



Jail proponents schedule trio of forums

Area residents with questions concerning the proposed construction of a new Howard County Jail — financed by a \$10.1 million bond issue — will have plenty of chances to get answers in the coming week, as

proponents of the facility hold several fact-oriented forums.

According to former Moore Development for Big Spring board member Joyce Crooker, forums have been slated for Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday at area elementary schools.

The forums are:
— Tuesday in the Bauer Elementary cafeteria, 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.
— Wednesday in the Kentwood Elementary cafeteria, 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.

— Thursday in the Marcy Elementary cafeteria, 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.

"It's very important to remember these will be forums, not debates," said Crooker. "We plan to take the last 15 to 20 minutes of each forum to answer questions that have

been submitted in writing. We'll also answer questions that have been submitted through the Internet."

Crooker said the need for such forums became apparent when what she described as

Abused?

Victim Services can help you get out of an abusive situation

For everyone, there are people and events that are simply unforgettable.

Victim Services Executive Director Shann Smith knows that all too well. Each morning when she walks in the entrance to the agency's doors, three pink silhouettes remind her of Howard County women who've lost their lives to domestic violence.

For Smith, one of those silhouettes is a particularly painful reminder of the toll domestic violence takes in our society.

"It was nine years ago and I remember it like it was yesterday," Smith said, recalling the first domestic violence victim she ever worked with.

Sadly, the woman would become the first victim she'd ever counseled to be killed by a partner.

"I really don't want to use the victim's real

"I can't say this strongly enough, if you're in an abusive relationship, you're simply not going to be able to love that person enough to change them. For your own good, you've got to get away from that person."

name because she has family that still lives here in Big Spring and the memory of what happened is still very painful for them, so let's just call her Janice," Smith added.

Angel Tree applications available Monday

While most area residents don't have Christmas trees on the brain yet, the men and women at the Big Spring Salvation Army certainly do.

Angel Trees, to be exact. According to Capt. Russ Keeney, the local charity will begin taking applications Monday for the annual program, which provides Christmas gifts for area low income children. Applications

will be taken Monday through Friday, Oct. 20, and the following week, Oct. 23 through Oct. 27.

Keeney said the application process is simple, and for some area children it could be the difference between waking up with gifts under the tree Christmas morning and waking up to nothing.

"They need to come in and bring a picture ID for all of the adults, social security cards for all of the household members living there, birth certificates for children 12 and under and proof of income," said Keeney.

"That means check stubs from work, food stamps, AFDC, TANIF, HUD or any of those types of income. They need to bring those in with them, because we do verify them. They also need to bring in a copy of all of their expenses, as

well as a list of what their children might want for Christmas, including clothes sizes and shoe sizes.

"We do ask that they be reasonable in what they are asking for. If a child asks for a 60-inch television, chances aren't very good they're going to get it. If they say they want a Hot Wheels car or something like that, it's a lot more feasible." Keeney said applicants will find out whether or not they qualify for the program the

same day they apply.

Once the names and gift ideas are collected and put on the Angel Trees in the form of cards, area shoppers will have the opportunity to brighten a child's holiday by choosing one and purchasing items for them.

"This program is extremely special to me. Of all the programs that we do, this one is my heart because of the young people it helps," said a teary-

Security Council to impose sanctions on North Korea

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — The U.N. Security Council voted unanimously on Saturday to impose punishing sanctions on North Korea for its claimed nuclear test, declaring that its action posed "a clear threat to international peace and security."

The vote came after the United States, Britain and France overcame last-minute differences with Russia and China during what Russia's U.N. ambassador called

"tense negotiations."

The resolution demands North Korea eliminate all its nuclear weapons, but expressly rules out military action against the country — a demand by the Russians and Chinese.

But U.S. Ambassador John Bolton warned Pyongyang that if it continues pursuing nuclear weapons, the United States would return to the council and seek further measures.

The resolution bans the import or export of material and equipment that could be used to make nuclear weapons or ballistic missiles. It orders all countries to freeze the assets and ban travel for anyone engaged in supporting North Korea's weapons programs.

To meet Russian and Chinese concerns, the Americans eliminated a complete ban on the sale of conventional weapons. Instead,

the resolution limits the embargo to major hardware such as tanks, warships, combat aircraft and missiles.

The resolution calls on all countries to inspect cargo leaving and arriving in North Korea to prevent any illegal trafficking in weapons of mass destruction or ballistic missiles. The final draft was softened from language saying the council "decides" — which is a stronger authorization.

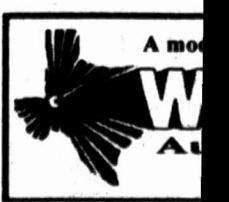

Family of four killed along Florida turnpike recently moved from Texas

FORT PIERCE, Fla. — A family of four found shot to death along an isolated stretch of highway had moved to Florida from Texas four months ago, authorities said Saturday.

The family, including two boys ages 3 and 4, was found Friday, fatally shot along Florida's Turnpike in Port St. Lucie, about 100 miles north of Miami. Investigators believe their vehicle, a 1998 four-door Jeep Cherokee, had pulled to the side of Florida's Turnpike before someone else in the vehicle shot them and drove away sometime between 1:30 a.m. and 3 a.m.

No one has been arrested, but authorities were searching for clues Saturday into the deaths, Sheriff Ken Mascara said. A search warrant was issued for the family's home in Greenacres in Palm Beach County, where the family had moved from the Brownsville, Texas, area. Authorities also were looking for the family's black Jeep Cherokee, which had a temporary license plate, Mascara said.

The mother, identified as Yessica Guerrero Escobedo, 25, was found clutching her sons in an apparent effort to protect them. The body of the father, Jose Luis Escobedo, 29, was found nearby.

Autopsy results were not expected until Monday, according to the medical examiner's office. Mascara said family members in Texas were notified of the deaths.

The scene of the shootings in a grassy area along the highway had no activity Saturday, a day after a passer-by spotted the bodies and alerted the Florida Highway Patrol, kicking off a search for evidence.

The vehicle left marks in the grass as it pulled away. A turnpike camera was in the area but wasn't recording at the time.

Investigators were watching 480 hours of surveillance tapes from toll booths along the turnpike hoping to spot clues.

They also sifted through trash cans along the turnpike to look for evidence.

Bullets found on the scene were being analyzed to see if the same kind had been used in any other crimes, Mascara said Friday.

"misinformation" about the issue began to run rampant in the county.

"We kept hearing information that wasn't factual and we felt the community should be informed," said Crooker. "We compiled a brochure, and to be absolutely sure it is factual it was screened by the Texas

Commission on Jail Standards and the bond attorney in Austin. We've heard a lot of misinformation and things that simply aren't true. We can say we're telling the truth about this.

"I feel good about this meeting because I feel like anyone who has a question can read this brochure and it will answer their questions. And if it doesn't, I would be happy to answer any questions they might have."

Among the speakers expected to present facts during the forum are Howard County Commissioners Bill Crooker, Jerry Kilgore and Emma Brown, as well as County Judge Ben Lockhart.

Sheriff Dale Walker is also expected to speak during the forum, as is local architect and project coordinator Phil Furquerson.

"All we're presenting here today is the facts, not opinion," said Bill Crooker during a pre-

vious forum on the subject. "We have this information at www.howardcountyjailbond.com for anyone who is interested. We will also have pictures of the existing jail up soon so county residents can see what kind of problems we're facing. We just want to make sure the voters are informed."

Consideration of a new jail facility began more than two years ago when commissioners identified jail overcrowding and non-compliance with state

jail laws as an ongoing and long-term problem.

Earlier this year, commissioners voted 4-1 in favor of building a new 144-bed jail, with Commissioner Gary Simer voting against the measure, citing size and location as reasons.

"She was the first domestic violence victim I'd ever worked with and I'd been working with her since around March of 1997," she explains. "Janice would leave her boyfriend and then go back. Leave and go back. Leave and go back. She just kept going back to him," Smith continued. "I remember telling her that if she stayed with him, he'd eventually kill her. She looked at me and said, 'Shann, I think I can love him enough that he'll change.'"

