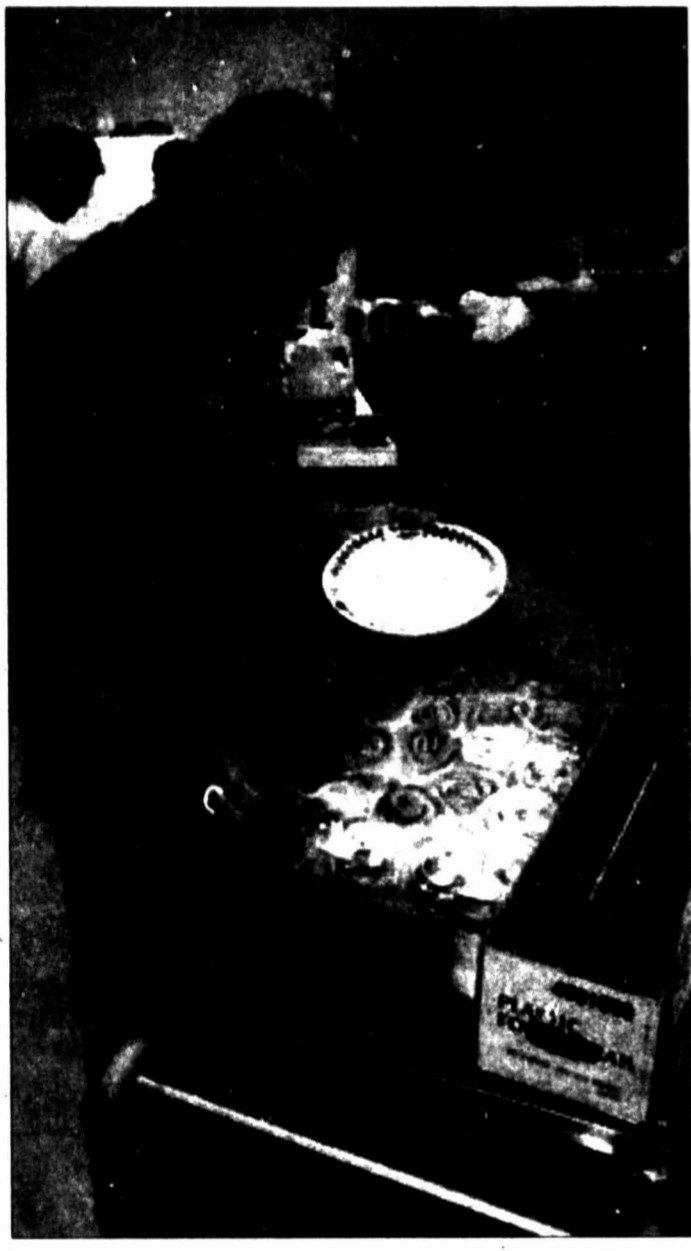

The 2006-2007 budget and tax rate will take center stage Monday when trustees with the Forsan Independent School District convene in their regular meeting.

Teachers with the school district are expected to get their first look at salaries for the upcoming year, according to FISD Superintendent Randy Johnson.

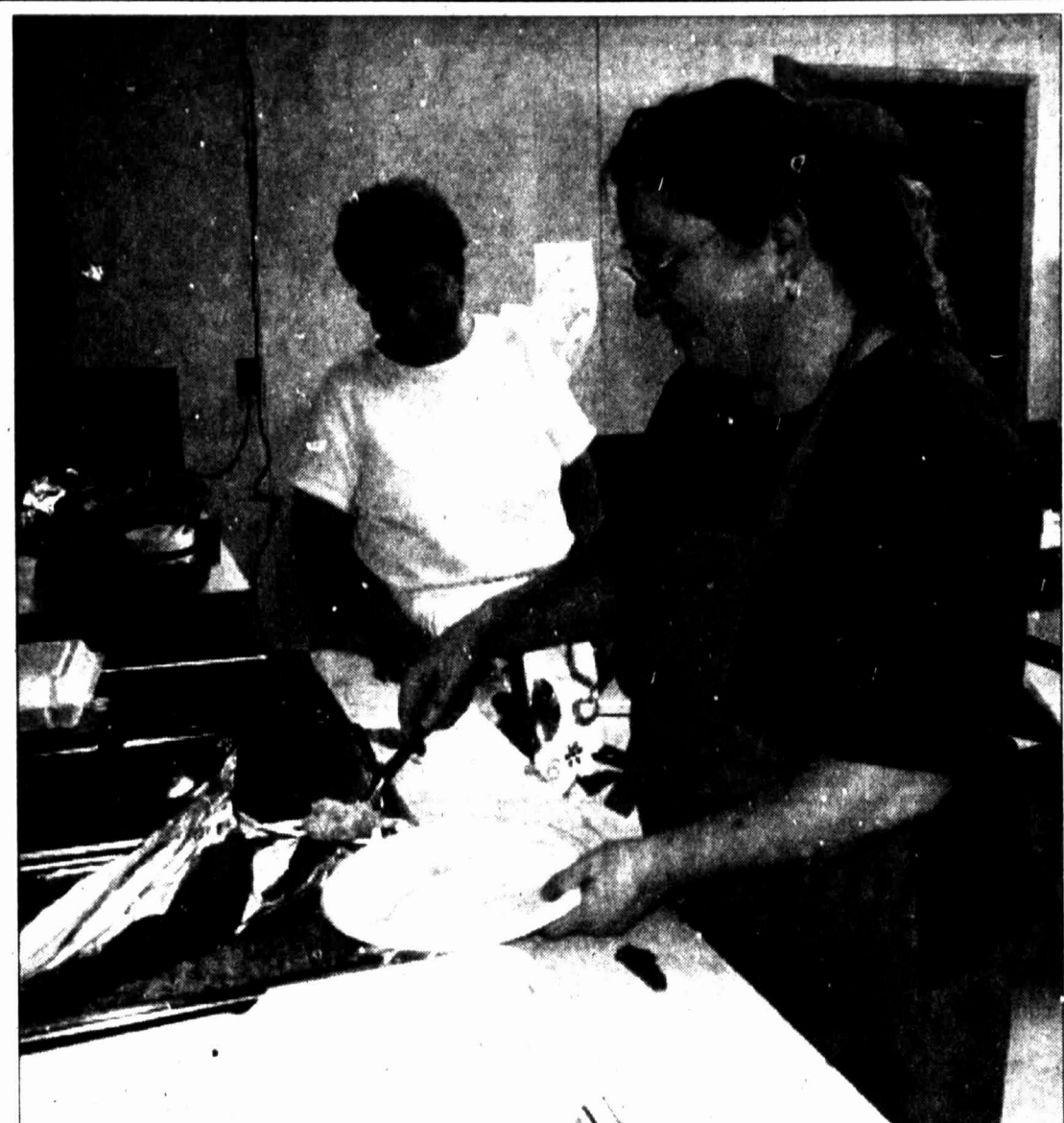

things." Johnson said preliminary talks have the tax rate at approximately \$1.37 per \$100 valuation plus an additional fee for debt service — a number he expects to see from a lot of different school districts this year.

"The entire terminology has changed this year," said Johnson. "The whole process is different. Most school districts are going to be looking at the \$1.33 maximum rate with the 4-cent option and coming up with these exact same numbers. If a district decides to go over that number this year, they will be forced to take it to a rollback election." Among the items expect-

ed to be discussed during the meeting are: Superintendent's report, including information on facilities and bond projects, payment of bills, salary schedule and budget overview, Howard County Consolidated Tax Appraisal District budget, an update on RCCI (Rural Community College Initiative) activities and purchase of a school vehicle.

• Consideration of junior high and high school student handbooks and student code of conduct for 2006-2007.
• Consideration of elementary school student handbooks and student code of conduct for 2006-2007.

Atkins' will be sorely missed as VAMC chief

Members of the community and Big Spring VA Medical Center employees said good-bye to Lou Ann Atkins during a reception in her honor Friday. She leaves Big Spring after serving for two years as director of the facility — a time that seems without question perhaps the most trying for the hospital.

However, Atkins leaves for a new VA facility in Ann Arbor, Mich., with the hospital here in excellent shape.

Atkins was officially named director of the Big Spring VAMC on July 11, 2004, just as the Department of Veterans Affairs' CARES (Capital Asset Realignment for Enhanced Services) process seemed to be pointing to curtailed services being offered in Big Spring or, even worse, the possible closure of the facility.

Instead, following approximately two years of study and uncertainty, it was announced earlier this year that the Big Spring VA Medical Center would not only be staying open, but would be expanding its services.

While Atkins gives much of the credit for that decision to members of the community who worked hard to make sure the facility stayed open, there is no question in our minds that her leadership was paramount in the process.

As she made clear during Friday's reception, the key to surviving the CARES process was staying focused on what mattered most — serving the veterans of West Texas.

"The CARES process was something we, as a facility, didn't have control over," Atkins noted. "It was a Congressionally-mandated review of all VA facilities, and we knew that study was going to happen no matter what we did."

As a result, Atkins made sure her staff did what it was supposed to do. They provided the best health-care they could to veterans and let the CARES process take care of itself. There was probably no better way to display just how important the Big Spring VAMC is, than to do a good job of what it was supposed to do.

Atkins says she believes the staff at the hospital will continue to do its work well, and that "with the community's support, there are great things ahead for the facility."

We agree.

But Atkins' leadership will be missed. We're sure of that.

