



More than 2,000 early votes cast so far

With the first week of early voting in this year's general election behind them, local election officials say more ballots have already been cast than during last year's entire early voting period.

According to Sandra Bloom, elections administrator for Howard County, more than

2,000 ballots have been cast in early voting thus far, compared to 1,675 in the 2005 election.

Official vote counts Friday afternoon show 1,800 ballots cast in person, 213 mail-in ballots received and 82 ballots cast at branch voting locations for a total of 2,095.

Bloom said the stream of voters making their way to the early voting polls — located in

the lobby of the Howard County Courthouse — has been steady.

"Monday seemed like it was a lot more hectic than the other four days, but I think that's just because everyone was trying to get into the flow of things," Bloom said Friday. "It's been very steady all week long, and while it may seem like it's slower now than at the beginning of the week, I feel like that's just

Watchful eye to scrutinize local sex offenders

Area sex offenders won't have to look far to find a place to trick-or-treat Tuesday night, as the District Adult Probation Office will once again hold mandatory meetings through the holiday.

Kent Minchew, supervisor for the district office and lead sex offender officer, said approximately 17 convicted sex offenders will gather for a probation meeting at the Howard County Courthouse during traditional trick or treat hours Tuesday.

Minchew said convicted sex offenders from Howard, Glascock and Martin counties will attend required counseling during the evening, and if they don't, they could once again find themselves in hot water with law enforcement.

"Most of these people are eager to comply with the meeting because it not only keeps the public safe, it keeps them safe as well," said Minchew. "They're all for it because they can't be accused of violating their probation because we know where they are and what they're doing."

"If they don't attend, I alert the Big Spring

Police Department or the Howard County Sheriff's Office and have them picked up. If they don't have an officer available, then I'll drive to their home and pick them up. Either way, they have to attend."

Minchew said this will be the second year his office has participated in the Halloween program, which was born from a similar program used in San Angelo.

"In the past, we would just drive to their homes and make sure their porch lights were off and they weren't doing anything to encourage trick-or-treaters," said Minchew. "It is much easier just to have them all at one central location."

DENVER (AP) — Don't feel like standing in line on Election Day? In Denver, you can get a limo ride to the polls if you take advantage of early voting Saturday.

Fearing that new voting machines, new voting centers and a ballot full of measures could create gridlock Nov. 7, a coalition of advocacy groups is offering door-to-door service to the city's six new voting centers.

"We're expecting a lot of confusion, voter fatigue and, because of the long ballot, we're expecting long lines on Election Day," Lindsey Hodel, a spokeswoman for the limo effort, said Friday.

Two repeat offenders receive prison terms

Two repeat offenders were sentenced to prison terms in trials held this week in 118th District Court in Big Spring.

Edward Lee Hurrington, 52, and Javier Francisco Casillas, 41, both of Big Spring, received sentences totaling 26 years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice after being found guilty of their respective felony offenses this week, District Attorney Hardy L. Wilkerson said.

Hurrington was sentenced to 16 years in state prison after being found guilty on two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Because of previous convictions, his charges were enhanced to second-degree felonies, which carried possible punishment of up to 20 years in prison.

Testimony in his trial showed that Hurrington was the driver of a vehicle that was stopped by sheriff's deputies on Feb. 3. A subsequent search of the vehicle found 1.1 grams of crack cocaine and assorted drug para-

phernalia. Ten days later, the vehicle he was driving was again stopped after making an illegal turn on FM 700.

This time, a search of the vehicle found about a half-gram of crack cocaine and drug paraphernalia.

Casillas pleaded guilty to the charge of evading arrest at the start of his trial Wednesday and was subsequently sentenced to 10 years in state prison. His enhanced offense carried a possible punishment of up to 20 years in prison, authorities said.

Court testimony showed that two local police officers attempted to stop Casillas' vehicle early in May.

Instead, Casillas fled from the officers, leading them in a high-speed chase across town.

"The guy was tearing through town in the middle of the day and created a really dangerous situation in a residential area," Wilkerson said.

Abuse victims need to know help's available

As we wind down the month of October, closing out the observance of National Domestic Violence Awareness Month for another year, it's important to remember that domestic violence occurs throughout the year and it's important to let victims know help is always available.

Perhaps one of the most troubling facts about domestic violence is how often the victim doesn't realize they're actually in an abusive relationship. Time and time again, professionals working with abuse victims say their clients often spend years in denial about their situation.

While some consider the topic of domestic abuse uncomfortable to think about, much less discuss, it's something our community must care greatly about, because domestic violence is a problem in our community, just as it is in every community. And sadly, it all too often is a problem that seems to be passed on from generation to generation.

The cycle can be broken, however, and our community has resources to help those who find themselves in jeopardy. That's where the staff and volunteers of our local Victim Services office come in.

Victim Services Executive Director Shann Smith says it is vitally important that women know the "15 Warning Signs of an Abusive Relationship." They are:

- Pushing for quick involvement: Coming on very strong, "I've never loved anyone like this before."
- Jealousy: Excessively possessive, calling constantly, visiting unexpectedly.
- Controlling: Interrogate you on your whereabouts or who you've talked to, checks mileage on your car, keeps control of the money or insists you get permission to go anywhere.
- Isolation: Tries to limit your contact with family and friends, deprives you of a phone or car, may insist that you quit your job or prevents you from working.
- Verbal abuse: Constantly criticizes you or says things that hurt your feelings.
- Threats of violence: "I'll break your neck," then later says things like, "I didn't really mean it. I was just kidding."
- Blames others for mistakes: It is always someone else's fault when things go wrong.
- Sudden mood swings: In a matter of minutes goes from loving and affectionate to explosively violent.
- Makes everyone else responsible for his feelings: "You make me angry. You hurt me when you don't do what I tell you. If you had just done what I said, I would not have had to hit you."
- Hypersensitive: Carries on about injustices of every day life.
- Playful use of force during sex: Enjoys throwing you down or holding you down against your will during sex.
- Rigid sex roles: "Serve, honor and obey."
- Unrealistic expectations: Expects you to be perfect and meet their every need.
- Past battering: Admits to hitting partners in the past but justifies the abuse.
- Cruelty to animals and children: Punishes or kills animals. Expects children to do things beyond their ability or teases them until they cry.

A combination of three or more of those 15 behaviors could indicate a potential batterer. We here at the Herald encourage those who see warning signs in their relationships to contact Victim Services by calling 263-3312. The agency's staff and volunteers are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

Please, please, please get the help you need. Your life could depend on it.

A few observations on election

I have to admit that the bond issues before voters in this year's election have drawn a lot of my attention. However, the same can be said of several of the political races we as voters are going to decide.

And while I'll admit most Republicans at the national and state level have done their best to turn me into a "Yellow-Dog Democrat," I simply can't be one. It was also easy to make my choice in the U.S. Senate race where incumbent Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison will get my vote.

I remember all too well how Hutchison worked for our community's interest when the Veterans Administration CARES process seemed to be threatening the existence of the VA Medical Center here in Big Spring.

As a matter of fact, Hutchison was my choice to be governor as much as two years ago. There's no question in my mind that she'd be a statesman — something that's almost disappeared in

Austin these days — but I understand her belief that she can do more for Texas as our senior senator.

My most difficult in all of the races, I must admit, has been that for the 19th Congressional District seat between incumbent Republican Randy Neugebauer and Democratic challenger Robert Ricketts.

I consider Neugebauer a personal friend and voted for him when he was first elected to fill an unexpired term. And, like Hutchison, I can't forget how hard he worked to protect our interest during the CARES process.

However, he has voted almost in lock step with President Bush and the House GOP leadership that included Tom DeLay. Among those votes have been our nation's continuing fiasco in Iraq and the House's nothing short of Draconian views for solving illegal immigration.

So, I'm afraid Ricketts is my choice.

Turning to the local scene... I am a resident of Precinct 2, which means I'm getting a chance to choose between incumbent Republican Commissioner Jerry Kilgore and independent write-in candidate Erven Fisher. This one is a no-brainer, as far as I'm concerned. While I have not always agreed with Kilgore, I knew I couldn't even consider Fisher's candidacy when he announced that as far as he was concerned there was "only one issue — the jail."

And that, of course, brings me to the hottest local topic — the bond issues.

Simply put, I'm for them — all of them.

While I do not live in the Coahoma school district, I have made many a visit to those schools and there's no question in my mind that improvements which would be provided by

that \$10.3 million issue are desperately needed.

I also plan to vote for both bond issues proposed by the city of Big Spring — \$9.2 million for street and roadway improvements and a little more than \$5 million for additions and improvements to the city's parks and sports facilities.

