



Proponents of bond issue organize to 'get facts out'

Just the facts, ma'am — or sir, for that matter.

That was the focus of a special meeting concerning Howard County's proposed \$10.1 million bond issue held Friday morning at the Dora Roberts Community Center, as county officials and project coordinators attempted to present "just the facts" about the bond election and the proposed jail facility it would finance.

Former Moore Development for Big Spring board member Joyce Crooker said the need for such a meeting — which was privately financed — became apparent when what she described as "misinformation" about the issue began to run rampant in the county.

"We kept hearing information that wasn't factual, and we felt

the community should be informed," said Crooker. "We compiled a brochure, and to be absolutely sure it is factual, it was screened by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards and the bond attorney in Austin. We've heard a lot of misinformation and things that simply aren't true. We can say we're telling the truth about this."

"I feel good about this meeting because I feel like anyone that has a question can read this brochure and it will answer their questions. And if it doesn't, I would be happy to answer any questions they might have."

One question Crooker said has been posed time and time again is whether the existing jail facility, located in the county courthouse, can be renovated to meet state requirements, a question local architect Phil

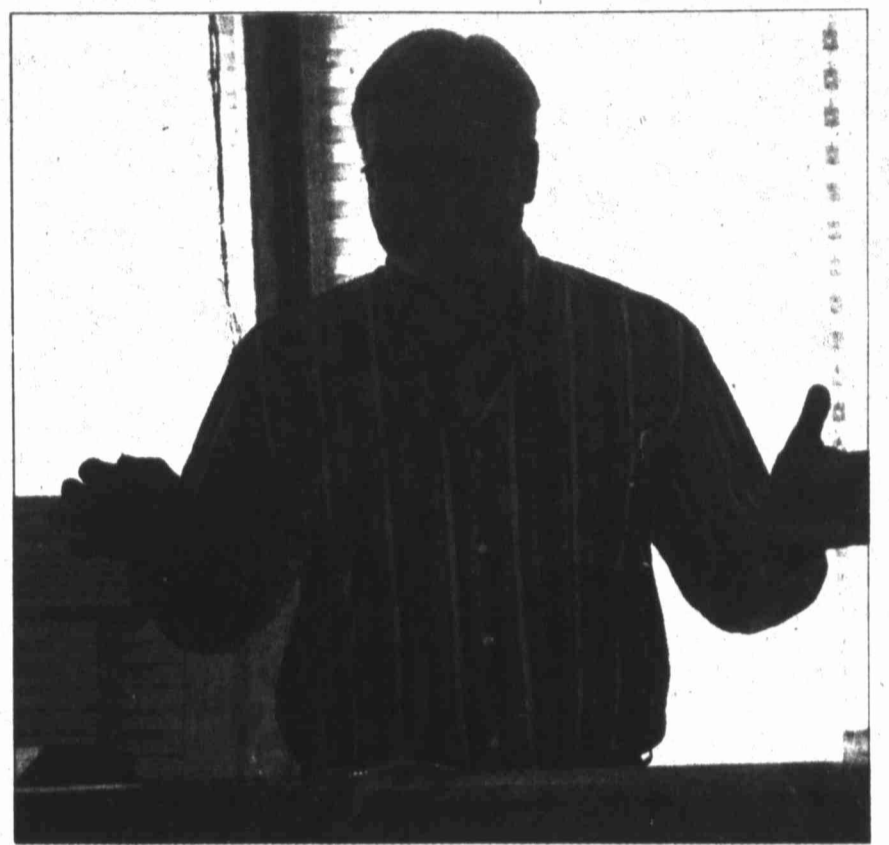
Furqueron answered for the audience.

"This is an exercise in futility," said Furqueron. "The state jail commission has already said it will not approve a refurbishment of the existing jail. They were very clear on this. Remodeling the courthouse simply isn't an effective solution to the problem."

Furqueron said another point of conflict on the issue — whether to build a 144-bed facility or a 96-bed facility — is also ineffective when simple economics are considered.

"When you compare apples to apples, it's only a \$250,000 to \$300,000 difference between the two sizes," said Furqueron. "And if you build a 96-bed facility where the opposition has proposed — adjacent to the District Court building — it

Solemn POW/MIA ceremony held

Local VVA president opens event with look at nation's mistakes

You are not forgotten. It was a theme that repeated itself time and time again Friday, as area veterans and residents came together to for a POW/MIA Recognition Day observance at the Vietnam Memorial.

Don Boling, president of Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 379, opened the ceremony — which included an invocation by John Wayne Metcalf and Pledge of Allegiance from former prisoner of war Buck Turner — with a look back into the U.S. government's less than prestigious track record concerning its captured soldiers.

"February 12 through April 1, 1973, 33 years ago, Operation Homecoming took place," said Boling. "American prisoners of war were returned from their imprisonment in Vietnam. Ultimately, 591 men were returned. One of those men had been help prisoner in China since the end of the Korean War in 1953.

"Ironically, even though we had radio intercepts

and pictures of them published in Soviet newspapers, those men that were taken prisoner in Laos and Cambodia that we knew to be alive did not come out. That gave birth to the MIA movement and other groups and radical activists — and I'm proud to be one."

Boling reminded those in attendance that the effort to bring American soldiers home from imprisonment on foreign soil was once again pushed into the shadows, much to the dismay of loved ones across the nation.

"Unfortunately, shortly after that time President Nixon told another one of his infamous lies, and told the public all American POWs were home," said Boling. "So the issue got pushed to the back. There were still a lot of family members listening to than and thinking, 'Where's my son? Where's my husband?' It's not only about

Vietnam. It's about all wars in the 20th century, even now."

With POW/MIA Recognition Day coming on the heels of the Sept. 11, 2001, tragedy, Boling also touched on the face of terrorism, giving it the name he said he believes it deserves.

"Unfortunately, it has come that the people that perpetrate these acts have come to be called terrorists," said Boling. "I have another word for them, and it's a repeatable word. It takes no act of bravery or honor to attack and murder unarmed, unprepared men, women and children as they go about their daily lives. It does take a supreme coward. So let's use the right word for these people. They're cowards."

Also part of the observance, Boling explained the "Missing Man Table," which was set prominently next to the Vietnam Memorial's granite monument.

"The table is prepared. This Table is small — symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner alone

Officials still investigating Sands fire

ACKERLY — Investigation continues into a fire that ravaged the field house at Sands High School early last week.

Arson is suspected in the fire, which occurred just before noon Monday. The field house sustained heavy damage in the blaze, which also destroyed a lot of equipment used by the SHS football team, including helmets and shoulder pads.

Sands Superintendent Wayne Blount said the community pitched in to help

save what they could.

"We were able to salvage the uniforms. The community really helped out," Blount said. "Staff, faculty and parents just washed and washed and washed (football) jerseys for the past couple of days."

Helmets and shoulder pads have since been replaced at the cost of thousands of dollars, although insurance should reimburse the district for that expense, he noted.

The district has contracted with the Lubbock firm of Blackmon-Mooring to handle cleanup in the field house. A

dollar estimate as to damage at the facility was unavailable.

Blount said arson was suspected, although it had not been officially ruled the cause of Monday's fire. The Dawson County Sheriff's Office is investigating the blaze.

Ben Bryan, the district's maintenance director, received minor smoke inhalation injuries battling the fire, but no other injuries were reported. Bryan was subsequently treated and released from a Lamesa hospital.

Honored as Veteran of Month, King recalls his time in Nazi prison camp

As the nation paused Friday in observance of POW-MIA Recognition Day, few have an understanding of the subject like Big Spring resident William H. King, who was honored as the Hangar 25 Air Museum's Veteran of the Month.

King, who was a prisoner of war in a makeshift German prison for approximately 30 months, said his trip to manhood began with a trip to Mineral Wells and a whopping \$21 a month.

"I got started down in the cotton patch," said

King. "After Pearl Harbor I was down in Mitchell County, and went from there to Mineral Wells, where I took four months of training. We were making \$21 a month. I went from there to Brownwood with the 31st Division... and I stayed down there with them for about seven months.

"We pulled out from New Jersey and were guarding those B-17s, and we stayed there guarding those planes in the rain for about three days. It was pouring down on us. From there they decided they were going to set up a landing strip for those B-17s in North Africa.

When we landed in Casablanca, North Africa, we weren't able to go up to the big docks because they were just too big."

While King's trip to Casablanca may seem like something from the movies today, it quickly turned into something less than glamorous when his troops ran into German forces.

"We got up there and there were French and Iraqi boys there," said King. "There were all kinds of soldiers there with us that we picked up. Well, when we pulled into Casablanca, ol' Rommel was there waiting for us. So he picked

us up and loaded us up on those motor transports and flew us to Germany, about 20 miles outside of Frankfurt.

"It was an old winery. They didn't have any stepped up prison camps built then. They were in a hurry and had an old winery, so we stayed there. They had Italian prisoners guarding us because they had already finished their war. McArthur had already whooped them and gotten them settled, so the Germans let them guard us."

King said it wasn't until

against his oppressors — Remember. This tablecloth is white — symbolizing the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms — Remember," said Boling. "This single yellow rose — symbolizing remembrance, displayed in a vase, reminds us of the families and loved ones of our comrades-in-arms who keep the faith awaiting his return, lest we forget — Remember.

"The red ribbon tied so prominently on the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbon worn upon the lapel and breasts of thousands who bear witness to their unyielding determination to demand proper accounting of our missing — Remember. A slice of lemon is on the bread plate to remind us of their bitter fate — Remember. "There is salt upon the bread plate — symbolic of the families' tears as they wait — Remember. The glass is inverted, they cannot toast with us this night — Remember. The chair — the chair is empty — they are not here — Remember."

Boling said the ceremony isn't just about remembering, but also about making sure the men and women that serve in the military today don't face the same perilous circumstances as their predecessors.

"Today we gather to honor those men and women that served our nation in the most difficult of circumstances and unimaginable conditions

as prisoners of war," said Boling. "And we give thanks to God for their return and honor them for their dedication and service.

"Tonight we're also here to remember those that have not yet come home, that still may be held prisoners in a foreign land. As far as I'm concerned, any country that holds Americans as prisoners is not our former enemy, but continues to be such. And we're here tonight to make sure those that are still missing in action are not forgotten and to make sure it doesn't happen again."

Howard County clearly a key in this year's races

This is the season... No, the holidays haven't arrived, but the fall political campaign season is upon us and Big Spring and Howard County are clearly in for a little more attention than we're used to.

That's right, the politicians took notice when Howard County's support of Randy Neugebauer was the difference when he ran for an unexpired U.S. House of Representatives District 19 seat three years ago.

And there doesn't seem to be any question they think we're just as important in this year's race for the Texas House of Representatives' District 85 seat being vacated by the retirement of Democrat and former Speaker Pete Laney.

The combatants are Democrat Joe Heflin, and attorney and former Crosby County judge, and the Republican nominee, Plainview businessman Jim Landtroop.

It's clearly a seat both parties want desperately and they're both bringing out all the big guns at their disposal.

Anyone doubting this need only note that Gov. Rick Perry has scheduled a visit to Big Spring this week.

Upon landing in Big Spring at noon Thursday, the governor is scheduled to endorse Landtroop at the Hangar 25 Air Museum. Then he and Landtroop will make their way to the Big Spring Country Club, where several prominent Howard County leaders are hosting a private fundraising luncheon in support of Landtroop.

Heflin's supporters, among them the Texas Farm Bureau Friends of Agriculture Fund (AGFUND) and the bipartisan Texas Parent PAC have had representatives accompany him to Big Spring for endorsement announcements.

In other words, this race is important to both political parties and it's clear they both consider us here in Big Spring and Howard County pivotal.

And that's just one more reason why Howard County voters need to make sure they're registered to vote for the general election on Nov. 7. The deadline is 5 p.m. Monday, Oct. 4, so there's still plenty of time to get that small, but very important task accomplished. Registration is held at the County Annex building, east of Howard County Courthouse.

The right to vote gives us the opportunity to choose who we want to serve as our voice in the local, state and federal levels of government. It's an important election because we'll be voting on bond issues in addition to local offices — a county judge local and two county commissioners seats.

And we'll not only be asked to decide between Heflin and Landtroop, but also get to weigh in on a wild four-way governor's race and select a U.S. representative and U.S. senator.

So, once again, we want to make sure people realize that voter registration is simple, free and takes only a couple of minutes.

To be eligible to vote, residents must be 18 years of age and a U.S. citizen. You do not need to have resided in Howard County for a specific length of time before registering here.

Anyone who has moved since they last obtained a voter registration card should also register.

One misconception some people have is that because they did not vote in a March primary, they are ineligible to vote in November. That is not the case. It doesn't matter whether you voted, or for whom you may have voted. The only thing that matters is that you have a valid voter registration card.

From our point of view, voting is an important process in which all of us should participate.

So, please register if you haven't already. Then study the candidates and their platforms. Then go vote.

There is just soooooo much sports going on in our area these days, and I'm not just talking about the seven high schools playing football in our coverage area.

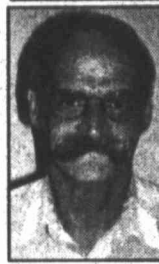
There's football, of course. Then there's volleyball. And, of course, cross country.

could cost even more than the 144-bed facility because it would have to be a multi-story building. That means elevators, increases in the face of the building and other items, as well as an increase in the number of staff needed to run it."

County Commissioner Jerry Kilgore said the state commission's demands for a new facility may seem harsh at first glance, but a closer look at the jail's history tells a different story.

