

# With no recourse, county to focus on jail repairs

Caught between the unpleasant realities of no jail on one hand and no hope of a new jail on the other, Howard County officials agree the best course of action is to get the current facility back up and running.

And the sooner the better, they say.

In the wake of the failure of a smoke evacuation test Wednesday — just the latest in a long string of shortcomings in

the jail — County Sheriff Dale Walker closed the facility to all overnight prisoners.

Formal notice from the state jail standards commission to close the facility is expected within the next few days, but Walker was in no mood to wait for a decision he considered inevitable.

"If we have a fire up there, they're dead," Walker said, "and I can't sleep knowing the situation is what it is."

Potential liability now greatly outweighs all other concerns,

City Fire Marshal Carl Condray said.

"Liability was an issue back before March, when we first tested the smoke evacuation system," Condray said. "Now, I don't see how anybody can claim any differently ... One wrongful death lawsuit is going to make the cost of a new jail seem like a drop in the bucket."

With the jail closed to overnight prisoners, county officials must ship those persons to other facilities, and estimates of annual costs asso-

ciated with that practice start county officials quickly agree at \$1 million and go up from the best course of action is to there.

# Grants

## Kentwood, Marcy to receive funds for at-risk students

Two Big Spring Independent School District campuses will soon receive grants totaling \$100,000 to improve educational opportunities for at-risk students.

Kentwood and Marcy elementaries will each receive grants of \$50,000 from the Investment Capital Fund, which was established by the Texas Education Agency to help schools improve student achievement, BSISD Superintendent Michael Downes said.

The two local schools were among 88 campuses statewide to receive the grants and the only ones — aside from two schools in Midland — in the Permian Basin, Downes noted.

consecutive year that two local campuses have received the ICF grants.

Last year, Goliad Intermediate and Washington

Elementary were beneficiaries.

"Four \$50,000 grants in two years is phenomenal," Downes said.

"They had to submit a grant application, which was reviewed against other applications across the state."

Kentwood Principal Karen Saunders said the campus will use the money to target test scores from students in various economic and social sub-groups.

# HC officials mull possible expansion in San Angelo

Possible expansion of services at the San Angelo campus will be the major topic of conversation when the Howard College board of trustees hold their regular meeting at 12:30 p.m. Monday in the East Room of Garrett Coliseum.

College President Dr. Cheryl Sparks said officials will dis-

cuss construction of a new Allied Health building and further renovation of the West Texas Training Center — which houses most HC services in San Angelo — during the meeting.

Financing for new construction in San Angelo

must come from non-taxpayer sources, such as private donations and student fees, Sparks noted.

The college's goal is to consolidate courses and services at one site, she said.

"At the present time, students in San Angelo attend classes at two separate locations," Sparks said. "We've been gradually moving classes to the training

center ... and a new allied health building would help us put all of our services on one site — and allow for future growth."

Consolidation of services is much on college officials' minds, especially since courses in San Angelo produce the biggest chunk of HC enrollment figures, Sparks noted.

"This past fall, enrollment

spiked at our San Angelo campus," she said.

"That was a result of dual-enrollment courses — mostly in the career-training area — we conduct with the San Angelo school district."

## SERVE LOTS OF CHEESE

BEIJING (AP) — China will use mice to test the safety of food for athletes competing in the 2008 Olympic Games, state media said.

"Milk, alcohol, salad, rice, oil, salt and seasonings will be tested by white mice 24 hours before they are used in cooking or served to athletes," Xinhua News Agency quoted Zhao Xincheng of the Beijing Municipal Health Inspection Bureau as saying.

Zhao told a meeting on hygiene safety for the games that the mice would develop an adverse reaction to any food poisoning within 17 hours, sooner than test methods such as bacteria cultures.

# Barnes & Noble and Borders to carry new O.J. Simpson book

NEW YORK (AP) — The nation's two largest superstore chains, Barnes & Noble, Inc. and Borders Group, Inc., will sell the new O.J. Simpson book, with Borders expecting "strong sales" and Barnes & Noble saying it has no plans to donate proceeds to charity.