It has been somewhat interesting that the uproar over the \$10.2 million bond issue to provide for construction of a new county jail has seemingly left those other bond issues "off the radar." We've only gotten one letter concerning the Coahoma bond election this fall and not a single one concerning the city's proposed bond issues.

To be honest, I personally think most of the rhetoric surrounding the jail bond has been little more than nonsense opinions represented as fact, plenty of fuzzy math and a ton of half-truths.

What I'm certain about, however, is that Howard

County needs a new jail. The Texas Jail Standards Commission, regardless of what anyone wants to think, can force us to close our existing jail. It does have that authority. It cannot tell us how big a jail to build ... can't force us to have one at all. But it has recommended that if we do decide to build a new jail, it should have a capacity of 144 beds.

They are the experts. I tend to take more stock in their recommendation than anyone else's.

Yes, there's not much question that those of us here in Big Spring will soon be faced with the need to decide on bond issues to improve our schools and our college, as well.

That's the price of progress and it's obviously something we've

avoided for quite some time. That's why we face all these needs at virtually the same time.

Improvements, and in some case, replacements should have been made years ago, but we weren't willing to pay the price.

Now those costs have increased — approximately \$2 million during the past 10 years or so where the jail is concerned.

It's time we do the responsible thing.

To my way of thinking, trying to get by as cheaply as possible is neither responsible, nor progressive.

It's just cheap.

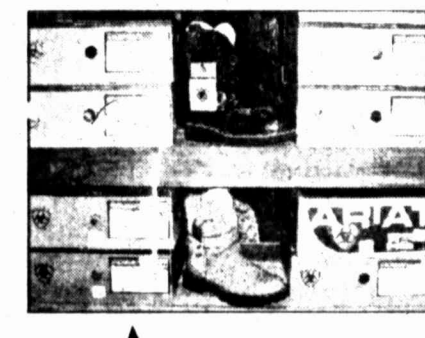

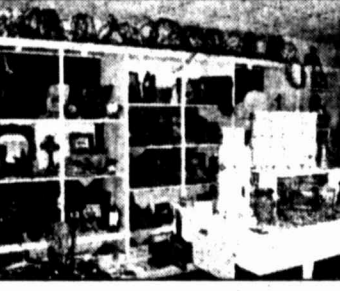

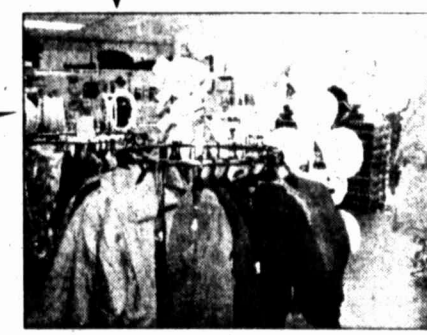

What might at first seem to have been a brilliantly played hand may not, on further analysis, have been anything more than the exercise of plain common sense.
Take this case where South was in four spades and the defense started with three rounds of hearts. Declarer ruffed the third heart with dummy's nine and cashed the K-Q of trumps, discovering to his horror that West had two seemingly certain trump tricks. Furthermore, he had a club loser to worry about.
But South made the contract despite his five losers, and it all came about in a perfectly reasonable way. He played four rounds of diamonds ending in his hand, leaving this position with South needing to win three of the last four tricks:
North ♦A Q J 5
West ♦J 8 6 ♠2
East ♥10 ♠K 8 7
South ♦A 10 ♠10 9
South realized from the earlier plays that West had started with five spades, three hearts and four diamonds, marking him with precisely one club. So, when he led a club and West followed with the deuce — known to be West's only club — South went up with the ace and returned a club from dummy. East played the king, but West was forced to ruff his partner's trick and return a trump into South's A-10! Declarer thus telescoped three losers into one, and so made the contract.

notice. I was a little disappointed when he resorted to "scare tactics" to sell his opinion.

There is no doubt that a new correctional facility is needed to house the people who refuse to abide by the same laws that most of us do. Where to build it, the size of the facility, the safety issues all need to be considered.

Sheriff Walker can give you numbers all day long to support what is needed, but most of us know that numbers can be manipulated, so that doesn't help much.

There is at least one other alternative that should be considered, but Sheriff Walker and the proponents of the \$10 million jail have neglected to share this with the average citizen. The sheriff has known of this option from day one.

I recall some information that Sheriff Walker shared with me in December 2000 when he had just returned from New Sheriff Training at the Texas Department of Public Safety Academy in Austin. I cannot quote the conversation verbatim, but the sheriff was told by instructors that private organizations would be willing to come into Howard County, build a correctional facility, operate that facility and lease space to Howard County for incarcerating prisoners. These same instructors also told the new sheriffs to fight this idea because the sheriffs would give up some of their powers if this happens.

Jones County has just entered into contract with a private organization to furnish and operate a new correctional facility. Property owners in Anson, Hamlin, Stamford and Hawley are elated that their taxes won't have to be raised to build a new jail. This also takes care of the concern that money would not be spent in Howard County since

the people staffing the facility will live in or close to Big Spring.

Mr. Wood, while speaking for the sheriff, should probably be more in tune with the sheriff's views. I am pretty sure Sheriff Walker would not refer to anyone who is against the \$10 million bond election as stupid. He has enough political understanding to know how many votes it might cost him in his next re-election bid.

Incidentally, Mr. Wood owns no property in Howard County and will not be affected by any increase in property taxes, but as a registered voter, does have the right to express his opinion.

I urge every eligible voter to go to the polls their opinion about the \$10 million bond on the election ballot. If you do not vote, you are saying, "Whatever others decided is all right with me." You also give up the right to complain about the decisions made by the ones who do vote.

I beg all Texas voters to take a minute to read the following: Interstate 35 serves the heartland of America, connecting South Texas to northern Minnesota. Starting in Laredo, it passes through San Antonio, Austin, Dallas/Fort Worth, Oklahoma City, Wichita, Kansas City, Des Moines and Minneapolis/St. Paul before culmination in Duluth, Minn.

Proponents of the Interstate 35 Corridor refer to it as the "real" NAFTA (North American Free Trade Agreement) highway. Texas has no intentions of abandoning Interstate 35 in its present location. We already have plans in place for years to come that will widen, upgrade, improve and maintain I-35, and we have the right of way to do so.

I truly believe the Trans-Texas Corridor is the largest, most corrupt

embarrassment this state has ever seen. If constructed, it would take over half a million acres away from the state, cost more than \$1.5 billion to build and then hand all that over to a foreign government to operate as it sees fit for 50 years.

Virgil Goode Jr. (R-VA) has introduced House Concurrent Resolution 487 in the 109th Congress. Rep. Ron Paul (R-TX) is a co-author of that resolution.

Texas is a huge state. There are many that believe the Trans-Texas Corridor (if built) will have no impact on them. The cost alone is staggering, but please evaluate the grave implications of the loss of this much land when our future critically depends on being able to grow renewable fuel.

Two-year-old shot in May drive-by dies

ARLINGTON (AP) — A 2-year-old who was injured during a May drive-by shooting as she slept with her mother and siblings in a front bedroom of their Arlington home has died.

Daisy Prado, who was shot in the head during the drive-by, died Friday afternoon at Cook Children's Medical Center in Fort Worth.

Her grandmother, Obdulia Prado, said that the toddler had been in a vegetative state since the shooting but opened her eyes before she died.

"She waited to see us one last time before she went," Obdulia Prado said. "Me, my son and her mother were rushing to the hospital to see her, and she opened her eyes, and saw us one last time. It was like she was waiting for us. As soon as she opened her eyes and saw us, she died."

Ely Adrianna Almandariz, 20; Henry Noel Gabrillo, 25; and Pedro Ariel Lucio, 25; are accused of firing numerous rounds from a handgun into the family's home. Each is being held in the Tarrant County jail in lieu of \$250,000 bail on one count of injury to a child.

The three could face harsher charges, said Lt. Blake Miller, an Arlington police spokesman.

"Arlington homicide detectives are in contact with the Tarrant County District Attorney's office about changing one of the charges to capital murder since Daisy is a child under the age of 6," Miller said in a press release.

Daisy, her mother, 20-year-old Christina Arrendondo, and two siblings were asleep when the shots were fired into the bedroom, shattering a window.

Daisy's 1-year-old brother, Jesse Prado Jr., was wounded in the arm but has recovered. Their sibling, 3-year-old Alexis Prado, and mother were not injured, Miller said.

Shortly before the shooting, the children's father, Jesus "Jesse" Prado, had gotten into an argument with three people at a Dallas nightclub. The three suspects, who live near the Prado home in Arlington, threatened revenge, police said.