"We have been under variances longer than any other county in the state," said Kilgore, referring to waivers granted by the state commission for items within the jail that do not meet require-

ments. "We've also been granted more variances than any other county in Texas. We've been working on several items, including the smoke evacuation system and the stand pipe, but even when these are fixed there are still a number of issues that simply can't be fixed."

"The state requires you to have so many square feet of jail space, something we're currently failing on," Kilgore continued. "We also need an exercise facility. It is a silly thing to think about trying to remodel the jail. We're looking at a five cent increase in the tax rate for this new facility, and we're already paying out almost \$250,000 a year for out-of-county housing, which represents two cents of the tax rate. The state has told us to get busy on building a new

jail, or they are not going to grant these variances anymore."

Sheriff Dale Walker said the most common solution he has heard to the problem is erecting a "tent city," an option that simply isn't open to counties in the Lone Star State.

"I've had a lot of people ask me why we don't just throw up a tent city like the sheriff in Maricopa County, Ariz., has," said Walker. "The answer to that is very simple. We have to adhere to the requirements set by the state jail commission, and Arizona doesn't have a state commission."

"Last year we peaked at 103 inmates, and had an average count of 66. This year we are expecting a average inmate count of 45-50 inmates. I want to be sure that when we build

this jail, we're addressing the issues for the next 50 years."

County Commissioner Bill Crooker said the existing jail's inability to meet state standards poses a very long reaching — and expensive — problem for Howard County.

"The current jail is antiquated and life threatening," said Crooker. "TAC (Texas Association of Counties), which holds the county's liability insurance policy, has told us they will cancel our policy effective Oct. 1. The county has been sued before, and it can cost millions and millions of dollars. We've dragged our feet on this long enough."

"Certain cultures are looking at Big Spring and saying its a nice place to live if you're a criminal.

You can commit crimes and then not have to pay for them because we don't have the jail space," Crooker added.

Crooker encouraged county residents to get the facts before heading to the polls in November.

"All we're presenting here today is the facts, not opinion," said Crooker. "We have this information at www.howardcountyjailbond.com for anyone that's interested to see it. We will also have pictures of the existing jail up soon so county residents can see what kind of problems we're facing. We just want to make sure the

voters are informed."

Consideration of a new jail facility began more than two years ago when commissioners identified jail overcrowding and non-compliance with state jail laws as an ongoing and long-term problem.

Earlier this year, commissioners voted 4-1 in favor of building a new 144-bed jail, with Commissioner Gary Simer voting against the measure, citing size and location as reasons.

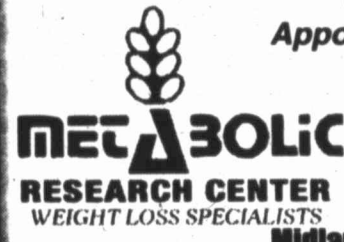

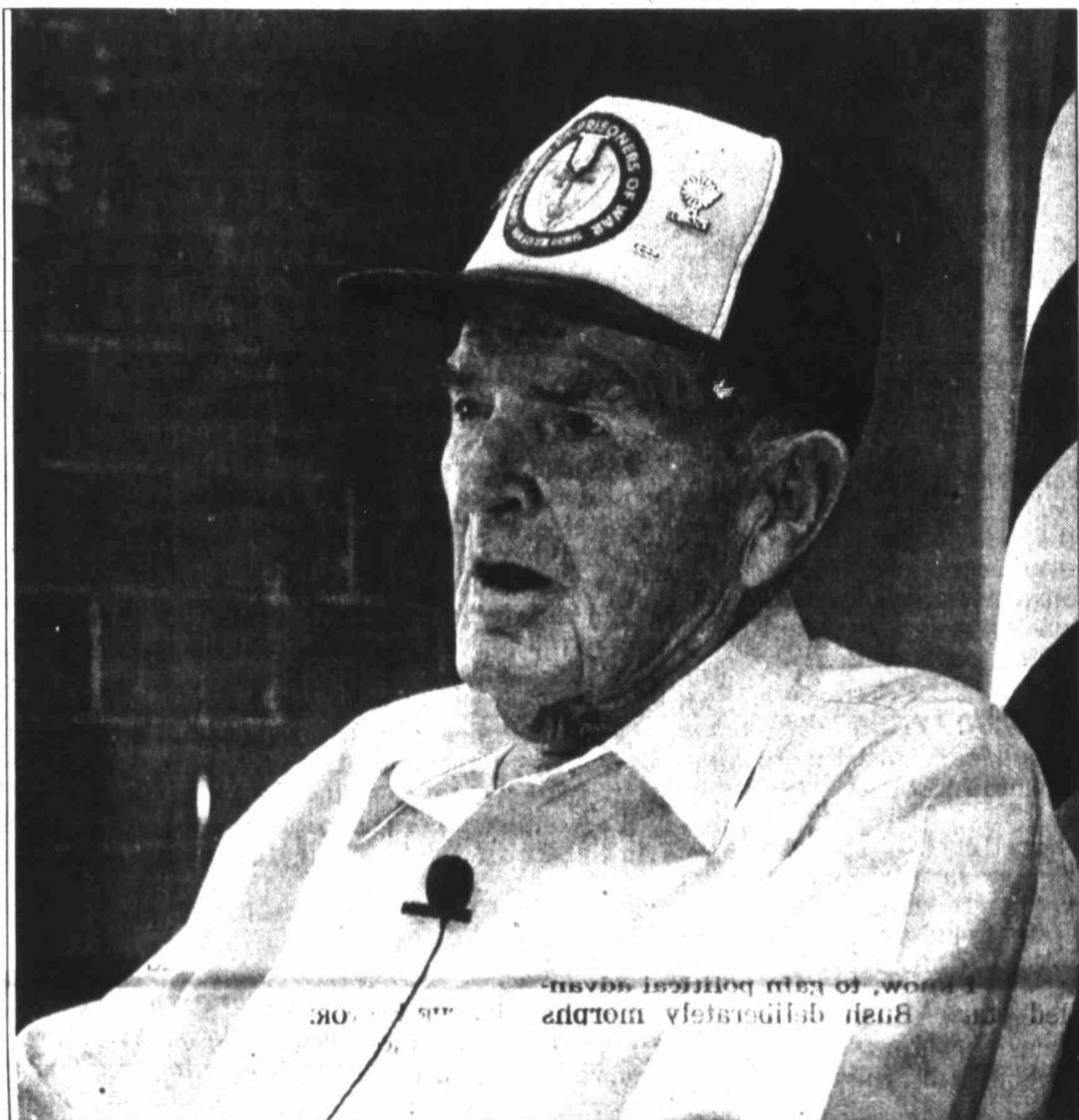

Gen. George S. Patton began rolling his troops through southern France that he once again found his freedom.

"We ate that goat meat, brussel sprouts and potatoes and stuff," said King. "I weighed about 240 pounds when I went in there, and I weighed about 130 when I came out. Gen. Patton was still circling around there... and then he came around through southern France and was on the way to the Battle of the Bulge and freed us. They turned us loose and we headed on up to the Bulge."

"That's when a Jeep I was riding in ran over a

mine and that's why I have pins in my legs, from the shrapnel. That's where I got my Purple Heart. We stayed at the Bulge for a little while and then the war was over. That was the end of World War II."

According to King, that would also mark the end of his stint in the military.

"I flew out of southern France back home, and my folks were in Nolan County," said King. "I stayed there for a while. That's when they told me I could have 45 days vacation and then I needed to get ready to go to Japan. I told them I didn't think so. That I was going to take my 45 days and get out. So I went to Arkansas to be discharged, and when I got

there, they told me they didn't have anyone to discharge me.

"So I went down to El Paso, and my records caught up with me. I was one of the first to fly home because I had a lot of good points, and that colonel in El Paso asked me how many benefits I wanted for my disability. I said I don't want very many 'cause I didn't want to have to stay in the hospital there. I told him I was ready to go home and get back to work."

King received a plaque to commemorate the occasion, presented by fellow veteran Don Boling.

Four dead in fiery 6-car accident

BRYAN (AP) — Four people died Friday in a fiery 6-car pileup that shut down Highway 6 for nearly 11 hours after a truck jackknifed, police said.

Two others were treated and released following the accident that caused two vehicles to catch fire, Texas Department of Public Safety dispatcher Donnie Jimenez said.

Among those killed were three students whose car slid under the truck that jackknifed across the undivided highway when the truck driver slammed on the breaks to stop for cars that had slowed behind someone turning left, DPS said.

The other victim, Augustin Zermeno Hernandez, 32, of Deer Park, was in a car that flipped on its side and caught fire after being struck from behind by the jackknifed truck.

The accident started when another tractor-trailer slowed down to make a left turn across traffic, the DPS report stated.

An off-duty officer who helped rescue one man from a burning truck described the scene as intense, with flames shooting as high as 10 feet.

"At one point he said he wanted someone to kill him," Harris County Sheriff's Deputy Ron Parker told the Bryan-College Station Eagle. "We heard another screaming from the dump truck, but we concentrated on the one we could help."

DPS identified the three teenagers killed in the car as Edward King II, 18, of College Station; Bryson Rashaad Thompson, 18, of Bryan; and Sarah Alexandra Nichols, 17, of Bryan. All were listed as students but their schools were not immediately known.

Nearby construction workers who tried to help Parker rescue the man appeared to suffer second- and third-degree burns from reaching into the wreckage, South Brazos County Volunteer Fire Chief Emily Staples said.

King, one of the students who was killed, was a football player at A&M Consolidated who graduated this year. His former coach, Jim Slaughter, told his players that their former teammate was killed in the afternoon accident after the team's game Friday.

"Ed was one of those kids that, I guess you could say, he kind of lived for you," Slaughter told the Eagle. "He didn't worry about himself. He was also worried about taking care of everybody else."

Judge postpones BP civil trial in refinery blast

GALVESTON (AP) — BP PLC will not face the first civil trial stemming from last year's deadly refinery blast until at least November after a judge granted the company's motion for a continuance Friday.

State District Judge Susan Criss had set opening arguments for Sept. 25 but postponed the date to give BP more time to prepare. Lawyers will now report back to court Nov. 7, with jury selection expected to begin that week.

Fifteen people were killed and more than 170 others injured in the March 2005 explosion at the company's Texas City refinery.

Lawyers for London-based BP requested the continuance Wednesday, claiming they are unprepared to defend the company against allegedly falsified data filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

Plaintiffs' lawyers plan to argue that BP falsified the reports to secure operating permits.

Attorney Tony Buzbee, who represents three workers severely injured in the blast, said plaintiffs' lawyers will resume efforts to get depositions from BP Chief Executive Lord John Browne during the continuance. BP has said the company already gave plaintiffs access to high-level executives with direct knowledge of the incident.

The other plaintiff in the first trial is the family of James and Linda Rowe, who were killed in the explosion. BP has settled with the families of the other 13 people who were killed.

Former border agent pleads guilty

LAREDO (AP) — A former U.S. border control agent pleaded guilty Friday in federal court to conspiring to transport illegal immigrants for money, a felony that carries a penalty of up to 10 years in prison, U.S. Attorney Don DeGabrielle announced.

William John Ferrone, 42, of Laredo, could also face as much as a \$250,000 fine. A sentencing date has not yet been set.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection agents stopped Ferrone on July 28 and found 11 illegal immigrants from Mexico and Honduras in his sport utility vehicle, authorities said.

Investigators said Ferrone had picked up the group on Interstate 35 about six miles north of the Laredo

border checkpoint. Two guides had steered the immigrants through the brush around the checkpoint and left them with Ferrone, authorities said.

Ferrone said Friday in open court that his original role in the scheme was only to introduce a coyote in the U.S. to one in Mexico. He said he only made the pickup July 28 when he learned the arranged driver was not going to do it, authorities said.

Woman gets prison in deadly smuggling case

EAGLE PASS (AP) — An Eagle Pass woman has been sentenced to six years in federal prison for her role in a deadly human smuggling case.

Cecilia Cigarroa-Wheeler, a 28-year-old permanent U.S. resident and Mexican citizen, was arrested in July 2005 after a state trooper stopped her for speeding and found a large amount of cash and some cocaine in the vehicle she was in with Diana Marisa Suniga, 29, of Beeville, Texas.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement officials said the women told investigators they left a sick illegal immigrant woman by a rural road near Carrizo Springs. Investigators later found the body of Maricela Alvarez-Rodriguez a short distance from where the women were arrested.

Cigarroa-Wheeler, who was sentenced Thursday on the charge of human smuggling resulting in death, is expected to face deportation once she finishes her prison term.

Suniga, who was convicted of the same charge, was sentenced to nine years in prison in May.

Aryan Brotherhood lieutenant sentenced

LUBBOCK (AP) — A member of a white supremacist group who calls himself "Baby Huey" was sentenced Friday to five years in prison for his role in the 2005 theft of 26 guns.

Aaron Thompson, 27, a "lieutenant" in the Aryan Brotherhood of Texas, pleaded guilty in June to one charge of conspiracy to possess and dispose of stolen firearms.

Two of Thompson's co-defendants stole the guns and stashed them at Thompson's home. The trio, all of whom belong to the white supremacist group, planned to trade the stolen guns for drugs and money, prosecutors said.

One co-defendant, Cory D. Daniel, 27, pleaded guilty in June to one count of felon in possession of a firearm. A jury convicted the other co-defendant, Matthew C. Courtney, 34, in July on conspiracy to possess and dispose of 26 stolen firearms, felon in possession of a firearm and possession of a stolen firearm. Daniel and Courtney are awaiting sentencing.

