Big Spring VA director leaving for Ann Arbor

Lou Ann Atkins, director of the Big Spring VA Medical Center for the past two years,

will soon leave the facility to take on a similar position in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Atkins will become director of the VA Ann Arbor Health Care System effective July 23, according to information released by the local VA

hospital.

"The decision was difficult because I have had a wonderful experience here over the past two years," Atkins said in a statement. "There is something to be said for West Texas hospital."

"In addition to the hospitality, the support for West Texas veterans and veterans' programs is

wonderful," Atkins added. "I sincerely thank the citizens of Big Spring and the entire VA service area for your encouragement and collaboration over the years, and trust the support of the West Texas VA Health Care System and the veterans we serve will continue."

Atkins was officially named director of the Big Spring

VAMC July 11, 2004. Prior to that, she had served as associate director of VA medical centers in Erie, Penn. and West Palm Beach, Fla.

She received her bachelor's of science in nursing from the University of Pittsburgh, her master's of nursing from St.

Jails — present and proposed, fill Monday's slate for commissioners

The Howard County Jail — both the existing facility and a proposed jail — will be the center of attention Monday as the county commissioner's court holds its regular meeting.

Phil Furqueron, who has been consulting with county officials on its two-pronged problem — designing and financing a new jail facility while bringing the current county jail up to state standards — is expected to make several reports to the commissioners.

Among the items Furqueron is expected to present is a report on the status of the plans and designs for a new jail facility, which is expected to be a 144-bed facility to be located in the north part of the city near the intersection of Highway 87 and Interstate Highway 20.

As commissioners begin to move forward with the design and construction of a new jail facility, the court is also faced with a slew of problems with the existing facility.

Furqueron is also expected to report on an environmental study being conducted at the proposed site.

BSISD trustees to address pay increases

Big Spring Independent School District trustees will take a large step toward approving significant pay raises for district employees when they hold their monthly meeting at 5:15 p.m. Monday in the high school board room.

Virtually every school district employee will receive a raise this year, with teachers, librarians, nurses and counselors seeing the most significant increase.

Under guidelines that have already received tentative approval from trustees, personnel in those four professions will see raises of between \$3,500 and \$4,400 from the previous school year, Superintendent Michael Downes said.

Downes noted that \$2,500 in raises in those areas was approved by the Texas

Legislature during its recent special session. In addition to that, however, BSISD is giving those personnel a "step" increase in pay (if they have less than 20 years service to the district), plus an additional \$500 in annual salary.

These raises should go a long way toward making BSISD

more competitive with other districts in the search for teaching talent, Downes said.

"This will move us ahead of a few more school districts in our region," Downes said. "We will certainly not be at the top (in salaries), but a lot of that is due to the inequities of the school financing system. It is not possible for property poor districts (like Big Spring) to maintain a salary schedule comparable to property rich districts. It just

can't be done." In addition to those pay raises, trustees likely will approve more than \$166,000 in raises for administrators, paraprofessional personnel and auxiliary employees.

Practically the only district employee not receiving a raise under the proposal will be Downes, whose salary is negotiated during his annual evaluation.

AUSTIN (AP) — A San Marcos man who admitted he stored sexually explicit images and videos of children on his iPod digital music player has been sentenced to 40 years in prison on that charge and several others, Attorney General Greg Abbott announced Friday.

Ron James Guzman, 39, pleaded guilty to nine counts of possession of child pornography and six counts of promotion of child pornography.

Under another plea agreement in a separate case, he pleaded guilty to four counts of aggravated sexual assault of a child and one count of indecency with a child.

Fr. Ray Stanley Wilhelm

The son of Raymond M. Wilhelm and Alma (Dreier) Wilhelm, Ray Wilhelm was born Feb. 3, 1932, in San Antonio. After graduating from St. Mary's Parochial School, he went to St. Anthony's Junior Seminary in San Antonio. He entered the St. Peter's Novitiate at Mission in 1951, where he took his first vows May 31, 1952.

His philosophy and theology courses were pursued at DeMazened Scholasticate (now Oblate School of Theology) in San Antonio. It was there that he took perpetual vows May 31, 1955. Upon the completion of his theology studies, he was ordained a priest by Archbishop Robert E. Lucey at St. Mary's Church, San Antonio, June 1, 1958.

Fr. Ray's first obedience was in 1959 as a professor at DeMazened Scholasticate. In the spring of 1960, he went to Catholic University, in Washington, D.C., for higher education, and in November of 1960, he went to the Studium Superius Generale in Rome and obtained a degree in canon law at Gregorian University in June of 1962. He was transferred to DeMazened Scholasticate — Oblate College of the Southwest in San Antonio as bursar and professor in September 1962. Other assignments included: assistant pastor to Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Harlingen; pastor to St. Ignatius Parish in Rancho; pastor to Sacred Heart in McAllen; associate pastor of the Immaculate Conception Cathedral in Brownsville, and pastor to St. John the Baptist in San Juan.

In January of 1986 he served as the associate director of college level seminary formation program at St. Edwards University, Austin. In 1988 he was assigned as Parochial Vicar to St. Louis of France Cathedral in New Orleans, then in 1990 to St. Patrick's Parish in Houston. In 1991, he was associate director of San Juan Shrine in San Juan. He then served a six-year term as pastor at St. Ann's in Colorado City. In June of 2000, he was assigned and remained until his death Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church and Shrine in Midland. Fr. Ray was also an Official of the Matrimonial Tribunal of the dioceses of Brownsville, San Antonio and San Angelo. He was Defender of the Bond of Marriage for the Texas Appellate Court in San Antonio and had also been a local Oblate Superior in several Texas districts.

"Fr. Ray was a committed and faithful servant of the Church, especially as Missionary Oblate to Mary Immaculate," said Fr. Ed DeLeon, pastor at Our Lady of Guadalupe. "He always gave 110 percent if not more. He was a true confessor, and people always felt God's mercy especially in the confessional. He was an excellent preacher and a good friend."

Fr. Ray is preceded in death by his parents, Raymond and Alma Wilhelm, J.P. Wilhelm, Edwin Wilhelm, E.V. Tumlinson, his uncles, and Maggie Schlein, his aunt.

He is survived by his sister, Mary Oswald and brother-in-law, Louis Oswald of Houston, his three nephews, Brent A. Oswald, of Houston, Kelly V. and Stacey Oswald of Houston, Louis A. and Crystal Oswald of Littleton, Colo., and his dearest friend, the Rev. Frank Montalbano, OMI of San Antonio.

"Fr. Ray was so special, so knowledgeable, so educated," said Toni Bustillos, a parishioner at Our Lady of Guadalupe and a friend of Fr. Ray. "You could ask him anything and he would tell you, and if he didn't know, he would find out. He was so gentle and always such a loving and kind person."

A Rosary, to be led by Fr. Ed DeLeon, pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and Shrine, will be held Friday, July 7, 2006, at 7 p.m., at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church and Shrine in Midland. A Mass of Resurrection will be held Saturday, July 8, 2006, at 11 a.m. at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church and Shrine in Midland with The Most Rev. Michael D. Pfeifer, OMI, Bishop of San Angelo, the principal celebrant and Fr. Ed DeLeon, homilist.

Fr. Ray's body will be taken to San Antonio for additional services. A Rosary will be held at the Oblate School of Theology's Immaculate Conception Chapel Sunday, July 9, 2006, at 7 p.m. His Mass of Resurrection will be celebrated Monday, July 10, 2006, at 10 a.m. at The Oblate School of Theology's Immaculate Conception Chapel followed by burial at the Oblate Community Cemetery on the same grounds in San Antonio.

Train, vehicle accident leaves Stanton man dead

STANTON — Driver error is the preliminary ruling in a train-automobile accident here Friday that left one man dead.

Ray Mitchell Hammock, 54, of Stanton, died when his vehicle was struck by a Union Pacific train at the St. Boniface Street crossing, officials said.

Stanton Police Chief Michael Adams said Hammock was northbound on St. Boniface when his 1988 Lincoln was struck by an eastbound Union Pacific train at about 7:25 p.m. Friday.

Hammock was pronounced dead at the scene by Martin County Justice of the Peace Merv Miller. An autopsy was ordered and will be performed later this week in Lubbock, Adams said.