"Barnes & Noble will carry O.J. Simpson's new book, 'If I Did It,' just as we do every book in print," spokeswoman Mary Ellen Keating said Friday in a statement.

"As always with publicity books like this we prepare for strong sales, but ultimately it is up to the customers' reaction to the

publicity," Bill Nasshan, Borders' senior vice president of adult trade merchandising, said in a statement.

Keating said Barnes & Noble had not seen the book and did not know how it would promote "If I Did It." Borders spokeswoman Ann Binkley said Friday that the book will have "easily visible" placement in stores, but that any profits will be donated to a charity, currently undetermined, that opposes domestic violence.

Numerous independent stores, appalled by Simpson's book, in which the former football star

speculates how he would have killed his ex-wife, have said either they won't sell it or will offer limited copies and give away the proceeds.

"We probably won't stock the book, but if somebody comes and asks for it, we'll order it for them and then donate the money," said Lise Friedman, manager of Dutton's Brentwood Books, in the Los Angeles County community where Simpson lived at the time of the murders.

"If I Did It" comes out Nov. 30, following a two-part interview on Fox Broadcasting, and interest appears strong, but

not overwhelming. Since the book's announcement late Tuesday, it has steadily climbed on the best seller list of Amazon.com, reaching No. 20 as of Friday.

According to an official of the Mystery Writers of America, Simpson's book will essentially be treated as "true crime," a genre that traditionally sells best at superstores, with independent sellers preferring purely fictional works. Reed Farrell Coleman, executive vice president of MWA, also said independent stores had more reason to worry about anger against the Simpson book.

"An independent store depends more on a faithful clientele, which it can't afford to offend. Superstores are more likely simply to respond to public demand," Coleman said.

Earlier Friday, publisher Judith Regan of ReganBooks, a HarperCollins imprint, said she took on "If I Did

It" because she was a victim of domestic violence and thought any proceeds would go to Simpson's children.

get the current jail up to acceptable state standards.

"I think that's what we're really focused on right now," Commissioner Jerry Kilgore said. "No one is pointing fingers or placing blame. I think there's a consensus that we need to fix the problems at the jail."

The first step in that direction will occur at 9 a.m. Tuesday, when county commissioners hold a special meeting at the

courthouse. They are scheduled to discuss steps to bring two major safety issues at the jail up to state standards.

Those concerns, as expressed by Condray, are the smoke evacuation system and the lack of a standpipe, which would supply firefighting water to the facility.

"I think as long as they get the smoke evacuation system and the standpipe up to specs, there's a very good chance the state's remedial order could be rescinded," Condray said. "Those ... issues were not being complied with, and the state finally said, 'Enough.'"

Of course, fixing those problems won't come cheaply.

"I have no doubt these problems can be fixed (within the next few months)," Condray said. "It's just going to cost a tremendous amount of money. Is that going to be cost-effective? I don't really know."

Kilgore said the cost of getting the jail in compliance has been estimated at \$250,000 or more, but said the county has no other feasible choice in the matter.

"I'm hoping we can do it (within the next few months)," Kilgore said. "If we can resolve the life-

safety issues, we'll still have all the other issues up there, but we'll at least have addressed the safety issues ... I think we can do it, and do it quickly."

will be a regular Parent Night at the school, in which teachers will meet with parents to offer tips on how to help their children with homework.

After school tutoring for students, as well as specialized training for teachers of at-risk stu-

dents also will be offered, Saunders said.


At Marcy, Principal Carrie Dunnam plans similar efforts.

"We will focus on our most at-risk students, the ones who tend not to get the kind of support most students should," Dunnam said.

A regularly scheduled after-school program, which will provide tutor-

ing in reading and homework — is scheduled. In addition, efforts to increase parental involvement will be pursued, as will training for teachers of at-risk students, Dunnam noted.

# Largest budget in state history hits snag

AUSTIN — Estimates show Texas will soon be sitting on the largest budget surplus the state has ever seen, but a quirk in the law may prohibit lawmakers from spending a large chunk of it.