Customs agents find \$2 million in heroin

EL PASO (AP) — U.S. Customs agents seized more than 23 pounds of heroin at a downtown El Paso crossing from Mexico this week.

Roger Maier, a spokesman for U.S. Customs and Border Protection, said the 23.5 pounds of white powder heroin were found Thursday in a hidden compartment inside a 2001 Chevrolet Impala driven by a 21-year-old Mexican national from Ciudad Juarez, across the Rio Grande from El Paso.

The driver, Oscar Eduardo Martinez Garcia, was arrested by Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers on charges related to the alleged drug smuggling attempt.

The seizure, worth as much as \$2.1 million depending on where the drugs are sold, is the largest heroin bust at the El Paso port in more than two years.

Maier said it was unclear Friday where heroin was from, but historically heroin in that form has come from South America.

Police find four bodies in Carrollton home

CARROLLTON (AP) — A couple and their two children were found shot to death in their large suburban home Friday in what police said appears to be a triple

murder-suicide.

Carrollton Police Sgt. Patrick Murphy said the couple was in their 40s and their sons were approximately 18 and 10 years old. He said he didn't know how long the bodies had been there. Police have not yet released the names.

"Preliminary indications are that it is possibly a murder-suicide," Murphy said. "Still, we are investigating it as a homicide."

He said there was no sign of forced entry, and that investigators were trying to piece together exactly what happened and who pulled the trigger.

Murphy said the woman's sister was concerned, came to the house to check on the family and discovered the bodies Friday morning. Murphy said the bodies were found throughout the brick home in an upscale neighborhood just north of Dallas near Indian Creek Golf Club.

"They were nice people. Everything was fine," said Rahil Berani, a friend of the teenager. "He was supposed to be going to Ohio State tomorrow."

Berani said he had plans to see his friend of at least seven years on Saturday before the teen left for college. High school friends of the teen, Rifaan Eswani and Alinoor Pradhan, stood a few houses away from the police tape and evidence trucks. They said they came because they heard the news and could not believe it.

They described their friend as a hard-working Buckeyes fan, who loved making people laugh and loved football. They said he planned to study architecture at Ohio State.

They said the teen attended Hebron High School in Carrollton and his brother went to a private school.

Other friends and acquaintances gathered near the home said the family appeared happy and successful. They said the family owned several discount stores.

"I wish we had seen some telltale signs," said Hussein Saddrudin, who attended Ismaili Center, a Muslim community center, with the family. "Whenever events like this happen, it is hard to believe it."

City to buy about 50 homes in 'flood zone'

EL PASO (AP) — The city has announced plans to buy about 50 flood-ravaged homes considered unsafe after disastrous storms.

City officials declared the westside neighborhood a flood zone this week after it was inundated with rain and mud in downpours that caused widespread flooding in late July and early August.

The plan to buy the homes in the Mowad subdivision, where the average home is worth about \$35,000 to \$40,000, was announced late Wednesday.

City officials say the neighborhood is no longer safe. "We have concluded that the area around Mowad is not conducive to residential development," Deputy City Manager Pat Aduato said. "We know (residents) are getting conflicting information, and we don't want them to spend any more money on their property because we are going to buy it."

Details about the buyout plan are still being worked out.

Minor injuries in McAllen taqueria explosion

MCALLEN (AP) — At least four people were taken to the hospital for what appeared to be minor injuries Friday after an explosion in a McAllen restaurant just before noon, fire officials said.

Restaurant Manager Horacio Alvarado told KGBT-TV that a wall in the restaurant exploded.

McAllen Fire Department Lt. James Schultz said it appeared the explosion was started by a gas leak.

About 15 more people were being treated at the scene and were debating whether to be examined at the hospital, Schultz said. He said some injuries could have been caused by shattered glass.

The restaurant had recently opened in the site of a former Black Eyed Pea.

Merchants say whole class of shoppers has disappeared

McALLEN — Luxury SUVs bearing Mexican license plates dot the retail centers of border cities like this one, but the bus station that used to bring scores of low-income shoppers is nearly empty.

Shopkeeper Monica Weisberg-Stewart and others blame the five-year-old "laser visa" and stricter enforcement of its requirements for short-term Mexican visitors.

The laser visa, a biometric, machine-readable card, was required as of Oct. 1, 2001, replacing the old border crossing card. But it costs \$100 instead of \$65 for the old one, fingerprints and photo are now required and the State Department says it is putting each applicant under increased scrutiny.

The visa gives a visitor 90 days in the immediate border region.

The result is that Mexicans who can easily prove they have income and assets in Mexico can

get a visa, while those who don't own property or have a full-time job often cannot.

"Essentially for a temporary visa the applicant has to prove to the officers that they have a good reason for travel temporarily," said State Department spokeswoman Laura Tischler. Proof of economic solvency in Mexico is a major factor, she said, and Customs agents who approve the visas work on the knowledge that it is easier to deny entry to someone than find and deport him later.

State Department records show 1.9 million visas were issued in 2001, declining each year to 702,308 in 2005. Tischler said the figures reflect an initial jump as people replaced their cards and that the numbers dropped off because the replacement phase were over.

More than 3 million border crossing cards were issued in each of the years from 1996 to 2000.

"It wiped out the whole lower socio-economic class of people," Weisberg-Stewart said. "To some people that customer didn't mean anything. But for people selling on the volume basis, making a dollar or two profit on an item, it really hurt."

Residents with friends and relatives in Mexico who were denied the new laser visa say the new requirements have cut down or eliminated visits.

Mercedes Leal, who has worked at the Weisberg-Stewart store for 41 years, says her sister-in-law, Maria Theresa Leal Suarez, had her visa revoked by Customs officials and can no longer cross the Rio Grande from Reynosa, Mexico.

"She was coming to visit, with cheese and nopales (cactus pads)," she said. "She said she was going to visit my brother. They said 'No, you can't pass,' and said her visa was being revoked for a year."

That year has passed,

but trips to the U.S. consulate in Monterrey and about \$200 in fees have not gotten her another visa.

"It's done," Leal said, shaking her head.

Maria Leal's neighbor in Reynosa used to come to buy bagfuls of used clothing to resell in Mexico.

"They told her \$20 was too little to come over with. They took her visa. But \$20 buys a lot of used clothing," Leal said.

McAllen Mayor Richard Cortez said many have similar family stories, including himself.

"Here on the southern border we have grown to really be interdependent with one another," he said. "My son married a girl from Reynosa (Mexico) who happens to be a U.S. citizen. When we have parties some times some of her cousins can't come over because they don't have a laser visa."

The new \$5 million bus station was completed around the same time

that the laser visa came about, which proved unfortunate timing. It has 10 new lines and brings in buses throughout Mexico from northern cities including Dallas, San Antonio, and Houston, but it processes barely more than the 1.3 million the old bus station handled in 2000 with just one line.

"We resent it very much," said Laura Riveroli de Perera, operator of Noreste, a Mexican bus line. "We have a good time in the holiday season. The U.S. people go to Mexico to see their relatives or something, but the Mexican people have a lot of difficulties to come. They need to fill a lot of papers, give their proofs of rent, telephones, light, banking accounts, friends and family on the other side."

The denials have not

affected the border's overall economic picture. Researchers at University of Texas-Pan American, University of Texas-El Paso, Texas A&M International and the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas all show that the Mexicans that are coming across are spending more than ever in trips across the border, though they are making fewer trips.

But some worry that honest short-term visitors are being denied.

Said Cortez, "It would be nice if we could figure out a way to screen them in such a way that we basically know who they are, that they're no threat to the country, find a way they could travel easily, peacefully, as often as they want to. ... I think the United States could be better served if we sit down and not put everybody in the same bag."

Nelson asks AG to decide if cities can limit where sex offenders live

AUSTIN — A state senator has asked the attorney general to decide whether Texas law or the state constitution can bar cities from limiting where sex offenders live.

Over the past several months, more than a dozen Texas cities have adopted ordinances prohibiting certain sex offenders from living within 1,000 feet of schools, parks and other places where children gather. A few are even tougher, extending the ban to 2,000 feet.

In small cities such as Watauga, a suburb of Fort Worth that comprises less than 5 square miles, the new 1,000-foot ban covers almost every home and apartment. Some city council members worry that violates the offenders' rights under the Texas Constitution.

State Sen. Jane Nelson, R-Lewisville, said she supports "the strongest possible limitations on sex offenders." But, at the request of some officials from Watauga and other

cities, she asked Attorney General Greg Abbott last month to clarify whether they have the authority to set such limitations. The attorney general's office made her request public Friday.

Abbott has about six months to respond to her request.

Lisa Graybill, legal director of the American Civil Liberties Union of Texas, said she believes some of the ordinances would be constitutional and others wouldn't, based on the wording of the statute and the geography of the town. Watauga's case is "a pretty extreme example," she said.

Her bigger concern, however, was that the ordinances would drive some of Texas' 46,000 registered sex offenders underground and away from the support services that could prevent them from attacking again.

"People have to live somewhere," she said. "Literally, physically, you can't not be somewhere. If their very presence is illegal in 95 percent of your town, how likely is it that

every single person of the wide, wide net to whom this ordinance is going to apply will be able to comply with it?"

But Marble Falls assistant police chief Ted Young believes sex offenders forfeited their rights when they committed a crime.

"They made that decision, not us, and I don't feel sorry for them," said Young, whose city adopted a sex offender ordinance Monday.

Marble Falls ordinance applies to registered sex offenders whose victims were under the age of 16. In addition to schools, parks and baseball fields, it bars offenders from living within 1,000 feet of the playgrounds at the town's McDonald's and the arcade at the local Wal-Mart.

The "safety zones" encompass more than a quarter of the city located 45 miles northwest of Austin and include almost all of its apartments. Landlords are responsible for checking their tenants, and both parties face up to a \$500 fine if they violate the

rule. "It's not a catchall thing, it's just another tool that we can use that'll also help us keep track of them," Young said.

The ordinances mostly build on state laws that say sex offenders who are on parole cannot live within 500 feet of schools, parks, and any place children gather. Probationers whose victims are children usually have distances set on a case-by-case basis, but usually it's 500 feet, according to the Department of Public Safety.

Those not on parole or probation have no proximity restrictions under state law.

That doesn't make sense to Cara Mendelsohn, a 40-year-old stay-at-home mom from Plano who is president of a PTA group that persuaded the Dallas suburb to pass a sex offender ordinance in July.

"Why is it that one day later that they come off parole that they're suddenly OK to live across from an elementary school?" she asked.

West Nile Virus cases in Texas outpace last year

DALLAS (AP) — Eighteen people have died of West Nile virus so far this year in Texas, with 123 developing the more serious neuroinvasive form of the illness, the Department of State Health Services said Friday.

Last year ended with 11 deaths and 128 neuroinvasive cases, the more serious form of the virus with symptoms including a stiff neck, visual problems, altered taste, body tremors, mental confusion and seizures.

"It's not something to become panicked about, but it's one of the risks in our lives like so many that we need to be aware of," said Tom Sidwa, manager of the zoonosis control branch for the health department.

After first appearing in New York in 1999, West Nile virus spread over the rest of the United States over a three-year period, said Dr. Roy Campbell, a

medical epidemiologist with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The virus was first identified in Texas in 2002, when there were 202 neuroinvasive cases and 13 deaths. In 2003 there were

439 cases and 38 deaths. In 2004 there were 119 cases and eight deaths.

West Nile virus usually begins appearing in late spring, peaks in early August and then tapers off during the fall as the weather cools, said health

department spokeswoman Carrie Williams. But just because the weather is getting cooler, experts say it is no time to stop being vigilant.

There are steps people can take to prevent getting bitten by mosquitoes,

Obrador calls end to street protest clogging Mexico City

MEXICO CITY — Supporters of leftist Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador on Friday ended the street protest that clogged the heart of the capital for nearly seven weeks, but they vowed to find other ways to resist the incoming conservative president.

The announcement of the end of the protest camps came a day after President Vicente Fox decided to move Friday night's annual independence celebration away from the main square to avoid the protesters. The president moved the ceremony to the city of Dolores Hidalgo, 170 miles away.

Mexican media quoted Interior Secretary Carlos Abascal as saying the feuding parties had struck a deal — Fox agreed to relocate the celebration in exchange for Lopez Obrador supporters dismantling their protest camp.

The former Mexico City mayor, who claims that his narrow loss in the July 2 presidential election was fraudulent, said he planned to travel across the country to meet with his supporters.

Spokesman Cesar Yanez told The Associated Press the protesters would not retake Mexico City's Reforma Avenue and its main plaza, the Zocalo, after they hold a convention there Saturday.

"Everything will return to normal," Yanez said.

Traffic already was flowing along Reforma, which had been blocked by tents, cars and buses since July 30 in an unsuccessful bid to force a full recount in the presidential vote.

Lopez Obrador and his supporters refuse to recognize the slim victory of Felipe Calderon, the candidate of Fox's conservative National Action Party who is scheduled to take office Dec. 1.

Protesters started dismantling their tent city Thursday to allow the military to stage its Independence Day parade Saturday along its traditional route down Reforma.

Until now, protest leaders had suggested the future of the protest camps would be decided at the "National Democratic Convention" on Saturday, where supporters will be asked if they want to declare Lopez Obrador president of a "parallel government" to challenge Calderon's administration.