Adams said preliminary investigation into the accident indicates Hammock was at fault.

"As with most train-car accidents, it looks like driver error," he said. "(Hammock) was just easing into the intersection ... It looks like he wasn't paying close enough attention."

This marks the fifth automobile-train collision

— and the third fatality resulting from such an accident — to have occurred in Martin County in the last eight months, Adams said.

"That's an unusual number of fatalities," Adams said. "It's a high number for anybody, much less a town of our size."

As is the case with the other accidents, there was no automatic guardrails installed at the St. Boniface Street crossing at the time of Friday's accident, Adams said.

City officials have been in negotiation with the Texas Department of Transportation to have guardrails installed at train crossings. Adams said he is hopeful TxDOT will begin installing the devices within the next few months.

In the meantime, he urges motorists to exercise extreme caution when crossing railroad tracks.

"It's just like you learned as a kid — stop, look and listen," he said.

facility, currently housed in the Howard County Courthouse.

Among the existing problems are a door that swings in the wrong direction, lack of a stand pipe to provide firefighters with water in the event of an emergency and an ineffective smoke evacuation system.

Consideration of a new jail facility began more than two years ago when commissioners identified jail overcrowding and non-compliance with state jail laws as an ongoing and long-term problem.

Commissioners tabled the jail issue nearly a year ago, having reopened it earlier this year following a meeting between commissioners and Texas Commission on Jail Standards officials that left the county with a 90-day deadline to present the commission with a detailed plan for correcting the

items currently out of compliance.

In April, commissioners voted 4-1 in favor of the proposed 144-bed facility. Since that time, however, progress stalled as officials with the city of Big Spring contemplated joining the county in the venture, which would have yielded a joint law enforcement center that would house both the police department and the sheriff's office.

Less than two weeks ago the city announced it would not join the county, forcing architects to begin redesigning the facility.

Also on Monday's agenda, County Auditor Jackie Olson will present the commissioners with invoices and purchase requests, as well as amendments to the county's budget.

County Treasurer Teresa Thomas is expected to present commissioners with personnel considerations, a payroll report and a quarterly report.

County Welfare Director Irene Dominguez is expected to report on

the county's burial policy and ask for permission to go out for prescription services and funeral services.

Civil and environmental engineer Steve Dennis is expected to address the court concerning Forsan grant application approval, while County Water Control and Improvement official Jimmy Earnest will present commissioners with approval of a Coahoma city/county grant application.

Commissioner Bill Crooker is also expected to address the court concerning a new procedure for citizen input during county commissioner's court meetings.

The meeting is expected to get under way at 10 a.m. in the commissioners' courtroom, located on the second floor of the County Courthouse.

New water meter project promises savings for us all

Remember that energy and utility conservation contract the Big Spring City Council approved with Siemens Building Technologies not long ago? Well, the city's water customers will be reminded of it soon when there's a knock at the door and a workman informs them their water meter is being replaced. The water meter replacement program, which begins July 17, will consist of installing new water meters equipped with radio transmitters which can be read with a mobile data collector in a vehicle. That's right, no more meter readers crossing your lawn — rather than employees reading the meters manually — will read the new meters. The replacement program is part of that conservation contract with Siemens which is expected to save the city more than \$5.6 million over the next 15 years.

According to Siemens Account Executive Chad Nobles, the biggest part of the savings will come from the improvements made to the city's water system, which includes the automatic meter reading system.

"Approximately 60 percent of the savings we've projected will come from this system at an annual rate of approximately \$397,000 a year," he explained. "This is accomplished through more accurate meter reading."

City officials said replacement of residential meters is expected to take approximately 15 minutes to complete, while commercial meters could take between one and four hours, depending on the conditions of the job site.

There will probably be some who are less than pleased with the upgrade, however.

Those people whose meters weren't being read, or had meters that didn't measure water use correctly, will probably be unhappy with a higher water bill.

Of course, there will probably be some that receive lower bills.

In the long run, though, Public Works Director Todd Darden said the upgrades will result in bills "that average out and will be more steady."

Anyone having questions regarding the program should contact the city water department by calling 264-2542.

One thing's certain. If the new meters do result in substantial savings for the city, the long-term result will be less burden for taxpayers. In fact, it will be a savings for us all. And that, we think, is a good thing.

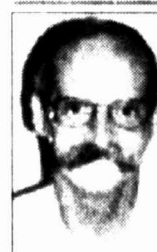

again in the fall. If passed, enough money to pay the bill would not be generated for about a year. Mayor Fredricka Shover said.

It also carries a fungus that can cause a deadly lung disease, so Peters wears a respirator mask to avoid breathing in the fertilizer dust. He is thinking about expanding his business to include more churches and other old buildings. "But churches are the best," he said. "Part of what makes the bat poop so special is that it's been sung to this whole time."

The Howard County Arc — a longtime advocacy group for people with mental retardation — was named the Frank M. Adams Outstanding Community Volunteer Service Award recipient during a recent statewide conference.

West Texas Centers for MHMR, who partners with Howard County Arc (Association for Retarded Citizens) on many activities, nominated the advocacy group for the award.

The award was presented June 29 during the 21st Annual Texas Community MHMR Center Staff and Trustee Training Conference in Dallas.

The award is presented annually in three categories: individual, community and media. Individuals and/or organizations are nominated across the state and represent a group who shows a high level of volunteerism.

The Frank M. Adams awards are intended to recognize individuals and organizations that exemplify service that enhances and enriches the quality of life for persons with mental illness and/or mental retardation, according to Shelley Smith, West Texas Centers for MHMR CEO.

"This is a highly recognized award in the state and there is a tremendous amount of competition. We are exceptionally

proud that the Howard County Arc was selected as a winner this year."

The Howard County Arc was organized in 1969 and has thrived under supportive leadership and dedicated volunteers, she said.

Its humble beginnings have expanded to now serve as a valuable financial resource for families who need funding for goods and services that are not paid for through

government programs.

"Rarely do you find a group of people who are more determined and more dedicated to helping others than the Howard County Arc," Smith said. "They took a small but ambitious goal of integrating people with mental retardation into the community and educating the public about their special needs."

"Since 1969, they have grown and evolved into a

major resource for people with special needs in West Texas."

During its inception, Howard County Arc focused on implementing the Special Olympics program and building a vocational workshop. The Howard County Arc bingo program was introduced 20 years after Howard County Arc's inception and since 1988 has become a major source of funding for programs for people with mental retardation.

"Howard County Arc's bingo program is so well-run, it has been recognized statewide as a model program," Smith said.

In addition to directly supporting people with

mental retardation and their families, the Howard County Arc makes regular financial contributions to other human service organizations such as the Alzheimer's Association and the American Cancer Society.

It provided a \$15,000 grant to the Howard County Volunteer Fire Department to purchase specialized equipment. In 2004, the Howard County Arc was recognized as "Volunteer of the Year" through the Special Olympics Program.

The strong partnership developed between West Texas Centers and the Howard County Arc has proven to be successful through the sponsorship of many special events, including specialized activities, parties and the "Hoops, Dreams & Goals" Mental Retardation

Month Basketball Tournament. This past year, Howard County Arc funneled more than \$50,000 into the community to assist individuals and families.

"Although the group is small in numbers, they have remained strong and active and family members have utilized the support structure to provide guidance, strength and advocacy for their loved ones with mental retardation in Howard County and the surrounding communities," Smith said. "They strive to educate the community about mental retardation and the value of integration within a community. Reducing stigma is their number one goal and they work on a daily basis to set the example and be a role model for the community."



Israel hopes violent standoff over captured soldier will yield new cease-fire with Hamas

GAZA CITY, Gaza Strip (AP) — Israel hopes its violent standoff with Hamas over a captured soldier will eventually produce a new cease-fire with the Islamic militants, an Israeli Cabinet minister said Saturday.

Meanwhile, Israeli troops exchanged fire with Palestinian gunmen and army bulldozers searched for militants' tunnels.

Until now, Israel had set only two goals for its military campaign in Gaza — to win the release of the soldier, Cpl. Gilad Shalit, and to halt Palestinian rocket attacks on Israel.

Cabinet minister Ofir Pines-Paz said Saturday that Israel wants to go beyond that.