Three weeks later, on Sept. 17, 1997, Janice once again was trying to leave her boyfriend. This time, however, in a fit of rage that boyfriend bludgeoned her to death.

"You don't forget things like that," Smith said. "I

was the only person here at the time and the call came in from the Garza County Sheriff's Office. They asked if I'd been working with Janice, and I told them that I had. That's when they told me she'd been killed."

Her boyfriend wound up being convicted of first degree murder and received a life sentence.

Smith says she believes Janice's story is an important one to tell this month, since October is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

"I can't say this strongly enough, if you're in an abusive relationship, you're simply not going to be able to love that person enough to change them," Smith said. "For your own good, you've got to get away from that person."

And that's one of the reasons Victim Services, one of the 15 local agencies supported by funding from the United Way of Big Spring and Howard County, exists.

"We're here to help in situations like that," Smith said, noting that one of the most volatile times in an abusive relationship is when the victim is trying to leave.

"The abuser feels like they've lost all control over the other person," Smith explained. "And, of course, that's because they have. Because of that, they tend to lose control of themselves. If someone's in an abusive relationship and is trying to get out, all they have to do is call us."

"Our staff and volunteers are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year,"

she added. "Our services are confidential. They can even give us a false name if they feel they need to. The important thing is for them to get themselves out of a dangerous situation and we're always available to help."

The bottom line, Smith said, is that Victim Services is available when victims in Howard, Glascock, Martin, Borden and Mitchell counties need to talk.

Poor Ricketts can't afford a bullhorn

If he were a contestant on the game show "Wheel of Fortune," Robert Ricketts, the Democratic challenger in Texas' Congressional District 19, the upper midwestern portion of the state that includes Lubbock, would need to buy the letter "M" to energize his campaign.

No "Ms" — no message and no money — is how a cynic might describe Ricketts and his David versus Goliath battle against Republican incumbent Randy Neugebauer. The less political savvy would suggest that Ricketts has no splash and no cash, but that person would be wrong on the second count.

Ricketts proudly broadcasts his grassroots campaign, e.g., the buzzphrase, "not beholden to special interests." Read here: Ricketts couldn't get enough deep-pocket donors to fork over the green stuff, so he usurped it as badge of honor and distinction. It's the attitude: I don't like people who don't like me, and I don't need their money either, especially since I ain't gettin' none.

But it's also the tort reform law passed by Texas' Republican-dominated legislature in 2003 that near-fatally wounded the business and the bottom line of trial lawyers, the traditional high dollar benefactors to Democratic causes and candidates. Limit the punitive damage awards, and there is less profit to line the coffers of the political left. Republicans, though, are still pulling down and rounding up the cash from big oil and big business, and from the insurance

companies and physicians' lobbies in grateful appreciation. A glance at Gov. Rick Perry's donor list for his re-election campaign confirms this money path.

In this time of syndicated politicians and poll trackers, he stands as an anomaly. Today's politicians advance quickie resolutions to any foreign or domestic problem to an ADD audience, voters with attention spans shorter than the beer commercials during a college football game on TV. Sound bites become the solution, and the partisan, the pragmatic, answer.

In a recent chat with the Texas Tech Law Democrats on campus, Ricketts is conversant on the issues, a rarely seen characteristic in a politician. He is quite unpolitician-like in his stump speech. While most elected officials are all fluff and no stuff, all procedure and no substance, Ricketts gives the impression of being the latter, surprising especially in front of an educated audience of law students and law professors.

Is being knowledgeable a benefit to Ricketts, though, or could it be perceived as a detriment to his campaign?

Ricketts appears an ironic relic of a time past when Americans expected and elected only educated politicians.

One prerequisite of today's successful politician — one from Florida in particular — is his ability to text message quickly and cleverly, and without being caught. Our standards for public officials have declined.

Ricketts' slogan is "Sensible Government." He wants to lower the national debt and the federal deficit. Both are good, solid topics that intimate common sense, but

it is pie in the sky to jazz up voters about the resulting bad news to their grandchildren if the national government fails to balance its checkbook. Numbers and cents just don't make sense to the average American voter. The here and now is how we vote. It's the economy, stupid, after all.

"The future looms like a dark cloud over our children and grandchildren's futures," Ricketts warns on his website, but the price of gas is coming down and the stock market is going up the closer the November elections come. Ricketts seems more doomsday prophet than the CPA, Ph.D. in accounting, and university professor that he plays in real life.

That perception is unfortunate because he compellingly addresses the tough topics of Medicare and Social Security reform, advocates for a national health insurance program, and argues that it is not sound government or fair public policy to cut veterans' benefits during a conflict. The only issues Ricketts avoids are the Republican holy trinity of gay marriage, abortion and the Iraq fantasy or fiasco, depending on how far right or left you travel.

The problem with Ricketts' campaign is not what he is saying but to whom he is speaking. He has a message, but he needs another "M" — "M" for mobilization of the voters, because few are listening.

Or you can weigh, pay for, and ship your own Priority Mail or Express Mail packages right from your office or home. You even get delivery confirmation service at no extra charge when you choose Priority Mail and create your mailing label online.

Then, if you get mail delivered to your home, you can save yourself the time and expense of driving to the Post Office to ship your package. With Carrier Pickup online notification, you can get next-day pickup of Priority Mail and Express Mail packages by your regular letter carrier at no extra charge.

Also, it's never too early to start planning for overseas holiday mailings.

With thousands of American troops and civilians stationed around the world, the fall mailing season will be a busy time for mailing international and military

parcels and packages.

International holiday mail destined for Africa, Central and South America and the Middle East should be mailed by the end of October in order to arrive by Dec. 25. In response to the letter to the editor from Mr. Salazar, I would like to make these comments. I was one of the five women standing in front of him at the Sept. 28 homecoming game. I will not deny the fact that we were standing, that is something that we do from the opening kickoff until the end of the football game.

We do believe that this, along with our yelling and clapping, is our way of supporting our team and our boys. For the record, we do this at every game and have for a long time.

The game had already started and we were, in fact, already standing cheering when the Salazars showed up. There were empty seats in the stands, including the ones in front of us, when they chose the seats behind us. Section B is a general admission section and people are free to stand, or sit, wherever they please so they were not forced to sit behind us.

Mr. Salazar's wife never asked us "Ladies can you please sit down" and we did not turn around and immediately tell her that "we were there first" as he stated. That response came after they continued to argue with us about sitting down and after someone in their party forcefully and repeatedly poked my sister-in-law on the shoulder.

We did not think that it was rude that your wife and sister-in-law stood in

front of us like you stated, what we thought rude was when they came and stood on the stairs right beside us, blocking access to the stairs, trying to "intimidate" us.

I was, in fact, the one that went and got the police and had already left the stands when the event staff person came up. The event staff person did not at any point call the police as he stated, but was leaving the stands when the police officer and I were coming back up. Some players employ a great variety of bidding gadgets. Many of these gadgets do more harm than good and should be quickly abandoned. Other such devices, however, are quite worthwhile.

Consider this deal from a team-of-four championship where a valuable gadget was used. At the first table, Team A's North-South pair got to four spades as shown and made it because of bad defense. West led the K-A of diamonds, East playing the eight and then the deuce. West, noting partner's high-low, continued with a third diamond, handing the declarer the contract when he dis-

carded a club from dummy and ruffed in his hand. South later lost a heart trick but scored 620 points for making four spades.

When Team B held the North-South cards at the second table, the bidding went:

South West North East
1♦ Pass 4♦ 4NT
Pass 5♦

East's four-no-trump bid was an unusual application of the "unusual notrump," indicating great length in both minor suits. True, East had fewer high-card values than one would expect for making his partner bid at the five level. But from East's viewpoint, it seemed that South might make four spades and that five clubs or diamonds could not be badly hurt.

