

Landtroop withdraws from planned debate here

There will be no Big Spring debate involving the candidates seeking the District 85 seat in the Texas House of Representatives.

That decision was made by Big Spring Area Chamber of Commerce officials, who'd planned to sponsor an Oct. 10 debate, following the announcement by Republican nominee Jim Landtroop's campaign that

he would not participate in a debate with Democratic nominee Joe Heflin of Crosbyton.

In announcing the Plainview Republican's decision not to take part in the debate, Landtroop spokesperson Kevin Brannon sent the Big Spring chamber a letter primarily objecting to the role being played in the debate by Big Spring Independent School District Superintendent Michael Downs.

Downs serves as head of the

chamber's vice president for governmental affairs.

"We have serious concerns regarding a proposed Oct. 10 debate which, to this point, has apparently been organized by Mr. Michael Downes who serves as head of the Government Affairs Committee for the Chamber," Brannon wrote in the letter received by the Chamber on Sept. 25. "Mr. Downes has worked to defeat Jim Landtroop in both the primary campaign and, as we have

now confirmed, the Nov. 7 general election. Dr. Dana West, principal at Estacado Jr. High School in Plainview, has confirmed that Mr. Downes came to Plainview in the primary and actively campaigned against Mr. Landtroop. The Landtroop campaign has received other calls expressing the same concerns about Mr. Downes traveling to campaign against Mr. Landtroop in the primary. Many were reluctant to speak out publicly for fear of

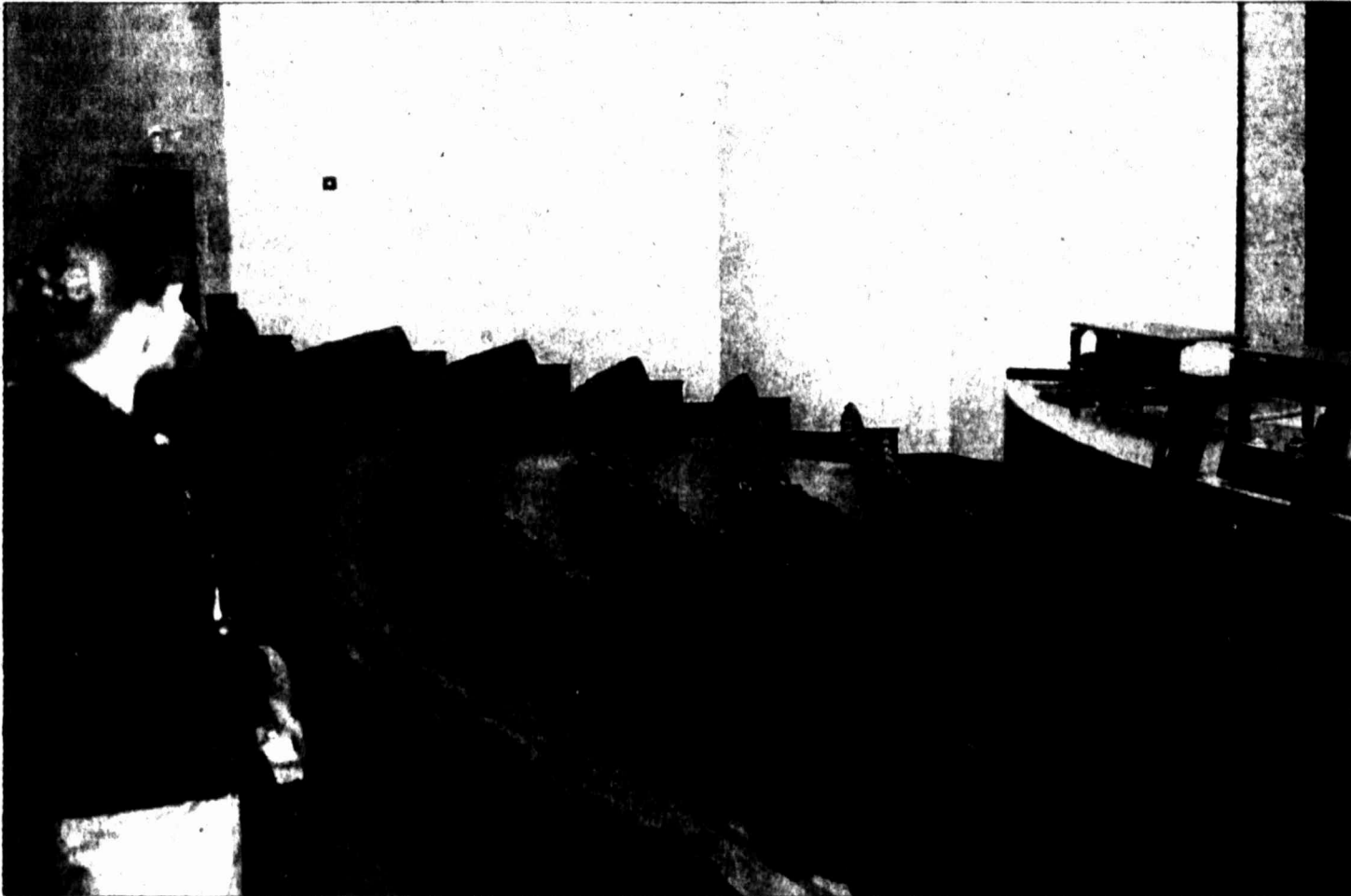
retribution.

"While we previously chose to give Mr. Downes the benefit of the doubt, this new information concerning his latest activities in support of our opponent leaves us no choice but to insist on a new event organized by an individual agreed upon by both campaigns."

"Because of Mr. Downes' blatant efforts against Mr. Landtroop, we have grave con-

Howard College unveils Hall Center

Nine years of planning, 20 months of construction and almost \$4 million in costs were finally on display as Howard College officials unveiled their new Hall Center for the Arts Saturday afternoon.

The structure, made possible entirely through private donations, features an auditorium, studio stage, amphitheater and dance studio and will house the college's art and theater departments.

Like a proud parent, College President Dr. Cheryl Sparks beamed as she explained how the new center can host a variety of functions, all at the same time.

"We can literally have the auditorium and studio theater in use at the same time, and have something outside in the amphitheater as well," Sparks said.

The center's dedication marks the end of a long road from dream to real-

ty for the college, Sparks said.

Officials had long wanted to renovate the college's aging auditorium, but discovered that building a new structure would actually be more feasible, economically, she said.

Sparks and others with the college then fanned out across the state, looking at other structures to get ideas for the new center. The project finally hit high gear in early 2003, when the old auditorium was demolished and plans were drawn up for the new structure.

Like many plans, however, this had a few snags.

To make way for the new center, the college's child care facility had to be moved, which required a year's worth of work. Then, it was discovered that existing water lines at the campus would prevent the facility from having a basement.

BSHS, Goliad teachers to decide incentive pay

If teachers don't like the new incentive pay program at Goliad Intermediate and Big Spring High School, they've got no one beside themselves to blame.

An incentive pay program for teachers will begin this year at those two Big Spring Independent School District campuses.

District officials learned earlier this year that Goliad and BSHS would

receive more than \$200,000 in funds earmarked for incentive pay.

But among the various regulations and mandates attached to the money was a requirement that teachers themselves would be the ones to determine how the money would be disbursed locally.

The results of weeks of meetings and planning were reported to the BSISD Board of Trustees during their Thursday night meeting.

And while the educators

say the plans are perfect, they hope they are at least as fair as possible.

"I'm still neutral about it," Goliad Principal Wayland Pierce said. "This is the first year of the program. I think it can be a good thing, and it can be a distraction, as well. We'll see how it works out."

Pierce said the teacher's biggest concern was avoiding resentment between those who receive the extra money

Last day to register to vote is Oct. 10

Are you registered to vote?

That's the question county election officials are posing as the Oct. 10 deadline to register to vote in the November general election nears.

According to Howard County Election Administrator Sandra Bloom, would-be voters will get an extra day to register thanks to a holiday.

"The registration deadline for any election is 30 days prior to the election day," said Bloom. "This year the dead-

line, which is Oct. 10, actually falls on a holiday — Columbus Day — so the state is giving everyone the following working day, which is a Tuesday, to get voter registration cards in."

Bloom said voters that currently hold a yellow voter registration card will be able to use them in the November election since they are good until the end of December 2007.

"If they haven't received their card or aren't sure if they're registered, all they have to do is come by the office," said Bloom. "They can fill out the voter registration card and their card should be

mailed to them in time for the November election.

"For those that can't get out, they can call us and we'll mail them the form. They can fill it out and just mail it back to us. It's a very easy process."

Several bond issues — at a staggering combined price of \$35 million — are expected to find their way onto the November ballot, including elections for a \$10.1 million-plus county jail facility; an \$11.1 million proposal from the city of Big Spring for a street recon-

cerns regarding the integrity of the planning process to this point. While we remain eager to discuss a potential event sponsored by the Big Spring Chamber at a later date, Mr. Downes' participation in the planning, execution, and negotiations for any potential debate are unacceptable to the Landtroop campaign — including the Oct. 10 event spearheaded by him."

In response to Landtroop's withdrawal, Heflin noted that the Big Spring debate was the only one that had been scheduled, although he had hoped there would be a second debate in Plainview.

"Mr. Landtroop's decision to withdraw from the debate means that West Texans will not have the opportunity to see the two of us field the public's questions on the issues," Heflin concluded. "I think that's unfortunate. I was really looking forward to our having a chance let the voters hear our views at the same time."

Chamber officials announced in late June that both campaigns had agreed to the debate. But it was not until mid-September that both campaigns were provided with guidelines for the event, which called for Big Spring High School debate teacher Jennifer Adams to serve as moderator for the debate and a media panel composed of Big Spring Herald reporter Thomas Jenkins, KBST radio newsman Mike Henry and KBYG's Raul Marquez to provide questions to the candidates. Downes was to be the timekeeper.

Those guidelines called for a "podium style" in which both participants would be on stage behind podiums with fixed microphones. A live audience was planned and the debate was to be videotaped for playback on the local cable television channel.