The suspects were stopped about a mile from the shooting and a handgun was found inside the car, police said. The suspects and Daisy's father had been involved in a feud, Miller said.

Conroe hiker dies in Big Bend National Park

BIG BEND (AP) — A 71-year-old hiker from Conroe died of dehydration while being evacuated from Big Bend National Park, officials said.

A search for Carl Springer began after a routine check found the man hadn't returned from a hike along the Outer Mountain Loop Trail.

He was found Oct. 23 after a two-day search and was "alert and oriented, but too weak to stand," according to a news release from the National Park Service.

Springer was treated near the trail, but died on the way to meet an emergency helicopter.

"We are truly saddened by this tragic death and offer our condolences to Mr. Springer's family," said Brad Traver, acting park superintendent, said in the news release.

Nuclear reactor shut down

GLEN ROSE (AP) — TXU Corp. shut down the Comanche Peak 2 nuclear reactor early Friday after a problem came up with the system that provides water to the steam turbines, said a spokeswoman for the company.

The unit had already been down for scheduled maintenance and they were in the process of bringing it back online — ahead of schedule — when they discovered the issue with the feedwater system, said spokeswoman Kim Morgan.

She said that on Friday they were doing some testing and she anticipates it being fully operational early next week.

The reactor is located near Glen Rose, 75 miles southwest of Dallas.

Deputies say couple bit, beat children

AUSTIN (AP) — A Hays County couple was arrested on felony child abuse charges after authorities said they found their three apparently malnourished children with broken bones and bite marks.

Cesar Mojica, 22, and Sara Hernandez Amaya, 21, were charged Wednesday with first-degree injury to a

child. Mojica and Amaya, who is pregnant, were held on \$150,000 bail at the Hays County Jail. Additional charges might be filed, sheriff's officials said.

The children were taken to a hospital. According to court records, the children had healed and partially healed fractures and bite marks, and they appeared malnourished.

Two-year-old Amber Amaya had eight to 10 healed fractures on her ribs and breaks in both femurs. Her body was covered with bite marks from children and adults.

Her twin brother, Cesar Mojica Jr., had numerous healing rib fractures, a femur fracture and other fractures in his legs and hands. His back was covered with bruises and bite marks.

Three-year-old Angel Amaya told investigators bite marks on her body were from her father and that he had hit her with a stick, although she initially said the bite marks were from the boy.

Sheriff's deputies had been to the couple's home near Dripping Springs 10 times since they moved there in 2002, for issues ranging from assault to noise complaints, Lt. Leroy Opiela said.

Both Mojica and Amaya had previously been arrested on suspicion of assault on a family member. Mojica was convicted of assault in 2004, and Amaya received deferred adjudication in 2002, according to court records.

Chris Van Deusen, spokesman for the Department of Family and Protective Services, said the agency received an anonymous call Monday from someone who suspected abuse.

CPS investigators had been to the family's mobile home once before, in 2003, when an anonymous caller reported unsanitary conditions, Van Deusen said.

In that instance, Angel, then an only child, was removed from the house. She was returned to her parents after investigators were satisfied the house had been cleaned.

Builder unearths grave near freed slave community

FORT WORTH — A home builder working near a community founded by freed slaves recently discovered a grave, halting the project while officials determine if the area is a burial site.

Lennar Homes had been working on the housing project near Bell Helicopter Textron's south plant and Mosier Valley, a community founded by former slaves after the Civil War. An archaeologist working with the builder unearthed the grave this month.

Investigators with the Tarrant County Medical Examiner's Office have to visit the site to determine the grave's age, whether the remains are human and other details, said Roger Metcalf, chief of the agency's

human identification lab.

For now, the grave site is being protected while Tarrant County officials determine the findings, said Steve Henry, a Dallas attorney for Lennar.

Lennar wants to continue work on the housing project after findings are made and move any possible remains to the Mosier Valley Cemetery.

Atmos Energy, seeking rate hike, faulted on expenses

FORT WORTH, (AP) — Natural gas utility Atmos Energy Corp. is seeking a \$63 million rate hike, but critics say customers shouldn't have to pay for some of the company's expenses, including \$75,000 in artwork, meals at expensive restaurants and airline tickets.

"It's outrageous," Joe Sanchez, AARP's associate state director for advocacy, told the Fort Worth Star-Telegram. "High rates are a burden for everyone. ... I find it distasteful that the company is lining their walls with \$75,000 in artwork when these (gas bills) are hitting hard on the elderly and those on fixed incomes."

A spokesman for the Dallas-based utility called the expenses necessary and legal under state law.

In May, Atmos filed a request for a rate hike that would boost the average home gas bill by about \$4 per month.

But an organization representing Texas cities has offered an alternate proposal to slash the company's revenue by more than \$30 million and reduce rates by about \$5 per month.

State law allows utilities to pass on legitimate business expenses to ratepayers. The municipal group examined hundreds of pages of company documents and complained about spending it considered unreasonable.

Those items include the artwork, \$1,722 in airline tickets for an executive and his wife to attend President Bush's inauguration, eight office chairs that cost \$2,000 apiece, a \$2,640 dinner for 30 at a fancy Dallas restaurant, and at least four other group meals that cost more than \$3,000 apiece.

Former N.Y. pastor gets 11 years in fed prison for having sex with teen

BINGHAMTON, N.Y. — A former Baptist pastor who disappeared with a 15-year-old girl for a month and later pleaded guilty to raping her was sentenced Friday to more than 11 years in federal prison.

Lewis Lee, 54, admitted in May to four federal charges, including crossing state lines to have sex with a minor. In August, he was sentenced to 9 1/3 to 28 years in state prison after pleading guilty to seven counts of third-degree rape.

Lee will serve 11 years and three months in a federal prison and then the remainder of his time in state prison.

U.S. District Court Judge Thomas McAvoy also ordered Lee to be supervised by authorities for 25 years after his release.

"Mr. Lee you have gone a long way to destroy the lives of the victim and her family. It is beyond my power to describe how heinous this crime is," McAvoy said.

The judge said he had little faith Lee could be rehabilitated in prison.

Lee was ordered to pay nearly \$67,000 in restitution to cover the cost of mental health treatments for the girl and for some of the income the family's farm lost while the family searched for the teen.

McAvoy also imposed a list of restrictions if Lee ever gets out of prison, including barring him from ever having unsupervised contact with any minors.

At the sentencing, the victim's mother said Lee, their pastor and friend, "betrayed" them, and described the family's ordeal.

"This has been like living a nightmare ... but I never wake up, and it never goes away," she said.

The mother said her once-cheerful daughter has been left "confused, hurt and angry."

Lee, who is married, had been the girl's pastor at Christian Baptist Church in the central New York town of Sherburne before the two disappeared in mid-March from her family's dairy farm. The girl left willingly, but the state's legal age of consent is 17.

The pair set off a nationwide search, traveling as far west as Wyoming before Lee was arrested in April in Hagerstown, Md.

Bush reaffirms support for Iraq's prime minister

WASHINGTON — President Bush on Saturday sought to repair tensions with Iraq's prime minister and the White House asserted that Nouri al-Maliki is not "America's man in Iraq" but a sovereign leader whom the U.S. is aiding.

Ten days before the Nov. 7 congressional elections in which the unpopular war in Iraq is a top issue, Bush and al-Maliki played down a feud over a U.S. plan for benchmarks for reducing violence. The dispute has thrown the White House on the defensive and undermined Bush's attempt to put a new face on his much-criticized Iraq strategy.

For 50 minutes, Bush and al-Maliki talked by video conference to find common ground. Al-Maliki demanded the talk, according to a close aide, because U.S. Ambassador Zalmay Khalilzad was "no L. Paul Bremer" — the former administrator of the U.S.-led occupation — who could make decisions on his own. The White House issued a statement summarizing the talks.

The leaders said they were "committed to the partnership" and would work "in every way possible for a stable, democratic Iraq and for victory in

the war on terror." "On the overall strategy for proceeding, the two countries are entirely aligned," White House press secretary Tony Snow told reporters.

Bush and al-Maliki outlined three goals: speeding up the training of Iraq's security forces; moving ahead with Iraqi control of its forces; and making the Iraqi government responsible for the country's security.

A special group of high-level Iraqi ministers will work with the top U.S. commander in Iraq, Gen. George Casey, and Khalilzad to recommend how best to achieve those goals.

"As leaders of two great countries, we are committed to the security and prosperity of a democratic Iraq and the global fight against terrorism which affects all our citizens," according to their joint statement.

During the video hookup, al-Maliki told Bush, "History will record that because of your efforts, Iraq is a free country," according to Snow.