As it happened, East's judgment was wrong on both counts, but serendipity nevertheless reigned supreme. His teammates at the other table should not have made four spades, and his partner easily made five clubs (losing only a spade and a heart).

Whether or not you agree with East's action at the second table — which could easily have been wrong had his partner held a different hand — is left to the tender mercies of the reader. Whatever you think, though, East at the second table certainly demonstrated the value of the unusual notrump convention.

Ex-nurse maintains innocence in 10 patient deaths

MONTAGUE (AP) — As a former nurse prepares to spend the rest of her life in prison, she remains defiant, denying she is a serial killer who injected 10 patients with a paralyzing drug that stopped their breathing nearly six years ago.

"For 5 1/2 years I've never talked to anyone, and I wanted people to know it wasn't me," Vickie Dawn Jackson told The Associated Press from the Montague County Jail while awaiting transfer to a state prison. "I feel sorry for the families, but I can't show remorse for something I didn't do."

Jackson said she believed she would have been convicted if her case had gone to trial, so she decided to plead no contest, refusing to admit guilt, leaving her fate in a judge's hands.

"It was a very hard decision, but I was thinking I can plead no contest — I didn't admit guilt and I never will — or I can take it to trial and let the jury hear all these family members and (I will) look like a monster and get the same sentence," said Jackson, 40. "I saved my kids from testifying. It wasn't the easy way out."

Authorities, however, say mounds of evidence overwhelmingly point to Jackson as the killer — in fact, one of the state's most prolific killers.

"There was no one else who was there for every code and death involved," said Montague County District

Attorney Jack McGaughey, referring to cases in which some patients stopped breathing but were revived. "This plea in an odd way allows her to remain in control of the situation."

Dallas man sentenced to death for 2005 killing

DALLAS (AP) — A Dallas man who blamed an alter ego he called "Pretty Boy" for killing an 11-year-old girl was sentenced to death Friday.

Jurors last week convicted Steven Lynn Long, 35, of capital murder for the May 2005 sexual assault and strangulation of Kaitlyn Briana Smith. Long had blamed his alter ego of committing the crime.

An affidavit indicated Long told police it was "Pretty Boy" who attacked Smith and dumped her body under a vacant trailer.

Smith was reported missing after she failed to return from a sleepover at a friend's house.

Church teacher says boss told her to stop sex life until marriage

DALLAS (AP) — A church preschool teacher who became pregnant out of wedlock sued her employer, saying she was forced to sign a statement that she would stop having sex until marriage.

Freda Brown, whose pregnancy began in spring 2005, also claims in her federal lawsuit against First Baptist Church of Dallas that church leaders asked her inappropriate questions and reduced her wages.

The suit was filed this week after an investigation by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission determined that she had been discriminated against because of her gender and pregnancy, The Dallas Morning News reported in Friday editions.

A First Baptist spokeswoman referred calls to its attorney, John Harrison, who told the newspaper he was on vacation and had not yet talked to the church. He did not immediately return a message left by The Associated Press on Friday.

Kelly Shackelford, a Plano religious freedom attorney not involved in the case, said churches should expect their employees to live up to their values.

"If the church can't set moral standards for those employees, what can it do?" said Shackelford.

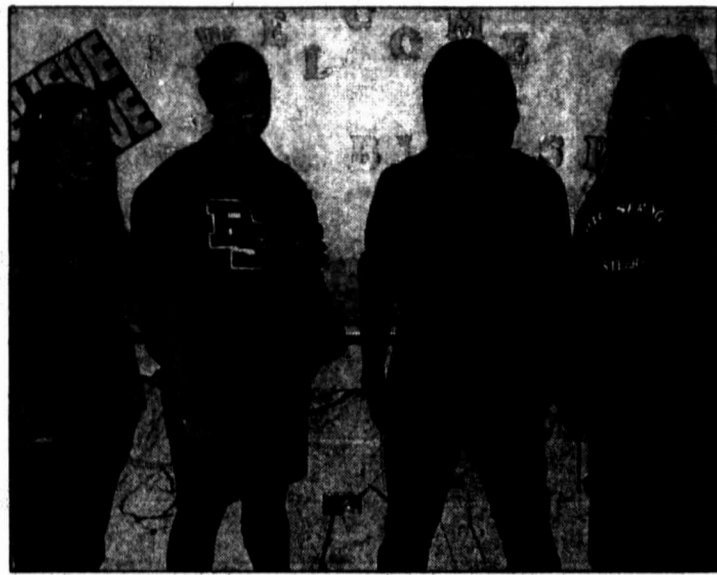

Defenseless Steers fall, 50-20

PLAINVIEW — In the third quarter the Big Spring Steers allowed a close game to turn into a rout.

Having just scored a touchdown before intermission, BSHS was down only 8, but then Plainview unleashed a ground attack that racked up close to 500 yards in ended in a 50-20 blowout Friday night.

When the final whistle blew the Bulldogs had amassed 493 yards rushing on 54 carries, while passing for only 11 yards. They were one-dimensional, but dominated a football game that was mired by 16 penalties, 11 of which went against Plainview for 95 yards.

It could have been worse.

"Defensively, we missed a ton of tackles in the open field," Big Spring Head Coach Tim Holt confessed. "We did a poor job

of filling the alleys. We had a lot of kids who did the right things, but it only takes a breakdown of one or two when you have that kind of speed. It was very much like Sweetwater. If they have any speed at all then those breakdowns are just not forgiving."

Those alleys and breakdowns were exploited by Plainview senior running back Evan Hearn. Before being removed from the game he pierced the Steers defense for 212 yards and four touchdowns.

After the half the Steers were never able to sustain a drive and the outcome was decided early in the third quarter.

On the first possession of the half, trailing 29-14, a late option pitch by Ryan Tannehill resulted in a turnover on the BSHS 27-yard line. On the ensuing play the Bulldogs bolted to the end zone and never looked back.

"We never got to a point where we averaged 4 yards per play like we need to do in order to control the offense," Holt said. "We had multiple receivers open, but we

didn't have time to get the football to them because of the breakdown in pass protection. A lot of time we had the right things going on, but Ryan didn't have time to set his feet

and get the ball to them. So from an offensive standpoint we failed to answer them whenever they were able to do some