"We have a great interest in changing the rules of the game," Pines-Paz, a member of the moderate Labor Party and of Israel's Security Cabinet, told Israel Radio. "If we reach a situation in which there are no kidnappings, no rockets, no tunnels, no raids into our territory, certainly Israel will have to reciprocate."

Hamas officials offered contradictory responses.

U.S. envoy offers bilateral meeting with N.Korea on sidelines of informal 6-party talks

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — A U.S. envoy expressed support for China's proposal to hold informal six-party talks on the North Korean nuclear threat and offered to meet bilaterally with North Korea on the sidelines of those discussions.

U.S. envoy Christopher Hill was in Seoul on a tour of regional capitals to coordinate the international response to the North's test-firing of seven missiles on Wednesday. The tests caused an international outrage but also division over whether North Korea should be punished.

Over Chinese and Russian objections, Japan introduced a draft Security Council resolution on Friday that would impose sanctions on North Korea and order a halt to its development of ballistic missiles.

Backed by the United States, Britain and France, the resolution condemns the launches that the North conducted Wednesday despite international warnings against the move.

U.S. military commander completes review of inquiry into alleged cover-up of Haditha case

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — A top U.S. commander who reviewed an investigation into whether the Marines tried to cover up the Haditha case agreed that errors were made, a U.S. military official said.

Lt. Gen. Peter Chiarelli has forwarded his findings and recommendations to Gen. George W. Casey, the top commander in Iraq and the only one superior to Chiarelli.

The investigation was separate from an inquiry still under way into whether a group of Marines killed 24 civilians — including women and children — on Nov. 19 in a revenge attack after a fellow Marine died in a roadside bombing in the town of Haditha.

Chiarelli's report was based on an investigation conducted by Maj. Gen. Eldon Bargewell into whether the Marines from the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment followed proper procedures in reporting the incident to commanders, or whether anyone engaged in a cover-up.

His investigation also may consider whether any criminal charges should be brought.

New Jersey governor ends government shutdown after lawmakers pass state budget

TRENTON, N.J. (AP) — New Jersey Gov. Jon S. Corzine issued an executive order early Saturday ending a weeklong state government shutdown.

The governor acted minutes after lawmakers approved a \$30.9 billion state budget that increases the state sales tax, ending a stalemate that also forced the closing of Atlantic City's casinos.

The 12 casinos, which closed Wednesday, were prepared to resume operations within hours. On Monday, 45,000 furloughed state workers could return to work, although exact plans were not immediately announced. State parks would reopen and lottery sales would resume.

The Senate voted 23-17 to approve the budget at 4:20 a.m. The Assembly followed suit at 5:40 a.m., by a 44-35 vote.

Corzine said he wasn't sure exactly when he would

sign the budget, saying he wanted to take some time to review it.

The budget crisis began when Democrats who control the state Assembly balked at the Democratic governor's proposal to increase the sales tax.

Government announces disruption of terrorist plan to attack New York City train tunnels

NEW YORK (AP) — The terrorist plot, in the words of one FBI official, involved "martyrdom and explosives": suicide bombers who would attack train tunnels used by tens of thousands of commuters in an effort to bring death and flooding to lower Manhattan.

Eight suspects had hoped to pull off the attack in October or November, federal officials said. But federal investigators working with their counterparts in six other countries intervened before the suspects could travel to the United States and become a more serious threat, officials said Friday.

Initial reports said the suspects — including an al-Qaida loyalist arrested in Lebanon and two others in custody elsewhere — wanted to attack the Holland Tunnel, a major thoroughfare that carries cars beneath the Hudson River and into Manhattan.

But officials said the group, with five suspects still at large, had specifically mentioned only the Port Authority Trans-Hudson Corporation train tunnels, which carry more than 215,000 passengers each weekday between New York and New Jersey.

"This is a plot that involved martyrdom and explosives," said FBI Assistant Director Mark J. Mershon.

2 college professors say Flight 93 memorial includes their designs without credit

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Two college professors who submitted a design for a memorial to those who died aboard United Flight 93 on Sept. 11, 2001, say changes made to the winning submission include elements of their entry, and they want credit for them.

But officials with the Flight 93 memorial, to be built on the site of the crash near Shanksville, said any similarities are just coincidence. Many of the more than 1,000 designs that were submitted contained similar themes, they said.

Lisa Austin and Madis Pihlak claim the winning design includes about 10 ideas included in their submission, titled Sacrifice. They include a break in a grove of trees to mark the flight path, a sound element built 93 feet high, the planting of blue coneflowers at the entrance and a curving wetlands path.

The pair said the winning design, created by Los Angeles-based Paul Murdoch Architects, did not originally include anything from their design. However, the Murdoch plan was redesigned last fall to change a crescent shape that some people deemed offensive, and the resulting design included elements of sacrifice, Austin and Pihlak claim.

John Reynolds, chairman of the Flight 93 Advisory Commission, said in a statement that the redesign was based on feedback from the competition juries and many others involved in the project.

Navy and environmental groups settle suit, limiting when and where signals can be used

HONOLULU (AP) — The Navy said it will use active sonar during warfare exercises off Hawaii as early as this weekend, after reaching an agreement with environmentalists who claimed it poses a threat to whales and other sea life.

The settlement reached Friday prevents the Navy from using the sonar within 25 miles of the newly established Northwestern Hawaiian Islands Marine National Monument during its Rim of the Pacific 2006 exercises. It also imposes a variety of methods to watch for and report the presence of marine mammals.

Navy officials have said the value of training to detect stealthy submarines would have been severely diminished without the sonar, which bounces sound off objects in the ocean.

"We want to ensure that the U.S. Navy and its partner navies get the benefit of this opportunity to train in anti-submarine warfare," said Rear Adm. James Symonds, director of environmental readiness.

The Navy hadn't been allowed to activate the sonar under a temporary restraining order issued Monday by U.S. District Court Judge Florence-Marie Cooper in Los Angeles. She lifted the order after the settlement was reached.

There are hands where declarer might appear to be subjecting himself to an unnecessary risk during the play. Yet when these hands are later analyzed, it can often be demonstrated that the so-called risk was not really a risk at all, since it improved declarer's chances without exposing him to any greater jeopardy than he already faced.

For example, consider this deal where South was in four spades and the defense started by taking the first three club tricks. East then shifted to the heart queen, taken by South with the ace.

Declarer cashed the A-K of trumps and then abandoned further trump leads, leaving the jack outstanding. Next he played the A-K of diamonds and a third diamond to the queen. After West discarded a heart, South led his last diamond, ruffed it with dummy's last trump, ruffed a heart in his hand and scored the last two tricks with the Q-6 of spades.

It might seem that declarer was living dangerously when he began playing diamonds while a trump was still out, since one of the diamonds might have been ruffed. Nevertheless, South's line of play was absolutely correct.

If declarer had drawn a third round of trumps, he would have made the contract only if the opposing diamonds were divided 3-3, and he would have failed against the actual distribution. By playing as he did, though, declarer would not only make the contract if the diamonds were 3-3 — in which case he would have drawn the last trump before cashing his fourth diamond — but also if the player with the greater diamond length also held the jack of trumps, as in the actual case.

Of course, if the diamonds were divided unevenly and the player with the diamond shortness held the jack of trumps, South would have gone down one. But in that case, the contract could not be made regardless of what declarer did.

No. 1 Federer to face No. 2 Nadal in Wimbledon final

Federer gets rematch with Nadal on 'his turf'

WIMBLEDON, England — Now Roger Federer gets Rafael Nadal on his turf.

With a performance he deemed flawless, three-time Wimbledon champion Federer won the most lopsided men's semifinal in tournament history, beating Jonas Bjorkman 6-2, 6-0, 6-2 Friday.

Top-ranked Federer's reward? A championship match Sunday against No. 2 Nadal, who got past No. 18 Marcos Baghdatis 6-1, 7-5, 6-3 to extend his surprising run at the All England Club.

Federer is 0-4 against Nadal in 2006, 55-0 against everyone else. But three of the losses came on clay, including in last month's French Open final, and they've never met on grass — where Federer has won a record 47 consecutive matches, including 27 at Wimbledon.

And it's been 54 years since the same two men met in the finals of these two Grand Slam tournaments.

This is how big-time rivalries are born.