Al-Maliki was quoted by a close aide as having told Khalilzad on Friday, "I am a friend of the United States, but I am not America's man in Iraq."

In response, Snow told reporters, "He's not America's man in Iraq."

The United States is there in a role to assist him. He's the prime minister — he's the leader of the Iraqi people. He is, in fact, the sovereign leader of Iraq." Al-Maliki squabbled with the Bush administration this week over his objections to a timeline proposed by Washington for bringing security to Iraq.

"There are no strains in the relationship," Snow said.

"In this prime minister, you have somebody in the Iraqi government who wants to take charge, who wants to take responsibility, is working on all fronts, on the economic side, on the security side, and on the political reconciliation side," the spokesman said.

"And he believes it's important to do whatever he can to build greater faith and trust with the Iraqi people in the democ-

racy. So the president's very happy actually with the way the prime minister is working."

In the video hookup, Al-Maliki portrayed the U.S.-Iraqi relationship as strong and growing stronger, according to Snow, and said there are many signs of success in Iraq. Most of the conversation focused on security strategy, with the prime minister pressing for more control over Iraqi forces and greater ability to respond quickly to problems, the spokesman said.

Bush "expressed not only his confidence but happiness that you've got a prime minister who's being very assertive about building greater Iraqi capability and also engaging in the necessary business of using force when necessary to go after the people who are going wrong," Snow said.

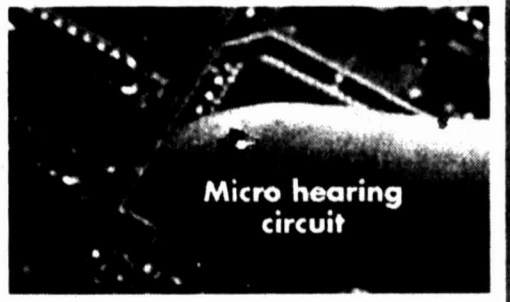

Tucson police: Sniper Malvo confessed to killing Arizona golfer

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Cheryl Witz wrote convicted Washington-area sniper Lee Boyd Malvo a letter in June, imploring him to talk to Arizona detectives about her father's 2002 death. She got her wish. Police said Friday that Malvo tearfully confessed that he and John Allen Muhammad were responsible for killing 60-year-old Jerry Taylor on a golf course in Tucson. Witz said she long suspected

the pair were responsible, though they had never been conclusively linked to the death. With her approval, Tucson police interviewed Malvo for two hours Thursday in Maryland after granting him immunity from prosecution. Capt. Bill Richards said. Malvo said the shooting took place while he and Muhammad were in the area visiting Muhammad's older sister, Richards said. Malvo said he was sorry for Taylor's family, said Detective

Benjamin Jimenez. "He willed up a few times in tears during the interview," he said. Witz said she had written Malvo a five-page letter after he pleaded guilty to six sniper killings, appealing to him to help her gain closure. "It has been four years now, and my family ... would love to have some closure," she wrote. "Lee, I am begging you... Please Lee, give myself and my family the closure that we need to heal, and to move on with our lives. ... You will be able to start

our healing process, and I will be ever so grateful (sic) to you." Witz, without elaborating, said at a news conference Friday that she knew Malvo read her letter and was remorseful. She said she intends to write him another letter to thank him for confessing and that she would like to meet him in person. "I needed to know," she said. "I really need to forgive him. I do believe that he was brainwashed and I do truly believe that he was made to kill my

father." Malvo has previously testified that Muhammad trained him to shoot and lured him into a plot to kill people. As for Muhammad, Witz said: "He's a monster, and he set out intentionally to kill people. He knew exactly what he was doing. I would love to see him prosecuted." Richards said the police investigation, which long ago had hit a dead end, would continue based on new information Malvo provided, with the intent of prosecuting Muhammad.

The Tigers offense had not taken a snap, the first quarter came to an end, and yet the score was tied 7-7.

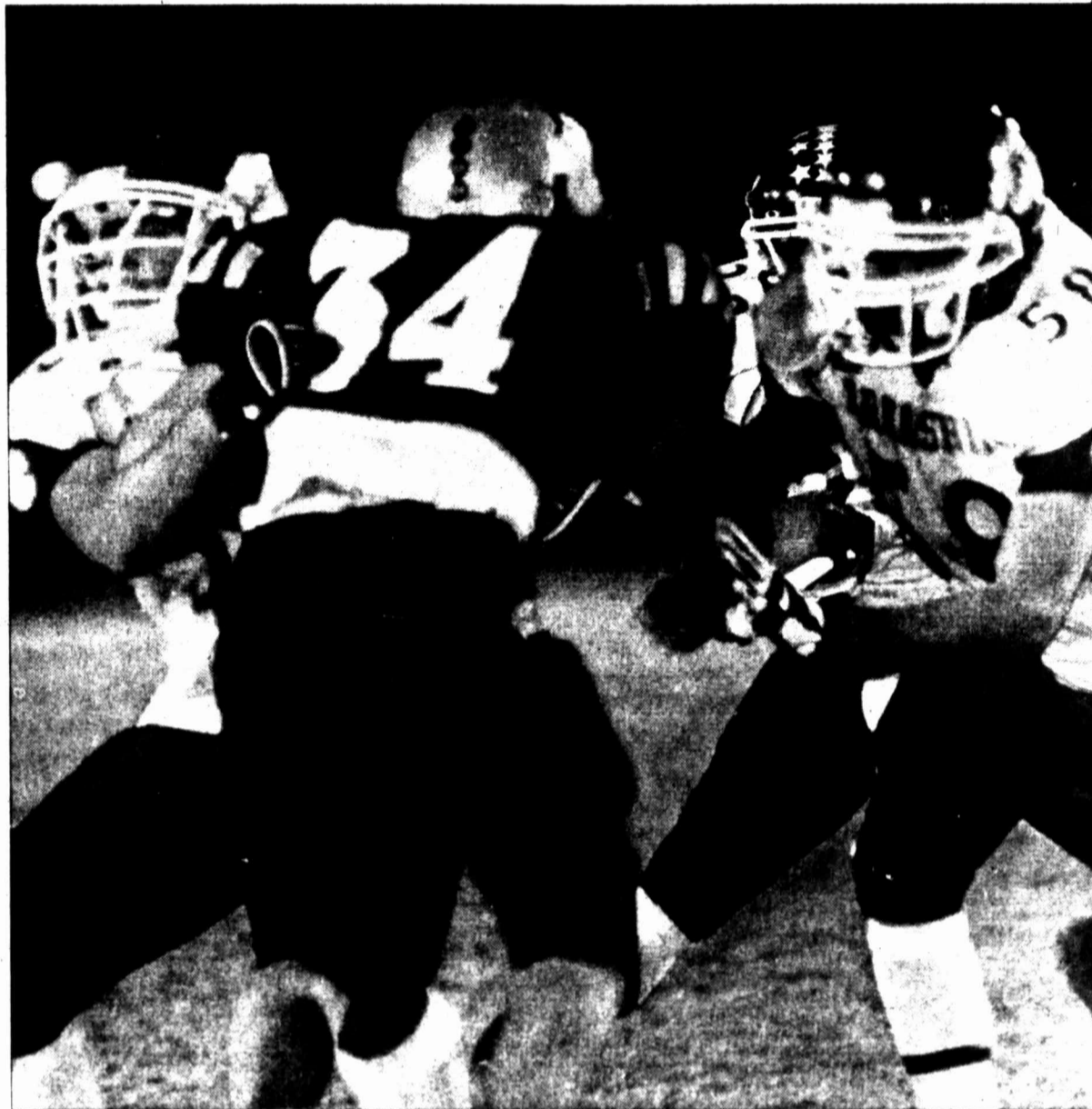

Cardinals beat Tigers 4-2; claim 10th World Series

ST. LOUIS — Instead of a Fall Classic, this World Series will be remembered for bumbles and stumbles, smudged hands and wet balls, rainy days and cold nights.

Flatter than the Midwestern heartland and a flop in the TV ratings, it was a yawner to most — except the St. Louis Cardinals.

They beat the Detroit Tigers 4-2 in Game 5 on Friday night behind castoffs Jeff Weaver and David Eckstein and sore-shouldered Scott Rolen to wrap up their first Series title in nearly a quarter-century and 10th overall.

"I think we shocked the world," Cardinals center fielder Jim Edmonds said.

At least those who were

still paying attention. Instead of highs, this Series will be remembered for lows.

—St. Louis (83-78) had the worst regular-season record of any Series champion in a non-shortened season.

—Detroit pitchers set a Series record with five errors, two more than the previous high.