Garden City blows out Sands in 82-6 victory Friday night

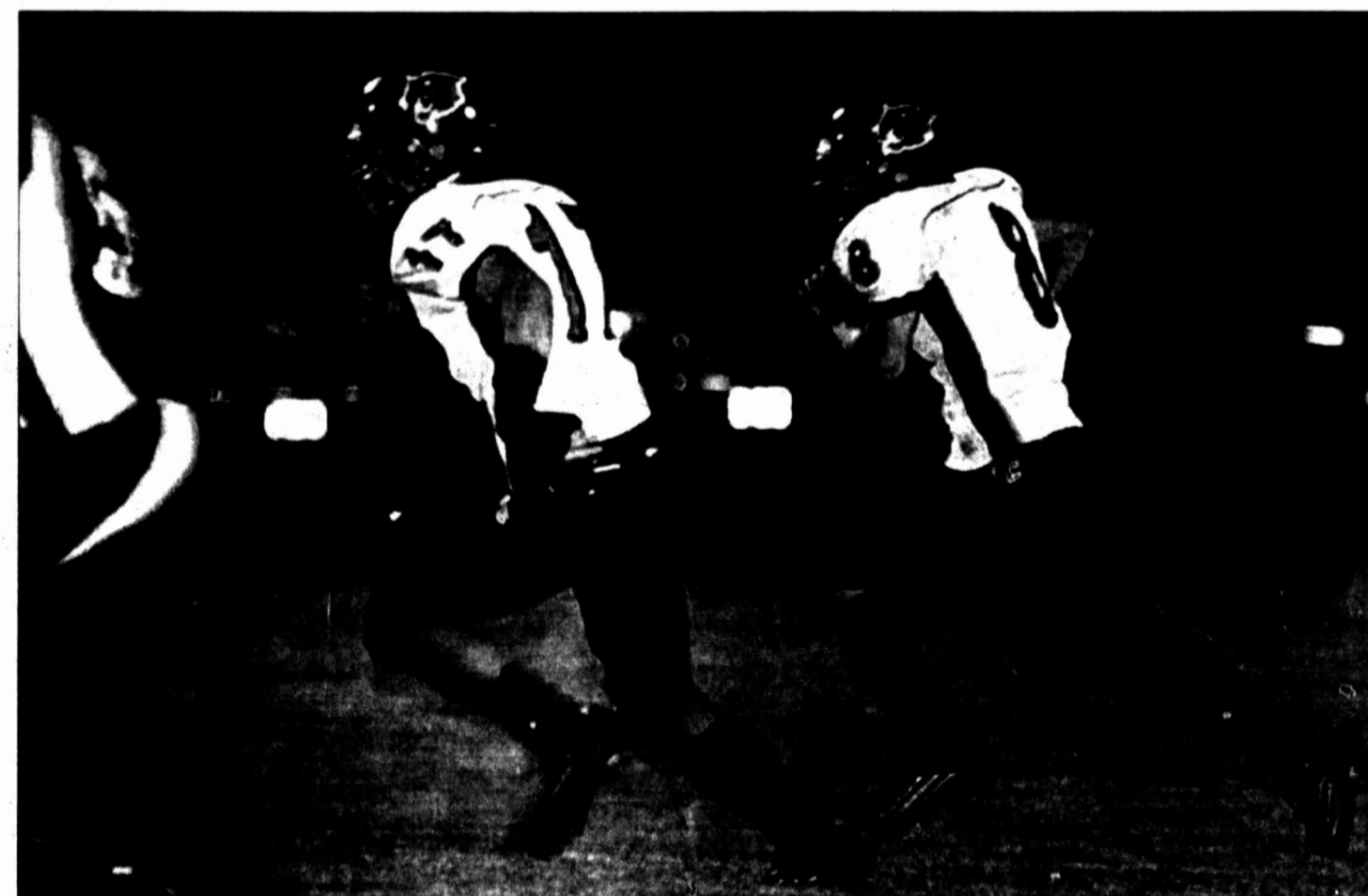

DETROIT — All year long, Jim Leyland kept telling his Detroit Tigers to believe they were winners, even if no one else did.

And now it's come to something that would've been impossible to believe in spring training: The Tigers, the losingest team in the majors over the last 13 years, are one win away from the World Series.

Kenny Rogers pitched the game of his life for the second straight week and the Tigers backed him

with their bats, gloves and legs, beating the Athletics 3-0 on a frosty Friday for a 3-0 lead in the AL championship series.

A victory Saturday and the Tigers can sit back, enjoy the week and wait for the World Series to come to Comerica Park.

"That's our goal. That's what we play for," Rogers said. "I can't say enough for the way the guys played behind me."

Pushing aside two decades of frustration and failure, plus a late-season collapse that threatened to wreck their year, the wild-card Tigers made it look easy. Just like the

1984 club that stormed to the title.

Gone was the embarrassment of 2003, when Detroit dropped 119 games.

"With what we've done now, it feels like that season has finally been wiped off the map," third baseman Brandon Inge said.

Leyland made another lineup hunch pay off in Game 3 as the team that started the year with five straight victories posted its sixth straight playoff win.

The Athletics sense they're up against something special, too.

"We're running into a better team, and they're knocking down everybody in their path," third baseman Eric Chavez said. "It's not frustrating, they're better than we are."

Added slugger Frank Thomas: "That's a whole new team over there right now. That's not the team I've been battling for years."

Putting aside temperatures in the low 40s that forced both teams to put flame-throwing blowers in their dugouts, Rogers shut out the Athletics on two mere singles over 7 1-3 innings.

Cardinals 9, N.Y. Mets 6

NEW YORK — Super subs So Taguchi and Scott Spiezio saved St. Louis on a night when Mets closer Billy Wagner wobbled, allowing the Cardinals to head home with a split in the NL championship series.

Taguchi hit a tiebreaking homer off Billy Wagner leading off a three-run ninth inning, lifting St. Louis to a 9-6 victory Friday night that tied the NL championship series at one game apiece.

NL Cy Young Award winner Chris Carpenter faltered, but the Cardinals tied the game after trailing 3-0 and 4-2, then came back again in the seventh after falling behind 6-4.

During the regular season, Taguchi isn't much of a power threat: He homered just twice in 316 at-bats this year. But he's 2-for-2 with a pair of homers in the postseason, also connecting off San Diego's Scott Linebrink in Game 3 of the first round.

Wagner entered with the score 6-all in the ninth. Taguchi, 0-for-5 against him in his career, worked the count full and, on the ninth pitch of the at-bat, drove the ball over the left-field wall.

"Unbelievable. We were all jumping around down there," Spiezio said. "But he's got a flair for the dramatic. He's a little guy, but he's got a lot of power."

Albert Pujols then singled and scored on a double by Spiezio, whose seventh-inning triple off Guillermo Mota had tied the score. Juan Encarnacion followed with a run-scoring single off Wagner, who had gotten the save in New York's opening 2-0 win Thursday night but was booed when he walked back to the dugout after being removed with two outs.

"They must have fouled

off 60, 70 pitches," Mets manager Willie Randolph said. "We made some bad pitches at the wrong times."

Spiezio, playing because slumping All-Star third baseman Scott Rolen was benched, nearly had a home run in the seventh but right fielder Shawn Green got his glove above the wall, and the ball ricocheted off the thumb of his glove, then hit the top of the fence and bounced back onto the field.

Right field umpire Tim Welke got the initial call right and, after Cardinals manager Tony La Russa came onto the field, the umpires huddled and upheld the decision, which replays showed was correct.

"I was sitting on everything," Spiezio said. "I was trying to shorten my swing even more."

Arnold Palmer gives up competitive golf

SPRING — An aching back and too many bad shots finally convinced Arnold Palmer to end his competitive career.

Palmer withdrew after playing only four holes of the Administrist Small Business Classic on Friday, then told his loyal fans at the end of the round that he was retiring from tournament play.

Palmer made the tearful announcement with a large group of "Arnie's Army" huddled around.

"I made every move in the bag today to make a good shot and I wasn't very successful," Palmer said. "That's not surprising. It just didn't come today. It's been working its way into my repertoire. It's tough and it's emotional for me because it's my life."

Palmer, 77, has played less frequently in recent years. He had played in only one other Champions Tour event this year. He hit two balls into the water on the par 4, 440-yard No. 4 hole Friday, playing in a three-some with Lee Trevino and John Mahaffey.

He played the rest of the round but did not keep score.

"I've been doing this for a long time and, first of all, to stand out there and not be able to make something happen is very traumatic in my mind," Palmer said. "The people, they all want to see a good shot and you know it and you can't give them that good shot. That's when it's time."

Palmer played his final PGA Tour event at the 2004 Masters, a record 50th consecutive start at Augusta National. His first victory at the Masters in 1958 is where "Arnie's Army" was created, a time when television began to take an interest in golf and had the charismatic Palmer to bring the masses to the game.

Known universally in golf as "The King," Palmer joined the PGA Tour in 1955 and won the Canadian Open that year for his first professional victory. He won the last of his 62 PGA Tour titles in the 1973 Bob Hope Classic, and he last won a Champions Tour event in 1988 at the Crestar Classic. He's fourth on the PGA Tour victory list with 62, won 10 times on the 50-and-over tour — including five majors — and also won the 1954 U.S. Amateur.

Palmer did not play his first Champions Tour event this year until last month outside Baltimore. He continued to play the Administrist Small Business Classic because of a relationship with the company.

Palmer said he would play in some charity events, but now there are no more thoughts of tournament golf.

Palmer said he would spend more time with his other business pursuits.