The guidelines also called for each candidate to be allowed an opening and closing statement, the order of which would have been determined by a coin toss prior to the debate. The program was scheduled to last 90 minutes.

Rules for the debate, provided to both candidates and the media panel, stressed that "debate questioners will ask questions that provide the audience with a fair and balanced view of both candidates in the debate. The questions shall be clear, concise and restricted to a single core subject matter. Questioners will not show bias for or against any point of view, or preference or opposition for any candidate in their questioning. They shall also not make comments on a candidate's answer if it is not a necessary part of a follow-up question."

Brannon's letter announcing decision not to debate, however, said Landtroop's campaign had not heard from chamber officials since first discussing the debate with Downes in June.

"Since that time we have had absolutely no follow-up from Mr. Downes concerning the details of this proposed event," Brannon's letter continued. "It is generally accepted that debates of this magnitude obtain the input and agreement of both campaigns. We have been afforded neither opportunity. Having not heard from Mr. Downes in more than three months, we proceeded to schedule other events on that date."

"Our campaign has not agreed to the format, moderator, or other terms of a proposed debate - in large part because we have not even been presented those options. Yet, incredibly, we received the enclosed e-mail late Friday, after business hours - and only after the proposals contained in the e-mail had been released to the media. This blatant breach of protocol confirmed our fears concerning Mr. Downes' motivations and fairness."

Brannon did note, however, that schedule permitting, Landtroop is willing to appear with Heflin in "forums which are fair and where our campaign has been allowed to have input into the planning."

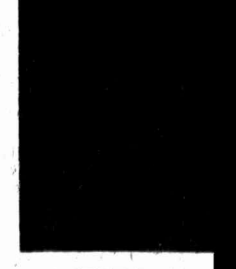
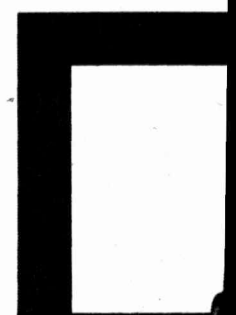

and those who don't. "My biggest concern is that this could create divisiveness among teachers," he said. "I do not agree with the philosophy of pitting our teachers against each other. If this turns out to be a case of campus incentives instead of classroom incentives, then I'll be all for it."

Goliad will receive \$90,000 in incentive pay this school year and it will be split 75-25 among classroom teachers and other support personnel. BSHS will receive about \$166,000 and will split that at an 80-20 ratio between teachers and support per-

sonnel. Teachers will receive incentive pay based on a variety of factors, including student performance on the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS), teacher and student attendance and involvement in special projects.

"Basically, the more teachers do, the more (incentive pay) they'll receive," Pierce said.

BSISD Superintendent Michael Downes said he is skeptical to the idea of incentive pay.

"I look at this (program) as a reward for the work teachers have already done," he said. "The idea that this will make them work harder is a joke. The teachers who worked hard before the plan was implemented will continue to work hard."

Opening lead — king of hearts.
You can't play bridge by rote and expect to get good results. A basic knowledge of general rules is certainly helpful, but occasionally a situation arises where following the general rule is clearly wrong and where something else should be done instead.
Consider this deal where West led the K-A and another heart, East ruffing the third heart. East returned a diamond, and South had to take the rest of the tricks to make the contract.

He won East's diamond with the king, drew trumps and then played the king and another club, planning to finesse dummy's jack. But West showed out on the second club, and South had to go down one.
Declarer's method of play appears normal, and the outcome — down one — seems preordained. But, upon reflection, it is easy to prove that South misplayed the hand.
Declarer learned at trick two that West had started with six hearts, and later learned that West had started with three spades. Before touching the clubs, he should next have led a diamond to dummy's ace and ruffed a diamond.
This search-and-discovery mission would have revealed that West had also started with at least three diamonds, leaving him with at most one club.
Leading the K-x of clubs at this point was therefore likely to be a futile exercise, even though it was the usual way of handling this combination. South's best chance, knowing that West had at most a singleton club — hopefully the queen or ten — was to start the suit by leading the four to dummy's ace. After West's ten appears, declarer wins with the ace and returns the three to his nine with a 100 percent certainty that the nine will win the trick.

Today marks the start of National Newspaper Week, which since 1940, has been a week-long celebration showcasing the impact of newspapers on the everyday lives of citizens.

In celebrating the role newspapering plays in American society, we are again reminded of "The Journalist's Creed," penned by Walter Williams, dean and founder of the School of Journalism at the University of Missouri from 1908 to 1935. We believe it deserves reprinting on an annual basis.

The Journalist's Creed

I believe in the profession of journalism.

I believe that the public journal is a public trust; that all connected with it are, to the full measure of their responsibility, trustees for the public; that acceptance of a lesser service than the public service is betrayal of this trust.

I believe that clear thinking and clear statement, accuracy, and fairness, are fundamental to good journalism.

I believe that a journalist should write only what he holds in his heart to be true.

I believe that suppression of the news, for any consideration other than the welfare of society, is indefensible.

I believe that no one should write as a journalist what he would not say as a gentleman; that bribery by one's own pocketbook is as much to be avoided as bribery by the pocketbook of another; that individual responsibility may not be escaped by pleading another's instructions or another's dividends.

I believe that advertising, news and editorial columns should alike serve the best interests of readers; that a single standard of helpful truth and cleanness should prevail for all; that the supreme test of good journalism is the measure of its public service.

I believe that the journalism which succeeds best — and best deserves success — fears God and honors man; is stoutly independent, unmoved by pride of opinion or greed of power, constructive, tolerant but never careless, self-controlled, patient, always respectful of its readers but always unafraid, is quickly indignant at injustice; is unswayed by the appeal of privilege or the clamor of the mob; seeks to give every man a chance, and, as far as law and honest wage and recognition of human brotherhood can make it so, an equal chance; is profoundly patriotic while sincerely promoting international good will and cementing world-comradeship; is a journalism of humanity, of and for today's world.

This creed is something we try to live up to on a daily basis at the Herald.

Furthermore, we believe all business should be conducted in such a manner.

Read about your life in our pages

When you're born. When you marry. When you die. Some wagging tongues will tell you those are the only times most people get their names in the newspaper.

In the first and last instances, the tongues continue, you just won't care. And when you get married, you have other things on your mind.

So what's the difference?

The difference is huge. Like a stopped clock, even wagging tongues are right a couple of times every day. Whether joyful or tragic, important junctures of everyday living make the papers. You probably did get your name published when you were born and when you got married. You probably will again when you pass away.

But today's newspapers do so much more than that. Newspapers cover your life - all your life, not just the beginning and the end. Along the way, newspapers will tell you things you need to know and occasionally tickle your funnybone or even make you mad.

Hey, remember when your kid was the star of the big game? Remember the way the football kind of floated through the air until he reached up and pulled it in? Remember the way he took off for the end zone? How many papers did you buy that weekend? That's right. Some of them are still around and Grandpa still has the clipping on the wall above his desk, doesn't he?

Well, maybe it wasn't the big game. It might have been the recital or the school play or Vacation Bible School graduation or a feature picture or a million,

zillion other things that sneak "beneath the radar" in this go-go world of ours. Not all of them are in the paper but some are.

Newspapers do cover the hard news but they also publish lots of features and pictures and little articles someone brought in.

Most of the time, the stories will be written and the pictures taken by one of your neighbors who goes through the same things you do every day, who knows about the long lines at the grocery store and the prices at the gas station and who wonders why something isn't done about the same things you wonder about. If it's a local problem, something like that big pot-hole down the street, the reporter probably will ask somebody at City Hall and the newspaper again will be covering part of your life. With any luck, you and your newspaper will get that hole filled in.

Even if you don't see your own name in the papers too often (and lots of people like it that way), newspapers are still covering your life because they are covering your times. That's where the hard news comes in.

Hard news usually falls into two categories: There's institutional news such as what happens in Congress or at the courthouse, and breaking news, like when the airplane crashes or war breaks out. When big hard news happens, everybody's going to be telling you about it and it will be in your newspaper as well.

Newspapers may not be able to get it out first these days but they still can do it best, they still can fill in the details, they still can answer your questions and some of their people still write in a way that captures a moment or stirs your soul. Just because it came out first somewhere else doesn't mean that newspaper story doesn't contain information you need and

want to know. More often than not, it does, and sometimes it's the only place you can get the story straight.

But you know what? Even though newspapers can do a great job on the big stories, they really excel with "little" stories, everyday things in your town that are probably going to affect your life more than anything halfway across the world or who's in the White House.

Go to a local meeting, say your town zoning board or your city council or maybe some kind of hearing in one of your courts. Is there a reporter there? Where is he or she from? That's right. Nine times out of ten, maybe more often, it's your local newspaper. Yes, TV gives you local news but their people usually have to work on a broad canvas. They're covering lots of communities in half-an-hour while there's probably one or more newspapers working hard just to cover yours. If your neighbor makes an application to put in a trailer next to your backyard fence, they're not going to break into CSI to tell you about it. You're going to read about it in your local newspaper.

Some newspaper somewhere probably did carry a few words when you were born. There may have been two or three pictures and stories about your engagement and wedding. Newspapers did those things then and they do them now.

But newspapers don't stop there. This is National Newspaper Week and the theme for the week tells the whole story: "Newspapers - We Cover Your Life."

It's a good slogan because it's true. Newspapers do cover our lives.

of state agencies.

Some of the reasons that inmates cannot bond out would be for such things like parole violations, felony revocations of probation, some warrants for the Attorney General's Office or out of state extraditions.

We maintain our population daily with a huge effort to stay below the Jail Commission's number. We struggle with this because we do not have anywhere to house inmates everyday. We can't use the police department's facility to house our females anymore, and the two contracts we have with other jails are usually overcrowded. This puts us in a position to throw our hands up and make miracles happen! We always find a place eventually, but this is the main reason we need an accommodating jail.

