

have to think about so many things. So many factors play a role."

Sorenstam shot a 2-under 69 in the fog-delayed first round of the U.S. Women's Open to move into a tie for the lead with Se Ri Pak, Pat Hurst and U.S. Women's Amateur winner Jane Park. Sixteen-year-old Michelle Wie was among five women one stroke back at 1 under.

A two-time winner of the event — in 1995 and '96 — Sorenstam was the only golfer of the day to birdie No. 9, a 436-yard par-4. Her drive landed in a puddle, but because of the soggy conditions on the seaside course she was entitled to relief; she put a 185-yard 4-iron onto the fringe, and putted over a ridge and into the hole.

"I was lucky that I was in casual water because I had a chance to clean my ball," Sorenstam said. "I had so much mud on it."

The first round was postponed on Thursday when fog rolled in from the ocean and lingered into the afternoon. That night, rain puddled an already drenched course.

That combined with the U.S. Open setup to make things even tougher for the players — the average score was almost 76 on the 6,564-yard Newport course. Twenty-one players failed to break 80 and only nine broke par, two of them amateurs.

Amanda Blumenherst, who helped lead Duke to the NCAA title as a freshman, was in the group at 70. Lorena Ochoa of

Mexico and Paula Creamer were even at 71.

Karrie Webb, who has finished 1-2 in the first two majors, was 4 over through 12 holes and slipping out of contention until she rebounded with a pair of birdies and a chip to 4 feet on the ninth to save par and a 73.

Wie made 15 pars and one bogey, then made her second birdie of the day on the 18th with a 15-foot putt. Her occasional shots from the soggy rough left her rubbing her sore wrist, but the minor injury didn't seem to hold her back.

"I had a very solid round today, lot of pars," she said. "That's what the U.S. Open is. You have to have pars when you're in trouble, get away with

a bogey or a par. And I felt like I did that today."

Pak, who is looking for her second consecutive major victory and her sixth overall, moved to the top of the leaderboard with a 35-foot birdie putt on the sixth hole, another birdie on the seventh and a two-putt par from 60 feet and over two ridges on the ninth.

"I'll always be here if anyone forgets about me," Pak said with a laugh. "I just so much enjoyed it out there, all day long, so much comfortable and confidence in myself. It helped me out with a good round."

Sorenstam made only one bogey, when her 7-wood went through the green on the par-4 sixth, but she birdied the two toughest holes.

# Top teams in AL Central Division continuing to cruise

The Minnesota Twins are baseball's hottest team, winners of eight straight and 18 of 20. Yet they're still struggling to make up ground in the American League Central.

Justin Morneau and Torii Hunter hit back-to-back home runs, Brad Radke sailed through seven innings and Minnesota beat the Milwaukee Brewers 8-2 Friday night. But the Chicago White Sox knocked off the Cubs 6-2 and Detroit held on to beat Pittsburgh 7-6.

The Tigers have won seven in a row, 13 of 14 and lead the division by 2 1/2 games over the defending World Series champion White Sox, who have the second-best record in baseball. The Twins are alone in third, 11 games out of first despite their strong run.

"There's a lot of energy on this ballclub, a lot of things going on, and it's fun to watch," Minnesota manager Ron Gardenhire said.

In other interleague games, it was: Florida 5, Boston 2; New York Yankees 2, New York Mets 0; Cincinnati 9, Cleveland 8; Kansas City 7, St. Louis 5 in 10 innings; Toronto 8, Philadelphia 1; Los Angeles Dodgers 6, Los Angeles Angels 1; Atlanta 5, Baltimore 3; Arizona 6, Oakland 4; Colorado 2, Seattle 0; Texas 3, Houston 1; and Tampa Bay 11, Washington 1.

In the only NL game, San Diego beat San Francisco 6-5.

At Pittsburgh, Carlos Guillen's two-run triple highlighted Detroit's four-run third inning and the Tigers overcame Kenny Rogers' shaky start to hand the Pirates their 14th loss in 15 games.

