Tensions mount over possible North Korean atomic bomb test

SEOUL, South Korea — Tensions mounted over North Korea's threat to test its first atomic bomb, with shots ringing out Saturday along the border with South Korea and Japan warning of harsh sanctions if Pyongyang goes nuclear.

With a possible test expected as early as Sunday, the U.N. Security Council issued a stern statement Friday urging the country to abandon its nuclear ambitions and warning of unspecified conse-

quences if the isolated, communist regime doesn't comply.

Jittery nations have warned a test would unravel regional security and possibly trigger an arms race.

A midday incursion Saturday by North Korean troops into the southern side of the no-man's-land separating North and South Korea only stoked the unease.

South Korean soldiers rattled off 40 warning shots at the five communist troops who crossed the center line of the Demilitarized Zone, the inter-Korean buffer.

It was unclear whether the North

Korean advance was intended as a provocation, or was an attempt to go fishing at a nearby stream, an official at South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said on condition of anonymity, citing official policy. No one was hurt, and the North Koreans retreated.

While such border skirmishes are not unheard of, they are relatively rare. Saturday's incursion was only the second this year, the official said.

Meanwhile, world powers were

Early diagnosis key to treating depression

Early diagnosis and care for depression encourages successful outcomes for the disease.

"There is a physical component to depression and the sooner it gets treated the easier it is to deal with its psychosocial aspects," said Dr. Rosalie Hydock, Big Spring State

Hospital psychologist. "It's like anything else: If you patch a symptom quicker or if we catch a cold earlier and the earlier you deal with it, the easier it is for the body to respond faster."

Early intervention such as the free depression screenings hosted Thursday by West Texas Centers for MHMR and Big Spring State

Hospital are great opportunities for the public, said Janet Payne, West Texas Centers for MHMR mental health director.

"By providing screening areas in the community, we get a chance to reach out to the community rather than wait for the community to

Don't delay getting flu shots this year

As the holiday season quickly approaches, another season is already here: flu season.

According to officials with the Texas Department of State Health Services, flu season typically runs from October until March, and if you think it's too early to get a flu vaccination, you're wrong.

"My advice to Texans is simple: get a flu shot," said former Texas Commissioner of State Health Services Eduardo Sanchez, M.D.

Sanchez, who stepped down as commissioner this week, has accepted a position with The

University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston's School of Public Health. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that flu vaccine manufacturers are expecting to produce and distribute more than 100 million doses of influenza vaccines in the United States through early January 2007.

These projections are a marked improvement over vaccine totals from 2005, when a major vaccine developer and sup-

FORSAN — Despite a few snags along the way, Forsan school officials are pointing with pride at almost \$5 million in construction projects that are, for the most part, complete.

Forsan school trustees will hear a final update on those construction projects when they hold a regular meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday in the administration building board room.

Forsan ISD voters approved the projects in a

\$4.9 million bond election in November 2004. Among the many projects fueled by the bond money were renovations at the high school band hall and auditorium, new science labs for the high school/junior high, construction of softball and baseball fields and extensive renovation at Elbow Elementary.

All in all, it was money well spent, Superintendent Randy Johnson said.

"There were snags along the way," Johnson

BUSH CARRIER CHRISTENED

NEWPORT NEWS, Va. (AP) — Spraying the bubbles from sparkling wine across the enormous gray bow of the USS George H.W. Bush, the Bush family on Saturday christened the nuclear-powered aircraft carrier named after the 82-year-old former president.

"I know you join me in saying to our father, President Bush, your ship has come in," the current president said during a ceremony for the last of the Nimitz-class carriers, the CVN 77.

"She is unrelenting, she is unshakable, she is unyielding, she is unstoppable," Bush said, lauding the warship's state-of-the-art design.

RESIDENTS RETURNING

APEX, N.C. (AP) — Residents who left their homes to escape fumes from a fire at a hazardous materials plant began returning Saturday, two nights after officials urged 17,000 people to evacuate.

Firefighters extinguished the blaze at EQ Industrial Services at 12:22 a.m., Apex Fire Chief Mark Haraway said. About 90 percent of evacuated residents were allowed to return at 9 a.m., and by noon, those who live in the area immediately surrounding what's left of EQ Industrial Services were also allowed back into their homes. The only area of Apex that remains closed is a section of Investment Boulevard.

plier was shut down shortly before last year's flu season, causing a shortfall.

According to Delia Ross, a clerk with the Howard County DSHS office, flu shots have not been delivered yet.

"We haven't received ours yet," said Ross. "The state is telling us we should get them in toward the end of the month."

Summer Rawls, an LVN with Leonard's Pharmacy, said her office has received flu vaccine,

and there's plenty to go around. "It's not going to be like it was last year," said Rawls. "We have vaccine in, and we have plenty of it."

Rawls said vaccinations at Leonard's Pharmacy are free to patients with Medicare Part B and \$30 for those without similar insurance coverage.

"We'll also have a shipment of vaccine coming in either later this month or the beginning of November especially for children," said Rawls. "As long as the parents bring their shot records with them, the vaccination is only \$7, and free if the

child is on Medicare."

An appointment isn't necessary to receive a vaccination, according to Rawls, who said they are given at the Leonard's Pharmacy on Scurry Street from 10 a.m. until noon and 2 p.m. until 6 p.m. daily.

CDC officials said most of the vaccine is expected to be distributed in October and November.

State officials recommend that those at increased risk of flu complications — children age 6 months through 4 years, people 50 and older, residents of long-term care facilities, preg-

nant women and those with chronic medical conditions — get their flu shot as early as possible.

People who live with or take care of those at increased risk of flu complications also are encouraged to get the vaccine now.

According to information provided by the DSHS, the flu is a viral respiratory illness with symptoms that include a sudden, often high, fever; headache; extreme tiredness; dry cough; sore throat; runny or stuffy nose; and muscle aches.

The illness is spread when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks, releasing the contagious virus into the air. Complications of flu can include bacterial pneumonia, ear and sinus infections, dehydration and worsening of chronic conditions such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes.

The flu shot takes about two weeks to become effective.

come to us.

"Generally speaking, it is not easy to ask for help."

Many people may not recognize the signs of depression, passing it off as natural part of aging.

"It's normal," said Dr. Melanie Sheets, Big Spring State Hospital psychologist. "We have stereotypes and misinforma-

tion. "Individuals who are depressed or anxious might not seek medical care, and they may live years and years feeling that way."