When the Jail Commission is scheduled to come, we all know about it in advance — this is one true statement. However, that does nothing for us when we are still faced with the dilemma of finding a place for inmates when our housing capability is maxed out!

Some people in the community will continue to pass out their opinion about why we should not have a new jail built, but the fact is we both work for the Sheriff's Office every day. We are not passing judg-

ment, just giving the residents of this great county a real sense of what the jail goes through on a daily basis.

The small tax increase will be well worth keeping your family and property safe. The people of this county need to know facts, not opinions that seem to be everywhere we turn.

The jail is here to protect the citizens of Howard County from those that chose to break the law.

We are here writing about facts for those who like to pass judgment on issues they know nothing about!

TO THE EDITOR:

I believe that Howard County needs the 144-bed jail facility. I have been reading some of the other opinions published lately, and hearing plenty of hype, so I decided to research the proposition myself.

The following is what I found: I got a copy of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards needs analysis for Howard County. On the cover page Executive Director Terry Julian wrote, "This analysis is not a directive, but a tool in guiding you as you plan for a new facility. You are strongly urged to give full consideration to a 144-bed facility in order to best serve the current and future needs of Howard County."

The Howard County jail currently has 43 beds. We cannot house any females. All females must be transported out. The average daily prisoner count in the analysis was listed at 67. That means on any given day at least 24 of our prisoners are sitting in other facilities. I believe the commissions' recommendation should be given a great deal of weight.

The Jail Standards Commission does not stand to gain anything from the size of our jail, be it 10 beds or 144. I have read published accounts that salary and benefits for jail personnel will be \$1.7 million. I asked for and received from county officials a complete personnel and salary with benefits statement for all county jail employees. There were 19 positions listed with total salary and benefits of \$635,881.54 per year. That averages out to \$33,467.45 per employee per year. The proposed jail will require 28 people to staff. A nine person increase in staff will cost \$301,207.05 for a total of \$937,088.59. That is a lot less than \$1.7 million.

We will be able to house three times the number of inmates for a little less than a 50 percent increase in staff. That seems like a good deal to me.

Howard County currently has contracts to house overflow prisoners with a number of other counties. These counties are Dickens, Lamb, Reagan and Glasscock. The majority of our prisoner transfers go to Dickens county because they have

a 500-bed facility. It is about 240 miles round trip for each transfer to Dickens. This kind of expense adds up quick, and we are paying it now!

There also seems to be quite a bit of debate on where to locate the jail. The jail needs to be located where there will be room for improvements and expansion that may be needed someday. Our current jail is 55 years old. We need to have that kind of time frame in mind when the site is selected. Also, when the site is selected, citizens of Howard County need to know exactly from whom the property will be purchased. No public official should gain financially from the location of the jail and no business owner should be forced to relocate. There are enough empty lots available in this town to locate this facility.

The proposed bond is \$10,185,000. The cost is an additional \$.058 per \$100 of property. My house is appraised at about \$35,000. It will cost me almost \$21 per year to pay my part. Am I willing to pay this to better MY city? YOU BET I AM!

I wish we could house prisoners in tents and have them mow the park and the golf course, but current state law does not allow this. The reality is we MUST have a new jail. Don't let yourself be scared by the naysayers and shortsighted people on this issue.

Research the proposition yourself. Get your own copy of the Jail Co. missions needs analysis and read it. Then make an objective, informed decision.

Vote with an eye to the future. I have lived in Big Spring since 1983 and I LOVE THIS TOWN!

each day that goes by the cost of a new jail will only rise. I always heard when I was younger how Big Spring had a nickname of "The Little Chicago" because of all the crime. Lets not wait until it has developed a new nickname of "The Little New York."

made in a town simply because it effects not only the citizens but the business owners in a serious way, especially the restaurant owners.

While working a booth this week at the Howard County Fair, I was approached by a man who very openly was against the building of any new jail. I appreciate that everyone is entitled to their opinion and I welcome his comments and we visited for several minutes.

During our conversation he told of how in his opinion I was mismanaging this jail, and the jail commission couldn't tell the "sheriff" how to run "his jail." He explained that in his past experiences with the jail, they had some variances issued in the late 1970s and early 1980s. He told me those variances were corrected; that he had personally seen them changed years ago.

I then handed him a list of variances I received today from the jail commission. I showed him how every variance this jail has received was from 1978 to 1981, and none of them were corrected as he had stated. He then proceeded to tell me I should pass the jail inspections by reducing population of the jail before the inspectors arrive, and when cells were full in areas where the variances stated there wasn't enough square footage, just remove the inmate from the cell until the inspector left and then put him back. He told how females were kept on the jail floor even when they legally could not have been.

He continued to say the "fire exit door" wasn't an

exit; it was an entrance for jailers to "enter" from another floor to then evacuate the prisoners. He smiled and said the jail commission can't tell you it's an exit if used as an entry. He then said that the city fire marshal has no authority in the county jail. I could not believe what I was hearing.

I immediately informed him he was very wrong since the building sits inside the city limits, and the courthouse is a public building and falls under the NFPA life safety code. The city fire marshal is the authority, having jurisdiction with life safety codes as well as the local fire codes, and inspects the jail every time the jail commission inspects it.

The comments from this man sounded entirely too familiar, as I've heard them from others recently. I told him the jailers should not be off the jail floor, and they should never run into the jail if it's on fire, I tried to tell him he was wrong — way wrong — that even back in the '70s and '80s what he had described was illegal, and it is wrong to deceive the jail commission. He said I needed to put my foot down and manage this jail and tell the state what to do, not the other way around.

I allowed him his time to vent, and he finally walked off. I then sat down in utter disbelief and remembered why I ran for office.

I was elected as sheriff of Howard County for a reason. I was elected to bring honesty and integrity to this office. I have worked very hard to see to it everything I do is right, and always legal. I am not going to lie, mislead or deceive anyone.

I strive to work closely with other agencies. If you are deceptive, no one will want to work with you. I tell people that are getting into law enforce-

ment as a career that credibility is everything.

I will not do what he or others like him are suggesting. I will always run this jail in a legal, professional and safe manner. I will not put my staff of inmates in danger for any reason!

CHANDLER'S CROSS, England (AP) — Tiger Woods was exasperated after missing a half-dozen birdie putts inside 12 feet, each one costing him a chance to pull away in the American Express Championship.

One putt changed everything.

Woods holed a 35-foot putt on the par-5 18th to make eagle for the third straight day, turning a decent round into a good one at 4-under 67 and building a six-shot lead Saturday going into the final round at The Grove.

He was at 19-under 194 and had a comfortable lead over Adam Scott, who shot 65 but didn't get his wish.

"At the moment, I've made up a few shots," Scott said. "Hopefully, it will stay where it is right now, and you never know. There might be a chance for me to run him down tomorrow."

Woods was finishing up the 17th hole at the time, his lead at four shots.

After hitting his tee shot into the left rough, Woods caught a decent enough lie to give it a crack at the green, and he flushed it.

The ball hopped onto front of the elevated green and rolled 35 feet away, and Woods smiled when it dropped as if The Grove owed him one.

It's hard to believe a course would owe anything to a player who has treated it like a pitch-and-putt over three days, but Woods had reason to wonder if anything would fall on a breezy afternoon with sunshine, clouds and thunder on the horizon.

Trahan takes two-stroke lead at SFB Classic

MADISON, Miss. — The Southern Farm Bureau Classic has been a pretty good therapy session for a handful of PGA Tour players.

D.J. Trahan continued to shake off a "dismal year," shooting a bogey-free 4-under 68 to move to 11-under 133 on Friday at Annandale Golf Club. He has a two-stroke lead over Brad Faxon and Joe Durant, who described their seasons alternately as "lousy" and "terrible," but sit at 9 under with 36 holes to play.

Durant shot a 65, and Faxon had a 67.

Trahan and Durant are trying to earn their full tour cards for 2007, while Faxon is trying to make up for a difficult season that has put him at 136th on the PGA Tour money list. Faxon is one of the tour's steadiest players and hasn't finished out of the top 90 since 1985, his third year as a pro.

"There's a pride thing with that, too," said Faxon, who had knee surgery in the offseason. "I've done a lot of things I shouldn't have done this year. I'm hoping to make up for it the last four weeks."

Twenty-one players were within six strokes of the lead.

Mathias Gronberg (68) was 8 under, Skip Kendall (69) was alone at 7 under, and Ted Purdy (70), Robert Dameron (69), Troy Matteson (66) and Nick Watney (71) were 6 under.

Thirteen players, including two-time champion Fred Funk (70), were four shots back. That group also included Glen Day (72), who is desperately trying to hang onto his tour eligibility. He briefly took the lead during the afternoon round

at 10-under, but made three straight bogeys on Nos. 10 through 12 and a double bogey on 17.

After an opening-round 76, John Daly turned in Friday's best round with a 65 to avoid the cut. He was six shots back at 3 under.

Among those missing the cut at 1-over 145 were defending champion Heath Slocum, who shot a second-round 71 to finish at 4-over 148, and Jeff Sluman at 2-over 146.

The three players atop the leaderboard have all had their struggles this year and have missed a combined 33 cuts.

Trahan, a fourth-year pro, sits at No. 142 on the money list and needs a strong finish to earn his full tour card as a top-125 money winner. After eight birdies in the first round, he had a more difficult second round. He had just one birdie on the first 13 holes, but birdied on Nos. 5 and 7, both par-5s, and holed a 20-foot putt on the final hole to take a two-stroke lead.

"It's been such a frustrating year because I don't feel like I'm playing as poorly as the results show," Trahan said.

While Faxon earned his place on the leaderboard with 13 one-putt greens in his first 15 holes, Durant took a more dramatic approach. He made a 50-foot birdie putt on the par-4 15th hole, then made a 20-foot chip on the par-5 seventh hole for eagle. He said he felt a "premonition" as he addressed the ball with a sand wedge.

"I got over that pitch and I saw in my mind very clearly where I wanted to land the ball and release it to the hole," he said. "I just pitched to my spot perfectly and it did exactly what I thought it would do."

