Accusations rage in District 85 House race

An official with Jim Landtroop's campaign says recent charges by his opponent smack of hypocrisy.

At a Wednesday news conference in Big Spring, Joe Heflin, Democratic candidate for the District 85 state representative seat, charged Republican opponent Landtroop with trying to

buy his way into office with money raised largely out of district.

While Texas Ethics Commission papers show that a vast majority of Landtroop's campaign contributions have come from outside of District 85, the same can be said of Heflin, Landtroop spokesman Kevin Brannon said. Brannon said that campaign

finance reports filed by Heflin showed that more than \$73,000 of the candidate's reported contributions of \$86,000 during the month of October came from outside the district. "... almost 85 percent of (Heflin's) funding (came) from outside the district," Brannon stated in a recent e-mail, "and the overwhelming majority of that money is from liberal per-

sonal injury trial lawyers." Heflin reported receiving in-kind contributions totaling

action committee, which Brannon called a "front group" for personal injury trial lawyers. "(Heflin's) support ... comes from personal injury trial lawyers, and that's bad for West Texas," Brannon said.

While Brannon was busy accusing Heflin of being a pup-

60 in style

Nix anniversary celebration set at Stampede

He's just carrying on an old family tradition.

That's exactly what local country music legend Jody Nix is doing, as he and his Texas

Cowboys prepare to celebrate 60 years in the professional music business for the Nix clan.

"The music business started professionally for the Nix family on Nov. 11, 1946. When my dad, Hoyle Nix, and my uncle, Ben Nix, started with their band at Yell's Inn, which was in the west part of Big Spring," said Nix. "It's not there anymore, but that's where they started their professional career. It lasted almost 40 years for both of them before they passed away."

"In 1996 — which was the 50th anniversary — I started holding a reunion for all of the family and old band members, and the guys that had worked with them through the years. We held that reunion for nine years in a row."

Marking exactly 60 years since the Nix brothers took the stage for the first time, Nix and the

Hangar 25 showcases F-100 jet fighter in Friday ceremony

The F-100 was an acquired taste, but one that Jim Frogge found to his liking.

Frogge, a retired lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Air Force, was the keynote speaker at a reception Friday night at Hangar 25 Air Museum showcasing the museum's latest addition — a restored F-100 jet fighter.

The F-100, the first jet in the Air Force arsenal to achieve

Hangar 25's F-100, tail number N56-982, entered active duty in July 1958 at England AFB, La., and saw duty at stations in Italy, Turkey, Spain, Libya, Nevada and Arizona before

being dropped from the Air Force inventory in July 1995.

It was acquired by local officials late in 2004 before being restored by a team led by Las Vegas native Katie Kubernach in April.

As a crowd of about 100 people viewed the new display, Frogge, who logged thousands of flying hours in the F-100, talked about both the plane's shortcomings and its advantages.

4,100 vote early

Officials gear up for election day

Surpassing totals posted four years ago, Howard County voters have taken advantage of early voting to the tune of 4,146 ballots as local election officials prepare for Tuesday's election.

According to Sandra Bloom, elections administrator for Howard County, early voting in this year's election has surpassed totals posted in 2002, when 3,320 ballots were cast.

"I feel like early voting has gone really well," said Bloom. "Voting has been really consistent over the past two weeks. The best day we had was Thursday — when we had the extended hours — which drew 509 ballots. The slowest day was weekend voting, which drew 111 votes. So we've averaged about 300 ballots a day during early voting."

Bloom said she's had only minor problems with the electronic balloting, including the omission of a candidate in the Coahoma School District.

"In Precinct 205, which is in the Coahoma School District, the Justice of the Peace race was left off the electronic ballots," said Bloom. "We added a supplemental ballot during early voting to correct the problem, and we'll do the

"It was just a pleasure to fly, once you got some time in it and got used to its idiosyncrasies," Frogge said. "I never met anyone who ever had any time in it who didn't love it."

That's not to say the aircraft was perfect, he quickly added. Among its shortcomings was the lack of an autopilot, meaning that one had to "fly it every foot of the way," he said, and that it was underpowered for its designed mission of air-

superiority combat.

"If you got yourself in a situation where you needed instant power in a hurry, you were in trouble," he said. "The F-100 ... didn't have the top speed of some of the other aircraft I flew."

Although the plane's wide turning radius made it ultimately impractical for air-to-air combat, other missions were developed for the aircraft that became known as "The Hun."

"They made a good air-to-ground fighter out of it," Frogge said. "But its greatest role was as a fast forward air control aircraft in Vietnam. It would go looking for (anti-aircraft) sites and call in air strikes on those positions."

Hangar 25 Director Heather Wallace said the plane will return to storage in a hangar at McMahon-Wrinkle Airport until additional display space is secured

by the museum, something that Wallace hopes will be procured within the next few months.

Christmas Child project needing our help again

How much difference can a simple shoe box make in the life of a child in an impoverished and war-torn country? We asked that question in a story last week and the answer is simple — lots.

At least that's the case if the shoe box in question comes from Operation Christmas Child, a project offered annually by the Samaritan's Purse charity, it can mean the difference between opening a gift Christmas morning and finding nothing under the holiday tree.

"It really is a blessing for a child to receive one of these boxes," said Brenda Franklin, a local coordinator with the Operation Christmas Child effort. "These boxes will be the only thing many of these children will have to open Christmas morning. Many donors will put scriptures and words of encouragement in the gift, as well, so I feel like we're helping to deliver a really good message."

Participating in the annual program is simple, all one needs to do is get a shoe box and fill it with different items — things like toys and hygiene items are always a good idea. However, liquid items like lotion or shampoo, or anything that comes in an aerosol can should be avoided.

Franklin also suggests that when picking out toys anything that might be considered **war related**, such as guns or knives, is not a good idea.

Once the box is filled, it can be dropped off at Allan's Furniture, located at 202 Scurry in downtown Big Spring. Franklin and the rest of the folks there will then pack up all the boxes in a crate and ship it to Odessa. From there it and others from numerous communities will be the trip overseas.

Those who plan to participate should mark their boxes for either a boy or girl in age groups 2 to 4 years; 5 to 9; and 10 to 14 years of age.

The boxes can be decorated with Christmas paper but the lid must be able to be separated from the box. A \$7 donation is requested — but not required — to help with the shipping costs, and can be left inside the box, according to Franklin.

Collection of the boxes will begin at Allan's Furniture Nov. 13 and wrap up on Nov. 20. Resources for packing and preparing boxes can be found online at www.samaritanpurse.org.

Campaign finance reform needed

Random thoughts while praying for the end of the election season: While working on a story on campaign contributions in the District 85 state representative race, I came to the conclusion that there's just too darned much money in politics these days.

I know this is not exactly an earth-shattering conclusion on my part.

During the month of October alone, Jim Landtroop and Joe Heflin raked in more than \$500,000 in campaign contributions. Landtroop alone received more than \$400,000 in contributions.

And that's just for dinky little District 85, out here in the middle of West Texas. The money going into statewide races like the governor's election must be enough to pay off most of the existing Third World debt.