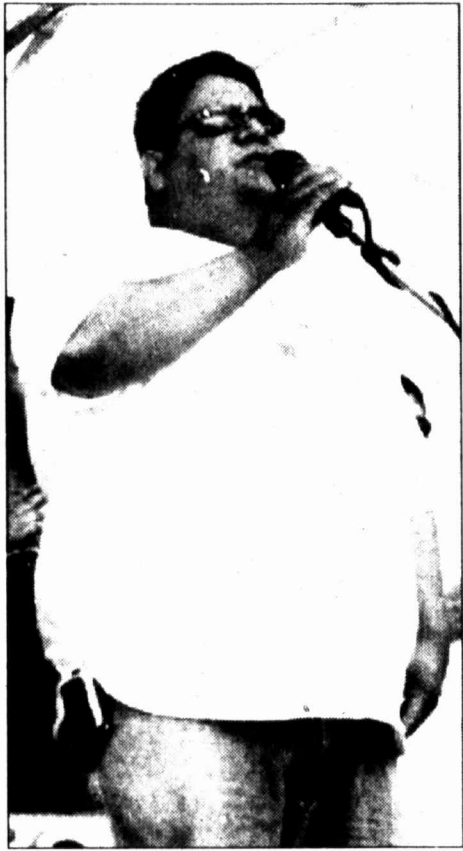

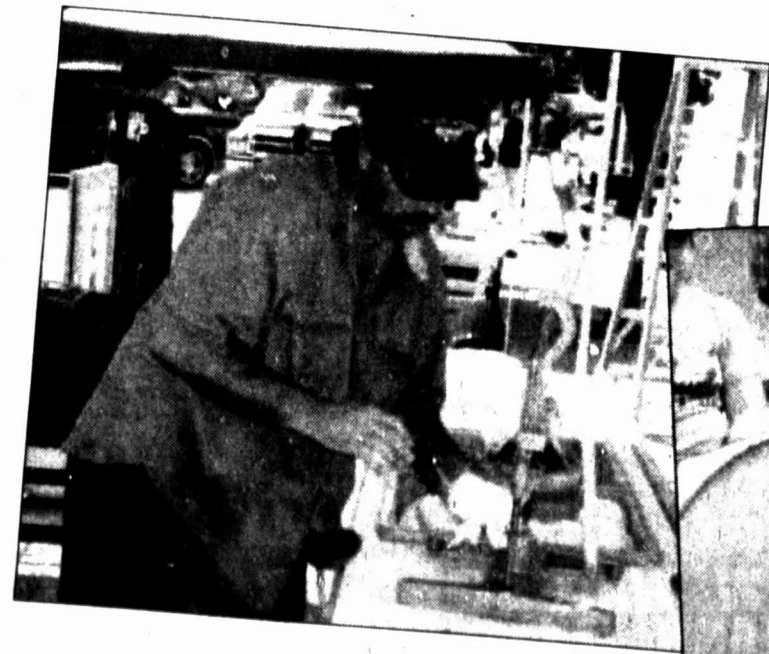

Small businesses worry about new state tax

AUSTIN (AP) — A platter of ribs, potato salad and beans will probably cost 35 cents more at Green Mesquite Barbecue next year, and the owner of the popular eatery blames the state's new business tax.

"If I have to pay an extra \$3,000 to \$4,000 a year in taxes, I'm going to have to raise my rates," said owner Tom Davis. "There's no way around it."

In fact, many small businesses in Texas expect to absorb the biggest impact from the state's new tax structure. That could mean higher rates for Texans on a lot more than a plate of barbecue.

"When small businesses are going through crunch time,

we're not like the big corporations that can just lob off big chunks of overhead," said Kurt Summers, who owns Austin Generator Service. Summers expects a lofty increase in his annual tax bill, too.

The Legislature approved the new tax format this spring, bringing in new business tax money to replace local school property taxes that would be cut. The tax takes effect next year, and the first due date for businesses is May 2008.

The new law changes a system under which only one in every 16 Texas businesses is estimated to pay the tax. Most Texas businesses, including Dell Inc., use well-known

accounting tricks to avoid paying the tax.

But many small business owners worry they'll carry the burden. They fear big companies with a lot of land and property will get a net tax cut when the new hike is coupled with property tax reductions.

"I think small businesses by and large want to and are willing to pay their fair share," said Will Newton, state director of the National Federation of Independent Business. "But if it comes down to paying for property tax reductions for mega-corporations, they have a little heartburn over that."

Experts say the tax will be favorable to capital intensive

industries, or those with a lot of land and equipment like the oil and gas industry. Service-oriented businesses, like accounting and law firms, will have a harder time and are more likely to raise their rates, said Jimmy Martens, an Austin attorney who specializes in state tax law.

Businesses will be taxed at 1 percent — 0.5 percent for retailers — of gross receipts, which is the total amount of money a company brings in before expenses. Companies can choose between deductions for cost of goods or employee benefits like salary and health care. Sole proprietors and general partnerships are exempt.

Companies with annual gross receipts of \$300,000 or less also are exempt.

Lawmakers spent years trying to fix the loophole-ridden franchise tax. They stumbled over how to structure a new tax within legal constraints that would apply equally to different business structures. And business-friendly Republicans were hesitant to levy a new tax that could be harmful to job creation and economic growth.

"The people of Texas need to understand that the Legislature was faced with a very serious challenge on a lot of different levels," said Bill Hammond, president of Texas Association of Business.

State's park chief says 18 parks may close

AUSTIN (AP) — Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officials are warning that 18 state parks may close if lawmakers don't spare the struggling agency from mandatory budget cuts ordered by Gov. Rick Perry.

Dozens of full-time jobs may also vanish and local parks would suffer \$4 million in cutbacks if the department complies with Perry's request for state agencies to trim budgets by 10 percent, executive director Robert Cook said Friday.

"I'm not (saying) this because I want to scare anybody — but these are some of the things we're seriously looking at," he said.

Cook delivered the grim outlook to a special committee examining the ongoing shortfalls of the 600,000-acre state park system. Agency officials say a tight budget has forced 100 positions to be eliminated or left unfilled and that aging equipment is deteriorating under a backlog of repairs.

Texas ranks 49th among the 50 states in per capita spending on parks. The agency's current budget is \$56 million, and its new appropriations request is due to lawmakers Aug. 16.

A spokeswoman for Perry said the governor opposes the shutdown of historical sites, but that the agency should consider options for parks that receive few visitors.

"The governor has an excellent relation with Parks and Wildlife (and) the governor does have a concern about the adequacy of funding for the parks department," spokeswoman Kathy Walt said.

Cook told his agency's State Parks Advisory Committee that forced

budget cuts could mean the loss of 44 full-time positions and the absence of game warden cadet classes during the next two years.

He didn't say which parks may close but said the focus would be on historical sites that traditionally attract the fewest visitors.

Ex-campus president arrested

BROWNSVILLE (AP) — The former president of a South Texas vocational school was arrested on charges of embezzling more than \$13,000 in financial aid from students.

Reynaldo Garcia, 44, allegedly took financial aid from 13 students at the South Texas Vocational Technical Institute. He owned the campus from 1993 until 2002.

Garcia was being held without bond and did not have an attorney as of late Friday.

The original owner of the campus said she took the school back from Garcia after he kept his students' money and did not pay staff for more than a month.

"He was a model employee," said Elma Rodriguez, who sold the school to Garcia. "I don't know what happened to him."

Dynamite thieves receive tough sentences

FORT WORTH (AP) — Three men who stole dozens of dynamite sticks from a rock quarry received tougher sentences from a federal judge than prosecutors had sought.

Bryan Newsom, 22, was sentenced to three years and five months in prison Friday for taking 103 sticks of dynamite and a box of blasting caps from a Weatherford quarry. The Jan. 22 theft led to an intense 17-hour pursuit by authorities.

James Hardin, 19, and Brett Garrett, 20, received two years and three months in prison. Both had previously worked at the quarry.

Prosecutors had told Judge John McBryde they weren't pursuing excessive sentences because investigators determined the explosives weren't going to be used for terrorism or another crime.

McBryde characterized Newsom as "an almost one-man crime wave" who traded drugs for firearms.

Israeli airstrikes hit bridges, gas stations

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Israeli warplanes pounded Hezbollah's south Beirut stronghold and struck roads around the country Saturday, killing at least 18 Lebanese fleeing the onslaught. Hezbollah rockets continued to pour into Israel, where officials warned citizens that Tel Aviv could be hit.

The deadly barrages came as Israel charged that Iran, the main sponsor of Hezbollah militants, has 100 troops in Lebanon providing Hezbollah key support — including helping fire a missile Friday that badly damaged an Israeli warship. Hezbollah denied it.

Neither side showed signs of backing down from the conflict, which erupted Wednesday when Hezbollah captured two Israeli soldiers in a cross-border raid. As civilian deaths mounted, diplomatic efforts to end the crisis had yet to get off the ground.

President Bush, on a trip to Russia, said it was up to

Hezbollah rockets hit city well inside Israel

JERUSALEM (AP) — A second round of Hezbollah rockets hit an Israeli city 22 miles south of the border with Lebanon Saturday, Israeli rescue services said. There was no immediate word of injuries in Tiberias, a resort city well inside Israel on the Sea of Galilee. An earlier barrage was the first attack on Tiberias since the 1973 Mideast War.

Residents were ordered into bomb shelters, and Israeli media reported that hundreds of tourists were fleeing the city. Four Israeli civilians have been killed in rocket attacks that began Wednesday after Israel launched an offensive in response to a Hezbollah raid into Israel that captured two Israeli soldiers and killed eight.