Nextel Cup chase continues Sunday

KANSAS CITY, Kan. — Wait until the last split-second, then stomp on the brake pedal to slow down for the turn. Snap the steering wheel to the left, mash the gas and blast down the straightaway.

It's a driving style that might work for young drivers, but not for Jeff Gordon.

Gordon is a little smoother, easing on and off the gas and babying his brakes. Driving that way has won him four NASCAR championships, but it wasn't working for him last year.

"I can't change how I drive," Gordon said. "I tried that. It doesn't work."

Gordon hasn't changed his style this season, though he is getting better results.

After failing to qualify

for NASCAR's postseason-style Chase for the Nextel Cup championship format in '2005, Gordon is now second in the standings, only six points behind leader Jeff Burton.

A key to Gordon's turnaround: Significant improvement at intermediate-length tracks such as Kansas, one of the No. 24 team's major stumbling blocks last season.

A year ago, Gordon was left in the dust by his teammates on a regular basis. They were all driving similar cars. So the problem must have been the guy in the driver's seat, right?

"My teammates were doing things, and they were working for them and they were running good," Gordon said. "And we were trying the same things, and they weren't working. So all of a sudden, now it must be the driver."

In a sense, it was.

Although Gordon insists he never lost his focus on racing - a popular line of criticism of the four-time NASCAR champion over the past year - he does admit he struggled to adapt to changes in the sport.

NASCAR officials set the sport's technical rules to make cars fairly equal, so the difference between winning and finishing 15th often can be found in the way a driver works with his crew to figure out which suspension adjustments will make his car handle properly.

And these days, team engineers play a bigger role than a driver's seat-of-the-pants feel in determining which suspension adjustments will make the car perform best.

That's not a problem for young drivers, who don't really know what their car is supposed to feel

like in the first place. But Gordon and other veterans have struggled to drive the way the engineers say they're supposed to.

So Gordon and his new crew chief, Steve Letarte, started over in a test session at Atlanta Motor Speedway late last season. They eventually settled on a compromise that combines engineers' suggestions and Gordon's comfort.

"We were thinking outside the box, because I just wasn't comfortable with the setups that we were running," Gordon said.

Gordon won at Chicagoland Speedway in July, and also ran well in races at Michigan International Speedway and California Speedway.

Matt Kenseth said that after Gordon had so much

Two days left and NL field still up in air

With two days left in the regular season, a lot of excitement remained in the National League.

Three playoff spots were still undecided, with St. Louis, San Diego and Los Angeles moving into good position to advance to the postseason and Houston, Philadelphia and Cincinnati hoping for dramatic comebacks during the final weekend.

Jeff Weaver won for the first time in nine home starts since joining St. Louis, and Albert Pujols and Preston Wilson homered Friday night in the Cardinals' 10-5 victory over Milwaukee.

St. Louis (82-77) increased its lead in the NL Central to 1 1/2 games over Houston (81-79), which lost 4-1 at Atlanta. The Cardinals had a seven-game lead with 12 games to go but wasted nearly all of it by losing eight of nine.

"This is what we play the whole season for, to be in a situation like this," Weaver said. "Everything turned out great."

In Atlanta, Roger Clemens lost in what might have been the final start of his career, and the Braves stopped Houston's nine-game winning streak. The Astros trailed in the division by 8 1/2 games on Sept. 20.

"We still have some baseball to be played," Clemens said. "Standing here in front of y'all with two games left to play, that's pretty nice."

Out in the NL West, Russell Martin scored the go-ahead run on Mike Stanton's wild pitch in the ninth inning after pinch-hitter Olmedo Saenz singled in the tying run, and the Los Angeles Dodgers rallied for a 4-3 win at San Francisco.

Los Angeles and San Diego, which lost 3-1 at Arizona, are 86-74, tied for the NL West and wild-card lead. They are two games ahead of Philadelphia (84-76), and the Dodgers and Padres would each clinch a playoff berth with one more win or a Phillies loss.

"Tonight definitely was a big win," the Dodgers' J.D. Drew said.

"We could have stayed right where we were with San Diego and lost a game to the Phillies." In other games it was Cincinnati 5, Pittsburgh 2; New York 4, Washington 3; and Colorado 5, Chicago 2.

Rangers win, Young continues to improve despite low numbers

SEATTLE — Even with power numbers lower than the previous two seasons, Michael Young of the Texas Rangers continued to improve as a hitter this year.

Young doubled twice to set a franchise record for two-base hits in a season, and drove in two runs in the Rangers' 6-5 victory over the Seattle Mariners on Friday night.

Young hit his 51st dou-

ble in the first inning to break Juan Gonzalez's club record set in 1998. His more damaging hit came in the sixth, snapping a 3-3 tie with a two-out, two-run double off reliever Emiliano Fruto.

"To be in a situation where I can improve every year and set a record with an organization that has had so many great hitters means a lot," Young said.

Young has 14 homers this year, down from a

career-high 24 last season. But he topped 100 RBIs for the first time and the 52 doubles are 12 more than last season. Young is closing the season strong, hitting .396 over the last 12 games.

Young set another franchise record Friday with his 740th plate appearance, besting his mark of 739 in 2004.

"Mike just never ceases to amaze me, the things he does," Texas manager Buck Showalter said. "He







is playing today like it's the first day of spring training. He's got that same zest."

Clemens loses, Astros running out of time CHASE

ATLANTA — Roger Clemens wasn't ready to talk about any endings for himself or the Houston Astros.

"We still have some baseball to be played," Clemens said after losing in what might have been the final start of his career, 4-1 to the Atlanta Braves on Friday night. "Standing here in front of y'all with two games left to play, that's pretty nice."

Houston's run at one of baseball's greatest late-season comebacks — the Astros trailed in the division by 8 1/2 games on Sept. 20 — was dealt another blow when first-place St. Louis beat Milwaukee 10-5, extending the

Cardinals' lead in the NL Central to 1 1/2 games.

"This just slowed us down a little bit," Astros manager Phil Garner said. "We've been playing mighty good, and we've still got some momentum. We've got to take that to heart tonight."

With the score 0-0 in the sixth, first baseman Lance Berkman misplayed Chipper Jones grounder as Atlanta's first run scored in a two-run inning. Edgar Renteria and Jones added consecutive homers off Fernando Nieve in the eighth.

There were runners on first and third when Berkman charged in for a possible throw to the plate only to miss the ball.

"He was coming hard

and that was going to be his play," Clemens said. "We had just talked about that on the mound, that was what he was going to do on a hard-hit ball or a soft-hit ball."

Clemens (7-6), a 44-year-old right-hander who has won seven Cy Young Awards in a big league career that began in 1984, allowed two runs — one earned — and six hits in six innings.

"Roger proved tonight that he can pitch in any big game," Braves manager Bobby Cox said.

The Rocket dropped to 348-178 in his career, and with seven strikeouts he raised his total to 4,604, second only to Nolan Ryan's 5,714.

"You can't pitch better than Roger pitched tonight," Garner said.

"I'm totally fine with that," Gordon said. "I like being a little bit more under the radar. At this point, it seems like every time you jump up there in the points lead, the spotlight's on you and all the pressure's there as well. It's a little bit more comforting being where we're at."

"We're right in the thick of it, so close, and just consistency's what it's all about for us."

Gordon credits Letarte, who replaced Robbie

Loomis as Gordon's crew chief near the end of last season, with much of the turnaround.

"With such a new crew chief and where we've been the last couple years, I didn't know if it would take a year, it would take two years, how long it was going to take for us to really be championship caliber," Gordon said. "But I can honestly say that we were on the verge of it, then when this Chase started, all of a sudden this team went to a whole 'nother level."

And if that translates into a fifth championship, Gordon doesn't seem inclined to throw it back in the faces of critics, including former drivers Darrell Waltrip and Rusty Wallace, who questioned his commitment to racing.

Parcells won't say if Owens will play

IRVING — Terrell Owens sat at his locker Friday flexing his swollen right hand, smiling and saying little.

After practicing for the second straight day, the Dallas Cowboys receiver seemed in good spirits and on track to play Sunday. But Owens, who will travel to Tennessee, refused to say if he would play against the Titans and reminded the media surrounding him that he talks on Wednesdays.

"You can go on and migrate around," teammate Terence Newman told reporters, standing in front of Owens and pointing to other lockers. "Thank you for coming out."

Owens had only a small bandage over the scar on his hand from surgery Sept. 18, a day after he broke a bone near his ring finger in his home debut for the Cowboys.

When asked about the swelling, Owens said, "It's gone down a lot."

Coach Bill Parcells said Owens has done everything he's been asked to do in practice this week. Still, Parcells said he hasn't decided if the receiver would play against the Titans.

"The injury status has not changed, and we're going to make some game-time decisions as to who's going to participate," said Parcells, who will talk to trainers Saturday.

He hadn't sat down with Owens yet, but the coach said he "would have time to do that."

Owens could play at the end of a week in which he was hospitalized for mixing painkillers prescribed for his hand injury with his usual supplements, then had to deny a police report that he had attempted suicide.

On Thursday, Dallas police closed their investigation, calling it an

"accidental overdose."

Now, Owens might not even miss a game, despite having a metal plate screwed into the bone he broke Sept. 17 against the Washington Redskins. The Cowboys had a bye last weekend.

Within hours after he left the hospital Wednesday, Owens was on the field catching passes from Drew Bledsoe and Tony Romo. He returned to practice with the full team Thursday.

The finger didn't appear to bother Owens during the 15 minutes of practice open to the media Friday. Wearing receiving gloves with padding protecting the injury, he caught balls with his hands in front of his body, and readjusted on one pass over his shoulder to make a fingertip catch in the back of the end zone during a drill.

Generally, players who practice Thursday and Friday for Parcells are available for games.