—The Tigers became the first team since the 1956 New York Yankees to allow as many as eight unearned runs.

—Detroit hit .199, the worst in a five-game Series since the 1983 Philadelphia Phillies.

"If you don't make the plays, you're going to lose — whether you're playing the Yankees or the junior varsity," Detroit

Coahoma wins, 34-27

COAHOMA — The streak is at two and counting.

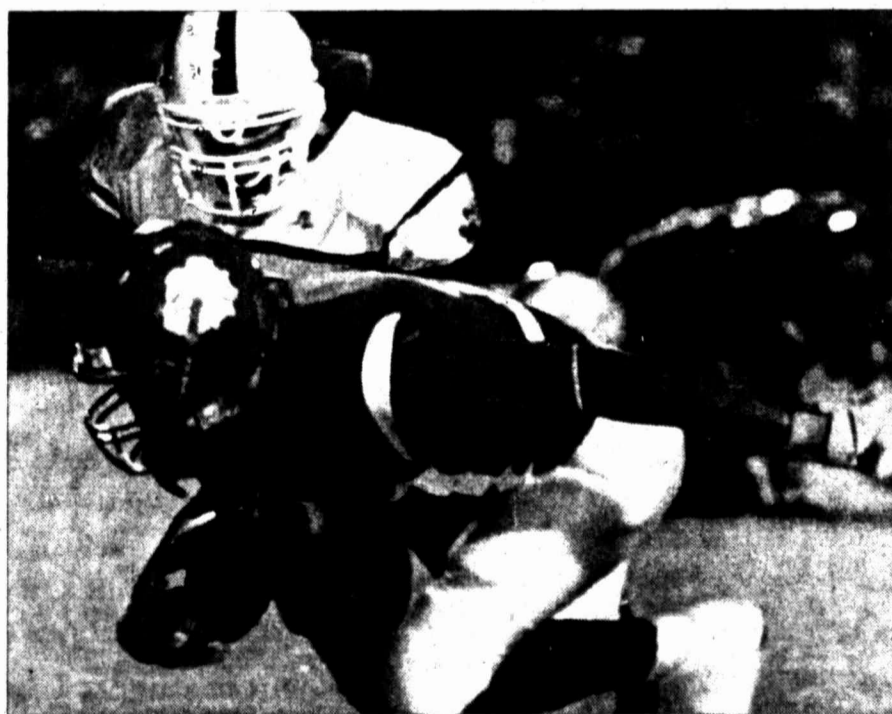

"Going in at halftime we had an advantage, but we didn't come out and play as well as we would have liked in the third quarter. We allowed them to not only get back in the game, but we saw them take the lead."

In the third quarter Stamford outscored Coahoma 20-6. Coming out of the locker room Stamford's Detrich Mays ignited the furious Bulldog comeback by blasting through the defense for a 56-yard touchdown run.

Over the next 2:27, Stamford exploded and scored two more touchdowns.

Trailing 27-21, Coahoma got back in the game behind a sensational performance by quarterback Blaine Kerby. Coahoma scored the final 13 points of the game, and Kerby finished the night with three touchdown

Ernie Els finding his swing at the right time

PALM HARBOR, Fla. — Ernie Els appears to be hitting his stride at just the right time.

His iron play was superior on Friday in the Chrysler Championship, leading him to a 5-under 66 that left him only one shot behind K.J. Choi going into the weekend. And at No. 30 on the PGA Tour money list, his solid play at Innisbrook appears to have made him a safe bet to hold down his spot and get into the Tour Championship next week.

Even better news? Tiger Woods won't be playing at East Lake.

"Tiger's not playing?" Els said, the surprise evident on his face. He wondered aloud if Woods was waiting until the start of next year at Kapalua before trying to build on a six-tournament winning streak, then said Woods and Phil Mickelson, who also is skipping the Tour Championship, have

done enough this year.

Along with his three majors and graceful swing, Els has developed a reputation for being Woods' punching bag, having been runner-up to him seven times. But that doesn't bother Els, and he has more important things on his mind.

The Big Easy has not won anywhere in the world this year, and time is running out.

But he feels as though his game is on the rise, which he can trace to the British Open. Els had knee surgery a year ago, and the recovery has been slow. There are times when it hurt him every day he played, but since July, the aches have been minimal.

"When you stop thinking about the knee, you can really start looking forward to improving your swing, and your mechanics, and everything else," Els said. "It's hard to do that when you've got a screwy knee. Ever since then, and really after the World

Championship event (he finished fifth in London), I got some new stuff I can work on. I feel clearer about it."

That much was evident on No. 10, his opening hole of the second round.

This wasn't a shot that will make a highlight reel, but it was pure. Into a slight breeze to a back pin, from 161 yards, Els fired a 7-iron without fear and watched it settle 3 feet from the hole for an opening birdie. More solid shots followed, such as his tee shot to 5 feet and just over the water on the par-3 13th (a par when he missed the putt), and a 5-iron to 15 feet on the 15th.

There were a few mistakes along the way, but not enough to douse his spirits.

Choi is still the man to catch, riding a 66 to a one-shot lead over Els, Jonathan Byrd (67) and Brian Gay (71). Choi won at Innisbrook in 2002, and found himself in control of his swing, which never hurts.

The Chrysler Championship is the final full-field event of the year on the PGA Tour, and there are battles all over the Copperhead course as players are trying to get into the top 30 on the money list to get into the Tour Championship, the top 40 to secure Masters invitations, or the top 125 to keep their cards.

As usual, the drama was toward the bottom of the leaderboard, because the only way to make money is to make the cut.

Brian Bateman was No. 126, and getting a tee time on the weekend might have been all he needed to get inside the top 125. It was a struggle most of the day, but he finished strong with an approach into 2 feet on his final hole to reach 3 over.

Then he waited in vain, as it turned out.

Stuart Appleby made a 15-foot birdie on his ninth and final hole, and not enough players on the bubble made bogey in the blustery conditions late in the

day. Seventy players made the cut at 2-over 144, meaning Bateman will have to head back to Q-school.

Still alive were Duffy Waldorf (No. 130), despite a 76 that put him at 143; and Paul Goydos, a long shot to keep his card. He birdied the 18th for his second straight 68, leaving him in fifth place and only two shots out of the lead.

Goydos needs to finish at least alone in fourth place or better to have a chance at earning his card for 2007.

The thrills belonged to Paul Azinger, who two years ago bogeyed the last two holes to miss the cut by one shot, eventually costing him his card. He was at No. 122 coming into the Chrysler Championship, and had to scramble at the end. But he holed a 15-foot par putt on the 17th, and an 8-foot par putt on the 18th to make the cut by one shot.

closer Todd Jones said.

After smoking the Yankees in the first round and sweeping Oakland in the second, the Tigers looked like the JV — on a bad day. They had six days off in the Rust Belt after finishing off the Athletics and looked, well, rusty.

St. Louis, which entered with one day off after beating the New York Mets, won its first title since 1982.

"No one believed in us, but we believed in ourselves," said Eckstein, the 5-foot-7 shortstop who was selected Series MVP after batting .364.

After closer Adam Wainwright struck out Brandon Inge for the final out, the ballpark erupted. Wainwright raised his arms in triumph, catcher Yadier Molina ran to the mound and the pair bounced off toward second base, where they were joined by teammates running from the dugout and the bullpen. Ace starter Chris Carpenter and injured closer Jason Iiringhausen gave manager Tony La Russa bear hugs.

Minutes later, fireworks filled the sky above the ballpark.

Minnesota, in 1987, had set the previous low for wins by a Series winner in a nonstrike year, going 85-77.

"The team that wins a world championship is the team that played the best," La Russa said.

A repeat of 1968's dramatic Tigers-Cardinals matchup — won by Detroit in seven games — ended on a cold night more suitable to football than baseball. The Tigers made two more errors, raising their Series total to eight — three by Inge, the third baseman, the rest by pitchers who will no doubt be practicing their infield tosses from the moment they report to spring training.

"We didn't play well enough," Tigers manager Jim Leyland said. "There's no excuse here. I don't really know what the reasons were."

Detroit saw its key players' averages shrink with the temperature. AL championship series MVP Placido Polanco was 0-for-17, Magglio Ordonez 2-for-19 (.105), Craig Monroe 3-for-20 (.150) and Ivan Rodriguez 3-for-

19 (.158).

"We just never got the bats going," Rodriguez said. It was the National League's first title since the 2003 Florida Marlins.

La Russa, who led the Oakland Athletics to a sweep in the earthquake-interrupted 1989 Bay Bridge Series, joined Sparky Anderson (Cincinnati and Detroit) as the only managers to win Series titles in each league.