A half-million dollars, folks — for a job that pays about \$600 a month. That's outrageous any way you slice it.

What's even more disconcerting is that most of that money isn't coming from inside the district. Most of it is coming from political action committees — the dreaded "special interest groups" we hear about all the time.

And if you think that money comes with no strings attached, think again.

PACs contributed more than \$300,000 to Landtroop's campaign during October, and you can be

sure they will want a return on their investment.

Groups such as the insurance lobby, oil and gas interests and banking concerns have contributed heavily to Landtroop's campaign, and you can be sure they haven't done so for purely esoteric reasons.

Now, I'm not saying Landtroop will automatically become the toady of every special interest group that donates to his campaign.

To the best of my knowledge, he is a good, decent man who is sincerely interested in serving the constituents of this district as best he can.

But that's not the point. The old saying that money is the root of all evil contains more than a grain of truth. When the vast majority of contributions to your campaign come from special interests — and those special interests can very well refrain from giving you money the next time you run for office — isn't it fair of citizens to ask if the candidate really has their best interests at heart?

When a candidate is cashing six-figure checks from PACs and the like, do you really think your \$20 contribution is going to carry much weight?

Landtroop supporters are quick to point out that most of the contributions to Heflin's campaign come from special interests, also — and they're right.

But two wrongs never made a right, as my momma used to say.

We have to have campaign finance reform, folks.

It's that simple.

There's no way to justify the

obscene amount of money being spent on this race.

And unless we do something to check this trend, it's only going to get worse in the future.

There's only two solutions that I see — either put a hard cap on the amount of money candidates can accept per race; or create a fund composed entirely of taxpayer money and divvy it out to candidates every election year.

Somehow, some way, we have to stop this madness.

Now that I've depressed both myself and you, faithful reader, allow me to lighten the mood with a couple of political jokes.

In the interest of fairness, figures in both major political parties get trashed:

"President Bush warned Democrats not to celebrate too early. This is from the guy who put up the 'Mission Accomplished' sign three years ago." — Jay Leno

"Sen. largest employer in the community. Most of these employees live in the community. How many families pay an unofficial gas tax when they live in the community and commute to other towns so that their children can attend Coahoma schools? Many own their own homes and others fill rental property, but they are there for one main reason, the school. For those that question if this is a good economic decision, think about it.

This bond has the ability to make the school facilities stable for the next 30 to 50 years. Sure there will be things that will come up, such as replacement of the air conditioning units that will be replaced with this bond, but that is in the distant future.

For those who want to try to find some reason not to vote for the bond because they feel that more should have been done in the past to keep up the schools, all I can say are three things: 1.) We can't go backward, only forward and we have to deal with the here and now; 2.) It is time to make repairs on the "new" elementary that was built in 1982 — repairs like resealing grout and reinforcement of the foundation where it has shifted. These are efforts to maintain what we have; and 3.) When buildings reach a certain age, such as more than 40 years old, things like metal plumbing in concrete reach the end of their life and collapse. Electrical service that is original will not meet current technology requirements. Our buildings range in age from 63 years to 9 years old.

With property tax relief, property owners will pay less next year in property taxes, even with the bond passing, than they did last year. People over the age of 65 get the homestead exemption and will have no additional tax impact on their homes. In the last

seven years, taxes have been lowered twice and will be lowered again next year when they drop from \$1.37 to \$1.04. We have only had one tax increase in the last seven years. The school respects our taxpayers. That is why a community facilities committee was formed to find out what the community wanted or recommended with this bond.

Taxpayers will be paying less than they did last year with the whole bond passing, and there is only a five-cent difference between everything being repaired and Proposition 2.

Despite taking things out of this bond, it still went up \$2 million within one year with Katrina and Rita. The trend is not for the price of things to go down and it will never in all probability get cheaper to repair the school. Again, this is about priorities. Sure, we can wait. We can let things deteriorate and be facing something like Kermit. There they are asking for \$33 million to build two new schools.

If you have been paying attention, most schools are in the same situation. Take Big Spring for instance, where they have brought in a facility evaluator to lay down ground work for future school repairs and a bond.

Sure, we can wait for things to deteriorate and fail and at some point we will be paying for a bond for our children to go to school somewhere, whether it's Big Spring or Coahoma. If you doubt this, ask the superintendent at Big Spring if he visited Coahoma and Forsan prior to the bond attempts to see what the economic impact would be when they absorb local schools.

For those who think that this is not possible, what happened to the Midway School, Centerpoint School, Gay Hill School, R-Bar Community School and the Moore School — local schools that were absorbed and no longer exist? Ask some of our

retired educators if they remember state and local efforts to consolidate small schools.

Big Spring is currently looking into efforts to annex a portion of property currently on the Coahoma tax rolls because it is a property-rich area and is being developed. This is property where the students who live there currently go to Coahoma schools.

There has been a lot of misinformation put out about the bond by a select few who do not want to be bothered or confused with the facts. We urge you to seek out the facts because the school is available to share them with you and even take you on a tour. Seeing is believing. So often in small towns people fear change. Well, nothing rarely stays the same and you are either growing or you are dying. Enrollment at Coahoma has been growing while much of the facilities are dying or are on life support. Coahoma has a rich history of supporting its schools, so why not now?

There is more information on the school web page that can be accessed by the Internet. We encourage all voters who are willing to vote for Proposition 1 to also vote "yes" on Proposition 2 to help insure that the minimum that Proposition 2 passes.

For those who question what next if the bond fails, well any way you look at it, the situation is not good. High interest emergency loans for repairs are an option, but money will have to be "freed up" to pay for it. In schools you can only make major cuts in two areas — personnel and programs. The school has already reduced personnel. When you cut programs, you are cutting off your nose to spite your face. The school has made great strides to keep its programs. Take FFA for instance. Coahoma is the only school left in the county that still offers it. What happens to important programs like that when money is needed to

maintain core educational programs required by the state? The voters have to decide than just voting for the bond; they are voting for the future of our children and this community.

For those who believe our facilities are adequate and in no need of repair or complete replacement, I encourage you to apply for one of the many job openings we are offering. I realize that taxes will increase and I assure you I am a property owner myself. However, I come to work every day to conditions that are in dire need of attention, which can only be satisfied by a whole new facility.

For instance, our communications and booking area shares an office that is literally the size of our inmates' cells. We have two sides to our office and are constantly being overwhelmed by warrants that take up the majority of this office. I want to express also that most of these warrants are only locals and are not avail-

able for other agencies to view in the state and national computer database.

Keep in mind that these local warrants cannot be served frequently due to the fact that our jail is constantly at its maximum capacity.