"I am not giving up nor giving in, and I'm going to visit all the towns in the country," Lopez Obrador said, speaking in the Zocalo on Friday.

The protests that snarled traffic in the already congested metropolis of 20 million people took a toll on Lopez Obrador's popularity and exposed divisions within his Democratic Revolution Party. Recent opinion polls pointed to growing resentment against the protest.

Lorenzo Ysasi, head of the National Business Chamber, said the demonstration cost the city more than 3,000 jobs and about 67 small businesses were forced to close.

In a letter published in local media Friday, the leftist party's founder, Cuauhtemoc Cardenas, said the decision to seize Reforma was "causing losses and wearing out the democratic movement

in general." The letter was sent to writer Eliana Poniatowska, a Lopez Obrador supporter.

Hundreds of his supporters began trickling into the Zocalo Friday afternoon where they planned to throw their own Independence Day party. Live bands played traditional Mexican music, while revelers blew plastic horns, donned large sombreros,

and threw balloons up in the air.

But there were signs many were staying away.

"It's significant that Fox has stepped aside," said Yazmin Quiroz, 40, who was enjoying a beer with friends on an outside hotel terrace overlooking the Zocalo, and planned to go down to the square later to cheer for Lopez Obrador.

"If it's not an act of cow-

ardice, it is a recognition of the social power" that Lopez Obrador has, she said, adding that if Fox had come, he would have been greeted with a shower of tomatoes and eggs.

Lopez Obrador had called on his supporters to turn their backs when Fox made the traditional independence night cry of "Viva Mexico!"

Fox's decision to move the celebrations prompted

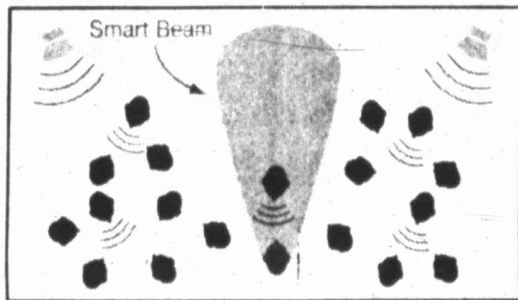
Lopez Obrador to declare victory.

But Fox's spokesman Ruben Aguilar said Friday the president moved the ceremony to Dolores Hidalgo, 170 miles away, because the government had "solid information" radical groups planned violence that could have caused deaths.

He refused to give specifics.

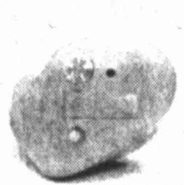

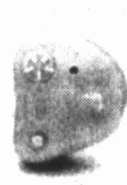

HEREFORD — For three quarters the Big Spring Steers dominated their football game with Hereford Friday night.

Unfortunately a disastrous first quarter was more than the young Steers could overcome, and the Whitefaces held on for a 41-34 win which allowed them to remain undefeated this season.

Down 34-6 to open the third quarter, quarterback Raul Aguilar led a furious air attack to get the Steers back in the game.

those playmakers. The sophomore ended the night with 4 touchdown catches, and could not be contained by Hereford.

"Who was No. 4 anyway?" Asked Hereford Head Coach DeLozier after the game. "We had a hard time containing him all night. He played really well, and he was quite impressive when I made a point to find him and congratulate him after the game."

Aguilar and Parker connected all night for 165 yards in the comeback effort, including one for 34 yards and a score.

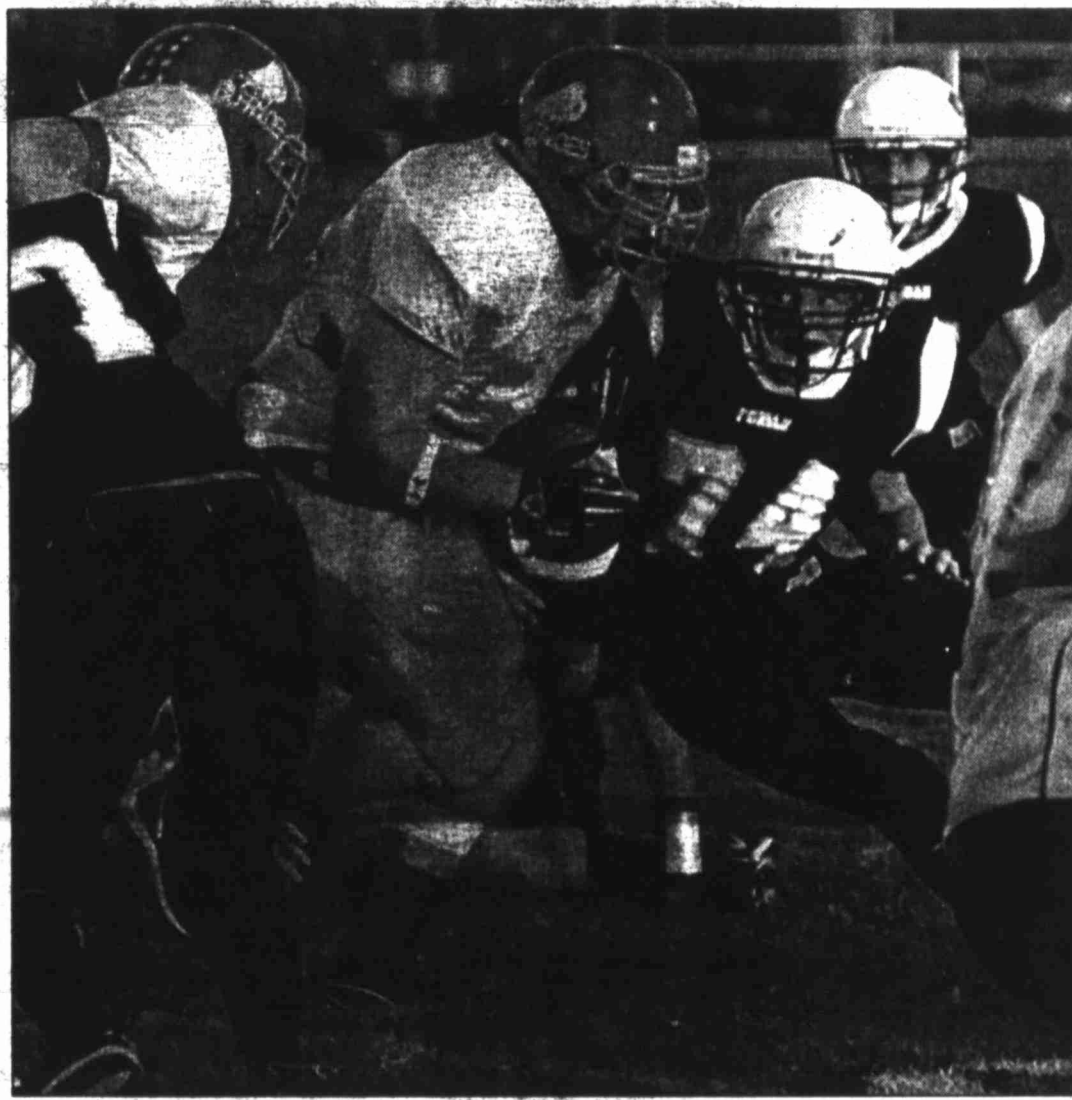
"If the ball is in the air then I'm going to go up and get it," Parker said. "Had we played a whole game and not three quar-

The game was scoreless after one quarter, but the Bearcats scored twice in each of the last three periods to secure the victory.

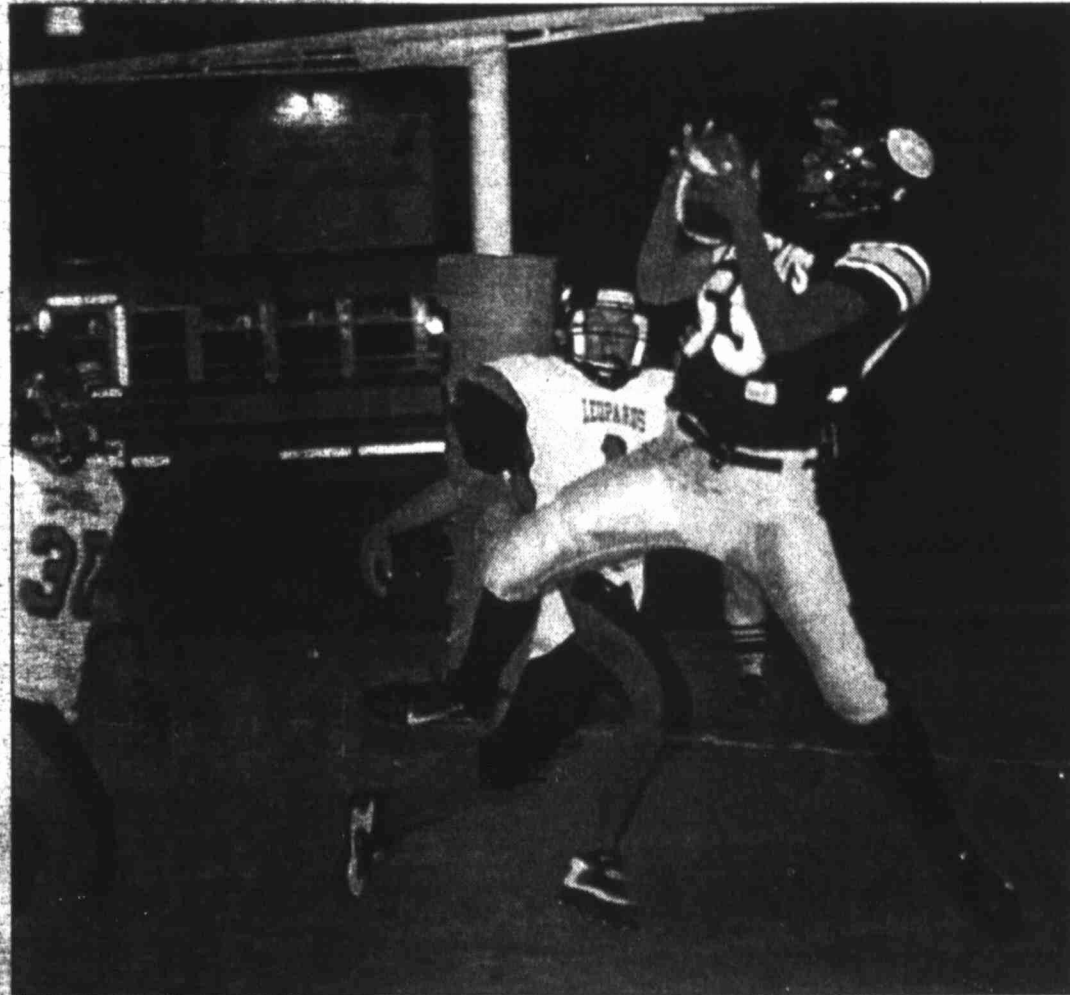

Rivas scored three

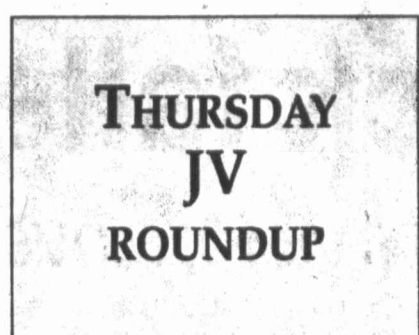

With time moving down close to 5:00 left in the game, Stanton chipped their way toward the Forsan goal line and on 3rd and 8 from the 11, Fulton found room up the middle and scampered in for the go-ahead TD.

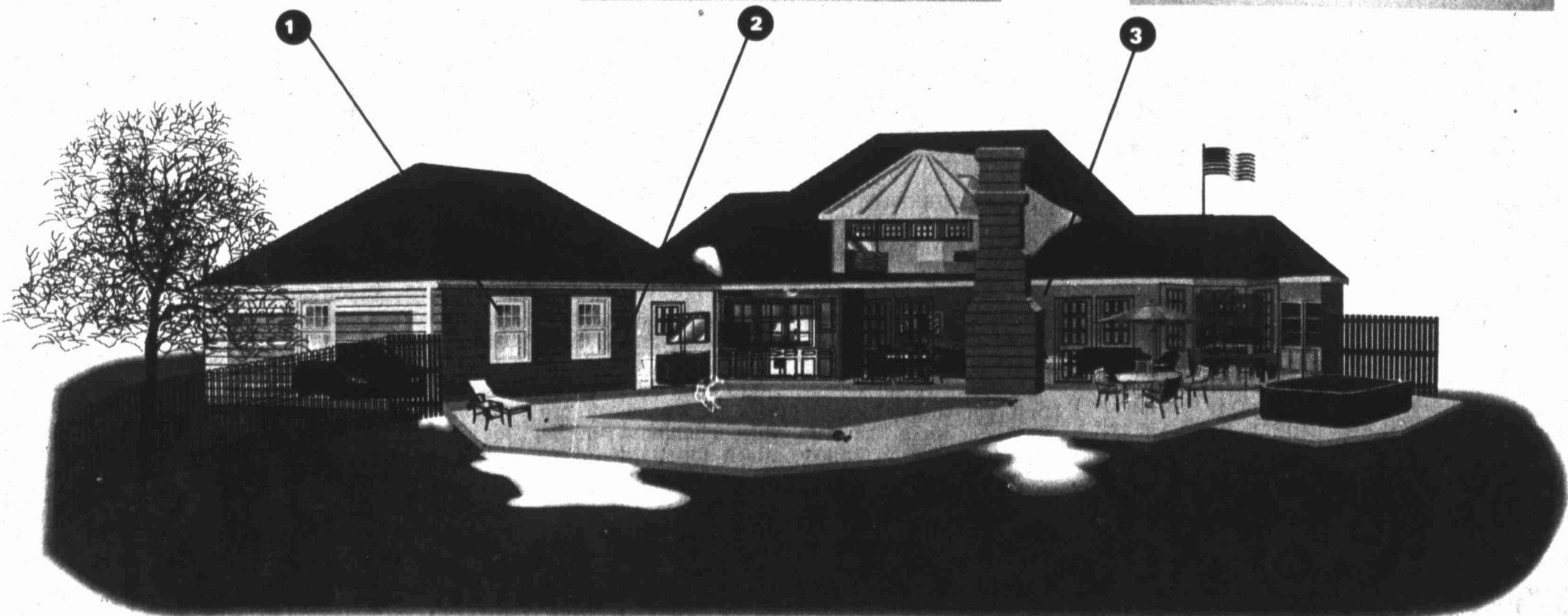

Owens ready to start celebrating as Dallas prepares for home opener

IRVING — Terrell Owens has had six months to come up with a memorable way to celebrate his first touchdown at Texas Stadium as a member of the Dallas Cowboys.