"It isn't that I'm not busy," Palmer said.

"I've got a lot to do. I'm going to concentrate on building golf courses now and really spend a lot of time doing that. I've got quite a few on the books ready to go. That's going to be my next major passion."

Trevino grabbed Palmer's ball after the final hole and asked him to sign the ball and Palmer's glove.

"When he putted out, I

grabbed the ball and I had the Sharpie in my back pocket and then while he had the Sharpie, I said sign that glove too," Trevino said. "We didn't take his shoes."

Trevino knew early in the round that Palmer was having trouble playing.

"After the third hole he was ready to throw it in," Trevino said. "I said, 'I'll get a cart, you don't have to play.' He said, 'No I can't go. I can't leave, but please don't put a score down.'"

Palmer said he finished the round because he owed it to his fans, a trait that followed Palmer throughout his Hall of Fame career.

"My toenails were aching," Palmer said. "I took a bunch of pills and I made it and I feel fine now. I'm still aching. I'm glad I did the 18 holes. I sat down a couple of times and I wasn't sure I'd get back up."

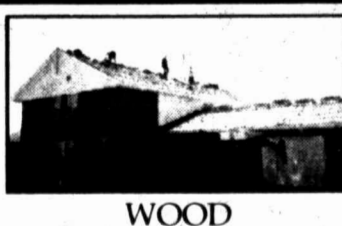

Owens blasts coach

DALLAS — Terrell Owens is done talking to his position coach. T.O. said on his radio show Friday that his relationship with Dallas Cowboys receivers coach Todd Haley was ruined by a blowup this week. It began when Owens missed the start of Wednesday's practice because of an upset stomach, and Haley berated him for being late. Owens held his tongue then, but they later argued during a meeting.

The story getting out seems to bother Owens the most because Haley vowed since training camp that all internal matters would stay behind closed doors. Owens spoke with reporters for 45 minutes Wednesday without ever mentioning any problems with Haley. But the incident was reported by several media outlets Friday before Owens gave his side of the story later on his weekly show.

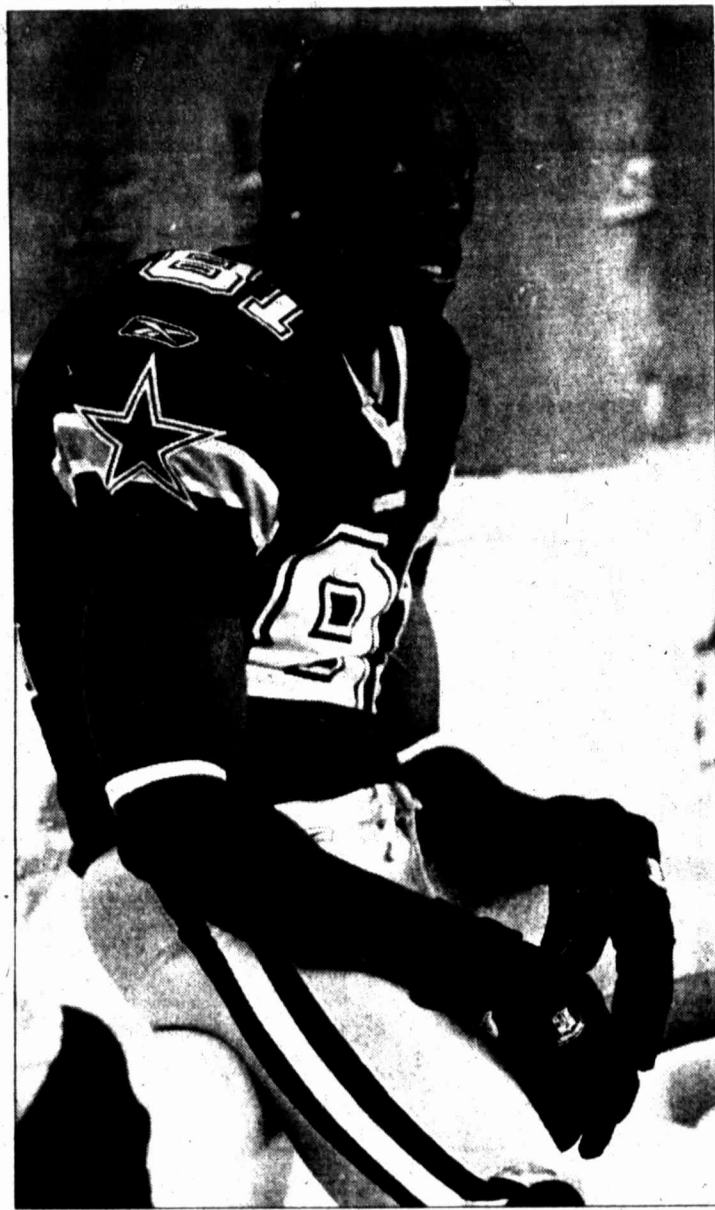
From now on, T.O. said, "there will be nothing else, no other dialogue" between him and Haley.

"There will be no more friendly nothing because I don't trust anybody like that," Owens said. "I will go out and practice hard. I will respect him as a coach, and he should respect me as a player. Anything outside of that I am not going to be able to deal with."

"Right now, we are merely co-workers, and that's it," he added.

Owens caught only three passes for 45 yards in a loss to Philadelphia on Sunday. It was a key division game for the Cowboys and a personal revenge game for Owens after the Eagles dumped him midway through last season.

TV cameras showed Owens screaming at Haley — who also carries

the title "passing game coordinator" — on the sideline during the game. Although teammates said some of his rants were encouragement, Owens admitted saying, "Why am I here?" about his limited action. Coach Bill Parcells later noted that 13 balls were thrown to Owens, five more than anyone else; two were intercepted and one was dropped.

The confrontation between receiver and coach occurred Wednesday, the first time the Cowboys were back on the practice field. A strength coach was sent to get Owens when he was absent.

"By the time I step on the field, Todd starts cursing at me, this and that, and I'm like, 'Dude, I was in the restroom,'" Owens said. "He said, 'I don't (care) what you were doing. Everybody else is out here.'"

Owens said he didn't respond, although he

later apologized to Parcells and was told, "All right, just try to get out here a little earlier." Then Owens and Haley butted heads during a meeting.

Dallas-Houston: A no-hype affair

IRVING (AP) — The last time the Dallas Cowboys and Houston Texans squared off, it was quite a shindig.

The Texans made their NFL debut that night in a game Houstonians had anticipated for years, ever since the Oilers packed up and left.

And it turned out to be a game that neither club can forget.

For the Texans, getting off to a 1-0 start at the expense of their in-state


rival remains their greatest accomplishment. For the Cowboys, losing to an expansion team making its debut remains the low point in their long, proud history.

Four years later, the teams finally meet again Sunday at Texas Stadium. And while it would make for a nice story to say Dallas is eager to avenge the 19-10 loss in the 2002 opener, it would hardly be true.

The Cowboys have only

four players and two assistant coaches left who were part of that debacle. Plus, the big story this week has remained Dallas' loss at Philadelphia last Sunday, overshadowing pretty much any talk of the Texans.

The rematch hasn't generated any of the hype the first one did. Beer companies haven't built ad campaigns about a "Battle of Texas" and the mayors haven't made a bet.

There's thrills, and more than a few chills, but junior cowboys and cowgirls find life on the rodeo circuit to their liking

There aren't any Brahma bulls or buckin' broncs, but several area youngsters have found there's still plenty of thrills to be found on the junior rodeo circuit.

The youth, who range in age from 8 to 16, all participate in the West Texas Rodeo Association, which sponsors more than 20 events a year.

At these rodeos, the junior cowgirls and cowboys hone their skills in events such as barrel racing, pole bending, goat tying and calf roping. And while the competitions may not have the notoriety of professional rodeos, the thrill of competition is the same, regardless of age or size.

"I thought my heart was going to come out of my chest," said 12-year-old Lacy McMurtrey, recalling her first competition. "And my horse was very, very nervous, too."