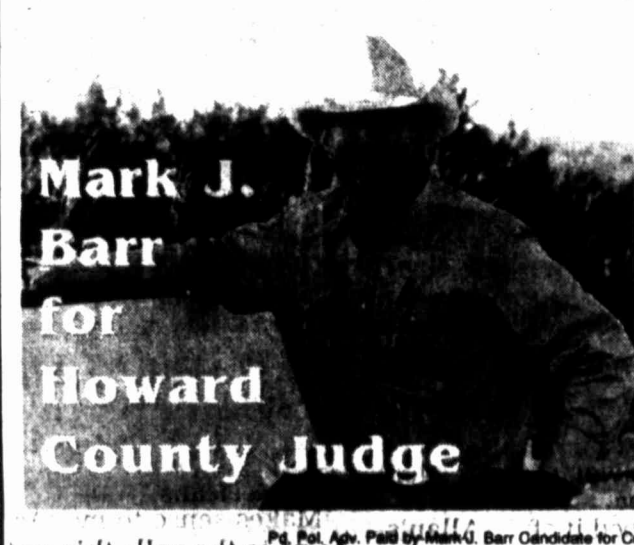
As some have expressed in the past, there are ways around the jail occupancy issue. I assure you that our current sheriff, Dale Walker, will not disobey the law, nor should we expect him to. We are making the best of the conditions we work in, but those who are not employed by this agency have no idea how truly difficult it is to find any facility capable of taking on more inmates other than their own.

It is important for all to understand that on a daily basis we detain subjects that are incapable of posting bond due to lack of funds, parole and probation violations and sex offenses. Many are awaiting transport to and from state and federal correction facilities and out of state agencies.

that choose to extradite several states away obviously want these criminals for a reason. These are not the types of people we want on the streets of Howard County. We hold these inmates not only for our community's safety, but the nation's as well.

Sure, at this time there may be only 50 or 60 inmates at a time in jail, but the amounts of warrants we hold are well over that number and would surpass even the 144 beds we are requesting. To be accused of holding inmates just for purposes of increasing our jail census is absurd.

As far as female inmates, go, this truly is a huge problem. When a female is arrested during the day, she is searched, dressed out in the courthouse bathroom by a jailer and is then told to sit in a chair in front of the booking/communications office for as long as 10 to 12 hours until arrangements can be made for transport. Most frequently, Dickens County, our female holding facility, is a full occupancy because they not only house for our agency but multiple others.

In that case, we then contact the agency she is wanted by and request immediate pick up. With such short notice, this also rarely happens and in some cases, our transport officer is deployed to meet the agency half way. In retrospect, if the female is wanted by our agency and is arrested by our deputies, DPS troopers or Big Spring police officers during the night, we then call out an off duty jailer to watch over this female while she sleeps on a pad that is inconveniently placed in the deputies' office where reports are written.

I would like to remind you that during the day our booking clerk is responsible for watching this unrestrained female prisoner, as if she has nothing more to do with her job responsibilities.

Whenever you're playing a contract that appears unbeatable, you should stop and ask yourself: "What, if anything, can defeat me?" If you think along these lines, you can occasionally avoid disaster.

Observe what happened to declarer on this deal. West led the club jack, and the defense took three club tricks before shifting to a diamond.

South won with the ace and played a trump to the queen, on which East showed out. A spade to the ace was then followed by another trump, dummy winning West's ten with the king. South next ruffed a

spade and led another heart, finishing the nine after West played low.

With only one trump left in each hand, declarer cashed the ace but later had to lose a diamond trick to go down one. However, he should have made the contract.

When South wins the diamond return at trick four, he should start thinking in terms of "What can defeat me?" The obvious answer is that only four trumps in one hand can jeopardize the contract.

Declarer is helpless if East has four trumps, so all his thoughts should be centered on the possibility that West has them. As we've seen, South fails if he tackles trumps at once.

Instead, he should cash the ace of spades before leading a trump. This might not seem like an especially meaningful play, but it represents the difference between making the contract and going down one. It protects against West holding all four trumps.

After East shows out at trick six, South ruffs the spade ten and leads another trump. He wins West's ten with the king and then ruffs the spade queen.

This leaves South with one trump while West and dummy each have two. Declarer now leads his last trump, trapping West's J-4 in front of dummy's A-9. South then discards his four of diamonds as dummy's last trump is cashed, and the contract is home.

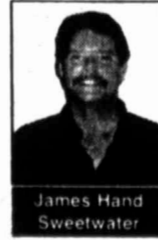

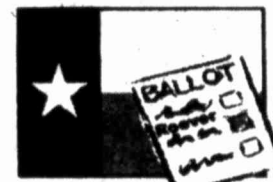

Big Spring rumbles to 53-28 win

LUBBOCK — If you enjoy offense, Lowrey Field in Lubbock was the place to be Friday night.

When the final whistle blew it was the Big Spring Steers (2-7, 1-2 in district) ruining the Estacado Matadors' (2-7, 1-2) chance to solidify a playoff spot, 53-28.

The fireworks started with the Steers' defense igniting the scoring with a two-point safety after Ryan Tannehill had a 84-yard punt that pinned the Matadors back at their own 6. From that point on it was one long touchdown drive after another for both schools.

In the first half, BSHS freshman sensation Monte Anderson toted the ball for 100 yards on only 13 carries, and added two scores, one of which was a 47-yard reverse that stunned the Matador's crowd.

On the ensuing kickoff, the ball was lifted high into the wind, bounced off the turf and rolled backwards before being recovered by towards the Steers. The end result was first and ten for BSHS on the Estacado 20. Three plays later, Anderson scooted in from 12 yards out, giving Big Spring a 30-6 advantage.