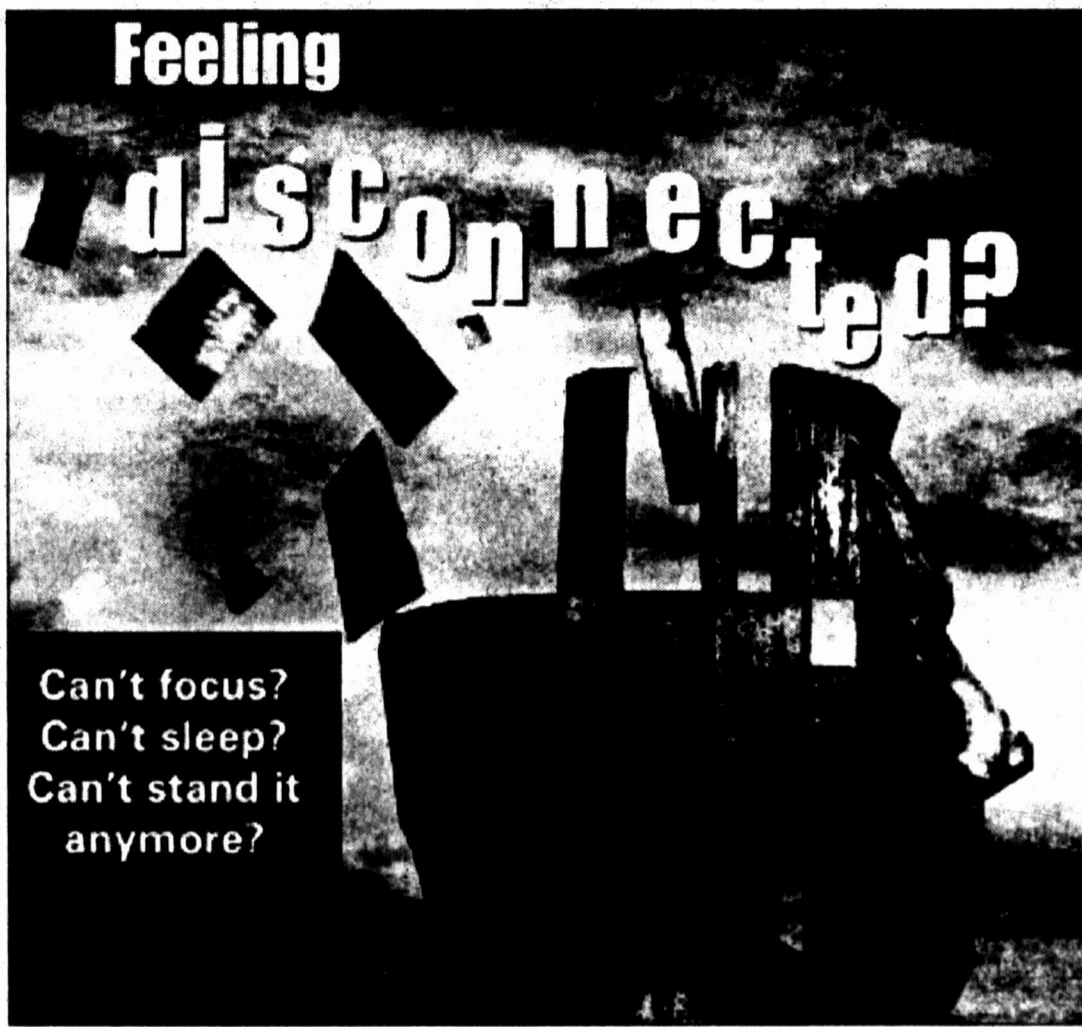
Screenings will be offered in two locations this year to better meet the needs of the public, said Shelley Smith, West Texas Centers for MHMR CEO. "We have had college students attend our screenings at the mall the past seven years," she said "but we wanted to set up a site at the college this year to accommodate their schedules."

Howard College's Student Union Building's Fireplace Room will be open for Howard College students and members of the community from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

"The Big Spring Mall has graciously allowed us to use one of the empty stores in the Mall to provide screenings," Big Spring State Hospital CEO Ed Moughon said. "Kathy Lusk and her staff have been very accommodating and very willing to help us in this community service."

The Big Spring Mall screenings adjacent to the inside Bealls entrance also will be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Advance appointments at either location are not necessary.

Attendees will be presented with a brief explanation of the screening and a questionnaire asking a variety of questions regarding many of their thoughts and feelings. Following completion of the questionnaire, a mental health worker will



review the answers and individually confer with each participant, said Janet Payne, West Texas Centers for MHMR Director of Mental Health Services.

A list of resources will be available for people who need additional assistance, including educational materials as well as a list of treatment providers.

A diagnosis for depression, bipolar disorder, or other mood disorders will not be made during the screenings, said Dr. Melanie Sheets, Big Spring State Hospital Clinical Psychologist. The screenings are not a substitute for a complete evaluation, but should be used as a tool to raise awareness of the illness and participants can explore some recommendations based on their answers

to the questionnaire and the ensuing interview.

"If you have been feeling anxious or depressed lately, you may want to come in and visit with us," Dr. Sheets said. "There are many signs of depression, and over the years of conducting this screening, many participants present as truly depressed and in need of treatment, while others seem to come in for peace of mind."

"Many of the people we have helped are relieved when they leave here whether they just needed to talk or whether they needed a place to turn."

Depression affects more than 15 million Americans each year, according to the National Mental Health Association. Clinical depression is treatable through various methods, including medications and psychotherapy or a combination of the two.

But fewer than half seek treatment because they don't recognize the symptoms or because of its stigma, Smith said.

THE WARNING SIGNS

Symptoms of Depression

- Persistent sadness, anxious or empty mood
- Feelings of hopelessness or pessimism
- Feelings of guilt, worthlessness, or helplessness
- Loss of interest or pleasure in ordinary activities
- Decreased energy, a feeling of fatigue
- Difficulty concentrating or making decisions
- Inability to sleep or oversleeping
- Changes in appetite or weight
- Unexplained aches and pains
- Thoughts of death or suicide

Symptoms of Mania

- Extreme irritability and distractibility
- Excessive "high" or euphoric feelings
- Increased energy, activity, restlessness
- Racing thoughts, rapid speech
- Decreased need for sleep
- Unrealistic beliefs in one's abilities and powers
- Increased sexual drive
- Abuse of drugs or alcohol
- Reckless behavior such as spending sprees, rash business decisions, or erratic driving

Symptoms of Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD)

- Excessive worry about everyday things that interferes with daily functioning
- Physical symptoms such as sweating, nausea, clammy hands
- Associated with higher risk for suicide

Symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

- Re-experiencing the event through intrusive thoughts or dreams
- Avoiding conversations or situations that remind the sufferer of the event
- A sense of detachment
- Irritability, anxiousness, hyper-vigilance
- Outbursts of anger

Symptoms of Postpartum Depression (PPD)

- Strong feelings of depression that continue beyond one to two months after childbirth.
- Feelings of sadness, doubt, guilt, or helplessness that increase each week and get in the way of everyday activities.
- Inability to care for oneself or the baby.
- Difficulty concentrating or doing tasks at home or on the job.
- Concern and worry about the baby are too intense or interest in the baby is lacking.
- Anxiety or panic attacks.
- Withdrawal or isolation from friends and family.

SUICIDE CAN BE SPOTTED, PREVENTED

People who are contemplating suicide often send warning signals.

Often, suicide can be prevented by recognizing the signs and intervening in a sensitive and timely manner, said Shelley Smith, West Texas Centers for MHMR CEO.

"Most people will let you know that they want to end their lives," Smith said. "We run into problems when we don't recognize it as a red flag."

People who make statements, such as, "I can't go on any longer," "I hate this life," "Everyone would be better off without me," "Life is not worth living," and "Nothing matters anymore," are all signals that need attention:

Signs of suicide include:

- Appearing depressed or sad most of the time and being preoccupied with death or dying and perhaps writing a will or notes or poems about suicide or death.
- Feelings of hopelessness and losing interest in most activities.
- Withdrawing from family and friends.
- Change in sleep habits, either sleeping too much or too little.
- Feeling tired most of the time and frequently complaining about headaches and stomachaches.
- Gaining or losing a significant amount of weight.

If you suspect someone of being suicidal, be compassionate and invite them to expand on their thoughts, said Janet Payne, West Texas Centers for MHMR Mental Health Director.

Ask the person if they are feeling suicidal.

Persuade them to get help.

Refer them to an appropriate mental

health provider.

Do not leave them alone if they are feeling suicidal. Accompany them to the closest emergency room, or call the WTCMHMR Crisis hotline or 911.

"Some people do not give any signs that they are suicidal," Payne said.

"Twenty nine people committed suicide from 1999-2003 in Howard County," Smith said. The Mental Health Association in Texas reported 2,355 suicides in Texas in 2003 — an increase of 15 percent from the numbers reported in 1998.

Friends, loved ones and acquaintances often recall conversations they had with the deceased and wished they had known that the deceased was really crying out for help, Payne said.

"One of the most difficult things I see in my job is working with people who wished they had just known that the things they discussed just before their death was a signal.

"They really wanted them to recognize that they were in distress and wanted someone to reach out. Don't hesitate to ask if someone is suicidal. Be direct in your questioning."

"It is difficult for the people who are left behind to think that they may have been able to prevent the suicide."

One of the biggest myths of suicide is that talking about it encourages it, Smith said. "You can't address a public health issue without talking about it."