Kaley Duncan, 11, also recalls some nervous moments involved with her first rodeo.

"I was so scared that I couldn't keep my reins still," she said. "I couldn't hear anything. I was so focused, I couldn't even hear the sounds of my horse's hooves."

But before you get the impression that there's nothing but fear and loathing on the junior rodeo circuit, understand that the Western way of life suits these kids just fine.

"I've always been riding horses," said 8-year-old Anne-Marie Lugo. "My favorite thing is just being with my horse."

Anne-Marie may be one of the smallest competitors on the circuit, but she's already one of the more accomplished riders. She has already captured several first place awards at events on the circuit.

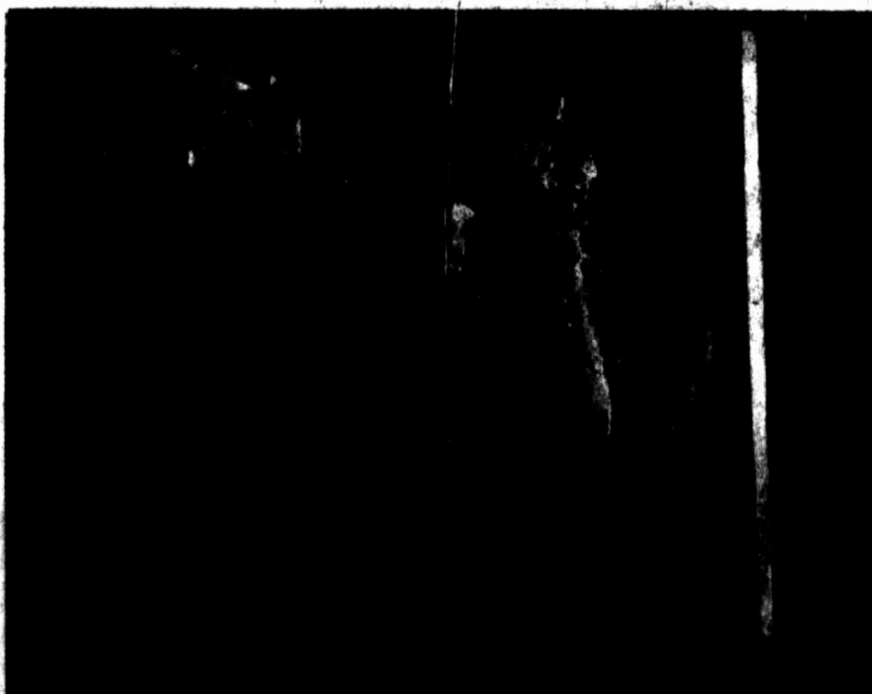
"She's won belt buckles, horse tacks and money," supporter Gloria McDonald said of Lugo. "For 8 years old, that's not bad."

And it's a life they are more than happy to continue.

Anne-Marie and has dreams of riding in the professional circuit, while Lacy wants to go into the horse-breeding business someday.

Kaley, meanwhile, has a high-profile goal of her own — and of course, it involves being on horseback.

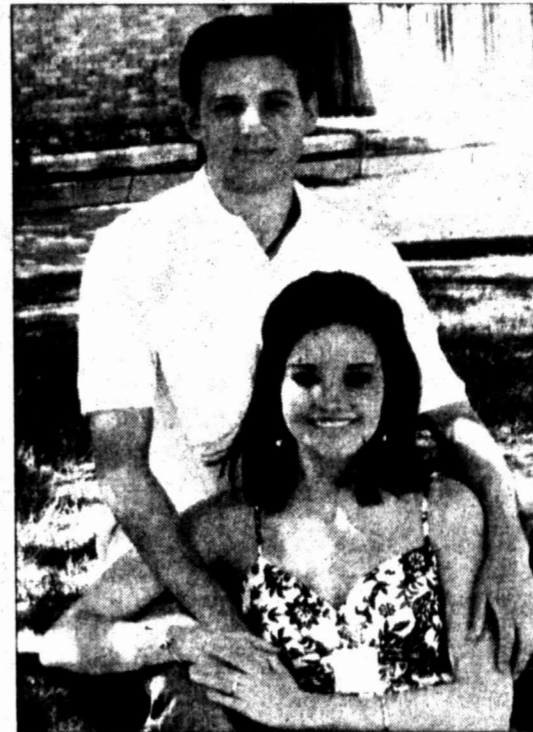

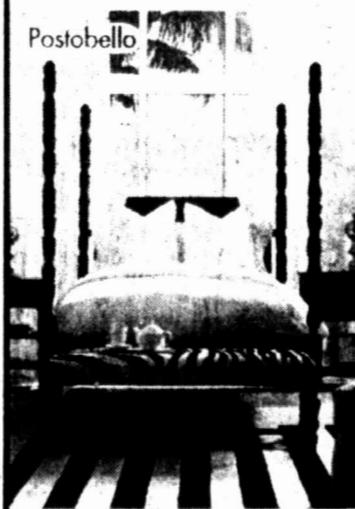

Nokia to close Fort Worth plant

□ Will begin laying off 300 employees starting Dec. 10.

FORT WORTH (AP) — Nokia Corp. will close a facility that repaired and distributed cellular phones and lay off 300 of the plant's 450 workers, ending the company's U.S. production. Nokia spokesman Charles Chopp said Friday that the lay-

offs will start Dec. 10 and continue through the first quarter of next year. He said about 150 transition and management employees will move to the Dallas suburb of Irving, where the Finnish phone giant has its U.S. headquarters.

Chopp said the plant will be put up for sale next spring.

Employment at the plant has been sliding since Nokia opened a factory in Reynoso,

Mexico, just across the Rio Grande from McAllen.

Chopp said the Fort Worth plant is currently used to repair phones for customers in North America and to take quick-fill orders.

Nokia will send its repair work to a Jabil factory in Mexico and will use another supplier, whom it won't identify, to handle quick-fill orders, he said.

Nokia began making phones in the Dallas-Fort Worth area in 1992 in a joint venture with the predecessor of RadioShack Corp.

Three years later, Nokia opened the plant in Fort Worth's Alliance Airport industrial park, and the plant had 3,800 workers there in 2000 before Nokia built a plant in Mexico. Nokia's tax incentives to build the plant expired last

year. Chopp said the 447,000-square-foot plant and surrounding 60 acres was too big to keep a work force of 450. He said it will cost less to close the facility and send the work to other companies.

Nokia will manufacture all its phones for North America at the plant in Reynoso, he said. Nokia has nine other manufacturing plants in eight countries.

You might want to think twice about taking on a second job

DALLAS — For many people, the solution to their financial troubles is to make more money.

Many see taking on a second job to get them there. But experts say taking that second job deserves careful consideration.

"The question is, what kind of jobs can you get, and what is it going to take out of you in terms of the effort you have to put in for the earnings?" said Alan Goldfarb, a certified financial planner and director of financial strategies at Weaver and Tidwell Financial Advisors in Dallas.

Before looking for a second job, Goldfarb says check with your employer about its policy on its workers taking another job.

"Make sure it doesn't interfere with your (primary job)," Goldfarb said. "There are

Have clearly defined goals for the extra money you'll be earning, and determine how much time an extra job will take away from your family. Make sure you have time to rest and recharge.

some employers that have restrictions."

Other experts say you shouldn't tell your employer about working a second job.

"It's something that needs to be kept confidential just to be safe," said John Challenger, chief executive of Challenger, Gray & Christmas, a Chicago outplacement firm. "It could interfere with your ability to get bonuses or in your stability in the first job if they find out. They might think of you

differently in terms of promotion if you were just giving them nine to five if you had to go to a second job."

If you decide to seek a second job, try to stay in your field because you have a greater chance of being paid more.

"You have skills and experience in a particular field that make you valuable," Challenger said.

It will also make things easier because you won't have a steep learning curve as you would if you entered a whole different field.