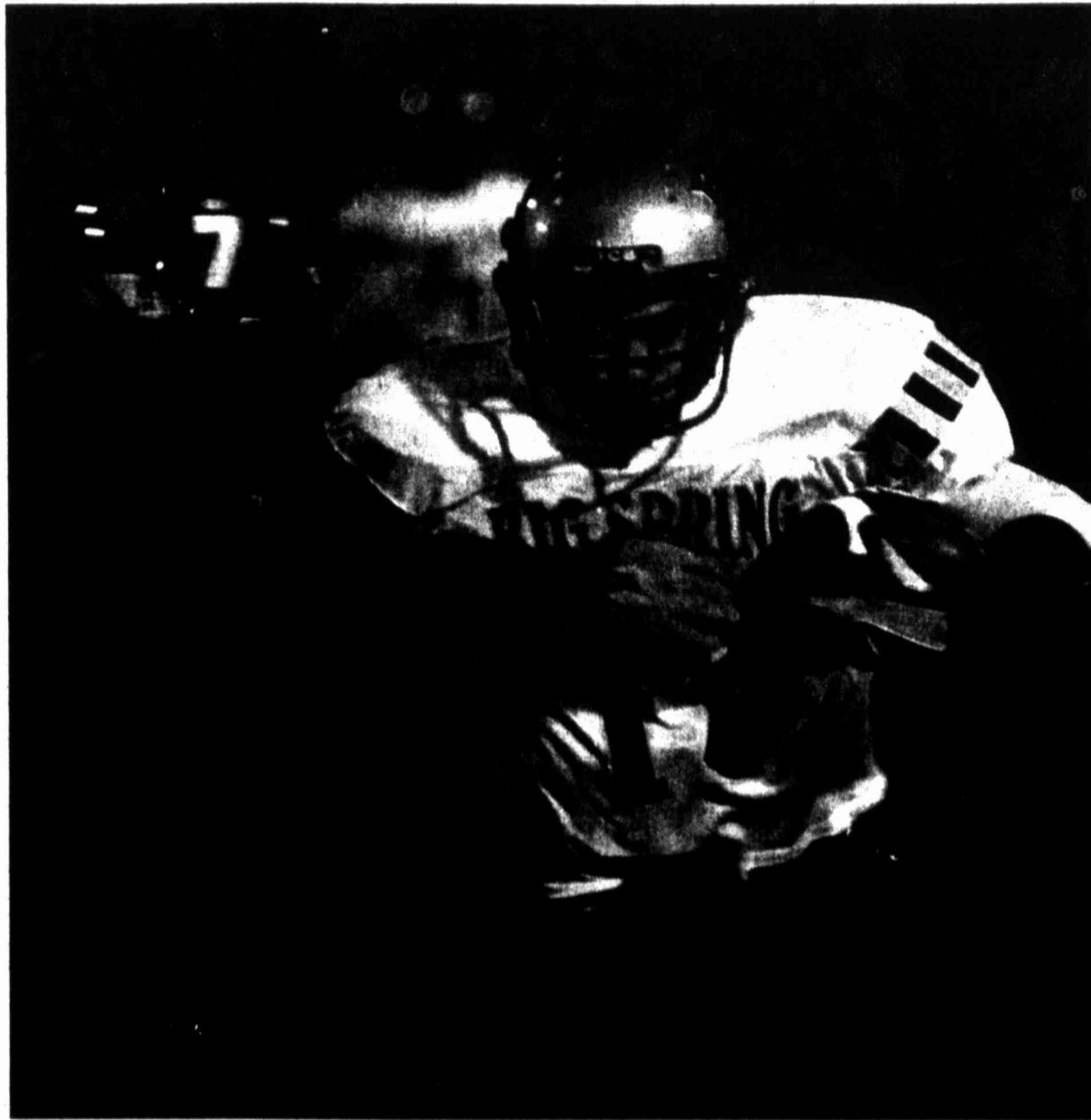
The Matadors closed the gap to 30-14 on a pass just before halftime.

"Monte did not play in the second half because of a hamstring pull," Coach Holt explained, when questioned about the change in the Steers backfield for the second half.

"We didn't want to chance it getting any worse, and the way our offensive line was blocking we felt like we were going to move the ball anyway. The offensive line did the best job they have done all year long. They recognized who was where, and who they needed to block tonight. Ryan (Tannehill) did an outstanding job of changing the plays and making audibles at the line of scrimmage based on their defensive alignments."

After the injury to Anderson, Chayson Holt took over and the Steers' ground attack never missed a beat. It was Holt to the left, Holt to the right and Holt up the middle, as the offense ran wild through the Estacado defense. Holt ended the night with 103 yards rushing on 17 carries, and added five touchdowns as well.

"I'm real proud of Chayson," the elder Holt said after the win. "He had to change positions at the half, and he did an outstanding

Newcomb scored his first touchdown, going in from 6 yards out, midway through the first quarter. Then Vince Penick got

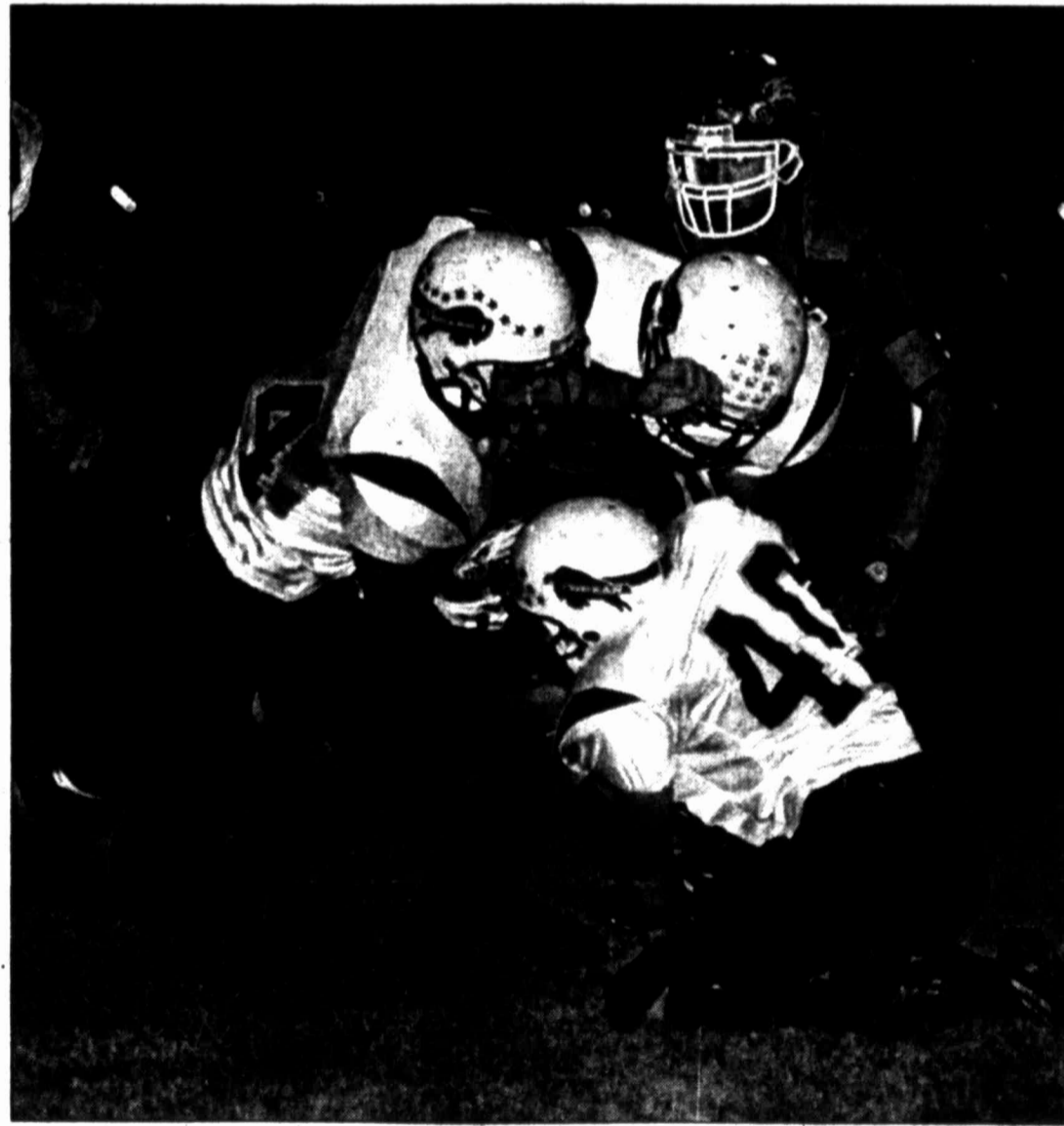
into the action, returning an interception for a 30-yard touchdown, as Forsan went up 20-6 at the end of the first.