People should seek help when:

1. When it starts interfering with doing the things you normally do: getting dressed, paying attention.
2. There's a loss of pleasure. "When you just don't care and things just don't give you much pleasure," Dr. Hydock said.

3. There's a sense of hopelessness that no matter what I do it won't make a difference.

"There are good days and not-so-good days and when it continues for more than a week or two and you can't shake it then it may be clinical depression," she said.

People who suspect they may be depressed should speak to their family physician or a crisis hotline, such as that operated by West Texas Centers for MHMR.

"What we need people to realize is that depression is treatable, and it is not something you have to slog through. It's just not medication and learning how to cope with the symptoms. It's not just about popping a pill, it's not about waiting it out. There is that physical component. Why would you suffer when there is help?"

supplying up diplomatic efforts to avert a nuclear test. Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe was to visit Beijing on Sunday for talks with Chinese President Hu Jintao and then proceed to Seoul for talks with South Korean President Roh Moo-hyun the following day.

On Saturday, South Korea's nuclear envoy announced he will visit Beijing on Monday for two days of talks with Chinese officials about the threatened nuclear test.

In a separate statement from Tokyo, Japan's Foreign Ministry said it was prepared to push for punitive measures at the United Nations if the North goes ahead with the

test. "If North Korea conducts a nuclear weapons test despite the concerns expressed by international society, the Security Council must adopt a resolution outlining severely punitive measures," the ministry said.

Japan plans to step up economic sanctions against North Korea, tighten trade restrictions and freeze additional North Korea-linked bank accounts should a nuclear test be carried out, Japan's Nihon Keizai newspaper reported.

The U.N. statement adopted Friday expressed "deep concern" over North Korea's announcement Tuesday that it is planning a test.

The council acted amid speculation that a nuclear test could come on Sunday, the anniversary of North Korean leader

Kim Jong Il's appointment as head of the Korean Workers' Party in 1997.

Japanese Vice Foreign Minister Shotaro Yachi told Japan's TV Asahi: "Based on the development so far, it would be best to view that a test is possible this weekend."

The U.N. statement also urged North Korea to return to six-nation negotiations aimed at persuading the country to abandon its nuclear ambitions in exchange for security guarantees and badly needed economic aid.

Those talks, which involve the United States, China, Japan, Russia and North and South Korea, have been stalled since late last year, when North Korea boycotted the negotiations in response to American economic sanctions.

A North Korea expert in

China, the North's closest ally, said only the removal of the sanctions could dissuade the North.

"North Korea has already made a decision to carry out a test," said Li Dunqiu of China's State Council Development Research Center, a Cabinet-level think tank. But "if the U.S. removes sanctions ... then tensions can be eased. Otherwise launching a nuclear test is unavoidable for North Korea."

The United States imposed economic restric-

tions on North Korea last year to punish it for alleged counterfeiting and money laundering.

North Korea said Tuesday it decided to act in the face of what it claimed was "the U.S.

extreme threat of a nuclear war," but gave no date for the test. Washington has repeatedly said it has no intention of invading North Korea.

conceded. "There were a lot of different contractors working on the job ... and we ran into some staffing worries, but we felt like we got a quality product, and we're proud of what came out of the project."

Despite the delays, the project came in under budget, Johnson said.

Another unexpected benefit is that the tax burden, so far, is less than projected. Debt service on the bond cost taxpayers 17 cents per \$100 valuation last year and 13 cents per \$100 valuation this year, down from the 22.8 cents

in original projections, Johnson said.

Two final construction projects remain, although they will not effect classroom operation — building a covering for the bus parking area and roofing work at the junior high/high school.

The simple truth about a new jail. The state DOES require if a county has a jail, that it meet the minimum standards set forth under the Texas Administrative Code, Title 37, part 9, Chapter 251, Rule 251.1, which clearly gives the Texas Commission on Jail Standards the authority to oversee the maintenance, construction and operation of the jails it regulates.

So what jails does it regulate? Again, by statute, "All county jail facilities..." (Texas Administrative Code, Title 37, part 9, Chapter 251, Rule 251.1) The Texas Legislature created the Commission on Jail Standards in 1975 and did not "grandfather" the Howard County Jail from compliance on its standards. It did grant "variances" on some conditions until such time as they could be corrected, but only if the jail complied with all Life Safety Code requirements. In 30 years Howard County has neither complied with these codes, nor corrected the conditions of variance and that is why we are facing closure at this time.

To those who propose we shuffle extra inmates around the inspections, it is not only irresponsible, but illegal as well. I cannot believe that you would want to go back to a sheriff's administration that condones such activity. What other laws do you wish him to violate? Truth is that not all inspections are announced. You are gambling with monies you don't have. It only takes one wrongful death from conditions in violation of the statute to bankrupt this county.

Contrary to what some people opposed to a new jail are spreading, the State of Texas has never mandated that we build a 144-bed jail or a 96-bed jail for that matter. The Jail Commission has only made recommendations as to the size of the facility. They base this on many factors including projections based on population but more importantly on statewide crime statistics and regional trends. As the state's jail supervisory agency, they have the greatest working knowledge of jail needs, construction and operations. They offer this expertise and technical assistance, again by statute, to all the county and municipal agencies that request their services. The Jail Commission is aware of the expansion needs in our area and the simple fact is they have seen where too many new jails were built too small to last for their expected life. With the cost of construction escalating, we can build more proactively for less than even two or three years from now and avoid a costly mistake.

So what do you do with the extra beds? You do the same thing that hotels do, lease them out at discount. Hotels, like some other county jail facilities, lease out the beds they are not using. A hotel can lease a room out for a dollar over the cost of cleaning the room, utilities required and consumables and still make a profit. That is why Dickens and the other counties can lease out their extra cells at a seemingly low rate and still make a profit. If you have the staff assigned already to supervise inmates, then why not lease out extra cells up to the next staffing level? You would only have to cover the cost of meals, linens etc. to make a profit. This is why they are making a profit and helping to service their debt at the same time. If you don't think this concept is plausible, why do you think Priceline.com and Hotels.com are so successful?

Still I hear that we wasting our county tax dollars if we house all our inmates here and yet in some twisted way sending inmates out of county saves our tax dollars. If that were true, we would send them all out of town. Of course that will go over big with our bail bondsmen, food vendors, janitorial suppliers, attorneys, magistrates, etc. — not to mention the fact that inmates' families will not be able to visit them.

Let us not forget that someday, someone we care for may fall into misfortune and be incarcerated for a time. Let us also remember that "out of county" housing does not release Howard County of its liability; it just removes our control over it. We still are liable for their medical cost and personal safety! Cornell Corrections is a prison, not a private jail like some think, and cannot house county inmates.