"I have such a respect and affection for Sparky," La Russa said. "It's such a great honor. He should really have this alone."

While the Tigers had fielding problems, the Cardinals were mostly crisp, with the notable exception of right fielder Chris Duncan, who dropped a fly ball just before Sean Casey's two-run homer in the fourth put Detroit ahead 2-1.

St. Louis had gone ahead on Eckstein's infield single in the second, with Inge making a diving stop over the bag but throwing the ball low and wide to first.

"It's the atmosphere that can get you a little tight," Inge said. "It's the biggest stage in the world for baseball. It can make some nerves, get people a little jittery."

Casey, who batted a Series-high .529, homered for the second straight night, but St. Louis came right back to take a 3-2 lead, in the bottom of the fourth as pitcher Justin Verlander threw away a ball for the second time in two starts. One run scored on the error and another on Eckstein's grounder.

"I had the wrong mind set," Verlander said. "I picked it up and said to myself, 'Don't throw it away,' instead of just picking it up and throwing it. I got tentative."

Rolen, who led Cardinals' batters at .421, added a big run with a two-out RBI single in the seventh off reliever Fernando Rodney, extending his postseason hitting streak to 10 games.

It marked the first time since the 1912 Red Sox at Boston's Fenway Park that a team won the Series at home in a first-year ballpark.

As the Tigers failed in their bid for their first title since 1984, their season ended with Kenny Rogers rested and ready with no place to pitch. Rogers, who threw 23 shutout innings in the postseason, was saved by

Leyland for a possible Game 6 in Detroit on Saturday.

Rogers created a stir by pitching with a brownish smudge on his throwing hand in Game 2, when he tossed eight scoreless innings to lead Detroit to its only Series win.

Weaver, cast off by the Yankees three years ago after a World Series flop and dealt to the Cardinals by the Angels in July, allowed four hits in eight innings. He matched his season high with nine strikeouts and walked one before Wainwright finished for the save.

"It's all the belief in yourself, knowing that you're going to work through it," Weaver said. "Just never say die. Just keep working."

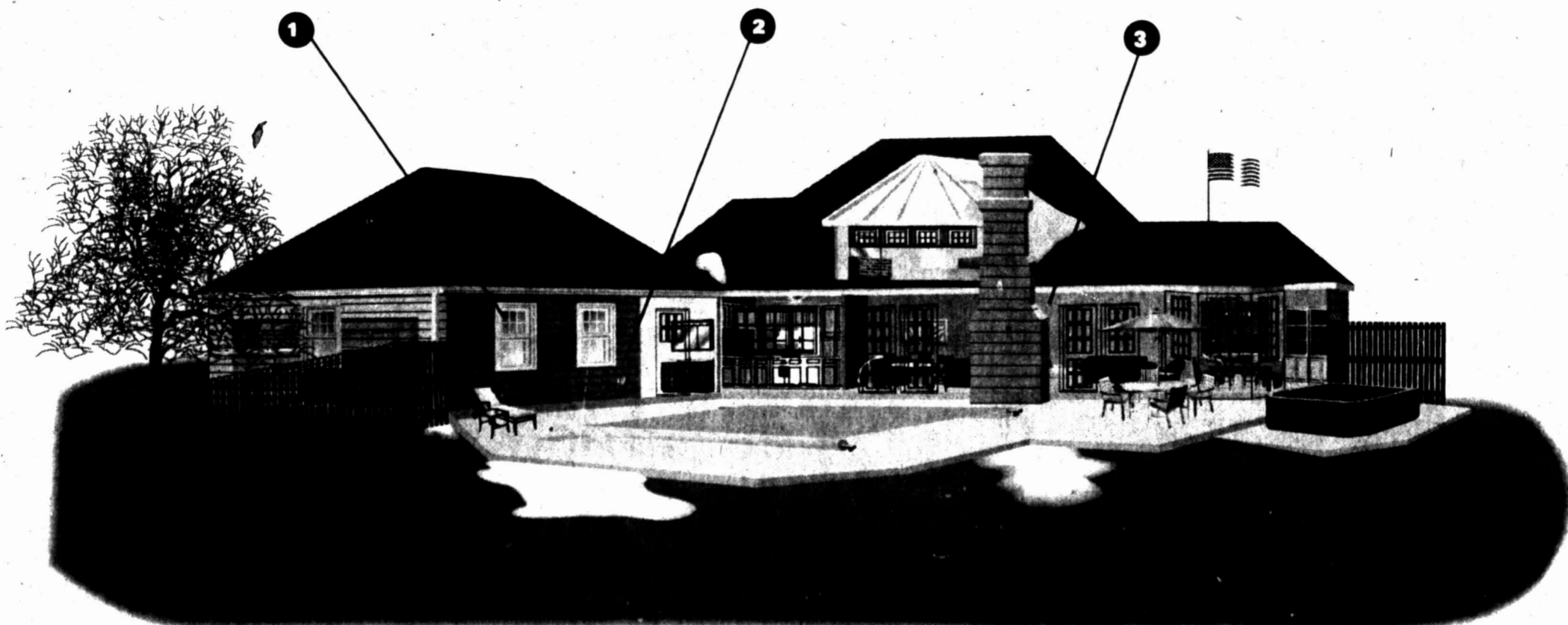

Former MLB pitcher Joe Niekro dead at 61

TAMPA, Fla. — Former major league pitcher Joe Niekro, Houston's career victory leader, died Friday, Astros president Tal Smith said. He was 61.

The two-time 20-game winner suffered a brain aneurysm Thursday and was taken to South Florida Baptist Hospital in nearby Plant City, where he lived. He later was transferred to St. Joseph's Hospital, where he died.

"It came as a real shock

to us," Smith said. "He was a great guy. He had a real spark and a great sense of humor."

Smith said Niekro did not have an active role with the Astros but kept in contact with many of his former Houston teammates.

Niekro, father of San Francisco Giants first baseman Lance Niekro, won 221 games in his career but never became as well known as his Hall of Fame brother, Phil.

Like his older brother, who won 318 games, Joe Niekro found success

after developing the knuckleball and pitched into his 40s. They had a combined 539 major league victories, a record for brothers.

Smith said he was told of Niekro's death by Enos Cabell, one of the Niekro's Astros teammates.

"Enos said he just visited with him a few weeks ago in Cooperstown," Smith said. "Enos said he seemed healthy and full of life. This just came as a sudden shock to everyone around him."

Newcomb opened up the scoring midway through the period, finding the end zone from 7 yards out, before Johnson found the hot hand and connected on his two touchdowns.

But the Buffs weren't finished, even if they thought they were with the score now at 34-0.

With under a minute remaining in the third, Sandridge took the ball on a simple running play and turned it into a dazzling 43-yard score.

Forsan, not looking to do any more damage, just played vanilla football the rest of the way, wanting to just get in the locker

room to savor the sweet win.

"Our defense played awesome tonight," said Thompson. "They refused to let Bronte have any breathing room and attacked the line of scrimmage all night. They had some issues in the secondary that we were able to exploit and our offense was just as relentless. It's just a great win for us. It puts us firmly in control of our own destiny."

Forsan still must take care of their business next week against Eldorado (0-8, 0-5) and in the season finale at home against Menard (1-7, 1-4).

With Irion County defeating Eldorado last night, 42-12, the Buffs remain tied with the Hornets in the district race, but hold the season tie breaker.

"We are not totally in the clear yet," Thompson said. "We are in a better position than we've been in a long time around here. I'm confident nothing will be taken for granted in the final two weeks. We can smell the postseason and we are hungry."

The Buffs will travel to Eldorado next Friday for a 7:30 kickoff.

Big Spring's Voncille Sims is quite the clown, and she has the hardware to prove it

That Voncille Sims ... what a clown. For the past 15 years, Big Spring resident Sims has been entertaining area children — and more than a few adults — as Dimples the Clown, mixing balloon animals and admittedly corny gags with a Christian message.

All those years of clowning around have apparently paid off.

Recently, Sims — or was it Dimples? — was honored by the Texas Clown Association as its Best All-Around Clown during the organization's 2006 convention in Irving. She is the first non-Houston area performer to win the award since its inception.

"When they called my name, I just sat there for a little bit," Sims recalled.

"Finally, my husband said, 'Hey, that's you.' ... It must have taken me about 20 minutes to get to the podium, because people were stopping me and congratulating me. It was very nice."

Sims' road to becoming the state's top clown began in 1992, when she was approached by a woman who wanted to start a clown "alley" — basically, a club — in Big Spring.

"She eventually turned everything over to me, and I've been doing it ever since," she said.

For Sims, being a clown involves more than just putting on the makeup, doing gags and making balloon animals.