"He is the best on all surfaces," Nadal said, "but here more."

That's for sure. Federer will try to join Bjorn Borg and Pete Sampras as the only men since World War I to win four straight Wimbledon titles.

Nadal stands in the way. "I know I can beat him," said Federer, who's won seven major titles. "I don't need to think of playing against him. I need to focus on me playing on grass, my style, playing aggressive. It's going to be easier on grass to do that than on clay."

Clay is slower, grass is slicker, and each make different demands on footwork and shotmaking. That's why it's so rare for players to succeed on both: No man has won the French Open and Wimbledon back-to-back since Borg did it in 1978-80.

Neither woman has won Wimbledon, and Henin-Hardenne will be aiming to complete a career Grand Slam.

Cink fires round to remember, Woods gets back into mix

Chopra leads after two rounds at Cog Hill

LEMONT, Ill. — The way Phil Mickelson sees it, he needs to shoot 7 or 8 under par Saturday to have a chance to win the Western Open.

His focus is on a bigger prize, though: the British Open.

"These next two rounds I'll use as a chance to get my game sharp, hopefully, for the British," Mickelson said.

While Tiger Woods rebounded from a rough opening round at the Western and Stewart Cink jumped into contention with one of the best performances ever at the tournament, Mickelson stumbled with a 3-over 74 Friday.

Woods shot a 4-under 67 during the second round, a day after struggling for a 1 over. Still, he was seven shots behind leader Daniel Chopra, who carded a 5-under 66 to hold a two-stroke lead over Vijay Singh at Cog Hill.

Chopra, who began the day in a four-way tie for the lead, is at 10 under. Singh shot 67 to stand at 8 under. Mickelson, who went into the second round one stroke back, is

now nine behind the leader.

But it was Cink who impressed after a 6-under 29 on the front nine tied the tournament's nine-hole record. His 64 for the round was one off the mark for 18 holes. That put him at 7-under 135 and in a tie for third with Trevor Immelman and Joe Ogilvie.

"I can't remember playing nine holes any better than that," Cink said. "I don't think I missed a shot, and I didn't miss many putts, either."

After shooting 71 in the first round, Cink birdied six of the first nine holes and finished with nine in all. His only blemishes were bogeys on 13 and 18.

Mickelson seemed to answer any questions about his psyche Thursday when he shot a 4 under in his first tournament following his collapse on the final hole of the U.S. Open.

But things came apart early Friday.

Mickelson bogeyed the second third, fourth and fifth holes and was at 4-over 39 through the first nine. He couldn't pinpoint exactly what went wrong, saying, "Things kind of didn't go my way."

"Obviously, I would like to play Rafael, because of the matches we've had in the last couple of months."

Both men were brilliant Friday.

Nadal saved all nine break points he faced against Baghdatis and compiled a 43-16 ratio of winners to unforced errors.

Federer, meanwhile, was simply sublime against the 34-year-old Bjorkman, the oldest Wimbledon semifinalist since 1987 and a player who's greatest success has come in doubles, with eight major championships.

The way Federer played, one wondered whether Bjorkman would have had a chance even if there'd been another player at his side.

"I felt like I played a guy who was as near to perfection as you can play the game," the 59th-ranked Bjorkman said. "I had the best seat in the house."

He did, indeed, as

Federer mixed speeds, volleyed with precision, and alternated serves like a pitcher going from fast-ball to changeup and back again. One of Federer's shots was so hard, it nearly knocked the racket out of Bjorkman's hand.

Federer never faced a break point, went 7-for-9 on his break chances, conjured up 30 winners to only 13 unforced errors, and won 11 games in a row. He's closing in on being the first man to win Wimbledon without dropping a set since Borg in 1976.

"I can't rely on a performance every time (that's) flawless, straight sets, no worries, no break points, all this stuff," Federer said. "A final is always very different because the pressure is much higher."

He should know, having reached the finals of his past 16 tournaments, including five Grand Slams.

If a spot in the Wimbledon final almost feels like a birthright for Federer at this point, no one expected the 20-year-old Nadal to get there this quickly.

Not Federer. Not Nadal. No one.

"Two weeks ago, I didn't even think about this," said Nadal's uncle and coach, Toni. "I am surprised."

Nadal, close to tears after beating Baghdatis, said: "I'm very emotional. It's amazing to be in the finals."

His record 60-match winning streak on clay was built with punishing strokes and unbridled tenacity. But grass doesn't afford him the same amount of time to track down opponents' shots, nor does it allow him to slide into position.

He arrived at Wimbledon with a 5-4 career record on the green staff.

What a quick study. "When he's on defense, he's playing unbelievable," Baghdatis said. "And when he's attacking, the ball is so fast."

After Federer's 77-minute stroll, Nadal and Baghdatis engaged in thrilling exchanges for 2 1/2 hours.

The most spectacular point came when Nadal broke to 3-1 in the third set. He slipped while coralling a drop shot, but Baghdatis' passing attempt clipped the net

and popped up. Nadal rose and swatted a reflex volley to end the point.

Baghdatis — cheered on by people wearing T-shirts reading, "It's in the Bagh" — made one last stand, getting to love-40 while Nadal served at 4-2.

On the third break point, Baghdatis smacked a forehand right near the baseline.

It was called long, but replays showed the ball caught the line. Baghdatis argued a bit, to no avail, and later earned yet another break point but slipped on the muddy baseline, lost the point, and banged his racket on the ground.

At the end, Nadal dropped to his knees, arched his back and raised his arms, the sort of pose usually reserved for winning the title. He or Federer will get to kiss the trophy Sunday.

"If they both bring the tennis we've come to see, how can you ask for more than that?" said Jimmy Connors, who played in classic Wimbledon finals against Borg and John McEnroe. "It's the 1 and 2 players in the world — sweet."

Rangers hand Twins third straight defeat

ARLINGTON (AP) — Michael Young and Gary Matthews Jr. homered, sending the Texas Rangers to a 9-4 victory over the Minnesota Twins Friday night.

Hank Blalock added three hits and three RBIs for the Rangers, who built a big lead for winner John Wasdin.

Joe Mauer, Jason Kubel and Justin Morneau each hit a solo homer for Minnesota, which has lost three straight after an 11-game winning streak. Starting pitcher Carlos Silva left early with a strained knee.

Texas hit a club record and major league-leading 260 homers in 2005, four short of the big league standard, but started the night with only 91 long balls this season — 10th in the AL. The Rangers have started to show some power lately, scoring 18 runs in the past two games and getting 15 extra-base hits.

They scored eight times in the first three innings and Wasdin, a spot starter, was the beneficiary.

Wasdin (2-1) protected the big lead, giving up three runs, seven hits and three walks in five-plus innings to help Texas win for the third time in four games.

Wasdin started in place of Kevin Millwood, who won't take the mound until after the All-Star break while he recovers from a strained right biceps. Millwood, who signed a five-year, \$60 million contract as a free agent last December, is tied with Vicente Padilla for the team lead with eight victories.

Silva (4-9) departed with

a strained right knee in the second inning after struggling in his second consecutive start.

He gave up seven runs and nine hits in 4 1-3 innings to Milwaukee on July 1, and Texas knocked him around for five runs and six hits in 2-3 innings.

The Rangers jumped on Silva in the first inning when Matthews led off with a double and Young ripped a 420-foot homer for a 2-0 edge.

Texas left runners on second and third in the first, and when the Rangers loaded the bases with two outs in the second, Twins trainer Rick McWane and manager Ron Gardenhire went to the mound and removed Silva from the game.