Of course, it's got to involve the midfield star logo he stomped on six years ago.

Pulling a marker out of his sock and signing the logo would be quite a spectacle. As would borrowing pompoms from one of the famous Cowboys cheerleaders and shimmying on the 50-yard line. Or he could just plow down and do some midfield sit-ups.

But Owens prefers to be an innovator, not a copycat, even if those would merely be digging into his own repertoire.

So, T.O., what's it going to be?

"I don't really know what I am going to do," he said. "I'm just going to go out there and try to wing it, try to have fun with it."

Owens will get his chance Sunday night against the Washington Redskins, providing he reaches the end zone.

The game itself should be a good one. The Cowboys and Redskins are division rivals that came into this season with playoff hopes, but made too many mistakes and lost their openers. The loser will be 0-2, adding urgency to this battle of wits between coaching greats Bill Parcells and Joe Gibbs, and providing taunt-worthy material for team owners Jerry Jones and

Daniel Snyder.

Yet those aren't the reasons NBC got this game for its second prime-time showcase.

It's all about the guy wearing No. 81 on his shirt and a star on his helmet — and what he might do after a touchdown.

Owens is well aware a national television audience will be watching. And he knows they'll be waiting for something outlandish, ideally one that invokes his look-at-me antics on the logo in 2000, the move that launched him from quality receiver to A-list personality.

"I'm going to have to figure it out. I just haven't figured it out yet," he insisted this week. "I've about run out of touchdown dances and celebrations, as far as something creative."

The broadcast is sure to include a rundown of T.O.'s TD stunts, including his autograph session for beaten cornerback Shawn Springs, then of Seattle but now playing for Washington.

Springs is recovering from surgery and not expected to play. But he knows what to expect should Owens score.

"He's going to act the fool, just like he will always do," Springs said. "That's Sunday night and it's prime time, so he's going to show up because that's what keeps you on SportsCenter. He's going to do something big, so your goal is to go out there and try to shut out him and (Terry) Glenn."

"But the thing I keep telling everybody — I don't want y'all to be sur-

prised — T.O. is a great player, but the difference is that now you can't double-team Terry Glenn, and he's been lighting up the last two years."

Without Springs, the Redskins gave up 223 yards passing in a 19-16 loss to Minnesota last Sunday. Cornerback Carlos Rogers gave up a 20-yard touchdown and Mike Rumph gave up a 46-yard completion.

"You've got to give them different looks, mix up the coverage," said Rogers, a first-round pick last year who is likely to draw Owens most of the time. "T.O., he likes to be physical. I was telling some of the guys, we've got to get back in the weight room this week, because with him, we've got to be physical the whole game."

In Dallas' opener, Glenn caught four passes for 81 yards and Owens had a team-best six catches for 80 yards, including a twirling grab for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter. He didn't celebrate because the Cowboys were on their way to a 24-17 loss to Jacksonville.

While Owens denies choreographing anything for this game, he acknowledges he wants to do something special.

"You better believe it," he said. "I'm going to try to bring some excitement to Texas Stadium."

Actually, the sizzle factor might start with Cowboys quarterback Drew Bledsoe, who is on the hot seat — at least with fans, if not coach Bill Parcells — after throwing three interceptions last Sunday.

Texans ready for Manning, Colts

INDIANAPOLIS—The Manning Bowl had the buildup, the prime-time slot and the nation's attention.

Sunday's game against Houston may not have the intrigue, but the Indianapolis Colts insist it's more important.

"This is bigger because it's almost as if it counts as two games," three-time Pro Bowl defensive end Dwight Freeney said. "It's a division game, and there are the tiebreakers and all the stuff that goes with it."

The Colts (1-0), like coach Tony Dungy, believe it's never too early to start considering playoff implications — even in Week 2.

Dungy routinely informs players about tie-breaking procedures, historical trends and constantly stresses the need to win division games, a point he'll make repeatedly over the next month.

With home wins over the Texans this week and Jacksonville next week, the Colts could quickly make a move for their fourth straight division title. They also host Tennessee on Oct. 8.

A sweep could turn the division chase into a one-sided race. The Colts are 20-4 all-time against division foes since moving to the South in 2002, have won 16 of the last 18 and swept the division last year.

And no team has had more trouble with the Colts than Houston (0-1).

The Texans have been perfectly awful in this series. Besides losing eight straight games,

they've been outscored 233-109 and allowed two-time MVP Peyton Manning to carve up their defense for 19 touchdowns and a 116 rating.

Meanwhile, Houston has scored more than 17 points only twice against Indy.

But these Texans have new expectations.

First-year coach Gary Kubiak installed a different offense, a different defense and a different attitude. Now the Texans will see if the changes can also produce different results.

"They'll be fast, it will be wild and we've got to be on our game in there," quarterback David Carr said. "So it's definitely a challenge for us."

Yet Houston looked a lot like its old self last week. The Texans fell behind Philadelphia in the first half, Carr was sacked five times and their makeshift running game, which is missing Domanick Davis, struggled.

Houston hopes part of the answer arrived Wednesday when it traded for running back Samkon Gado, while Kubiak continues to tinker on the other big problem: pass protection.

"There's various things you can do scheme-wise," he said. "You try to keep him protected, but you can change his launch points by moving him around. The bottom line is that we've got to get better."

One area the Texans expect to improve is the pass rush.

They surprised many by taking defensive end Mario Williams with the top pick in this year's draft, in part to slow

down Manning. Williams' presence means three No. 1 picks — Manning, Carr and Williams — will be on the field Sunday, and the most successful of them offered some friendly advice for Williams.

"I went through the comparisons with Ryan Leaf my rookie year, so he'll have to do that with Reggie Bush," Manning said. "My advice to him, and he probably knows this already, is to go out and be the best player he can be."

The Colts weren't exactly in sync last week. Minus Edgerrin James, they managed a meager 2.4 yards per carry and the defense allowed New York to pile up 186 yards rushing.

It was nowhere close to Dungy's expectations.

But with Manning and Marvin Harrison on the verge of reaching even more milestones — Manning is closing in on 250 TD passes and Harrison needs five catches to pass Art Monk for fifth all-time on the receptions list — the Colts' foundation remains solid.

"Absolutely, it's a big deal," Manning said. "Coach Dungy always talks about getting off on the right foot and how division games count double."

And if Dungy didn't get the defense's attention with some uncharacteristic criticism Monday, he can always rely on the playoff talk.

"I think our guys understand the urgency of an AFC South game," Dungy said. "We want to come out and really play the first quarter the way we played the first quarter in New York."

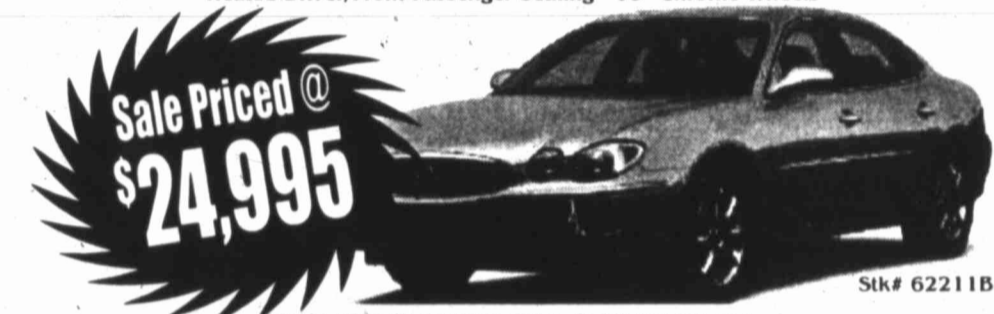

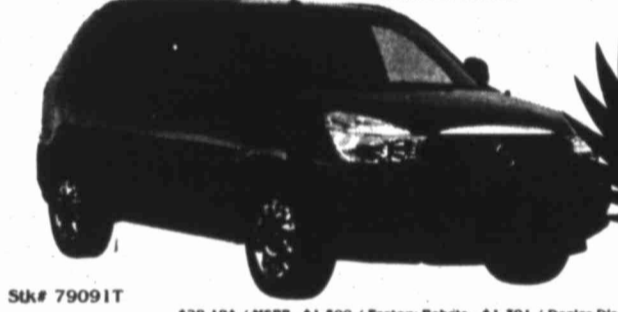

Frogs want revenge against Texas Tech

FORT WORTH, — TCU quarterback Jeff Ballard and defensive end Tommy Blake still vividly remember that repetitive sound: the blast of the cannon celebrating each Texas Tech touchdown.

Ten times by the end of that game two years ago, a 70-35 Tech win.

"When you hear it go off three times in two minutes, you don't forget it," said Blake, the Mountain West Conference defensive player of the year who played as a freshman in that game. "You remember that stuff, and take notes."

After TCU scored the first three touchdowns that afternoon in Lubbock, the Red Raiders tied the game by halftime - part of five TDs in a 6 1/2-minute span. It became the Horned Frogs' most lopsided loss in coach Gary Patterson's six seasons.

"We've been waiting for this game for quite a while," said Ballard, 10-0 since becoming TCU's starting quarterback last year.

No. 20 TCU (2-0) finally gets another chance against the old Southwest Conference rival Saturday when No. 24 Texas Tech (2-0) travels to Fort Worth for the first time since 1994. The 2004 game is the only one they've played since the SWC disbanded.

There's also another

motivation. The Frogs' 12-game winning streak is the longest in NCAA Division I-A after defending national champion Texas' 21-game streak ended with a loss to No. 1 Ohio State last weekend.

"I am sure they have got that (2004 loss) on their mind. We still have it on our mind," said Joel Filani, one of four Tech receivers already with at least eight catches. "If we break their winning streak, that would be great too."

Even with their fifth starting quarterback in five seasons - and first underclassman in that span - the Red Raiders remain one of the nation's best passing teams. Sophomore Graham Harrell has completed 74 of 101 passes (73 percent) for 718 yards and seven touchdowns.

Ballard, a sideline spectator two years ago, is trying to become the first TCU quarterback to win his first 11 starts.

He became the starter after Tye Gunn - the other 10-0 starter - got hurt.

TCU has won 12 straight games for the third time since 1999. The school's only longer streak was 14 and included the Frogs' undefeated national championship in 1938, when quarterback Davey O'Brien won their only Heisman Trophy.

Since the loss at Texas Tech in 2004, TCU has gone 3-0 against Big 12 teams.

Longhorns look to get back on track

HOUSTON — Facing Rice might be just what No. 8 Texas needs to shake off its loss to Ohio State and get back on track to defending the national title.

After all, Texas (1-1) hasn't lost consecutive games in seven seasons and Rice (0-2) has won just one of its last 19 games. The Owls are even worse against the Longhorns, taking only one of the last 36 meetings.

"What we've got to do now is deal with the pressure that no team at this school has lost back-to-back games in 78 games, since 1999," said Texas coach Mack Brown. "So

they sure don't want to be the team that loses two."

Safety Michael Griffin thinks his team can move on and sees the loss as a new beginning.

"I don't think you can stay on top forever," he said. "One day you have to fall. Saturday was the day we fell. There is always a start and an end, and we can't start all over until something hits. It's time to start over."

Saturday's game is at Reliant Stadium. The last time Texas visited the Houston Texans' home they embarrassed Colorado 70-3 in a Big 12 Championship game that propelled them into the Rose Bowl.

Adding a bit of intrigue to the matchup is that former Texas quarterback

Major Applewhite is in his first season as offensive coordinator at Rice. The 27-year-old Applewhite finished his career with the Longhorns in 2001.

New Longhorns starter Colt McCoy is looking forward to seeing Applewhite again. Applewhite was working at Texas when McCoy was recruited.

"It's going to be fun because Major is an idol here as quarterback and anytime you hear of a quarterback at Texas, you always picture Major Applewhite in your mind," McCoy said.

The Longhorns opened the season with a 56-7 win over North Texas before

the 24-7 loss to No. 1 Ohio State. Rice lost a tough 31-30 game to in-town rival Houston before a 26-16 defeat by UCLA.

Applewhite, who played for Brown and was a graduate assistant coach under him, knows a thing or two about how he'll prepare his team.

"Coach Brown has always done a great job of getting their guys back up after a loss," Applewhite said.

"I've been in those staff meetings where players and coaches are challenged. So they'll be ready to go, but we're going to be ready to go as well."