A spending limit put in the state constitution in 1978 to limit the growth of government could leave as much as \$5 billion of an estimated \$15 billion surplus off limits. But this year's school finance legislation requires the state to spend more to make up for lower property tax rates in local school districts.

"There could be a requirement that we leave 3 to 5 billion dollars on the table," Rep. Jim Pitts, chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, told a group of foster-home agencies. "Those funds are there, but they won't be able to be spent on some of the programs that you would like for us to spend them

on." The Legislature can vote to circumvent the limit, but the politics of that are dicey in the Republican-controlled state government.

The spending limit, which is based on the state's economic indicators, has not yet been set. Several experts estimate that the spending limit will be well under the cost of maintaining state services at their current levels and paying for the property tax rate reduction.

"The question is, how do they present that vote" to circumvent the limit, asked Bill Allaway, president of the Texas Taxpayer and Research Association.

In approving the school finance legislation, "the Legislature made a policy decision to do something that most people said the state ought to do. That's the simple reality of it and it shouldn't be painted as some kind of evil, underhanded massive

growth in state government," Allaway said.

Conservatives perennially criticize any efforts to increase state spending.

"If we're going to be conservatives we've got to address spending," said Rep. Warren Chisum, R-Pampa. "That's what conservatives do, make sure we get bang for our bucks and not just keep spending money. If we don't, we'll suffer the same fate they did in Washington, D.C. We'll be out on the streets."

Chisum said he would only support circumventing the spending limit if the additional spending was dedicated to property tax relief. A spokesman for House Speaker Tom Craddick said the Midland Republican also would only support exceeding the spending limit for property tax relief.

A spokesman for Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst did not return repeated calls from The Associated

Press. Mike Morrissey, Gov. Rick Perry's budget policy analyst, said Perry wants lawmakers to change the way the spending limit is calculated, so that the limit would not apply to property tax relief.

If the surplus estimate holds true, it means lawmakers will have \$15 billion more to spend in the 2008-09 budget cycle.

The budget allocates money to all state agencies and operations, with more than half spent on education. Health and Human Services takes the next largest chunk, accounting for about 24 percent of the state budget.

In contrast, lawmakers wrote the 2004-05 budget in the face of a \$10 billion revenue shortfall. Some of the cuts in that budget haven't been restored.

This year, state agencies were asked to cut at least 10 percent from last year's budget when they submitted their spending

requests to lawmakers. Perry has repeatedly said the lower numbers will only be a starting point for crafting their budget.

The request is "an effort to identify any efficiencies that haven't been previously identified to see if, basically, there's any, where to trim the fat," said Sen. Steve Ogden, R-Bryan.

The Health and Human Services Commission proposed cutting almost 1,800 employees to comply with the request.

The Texas Education Agency proposed cuts to the Student Success Initiative, which was established in 1999 to ensure that third- and fifth-grade students struggling in reading and math get intense instruction in those areas.

"I'd rather not cut money from the Student Success Initiative, but this is where a very large amount of money is budgeted," said Texas Education Commissioner Shirley Neeley.

## Contract Bridge

### Good Reasoning Helps a Lot

The bidding:

Declarer often knows a lot about how the opposing cards are divided before the play begins. This knowledge, acquired from the bidding, frequently guides him to the best line of play.  
Consider this deal where West leads a ♠ jack against three notrump, declarer winning East's king with the ace. How should he proceed?  
There are two obvious approaches

to the play. One is to force out the ace of clubs, hoping to acquire nine tricks by way of four clubs, one diamond, two hearts and two spades. The other is to start with a diamond finesse, hoping West has the king.

Both methods of play fail in the actual deal, the first because the clubs are divided 4-1, and the second because the diamond finesse loses. Declarer goes down at least one either way.

However, both lines of play are wrong! South knows from East's takeout double that East is likely to have the king of diamonds and probably four clubs as well. Consequently, a third line of play, not nearly so obvious, is clearly indicated.

Declarer should lead a heart to the ace at trick two and return a low club from dummy. There is absolutely nothing East can do at this point to defeat the contract. If he goes up with the ace, South acquires four club tricks, and his troubles are over.