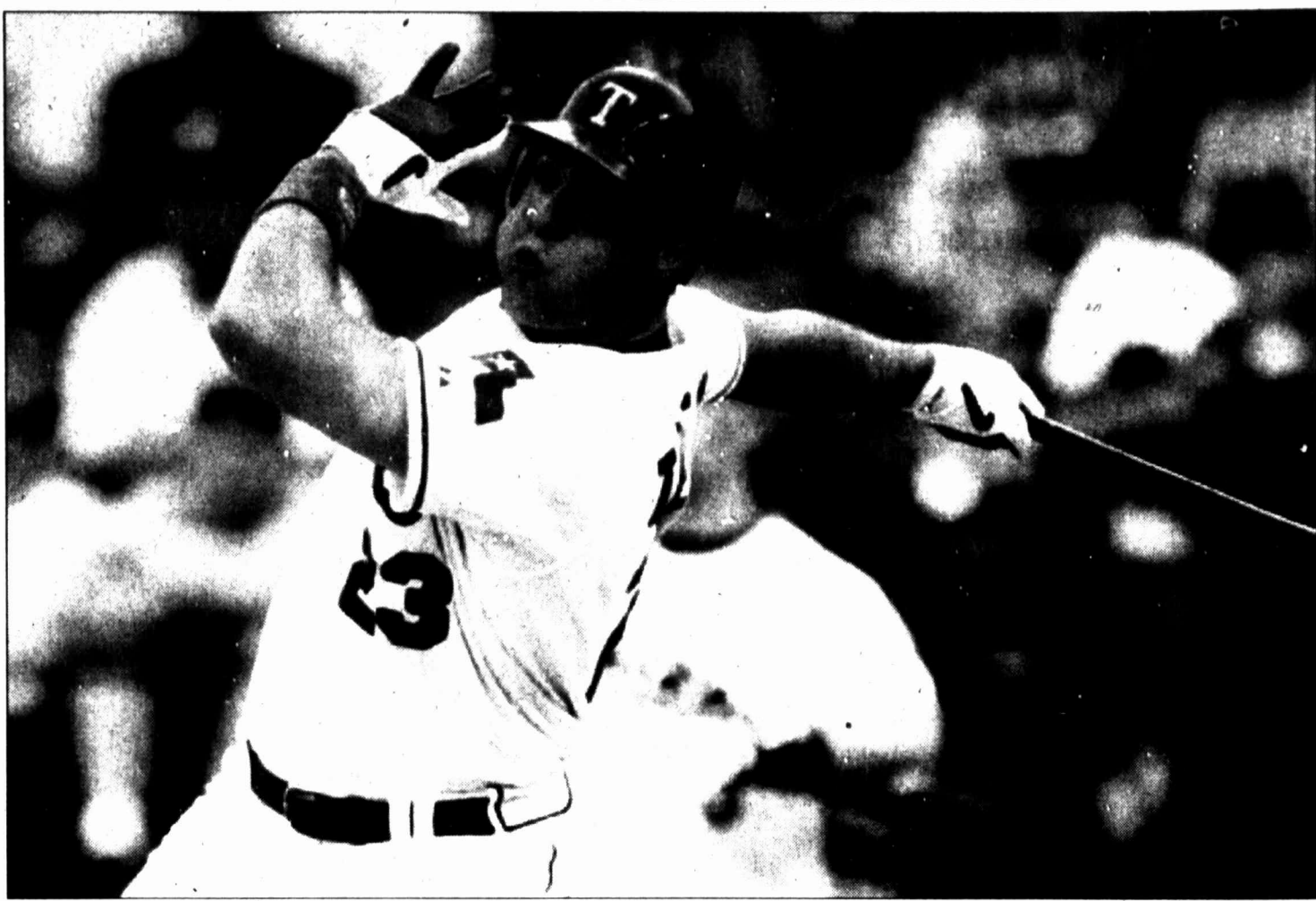
The Twins said Silva caught his spikes on the mound in the first inning and twisted the knee, but he remained in the game and faced five batters in the second. He is day to day.

Mark Teixeira greeted reliever Willie Eyre with a two-run double in the second, and Blalock followed with a two-run single to extend Texas' lead to 6-0.

After Morneau's RBI double produced Minnesota's first run in the third, Matthews' ninth homer in the third off Eyre gave the Rangers an 8-1 advantage.

Mauer's leadoff homer in the fifth and Kubel's leadoff drive in the sixth pulled the Twins to 8-3, but Blalock's run-scoring single in the sixth made it 9-3.

Morneau's solo shot in the seventh off Ron Mahay reduced the deficit to 9-4.



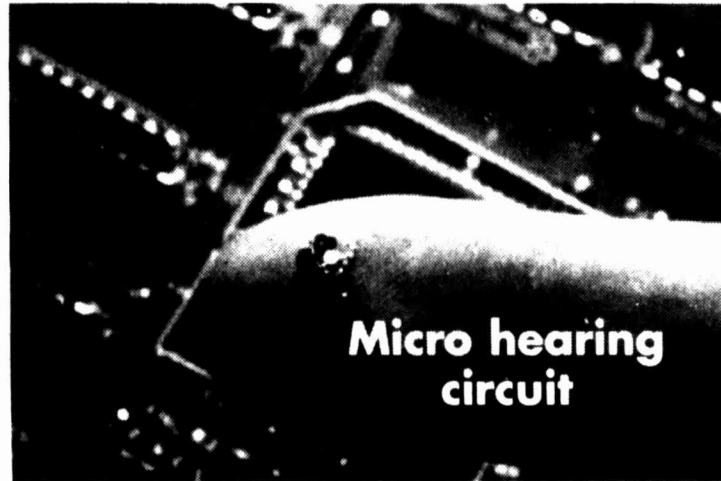

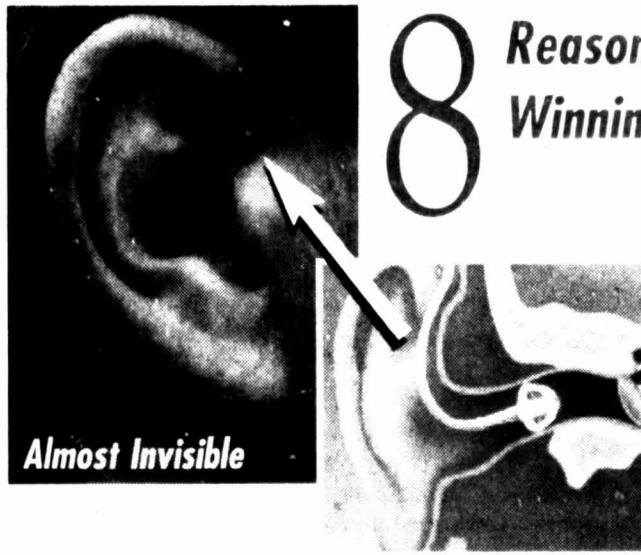

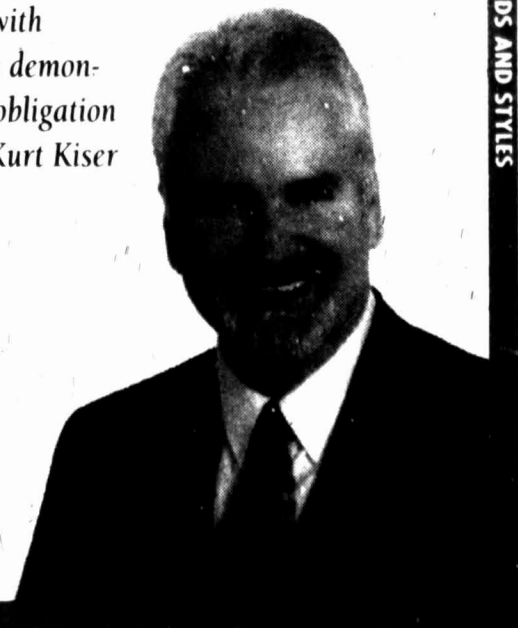

Big-game player?

• Mauresmo gets over big match hump with victory over Justine Henin-Hardenne in women's final of Wimbledon

WIMBLEDON, England — So much for Amelie Mauresmo's reputation for getting tight and failing to win big matches.

Mauresmo rallied from a set down and held firm down the stretch to beat Justine Henin-Hardenne, 2-6, 6-3, 6-4 Saturday to win the Wimbledon title for her second Grand Slam championship.

"I don't want anyone to talk about my nerves anymore," she said.

Mauresmo became the first French women's singles champion at Wimbledon since Suzanne Lenglen won the last of her six titles in 1925.

The top-seeded Mauresmo also stopped No. 3 Henin-Hardenne from completing a career Grand Slam. The Belgian was trying to win the only major title missing from her collection.

It was the second Grand Slam final between the two players this year — and this time there was an outright winner. Henin-Hardenne retired at 6-1, 2-0 down at the Australian Open in January, handing Mauresmo her first major title.