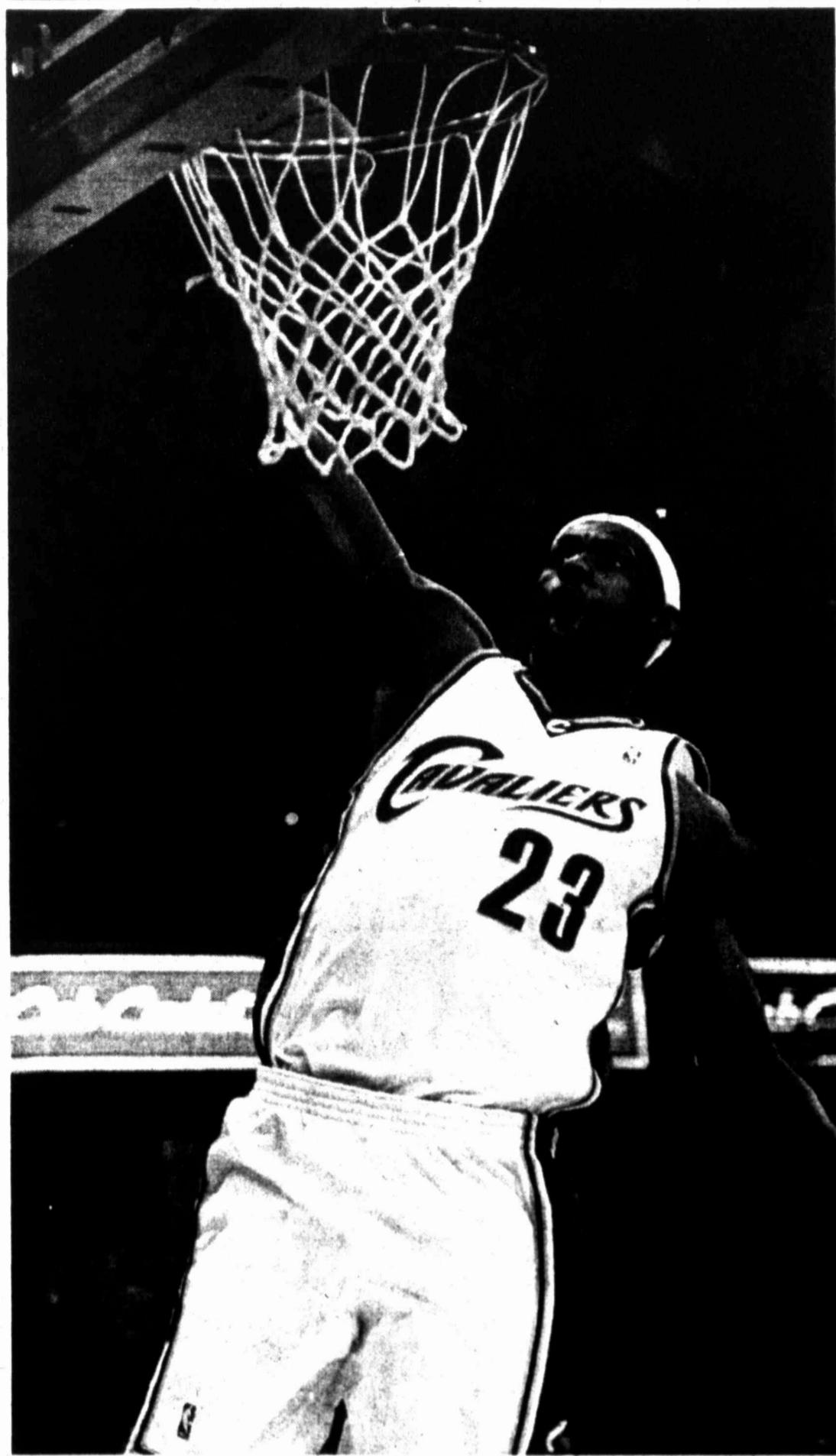

James leads Cavaliers over San Antonio, 88-81

SAN ANTONIO — LeBron James dunked over Tim Duncan with a snarl, an early statement of a rugged night. And by the time it was over, the Cleveland Cavaliers got out of San Antonio with their first win in the Alamo City since 1988.

James scored 35 points, hitting a key layup and free throw late in the fourth to help snuff a San Antonio rally and lead the Cavaliers to an 88-81 victory Friday night.

"I was 4 years old the last time we beat San Antonio," in the Spurs' hometown, James said. "I think for us to become one of the powerhouses which we've been preaching, we've got to go out there and walk the walk."

But James' night wasn't as easy as it might have looked when he powered over Duncan for the early slam and scored 15 points in the first quarter.

The Spurs, one of the most dominant home-court teams in the NBA, slashed a 13-point deficit in the fourth down to four and might have won if not for a dismal 18-of-34 effort shooting free throws.

"I wish I had a nickel for every time somebody asked me if free throws are a concern," Spurs coach Gregg Popovich said.

They have "always been an Achilles' heel."

Duncan finished with 25 points and 12 rebounds and scored 14 points in a five-minute span to spark the rally. But he struggled badly from the line, going 9-of-19.

"I've shot a million free

throws over the summer," Duncan said. "But it's nothing like actually getting in a game, banging around and then having to calm yourself down."

James, who missed five

consecutive shots in the Spurs' rally, hit the layup then made one of two free throws for an 86-79 lead with 42 seconds left. His outlet pass for a dunk by Larry Hughes, who had 18 points, finished it off.

Knight critical of chancellor

LUBBOCK (AP) — Without mentioning him by name, Texas Tech coach Bob Knight got in a verbal jab Thursday at former Tech chancellor David Smith.

Knight praised Kent Hance, the school's sole finalist for chancellor and a former West Texas congressman, at the start of his address to a crowd of about 1,000 people at the Red Raider Club Tip-Off Luncheon.

"(Hance) replaces a chancellor that only had one thing on his mind and that was self-promotion," Knight said. Knight predicted Hance would lead the school to a promising future and said he cared about Tech faculty and students.

"If Hance says hello to one person, that will be

an improvement from the last guy," Knight said.

Knight and Smith had a strained history that included an incident at a salad bar in a Lubbock grocery store in February 2004.

The incident led to Knight getting a reprimand for a loud public outburst.

Smith resigned in January and became president of the Upstate Medical University in the State University of New York system in June.

He was not Tech's chancellor when Knight was brought out of early retirement to coach the Red Raiders back in March 2001.

No help; Jeff Burton still satisfied with Gordon penalty in Fort Worth

FORT WORTH — Jeff Burton is satisfied with the penalty NASCAR imposed against Robby Gordon, even though it doesn't help Burton in the championship Chase.

NASCAR ruled that Gordon intentionally threw a piece of roll bar padding on the track at Atlanta last week. The ensuing caution benefited Gordon, who went on to finish 10th, but hurt Burton, who was a lap down and wound up 13th.