The Longhorns could get a boost by the return of cornerback Tarell Brown.

'Old Guard' vet, Aggies to face Army

COLLEGE STATION — The dream is always the same, and Texas A&M linebacker Mark Dodge would prefer to never have it again.

Hot and exhausted, he's wandering through the wreckage of the Pentagon a few days after American Airlines Flight 77 crashed into it on Sept. 11, 2001. Dodge spots a large shape and removes some debris to get a better look. The object is a charred human body, and as he moves closer, it suddenly reaches out to him with both arms, eyes wide open.

"That's usually when I wake up," Dodge says. He doesn't have the nightmare much any

more, but it haunted him constantly in the weeks after the attacks - when he actually was there, at the Pentagon.

Dodge is 25 now and never finishes a day without smiling about something. After all, he's playing Division I-A football, and whenever his teammates gripe about the oppressive heat or the lousy food at the training table, he's quick to remind them how lucky they are.

"That's kind of my leadership role, to try to let everybody know what you've got, don't take it for granted," he said, "because one day you've got it, the next day it's gone."

The Aggies (2-0) play

Army (1-1) on Saturday in San Antonio, a fitting end to a week five years removed from the days and images that changed Dodge - and the world - forever.

Dodge was a member of The Old Guard, the Army's 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment. The unit is partly ceremonial, presenting colors at funerals at Arlington National Cemetery and state dinners at the White House.

On 9/11, it received a mission unlike any before.

Dodge was on the other side of the Pentagon that morning, filling out paperwork to gain top-secret security clearance. He saw a crowd gathering around televisions in a

mall area, and there he got his first look at the attacks on the World Trade Center.

A few minutes later, a thunderous explosion shook the giant building. Alarms sounded and the Pentagon was evacuated. Once Dodge got outside, he looked over his shoulder and saw black smoke billowing from where a hijacked plane had crashed.

Acting on instinct he attributed to his Army training, Dodge hurried to his car and drove to Fort Myer, the Old Guard's headquarters about a mile away. He learned there that his regiment was headed back to the Pentagon to help in the cleanup.

In time all things change. Restaurants come and go whether they are in a small town or a big city. Whether a restaurant survives or not depends on many factors, but ultimately begins with the dream of one person.

Sally Rodriguez, owner of Alberto's Crystal Cafe, was such a person. "I knew I would own a business," she explained, "I just didn't know what."

After growing up in San Antonio, Sally moved to Big Spring at the age of 18 with a friend when she met her husband, Alberto. She began working at his parents' restaurant the Spanish Inn and remained there for the next 15 years.

But she wanted to start a business of her own and with the help of her husband, owned Sally's Beauty Shop before starting the restaurant.

With the encouragement of her husband and some of her friends, Sally decided that a restaurant would be the way to go. "If you can't fight them, join them," she recalls thinking when she had made up her mind. Money was an issue, though, and a loan had to be acquired. When Sally approached her husband with the prospect, he was doubtful.

Sally stuck to her guns. "My husband said there was no way they would give me that money because I am Hispanic and female," she explained. There were Mexican restaurants, but they were all on the north side. "There had never been one downtown," Sally explained. The possibility of getting the loan seemed unlikely.

However, being a self-described "people person" and with her impressive work history, she won over the board at the credit union and a loan was given to her for \$19,000. "I went



home after the meeting and everybody was shocked," she said with a laugh.

The restaurant opened in December 1974, making the eatery the first Mexican food establishment downtown. The abstract of the property was soon obtained but Sally noticed something disturbing written on the document. "On one part the previous owner had written 'This property is not to be sold to any Mexicans or Blacks,'" she said. A reminder to Sally of how times were changing and the mindset of those who preceded her.

Putting this aside, the real work began and the condition of the building was less than conducive to a restaurant business. "We started with a four burner stove, a small refrigerator and the sink had holes in it," she said. But with \$39 in the register the little 15 seat cafe was soon packed. "And we stayed packed," said Sally.

The menu consisted of traditional cafe fare of chili, burritos, stew and breakfast. Soon friends were requesting more be added. "A friend told me, 'Sally,

we know you can cook. Why not make green enchiladas once a week?'"

At first overwhelmed with the idea, Sally complied and soon had a line at her door. Before long it was evident that expansion was needed and the pharmacy next door was purchased. This provided room enough to create a dining room. The Crystal Cafe, as it was previously known and had started as a small counter style breakfast and lunch restaurant, now could seat 60. And in honor of her husband's inspiration, the restaurant was named Alberto's Crystal Cafe.

This all occurred in the span of one year.

Statistically, according to daughter Debbie Rodriguez, that kind of growth was unusual in the 1970s. "The restaurant became successful within a couple of years," Debbie remarked. "The stats at that time was 10 years for a restaurant to see any profits. We were doing very well," she said with a smile.

The restaurant flourished despite the

closing of Webb Air Force Base and remained at the downtown location for 33 years. It was featured in Texas Monthly Magazine, Houston City Magazine, Who's Who of Restaurants and The Interstate Gourmet.

During its heyday the restaurant was visited by many interesting personalities including the cast of Hangar 18, which was filmed in Big Spring and members of the Dallas Cowboys. Sally remembers them fondly, "They were all very nice people," she said. "We would shut down the restaurant for them and it was a lot of fun."

When Alberto's Crystal Cafe was shut down for several weeks after being in businesses 32 years in downtown Big Spring, Sally had another life changing decision to make. For her, retirement was not an option. "I couldn't just sit and twiddle my thumbs," she said. With that in mind, accommodations were made to make life a little simpler for the

If someone aims a gun at your head, it is a good idea — as a matter of self-preservation — to disarm him if you can.
An analogous situation sometimes occurs at the bridge table when a particular opponent threatens your chance of making the contract. In that case, you try, if possible, to eliminate the threat.
Let's say you're declarer at three notrump in today's deal. West leads a spade — presumably fourth-best — and you win East's ten with the queen. You see that the contract can be made easily enough if West has the king of diamonds. He can be finessed repeatedly, and you would in all likelihood wind up with five

diamond tricks, after which you can drive out the ace of hearts to assure either 11 or 12 tricks.
However, there's no way of knowing for sure that West has the king of diamonds, and if the finesse loses, East will return a spade and establish West's suit. Then, if West has more than four spades and also the ace of hearts, you will go down.
Once you reach this point in your considerations, you might see the advantage of leading the queen (or jack) of hearts at trick two instead of taking an immediate diamond finesse. The effect of this play is that, for practical purposes, you assure the contract.
West is the dangerous opponent, and he is the one who may have a pistol (the ace of hearts and spade length) in his pocket. You can disarm him by leading the queen of hearts before you do anything else. If he has the ace and takes it, you intend to duck the spade return and win the next spade.
Now when you take the diamond finesse, you are on safe ground. If the finesse loses, either East will not have a spade to return (because he started with only three of them), or East will lead a spade (because he started with four of them), in which case the contract is safe.
Of course, if West does not take the first heart, you can then try the diamond finesse with impunity and finish with at least nine tricks. Either way, the contract is assured by leading a heart first.

Ford cuts 10,000 more salaried jobs, shuts down two plants

DETROIT — Ford Motor Co. said Friday that it plans to cut 10,000 more salaried jobs, offer buyouts to all of its U.S. hourly workers and shut down two more plants as it expands its restructuring plan designed to rein in expenses and restore the struggling automaker to profitability.

The company said in a news release that it would shutter a stamping plant in Maumee,

Ohio, in 2008 and an engine plant in Essex, Ontario, in 2007. That is in addition to previous plans for 14 plant closures.

In addition, Ford said an assembly plant in Norfolk, Va., will close in 2007, a year earlier than previously announced and will see a shift reduction in January. Also, an assembly plant in St. Paul, Minn., which is scheduled to close in 2008, will have a shift reduction in 2007.

Ford said it would complete its cuts of 25,000 to 30,000

hourly jobs by the end of the 2008, four years ahead of its previous target.

Ford said the new cuts in salaried jobs are in addition to 4,000 already eliminated in the first quarter of this year. The combined 14,000 jobs cuts represents about a third of Ford's North American white-collar work force.

By 2008, North American factory capacity will be reduced by 26 percent compared to 2005 levels, Ford said in the release.

The company said the plan

would cut about \$5 billion in operating costs, mainly by offering early retirement and buyout packages to all hourly workers and to white-collar employees. Ford plans to expand buyout and early retirement offers to the company's U.S. hourly work force of more than 75,000 as part of the plan. The union said that the blue-collar buyout offers range as high as \$140,000.

Ford said it expects to achieve full-year profitability in its North American automotive

operations no earlier than 2009. The company had previously said it expected a profit on North America in 2008.

The company also plans to suspend the quarterly dividend on its common and Class B stock in the fourth quarter of this year.

Ford shares fell 56 cents, or 6.2 percent to \$8.53 in premarket trading on Friday. Its shares have traded in a 52-week range of \$6.06 to \$10.09.

Learning Tree Academy gets a new home

The Learning Tree Academy has found a new home.

The former National Guard Armory will house the educational center licensed to teach up to 51 students.

"We outgrew the mall," said Deidra Knight, director. "Now we'll have a kitchen and a place for the kids to play outside."

Each age group will have its own class room and something sorely missed, according to Deidra. "We will actually have windows," she marveled. "We didn't have that in the mall and there will be more things for the kids to do."

Meanwhile, enrollment is the same and will continue through the end of September. The academy takes children as early as 18 months through 5 years-old.

For those who enroll now there will be no enrollment fee. Breakfast and two snacks are provided for the children with lunch provided by the parents.

The curriculum will remain the same.

"It's a Christian based program and we teach them phonics," said Deidre Knight, director.

With seven years experience as a preschool teacher Knight prefers to do her own thing, but the Self Pronouncing Alphabet (SPA) is her

curriculum of choice. "It's a great phonics program and I really like it."

Through hands on learning the children are taught everything they need to know before they enter kindergarten.

"They learn letter recognition, numbers, and colors," said Knight. "We also teach sign language and Spanish."

A computer class is held each Thursday and is included with the tuition. Field trips are not currently part of the program, but speakers from the community will be scheduled.

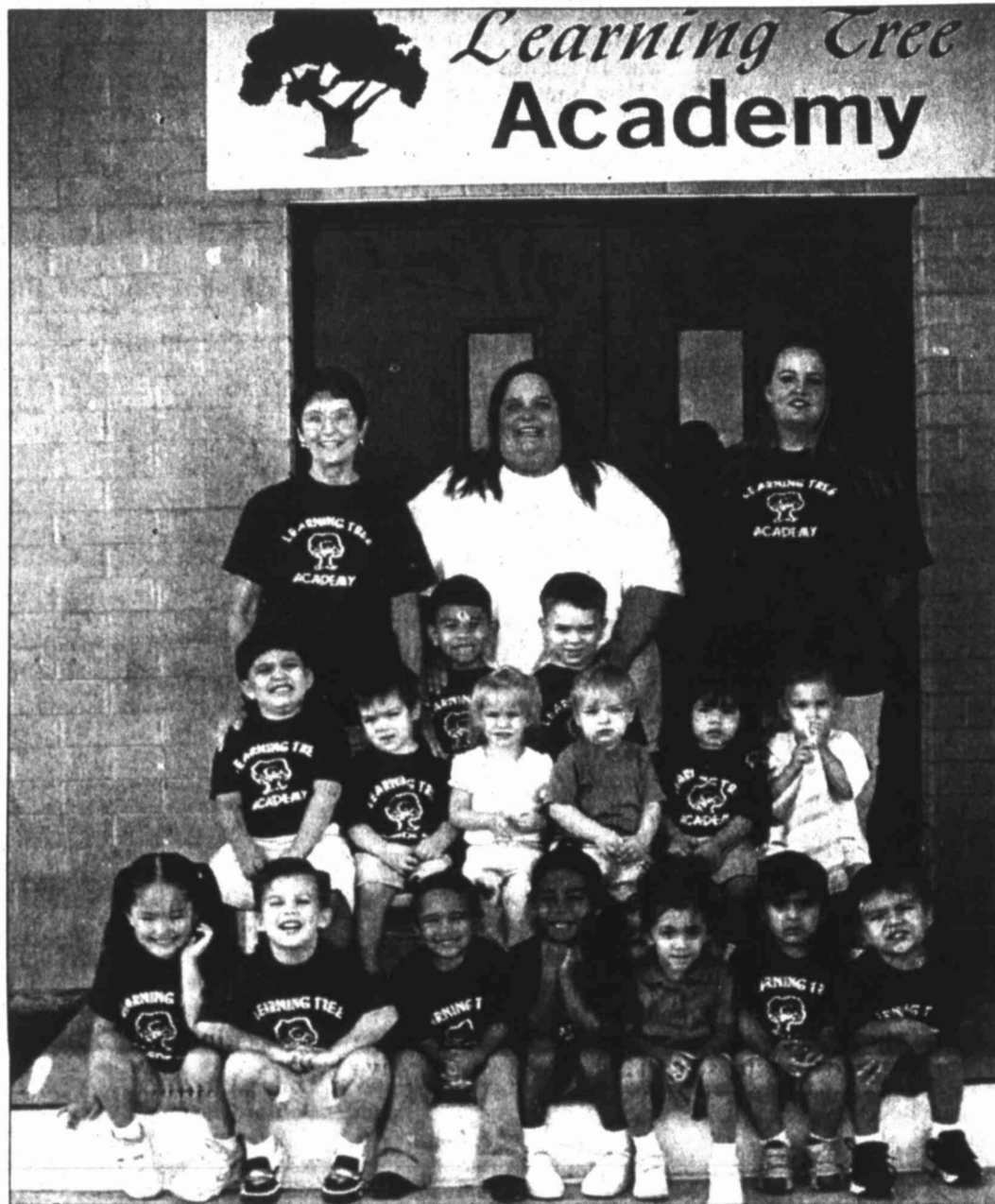
While learning is the goal of the academy, safety is of paramount importance.