After Henin-Hardenne hit a forehand into the net on the first match point, Mauresmo dropped to her knees on the grass and buried her face in her hands. After the hand-

shake at the net, she climbed into the stands and shared a long, tearful hug with her coach, Loic Courteau.

Mauresmo received the winner's trophy — the Venus Rosewater Dish — from the Duke of Kent and held it high in the air as she received a rousing ovation from the Centre Court crowd.

"It feels great," she told the fans. "I had a great two weeks. I really wanted to win this trophy. It's a great moment for me. This trophy is so special in the world of tennis. I am very proud."

Mauresmo won by playing serve-and-volley grass-court tennis.

"That's what I did for the whole tournament and it seems to be working really well," she said. "That's what I like to do on grass."

It was by no means a classic final. Both players looked tight. For a while, particularly in the second set, it seemed like a match no one wanted to win.

Henin-Hardenne, winner of five Grand Slam titles, is known as a gritty player who doesn't give much away to her opponents. Mauresmo, on the other hand, has for years been burdened as an underachiever who tenses up and fades at crucial moments.

This time, Henin-Hardenne buckled, and Mauresmo didn't falter

when the match was on the line.

The Belgian appeared in control after racing through the first set in 30 minutes in aggressive, net-rushing fashion with two breaks of serve. But her game dipped at the start of the second set and Mauresmo moved out to leads of 3-0 and 4-1.

Both players started making ugly errors, including mis-hits landing several feet out of the court. Henin-Hardenne climbed back to 4-3 on serve, but the Frenchwoman broke back with a crosscourt court forehand passing shot. Mauresmo struggled to hold, saving three break points before serving an ace down the middle to close out the set.

Mauresmo broke for 2-1 in the third set and held the rest of the way, winning 16 of 21 points on serve.

She had two aces (her seventh and eighth) in serving out the match.

Mauresmo finished with 28 winners and 22 errors, while Henin-Hardenne had a 31-20 ratio.

Mauresmo snapped Henin-Hardenne's 17-match winning streak. Henin-Hardenne had also won 13 consecutive Grand Slam matches without losing a set.

The men's final Sunday features the matchup everybody in tennis wanted: No. 1 Roger Federer vs. No. 2 Rafael Nadal.

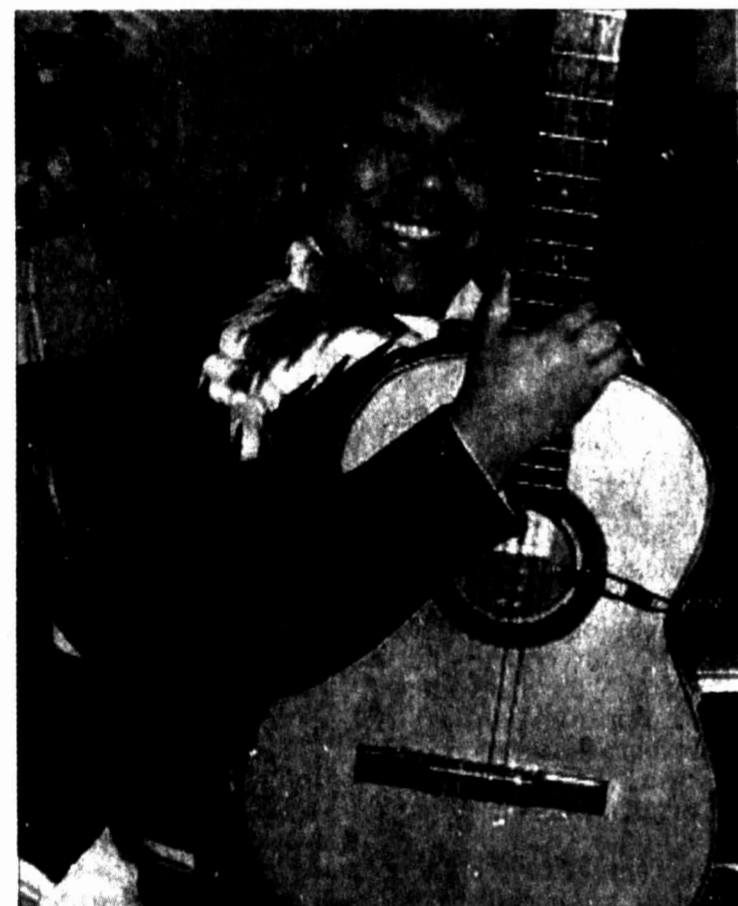
In addition, the band is one of the only Christian mariachi groups in El Paso, and is probably the only Lutheran mariachi group in the world.

Summer dream, strawberries and cream

HYDE PARK, N.Y. — What would summer be without fresh, vine-ripened strawberries? Their unmistakable fragrance and sweet, juicy flesh help make it a magical season.

Sure, they're good eaten straight from the patch. But for a special-occasion treat, try a presentation that's still simple to do, but has a certain flair and a quite glamorous appearance.

Slice a pint and arrange them on a crisp tart shell with velvety pastry cream and you'll find you have created a combination of flavors and textures that can't be beat. Easy to make and a pleasure to eat, the Culinary Institute of America's strawberry cream tart is summer at its best.

The notion of making pastry dough from scratch can sometimes induce panic, but the CIA's tart dough recipe is simple to master. This kind of dough is known as short dough (French chefs call it *pâte sucrée* or *pâte sablee*, "sugary" and "sandy" pastry) and it uses the creaming method, one of the easiest mixing techniques.

The creaming method produces a cookie-like pastry that can hold creamy fillings and custards without turning soggy. It is far more forgiving than the rubbed-dough method used to create flaky pie crusts. The creaming method can be done by hand or with a stand mixer using a paddle attachment. Just blend the butter and sugar until light and creamy, and add the remaining ingredients in sequence to produce a smooth dough.

Assembling a tart with precooked ingredients — as with this one using pastry cream and fresh strawberries — requires baking the crust in advance, a process referred to as blind baking or prebaking.

Kate Cavotti, associate professor in baking and pastry arts at the Culinary Institute of America, offers this advice:

"To blind bake a pastry shell, line the pan with the dough and poke holes in the bottom and sides of the pastry with a fork; this is known as 'docking' the dough. This keeps the pastry from puffing up as it bakes.

"Place the dough-lined tart pan in the refrigerator for 30 minutes or so. Resting the dough in the refrigerator solidifies the butter and relaxes the gluten to prevent shrinkage during baking.

"Next, line the pastry with parchment paper or aluminum foil and fill the pan with pie weights, dried beans or uncooked rice. The weights prevent the bottom of the crust from bubbling up and the sides from collapsing or sliding down during baking.

"Place the pan in a preheated oven and bake the pastry until the dough is just set and the edges look dry, about 10 minutes. Remove the weights and the paper or foil and finish blind baking until the desired color is achieved."

Gather the prepared components in advance — the pastry shell, pastry cream and strawberries — so the tart can be assembled in a few minutes and served immediately.

Brushing the crust with melted chocolate helps to

keep it crisp. However, even with the chocolate layer, the tart will lose its texture contrast if it sits for more than 12 hours before serving. For the best results, serve fresh fruit tarts on the same day they are made.

Strawberry Cream Tart

One recipe Tart Dough (recipe follows)

1/2 cup strawberry jam
1/4 cup melted chocolate (optional)
2 cups Pastry Cream (recipe follows)
2 pints fresh strawberries, hulled and sliced

Heat the jam in a small saucepan over low heat until it is warm enough to strain through a fine-mesh sieve. Strain the jam into a small dish and keep warm.

If using chocolate to line the tart (to help keep it crisp), brush with the melted chocolate. Place the tart shell in the refrigerator so that the chocolate will harden. Remove from the refrigerator and spread the pastry cream in the tart shell in an even layer. Arrange the strawberries over the surface of the pastry cream.

Use a pastry brush to coat the strawberries very lightly with the warm jam. Let the glaze set for about 10 minutes in the refrigerator. If you are not serving the tart immediately, keep it covered and refrigerated for up to 12 hours.

Makes one 8-inch tart, 8 servings.

Tart Dough

8 tablespoons (1 stick) unsalted butter, room temperature

1/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 large egg yolk
1 1/2 cups cake flour, sifted, plus extra for dusting

To make Tart Dough: In a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, cream together the butter, sugar and vanilla extract on medium speed, scraping down the bowl with a rubber spatula as needed, until smooth and light in color, about 2 minutes.