Hezbollah "to lay down its arms and to stop attacking." Arab foreign ministers gathered in Cairo but fell into squabbling after moderate states, led by Saudi Arabia, denounced Hezbollah for starting the fight.

France decided to send a ferry from Cyprus to evacuate thousands of its citizens from Lebanon — the first nation to do so. The move signaled the West expects a drawn-out battle. The U.S. Embassy in Beirut said Saturday it was looking into ways to get Americans to

Cyprus after Israeli strikes closed down the airport.

Police said a 106 people, mostly civilians, have been killed in Lebanon in the four-day Israeli offensive. On the Israeli side, at least 15 have been killed, four civilians and 11 soldiers.

Israel has targeted Lebanon's highways and airport to cut off the country from the outside world and at the same time hit Hezbollah strongholds, usually in populated areas, such as the Hezbollah leader's home and office in south

Beirut Friday night.

Hezbollah in turn has unleashed rockets on northern Israel with increasing sophistication. Five rockets hit Tiberias on Saturday, the first such attack on the Israeli city, 22 miles south of the border, since the 1973 Mideast War. The rockets caused no injuries.

An Israeli intelligence official said Hezbollah has missiles with ranges of 60 to 120 miles that could reach Tel Aviv, Israel's largest metropolitan area. The Israeli officials spoke on condition of anonymity because of the sensitivity of the information.

The strike on the warship off Beirut's coast Friday night was the first direct Hezbollah hit on Israel's military since Wednesday's raid. Israel said the strike was carried out with an Iranian-made, radar-guided C-102, missile. Earlier, the military said the ship was hit by an unmanned, remote-controlled aircraft loaded with explosives.

Drugs seized at checkpoint

KINGSVILLE (AP) — Border Patrol agents assisted by the Texas National Guard seized more than 2 tons of marijuana from a tractor trailer at an inland immigration checkpoint, U.S. Customs and Border Protection said Friday.

The seizure occurred Thursday at the Sarita checkpoint, after a drug sniffing dog alerted authorities to the tractor trailer.

Guard members assisted the Border Patrol in finding 4,227 pounds of marijuana valued at \$3.4 million in a false compartment under the load of cottonseed hulls and plywood.

The driver, a 36-year-old from Santa Rosa, was arrested.

'Thank you, Jesus' puts man in jail

HONOLULU (AP) — Junior Stowers raised his hands and exclaimed, "Thank you, Jesus!" in court last month when he was acquitted by a jury of abusing his son.

But his joy was short-lived when Judge Patrick Border held him in contempt of court for the "outburst" and threw him in jail.

Stowers, 47, sat in the courtroom and a cellblock for about six hours until the judge granted him a hearing on the contempt charge and released him.

The judge at a July 7 hearing dropped the contempt charge, a petty misdemeanor that carries up to 30 days in jail. Court minutes said Border had realized Stowers' trial lawyer did not have time to tell Stowers the judge had ordered both sides not to show emotion when the verdict was announced.

Stowers was charged with hitting his 15-year-old son with a broomstick in January. The misdemeanor charge of abusing a household member carries a sentence of up to a year in jail.

During trial, the boy recanted, according to court records. The boy instead testified his brother hit him with a car door, a story his brother verified in court.

Stowers couldn't be reached for comment. But his attorney in the contempt case, Deputy Public Defender Susan Arnett, said he wasn't treated fairly.

"I don't think there's anything about saying 'Thank you, Jesus' that rises to the level of contemptuous behavior in this case," she told *The Honolulu Advertiser*.

Bush blames Hezbollah, Syria for Mideast violence

ST. PETERSBURG, Russia (AP) — President Bush Saturday blamed the Islamic militant group Hezbollah and a compliant Syria for the escalating violence in the Middle East, taking a sharper stance than Russian President Vladimir Putin.

At a joint news conference, Bush held Israel blameless while Putin criticized Israel's military response.

"The best way to stop the violence is for Hezbollah to lay down its arms and to stop attacking. And therefore I call upon Syria to exert influence over Hezbollah," Bush said about the flare-up that

could overshadow this weekend's meeting of world powers.

The U.S. pressed for the Group of Eight's approval of a statement identifying Hezbollah as the main culprit and emphasizing the importance of maintaining a democratic Lebanon.

White House aides said it appeared to be gaining support.

Bush and Putin announced a series of agreements — from more cooperation in fighting acts of nuclear terrorism and in storing spent nuclear waste to setting up a U.S.-Russia foundation to

help modernize Russia's economy.

But talks broke down on Russia's bid to gain U.S. support to join the World Trade Organization, delivering a disappointing blow to Putin as Russia hosted the annual big-power economic summit for the first time.

While Bush had promised not to lecture Putin publicly on human and political rights, the two presidents exchanged pointed comments on the state of democracy in Russia.

"I talked about my desire to promote institutional change in parts of the world

like Iraq where there's a free press and free religion, and I told him that a lot of people in our country would hope that Russia would do the same thing," Bush said.

Putin replied: "We certainly would not want to have the same kind of democracy as they have in Iraq. I can tell you quite honestly."

"Just wait," Bush said.

Both called for an end to the Middle East violence.

Israel launched its offensive after Hezbollah guerrillas crossed the Israel-Lebanon border and captured two Israeli soldiers Wednesday.

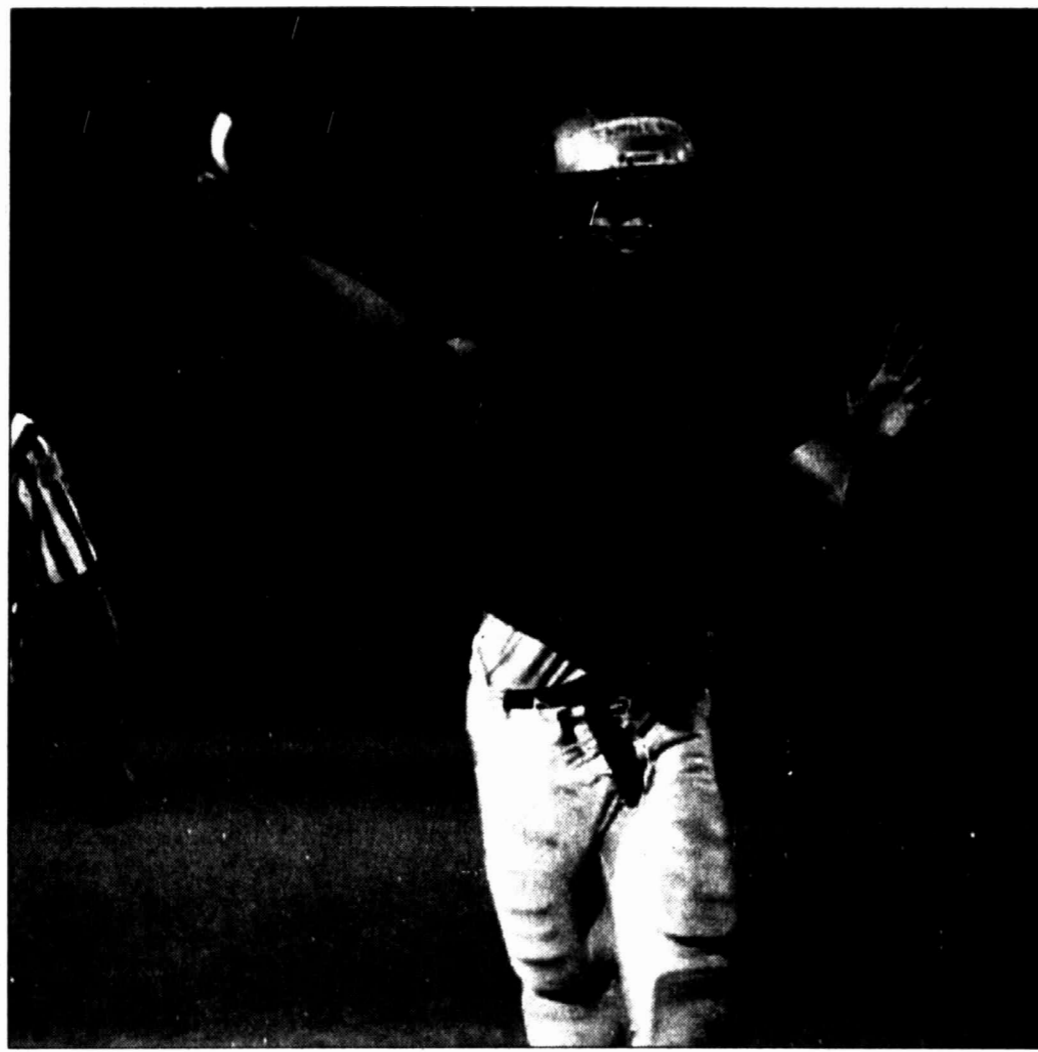

Amy Moore of Stamford will be the new girl's track coach. She has also coached at Fort Stockton.