Tigers skipper Jim Leyland managed in PNC

Park for the first time against the team that gave him his first big league managerial job in 1986.

"Leyland, we wanted to win for him," reliever Joel Zumaya said. "He kind of busted on us, saying, 'Hey we're going back to my old place, we'd better kick their rear ends.' It was a little tough, we were a little shaky, but we came out victorious."

Roman Colon (1-0) pitched 1 2-3 scoreless innings to get the win and Todd Jones pitched the ninth for his 21st save in 24 opportunities.

Kip Wells (0-3) allowed seven runs and six hits in 2 1/3 innings for Pittsburgh.

Juan Uribe homered and drove in five runs for the White Sox, who have won 12 of 14. Jon Garland (7-3) allowed seven hits and two runs in six innings.

Cubs starter Sean Marshall (4-7) gave up eight hits and four runs in six innings.

The game was overshadowed by A.J. Pierzynski and Michael Barrett, the two central combatants in a brawl earlier this season who chatted in the outfield before the game and shook hands.

Barrett, a catcher for the Cubs, punched Pierzynski in the jaw after he'd been run over at the plate in a game May 20, setting off a bench-clearing melee. Barrett returned Friday after serving his 10-game suspension and went over to Pierzynski during pregame batting practice.

"What was said was between him and me," Pierzynski said. "I appreciated the gesture and we're over it and we're moving on."

Radke (7-7) allowed one run and four hits. He struck out four and didn't walk a batter to help the Twins improve to 28-10 at home, best in the majors.

Brewers rookie Carlos Villanueva (0-1) lasted

five innings, giving up six hits and six runs.

**Marlins 5, Red Sox 2**

At Miami, Dontrelle Willis (5-7) yielded two runs in seven innings, Miguel Cabrera drove in two runs and the Marlins snapped Boston's 12-game winning streak.

Boston played error-free defense for the 17th consecutive game, setting a major league record, one better than the St. Louis Cardinals' run in 1992.

Jason Johnson (3-9) got the loss in his debut for Boston. Johnson, who was obtained from Cleveland in a trade on June 21, allowed six hits and five runs in four innings.

Five pitchers combined on a one-hitter and Jason Giambi homered for the Yankees.

Endy Chavez's leadoff single in the sixth inning against Ron Villone (2-1) was the only hit for the visiting Mets, who have lost four straight.

#### Food Safety Tips to Remember


With frequent stories in the news about E. coli, salmonella, and other bacterial contamination

of foods, I am often asked about food safety as it relates to fresh fruits and vegetables. While the problems that these organisms cause are serious, I am happy to report that with a little knowledge and care, you can ensure that the fresh produce you feed your family is clean and safe.

First: All fresh produce, whether bought in the grocery store, the Farmers Market, a roadside stand, or picked fresh out of your garden, should be washed thoroughly before eating. This applies whether the produce was organically-grown or raised by conventional methods. Illness-causing bacteria can be present on the surfaces of the produce as a result of contact with soil, fertilizers, or the many hands that touched it between the field and the table. Now before you get too upset by this information, let me tell you that there is a very simple solution to ease your mind and keep you healthy!

Second: Wash all your produce with clean, running water. That's right — water. It is recommended you wash pro-

## Smiths to combine forces for better service, warranties

Smith Automatic Transmission of Big Spring and Ronnie Smith Transmission LLC of Abilene are joining together to provide customers with better, lower-cost service.

The businesses will be able to furnish dyno-tested transmissions, backed in most cases with a two-year, 24,000-mile warranty good anywhere in the United States. The transmissions can be installed at Smith Automatic Transmission

or Ronnie Smith Transmission or a facility of the customer's choice.

"We have put together a team with more than 150 years of combined experience to provide our customers with great service," said Bill Smith Jr. "Our prices will be 10 to 50 percent lower than our competitors' with similar warranties."