Some propose a 96-bed jail. Where will it be built and how much will it cost? What will have to be done to the site, whom will it offend? Any site suitable for a jail needs to have enough room to expand. Some people speak of the lots south of city hall. Those lots have old service stations on them with underground tanks that have to be abated. This also means ongoing monitoring, what does that cost? The location west of the courthouse is even more impractical for a like reason, as well as very limited area. If the City Hall site were deemed feasible, then what difference does it make if you transport inmates four blocks or 14 as with the Northside site? You still have the same number of transport vans and personnel required.

I do understand that some people may have an issue with a jail building on land near to them. I wonder if they have even seen the drawings? This facility looks a lot better than the old tractor house that use to be there or perhaps a trucking company that could be built there with all its noisy trucks. This property is zoned to allow a mechanic shop, a welding business or any

number of light commercial enterprises like another second hand store or tire repair business. I believe having a stable, attractively designed business that more resembles a school than a prison is a lot more appealing than an empty lot that is in need of constant mowing and cleaning. Look at the plans and see if you don't agree. As for security, it meets a higher standard than the present one and even the opposition affirms that there has never been an escape due to security.

No one can even tell you a site or construction cost for anything other than the proposed 144-bed Northside facility, so how can they say it costs too much? I have listened to opposing views projecting operating costs and the "real" tax cost. They are so off base it doesn't deserve discussion. Instead, I choose to listen to the tax and bonding professionals that deal with it daily and came to speak on the topic. Meeting after meeting has disproved the feasibility of all but this proposal and that is why it is the only one decided to be put on the ballot. It was a unanimous decision arrived after great compromise on all sides. I have personally been in all nine correctional facilities that are in Howard County on several occasions. They are jails and prisons, not palaces. Look at the plans, the new jail will simply be a modern and code compliant structure.

Can the existing jail be renovated? The architect addressed that matter as well. The basic structure of the courthouse precludes being able to add enough additional floor space to overcome the future needs. The entire courthouse would have to be brought up to current codes and still there would be no room for expansion. The disruption to business would be extremely severe and for a period of much more than six to eight months. It took them that long to even begin repairs on the smoke removal system. The noise and dust problems encountered in such a remodel would bring all business in the courthouse to a virtual standstill.

The bottom line is simple. Many of the opposition's views are based more on opinion than fact, as well as material that was incomplete when they got it; information that they have not tried to correct. They will tell you that it cannot be built for the bond amount. They have no way to prove it. If the bids come in too high it will be redesigned to fit the available funds. That is how the process works. It is a shame that for 30-plus years we could not get a unified commissioners court to be responsive to the needs of the current jail. Now we will pay for the indecision of past sheriffs and commissioners. Let us not be

deceived any longer and give in to that negative attitude that has stifled our community for so long.

Look at all the opportunities we have had in Howard County and how the negative faction has squashed the spirit of life out of them. Let's break out of our shell. To have a progressive community requires progressive action and judgment. Seek out the information for yourself, come to the upcoming jail forums and ask the tough questions. That is all anyone can ask. You will make the right decisions when you know the truth.

When it is finished we will not have one more golfer. But we will have to pay higher green fees, higher trail fees and higher shed fees, if we can keep our carts.

There is nothing in Big Spring that is enjoyed by more people than our beautiful golf course. So why spend so much money when so many improvements could be made at a fraction of this cost without shutting down the course?

In 2005 the course brought in over \$225,000.

I think it is a mistake for the mayor and city council to do this just to please so few.

In maybe 18 months, when the course construction is over, I think we will have a nice course. But that's what we already have.

TO THE EDITOR:

A letter from Frank Parker appeared in the weekend edition of the Big Spring Herald, Sept. 23-24. Mr. Parker seems to have difficulty accepting facts and ignores the authoritative rule of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards, Title 37 of the Texas Administrative Code. I wish to make a statement on each of his assertions.

First, Mr. Parker states we have a "county with an average jail population of 42." The present jail has a capacity to hold 39 inmates. According to documentation from the sheriff's office, the average jail population through February 2006 was 65 inmates. Naturally, the overflow had to be sent to other jails. Since that time, the average jail population is 53. Start watching the daily Sheriff's Report in the Herald and listen to Mike Henry's news broadcast on KBST. You can verify the daily count.

Second, Mr. Parker states, "County taxes will go up over 30 percent." He is implying you will pay 30 percent more on your

taxes. Not true. The bond cost for a jail will increase your tax rate 5.8 cents per \$100 of assessed property value, less exemptions. If your home is appraised at \$50,000 and you qualify for a home-stead tax exemption of \$10,000, your taxes would be assessed on \$40,000 only, and you would pay \$23.20 per year. If you would like to know exactly what the increase would be on your property, call Kathy Sayles, the Howard County Tax Assessor at 264-2232.

Third, Mr. Parker states, "Jail costs will increase \$2.4 million the first year and go up each year thereafter." No analysis of costs offered — just an assumption. Costs do go up each year, particularly construction materials. If the bond election had passed in 1995 — it failed by 88 votes — we could have built a new jail, sheriff's offices and city police offices for \$4 million.

Fourth, Mr. Parker states, "The annual payment on the bond will be \$850,000." At last a true

statement. But once the new jail is operational and the county has utilized all of the space it needs, any excess space can be used to hold the overflow prisoners from other entities until the county requires the space for its own prisoners. While the county is not depending on leasing excess cells, the lease of excess capacity would generate money for the county to make its annual payment on the bond.

Fifth, Mr. Parker states, "...salary and benefit costs for jail personnel will be \$1.7 million." The sheriff's staffing analysis report reflects a present staff of 20, with salary and benefits of \$890,000. The new jail would require eight more employees (new jobs for the citizens of our community), making a total of 28 with salary and benefits estimated at \$1,246 million.

Sixth, he states, "Insurance costs will be \$2,000 each month, prisoner transportation will be \$25,000 per year and cable TV will cost \$2,500." Insurance probably will cost \$2,000 per month. We do have to have insurance on the building and liability on the personnel and inmates. I assume he is basing the transportation figure of \$25,000 on the sheriff's budget for road trips to transport prisoners to other facilities. With the new jail, women prisoners would be in cells in Big Spring and the overcrowding situation would be lessened. The only time transportation would be required is for trial purposes. The sheriff's office and the county auditor inform me the cable TV is paid out of the commissary fund. Since transportation costs will be decreased, we should look into increas-

ing the cable costs. With modern technology, the prisoners could remain in the new jail and hearings could be conducted with the district judge via TV with no transportation involved.