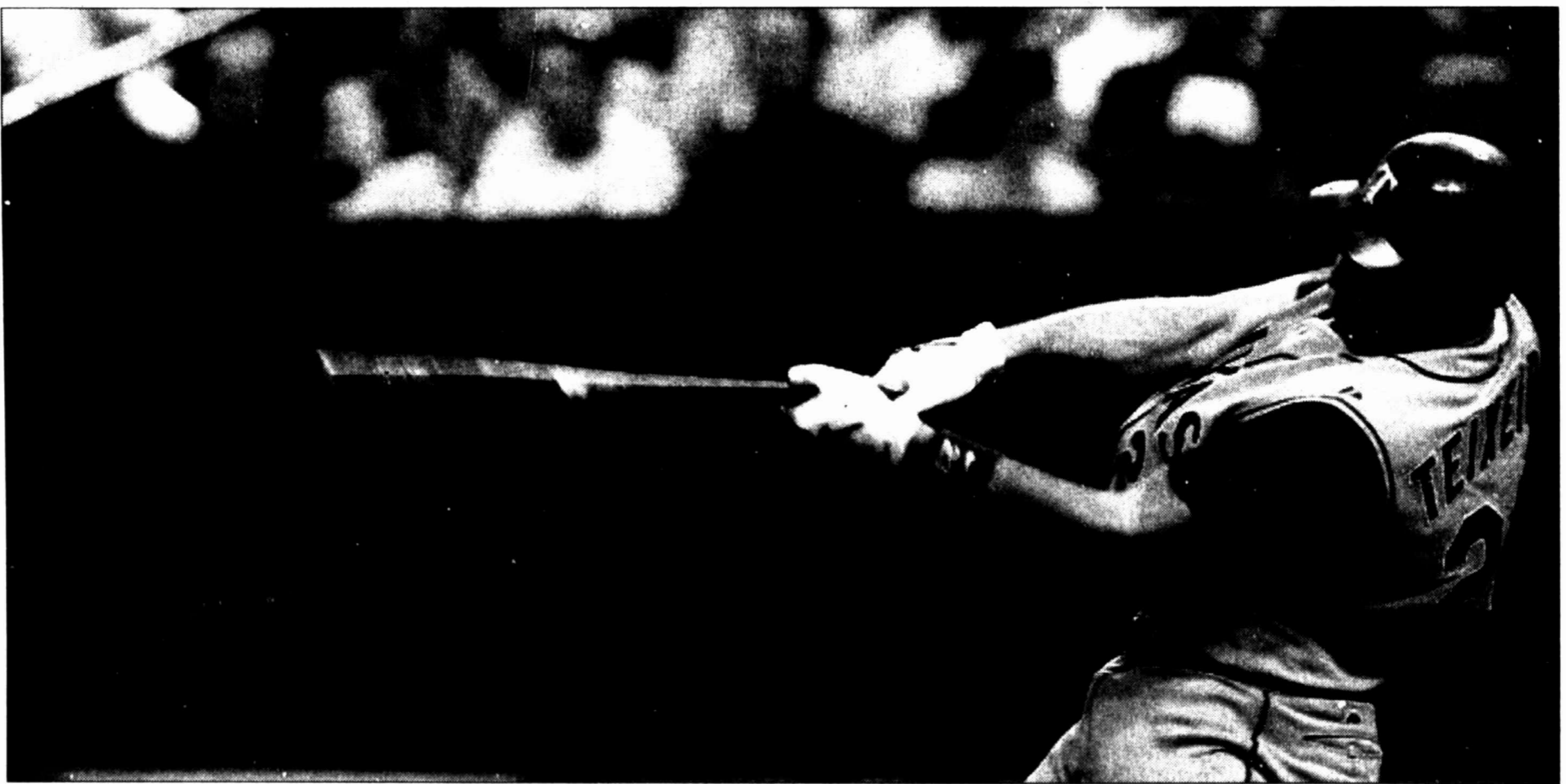
The new volleyball coach will be Amy Whitaker, who is young, enthusiastic and has college playing experience, said Holt.

Rangers out-pitch Baltimore, win on two sac flies

Millwood, three relievers shut down Orioles in Baltimore

BALTIMORE — The Texas Rangers aren't all about hitting anymore. These guys can also pitch. As evidenced by their first two games after the All-Star break.

Kevin Millwood and three relievers combined on a six-hitter Friday night, and the Rangers capitalized on one shaky inning by Kris Benson to slip past the Baltimore Orioles 2-1.

It was the second straight game Texas limited Baltimore to just one

run. "The last two games, we have to give them credit. Their pitching has been tremendous," said Baltimore designated hitter Javy Lopez, who went 0-for-3 with a strikeout.

After scoring 15 runs one night earlier, the Rangers got their only runs on fourth-inning sacrifice flies by Michael Young and Mark Teixeira. That, however, was enough to provide Texas with its third straight victory.

"We scored a lot of runs yesterday, and today we scored just enough," Rangers manager Buck Showalter said. "There was little margin for error."

Baltimore got its lone run on a sacrifice fly by Melvin Mora.

Millwood (9-5) allowed one run and four hits in six innings to earn his first win in four starts since June 16. Pitching for the first time since July 2, when he left a game against Houston with arm tightness, the right-hander was lifted after 78 pitches.

"I was tired," Millwood said. "The extra time off, I missed my last start, and then having the All-Star break is definitely good for your strength but not good for your stamina."

Former Oriole Rick Bauer worked a perfect seventh, Francisco

Cordero gave up two singles in the eighth and Akinori Otsuka closed it for his 18th save.

"To get those three shutout innings from our bullpen, and have (Otsuka) finish the relay race — the baton pass — it's impressive," Showalter said.

The Rangers have allowed four runs or fewer in eight straight games, the longest current run in the majors. They are 6-2 in that span.

"Tonight, for sure, they pitched pretty well against us," Orioles manager Sam Perlozzo said.

Benson (9-8) gave up four hits in his second complete game of the season. The right-hander has

lost three straight starts, but he probably deserved a better fate in this one.

The Rangers managed only one extra-base hit, stranded three runners and went down in order four times. On Thursday, they had 19 hits, including six homers, three by Teixeira.

"They've got a good lineup," Benson said. "I'm just glad to start off the second half on a good note. Even though I didn't get the win, I gave us a chance."

After failing to get a hit in the first three innings, Texas took a 2-0 lead in the fourth. Gary Matthews led off with an

Owens appears to tell all in new book

IRVING — Terrell Owens says plenty in his new book. Except for one word he now claims he didn't say.

But making a big deal of an apparent misquotation is the kind of media nit-picking Owens would lament in his 242-page book that mostly offers his side of two tumultuous seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles.

In "T.O.", which debuted last week, Owens likens former teammate Donovan McNabb to a bully who spat in his mouth as a teenager while he innocently slept on a school bus.

The new Dallas Cowboys receiver also devotes pages to his perceived vilification in the press and described his quick comeback from a leg fracture in 2004 as, "If you'll forgive me for saying so ... nothing short of heroic."

But forgive him or not, Owens said Thursday during a book signing near the Cowboys' headquarters that it was "T.O." co-author Jason Rosenhaus who invented that particular phrasing.

Rosenhaus is the younger brother of Owens' agent, Drew, who Owens credits in "T.O." for the three-year, \$25 million contract he got from the Cowboys in March. Jason often works with his brother on contracts.

"(Heroic) was one of the words that Jason used," said Owens, after signing his book for about 400 fans and collectors at a Wal-Mart near the Cowboys' headquarters.

The discrepancy seems to contradict Owens' assertion of "These are my words, straight from me to you" on the book's second page.

But that bothered Cowboys fans at the Wal-Mart about as much as when Dallas signed the controversial receiver, who once grandstanded on the Cowboys' star logo at Texas Stadium when he was with San Francisco in 2000.

"(The book) really makes him across more personable," said Christopher Taylor, 29, who read the first three chapters while waiting in line for two hours.

But it's the fourth chap

Still no support for Clemens as Astros lose

MIAMI — Rookie Anibal Sanchez outdueled Roger Clemens, and Reggie Abercrombie hit a two-run homer to lead the Florida Marlins to a 3-1 victory over the Houston Astros Friday night.

Sanchez (2-0), who was born 78 days before Clemens made his major league debut in 1984, was making his third career start and first at Dolphin Stadium. He didn't allow a hit until pinch hitter Willy Taveras singled to lead off the sixth. Sanchez pitched seven shutout innings, giving up two

hits while striking out two and walking one.

Logan Kensing pitched the eighth for the Marlins, and Joe Borowski earned his 17th save despite allowing a run in the ninth.

The Marlins broke a three-game losing streak, while Houston has lost three of its last four road games.

Clemens (1-3), making his fifth start of the season, lasted five innings, giving up two runs and seven hits with seven strikeouts.

Clemens referred to as "Mr. Cy Young" before the game by Marlins manager and former team-

mate Joe Girardi entered the game with a 5-0 record against Florida, his most wins without a loss against any team. The seven-time Cy Young Award winner remains at 342 career wins, tied for eighth all time with Tim Lincecum.

Girardi said he would instruct his hitters to try to wear down the 43-year-old Clemens by being selective at the plate early in the game. It appeared that the young Marlins lineup listened to Clemens' former catcher. Clemens threw 53 pitches in the first two innings, and Abercrombie hit a two-

run homer to left on an 0-1 pitch in the second. It was Abercrombie's fifth homer of the season.

Mike Jacobs went 3-for-4 with two singles and a double. He entered Thursday's game hitting .356 with seven homers and 17 RBIs in 28 games as the No. 3 hitter.

The Marlins added an insurance run in the eighth on Josh Willingham's sacrifice fly.

Chris Burke doubled with two outs in the ninth and scored on Lance Berkman's single to right. Borowski struck out

but received scholarship offers from TCU and Houston and also got interest from Stanford, Texas Tech, Tulsa and New Mexico State.

According to rivals.com, Tannehill, who is on vacation with

his family and could not be reached for comment, is a three-star athlete who is not ranked among national quarterbacks. He is 6-foot-4, weighs 193 pounds, recorded a 4.63 40-yard dash time and has a 21-inch vertical jump.

Wie removes herself from John Deere Classic

SILVIS, Ill. — Missing yet another PGA Tour cut was the least of Michelle Wie's worries.