And if East plays low instead, allowing South to win with the jack, declarer abandons clubs and takes a diamond finesse. East wins with the king, but South then has nine tricks — four diamonds, two hearts, two spades and a club — ready to go.

# Jury sentences teen to life in prison

HOUSTON — A teenager described as a white supremacist was sentenced Friday to life in prison for savagely beating and sodomizing a Hispanic boy at a drug-fueled party.

David Henry Tuck, 18, was convicted Thursday of aggravated sexual assault in the near-fatal attack. Witnesses testified that he hurled racial insults and shouted "white power" while sodomizing the 17-year-old victim with the plastic pole of a patio umbrella.

Prosecutor Mike Trent told the jury that Tuck's history of violence showed he is beyond rehabilitation and would commit more attacks if released.

"He is an evil person, and he is

not going to change or get better," Trent said. "We need protection from him. You are the only ones that provide that."

"Even if you give him life in prison, it will be more mercy than he showed to (the victim) that night," Trent said.

After the jury imposed the sentence, Tuck's mother, Sharon, hugged the victim's mother in the courtroom.

"I am so sorry," Sharon Tuck said as they both cried. She also hugged the victim, whom The Associated Press has not identified because he is a juvenile sexual assault victim.

The assault took place at a party in the Houston suburbs where several youths had gathered to drink alcohol and take drugs, including marijuana, cocaine and the anti-

anxiety medication Xanax. According to testimony, the attack was triggered by the victim's drunken pass at a 12-year-old girl and his attempt to steal drugs.

Doctors did not initially expect the boy to live. He was hospitalized for more than three months and underwent 20 to 30 operations. He testified Wednesday that he remembered nothing of the assault.

Defense attorney Chuck Hinton appealed to the jury's religious faith, saying that Jesus would show Tuck mercy.

"I know that justice has to be done. I know a terrible thing happened. Justice needs to be done, but with mercy," Hinton said.

He also said Tuck had an abusive, absent father and was raised by a single working mother.

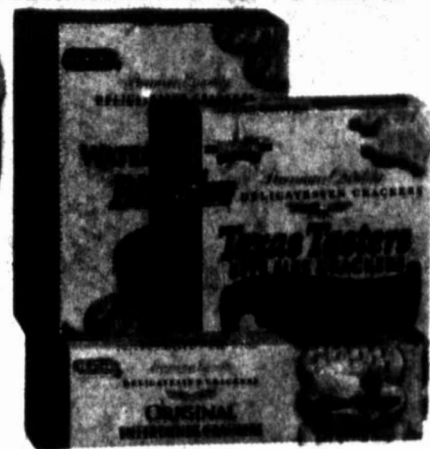

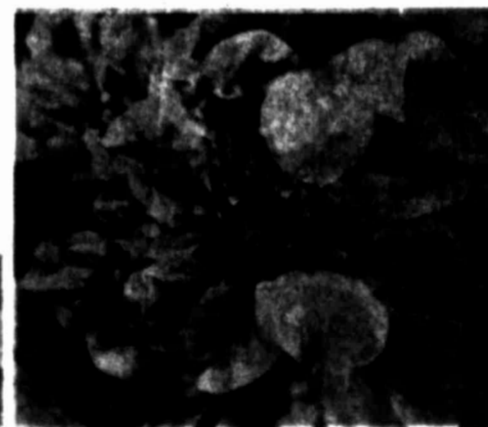

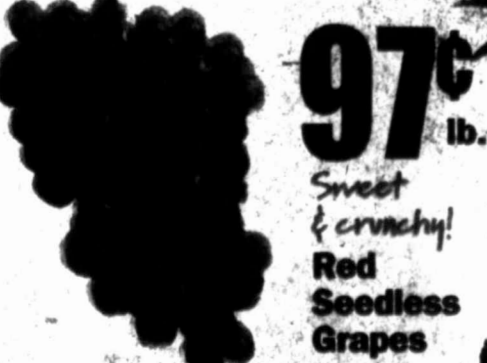

**Bush works to strengthen coalition against North Korea at APEC summit in Vietnam**

HANOI, Vietnam (AP) — President Bush, trying to fortify global pressure on North Korea, on Saturday backed Pacific Rim leaders in demanding that the communist regime abandon its nuclear weapons program.