Seventh, Mr. Parker states, "A prisoners' law library will cost \$12,000 each year." Again, he is ignoring the Texas Commission on Jail Standards.

Deputy Director Teri Dollar informs me no specification for a law library will be approved by the commission. A law library is required in federal prisons, but not in Texas prisons and jails. We can deduct that \$12,000 from his figures. The requirements and dimensions are listed in the Texas Administrative Code — an inmate entrance, processing area, visiting areas, kitchen, dining space, laundry facilities, commissary, infirmary, multipurpose room, exercise area, single cells, multiple occupancy cells, separation cells, holding cells, detoxification cells, violent cells, day rooms, safety vestibules, power operated locks, temperature control, air flow, audible communication and television monitoring.

Eighth, Mr. Parker states, "Frankly, it will take more than \$10 million to build this Taj Mahal and they will be back for more money to finish it." This is an outrageous statement. The proposition of the ballot reads as follows: "This issuance of general obligation bonds not to exceed \$10,185,000 to pay for the construction and equipping of a new county jail and the acquisition of a site therefore." The bonds cannot exceed \$10,185,000. There is a possibility that less than that amount will be spent.

The voters elected the persons on the Howard

County Commissioners Court to represent them. Judge Lockhart and Commissioners Emma Brown, Jerry Kilgore and Bill Crooker have diligently worked on this jail question for more than two years. Commissioner Gary Simer joined a very small group in opposition.

We have already lost two years with construction costs constantly rising. We have to act now. Early voting starts on Oct. 23. I urge voters to please cast their votes for the issuance of bonds.

A jail that can house all the prisoners would allow the county to keep those tax dollars within the county and not provide revenue to other counties.

The current jail has a capacity of 43 beds manned by a staff of 20. The proposed new jail would have 144 beds and when full, would require a staff of 28 persons. The new jail is designed for maximum efficiency in monitoring inmates and

Aryan Brotherhood member sentenced

LUBBOCK (AP) — A member of a white supremacist gang was sentenced Friday to nearly 15 years in prison for his role in the 2005 theft of 26 guns.

Matthew C. Courtney, 34, a "major" in the Aryan Brotherhood of Texas, was convicted in federal court in July of conspiracy to possess and dispose of stolen firearms, being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm and possession of a stolen firearm.

The Midland man was accused of stealing the guns from a Lubbock home in 2005 and conspiring to trade them for methamphetamine and money.

Courtney's two co-defendants, also members of the gang, pleaded guilty to related firearms charges and were sentenced in September.

Cory D. Daniel, 27, of Lubbock, was sentenced to 10 years in prison, while 27-year-old Aaron Thompson, also of Lubbock, was sentenced to five years.

Thompson is a "lieutenant" in the gang, which has infiltrated nearly every federal and state prison since its beginnings in San Quentin in 1964.

Suspect found dead after shootout

EL PASO (AP) — A 30-year-old robbery suspect was found dead after a late-night shootout with police.

Ismael Mireles of El Paso was found dead from an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound sometime after he and a 24-year-old man, whose name has not been released, fled from a southeast El Paso store and fired at officers responding to an alarm, police said.

El Paso police said the incident started about 11:15 p.m. Thursday when officers heard an alarm coming from a Lowe's Super Save store. As officers approached, police said, Mireles and the other man ran out of the building and started shooting. The officers shot back and later found the unidentified man in a nearby yard. Mireles was found dead at another location in the residential neighborhood, police said.

Investigators said Mireles and the other suspect held store employees at gunpoint before shooting at police.

The second suspect, also an El Paso man, was arrested on charges of criminal attempted capital murder and aggravated robbery.

El Paso police have fired at three suspects this year, killing two and wounding the third. There had only been six officer-involved shooting incidents in the previous five years.

Two killed after falling from freeway

DALLAS (AP) — Two men fleeing from police on a motorcycle were killed Friday when they struck a divider on a five-tier freeway interchange, careened out of control and were thrown to the highway 75 feet below.

Police were pursuing the motorcycle when the wreck happened about 2:40 a.m. on the High Five interchange at Interstate 635 and U.S. Highway 75.

The names of the victims were not immediately released. Police are conducting a review of the chase after watching video from the dashboard camera of the squad car, Dallas police Sgt. Gil Cerda said.

Officers had been monitoring an apartment complex north of the High Five when they noticed the men act-

ing suspiciously, authorities said. When a marked police vehicle approached the men, they fled on the motorcycle.

The men had been carrying backpacks filled with tools, an assault-type rifle and a machete, said Senior Cpl. Janice Crowther.

Legal immigrants sue Wendy's

HOUSTON (AP) — A group of illegal immigrants who worked for Wendy's International Inc. is suing the restaurant chain because the company fired them after discovering it had missed a deadline for joining a federal program that would have helped them attain legal status.

The lawsuit, filed Friday in state district court in Houston, is a companion to a similar class-action suit filed last month in Dallas against Dublin, Ohio-based Wendy's, its subsidiary Cafe Express and the Houston-based business law firm Boyar & Miller.

The immigrants, who worked for Cafe Express, are seeking unspecified damages.


Between the two lawsuits, 40 illegal immigrants say they were fired after the company recently found that Boyar & Miller, the law firm Wendy's had hired, never filed paperwork for a 2001 legalization program that allowed immigrants with employer sponsorship or an American spouse to apply for citizenship.

Once the discovery was made, Wendy's was forced by law to fire the employees because of their illegal

status. Immigrants in the program would have been insulated from being fired.

"I put all my hope and faith in this company," said Daniel Olivares, who worked for Cafe Express for nine years before being fired in September. "It was devastating news for me and my family."

Wendy's spokesman Bob Bertini called it an "extremely unfortunate situation" due to "the mistakes made by others" that began before his company acquired Cafe Express.


"We played our best game of the year," Holt said. "We have been practicing hard all year and the kids deserved this

Yankees on the brink of elimination, Tigers win behind Rogers, up 2-1

DETROIT — The Detroit Tigers didn't waste this homecoming, and Kenny Rogers made every pitch count.

In a ballpark normally locked up by October, the Tigers got 7 2-3 shutout innings from Rogers and outplayed New York in a 6-0 victory, pushing Detroit within one win of shocking the Yankees into an early winter.