The 16-year-old phenom withdrew from the John Deere Classic with nine holes left Friday, struggling to keep herself from getting sick on a hot, steamy afternoon. She walked off the ninth hole on her own, but after talking with her parents said she couldn't play anymore. She then was taken to the course medical trailer.

This was Wie's fifth attempt at becoming the

first woman since Babe Zaharias in 1945 to make a PGA Tour cut. But her chances at history were all but over Thursday after she opened with a 6-over 77, leaving her 13 strokes behind the leaders and eight strokes over the projected cut line. She was at 2-over 37 when she withdrew Friday.

The temperature Friday afternoon was 88, with the sun and humidity making it feel as if it was five degrees warmer. Wie teed off shortly before 2 p.m. CDT, and appeared fine for the first four holes.

But she looked listless as she approached the

fifth green, sitting on her bag with her head bowed, a towel to her face, until it was her turn to putt. She was in obvious pain over the next four holes, bending over and gripping her stomach, wiping her face with a towel and sitting on her bag every chance she got.

Her caddie gave her several bottles of cold water to drink, but Wie only got worse.

She could manage only a weak little wave after making a nice birdie putt on No. 8. And when a fan said, "Nice shot, Michelle," she responded with a weak smile.

After teeing off on the ninth, she took a seat on her bag, holding her sides and bowing her head. At one point she sat up straight but put her hand to her mouth, as if she was going to get sick.

When she stood up, she put her hand to her mouth again and headed toward some weeds next to the tee. She stood there for a minute or two, but didn't get sick.

Wie finished the hole, then headed straight over to talk to her worried-looking parents. As they patted her on the back, Wie said she didn't want to continue playing.

Rockets acquire Snyder for pick

HOUSTON — The Houston Rockets acquired shooting guard Kirk Snyder from the New Orleans Hornets Friday for cash and a conditional second-round draft pick in 2008.

The 6-foot-6 guard has averaged 6.5 points, 2.1 rebounds and one assist per game in two NBA seasons.

The former Nevada star was drafted by Utah in 2004, then traded to New Orleans in August 2005. He averaged 8 points, 2.4 rebounds and 1.5 assists last season.

The Rockets were the league's second-worst scoring team last season and have been looking for guards this summer to improve their perimeter shooting.

"It's a great opportunity for this guy," said Rockets general manager Carroll Dawson. "He doesn't have a whole lot of competition. He has a tremendous upside."

Snyder finished his college career as the seventh-leading scorer in school history with 1,404 points. He also ranks in the school's top 10 in field goals and free throws. Last season, Snyder shot 45 percent from the field and 36 percent from 3-point range. He scored 28 against Minnesota during a 10-game stretch in which he reached double figures seven times.

Dawson said he likes Snyder's defense because he'll match up well with bigger, more physical guards.

"He's strong, he moves his feet well and he's tenacious," Dawson said.

Snyder began last season as a reserve but replaced starter J.R. Smith in January, beginning a run of 40 consecutive starts. He shot 73.5 percent from the free-throw line, another attractive quality.

"He was coming along really well this year," Dawson said. "One of the things I really like is he puts it on the floor and gets to the (free throw) line. A lot of games are won at the line, and we looked at that part and that was very attractive also."

Dawson expected the Rockets to make more moves by summer's end and said they're still shopping for shooting guards.

"We've filled a big hole. We've still got guys were looking at in the backcourt," Dawson said. "Anybody that can shoot the ball and play the type of defense (Coach) Jeff (Van Gundy) and his staff wants, they're a candidate right now."

Dawson also said Friday that point guard Bob Sura has resumed workouts after missing last season following knee surgery. Sura averaged 10 points, 5.5 rebounds and 5.2 assists in 2004-05.

UT gives Barnes pay raise

AUSTIN (AP) — Texas basketball coach Rick Barnes got a \$500,000 pay raise Friday after taking the Longhorns to the Elite Eight round of the NCAA tournament.

University of Texas System regents approved bumping Barnes' salary to \$1.8 million and increased his bonus for participating in the NCAA tournament from \$25,000 to \$125,000.

Barnes also will have a bigger incentive to ensure his athletes' perform well in the classroom. He will be eligible

for an \$80,000 bonus if his players meet the highest academic goals, up from \$40,000 last year. Next year's goals have not been set, the school said.

Barnes' salary was \$1.3 million this season, and he received a bonus of more than \$200,000 for reaching the Elite Eight round.

This spring, he reportedly turned down a roughly \$2 million a year offer to replace Herb Sendek at North Carolina State.

Barnes, 51, joined Texas in 1998.

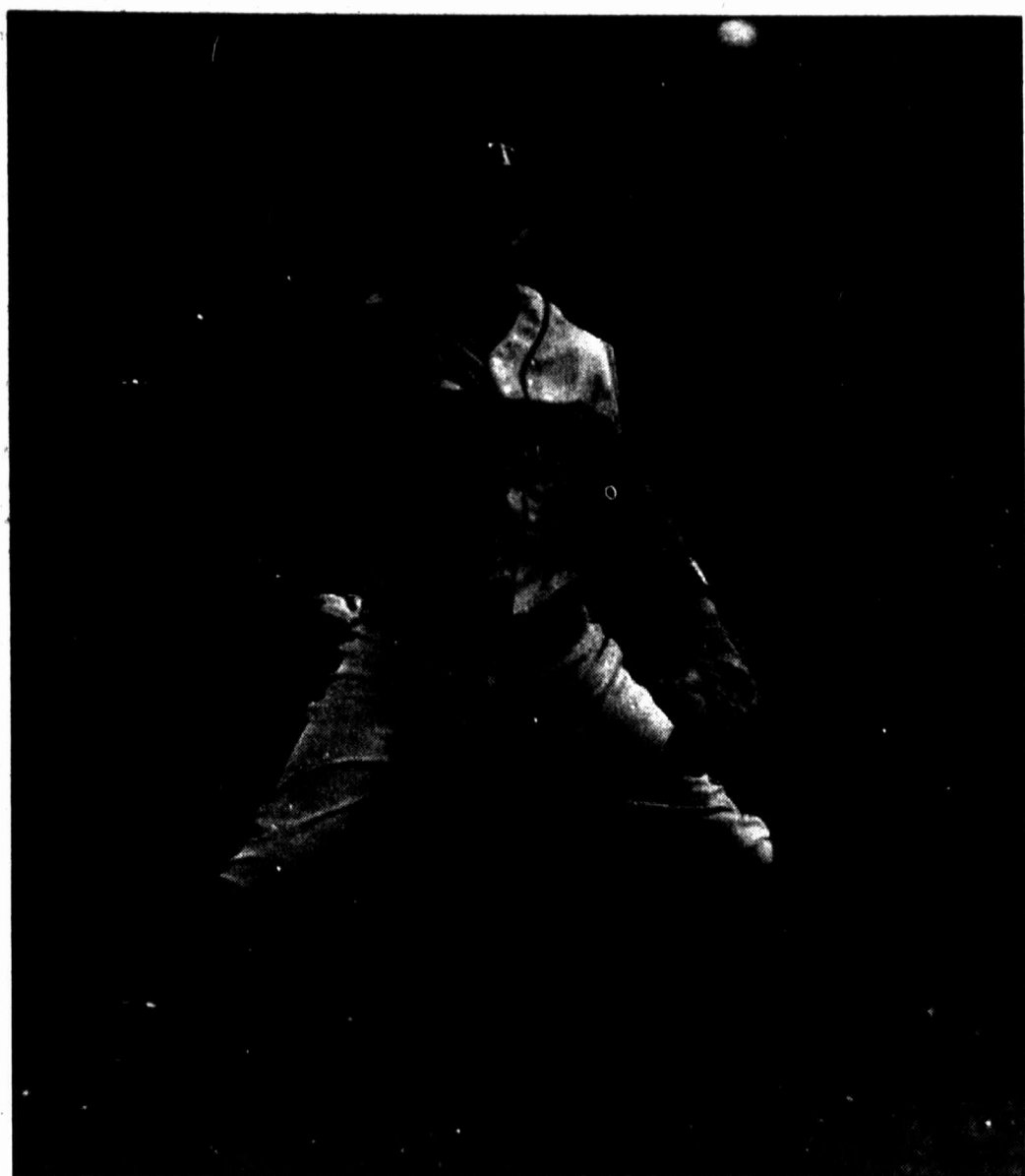

Owens also writes at length about his suspension from the Eagles and closes the book taking comfort in Cowboys owner Jerry Jones telling

him that he also "knew what it was like to be treated like Darth Vader."

Bison is one farmer's alternative to cotton



Raising bison reaps many benefits

For many years, cotton has been a mainstay for local farmers. However, the inconsistency of the crop has prompted agricultural producers to search for new ways to supplement their income. While alternative crops are always an option, Dero and Jeanine Shaw of Knott took a more diverse route. They were looking for some way to supplement their income when a relative suggested they invest in a relatively new market.

Buffalo.
North American Bison to be exact. The benefits of raising bison are many, according to the Shaws. And, when their 10-year-old son Sloan gained weight due to medication, the Shaws decided bison was the way to go.

"Our son has asthma and because of the medication he is on, he gained a lot of weight. Bison meat is very lean and we hoped it would help him lose weight. And we needed to have something else to supplement our income."

The Shaws learned that bison meat has many nutritional advantages including a 25 to 30 percent higher protein content, fewer calories and is lower in cholesterol than beef, pork, or skinless chicken. Because it is not subject to the same federal regulations as beef, the meat is free of growth hormones and antibiotics.