"Once it's happened and they threw the caution, the damage was done for us. There's no going back on that," Burton said Friday. "Robby was only doing what he needed to do for himself and, by the way, people have been successful doing that in the past. He did what has worked in the past, and I don't blame him."

Burton goes into this weekend's race at Texas Motor Speedway tied with Dale Earnhardt Jr. for fourth in the Nextel Cup standings, 84 points behind leader Matt Kenseth.

Gordon has denied any wrongdoing by the team he owns and will appeal. He was docked 50 driver points and 50 car owner points and fined \$15,000.

When the caution came out with about 35 laps left at Atlanta, Gordon got NASCAR's "free pass" to get back on the lead lap. Burton was trying to make up for lost lap from an early incident and needed another round of green-flag pit stops for the chance to catch up.

Burton asked NASCAR to review, which led to

the penalties against Gordon.

"I was upset it had such a negative impact on us. It had nothing to do with Robby," Burton said. "Rules are good only if they're enforced. ... If we don't, then the racetrack continues to get full of roll bar pads."

Some bumps and dips have been on other tracks so long that they have names, such as "Humpy Bumps" at Charlotte and the "Tunnel Turn" at Pocono. How about "Dale's Dip" at Texas?

Dale Earnhardt Jr. expressed concern Friday about a dip over the tunnel between Turns 1 and 2 at Texas, where he got his first Cup and Busch victories and his six top-10 finishes are more than any Nextel Cup driver.

"The asphalt or the dirt underneath the asphalt has settled over the tunnel, which it does at every race track that they build. But it seems to be more pronounced here," Earnhardt said. "That will hold this place back

for years to come until they repair that as far as being able to run two and three wide through that corner."

TMS president Eddie Gossage said Earnhardt is the only driver he has heard complain about the portion of track over the South tunnel.

"There's one bump in the whole race track," Elliott Sadler said.

Kevin Harvick doesn't have any problems with Texas and said he doesn't think any of the bumps "are any worse than they have been in the past."

Gossage said the track, which is completing its 10th season of racing, is surveyed at least twice a year and that the tunnel area hasn't changed in three years.

"I think we've got a great track record and if there's something wrong with the race track, all he has to do is let us know about it," Gossage said. "I love Junior, and we'll take a look at it after the race is over. It's no big deal."

McEndree is the current Area II first vice president and her election into this office allows her to be a voting delegate at the National FFA level, as well as serve on one of the most important committees at that level, the

Leadership and Career Development Event Committee.

McEndree said she had a "great time" and learned many lessons, including the politics needed to work through her committee goals.

She was able to meet FFA members from nearly every state in the nation.

Her future FFA plans include running for state office this year, which would send her back to the National FFA convention next year.



Beware big sales

Group describes how charging holiday gifts can multiply your debt

PHOENIX, Ariz. — The Friday after Thanksgiving kicks off the holiday shopping season. Store promotions and sales lure millions nationwide, but are you really saving by shopping sales?

Mike Sullivan, director of education for Take Charge America, a national non-profit credit counseling agency, says sale shoppers may be getting duped.

"If you don't need an item, don't buy it just because it's on sale," he said. "Many shoppers who seek out bargains end up purchasing items they wouldn't normally buy if they weren't on sale. And what's worse — shoppers who charge sale items thinking they're getting a deal. When you add interest rates to the sales price, it can far exceed the original purchase price."

According to the National Retail Federation, U.S. shoppers are expected to spend \$791.10 each on holiday merchandise this year. Sullivan says much of that will end up on credit card bills, so that \$791.10 could end up costing hundreds of dollars more in the end.

To put this in perspective, Sullivan describes five of the most-wanted gifts this holiday season, and what you'll end up paying on your credit card* when you only make the minimum payment each month:

Retail: \$249
Credit card total: \$314.12
32 months to pay off; \$65.12 in interest

Concert or professional sports tickets
Retail: \$400
Credit card total: \$615.41
62 months to pay off; \$215.41 in interest

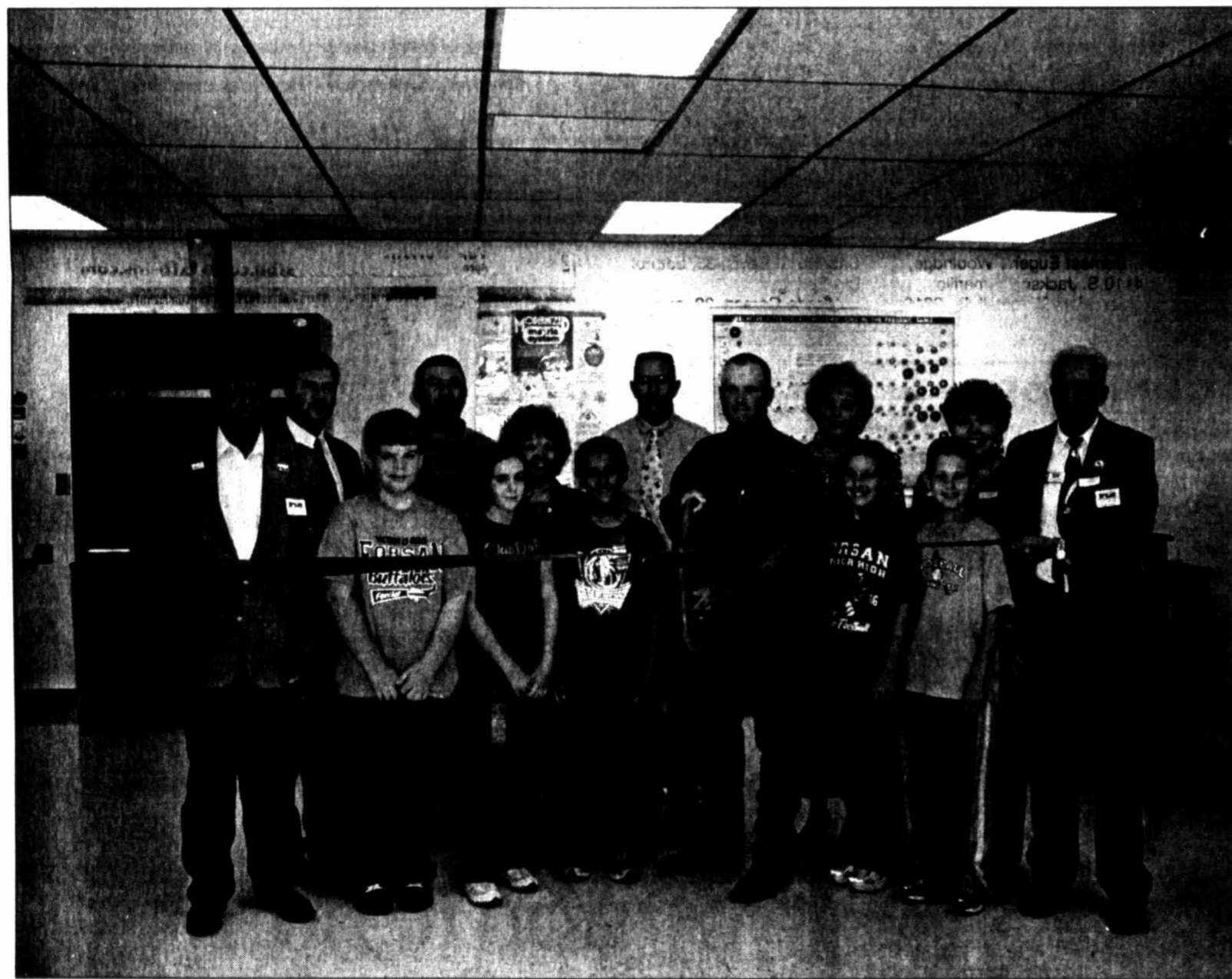
3-Day Cruise (2 persons)
Retail: \$1,000
Credit card total: \$2,115.41
153 months to pay off; \$1,115.41 in interest

Retail: \$2,000
Credit card total: \$4,614.43

Sullivan adds that you can still feel the credit card pinch, even if you don't purchase high-ticket items.