That's the way Richard Byron figured it.

Byron, 61, owns Computer Reset in Dallas, which sells used computers.

About five years ago he decided to supplement his income by expanding his market to eBay, the online auctioneer.

"The primary local sales just wasn't doing it, so eBay, as a second source of income,

has certainly helped out," said Byron, who has four employees. "I picked eBay because it would give us a worldwide market. There just wasn't enough economic reward just sticking to the Dallas market."

He isn't alone in using eBay as a source of secondary income.

According to ACNielsen International Research, more than 1.3 million people worldwide are making a primary or secondary income on eBay. In the Dallas area, more than 55,000 residents use eBay sales as a primary or second source of income, according to ACNielsen.

"The biggest advantage is there's an incredibly low cost of entry, so you don't have to make an enormous cost of investment in business in order to get up and running," said Jim "Griff" Griffith, eBay's dean of education.

Research focuses on turning mesquites into fuel

LOCKETT — Large clouds of dust filled the air as the bulky machine lumbered down the field, gobbling up every mesquite tree in its path.

Farmers and ranchers smiled as they watched their pesky nemesis being devoured, but they grinned as well about the possibility of turning that thorny tree into future fuel.

North Texas mesquite could soon get your motor running.

The Texas A&M Agricultural Research and Extension Center in Lockett is working on a project dubbed the "Mesquite Alternative Fuel Project," which will study the feasibility of harvesting mesquite and turning it into cellulosic ethanol.

"The whole program is developed to try to use the mesquite that nobody wants," said Jim Ansley,

professor and the rangeland ecologist who is overseeing the project.

Leaders in the renewable energy industry are casting covetous eyes on all sorts of plant matter to use in making this type of fuel. Ethanol made from corn is already used in regular gasoline like breadcrumbs in meatloaf. About 10 percent can be blended into regular gasoline, making it go farther.

Cellulosic ethanol is ethanol made out of any other kinds of plant mat-

ter than corn: rice hulls, willow, wheat straw, cotton gin trash, construction waste and more, experts said. All plant matter contains cellulose.

"You can go nuts. You could put 200 things on the list," said Arnold R. Klann, chief executive officer of California-based BlueFire Ethanol Inc.

But one of the top things on the list in Texas is mesquite, often a nuisance plant. And North Texas has plenty of it, Ansley said.

The plant is perfect for harvesting because of its high regrowth rate. Mesquite also tends to grow on flatter sites, which are easier to harvest, he said.

"The program is the ultimate sustainable resource," Ansley said. "It could potentially provide some economic benefit to rural areas."

The Wilbarger County extension site is currently in the "inception phase" of building and experimenting with the machin-

ery needed to cut and collect mesquite for fuel production.

Ansley's staff cranked up both cutting machine and harvester prototypes to showcase the possible technology to attendees at the recent 2006 Range and Wildlife Field Day, sponsored by the extension center.

Rancher Macon Boddy of Henrietta said the mesquite project looks promising. "We're all

looking for alternative uses for our land," he said. "If you made your brush work pay its own way (by harvesting the mesquite for fuel), that would be an incredible benefit."

Texas has 52 million acres of mesquite trees, said Montey Sneed, a marketing executive for Pearson Bioenergy Inc. of Aberdeen, Miss., and founder of Texas Ethanol Co. Sneed, of Vernon, sees mesquite as a renewable "feedstock" to make ethanol. Cutting a mesquite tree down agitates it, and it

grows back fiercely. It's renewable at least every 10 years, and it's one of the hardest woods out there — a plus for a bio-fuel feedstock. Pearson's process can turn a ton of "waste biomass" into 214 gallons of ethanol, Sneed said. The company has a proprietary method that turns biomass into gas in the

first stage. In the second stage, the gas is converted to ethanol. Several methods of converting plant matter into ethanol are out there, said Carol Werner, executive director of the Washington, D.C.-based Environmental and Energy Study Institute.

Consider your venture a business, not just a way to earn extra money.

"Whether you like it or not, if you're selling with some regularity, you are a business," Griffith said. "You have to admit to that and think, 'I'm going to run this as a part-time business in a very low volume. You'll be more effective in planning how you will grow your business, how much you will raise as a supplemental income.'"

If you don't want to stay in your field to earn extra money, look to an outside interest.

"Where is your best utility?" said Mark McClanahan, a certified financial planner at Baker Financial Services

in Arlington. "What other type of interest do you have that you can channel into making income?"

Beware of the income tax implications of taking a second job.

Your combined income from two jobs may throw you into a higher tax bracket.

"You may need to reduce the number of exemptions you're claiming or take more money out for taxes in the second job or you may be underwithheld, and you'll wind up with a big tax bill," said James A. Smith, a certified public accountant at Smith, Jackson, Boyer & Bovard in Dallas.

What's more, if you and your spouse file a joint tax return, the income from your two jobs, plus your spouse's income, could throw you into an even higher tax bracket, he said.

"If the second job is contract labor, then you will have to make estimated tax payments on that income if it's not withheld, or you can increase your withholding from your primary job," Smith said.

There's another issue for joint filers.

If you or your spouse had more than one employer and total wages of more than \$90,000, too much Social Security tax may have been withheld.

A higher income can also limit your tax breaks. Many tax breaks start to phase out as income rises.

Some notes for retirees: — If you're drawing Social Security benefits and get a job, it could reduce your benefits.

If you're under full retirement age—which varies, depending on when you were born—for the entire year, the government will deduct \$1 from your benefit payments for every \$2 you earn above the annual limit, which is \$12,480 for this year.

In the year you reach full retirement age, the government will deduct \$1 in benefits for every \$3 you earn above a different limit, but it only counts earnings before the month you reach your full retirement age.

If you reach full retirement age this year, the limit on your earnings for the months before full retirement age is \$33,240.

"It makes no sense to me to take Social Security while you're still working because they're going to reduce your benefit," McClanahan said.

— The second issue is taxation of Social Security benefits. If your income is too high, your benefits could be taxed.

"For middle-class America, they're going to have to watch that thresh-





"THE ISSUANCE OF \$10,300,000 OF SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING AND EQUIPPING SCHOOL BUILDINGS OF THE DISTRICT INCLUDING RENOVATING AND EQUIPPING ELEMENTARY AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS AND THE HIGH SCHOOL GYM AND AGRICULTURE SHOP FACILITIES AND RECONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING AND EQUIPPING HIGH SCHOOL CLASSROOMS AND THE HIGH SCHOOL OFFICE AREA AND LIBRARY, AND THE LEVYING OF A TAX IN PAYMENT OF THE BONDS"

Section 4. Representation to Voters.

The Board hereby represents, covenants and agrees that if both Proposition 1 and Proposition 2 are approved by a majority of voters, bonds shall not be issued nor taxes levied pursuant to Proposition 2.

Section 5. Persons Qualified to Vote.

All resident qualified electors of the District shall be eligible to vote at the Election.

Section 6. Election Precincts, Voting Locations and Voting Hours on Election Day.

The election precincts (the "Election Precincts") for the Election shall consist of the territory within the boundaries of the District situated within one or more Howard County election precincts as set forth below. The voting location for voting on Election Day for each Election Precinct shall be as set forth below. On Election Day the polls shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Section 7. Early Voting Locations, Dates and Times.

(a) Early voting by personal appearance shall be held on the dates, at the times and at the locations specified on Exhibit A. (b) Applications for early voting by mail must be received no later than the close of business on Tuesday, October 31, 2006; applications must be directed to the Early Voting Clerk, Saundra Bloom, Howard County Elections Administrator, P.O. Box 1069, Big Spring, Texas 79721. Saundra Bloom is hereby appointed as Early Voting Clerk.

Section 8. Appointment of Elections Administrator and Officers.