"This is nothing but pure meat," explained Dero. While bison production is a booming market in Kansas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Nebraska, the Dakota's and Montana, Texas has yet to really catch on. The initial cost of raising bison can be significant because of the heavy equipment and stronger fencing required. However, the animals are self sufficient and don't require as



much winter feeding because their metabolism is slower in the cold months. According to Dero, they can withstand subfreezing temperatures, unlike beef cattle who often succumb. Looking forward to beginning their new investment, the Shaws' initial contact with bison was less than encouraging. The intermittent interest in the use of bison as a commercial animal in Texas has led to the animals showing up at auction in less than ideal shape. But that didn't dissuade their determination.

"When I first saw them, I really didn't

want to buy them because they were so thin and ragged looking," said Dero. "But they've done real well out here and they look a lot better now."

After four years of free range grazing and some supplemental hay when needed, the herd is now at 13 head with five calves born just recently.

Meat is the bison's primary production value, being used in some gourmet restaurants in northern states. For now, the Shaws intend to focus on jerky until the market improves. Internet sources offer a wide range of cuts including roasts, rib eyes and strip steaks. For many farms and ranches it has proven to be an asset in other areas, according to Dero.

"Some ranches use them to train cutting horses," Dero explained, "because they have more endurance and are faster than cattle."

But raising bison is not something to just jump into. The Shaws say that raising bison is a "learn as you go" endeavor, requiring patience and behavioral understanding of the species. Initially, the animals on the 30-acre farm seem friendly and relatively tame. Upon reaching the fenced pasture following a short ride in Dero's truck, the bison readily approached the electrified wire where our small party had gathered.

Billy, one of the two mature bulls, eagerly accepted pellets fed by hand and a pat on the head. However, their docility can be deceptive.

"They are wild and dangerous," Jeanine said. Dero added, "They're fine like this as long as we stay on our side of the fence. If we were to step inside there, they would start acting silly."

"They've gotten out a few times and they're a lot faster than you think," said Jeanine. "You can't round them up like cattle."

Dero agreed that perhaps the greatest obstacle to the bison industry is the lack of knowledge, but with a lot of research and preparation the investment can eventually be lucrative because of their inherent low maintenance.

The Shaws first acquired the bison four years ago and they believe the change in diet has greatly benefited Sloan. "He hasn't had a spell in probably three or four years," said Dero. Meanwhile, the industry is slowly growing and has attracted one of entertainment's biggest moguls, Ted Turner, who owns around 150,000 head in Montana and opened a chain of restaurants featuring bison.

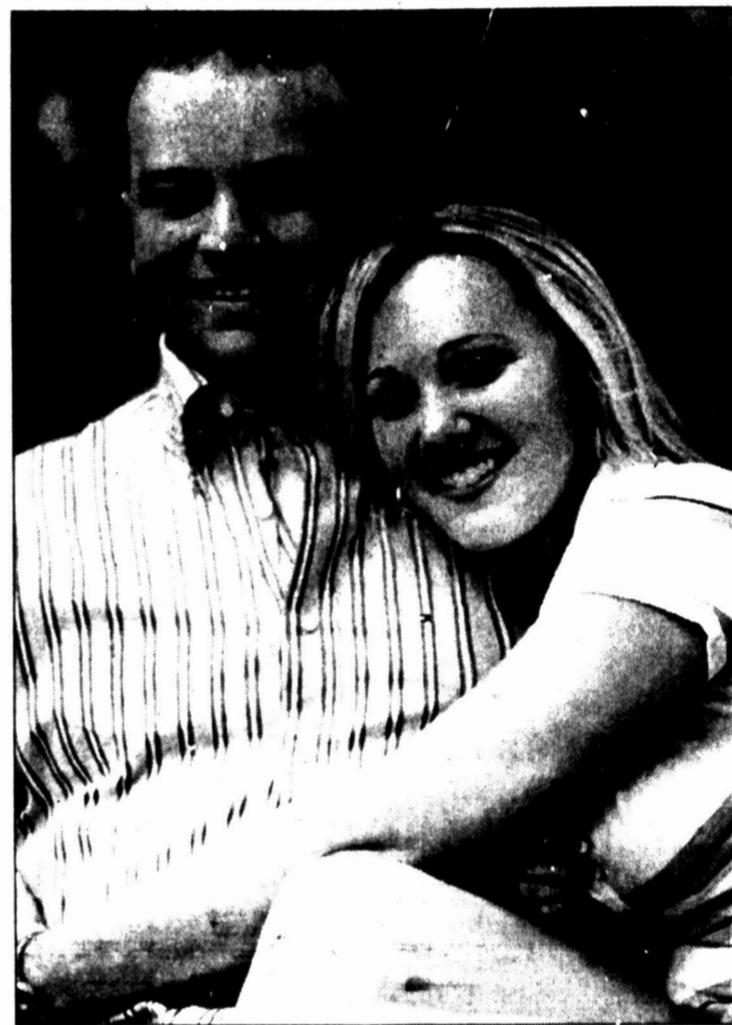

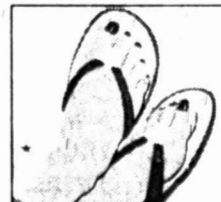

First Bank looking to acquire Western National Bank office

Western National Bank's Big Spring office will be getting a new look — and name — if the federal government gives the go-ahead for First Bank of West Texas to buy out the bank's local branch.

First Bank of West Texas, which currently maintains offices and branches in Coahoma, Big Spring, Loraine and Abilene, has applied with

the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) to acquire the assets of WNB's Big Spring office, located at 607 Scurry.

John Scott, president and chief executive officer of First Bank of West Texas, said the acquisition will help his company alleviate some rather painful growing pains. "We simply don't have

enough room to provide the level of customer service we want at our FM 700 location in Big Spring," said Scott.

"And there's really no intelligent way to add on to the facility, so we've been looking for a new location for some time now."

Scott said if the acquisition is approved, First Bank of West Texas will use the Scurry Street location as a second Big Spring branch.

"We've been looking for a way

to serve our customers that are located on the north side and in downtown Big Spring," said Scott. "And we were actually considering the spot that WNB is located in. They beat us to it by about a week."

"We'll be providing all of the same services we provide at our FM 700 location. This will just give our Big Spring customers another location to do business at."

While the acquisition should mean better service for First

Bank of West Texas customers, Scott said the change won't be immediate.

"This transition won't happen for quite some time," said Scott. "There are a number of waiting periods the FDIC requires, so we're looking at about two months before it's complete."

Keeping your head, and your shirt, in uncertain times

After a quarter such as the past one, when equity markets worldwide climbed to multiyear highs, dropped like a stone and then bounced, what's a small investor to do?

First, don't panic. Retail investors have a history of overreacting to market swings in harmful ways. They poured into technology stocks right before the bubble burst in 2000, and many of them were so shell-shocked by the ensuing decline that they piled out of equities altogether and missed most of the bull market of the past three years.

"What happens is a perverse form of market timing, rushing in at high prices and panicking out at low prices," said Richard Hoey, chief economist for Dreyfus Corp. "It's a mistake for you to assume you know what is going to happen in the market in the future."

But there are some ways small investors can protect themselves in a volatile market:

— Follow the long-term plan. Most financial advisers suggest that investors follow an asset-allocation strategy with fixed percentages of their money in bonds, cash and various types of stocks, such as large U.S. companies, small companies and international companies. Over the past three years, small-company stocks and stocks in the developing world have shot up much faster than those of large American companies, so many investors may find their portfolios out of balance. Now might be a good time to capture some of the gains and reinvest the profits in areas that haven't grown as quickly.

"If you were biting your nails during the last downturn, it might be a sign you need to diversify. If you've got a lot of money in emerging markets or small-cap stocks, quit it or at least don't put any more in," said Russ Kinnel, director of mutual fund research at Morningstar Inc.

— Prepare for worse times. The consensus view of economists is that the U.S. economy is slowing but not heading into recession. If that's true, investors can hedge their

bets by concentrating on big, strong companies with substantial businesses overseas. Large-company stocks are relatively cheap in terms of their share price relative to their earnings. That's

because they haven't enjoyed the same run-up in prices that small firms did over the past three years. Now, as the economy cools, many analysts think

the large companies will have their day.

"In good times, everyone does well. When the economy slows, the strong companies tend to do well," said University of Maryland business professor Peter Morici, an economist. The goal for long-term investors is not necessarily to make a huge pile of money during a slowdown but rather to avoid losing a pile and to invest in stocks that will do well in the long term, analysts said. "Quality is what you want when the market softens, especially if you are investing for the long haul," Morici said. "It's very hard to buck a downdraft."

— Fasten your seat belt. With Federal Reserve policymakers indicating that future interest rate increases will depend on what happens with inflation, many market strategists think the equity markets will remain volatile for a while, as investors react and overreact in response to each day's economic data.

In addition, the third quarter is traditionally the stock market's weakest, especially in a midterm election year, according to statistics compiled by Standard & Poor's.

Ken Tower, chief market strategist at CyberTrader Inc., advises investors to prepare themselves mentally for poor results. "Get comfortable with the idea that your portfolio is going to go down and then go back up," he said. "This is a time when the average investor should be cautious."

Bringing Generation Y aboard for the long haul

For graduating college seniors, the job market is, well, awesome, dude: Hiring is up sharply and corporate competition for the class of 2006 is hot.

But for employers, the real challenge isn't getting the freshly minted grads to sign on. It's getting them to stay.

Employers and hiring experts say the younger generation no longer approaches the first job as a nest for the next 10 or five or even three years.