Atmos Energy revises rate request

Company says it was going to do so prior to questions over expenses

FORT WORTH (AP) — Atmos Energy Corp. attorneys began removing about \$33,500 worth of lavish expenses from its proposal to raise North Texas natural gas rates shortly after a newspaper's inquiry about the purchases.

Among the expenses flagged by the Fort Worth Star-Telegram were from New York City's Four Seasons Hotel, where several Atmos executives paid between \$777 and \$961 a night per room, according to invoices.

The Dallas-based utility also included in its rate filing cases of wine for \$467.48 and \$350 each. An Atmos official also

charged a \$279 meal for Republican Texas Railroad Commissioner Victor Carrillo, his friends and another agency staff member.

Atmos spokesman Rand LaVonn said "largely the items" identified by the Star-Telegram would be removed from its request, but that the decision came before the paper contacted the company.

"In reviewing documents produced for the rate case, Atmos Energy discovered certain expenses which it believed should be removed from the rate case," LaVonn said.

The company has proposed increasing rates by about \$63

million annually, or about \$4 on the typical monthly bill for each of its 1.5 million customers. A panel of administrative law judges is hearing the case this week and is expected to make recommendations to the elected Texas Railroad Commission for a final ruling early next year.

Atmos' decision to remove the expenses appeared to surprise the judges, who ordered the company to provide more clarification Friday at the hearing continued. But LaVonn said Atmos decided to remove the items before being contacted by the newspaper.

Atmos filed its request in

May. State law allows utilities to pass on business expenses to ratepayers, but a coalition of cities critical of the gas utility has flagged multiple expenditures as unreasonable.

An alternate proposal by a municipal organization would instead cut the company's revenue by more than \$30 million annually and decrease typical rates by about \$5 per month.

LaVonn said the \$279 meal with Carrillo and his associates and any such expenses involving other railroad commissioners will remain in the company's request because it "came in the course of normal business ... (and) the expenditures

were recorded as part of Atmos Energy's adherence to a rigorous code of conduct," LaVonn said.

Separate filings with the Texas Ethics Commission show thousands of dollars in contributions from an Atmos political action committee to the railroad commissioners, including Republican Chairwoman Elizabeth Ames Jones, who is up for re-election next week. A lobbyist for a law firm representing a coalition of cities opposing Atmos also has made contributions.

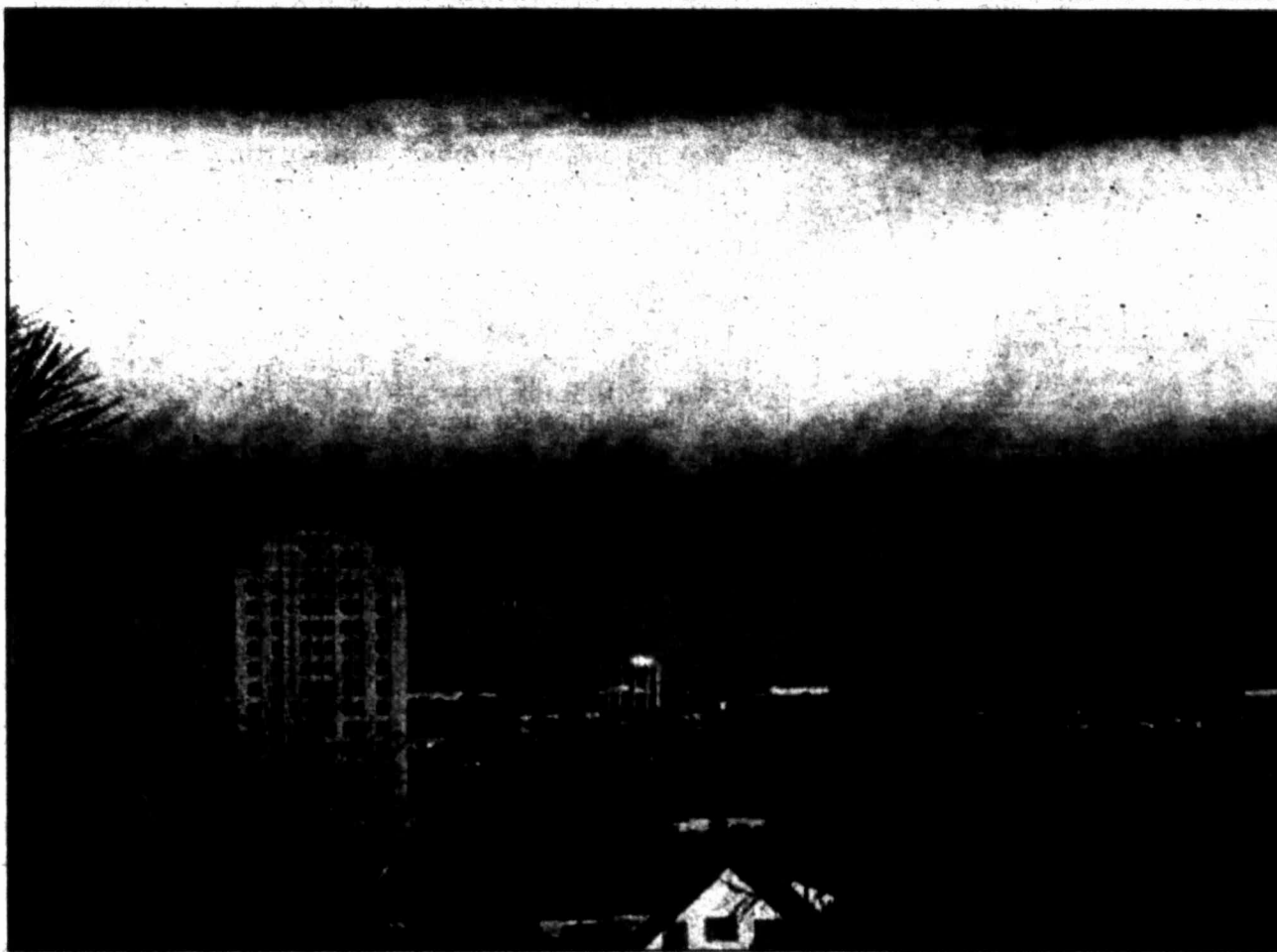

With the third, "Christmas Vacation", there really was no vacation to be had. The family went nowhere and never even planned on it. In fact, the Griswolds stayed at home to enjoy the holiday season by themselves and the rest of their family came to visit them.