The 41-year-old Rogers, one of the few Detroit staffers who doesn't fire 100 mph fastballs, used every pitch in his personal stash to blank a revamped Yankees' lineup for his first career postseason win.

As if conjuring the spirit of former Tigers phenom Mark "The Bird" Fidrych, Rogers spent much of the evening talking to himself on the mound. It was unusual

behavior on a night when a full moon hung over the ballpark.

"I was probably more emotional than I should have been," said Rogers, who was serenaded with chants of "Ken-ny, Ken-ny" afterward by Tigers fans. "That is by far the greatest lineup I've ever faced. I just wanted to win for everyone here."

Rogers' first win over the Yankees since 1993 came at the perfect time for the Tigers, who were playing their first post-season game in Comerica Park, the first playoff game in The Motor City since 1987 at Tiger Stadium.

Last weekend, the Tigers, baseball's darlings during the regular season, had a chance to wrap up their first division title in 19 years and secure home-field advantage in the first round of the AL playoffs. Instead, they flopped.

Detroit got swept by Kansas City and in the process the Tigers gift wrapped the AL Central title for Minnesota and wound up as a wild card with a playoff appointment in New York.

Well, whatever magic dust that carried the Tigers through the regular season is blowing in the Michigan wind again.

Detroit, which left New York on Thursday with a split after rallying to win Game 2, scored three runs in the second inning off Randy Johnson and two more in the sixth. And, Rogers, whose career highlights include a perfect game in 1994 for Texas and an embarrassing run-in with a TV cameraman, made them stand up.

Rogers, who played for New York in 1996-97, confounded the Yankees with fastballs, sinkers, change

ups and curves. The left-hander struck out eight his most since June 13 and walked two.

After striking out Bobby Abreu for the second out in the eighth, Rogers was lifted by manager Jim Leyland and received a long, loud ovation on his walk to the Tigers dugout. Joel Zumaya got one out and Todd Jones finished the combined five-hitter.

Sean Casey had two RBIs and Curtis Granderson hit a solo homer as the Tigers, who won just 43 games in 2003, moved within one win of taking a best-of-5 series few thought they had a chance in.

Jeremy Bonderman will start Game 4 on Saturday against New York's Jaret Wright.

The Yankees' offense sputtered again, and this time it wasn't all Alex Rodriguez's fault.

A-Rod was still AWOL following an 0-for-3 night that dropped him to 1-for-

11 in the series. New York's \$25 million man is batting just .116 (5-for-43) in his last 12 postseason games and hasn't driven in a run in his past 11.

Citing Bernie Williams' stronger numbers— a .353 average with two homers— against Rogers, Yankees manager Joe Torre shook up baseball's bash brothers from the Bronx by using the 38-year-old as his DH while resting first baseman Gary Sheffield.

Jason Giambi, New York's DH in the first two games at Yankee Stadium, played first and Rodriguez, who was dropped to sixth in the lineup for Games 1 and 2, was back in the cleanup spot.

The shakeup didn't stir a thing.

Williams went 0-for-3 with two strikeouts, Giambi 0-for-3 with a K and Sheffield sat on the bench with a blue-hooded sweat shirt pulled up over his head. The Yankees, who haven't scored in 14 innings, went 0-for-8 with runners in scoring position after going 1-for-8 in Game 2.

"He's pitched a long time and there's a reason for it," Torre said. "He was on a roll tonight. He moved the ball around and kept us off balance. You could see the fire at the end. He wanted to finish it himself."

Johnson required an epidural shot in his back a week ago to ease the pain from a herniated disc. On a chilly 50-degree night, the Tigers were the ones needling him with timely hits and aggressive baserunning.

The Big Unit allowed five runs and eight hits in 5 2-3 innings, dropping to 0-2 in the postseason since joining the Yankees.

From the moment beloved Hall of Fame outfielder Al Kaline threw a strike with the ceremonial first pitch, Detroit fans were rocking the way they used to in Octobers past at the corner of Michigan and Trumbull, about one mile from the Tigers' new home.

Leyland was concerned about his young club getting too caught up in the emotion of Detroit's play-off return.



Kubiak hard at work during bye week trying to fix Texans' numerous problems

HOUSTON — The Houston Texans are in much better shape through four games this season than they were last year. That doesn't mean things are good.

New coach Gary Kubiak is the first to acknowledge that. So while his players take a five-day vacation during their bye week, he's hard at work, trying to figure out what has gone wrong and how it can be fixed.

"We're going to go back and take our four games and evaluate what we're doing and how we're doing it and who is doing it, just what direction we think we need to head as a football team throughout those next 12 weeks," Kubiak said. "Just really do a self-evaluation of ourselves as a football team."

Houston had three ugly losses before ending the first quarter of the season on a positive note by getting its first win, a 17-15 victory over Miami. The win allowed the Texans to enter their bye week ahead of winless Tennessee in the AFC South.

But their problems are far from over. Their revamped defense is giving up an NFL-worst 435 yards a game and the running game is sputtering along at a snail's pace, averaging just 76 yards a game.

Top pick Mario Williams finally made an impact against Miami with 1 1/2 sacks and tipped a 2-point conversion attempt that would have tied the game. But for Houston's defense to improve it will need more consistent play from the 21-year-old defensive end.

"He's a rookie and we are asking him to do a lot," Kubiak said. "The quicker we get any consistency out of a rookie then they are no longer rookies, and that's what we are after right now."

While Williams has struggled with the transition, fellow rookie DeMeco Ryans has stepped in as a leader on Houston's young defense. The linebacker, a second-round pick out of Alabama, leads the Texans with 38 tackles.

The young secondary has been picked

apart by Donovan McNabb, Peyton Manning and Mark Brunell. Houston's pass defense is allowing 295 yards a game, also a league worst. Kubiak has lamented that the Texans' failure to effectively pressure the quarterback has made things tougher for the secondary.

It's not all gloom and doom for the Texans, though. David Carr continues to improve under Kubiak's tutelage and his 108.9 passer rating leads the NFL. He is completing 73 percent of his passes and has thrown seven touchdowns with just two interceptions.

Key to that improvement is the play of Andre Johnson, who is on pace for his best season. He is third in the NFL in yards receiving with 410 and his 30 receptions are tied for most in the league.

But Johnson said he won't be able to enjoy his work if it doesn't translate into more wins.

"All of that is great, but it really doesn't matter if you don't win games," he said. "We haven't been very fortunate to win very many games, and that's my main focal point, just trying to do everything I can to help win games."