"For me, it was a calling," she said. "I'm a Christian ... and I believe God called me to do this. Otherwise, I never would have done it, because I'm too shy."

Combining Christianity and clowning is a dream job, she added.

"It is a ministry, but it's also an entertainment avenue," Sims said. "It's an opportunity to bring happiness to people."

Dimples makes the rounds of birthday parties, hospitals, schools and other venues about 40 weekends a year, entertaining crowds with her gags, face-painting, balloon sculpting and simple illusions.

Sims admits she and Dimples are very different characters.

"When I put Dimples' face and clothing on, my personality changes," she said.

"Dimples can do a lot of things I can't ... (out of makeup) I can walk into a store, and kids don't know who I am, but when I'm in makeup, it's like the Pied Piper — they just crowd around."

And Sims is quick to add that Dimples won't be retiring anytime soon.

"Being Dimples is a lot more than I ever dreamed it would be," she said. "It's a lot of fun, but it takes a lot of preparation and work."

IG: Halliburton subsidiary exploited fed regulations

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Halliburton subsidiary that provides food, shelter and other logistics to U.S. troops in Iraq and Afghanistan exploited federal regulations to hide details on its contract performance, according to a report.

The special inspector general for Iraq reconstruction found that Houston-based Halliburton's Kellogg, Brown & Root Services routinely marked all information it gave to the government as proprietary, whether it actually was or not. The government promises not to disclose proprietary data so a company's most valuable information is not divulged to its competitors.

By marking all information proprietary — including such normally releasable data as labor rates — the company abused federal regulations, the report says.

In effect, Kellogg, Brown & Root turned the regulations "into a mechanism to prevent the government from releasing normally transparent information, thus potentially hindering competition and oversight."

The Iraq reconstruction audits have routinely found significant problems with contracting and rebuilding in the country.

Business briefs

United, American, Delta raise round-trip fares in some markets

CHICAGO (AP) — Citing high fuel prices, United Airlines said Friday it has increased fares by \$6 per round trip on flights to some cities also served by lower-cost carriers.

American Airlines and Delta Air Lines matched the move.

United, a unit of UAL Corp., said the increase took effect Thursday night and applies to most routes where it competes against discount carriers, such as Chicago to Dallas and Atlanta, and Denver to San Francisco, Los Angeles and New York.

The exceptions are routes where the nation's No. 2 carrier competes head-to-head with Southwest Airlines Co.

Southwest did not go along with the move. "We are not going to be involved in that fare increase at all," spokesman Ed Stewart said.

Still, Credit Suisse airline analyst Daniel McKenzie said in a note that the move by United, which follows an unsuccessful attempt last week by American Airlines parent AMR Corp. and Delta Air Lines Inc. to start an industrywide fare increase, is "a sign that underlying demand trends remain strong."

Northwest Airlines Corp. was studying United's price increase, spokesman Kurt Ebenhoch said.

Tenet sells California hospital

DALLAS (AP) — Tenet Healthcare Corp. said Friday it has agreed to sell a San Diego hospital that was accused of paying kickbacks to doctors in exchange for patient referrals.

Tenet said a subsidiary will sell 306-bed Alvarado Hospital Medical Center to Plymouth Health of Los Angeles. Tenet expects pretax proceeds of \$36.5 million.

Tenet announced in May that it would sell Alvarado as part of an agreement with federal prosecutors in San Diego to pay \$21 million and settle kickback charges. The settlement came after two juries failed to reach a verdict in criminal trials.

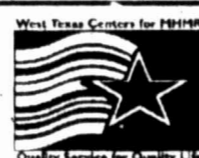

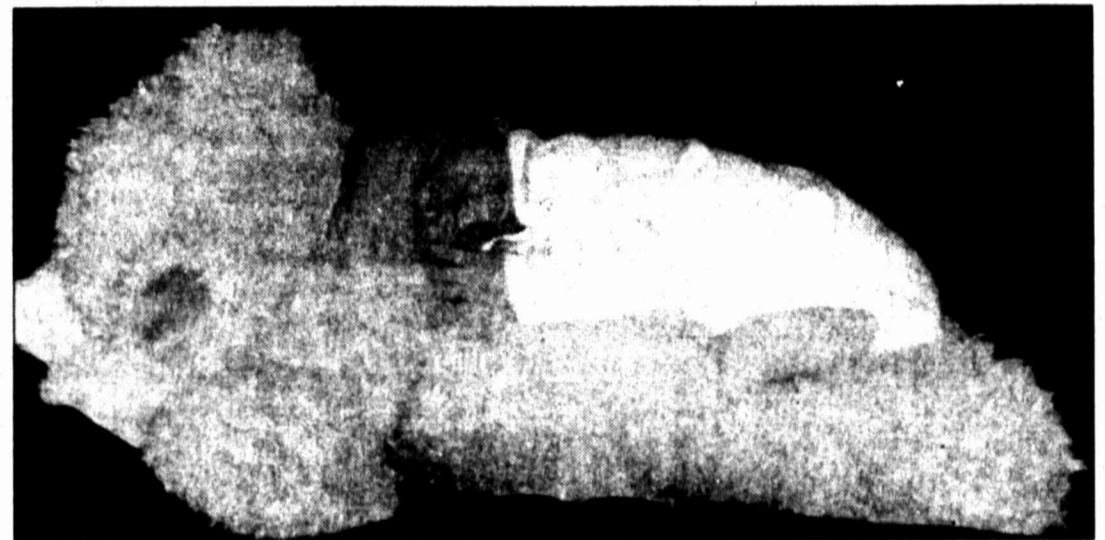

Is Walken still the 'King of New York'?

Director Abel Ferrara, most famous for films like "Bad Lieutenant" and "Ms. 45," has always been a filmmaker who's gotten by more on style than by making films with any kind of narrative substance. Even his best works have benefited more from Ferrara's ability to capture the oppressive and disturbing

feeling of New York City's seedy underbelly than strong scripts with logical plot motivations.

Sure, a film like either of the aforementioned movies features a story that's at least engaging on some level, but Ferrara tends to eschew many of the elements that critics look for in good films — character development and motivation, a logical plot progression to a previously established story goal, etc. The fact that Ferrara so willingly ignores these things that studio heads and film critics find so integral to movie structure hints at just how good a filmmaker Ferrara is — if a lesser director tried to make an Abel Ferrara movie, he'd find himself on the unemployment line.

And yet, Ferrara's not only still working, but he's also become something of an auteur in the process — and his 1990 urban gangster epic "King of New York" is one of the best examples of why Ferrara's style-heavy approach works so well.

Frank White (Christopher Walken — "The Dead Zone," "The Prophecy") is the "King of New York" — a druglord who's spent much of his life in prison, yet rules the streets with an iron fist.

As the film opens, we watch as Frank is released from the joint and placed

back on the street. Meanwhile, an unidentified man of Spanish descent leaves a brothel, and then uses a pay phone outside. While on the phone, a gang of black men materialize out of the darkness, trap the man in the phone booth, and begin blasting him with shotguns and pistols. As the man lays dying, the assassins stick a newspaper in his face — with a headline announcing that Frank White has been released from prison.

White's eager to get back into the drug trade, but not solely for his own gain. It seems that his time in prison has turned him into a modern-day Robin Hood, a philanthropist who wants to procure \$15 million dollars in

order to keep a hospital for low-income children open. Unfortunately, his fellow drug lords don't share this same aspiration — which ultimately causes Frank to kill them.

Still, his noble goal aside, he's a drug lord — a fact that doesn't sit well with the cops (David Caruso, Wesley Snipes and Victor Argo) who want nothing more than to put him away for life — even if Snipes and Caruso have to break the law to achieve their goal. Inevitably, this leads to a bloody showdown, and a surprisingly restrained ending that doesn't make complete sense, but does work on at least some levels.

Ferrara's visual style is in full flourish here. The

NYC in this film is similar to the NYC that countless cop shows and gangster films have shown us time and again. It's a dark, dank, claustrophobic place where various predators lurk in the shadows waiting to strike out at the innocent.

Yet, even though we've seen it before, Ferrara gives the film his own unique visual stamp. This New York is a dark and dirty place, sure — but, it's also populated almost entirely by criminals. Unlike the standard NYC depiction, there are no innocents in this particular hell, which seems to indicate that perhaps Ferrara feels that anyone who's honest and good can actually escape a place like this. Even when Frank shows up at a fancy restaurant, we get the impression that the well-to-do patrons are just as corrupt — and maybe even more so — than he is.