Smith Automatic Transmission was started in Garland in the late 1950s by Bill Smith Sr. He trained and mentored his nephew, Ronnie Smith. Bill moved to the Big

Spring area in the late 1960s and Ronnie moved to Abilene and began his career.

Bill sold the business to his son, Bill Jr., in the early 1980s. Bill Jr. and Ronnie decided to team up together this year.

The Smith families have been repairing automobiles almost since they have been making them but with new complex systems, the need for outside information and specialized equipment is growing

## French lawmakers pass 'iTunes law'

PARIS (AP) — French lawmakers gave final approval Friday to government-backed legislation that could force Apple Computer Inc. to make its iPod music player and iTunes online store compatible with rivals' offerings.

Both the Senate and the National Assembly, France's lower house, voted in favor of the copyright bill, which some analysts said could cause Apple to close iTunes France and pull its market-leading player from the country's shelves.

Currently, songs bought on iTunes can be played only on iPods, and an iPod can't play downloads from other stores that rival the extensive iTunes music catalog from major artists and labels — like Sony Corp's Connect and Napster.

Apple described the original version of the copyright bill as "state-sponsored piracy" earlier this year, but the company had no immediate comment on Friday's vote.

In a statement issued after lawmakers hashed out the final compromise text last week, Apple said it hoped the market would be left to decide

"which music players and online music stores are offered to consumers."

The vote was the last legislative step before the bill becomes law, barring the success of a last-ditch procedural challenge filed in the constitutional court last week by the opposition Socialists and Greens. The law would take effect only after that challenge is exhausted — a process expected to take several weeks.

The law states that companies are expected to share the required technical data with any rival that wants to offer compatible music players and stores.

"Any artist's work that is legally acquired should be playable on any digital device," Culture Minister Renaud Donnedieu

de Vabres told lawmakers before the vote.

But the final text tones down many of the tougher measures adopted by the lower

house in March. It also maintains a Senate loophole that could allow Cupertino, Calif.-based Apple and others to dodge the data-sharing demands by striking new deals with record labels and artists.


A new regulatory authority will have the power to order companies to license their exclusive file formats to rivals on request — but only if the compatibility restrictions they impose are "additional to, or independent of, those explicitly decided by the copyright holders."

Lawyers say this means Apple and Sony could avoid sharing their FairPlay and ATRAC3 copy-protection systems, providing they obtained permission from the artists whose music they sell.

The increased say for artists could strengthen the hand of recording companies in their recurrent negotiations with Apple, as they seek more flexible iTunes pricing — currently the same 99 cents for every standard-length track.

The final vote in France comes as several other European nations are considering action to force Apple to open iTunes to rivals' players. In a joint letter this month, consumer agencies in Norway, Sweden and Denmark accused Apple of violating contract and copyright laws.

The French law will also introduce new penalties for a range of online piracy offenses — up to a maximum three-year jail term and \$380,000 fine for knowingly offering or advertising a download service for pirated music or videos.



## Colombia's new Juan Valdez a true farmer

BOGOTA, Colombia (AP) — After a two-year search among more than 300,000 candidates nationwide, Colombia on Thursday unveiled the new Juan Valdez, the country's iconic coffee ambassador to the world.

His real name is Carlos Castaneda. Like his two predecessors, the 39-year-old sports the leather bag, bushy mustache and straw hat typical of rural Colombia where the

world-famous arabica coffee is grown.

But unlike those other Valdezes — who were played by a Cuban-born actor and a silk-screen artisan — Castaneda knows a thing or two about growing coffee. The oldest of 10 children born on a coffee farm, he picked his first bean at the age of 6.

Like most of the nation's 566,000 coffee growers, Castaneda has lived a modest

life, with his family's 10-acre plot earning \$200 a month.

That changed last week at a ceremony in the capital of Bogota, when Castaneda literally took over the reins of Conchita the mule from the previous Valdez — Carlos Sanchez, who's retiring after 37 years.