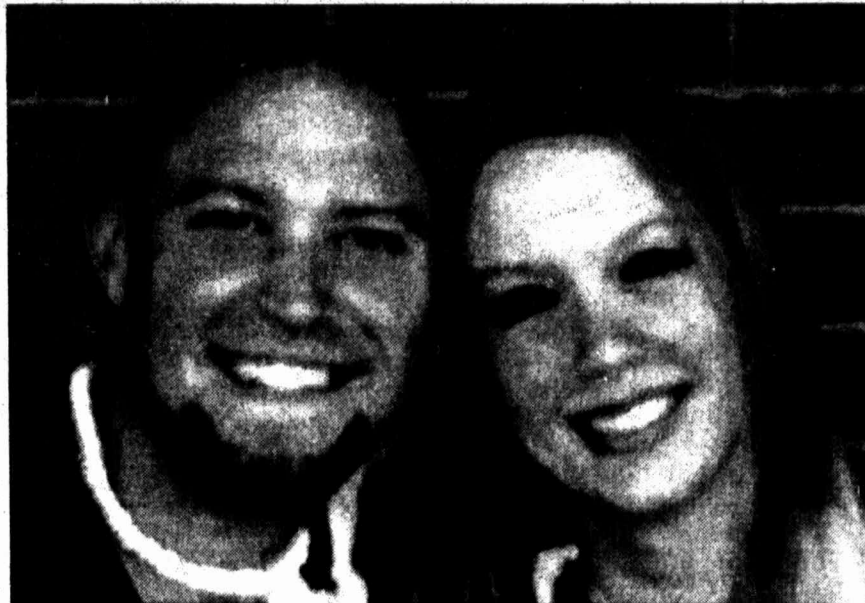

Nobel Prize-winning economist offers fix for globalization

NEW YORK — When Joseph Stiglitz published "Globalization and Its Discontents" in 2002, the Nobel Prize-winning economist took an issue of stodgy classroom debate — the unsettling rapid pace of change in the global economy — and gave it the voice of common-man fears.

Now he's back to offer a fix. A former World Bank chief economist and chairman of President Clinton's Council of Economic Advisers, Stiglitz published "Making Globalization Work" in

September. As the title suggests, he thinks globalization isn't working and that a protectionist backlash could follow that harms the U.S. and global economies.

"There are some real losers, and while globalization may not be the only or even the most important factor, it's one that people can grab a hold of and respond to and turn to these protectionist stances," Stiglitz said in a phone interview from Paris.

Globalization — the international flow of goods, services, capital and labor — dates at least to the Roman Empire. Today Chinese-made textiles

are swamping even the smallest countries. Electronic traders half a world away can purchase or unload billions of dollars' worth of oil, currency or stocks in seconds with a mouse click. Private-equity funds — large pools of investment capital — prowl the planet in search of companies to buy, strip and flip.

Over the past 18 months, globalization has met significant pushback. French workers took to the streets to demand job security in the face of cheap foreign labor. Several oil-rich countries have moved to renationalize their oil sectors. U.S. economists increasingly agree

that global forces are holding down American workers' wages.

"I think we're having the discussion now because, in spite of all the changes, it's very clear that there are some things that aren't working very well," said Stiglitz, who's now a professor at Columbia University. "Change is going to occur. The issue is really whether we are going to shape the change in ways that are constructive."

The changes Stiglitz proposes are controversial:

He advocates a shift away from the dollar as the world's reserve currency, similar to the move away from the gold stan-

dard in the 1970s.

Global institutions such as the World Trade Organization must be revamped, he thinks, to level a playing field in trade and finance that's tilted to favor rich nations. Stiglitz points to the latest round of global trade negotiations. They were supposed to benefit the world's poorest nations by increasing their agricultural exports, but the talks collapsed over the summer because of intransigence by wealthier nations.

He proposes direct financial aid to help the poorest nations build ports and roads, and sug-

After blockbuster start, Google scrambling for staying power

MOUNTAIN VIEW, Calif. — With its heft, power and sizzle among term-paper researchers to Wall Street financiers, Google Inc. has made an astonishing ascent from little-known start-up to Internet icon.

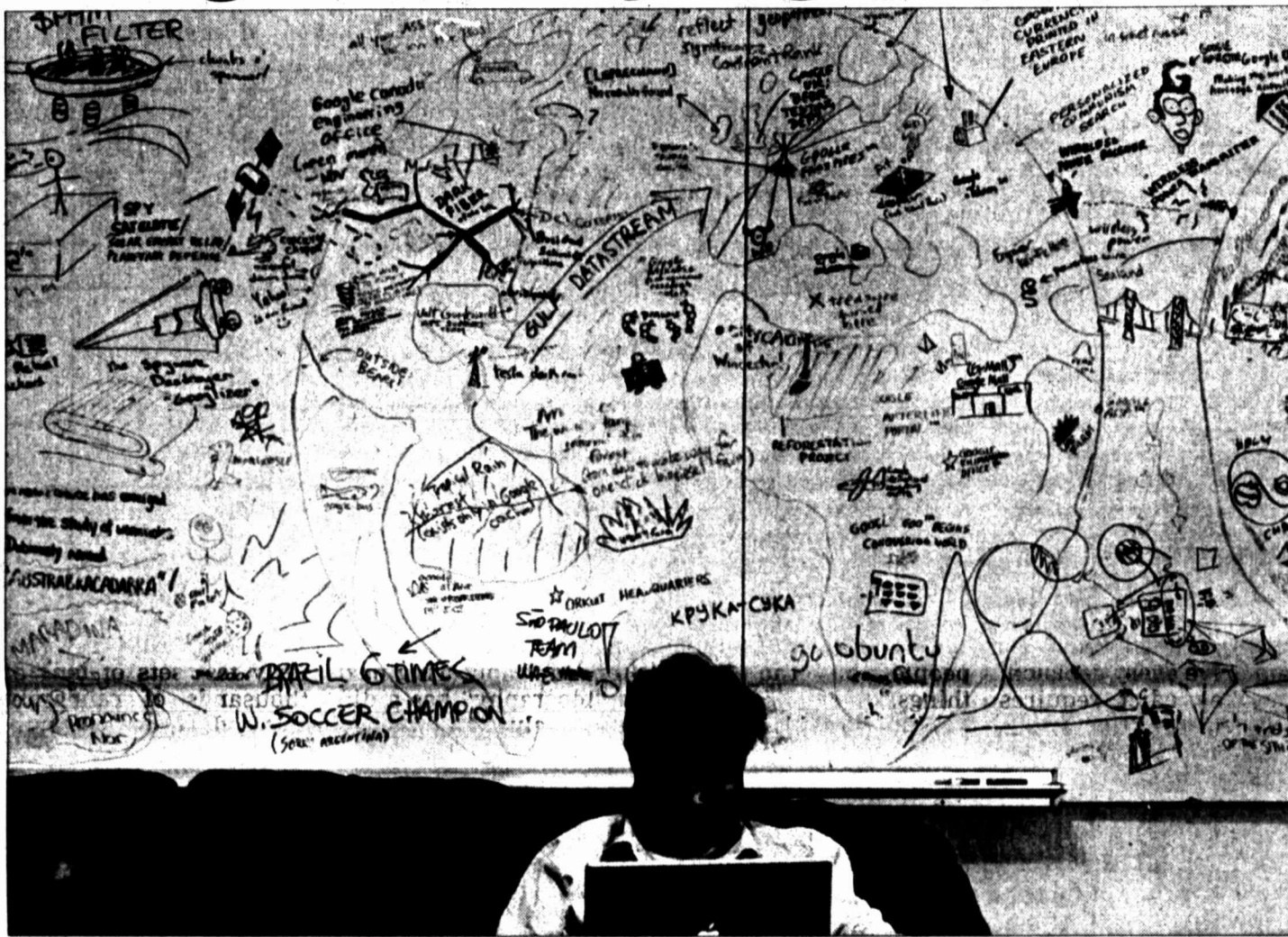
But even with its stratospheric market value of \$123 billion, Google finds itself in an odd position these days: always looking over its shoulder for the next threatening rival.

A rare extended look inside the company's Googleplex headquarters strips away the recent mythologizing of Google to reveal a different side: the manic scramble to invent breakthrough technologies, or risk becoming the latest dot-com also-ran.

In the conference room where Google executive Marissa Mayer holds court, time is precious as she considers ideas to refashion the famous, minimalist look of Google's search pages. Indeed, a large digital clock on the wall ruthlessly counts down the seconds.

"You should have a giant 'Click Me' button. You need something that screams 'Please, Click Me,'" she says at one point. To another proposal: "We have one shot." Then, "Next."

Fast action like that has helped Google stay atop the frenzied world of the

Internet while feeding an appetite for expansion nearly as vast as the Web itself. Just eight years after two Stanford University graduate students created the strikingly fast and comprehensive search engine, Google wants every move on the Internet to go through its disarmingly simple home page, period.

But Google is finding it impossible to stay on top of everything, everywhere. In fact, it isn't the leader in the latest rush

for Internet gold: video over the Internet. In that lucrative domain, a tiny company called YouTube rules.

Google's poor showing in video highlights an often-ignored fact: While the company started with a run of blockbuster hits — search, maps and Gmail — it hasn't had one since.

"The sense that Google can do everything well has been tarnished," said Joe Kraus, who co-founded and then sold Excite.com, which pio-

neered computer searches in the early 1990s. "They've made people say, 'Wait a second, not everything coming out of Google is amazing.'"

The trouble is, Google's phenomenal stock price, topping \$400 a share, is based on an assumption that the company will continue to amaze.

Google's struggle to catch up was center stage this summer when a design team crowded together in a Googleplex conference room to upgrade the firm's video

service. The designers tried to keep their eyes focused on Google, but every decision inevitably turned to YouTube.

One engineer wanted a new "Play" page to pop up when users return to Google Video. "That was one thing YouTube didn't do," he said brightly.

But they couldn't escape a nagging concern. "We look just like YouTube," said a leader of the team, Peter Chane, group product manager of

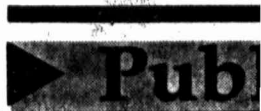

DALLAS — 7-Eleven Inc. dropped Venezuela-owned Citgo as its gasoline supplier after more than 20 years as part of a previously announced plan by the convenience store operator to launch its own brand of fuel. 7-Eleven officials said Wednesday that the decision was partly motivated by politics.

Citgo Petroleum Corp. is a Houston-based subsidiary of Venezuela's state-run oil company and 7-Eleven is worried that anti-American comments made by Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez might prompt motorists to fill-up elsewhere. Chavez has called President George W. Bush the devil and an alcoholic. The U.S. government has warned that Chavez is a destabilizing force in Latin America.