Also worth noting are the action sequences. Ferrara seems to have been inspired by Hong Kong action filmmaker John Woo — filming his action scenes with a frenetic

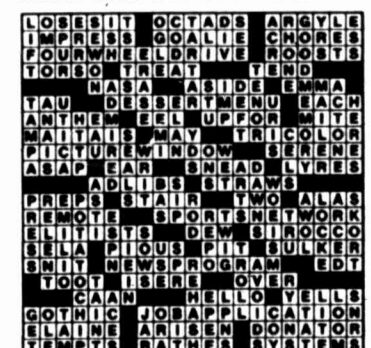
sense of pacing, an almost ballet-like choreography, and a two-pistol toting killer named Jump (Laurence Fishburne — “The Matrix,” “Deep Cover”). The violence, like just about everything else in this film, is highly stylized, at least until one poignant shoot-out near the climax which has more a high noon at the OK Corral feel to it. In a way, the film plays out like opera, a blasted urban tragedy with the shoot-outs themselves providing the arias.

However, style or no, this film would have been forever consigned to the B movie section of your video store if not for the magnificent performances. Walken is brilliant as Frank, demonstrating why he’s one of our best American actors as well as how sad it is that he’s been so badly typecast as a man who can only play weird, brooding characters. Walken sucks us in here — even though he’s a man who will murder other men at a moment’s notice, he reassures us that “he never killed a man who didn’t deserve it” — and judging from his actions in the film, we start to believe him.

White’s demeanor is that of an animal — not in the savage sense, but in that he seems to rely on his senses more than any kind of rational thinking. He exudes a calm and cool confidence in every scene, particularly one where he and his lawyer girlfriend are accosted in an empty subway car. Frank shows the men he has a gun, then tosses them a wad of cash — telling them that he can use them if they’re looking for work. Even when it appears that he’s not in control, Frank White is always in control, which is something that Walken’s performance helps drive home. With a lesser actor in the lead,

“King of New York” would play out as yet another tired Scarface imitator. But, the good acting doesn’t end with Walken. Ferrara’s assembled an impressive supporting cast to go along with his lead — and if there’s any flaw in this category, it’s that there are so many good supporting actors that many of them get relatively no screen time. Giancarlo Esposito, Steve Buscemi and Teresa Randle are all part of Frank’s cartel, and while good in the few scenes they get, you can’t help but wish they’d gotten more screentime. However, the best supporting performance in the film is provided by Fishburne as Jump. Jump’s

quite possibly a psycho, but he’s got a good sense of humor and a devotion to Frank that makes you like him anyway. Fishburne is totally over the top here — sort of reminding me of Clarence Williams III, who he later worked with in Deep Cover — cackling laughter even after he’s been hit with numerous bullets. On the downside, Ferrara lets a lot of interesting angles pass with no comment or development. For instance, the scene on the subway begs for a follow-up wherein the young thugs come to the hotel and meet their new boss, but we never get it. Also, there’s an interesting dynamic at work in the film in regards to race — Frank’s as white as they come and his crew’s all

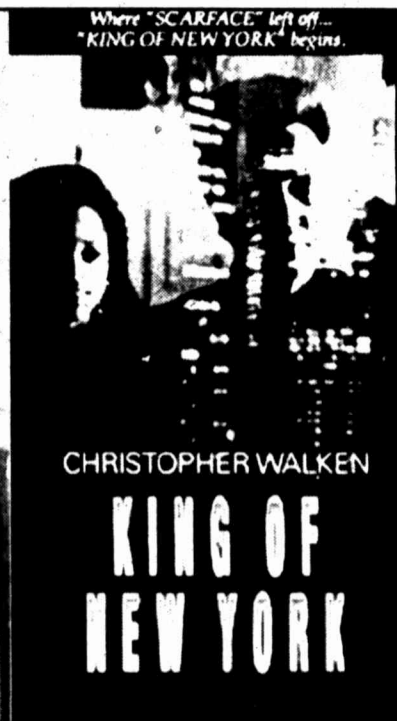


black (as is one of his girlfriends) — some sort of commentary on that situation would have been nice as well. Old school hip-hop veteran Schoolly D provides sever-

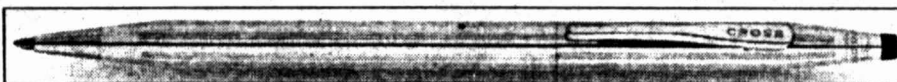

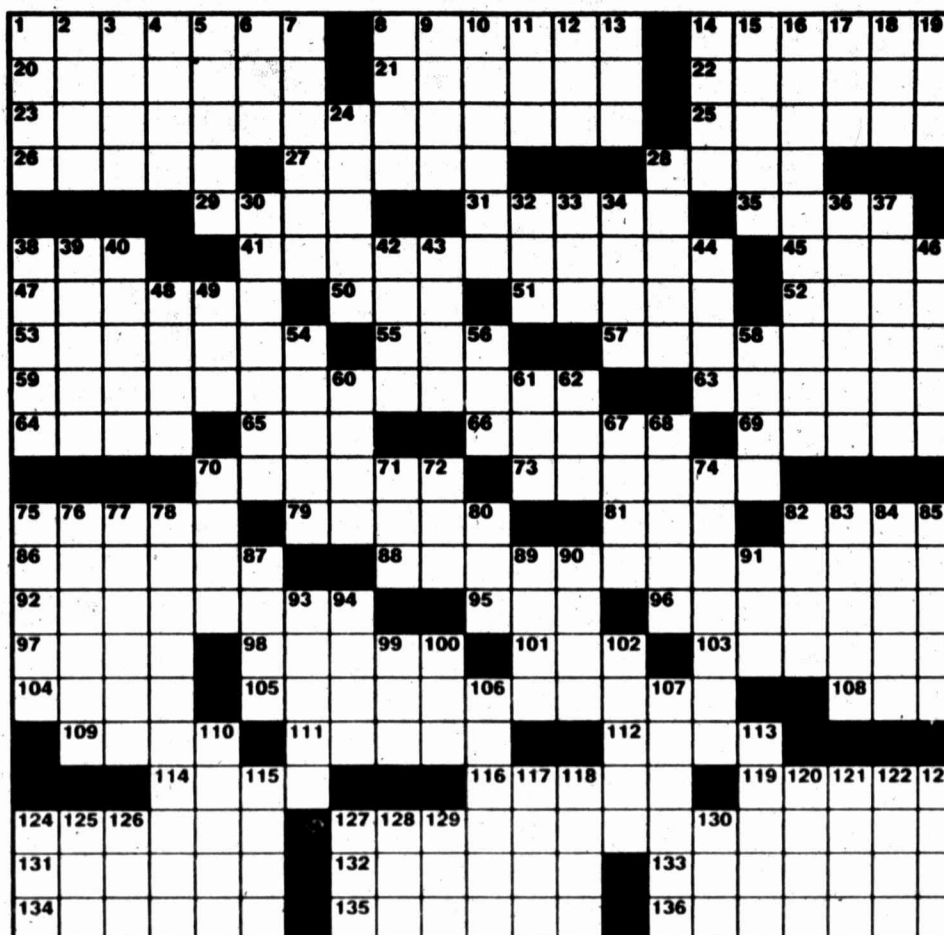

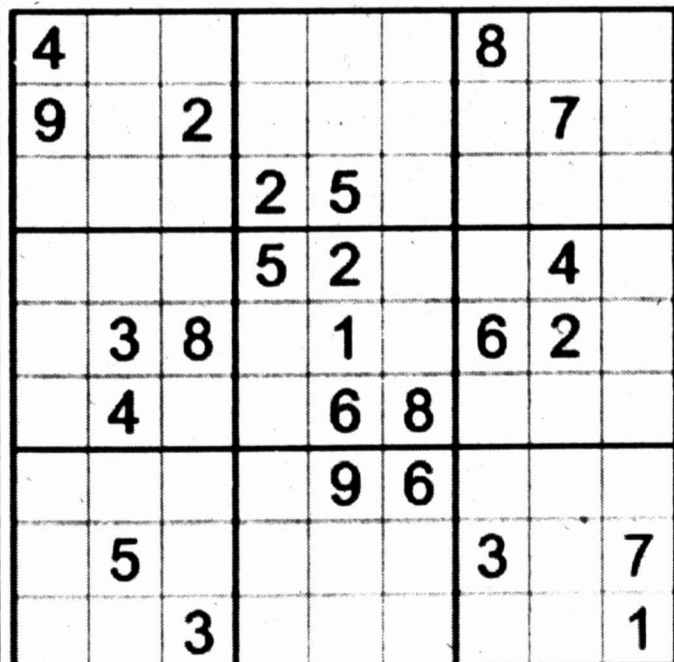