Add the egg yolk and blend until smooth, 1 to 2 minutes more. Add the flour all at once, mixing on low speed until just blended, about 30 seconds. The dough will be

very crumbly when you remove it from the mixer. Use a gentle touch to press the dough into a disk. Wrap the dough tightly and refrigerate for 20 minutes before rolling.

Preheat the oven to 400 F. Roll out the dough and use it to line an 8-inch tart pan. Dock the dough, line it with parchment paper or foil, fill partially with pie weights, and fully blind bake the crust (as previously described). Cool to room temperature in the pan on a wire rack.

Pastry Cream

1/4 cup cornstarch
3/4 cup sugar
2 cups whole milk
4 large egg yolks, lightly beaten
Pinch of salt
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
2 tablespoons unsalted butter

To make Pastry Cream: Combine the cornstarch with 1/4 cup of the sugar in a mixing bowl, and then stir in 1/2 cup of the milk. Blend the yolks into the cornstarch mixture, stirring with a wooden spoon until smooth.

Prepare an ice-water bath by filling a roasting pan or large mixing bowl half full with water and ice; reserve for later use. Combine the remaining 1 1/2 cups milk with the remaining 1/2 cup sugar and the salt in a heavy-bottomed saucepan over medium heat and bring to a boil. Remove pan from heat.

Temper the egg mixture by gradually adding about 1/3 of the hot milk mixture, whisking constantly. Add the remaining milk mixture to the eggs. Return the mixture to the saucepan and continue cooking over medium heat, vigorously stirring with a whisk, until the mixture comes to a boil and the whisk leaves a trail in the pastry cream, 5 to 7 minutes. As soon as the pastry cream reaches this stage, remove from the heat and stir in the vanilla extract and the butter. Place a sheet of plastic wrap directly on the surface of the pastry cream to prevent a skin from forming. Transfer the pan to the ice water bath.

Stir occasionally until the pastry cream is cool, about 30 minutes.

Transfer the pastry cream to a covered storage container and refrigerate until needed, up to 3 days.

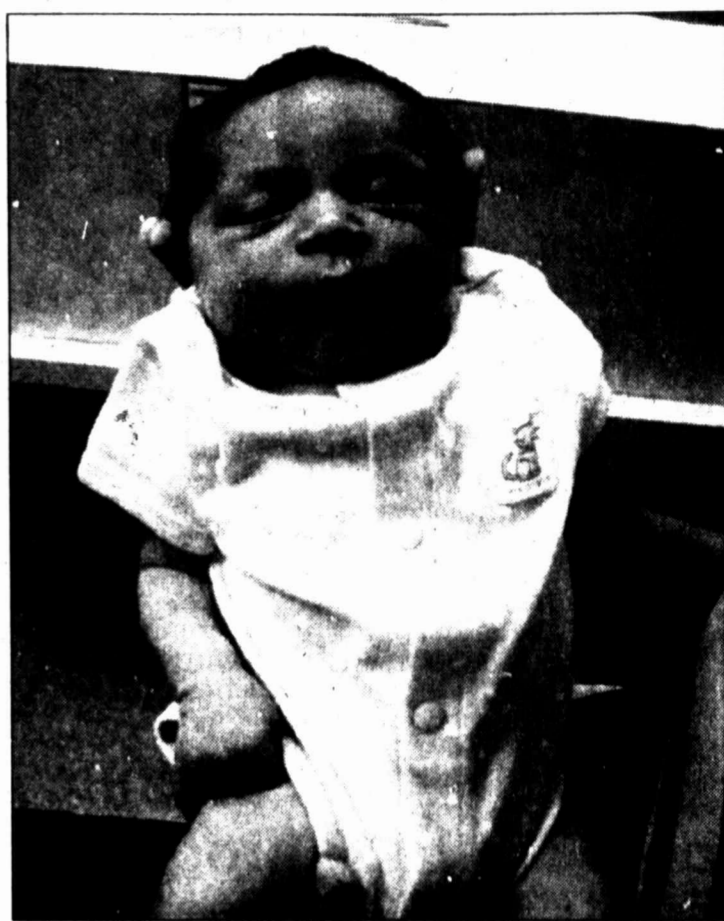

Statistics show it could prevent you from falling into bankruptcy

PHOENIX, Ariz. — The bills keep piling up, and the paychecks seem to disappear more quickly. You're on the brink of bankruptcy, now what?

Mike Sullivan, director of education for Take Charge America, a non-profit credit counseling agency, says it's

time to stop making excuses and seek help.

"There's a point many consumers will reach when they realize that the burden of their bills will just be too much to bear," he said. "Their choice of actions at that moment may determine whether this turning point will result in something better or worse."

New statistics show those who seek help may be better off than those who don't. A recently released report from the Consumer Federation of America and American Express reveals the benefits of early debt management programs (DMPs).

The study, conducted at Georgetown University's Credit

Research Center, found consumers who were recommended for a DMP by a credit counseling agency and chose to start making payments had a significantly lower incidence of bankruptcy. Moreover, these consumers had improved bankruptcy and delinquency risk scores over the next two years, compared to those who did not

start a DMP.

"If you can tell that your financial future is hazy, it's best to take early action," said Sullivan. "If you don't see a credit counselor before entering bankruptcy, you'll be forced to once you file."

Last fall, new bankruptcy

Lockheed's new fighter named Lightning II

FORT WORTH (AP) — Three months before it takes to the sky, the United States' next military fighter plane has a name: Lightning II.

The first copy of the plane was unveiled with much fanfare Friday at Lockheed Martin Corp.'s assembly plant, where the plane, also called the joint strike fighter, is being built.

"What a fantastic-looking flying machine," said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. T. Michael Moseley. "We put the enemies of peace and freedom on notice."

The first copy of the plane is parked in a hangar alongside a runway at the sprawling Lockheed facility.

It is scheduled to begin test flights in October and be ready for use by the Marine Corps in 2012, the Air Force and Navy a year later, and U.K. forces in 2014.

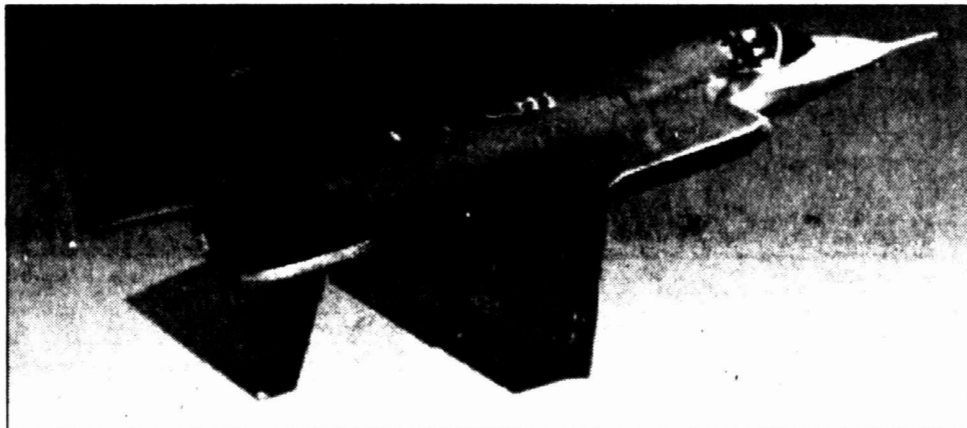
Lockheed Martin, which won a \$19 billion contract from the Pentagon in 2001, touts the plane as the most powerful single-engine fighter ever built. The finished product is expected to cost \$45 million to \$60 million apiece.

Lightning II is designed to replace the F-16 and several other fighters now used by the U.S. and U.K. militaries. Its name harkened back to two planes of World War II vintage and named Lightning, the Lockheed P38 and a British fighter.

Lockheed hopes to sell more than 2,500 copies to the U.S. and U.K. militaries and hundreds more to eight allies who have been given subcontracting work on the plane.

The Pentagon picked Lockheed and subcontractors Northrop Grumman and BAE Systems over a team led by Boeing Co. in 2001.