Funny? Yes! If ever there is an instance in what can go wrong than a family vacation, it's some "quality time" with the In-laws. The franchise was a bona-

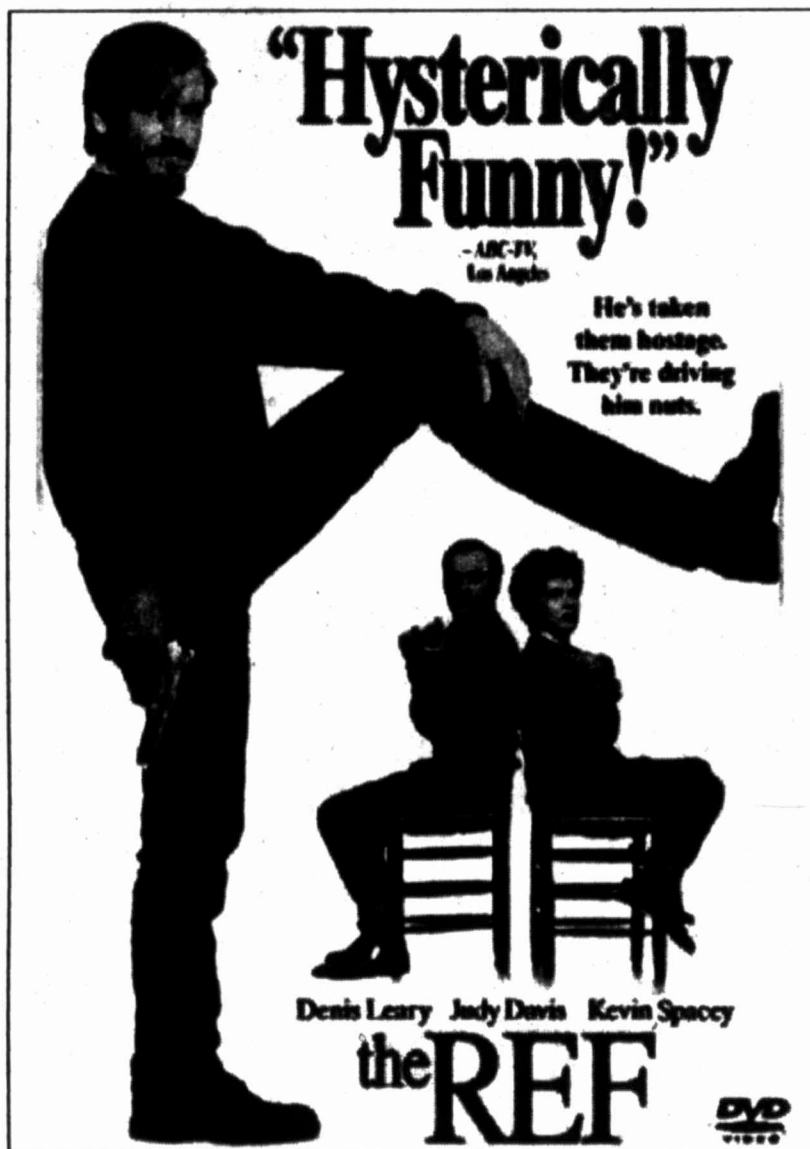
fide hit by the time this 1989 part of the series rolled around, so much so that many consider this to be the best one of the four (the 1996 "Vegas Vacation" shall not be discussed).

In this installment we find Clark as he is eagerly anticipating his bonus to buy the family a pool. We see that once again Rusty and Audrey have defied the age barrier and that Rusty (Johnny Galecki) is now about 12 years old again. Audrey (Juliette Lewis) is now older as well. of the movies. Describing slapstick comedies is something that takes a lot of skill, probably more than I have. However I can say this: If you're a fan of the "Vacation" movies, then you'll want to add this to your collection. The supporting cast is great and Randy Quaid steals the show. A must-see for the Christmas holiday.

"Bad Santa"

Yes, all the horrible things you've heard about the Billy Bob Thornton movie "Bad Santa" are true. It is crude, vulgar, twisted, deplorable, sick, immoral, depraved, loathsome, debauched and vile.

Thornton's character, Willie T. Stokes, is the most despicable man to ever wear a Santa suit, and how Stokes transforms from a man with no morals whatsoever to... well, a slightly decent fellow makes for one of the funniest, most ingenious comedies to make it the silver screen in a long time.

It's about time someone made a holiday themed comedy for adults, so make sure the kids are tucked snugly in bed for this one. Willie T. Stokes is one of those sad, miserable people who hate everything about life, but somehow keeps on living anyway. For years, Willie and his dwarf partner Marcus — played masterfully by Tony Cox — have ostensibly been working from one side of the country to the other as a department store Santa and elf, using their gig to case

each store for a Christmas Eve robbery, cracking the safe and grabbing all the goodies they can get into their van.

After one exceptionally good haul, Willie is ready to give it all up and open a small beachside bar in Miami. Marcus has heard all of this before, and despite his partner's protests, starts to plan next year's gig. Sure enough, when the fall has rolled around, Willie has blown

their jobs before they've even started, something Marcus has obviously had a lot of past training with, a well developed skill

lead role. To play the straight man against such a talented group of comedic actors takes a lot of courage, and Thornton's

performance is nothing short of perfect. His Willie is the most cantankerous cinematic anti-hero since Walter Matthau in "The Bad News Bears."

Cox, long recognizable from his minor supporting roles in such films as "Beetlejuice," "I'm Gonna Git You Sucka" and "Me, Myself and

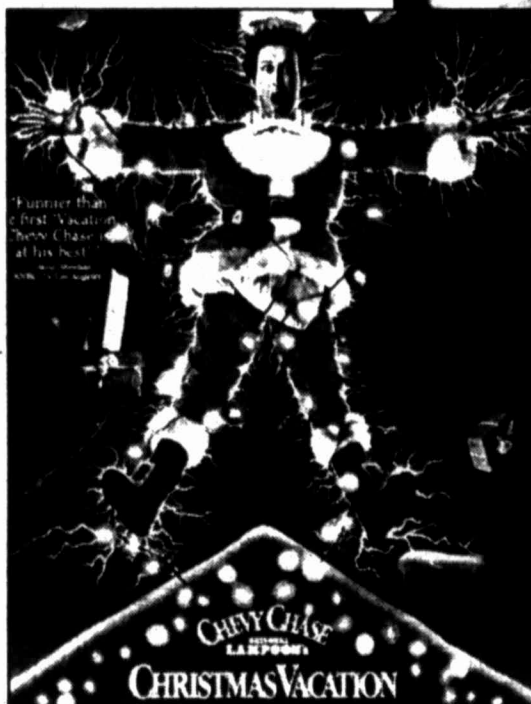