"There is a uniform just for the children's safety," said Knight. Uniforms enable the children to be easily recognizable in case of an unplanned adventure.

The teachers are all certified in CPR and first aid.

Four teachers provide individual attention to the currently enrolled 19 students. Therefore, the classes are kept small, but with enrollment growing help is needed. "We are hiring," said Deidre. "We need teachers and I prefer them to be certified, but a high school diploma would be okay."

While tuition provides for the curriculum and daily expenses, donations are excepted. "We need

just about everything," said Deidre. "Including some good play ground equipment."

Tuition is \$15 per day with a 20 percent discount for the second child. Breakfast and two snacks are included. Parents are required to provide lunch. Now through the end of September students that

enroll will not be charged a registration fee.

Financial aid is available through Child Care Management Services for those who qualify.

Growing in knowledge, social skills, language development and physical skills are just part of the Learning Tree Academy's purpose to help guide children

Labor Department says inflation pressures moderated in August

WASHINGTON — Consumer inflation slowed sharply last month as energy prices moderated, brightening prospects for future economic growth.
The Labor Department reported Friday that its closely watched Consumer Price Index posted a 0.2 percent increase in August, just half of the 0.4 percent rise seen in July.
The improvement reflected a big slowdown in energy costs, which edged up by just 0.3 percent in August after hav-

ing surged by 2.9 percent in July.
Core inflation, which excludes the volatile energy and food sectors, matched the overall number with a moderate 0.2 percent increase in August.
Both the overall rise in inflation and the increase in core inflation were in line with analysts' expectations, providing support to their view that a slowing economy is beginning to dampen inflation pressures.
Federal Reserve policymakers meet next Wednesday and the central bank is widely expected to leave rates

unchanged. The Fed passed up a chance to raise rates at its last meeting in August, breaking a string of 17 consecutive rate hikes.
However, the central bank has let it be known that if inflation pressures do not moderate, it is ready to raise rates further.
The new figures showed that core inflation over the past 12 months has risen by 2.8 percent, the biggest 12-month gain in nearly five years and far above the Fed's comfort zone of 1 percent to 2 percent price gains in core inflation. Still, optimists point to big declines in

world energy prices in recent weeks as evidence that inflation pressures are beginning to moderate.
After hitting a record closing high above \$77 per barrel in mid-July, crude oil prices have fallen by nearly 20 percent. And there was more good news on the energy front Wednesday when rising supplies pushed the price of natural gas down to the lowest level in two years.
Motorists are seeing a break in gasoline pump prices which climbed to record levels above \$3 per gallon in early August but have now dropped to \$2.62 per gallon, according to

Energy Department surveys.
For August, the small 0.3 percent rise in overall energy costs reflected a tiny 0.2 percent increase in gasoline prices and a 0.7 percent rise in the cost of natural gas and a 0.1 percent drop in electricity charges. Analysts said there should be even greater moderation in energy inflation in next month's price report based on current trends.
The fall in energy prices is expected to provide a boost to consumer spending for the rest of the year, helping to lift over-

all growth prospects and lessen fears that the current economic slowdown could deepen into something worse.
Already, the pump relief is translating into rising consumer confidence, which surged to a seven-month high in early August, according to the latest RBC Cash Index.
For August, food prices showed an increase of 0.3 percent, after a gain of 0.2 percent in July. Beef, pork, poultry and vegetable prices were all up while fruit and dairy products posted price declines.

Ford lost \$1.4 billion overall during the first half of this year and is under pressure from Wall Street to make further cuts and roll out new cars and trucks more quickly.
In July, the company said it would accelerate its "Way Forward" restructuring plan, which when introduced in January called for the up to 30,000 job cuts as well as closing 14 facilities by 2012.

"These actions have painful consequences for communities and many of our loyal employees," Chairman Bill Ford said in the restructuring release. "But rapid shifts in consumer demand that affect our product mix and continued high prices for commodities mean we must continue working quickly and decisively to fix our business."
The company also said

it would roll out new or significantly upgraded cars and trucks in 70 percent of its Ford, Lincoln and Mercury brands, expanding in growing areas such as car-based crossovers. At the same time, Ford said it will try to maintain its lead in the truck segment by introducing a new F-150 pickup truck that will go on sale in 2008.
Ford has acknowledged

a need for drastic changes in its product lineup. Like other U.S. automakers, its bottom line is heavily dependent on high-margin trucks and large SUVs, but recently consumer preferences have shifted toward more fuel-efficient vehicles. Ford says the speed of that shift caught it by surprise.

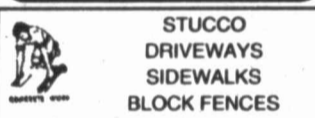

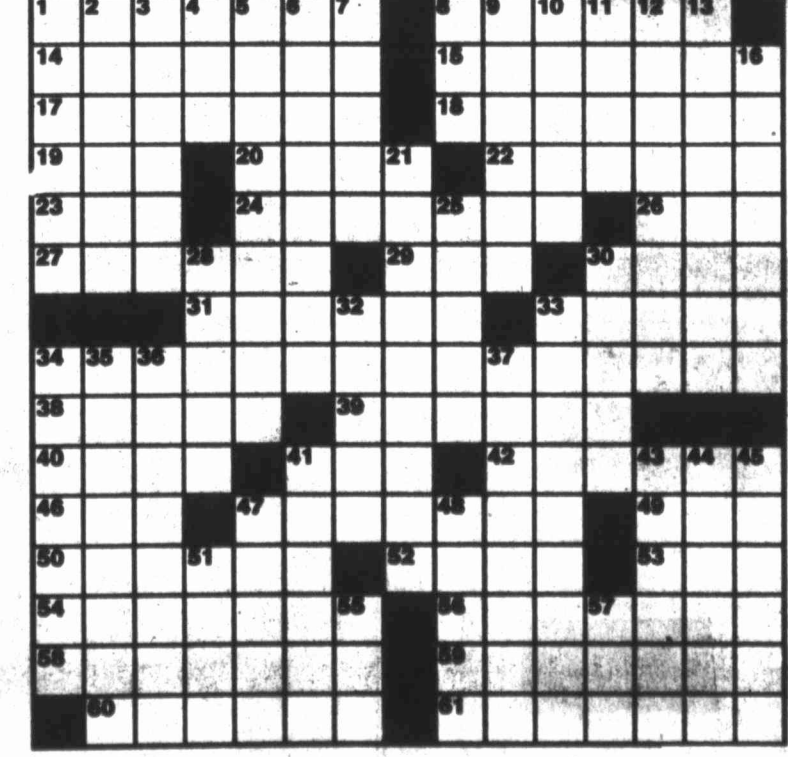

Annie's Mailbox : Advice for those in need

Dear Annie: Can you please tell me why a successful, loving, 54-year-old woman cannot seem to get past her 86-year-old mother's ongoing insults?

Why does it bother me so much at this age? Why do I need to feel accepted by her? Why does my mother have such a hold on me? — The Other Daughter

Dear Daughter: Because she's your mother, and you've been trying to gain her love and approval your entire life. Withholding those things is what gives her control over you. Your mother may not be capable of changing her attitude, but you can change yours. Please consider talking to a therapist who will help you work on your unhealthy emotional responses to Mom's behavior.

Dear Annie: I just heard that you should never refill a plastic water bottle or sports drink bottle because the used bottles release toxins. Is there any truth to this, or is it just an urban legend? — K.W., Lincoln, Neb.

Dear K.W.: Reusing plastic bottles is fine — as long as the bottles are properly cleaned in hot, soapy water, and air-dried thoroughly. The FDA has found no evidence that toxins are released by reuse. The main concern is the development of bacteria, either from improper cleaning or from sharing

the bottles. Dear Annie: Please publish this as a public service for all charitable groups that accept donations of used goods.

I am a minister at a large church in a resort area. We have many well-to-do members, but also a large segment that is just barely getting by. We have devoted a room of the parish hall as a place where people can come and get free clothing and shoes. The problem is that some people use it as the local dump.

We hope readers will take a good look at their gifts to make sure they are in usable condition. Thanks for the reminder.

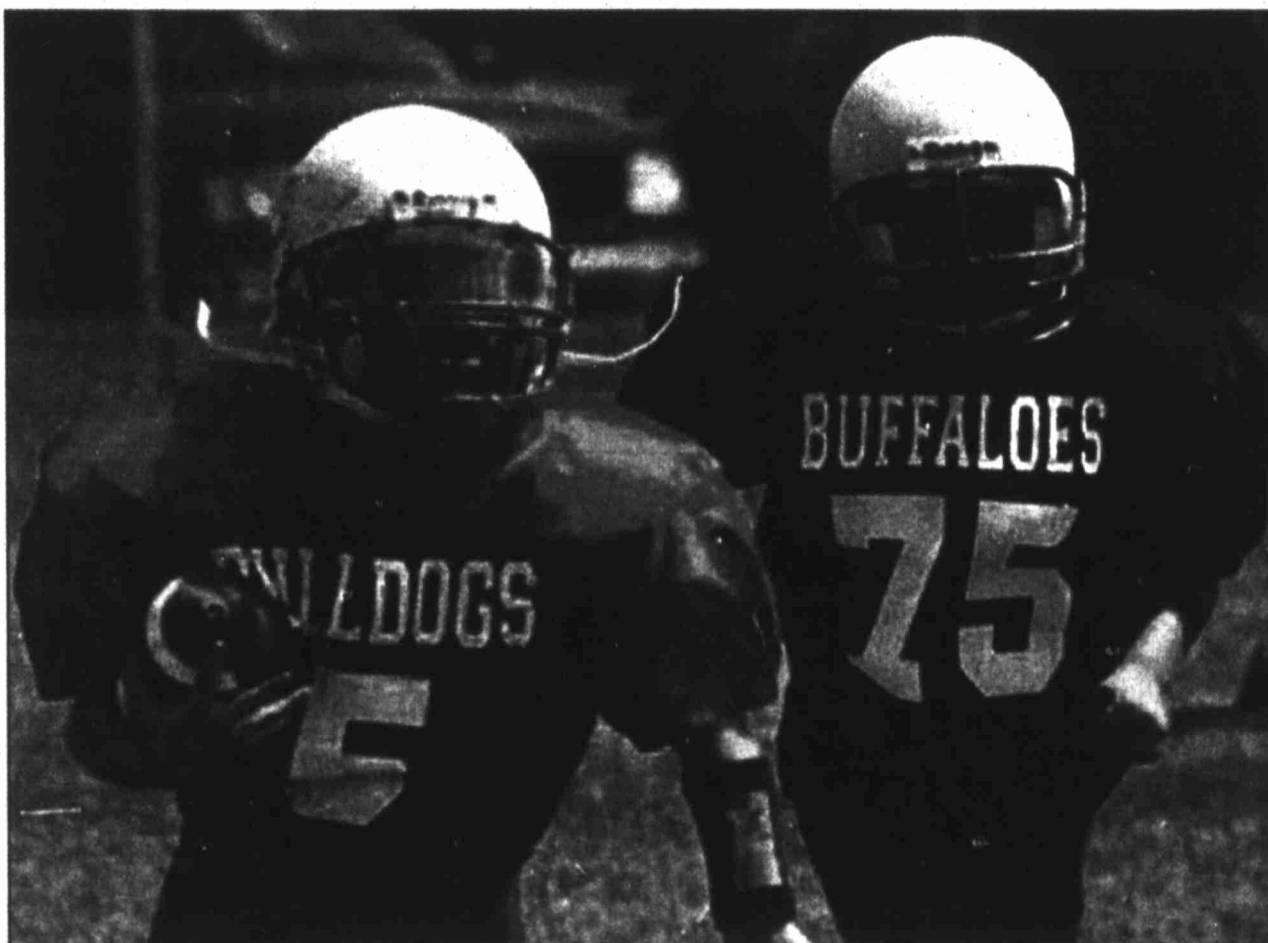

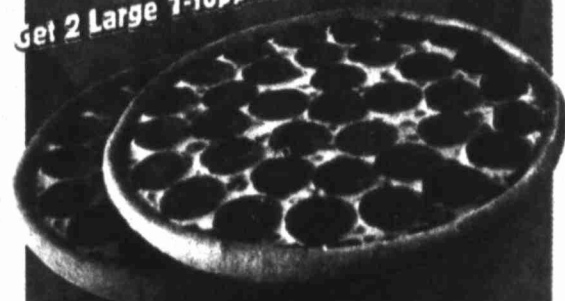

'United 93' goes for the gut

I had some notion of what Paul Greengrass' "United 93" was going to be like. But I was not prepared for how affecting it would be, or how raw my emotions about its subject matter still were. Watching the film's depiction of certain fateful events on September 11, 2001, I was suddenly taken back to that day, walking up Third Avenue toward my apartment after my building had been evacuated, and hearing from a guy coming out of a bar that the towers had come down.