In Hanoi for the annual summit of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation forum, Bush worked to preserve U.S. solidarity with five nations getting ready to restart nuclear negotiations with Pyongyang.

The White House endorsed a statement all 21 Pacific Rim members will issue to express their worries about North Korea's first nuclear test on Oct. 9 and its missile launches in July. "I think we're pleased with that statement and I think it will be a good contribution to the diplomacy," National Security Adviser Stephen Hadley told reporters.

But while cheered with the APEC statement against North Korea, Bush failed to win South Korea's support for intercepting ships suspected of carrying supplies possibly bound for North Korea's nuclear weapons program.

The president spent the afternoon at the APEC forum, held at a gleaming, massive building that Vietnam constructed especially for the summit in hopes of elevating its global profile. The leaders were gathering again in the evening for a gala dinner and cultural performance.

**Iranian TV: Previously unknown group claims responsibility for abduction of Westerners**

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — A previously unknown group has claimed responsibility for abducting a private security team of four Americans and an Austrian in southern Iraq, an Iranian-run Arabic-language satellite news station reported Saturday.

Al-Alam television posted a report on its Web site saying the group, called Islamic Companies, claimed responsibility for the kidnapping. The network said the group released a videotaped message saying that it was holding the five men. The Web site report could not immediately be verified.

A photo with the report showed an unidentified man whose face was covered with a checkered Arabic head dress reading the statement. He demanded the withdrawal of American forces and the release of all prisoners in Iraq.

Gunmen wearing police uniforms abducted the security team on Thursday near Safwan, a largely Sunni Arab city of 200,000 people in southern Iraq. The attack took place shortly after the Westerners had crossed the Kuwaiti border with a large convoy of supply trucks.

**Rock-throwing demonstrators clash with police outside finance chiefs' meeting**

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — Police on horseback and wielding batons clashed with rock- and bottle-throwing demonstrators outside a meeting of some of the world's top financial officials Saturday.

The confrontation turned what had been promised as a peaceful rally against poverty into running street skirmishes.

One officer was taken to hospital with a wrist broken by a toppled steel barricade and several other police received scratches and bruises but stayed on duty, police said.

Two demonstrators were arrested, and more arrests were expected, Victoria state Chief Commissioner Christine Nixon said.

"They threw missiles and rocks, ... bins — anything they could get their hands on they threw it at police and damaged property," she told reporters. "We have

not had anything like this, any kind of violent demonstration in the last six years."

Police on horseback and other uniform and riot officers brandishing shields and batons kept protesters out of the plush hotel where U.S. Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke and top officials from Europe, Asia and Latin America opened two days of talks on global economic issues.

**California's '60 Freeway Slayer' convicted of first-degree murder, could face death penalty**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A man nicknamed the "60 Freeway Slayer" could face the death penalty after being convicted in the 1993 and 1994 strangulations of six women.

A jury deliberated Friday for about three days before finding Ivan Hill, 45, guilty of first-degree murder. He also was found guilty of special circumstance allegations of multiple murders and having a prior murder conviction.

The jury was scheduled to begin the penalty phase Nov. 29.

The case drew its name from the 60 Freeway, also known as the Pomona Freeway. Bodies were found along the route running from Los Angeles County eastward into San Bernardino County.

During the trial, the defense acknowledged Hill killed the women, but disputed the prosecution's claim the slayings were premeditated.

**Evidence directly linking suspect to deadly California arson wildfire remains unclear**

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP) — Prosecutors who charged a man with setting a wildfire that killed five firefighters say they have overwhelming evidence against him, despite the difficulty of proving arson cases.

The attorney for Raymond Lee Oyler, however, insists his client has an "airtight alibi" for the night the blaze was set and points out that prosecutors haven't made public any evidence directly linking him to the fire.