Saundra Bloom, the Elections Administrator of Howard County, is hereby appointed Elections Administrator for the District. The Elections Administrator is directed by the District to designate the Early Voting Ballot Board and the Election Judges. Each of the presiding judges shall be authorized to appoint the necessary election clerks to assist in conducting the Election. The President of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to appoint any such other officials not designated herein as are necessary and appropriate to conduct the Election in accordance with the Election Code.

Section 9. Joint Election.

The District shall participate in a joint election with other participating governmental entities in Howard County who are also holding election on Election Day. The Superintendent of the District or his designee, acting on behalf of the Board, is authorized to contract with the Howard County Elections Administrator and Howard County, the City of Big Spring, Texas, or any other governmental entity, for the carrying out of this election by the office of the Howard County Elections Administrator in a joint election with other participating governmental entities in Howard County.

Section 10. Election Materials.

The Election materials enumerated in Secs. 272.001, et. seq., of the Election Code, shall be printed and furnished in both English and

Spanish for use at the voting locations and for early voting, and provisions shall be made for oral assistance to Spanish-speaking voters.

Section 11. Notice of Election.

Notice of the Election shall be given by: (i) publishing a substantial copy of this Order in both English and Spanish one time at least ten (10) but not more than thirty (30) days prior to the Election Day in a newspaper of general circulation in the District, and (ii) by posting, not later than the 21st day before the Election Day, a substantial copy of this Order on the bulletin board used for posting notices of meetings of the District's Board of Trustees. Notice of the Election shall also be provided to the county clerk of Howard County not later than the 50th day before the Election Day.

Section 12. Necessary Actions.

The Superintendent of the District or his designee, acting on behalf of the Board, is authorized to make changes or addition to polling places and election procedures in the event changes are required because of the joint election or become necessary due to circumstances arising after the date of this Order. The President and the Secretary of the Board of Trustees and the Superintendent of the District, in consultation with bond counsel are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Election Code and the Federal Voting Rights Act in carrying out and conducting the Election, whether or not expressly authorized herein.

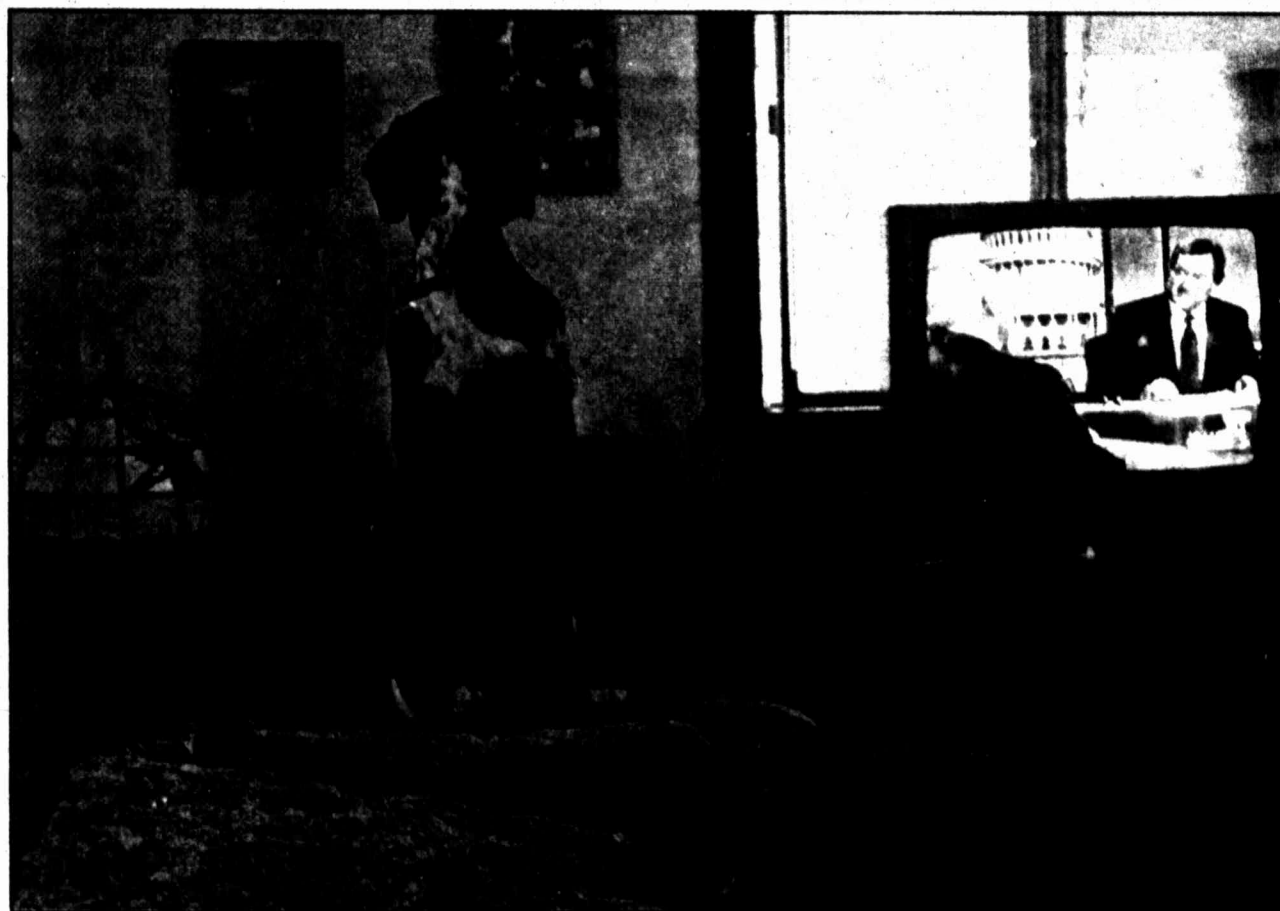

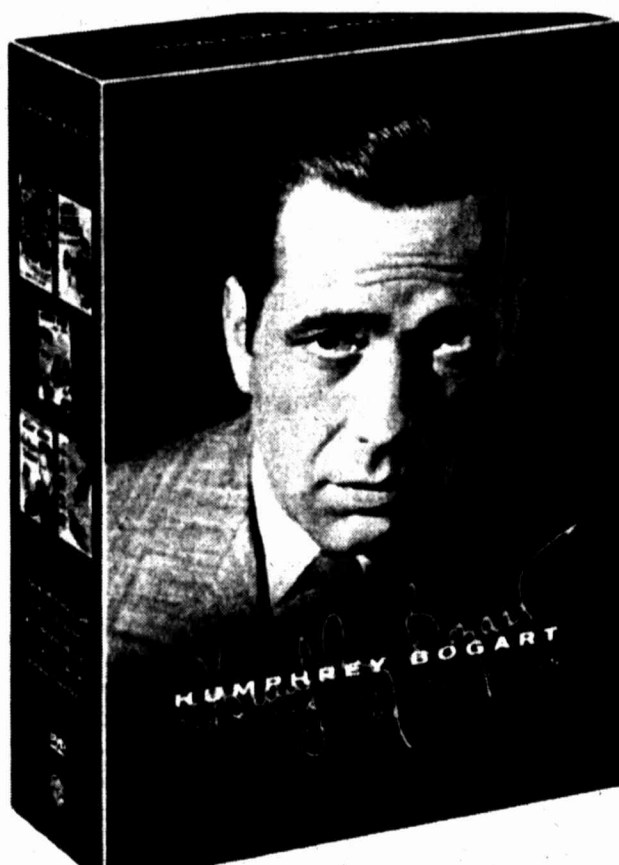

"Humphrey Bogart: The Signature Collection Vol. 2" Boxset

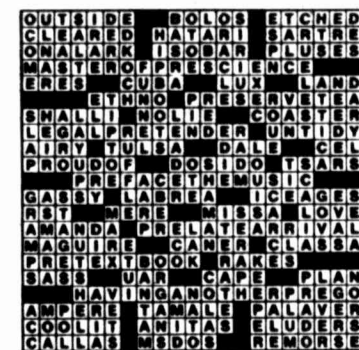