And watching the film's portrayal of the air traffic controllers and military response personnel involved in the day's events grappling with the relentlessness of the attacks, the utter confusion as to what was happening and the unknown of what was to come, I was suddenly transported back to my apartment as I stood in front of my television, totally overwhelmed.

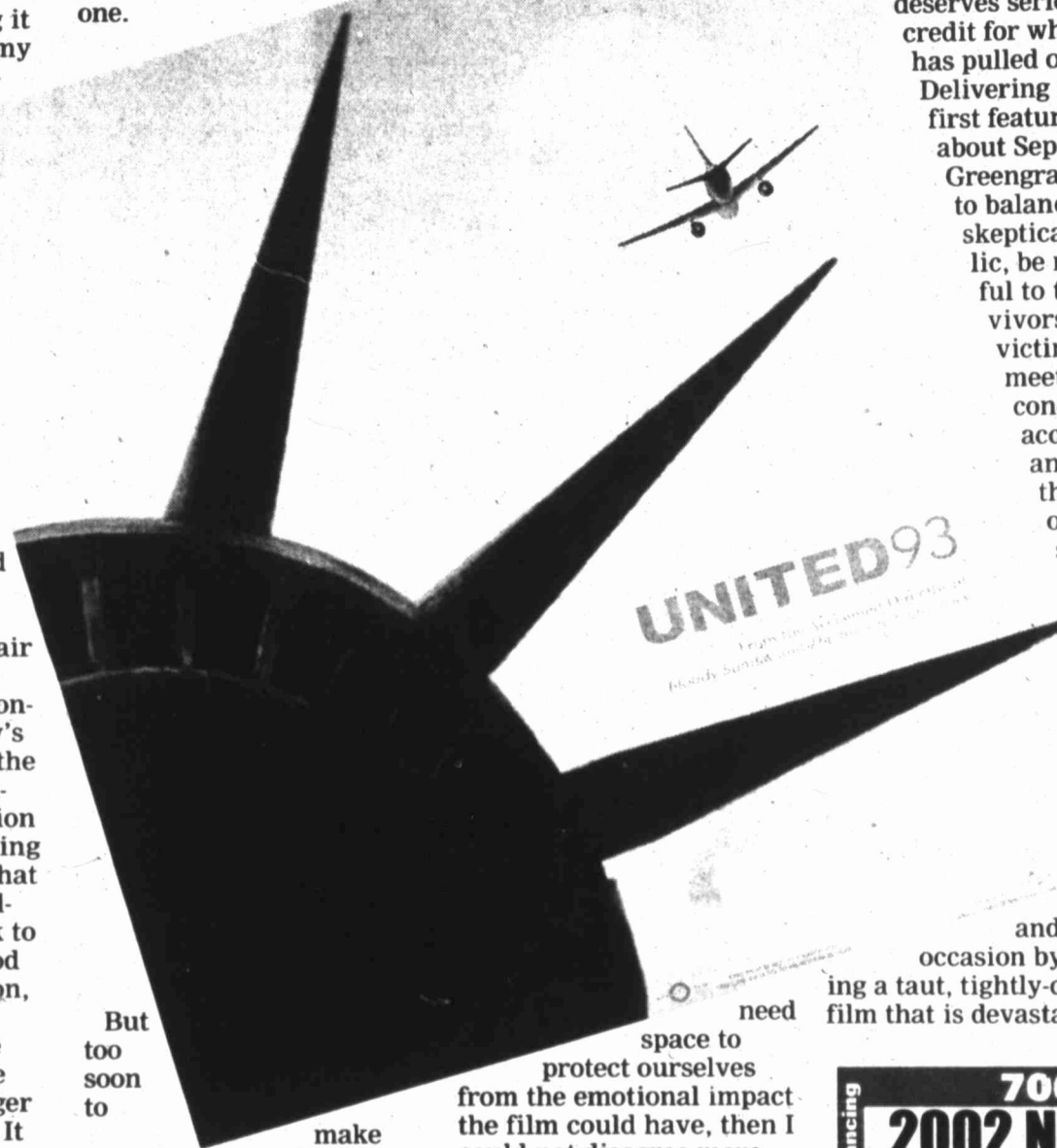
"United 93" made me feel something a movie rarely has. Horror, anger and immense sadness. It has probably been since "Schindler's List" that a movie has had that kind of impact for me.

So here comes the current \$64 million question surrounding this film, leading off every article published with respect to the movie, heard in movie theaters across the country in response to the trailers, mentioned ad nauseum whenever the film is mentioned. Is it too soon?

If the question is if it is too soon to see a film depicting the events of September 11, well, that's a personal question, I suppose. "United 93" is certainly more than about re-

No.

I don't see how it could ever be too soon to make such a gripping, harrowing, film about one of the most pivotal moments in our country's history.

What is the concern of the "too sooners"? Is it a fear that "United 93" is in some way exploitative, an attempt to cash in quickly on the tragic events of Sept. 11? Before seeing the film, I wondered the same thing. However, after seeing it, I can say with confidence that's not the case.

But if the "too sooners" are suggesting some distance is required to ap-

proach such an event, as if we need space to protect ourselves from the emotional impact the film could have, then I could not disagree more.

"United 93" achieves its impact in part because it arrives in theaters at a time when the wounds from Sept. 11 have not completely healed, but perhaps our memory is fading just a bit. Nothing like a ripping off a fresh scab on a wound you have begun to forget you had to get you to remember, to think again. And not just about how awful we felt, but about how these events occurred in the first place, and if we are any better prepared now than we were then.

Which leads us to "United 93" itself. Greengrass, whose previous work in-

cludes the well-regarded "Bloody Sunday" and the fast-paced and entertaining "The Bourne Supremacy," deserves serious credit for what he has pulled off here. Delivering the first feature film about Sept. 11, Greengrass had to balance a skeptical public, be respectful to the survivors of the victims, meet the concern for accuracy and get at the heart of the story. He has risen to the dif-

and tricky occasion by creating a taut, tightly-crafted film that is devastating

and involving, and respectful without being unnecessarily sentimental.

Taking an almost real-time approach to the unfolding of the events on Sept. 11, Greengrass shows us the events of the morning through the eyes of those involved, and resists the temptation to infuse it with his own commentary or politics, or to attempt to give the film some arbitrary Hollywood-type ending or sense of resolution.

As its name suggests, the film depicts the hijacking of United Airlines Flight 93 and the passenger revolt which caused the plane to crash in a Pennsylvania field, short of its target of the Capitol building in Washington, D.C. But its focus extends well beyond Flight 93.

Indeed, as Greengrass shows the passengers and crew and hijackers boarding Flight 93 and settling in, we actually spend much of the first half to two-thirds of the movie in the control towers and military response center, as we watch the horrific events of the morning play out through the eyes

of the air traffic controllers and soldiers. Many of the characters in these scenes are played by their real-life counterparts, in a very effective decision by Greengrass which lends this part of the film a certain genuineness free from melodramatic hokey.

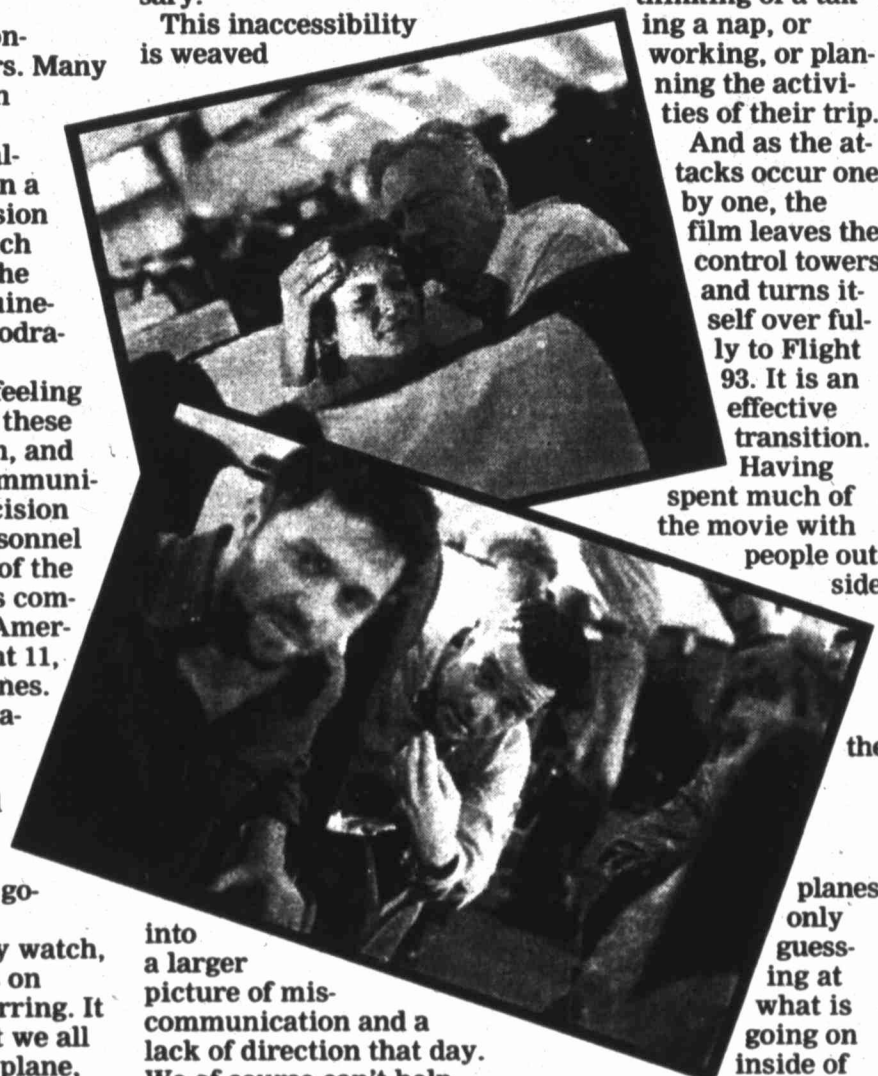
The dominating feeling that emerges from these scenes is confusion, and an utter lack of communication between decision makers. These personnel try to make sense of the information that is coming in first about American Airlines Flight 11, and then other planes. Conflicting information flies around through different control towers and NORAD. Nobody can get a direct handle on what is going on.

We watch as they watch, as it slowly dawns on them what is occurring. It is the feelings that we all had that day. One plane, then two, then three. How many more? What next? We may now know what's coming, but the film nonetheless renders us stunned and helpless when the people in air traffic control and elsewhere stare in horrified silence at the smoking World Trade Center towers out of their windows or on CNN, slowly piecing together the connection between the hit buildings and the missing plane.

Through all of this, we ask the same question those involved ask. Where is the president? Greengrass never waves a disapproving finger at the President or makes any political point, but in its depiction of the confusion that ruled that morning, the film highlights the inability of military personnel in air defense to reach the president — or the vice president, for that matter

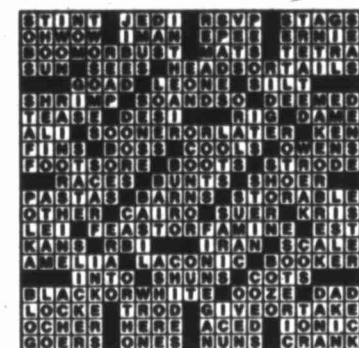
— in order to obtain fighter planes and the authorization to engage the hijacked flights, if necessary.

This inaccessibility is weaved



into a larger picture of miscommunication and a lack of direction that day. We of course can't help but imagine Bush sitting in a Florida schoolroom, reading "My Pet Goat" for several minutes after being informed of the attack, but none of the characters in the film know that part of the story.

As for Flight 93 itself, Greengrass introduces us to the passengers and crew, as well as the hijackers, intermittently as the film progresses. And they just seem like any other passengers and crew, without dramatization or personal subplots added — we thankfully are



not introduced to wives or children or anyone not on that flight. Just everyday people who are tired and

thinking of a taking a nap, or working, or planning the activities of their trip. And as the attacks occur one by one, the film leaves the control towers and turns itself over fully to Flight 93. It is an effective transition.

Having spent much of the movie with people outside

the planes, only guessing at what is going on inside of them, we

are suddenly walled off from those very people and on the last of the hijacked flights, seeing all too well what is going on inside the plane but unable to get a clear picture of what is going on outside.

We have come to consider the passengers on this flight as heroes, preventing further tragedy by overtaking the plane. But

here they are portrayed as people who come to understand their predicament, and in that moment, cannot imagine any course to take other than to act.

If watching the towers get hit through the eyes of the participants of that day is the seminal gut-wrenching moment of the first part of the film, the succession of phone calls to loved ones, played with little of the maudlin manipulation that could have been employed, is this part's moment.

I noted Greengrass' decision to have many of the key figures of Sept. 11 play themselves. Greengrass makes another crucial decision by casting unknown actors in the roles of the passengers, crew and hijackers. Without the distraction of celebrity or recognition, we focus only on the individuals. And it is easier to imagine that any one of them could have been us.

As for the hijackers, "United 93" humanizes them by depicting their faith, their nervousness and their fear. But this is not a film that pretends to understand the merits of

each side, or to explain away the fact that these hijackers are, and intended to be, mass murderers. It just shows us these people as they are, and chooses to recognize the fear and anxiety the hijackers themselves probably had, and how they probably viewed themselves — soldiers taking a courageous step in the name of their faith.

"United 93" likely will be one of the more difficult experiences you will have in front of your television. It hits home in a personal way, and it is not dressed up to provide assurances or some level of comfort. But I think it is an experience worth having, and I think now is as good a time as any to have it.