"Regardless of politics, we sympathize with many

Texas gas prices down 8th week in row

HOUSTON (AP) — Gasoline prices are down for the eighth week in a row, AAA Texas reported Friday.

The price of gas dropped 63 cents per gallon in the past month, the agency said.

The average price for regular, self-serve gasoline is \$2.21 per gallon, down 12 cents from last week.

The lowest average price for gasoline is in Corpus Christi, at \$2.05 per gallon, according to AAA Texas.

The highest price in the weekly survey is El Paso, where gasoline averages \$2.14 per gallon.

Americans' concern over derogatory comments about our country and its leadership recently made by Venezuela's president," said 7-Eleven spokeswoman Margaret Chabris.

"Certainly Chavez's position and statements over the past year or so didn't tempt us to stay with Citgo," she added.

Instead, 7-Eleven, which sells gasoline at 2,100 of its 5,300 U.S.

stores, will now purchase fuel from several distributors, including Tower Energy Group of Torrance, Calif., Sinclair Oil of Salt Lake City, and Houston-based Frontier Oil Corp.

Chabris said 7-Eleven's decision to sell its own brand was based on many factors, including Citgo's decision this summer to stop supplying stations in parts of Texas and other states to focus on retailers closer

to its refineries in Corpus Christi, Lake Charles, La., and Lemont, Ill.

But 7-Eleven had been considering creating its own brand of fuel since at least early last year, and some analysts suggested 7-Eleven may now be hyping the political angle as a way to curry favor with U.S. consumers.

"This has nothing to do with Chavez," said Oil Price

Information Service director Tom Kloza. "They (7-Eleven) just didn't want to be tied to one supplier."

Kloza said all 7-Eleven did was seek out suppliers who could sell the cheapest fuel and "that was not Citgo."

Citgo spokesman Fernando Garay declined to comment on whether Chavez's comments had a bearing on 7-Eleven's change in suppliers. He said the break was "a mutual agreement of the two companies."

Garay said 7-Eleven was a "significant" part of Citgo's retail presence in Texas and Florida. "It was a valued relationship," he said.

In July, Citgo decided to stop distributing gasoline to 1,800 independently owned U.S. stations because it was a lackluster segment of its business.

In order to meet service contracts at 13,100 Citgo-branded stations across the U.S., Citgo

Google Video. "We're a cleaner, more thoughtful YouTube, (only) with less features."
Internet video started as the outpouring of made-from-scratch creativity by citizens with video cameras. Now, though, the race between YouTube and Google is getting increasingly commercial.
YouTube in late June inked a pact with NBC to feature previews of the network's programs on YouTube, while NBC promised to promote YouTube on popular NBC shows such as "The Office." And it signed a deal this month to show videos from Warner Music and s in the advertising rev. ues the videos generate.
Google recently has cut deals with some of the hippest names in media, including MySpace and MTV. In the MySpace agreement, Google is paying the social-networking site up to \$900 million to place its search page on MySpace, which many young music lovers use to view videos of their favorite garage bands.

YouTube co-founder Steve Chen, 27, a University of Illinois graduate, relishes watching Google try to catch up. He thinks YouTube has one key advantage. "Every person that we're hiring, every person we're bringing on the team, is focused on video," said Chen.
When fellow grad students Larry Page and Sergey Brin founded Google, they vowed to let data drive every decision. One key edict requires that, across the enterprise, people spend 70 percent of their time on Google's core search and advertising businesses, 20 percent on other existing products and just 10 percent on new initiatives.
The 70-20-10 rule reflects the Google founders' understanding that search is their key franchise. But in the course of Google's meteoric growth, from its start as an unproven search engine in 1998 to last year's \$6.1 billion in revenues, the company's idiosyncratic orthodoxies are proving hard to enforce.
Eric Schmidt, Google's chief executive, requested an audit of employees' actual work habits recently, and found they were

spending only 60 percent of their time on Google's core business. Even more worrisome to Schmidt: Google had no idea it had veered so far off course. "It was quite alarming to find that we were below the 70 percent without knowing it," said Schmidt, a Sun Microsystems veteran recruited by Page and Brin in 2001. "It's a real crisis, in the sense that we are not fully deploying people on the right things."
Schmidt said he ordered up new internal audits to monitor how employees spend their work time, and the company has since corrected that flaw.
At the heart of Google's business is something most people learned, and quickly forgot, in high school: a mathematical algorithm. Google's algorithm is the series of instructions that provides the electronic flowchart needed to tell the synapses in Google's brain how to work.
Central to the algorithm is PageRank, a patented formula that helps order

results based largely on popularity. If many sites with high PageRank link to a Web page, then it, too, receives a high PageRank.
Google co-founder Page put it this way: "You're important if other people think you're important."
The system also examines about 200 other signals, ranging from how often keywords appear on a page to their proximity to each other. "John F. Kennedy" appearing next to "biography" has a different value than a document where those two phrases are paragraphs apart.
Google deploys automated programs called Googlebots to scan the Web for everything it can find and compile the results into an index. Google claims its index contains three times as many documents stored as any competitors, although there is no way to independently verify that.
The size of Google's index makes it particularly good at delivering results for obscure

queries. But competitors say that's not what really matters.
"If you have a rare query, go to Google," said Steve Berkowitz, who left a job as CEO of the search engine Ask.com to become Microsoft's senior vice president of online services. "They can have that 3 percent, and I'll take the other 97 percent."
At Yahoo, meanwhile, software engineers regularly test sets of tens of thousands of randomly selected query terms. After those queries are run, editors mark up what results are useful or not. Then Yahoo's programmers write commands that help its search engine reflect the judgment of the editors.
Yahoo believes its approach delivers better "perceived comprehensiveness," even though its index is smaller than Google's.
When Hurricane Katrina was driving toward the Gulf Coast last September, a "Katrina" query on Google turned up a Web designer's site, Katrina.com, that had nothing to do with the storm. Yahoo programmers already had manually inserted a fix that drove users to information about the impending disaster.
"We think that (the human touch) definitely adds to the product, as opposed to the kind of a purist view that you have to have an algorithm that necessarily does these things," said Jan Pedersen, Yahoo's chief scientist for search and marketplace.
Still, success doesn't last forever in Silicon Valley. The Googleplex itself is testament to that.
The glimmering glass-and-steel complex wasn't built by Google. A company called Silicon Graphics built it — then went bust.

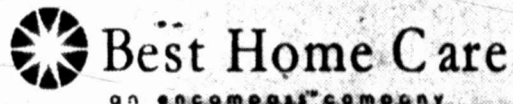

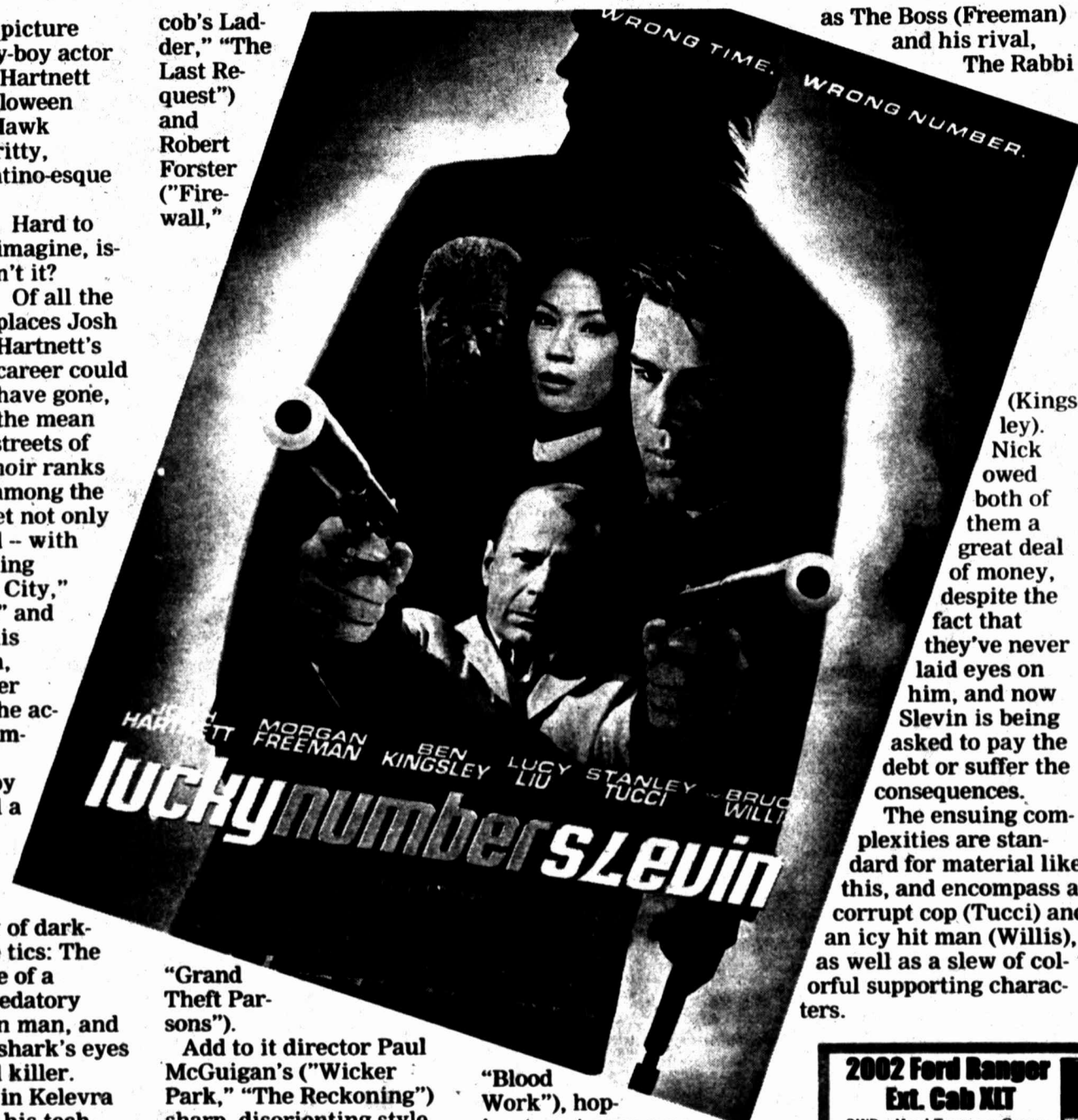
Hard to imagine, isn't it? Of all the places Josh Hartnett's career could have gone, the mean streets of noir ranks among the

His pretty-boy looks may feel a little too polished for the turf, but he compensates with a variety of darkly appropriate tics: The guileless smile of a chump, the predatory charm of a con man, and the glittering shark's eyes of a stone-cold killer.