"There's no longer a stigma in changing jobs frequently," said Eileen Kohan, executive director of the University of Southern California's career center. "It's not unnatural for someone to have several jobs in their first five years out of college."

That revolving door is costly. Every recruit gone after a year or so represents the loss of about 1.5 times the worker's salary for costs associated with recruiting, training and the like, according to Saratoga, a San Jose, Calif.-based unit of PricewaterhouseCoopers.

"The war for talent has shifted," Saratoga director Scott Pollak said.

"You still want to recruit, but the new challenge is, how do you keep the best people? Retention is now a big issue."

To understand exactly how the fickle Generation Y thinks, some employers are hiring consultants schooled in the ways of those born between 1978 and 2000, the usual definition of the group.

But for employers, the real challenge isn't getting the freshly minted grads to sign on. It's getting them to stay.

Companies are implementing training programs, pairing newbies with seasoned veterans and working on integrating their newest hires in hopes of boosting retention.

Generation Y, the children of baby boomers and Gen-Xers, is often described as the entitlement generation.

Gen-Yers arrive at their first jobs

with high expectations. After driving hard to be accepted to top schools and pumping up their resumes with myriad extracurricular activities and internships, many young grads expect a lush ride in the corporate world.

But while the job market may have changed, corporate culture hasn't.

Many entry-level positions still require making copies, fact-checking reports and taking the blame when the manager messes up. In industries such as Hollywood, no matter how many calculus classes the wunderkind has taken, the new kid on the block will still be asked to get coffee.

And new hires may not be ready for that kind of sacrifice.

Generation Y "tends to want, and want it now," said Carol Hacker, president of Carol A. Hacker & Associates in Alpharetta, Ga., a corporate consulting and seminar company.

"They don't want to take the time that it takes to work up. They expect that that's going to happen pretty quickly," she added.

Since graduating from Stanford University in 2004 with a degree in

human biology, Paul O'Leary's career path has been consistently inconsistent. At the age of 25, he's on job No. 5. O'Leary went to Japan for a stint as a gymnastics coach, worked as a salesman for Bose Corp. and held jobs at Google Inc. and Yahoo Inc.

"I have a pretty clear idea of what I want to get out of my career," O'Leary said. "When it gets to the point where the management or the company no longer seems in line with what I have in mind, I start looking elsewhere."

Introducing new hires to the wide array of jobs available within a company is how Ogilvy Public Relations Worldwide has dealt with young people who aren't quite ready to commit to one career path.

The New York company offers a one-year rotational program, giving young grads a chance to sample what the company has to offer before settling into a permanent role, said Trish Hamilton, Ogilvy's human resource manager.

Vital to the program's success is constant evaluation and personal development, Hamilton said.

"I work very closely with each associate, sitting down with them every two months and guiding them through their career," she said.

Consistently checking in with young workers is one of the most important ways managers can foster a good working relationship with Gen-Yers, said Bruce Tulgan, the founder of RainmakerThinking Inc., a management consulting company based in New Haven, Conn.

"The key is having an ongoing dialogue," he said. Tulgan recommends "spelling out expectations every step of the way and being honest with folks about how they're doing."

With young workers just stepping out of the classroom, the more specific the expectations, the better people respond, said Carol Cincotta, senior vice president and human resources director at New York-based Ketchum, an international public relations agency.

Ketchum uses in-house training and consultants to teach its young associates about core practices of the business and even whether walking around the office with iPod earphones is frowned upon.

"No one teaches that in school," Cincotta said. Ketchum also is starting a one-year rotation program similar to Ogilvy's, giving account associates the chance to work through different departments in the firm, with regular feedback sessions.

Although many companies in the finance, consulting and technology fields have programs to teach hard skills, including how to build financial

models, soft skills programs -- which emphasize workplace politics, career development and communication -- are increasingly in vogue.

Many employers, particularly small businesses without the resources to hire consultants, find that simply pairing young workers with mentors can be a good way to integrate the new hires into company culture.

"They can be either peers, people that have

recently come to the company who they can relate to or people who have been with the organization for a number of years whom they can respect," said Mark Mehler, co-founder of CareerXroads, a Kendall Park, N.J., consulting company.

If all fails and a young hire walks into the office to give two weeks' notice, offer to stay connected in case future opportunities arise, said RainmakerThinking's

Tulgan. "Stay in touch with people and try to re-recruit them," Tulgan said. "The goal from a business standpoint should be to continue to get a return on the investment."

North had bid that suit — the contract was in great jeopardy. South therefore took steps to deal with that possibility.
He won the club with the king, drew three rounds of trumps, then cashed the ace of diamonds and ruffed a diamond. Next he played the ace and another heart.
East won the heart with the jack and continued with the queen, but by now the defense was helpless. If East retained the lead with the queen, he would have to return a diamond, permitting South to discard a club while ruffing in dummy, or else lead a club from the Q-J-9, allowing South to score a trick with the ten sooner or later regardless of which club East returned.

Alternatively, if West overtook East's queen of hearts with the king, he would be forced to concede a ruff-and-discard immediately. Note that the outcome would be the same if West, rather than East, started with four clubs originally.
The key to the winning line of play was South's foresight in eliminating all the diamonds and hearts from both hands in order to force a losing lead from the defenders at the tail end of the play. Had the clubs been divided 3-2 all along, South's method of play would have proved a needless exercise, but a good declarer should always be willing to expend a little extra energy when the contract is at stake.

Declarers who rely solely on percentages often find not only their expectancies shattered but also no hope for recovery. The proper approach to sound declarer play is to anticipate bad breaks and do everything possible in advance to overcome them.
Consider this deal where West led a club against four spades. Declarer saw immediately that if the missing clubs were divided 3-2, he would lose at most two hearts and a club.
But if the clubs were divided 4-1 — a possibility made more likely by West's lead of a club even though

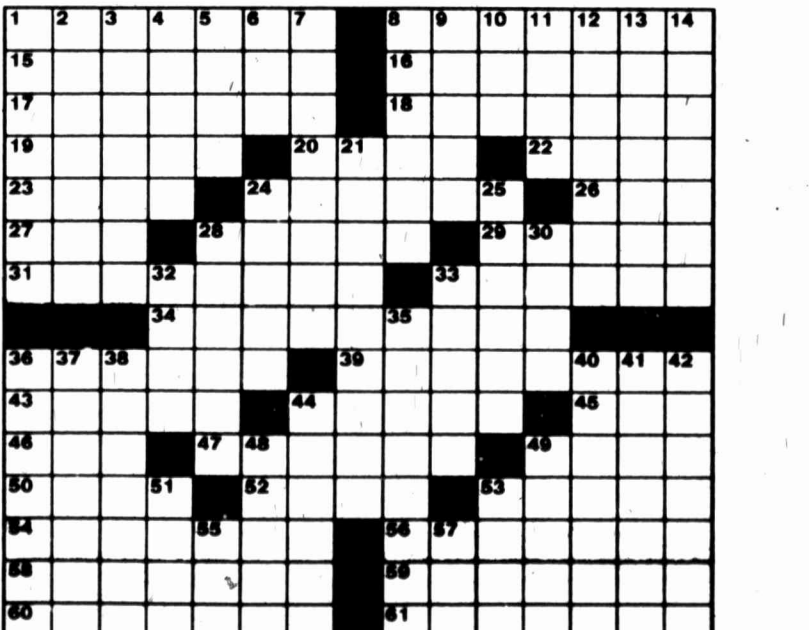

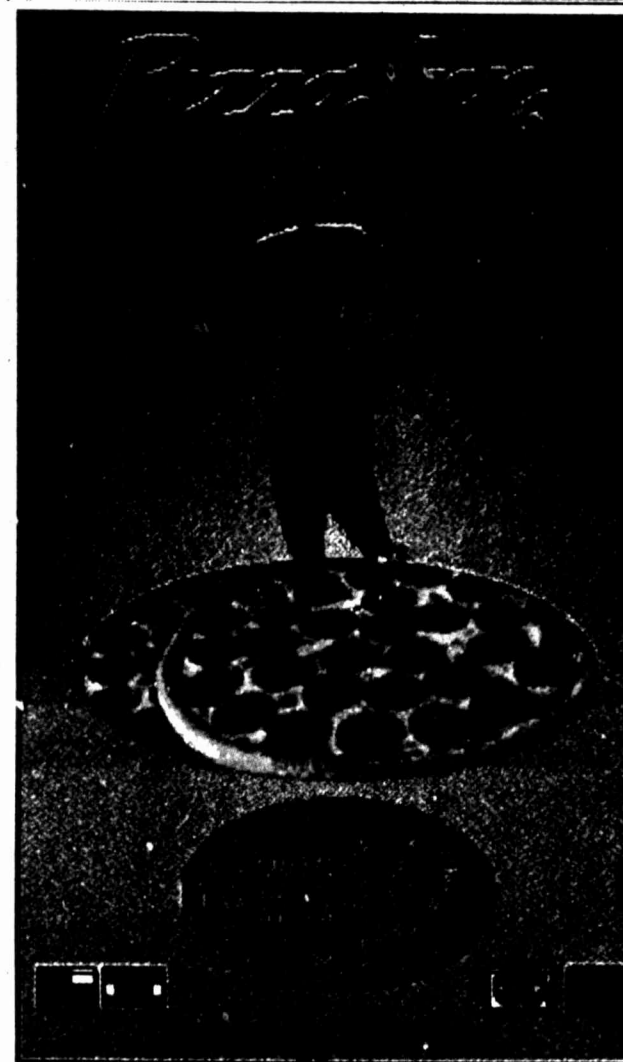

Local band taking prospect of \$1 million seriously

More than 5,700 bands across the United States are preparing to do battle in the Bodog Battle of the Bands, with hometown favorite Rustic Circle currently leading the pack in the Dallas division of the contest.