Kubiak said the Texans have been forced to move Johnson all over the field to get him the ball and that he's handled it well.

"I think he has a chance to be as good as there is in football," Kubiak said. "He is big. He's very fast. He's dynamic with the ball once it gets in his hands. He's very strong and has a chance to go the distance. I think he has a tremendous opportunity."

Carr's progress has also been helped by improved protection. He's still been taken down 15 times, but for the first time in recent history, the Texans don't lead the league in sacks allowed. And unlike in years past, he's shown poise and made plays under heavy pressure.

Kubiak said Carr, a former No. 1 pick in his fifth season, is finally beginning to "show some signs of really growing up as a player."

Watney, who shared a two-stroke lead with John

Rollins and Brent Geiberger after the first round, stayed in contention for his first victory on the tour. His personal best came during his most recent event, a tie for fifth in the Reno-Tahoe Open.

This time, Watney birdied his first two holes, had 10 consecutive pars and made his only bogey on the par-5 13th. He missed the fairway with his tee shot, got onto the green in four shots and left a par putt short.

"I was swinging well and had a few more opportunities early, but then (I) didn't hit it as well as I did yesterday, so I made a lot of good par saves," Watney said. "It's tough to get the ball close because the wind was, you know, kind of gusting and pretty tricky."

Palmer made the biggest jump of the round. Starting seven strokes behind the

Athletics 8, Twins 3; Oakland now advances to ALCS

OAKLAND, Calif. — The Oakland Athletics played flawless defense to back their impeccable pitching. They were smart on the basepaths, with none of the blunders that so defined all of the club's first-round flops from earlier this decade.

The balanced roster that general manager Billy

Beane upgraded last winter to contend this year is headed to the AL championship series — and the A's sure made it look easy with a sweep of the Minnesota Twins.

Milton Bradley homered and threw out Torii Hunter in a disputed play at the plate as the A's snapped a stretch of nine straight losses in potential playoff clinchers, beating Minnesota 8-3

Friday to reach the ALCS for the first time in 14 years.

Oakland never trailed in finishing off the Twins in three games and will face either the Detroit Tigers or New York Yankees starting Tuesday night.

"It's not only that we were having trouble doing it, we haven't done it," Beane said of getting past the first round. "The best team in the league,

the New York Yankees, won the most games but even they have to start over in the playoffs."

Marco Scutaro doubled twice and tied an A's postseason record with four RBIs and Eric Chavez homered as Oakland won a playoff series for the first time since 1990.

"Today went perfect," Chavez said. "We've had a lot of chances at it, and we've finally been able to

do it." Dan Haren escaped two early jams to win in his first postseason start and the A's avoided all of the gaffes that led to their

previous postseason problems. And when closer Huston Street got Luis Castillo to fly out to end it, they rushed onto the field for a big group hug.







Swiss Army cell phone

SAN JOSE, Calif. — As a deep bass thumps in the background of a TV commercial, a rich voice describes a sleek device that seemingly offers everything, from simple calling to a mobile music player.

It's a seductive image: One device that can be used as a phone, navigator, computer, camera, video player and mobile music library. Part MP3 player. Part phone. Totally sweet," the voice purrs.

Welcome to the increasingly ambitious world of mobile phone competition, where industry executives — unsure of what consumers will pay for — hope to win them over by adding more functions to their cellular mobile phones.

With more than 72 percent of the U.S. population already using mobile phones, the industry must introduce new functions to keep consumers buying new models and spending more money on applications such as text messaging, Web browsing and video games. So analysts, many gathered at the recent weeklong wireless conference about entertainment in Los Angeles, say that over the next few years consumers can expect to be bombarded with new designs and functions.

The industry debate centers on how

much consumers really want in a phone. Some industry executives say they believe the mobile phone of the future will replace other mobile devices. Naysayers say consumers are willing to carry multiple devices for better quality.

"People in general would rather carry less things, but we know the

Jupiter Research. "It's about secondary features that are good enough to use in a pinch, but you're not going to use as a primary. The worst camera in your camera phone is still better than the best phone (without a camera) you leave at home."

The first mobile battleground will be over the music sector, said Martin Kon, a director at Mercer Management Consulting, which surveyed 300 mobile industry executives recently.

About 70 percent of wireless dealers and retailers said new MP3 phones, such as the Verizon Chocolate introduced this summer, will replace stand-alone music devices such as the enormously popular Apple iPod series. The Chocolate can hold as many as 1,000 songs compared with an iPod nano that holds as many as 2,000 songs.

Apple does not appear to be sitting on the sidelines.

During the Cupertino, Calif., company's most recent quarterly earnings report, Chief Financial Officer Peter Oppenheimer breathed fresh life into an old rumor of a potential iPhone.

"We are very confident in our ability to compete in the marketplace. And we're very excited about what we have in the product pipeline, and you know that I can't comment on that," Oppenheimer said in response to an analyst's question about the company's reaction to the Sony Walkman phones.

"As regards to cell phones, we don't think that the phones that are available today make the best music players," he said. "We think the iPod is. But over time, that is likely to change. And we're not sitting around doing nothing."

An Apple spokesman said the company does not comment on "rumors and speculation."

But Gene Munster, a technology analyst with Piper Jaffray,

recently said in a research report that there is tangible evidence an iPhone is coming.

"It's going to happen, what's new from all the talk in the past 14 months versus today, you have the company suggesting it's real and documentation in iTunes 7 that it's coming," Munster said, referring to developer notes about the new version of iTunes.

The iPhone would probably work closely with Apple's iLife program and include a camera, video capture feature, video player as well as a contact area that



could tie in with the Apple address book, Munster said. He predicts it will be introduced early next year.

The makers of smartphones such as Palm Treo and the BlackBerry warn that no one phone can do everything well.

"There is a

It is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world.

Decisions crucial as cotton nears maturity

Cooler temperatures are limiting Panhandle crop development and may result in decreased yields, said a Texas Cooperative Extension specialist.

Dr. Randy Boman, Extension cotton agronomist in Lubbock, said lack of maturity is the biggest issue facing cotton producers, especially those north of Amarillo.

Proper use of harvest aids such as desiccants, defoliant and boll openers can help producers harvest earlier and at the same time maintain fiber quality and seed quality, Boman said. However, maturity is a big concern when harvest aids are applied.

Premature crop termination has been shown to reduce lint yield, seed quality, micronaire,

and fiber strength, he said. Once a defoliant or desiccant is applied, the cotton fiber won't improve any further.