Playing Slevin Kelevra lets him hone his technique to perfection, playing a character described by screenwriter Jason Smilovic as "just incredibly unlucky." His performance is particularly impressive because it comes amid a glut of far more prestigious actors, including Bruce Willis ("Pulp Fiction," "Die Hard"), who fits noir like a tailored suit, Morgan Freeman ("Seven," "The Shawshank Redemption"), Stanley Tucci ("The Devil Wears Prada," "The Terminal") and Ben Kingsley ("A Sound of Thunder," "Schindler's List"), as well as unbilled turns from the likes of Danny Aiello ("Ja-

cob's Ladder," "The Last Request") and Robert Forster ("Firewall,"



as The Boss (Freeman) and his rival, The Rabbi

(Kingsley). Nick owed both of them a great deal of money, despite the fact that they've never laid eyes on him, and now Slevin is being asked to pay the debt or suffer the consequences.

The ensuing complexities are standard for material like this, and encompass a corrupt cop (Tucci) and an icy hit man (Willis), as well as a slew of colorful supporting characters.

Add to it director Paul McGuigan's ("Wicker Park," "The Reckoning") sharp, disorienting style — a style that sings with hard-boiled beauty — and you have the makings of a thriller for the ages.

Sadly, it doesn't entirely fulfill that potential. Smilovic's screenplay uses fits of genuine brilliance to stave off the fact that it's often too cleyer for its own good, substituting smugness for wit in periodic displays of self-absorbed twee. That said, it's still an engaging scenario, full of twists and turns that remain consistently enjoyable, if not entirely seductive.

Slevin arrives in New York to stay with his friend Nick (Sam Jaeger,

"Blood Work"), hoping to get over a recent breakup and a history of general misfortune that tags along behind him like a tin can tied to a dog's tail.

The change of venue doesn't help, however. He heads to Nick's apartment, only to find his friend missing and a perky next-door neighbor — Lucy Liu ("Kill Bill: Vol. 1," "Payback"), in full-bore Nancy Drew mode — suspecting foul play.

It gets worse.

A pair of thugs soon arrive at the door, mistake him for Nick, and throw him headlong into a simmering gang war between the crime lord known only

Smilovic's script gives them all the right amount of attention, while ensuring that the plot they inhabit is both intelligent and modestly watertight. Unfortunately, it also relies a bit too much on convenient coincidence, and cheats us with some cinematic dirty pool — in which we're given information that later turns out to be false.

The dialogue walks a similar razor's edge, alternating between the genuinely clever and the brazenly phony.

If the script's flaws are distracting, however, its assets are still considerable, and McGuigan develops them with the same expert visual gymnastics that made his "Gangster No. 1" so compelling.

Production designer Francois Segin brings a puzzling yet unique look to the proceedings, dominated by patterns of strange wallpaper and the spartan elegance of the gang lords' respective lairs.

The cast, of course, is top-notch, and though Hartnett still struggles

with his hunk-of-the-month image, he's clearly hit upon a pattern that may elevate him into something more.

Slevin makes an excellent noir protagonist, his cheerful loser status hiding dark roots beneath its surface. Plenty of actors could play the grim stuff, but few could blend it with the nice-guy exterior like Hartnett does. When the script moves from energetic black humor into harsher territory, the actor is right there with it, and his performance makes the tonal transitions smooth and effective.

That trick works for other parts of the production as well, from McGuigan's creative staging to Andrew Hulme's staccato edits. They serve to dis-

tract us from a few inconvenient problems of logic, circling the film like vultures but held off indefinitely by its better elements.

Lesser thrillers ultimately succumb to such issues, as the pile of "Hey, wait a minute..." questions grows too large to excuse. Slevin has its share of them, and never really confronts them properly. Instead, it disguises them with clever flashiness, hoping that its mechanics are slick enough to excuse the shakier parts.

Luckily, the gamble pays

off, leaving a solid — if less than perfect — crime thriller in its wake. Even smart material can benefit sometimes if you don't poke at it, which is precisely the case here. The more you let the niggling questions go, the better Lucky Number Slevin gets.

Video-based extras begin with four deleted scenes — actually it's more like twelve, but like elisions are grouped into blocks —



totaling 21 minutes; three of these feature optional commentary from McGuigan.

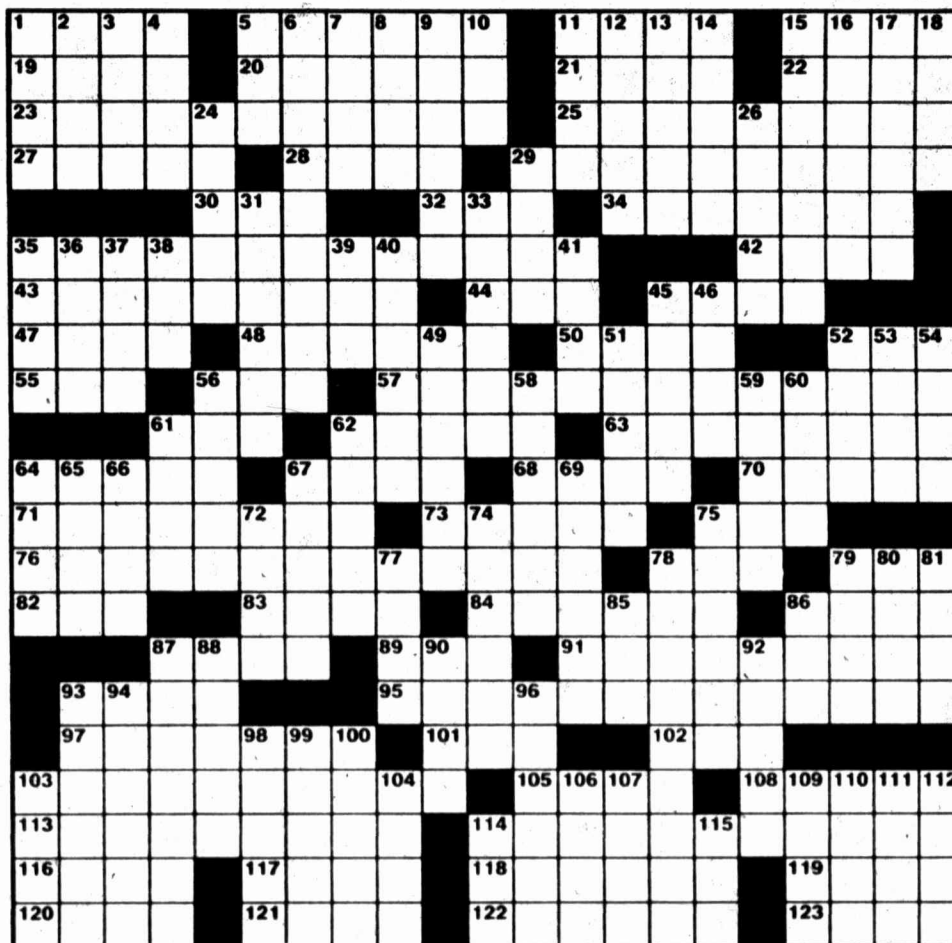

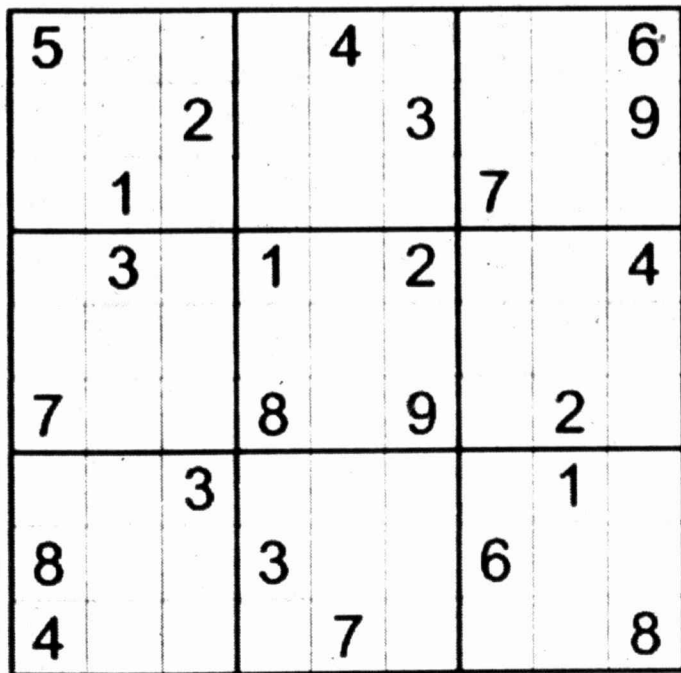

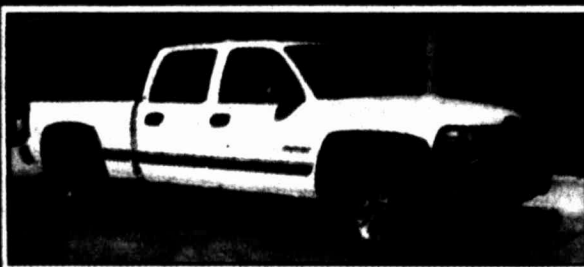