According to Rustic Circle frontman Rick Boiles, the band recently received a confirmation letter from Bodog saying the Big Spring band will be moving into the next round of competition, which will include a live performance at the landmark Curtain Club in Dallas' Deep Ellum art district.

"We're really pumped about getting a chance to move on to the next round," said Boiles. "The first part was made

up of judging from the people at Bodog and fan support, so we knew we'd do well. It's no secret Rustic Circle has the most loyal fans anywhere. So when we finished in the No. 1 spot for the Dallas market, we really felt like the fans expected it. We felt like we owed that to them, and after a lot of marketing and promoting, we were able to deliver it to them."

Although Rustic Circle finished No. 1 in the Dallas market and in the top 10 in the nation, Rustic Circle guitarist Thomas Jenkins said the band still has a tough road in front of them.

"It's one thing to take a recording and promote to

the fans and contest judges," said Jenkins. "We were

rainbow is every bands' dream — a \$1 million recording contract with the Bodog music label — and Boiles and

want this for our fans, because when the chips were down they're the ones that really believed in us. We want to be able to stand there with that contract in

our hands and say, 'this is for each and every one of you!' That's what the entire band is working toward."

Rustic Circle, which is made up of Boiles, Jenkins, Dominick Boiles, Ron Meek and Garren Jernigan, won't have it easy going into live competitions. Texas bands such as Elocation (Frisco), Mod Effect (Dallas), Ember (San Angelo) and Crimson Envy (Lubbock) have also made it to the next round.

"Those guys are really awesome," said Jenkins. "We've had the honor of performing with Ember and Crimson Envy in Odessa a while back, and they are both class acts. We knew going into this we were going to be going up against some really tough bands, and a lot of these

guys are our friends.

"It's going to be a bit weird, going up against our friends in such a big competition, especially with such a big contract on the line, but we're all dedicated musicians. Most of us have been down this road before, so I think it's going to be a really good time, if nothing else."

As if the pressure of a \$1 million recording contract weren't enough, Jenkins said the Bodog camp hasn't yet released Rustic Circle's show date or show lineup.

"Yeah, that makes you pretty nervous," he said. "Once you know when you're playing, and who you're going to be playing against, it's a little easier to concentrate, plan and practice what you're going to do. We get more than 100 messages on our MySpace profile every day just from fans wanting to know when we're playing. So it will be a big relief when we get our show date."

According to the Bodog Web site — located at www.bodogbattleofthebands.com — shows have been slated twice a week beginning the first part of August and continuing

able to take our time and prepare that. Now, however, we're faced with the live portion of the contest, when we have to get up in front of the judges and show them we're not only as good as the recording, we're better.

"A lot goes into preparing for a show like this. You only have a limited amount of time to play, so you have to pick and choose the songs you're going to perform. You also have to work on stage presence and your overall sound, because the judges are going to be looking at all of that."

At the end of the Bodog

Jenkins are taking that aspect of the contest very seriously.

"A million dollars equals a lot of high quality studio time," said Boiles. "A contract that size can allow you to do a lot with your music and tours, allowing you to reach more fans than seems possible."

"When you say it that way — \$1 million — it can really give you the shakes," said Jenkins with a laugh. "It's pretty obvious the pressure's on at this point. We want the prize, there's no doubt about that. But we also

through mid-September. "We're really excited about playing the Curtain Club," said Jenkins. "It's kind of special to me because it was one of Dave Williams — vocalist for Drowning Pool that passed away in August 2002 — favorite venues. It's not really big like an arena, so you're up-close and personal with the fans, which we have plenty of in the Dallas and Fort Worth areas. To be able to play on the same stage Dave did, well that's pretty emotional for me. Dave was really a special guy." "We played Deep Ellum a few years ago during the Dallas Music Festival, and that place has a great vibe," said Boiles. "It's the kind of place you wish you could bottle up and bring home with you. I

can't wait to get back there. It's going to be a lot of fun for everyone." Bands that make it through the first phase of live performances, dubbed "Boot Camp," will move onto to a second round of regional competitions, all culminating into a show Bodog has titled "the battle to end all battles." The battle is the brain-child of Calvin Ayre, founder and CEO of the Bodog Entertainment Group. A self-made billionaire, Ayre has been making aggressive moves in television and pay-per-view entertainment. Last year he

launched Bodog Music, an international music label with offices in the U.K., Germany, the U.S. and Canada. Ayre controls an online-gambling empire reportedly valued at over \$1 billion and ranked in the Power 10 online companies by eGaming Review, processing \$7 billion in wagers in 2005. Ayre is the head of the digital entertainment powerhouse Bodog.com and has emerged as the face of online gaming.

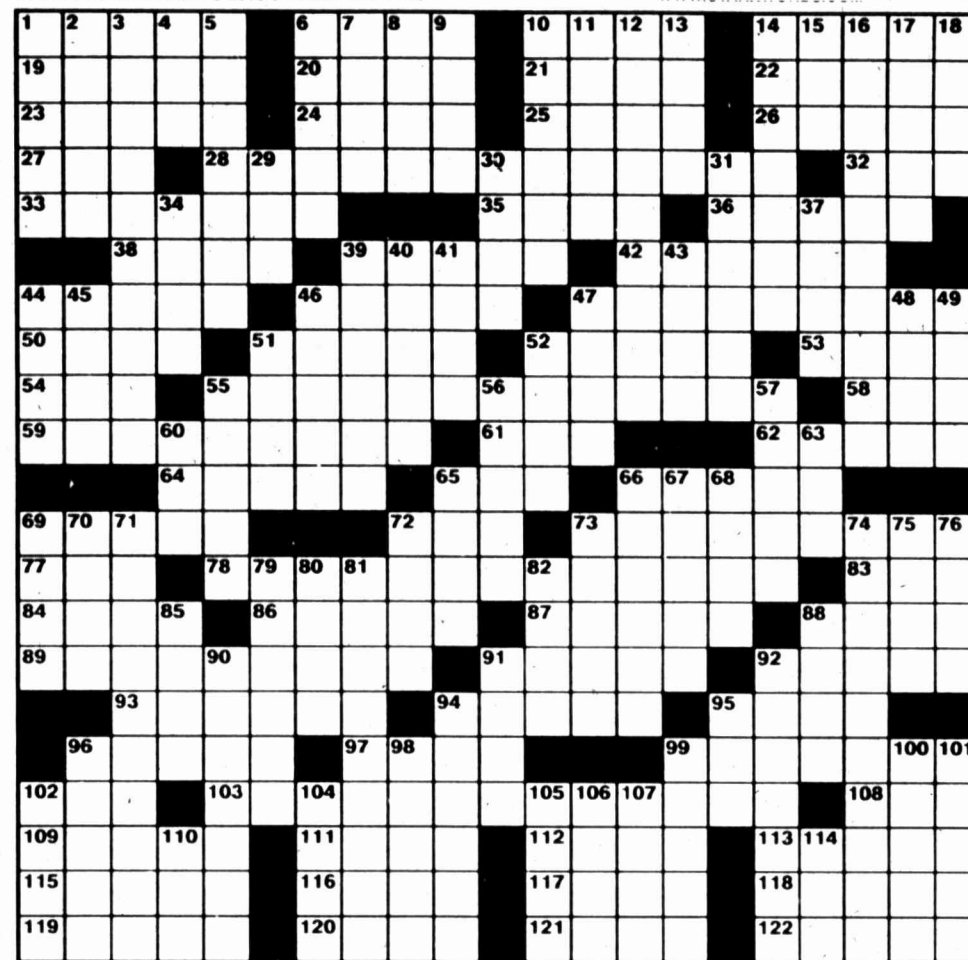

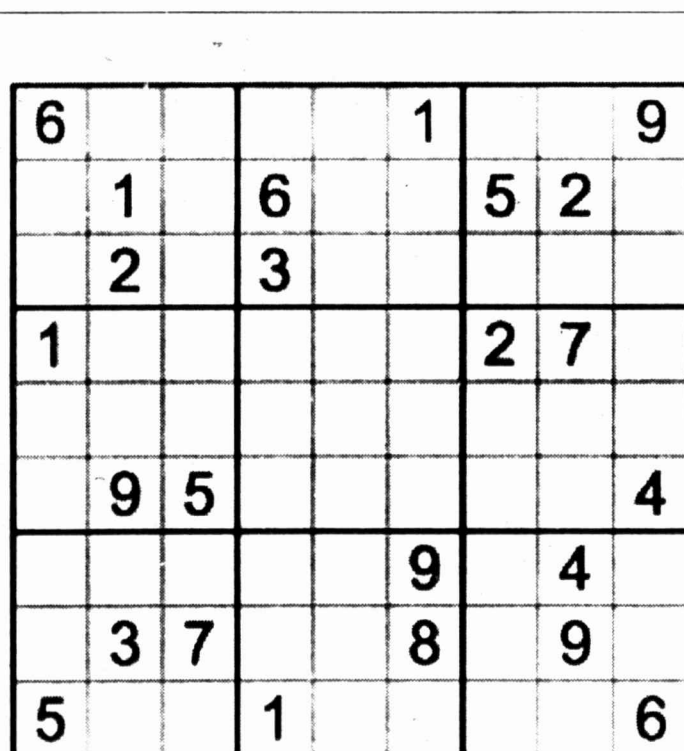