No harvest-aid chemical can increase the rate of fiber development, Boman said. Only additional growing weather, including open skies and adequate heat units combined with functional leaves, can help cotton bolls to mature.

Only temperatures that average above 60 degrees can advance the maturity process, he explained. The measure of this available heat is called a

"heat unit." A heat unit is determined by adding the high temperature and low temperature in a day, dividing by two, and subtracting 60.

To determine maturity, he said, bolls can be cut open with a sharp knife. If the boll is watery and the seeds are jelly-like on the inside, the cotton is immature and needs more heat units. If the knife cannot slice through the lint and the seedcoats are tan to black, the boll is nearly mature.

Because of the late rain this year and cooler September, the region north of Amarillo is behind on heat units and thus much of the cotton lacks maturity, Boman said.

"Some of these fields are going to run out of time," he said. "That's the tightrope we

walk in this region, especially up north of Amarillo. We're looking at trying to get everything mature and then apply the harvest aid. But in reality, what we face is a lack of maturity going into the time of year we lack heat units."

Then, Boman said, it may be necessary to open the bolls with a product called ethephon.

Ideally, 50 percent to 60 percent of the bolls should be open before the harvest-aid chemicals are applied, he said. Some cotton producers mix boll openers with defoliants to enhance natural leaf drop.

"The problem we get into is the cotton doesn't open up," he said. "A lot of times we'll tell producers to apply a condition

Military members need to be on guard — financially

DALLAS — One of the goals of financial planning is to be prepared as much as possible for the uncertainties of the future.

For most people, that's challenging enough. But for members of the military, the question marks loom higher.

You can be sent to a new posting or ordered into a combat zone at a moment's notice, complicating your ability to manage your finances. With the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, some troops'

deployments have been longer than they had expected.

"The relative uncertainty is the key thing that does make it critical to plan," said Joseph Montanaro, a certified financial planner at USAA Financial Planning Services and a lieutenant colonel in the Army Reserve. "In the military, we say, 'Let's get our house in order before the order comes.'"

Worse, the career of a soldier, airman or Marine can end in injury or death.

"You've got to go into a mobilization with that mind-set — just in case, how do I take care of my family to the best of my

ability in case I don't come back or in case I don't come back whole?" said Jeff Pugh, an Arlington police officer and a major in the Army Reserve.

Even if you're just considering a military career, it's important to take good care of your finances. Many people see the military as a way to make a fresh start, but that may not be the case if debt is a big problem. The armed forces will run a credit check on you, and too much debt can keep you out.

"We don't want to take in someone who has too many financial problems to begin with," said Lt. Col. Michael J.

Stephens, commander of the 344th Air Force Recruiting Squadron in Arlington, Texas. "We're inheriting a problem that's not solvable, because they're not going to make enough money."

The military doesn't want you distracted by financial problems once you put on that uniform. So you'd better clean up your credit before applying.

"We don't want you to bring significant debt that, once you join the Air Force and become an airman, then you're going to keep spiraling further and further into debt," said Stephens. "When you put on that blue

suit and join the Air Force, we want you to be responsible in all aspects of your life."

As a practical matter, financial problems may affect a soldier's security clearance.

"In the military, many people lose their security clearance if they have credit situations," said Al Duarte, executive editor of Military Money magazine. "They're more likely to be desperate for money and perhaps do some things they shouldn't do."

To comply with the rules, Staff Sgt. John Bowerman made

ing rate of boll opener (high rate).
"If you are going after all the pounds you can get while recognizing that immature fiber will result in low micronaire values at the classing office," Boman said, "you need to look at a rate of 32 to 42 ounces of those with the 6 pounds per gallon formulation."
Necessary heat units are trailing off and typically will be gone by mid-October throughout much of the region, Boman said. When the average temperature gets below 60 F, the heat units are zero.

"Producers need to be watching the weather and make their boll-opening application before we run out of heat units," he said. "If the cotton gets a killing freeze, these products do not work."

sure he patched any financial holes on his record.
"I ran a credit report," said Bowerman, an Air Force recruiter who's in Lt. Col. Stephens' squadron. "I fixed whatever I needed to get fixed."
Get used to making electronic transactions with your bank.
"Direct deposit is mandatory," said David Hollands, a colonel in the Army Reserve and a certified financial planner in Plano, Texas, who specializes in military clients. "Automate bill payments, as you won't have much time to worry about such things."
And if you haven't already done so, open a savings account.
"Don't blow all your money on beer," Hollands said.
Families need to have a financial plan well ahead of the time of any deployment.
"Avoid a crisis later by sitting down now with your partner to create a deployment action plan for your finances," said Carl Surran, managing editor of Military Money. "It all starts with under-

standing your family's financial situation, including monthly bills, how much debt you owe and how much you have for emergencies."
When he was deployed, Bowerman, a single dad with a 5-year-old son, had money automatically deposited in an account for his sister-in-law, who cared for his son.
"I sent her money for day care, for food," he said.
Jeff Pugh is an Arlington police officer and a major in the Army Reserve. He and his wife, Connie, have two teenage sons.
Communication helped them navigate the uncertainties of military life.
"It was going through the process and making sure we had everything we're supposed to have and making sure we were keeping up with things we were supposed to keep track of," he said.

It's a matter of respect for your partner, Pugh said.
"If something goes wrong, that's not a good way for that spouse to find out that there's another account out there that they didn't know about that they're responsible for," he said.
Here are some particulars:
— Make sure your bank and credit accounts are joint accounts.
"When the service member is away on a deployment, the spouse — the wife about 93 percent of the time — must maintain control of the household and must have access to the deployed spouse's financial accounts, assets and belongings," Surran said.
— Draw up important documents, such as your will, durable power of attorney, medical power of attorney and living will.

Bowerman gave his friend power of attorney over his financial affairs and his sister-in-law medical and legal power of attorney for his son.
— Review your insurance policies. Life insurance is essential if you have a family.
"Especially when you have a wife and kids — money's a big thing when you're taking care of a young baby," Bowerman said.
The military offers low-cost Servicemembers Group Life Insurance for a mere 7 cents per \$10,000 of coverage, or \$29 per month for the maximum coverage of \$400,000.
"Any family that's not taking advantage of the maximum coverage at such a low rate should do so," Surran said.
If you need additional life insurance from private carriers, make sure the plan covers a combat-related death, since many policies don't.