Dressed in the trademark Juan Valdez poncho, Castaneda said he was nervous about his new job, "but I'm going to put all my heart and will into mak-

ing sure things go well."

The Colombian coffee producers' federation wouldn't say how much Castaneda will earn in the high-profile gig, other than to say it'll be considerably more than his current income.

Before he was invited to the capital in May as a finalist, Castaneda had never boarded a plane. Now, he'll move from his house in the mountains of



Oil prices up ahead of Independence Day

WASHINGTON (AP) — Crude oil futures briefly surpassed \$74 a barrel Friday on strong U.S. gasoline demand ahead of the Independence Day holiday.  
Brokers said energy futures were also supported by hints from the Federal Reserve Thursday that it could be done raising interest rates.  
Societe Generale's director of commodity strategy, Michael Guido, said that by highlighting the role energy prices were playing in helping to slow economic growth to more sustainable levels "it was like giving high energy prices an honorable mention."  
The question is now, Guido said, "how much higher do (energy prices) go before it becomes a detriment?"  
After rising as high as \$74.15 a barrel, light sweet crude for August

settled at \$73.93, an increase of 41 cents, on the New York Mercantile Exchange. July gasoline futures plunged by 9.27 cents to settle and expire at \$2.2021 a gallon after closing at a nine-month high on Thursday.  
"Earlier in the week, the \$73 mark has always been considered the resistance level," said Victor Shum, energy analyst at Purvin & Gertz in Singapore. "Now, we've gone beyond that."  
Worries about a supply crunch ahead of the July 4 holiday grew after the U.S. government released a report Wednesday showing gasoline stocks shrank last week for the first time in more than two months.  
Gasoline demand in the U.S. continues to rise in spite of soaring pump prices. Over the past four weeks, daily gasoline demand was up 0.9 percent from a year ago.

duce under clean, running water, and when appropriate, scrub lightly with a clean vegetable brush. This will remove nearly all insects and dirt, as well as bacteria and some pesticide residues. It is also advisable to wait until just before preparation to wash your produce. Researchers have found that while special produce washes available in grocery stores are safe to use, nothing indicates that they are any more effective than using cool water and a vegetable brush.  
If you're tempted to use regular dish soap to wash produce, fight the feeling! Dish soap is not approved as a food item and can make you sick. You also increase your risk by adding residues from other substances — such as antibacterial components and scents from the soap.  
Additional tips to ensure clean produce:  
— Always, always, without fail, wash your hands with soap and running water before working with food. To encourage thorough hand washing, sing the entire Happy Birthday song while you wash your hands. When the song is finished, your hands are clean.  
— Scrub tougher-skinned produce such as potatoes, carrots, and melons, and citrus fruits, with vegetable brush to remove all dirt and bacteria.  
Use clean cutting

board and fresh, clean utensils when working with produce.  
— Clean vegetable bins in your refrigerator frequently. Mold in the bottom of the bins, as well as moldy produce items (ugh!) can encourage bacterial growth.  
— Wash your produce even if you don't feel it before eating. Contaminants on the skin can be transferred to the inner lining of the knife if it is used first.  
— When washing leafy greens, hold them in the green water with enough water to make the greens float. Rotate the produce to ensure the majority of the dirt and soil fall to the bottom of the sink. Rinse, and then wash each leaf under cool running water to remove any remaining contaminants.  
— In-store produce bins are a source of illness. Some produce, especially leafy greens, are more susceptible to bacterial contamination. Several studies have found that every time you go to your grocery store, you know you're at a good place to get your produce. And your produce is still good when you get home. Wash your produce and your hands.  
— Rubbing your hands with soap and water is the best way to keep your hands clean.  
— A lot of people are still using their old, worn-out kitchen towels. They are a breeding ground for bacteria. Wash your towels frequently.