Parts of the fuselage are being built in Fort Worth, Palmdale, Calif., and in England, with final assembly in Fort Worth. The first plane was finished in February and has been undergoing testing in the hangar before trial flights begin in October.



After conventional takeoff and landing this fall, the plane is scheduled to try short takeoff and vertical landing by early 2008. A carrier version is expected to be ready for testing by 2009.

Premium Standard Farms president resigns

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Pork processor Premium Standard Farms Inc. said Friday its president has stepped down.

The nation's second-largest pork producer gave no reason for the departure of Robert Manly, who is also the company's chief operating officer, saying only that he resigned to pursue other opportunities.

John Meyer, Premium Standard's chief executive officer, will assume the presidency in addition to his current responsibilities. There were no plans to name a new chief operating officer, the company said.

Lay funeral services set

HOUSTON (AP) — Two memorial services have been scheduled for Enron Corp. founder Kenneth Lay, who died of heart disease this week, in Aspen, Colo., and Houston.

A small, private memorial service will take place Sunday afternoon at the Aspen Chapel just outside the northern city limits of Aspen, family spokeswoman Kelly Kimberly

said in a statement. Lay died Wednesday in the western Colorado ski resort town where he and his wife, Linda, were vacationing.

A second memorial service will be held Wednesday at First United Methodist Church in downtown Houston.

Kimberly added Friday that attendance at both services will be restricted to friends and family. Reporters will not be allowed to attend.

Lay, 64, died just six weeks after he and former Enron CEO Jeffrey Skilling, 52, were convicted in May of defrauding Enron investors and employees through repeated lies about the company's financial health before the energy giant crumbled into bankruptcy protection in December 2001. Thousands of workers lost their jobs and investors lost billions.

RadioShack names new CEO

FORT WORTH (AP) — Friday, RadioShack Corp. named former Kmart and Sears executive Julian Day as chairman and chief executive officer.

Day, 54, replaces David Edmondson, who resigned in February because of questions about claims on his resume. Claire Babrowski, the company's president and chief operating officer, has served as acting CEO since Edmondson's departure.

Laws made it more difficult to erase credit card and other debts in a bankruptcy. They also made seeing a credit counselor a requirement for those who file for Chapter 7 or Chapter 13 bankruptcy.

So, how do you know if it's time for you to visit a credit counselor? Sullivan sets forth seven signs that you should look for when deciding if credit counseling is right for you:

You can't meet the minimums — High-interest credit card debt plagues millions. In fact, the credit card industry says the average American household owes more than \$9,000 in credit card debt. If missing the minimum payments is the norm for you, rather than the exception, you may need to visit a credit counselor.

You spend more than you take home in your paycheck — Take time to add up all of your expenses for one month. And yes, that means even your morning latte, movie rentals and other seemingly "trivial" expenses. You may be surprised just how much money you are actually spending. If quick fixes in your daily routine won't remedy the situation, get advice from a professional.

Collection agencies have your home phone number on speed dial — This may seem like a no-brainer to some; for others, the sense of being overwhelmed may prevent them from seeking help. Just remember, creditors won't stop calling, so it is best to deal with the situation before it gets any worse.

You lose your job — Unpredictable situations often force people into

more debt than they can handle. If a new job is not on the horizon and your credit card bills are piling up, you need to come up with a plan. Consider seeking professional assistance sooner, rather than later.

You regularly pay bills late — Late bills can have a negative affect on your credit score, which can in turn prevent you from receiving loans for a home or car. Don't make a habit of paying late. The late fees can be astronomical. Get help and do it fast.

You must use a credit card just to pay for daily necessities like food and gas — Credit cards should not be used as free-for-alls. A few bucks here and a few bucks there can eventually land you in serious debt. Using the card as a choice when you have the cash available is OK.

You need to use the cash advance from one credit card to pay another — This is a sure fire sign that you're in over your head with high-interest debt. Making payments this way is not getting you out of debt; you're likely sinking further into it and need help.

"Don't wait to seek financial help until all of these signs apply to you," said Sullivan. "If you find yourself in one or two of these scenarios, find help before matters turn worse. And trust me; they can turn worse very quickly."

Tapped and raiding the DVD collection

With this weekend's release of "Pirates of the Caribbean: Dead Man's Chest," the obvious impulse is to run right out and see the second film in what is sure to become a Hollywood blockbuster.

However, following my last few trips to the theaters, along with my daughter's trips to the concession stand — not to mention the July Fourth holiday — I find my wallet as empty as most politicians' heads. So nix that idea, at least for now.

Knowing I'm certainly not the only person in America feeling this way — it cost \$50 to fill up my Jeep, and I'm just waiting for what our children will someday call the "gas riots of the new millennium" — what better time to dive into my DVD collection and spin some of my favorites.

With that in mind, here are five movies no collection should be without — in my opinion, of course.

"Pulp Fiction"

This 1994 film, written and directed by a then little known Quentin Tarantino, remains one of the most quoted and referenced films of the 20th Century. You would practically have to be born under a rock not to have already heard of this film, or heard the catch phrase, "I'm sorry, did I break your concentration?"

Starring a slew of Hollywood heroes, including John Travolta, Samuel L.

Jackson, Bruce Willis, Uma Thurman and Ving Rhames — just to name a few — this movie literally redefined a genre.

Pumpkin (Tim Roth) and Honey Bunny (Amanda Plummer) are two thieves who, while dining at a coffee shop, decide that the best

ven together in a non-linear fashion that is both entertaining and surprising. Also, the retro style the film reaches for not only heightens the films overall effect, it becomes a character in its own right.

"The Big Lebowski"

I've seen this film well over 300 times since it was released in

1998, and even now, when I've had about as bad a day as a reporter can have, I race to the comfort of these silly, yet seemingly real characters.

Jeffrey "The Dude"

Lebowski (Jeff Bridges) is the ultimate Los Angeles slacker, until one day his house is broken into and his rug is peed on by two angry gangsters who have mistaken him for Jeffrey Lebowski (David Huddleston), the LA millionaire whose wife owes some bad people

some big money.

The Dude becomes entangled in the plot when he goes to visit the real Lebowski in order to get some retribution for his soiled rug and is recruited to be the liaison between Lebowski and the captors of his now "kidnapped" wife, played by Tara Reid.

What ensues is a mess that not only entertains, but provides a subtle reminder that no matter how many times the dog gets out of the fence or your boss yells at you, things can get so much worse.

And while Bridges' per-

formance is deserving of an award, it's The Dude's pal Walter — played by John Goodman — that steals the show for me. Much like that crazy friend we all have, unpredictable in nature and slightly neurotic, Goodman turns in the performance of a life time.

"Tombstone"

OK, so I'm not much on westerns, but when it comes to 1993's "Tombstone," you don't have to be.

Directed by George Cosmatos and written by Kevin Jarre, the film's depiction of the old west and many historical notables, including the likes of Wyatt Earp (Kurt Russell), Doc Holliday (Val Kilmer) and Johnny Ringo (Michael Biehn).

After success cleaning up Dodge City, Wyatt Earp moves to Tombstone, Ariz., with plans to get rich in obscurity. He meets his brothers, Virgil (Sam Elliot) and Morgan (Bill Paxton) there, as well as his old friend Doc Holliday.

A band of outlaws that call themselves "The Cowboys" are causing problems in the region with various acts of random vi-

olence, and inevitably come into confrontation with Holliday and the Earps, which leads to a shoot-out at the OK Corral.

The film also features the talents of Powers Boothe, Stephen Lang and Thomas Haden Church, who all turn in stellar performances.

Some films shine because one actor carries it, but "Tombstone" isn't one of those films.

"The Last Samurai"

I was apprehensive, at best, before seeing a film set in Japan, about the samurai and starring Tom Cruise. Don't get me wrong. Cruise is a tremendous actor, probably one of the best of our generation, but it was hard to imagine him portraying a samurai.

Boy, was I wrong.

Certainly one of the best films since the turn of the century, 2003's "The Last Samurai" holds a place in my heart very similar to "Braveheart," taking a broad sweep of war, from the violence to the heartfelt pains battle leaves men and women with.

Algren is captured by the Samurai and soon becomes part of the village he is being held captive in and find's that the lines between the warring factions are blurred, at best, as he trains to become a Samurai with the very people we once called his enemies.