'Saints' unrated release a major hit

Aspiring screenwriters know the "Cinderella" story behind Troy Duffy's script for "The Boondock Saints." Duffy, fueled by the same urban dismay that led Paul Schrader and Andrew Kevin Walker to pen the vigilante fantasies "Taxi Driver" and "Seven," hammered out a

screenplay about two Boston brothers who take revenge on the local Mafioso, which sold on spec to Miramax for \$450,000.

Not only was Duffy paid \$300,000 for his script, he was also given the chance to direct the movie himself, and have his own band do the soundtrack. Most of this incredible story was captured on a fascinating documentary called, "Overnight."

What made "Overnight" so incredible was not necessarily the rise of Duffy, but his unbelievable crash and burn which was captured on film. Duffy was filmed while drunk and partying saying many things about powerful people and other actors he will no doubt live to regret.

His passive-aggressive manipulations of family, friends and studio heads are forever burned onto celluloid. Eventually, Duffy's bombast and arrogance of how his film should be handled caught up with him and ultimately caused Harvey Weinstein and Miramax to drop the project — and Duffy — like a hot potato.

What once went from a \$15 million dollar package deal — at one point, Weinstein even offered to buy the bar and be co-partners with Duffy — quickly ended up with Duffy scrambling for backers and having only \$6 million dollars



complete his film.

Truly, if ever a documentary is to be seen by a hopeful Indie filmmaker, "Overnight" is that cautionary tale of how power can corrupt when it's given too fast and not appreciated.

If you're having a hard time conjuring a mental image of the movie's imagery adorning a theater wall somewhere, don't worry, senility isn't necessarily setting in.

While Duffy's crash and burn cost him millions of dollars in the long run, it cost "The Boondock Saints" a trip to the silver screen. This film, which boasts much of the same gritty veneer that made films like "Pulp Fiction" and "Reservoir Dogs," went straight to video thanks to the breakdown between Duffy and Miramax.

to what kind of story could spawn such real life drama?

The McManus brothers, Connor (Sean Patrick Flanery, "Suicide Kings," "The Adventures of Young Indiana Jones") and Murphy (Norman Reedus, "Blade H," "Mimic"), live and work in Boston, where they're deeply rooted in the community, known and loved by many of the locals.

They inadvertently become the "saints of South Boston" when, in self-defense, they kill some small-time hoods in the Russian mob who are trying to shake down their favorite bar owner.

They turn themselves in to the local police, who have brought in FBI agent Paul Smecker (Willem Dafoe, "Spiderman," "Once Upon a Time in Mexico") — who portrays a flamboyantly gay cop

they gain some adoration from the cops and the public.

Realizing that their actions may have some benefit, the brothers take it upon themselves to hunt down and kill the city's less desirable element, starting with some Russian mob bosses connected to the foot soldiers they just capped.

Smecker is assigned to the case, and Duffy stylishly relives the brothers' actions via flashbacks, which he creates through Smecker's CSI induced retelling. But Smecker doesn't know it's the McManus brothers, nor does the public cry out for justice.

Soon after their first vigilante undertaking, the brothers are embroiled in a deepening web of street justice.

With the help of their friend, Roc (David Della Rocco, a life long friend of Duffy), a runner for an Italian mob

So, better than most gay cops — to work on their case, since it involves organized crime. The brothers are set free, but only after

boss, they start going after some of the worse offenders from the underworld food chain.

Things start to get worse when those same mobsters hire an infamous assassin named Il Duce (Billy Connolly, "Open Season," "The Last Samurai") — who has a surprising connection to the McManus brothers — to go after the "saints."

Despite all the problems making the film, there is also no doubt that Troy Duffy has a unique eye as a director and is a pretty decent writer as well. The dialogue is mostly witty, dry and darkly humored. The direction is top notch for a first time filmmaker.

Editing, cinematography and lighting are expertly done as well. In the commentary, Duffy makes sure to give kudos to all involved in helping him along. All the actors — some of which never appeared on camera before — give very good and convincing performances. Using location shooting coupled with some set design gives the production an all around expertly produced look and feel.

Disc one is digitally remastered by THX for optimal video and audio quality. Presented in 2.35:1 anamorphic widescreen, preserving the films original theatrical presentation, "The Boondock Saints" is simply beautiful to look at. For an independent movie, contrast is well balanced and just about perfect in the daylight scenes, something which many Indie features suffer from. Colors are strong and vibrant producing a rich saturation, while flesh tones are natural.

This is a flipper disc and a full screen version is found on the other side. There are two audio commentaries. One from Troy Duffy and a separate track recorded by actor Billy Connolly.

Listening to Duffy's com-

mentary was pretty interesting, if not enlightening, as to all that went on behind the scenes. There is no arrogant Troy Duffy to be found here. He simply talks about the films' shoot, and how he complet-



ed it in 32 days on a budget of \$6 million dollars.

In fact, Duffy is sort of disingenuous when he says he'd like to talk "a little" about the films' controversies. Apparently, Troy is attempting to rewrite history, for there is zero talk about the original \$15 million dollar deal he had, Miramax, Weinstein, nor the documentary, "Overnight" which he was so famously captured on and serves as a video archive of the truth.

Instead, Duffy serves up a version that goes like this: "The Boondock Saints" was merely a victim of the times as the reason it didn't get played in all the theaters. The Columbine shooting had just occurred, and controversial movies such as "The Matrix" and "The Basketball Diaries" were already sparking out-

cries from the public.

Because of this, according to Duffy, his movie simply got "lost in the shuffle." Oh well, maybe he's trying to tone himself down and put the past behind him, or it's the studio

director and how their first professional meeting was, at Duffy's insistence, in a bar. Connolly's commentary is personable and talkative throughout. For Connolly, working on "The Boondock Saints" was a great experience.

The special features are found on disc two and are a mixed bag. There are seven deleted scenes. About four of them were good enough to have been re-edited back into the movie. There are only a minute & a half of out-takes, along with two trailers. Filmographies are also

found here. Finishing up the disc is the script for "The Boondock Saints." You have to put the DVD into your computer in order to access this feature, but for script buffs the

short walk to their computer is well worth it.

Its no secret I'm not necessarily a fan of Duffy, but it's even less of a secret that I'm a huge fan of "The Boondock Saints." Few films not created by Quentin Tarantino even come close to reaching into the dark heart of both reality and the fantasy world, pulling out something shaded by the kind of dark humor you can only find in a newsroom.

And with the re-release and its great new transfer and audio, along with being well acted, decently written, expertly directed and produced — despite all the behind the scenes turmoil — I highly recommend this new unrated edition of "The Boondock Saints" for any fan of quirky crime cinema.