# Alpine saddles up for 'Annie Get Your Gun'

With prints of horse hooves scattered across the sands of the Chihuahuan Desert, Alpine has been called the last frontier. This summer, the Theatre of the Big Bend will celebrate its western heritage with one of the most spectacular theatrical events Texas has ever seen.

In conjunction with Sul Ross State University, the 41st season of the Theatre of the Big Bend is planning to saddle up for "Annie Get Your Gun" July 1-3, 7-9, 14-16 and 21-22. All performances will be at 8:15 p.m. However, the Alpine version of the Tony-award-winning production is certain to be like

none other.

"The Theatre of the Big Bend is taking "Annie Get Your Gun" to a whole new level," said Dona Roman, Sul Ross theatre professor. Roman selected the frontier musical written by Peter Stone, because of the western lifestyle still prevalent in the Alpine area.

"I've been wanting to do a musical that really meshed with our life out here," Roman said. "'Annie Get Your Gun' seemed perfect."

The success of the Sul Ross rodeo program prompted Roman to take the musical one step further.

"It hit me to take the production to the S.A.L.E. (San Antonio Live Exhibition) Arena

and make a real wild west show." The show will involve live animals and authentic trick riders.

"I want to use real people riding their own horses," Roman said. "My vision with the show is to make it as close to what it would be as if Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show came to Alpine."

Not only will actors in "Annie Get Your Gun" need to ride and act, they will also need to sing. Directing the musical element of the show is Donald Freed, director in music.

"Music is essential to 'Annie Get Your Gun,'" Freed said.

While music may be essential, it is certainly not a simple task to produce the songs in a

rodeo area setting.

"Sure it adds a technical aspect," Freed said. "I'm a little nervous about it, but nerves are good. They keep us on our toes."

Working with individuals decreases Freed's anticipation.

"My imprint on the production is helping the singer do the best they can," Freed said. "One of the things I seek to do is help singers portray their character to the best of their ability."

Freed, who was involved in a production of "Annie Get Your Gun" during his years in high school, hopes this show will encourage interest in musicals.

"Some people consider American musical theatre to be

down the tubes. I think it's important to our history not only regionally but nationally," Roman agreed.

"This is something that's uniquely West Texas and uniquely Big Bend, but has universal themes that apply to all of America," he said.

Though challenging, Roman believes bringing "Annie Get Your Gun" to the last frontier will be an unforgettable experience.

"It's a really bold step," Roman said. "But if we all pull this off, it will be one of the greatest theatrical events Alpine has ever seen."

## Fraser earns top award

State Sen. Troy Fraser (R-Horseshoe Bay) has been named the top legislator in the nation by the American Legislative Exchange Council (ALEC), the association for state legislators.



Rider"), whose expiration date may have seemed to pass several years ago, seems to get into the fun, showing a rather evil side as Newman's boss and main antagonist, Ammer.

Michael's parents are portrayed by Henry Winkler ("Happy Days," "Arrested Development") and Julie Kavner ("The Simpsons," "Awakenings"), and Sean Astin ("The Lord of the Rings," "50 First Dates") brings up the rear — quite literally — as a grape smuggling swim instructor.

While there's certainly no denying the parallels between "Click" and Jimmy Stewart's "It's A Wonderful Life" — especially when Sandler enters into a George Bailey-ish tirade after his life takes a left turn — "Click" masters a boyish charm not seen very often on the big screen.

"When you're shooting a movie you are away from home most of the time," said Sandler prior to the release of the movie. "It's an amazing thing that we

get to do what we get to do, but you definitely are away from the family more than you'd like to be and time keeps passing, and I go movie to movie a lot and yeah, I'm 39 years old.

"I do feel looking back on the past 10 years of my life, I've been at work more than I've been at home, so I connected with this movie, the message of the movie. By the end of the movie, when I watch it, when I watched the playback the other day, I went home. I was excited to get home and do the right thing — be with the family."

Sandler said the dark side of "Click," an element that has been missing from his previous films, comes from an aspect of his life that played a very, deep-seated role in the new movie.