Attorneys watching the case say it's unusual for the district attorney's office to be so adamant about its case so early in the prosecution, particularly in an arson investigation. Arsons are challenging to prove because evidence often burns and suspects can be miles away creating an alibi by the time anyone notices flames.

"It's unusual for a DA to speak in such absolute terms," said Steve Harmon, a Riverside defense attorney who's handled arson cases. "I've heard, 'We have a strong case' or 'We are building a strong case,' but never 'overwhelming.'"

Within hours of its start on Oct. 26, the Esperanza Fire killed five members of San Bernardino National Forest's Engine 57. It also destroyed dozens of homes in the region 90 miles east of Los Angeles.

**Iraqi fo Shiite to free**

BAGHDAD, Iraq — U.S. and Iraqi forces raided a Shiite stronghold in Baghdad Saturday, looking for dozens of men abducted from an Iraqi government office. Coalition forces searched for American security tractors missing in an attack on their convoy southern Iraq.

Iraqi soldiers boarded U.S. helicopters through the Sadr section of the city motivated by intelligence indicating an American group was holding Iraqi hostages, the military said.

The statement did not say whether the hostages were found. Casualties were reported among coalition forces, but Iraqi police said three Iraqi civilians were wounded.

Gunmen dressed in Interior Ministry uniforms abducted 150 men Tuesday from the central Baghdad office that handles atomic grants exchanges. The men were handcuffed and driven away about 20 miles up trucks. About 100 were released Tuesday night Wednesday.

A Sunni who said he was among the hostages freed claimed the captors broke his hands. He said he saw them at least three hours after taking them to empty houses in the City Shiite slum.

The mass kidnapping was widely believed to have been the work of the Mahdi Army, a heavily armed militia anti-American cleric Muqtada al-Sadr.

The kidnapping raised questions about Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki's commitment to wiping out the militia, his prime political opponents: the Supreme Council for the Islamic Revolution in Iraq and al-Sadr's Sadr Movement.

Sadr City has long been a Shiite militia stronghold.

A rogue cell from the Madhi Army militia is suspected of kidnapping an American soldier last month.

# Iraqi forces raid Shiite stronghold to free hostages

BAGHDAD, Iraq — U.S. and Iraqi forces raided a Shiite stronghold in Baghdad on Saturday, looking for dozens of men abducted from an Iraqi government office. Coalition forces searched for four American security contractors missing in an attack on their convoy in southern Iraq.

Iraqi soldiers backed by U.S. helicopters swept through the Sadr City section of the capital motivated by intelligence indicating an armed group was holding the Iraqi hostages, the U.S. military said.

The statement did not say whether any hostages were found. No casualties were reported among coalition forces, but Iraqi police said three Iraqi civilians were wounded.

Gunmen dressed like Interior Ministry commandos abducted some 150 men Tuesday from the central Baghdad office that handles academic grants and exchanges. The men were handcuffed and driven away about 20 pickup trucks. About half were released on Tuesday night and Wednesday.

A Sunni who says he was among the hostages freed claimed the kidnapers broke his arm. He said he saw them kill at least three hostages after taking them to empty houses in the Sadr City Shiite slum.

The mass kidnapping was widely believed to have been the work of the Mahdi Army, the heavily armed militia of anti-American Shiite cleric Muqtada al-Sadr.

The kidnapping has raised questions about Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki's commitment to wiping out the militias of his prime political backers: the Supreme Council for the Islamic Revolution in Iraq and al-Sadr's Sadrist Movement.

Sadr City has long been a Shiite militia stronghold.

A rogue cell from the Madhi Army militia also is suspected of having kidnapped an Iraqi-American soldier last month.

Ahmed Qusai al-Taayie, a 41-year-old reserve soldier from Ann Arbor, Mich., was visiting his Iraqi wife in Baghdad on Oct. 23 when

gunmen handcuffed him and took him away.

Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice on Saturday reiterated Washington's determination to support the "small seeds" of Iraqi democracy, but she said that success depends on the government and people of Iraq themselves.

It is up to Iraqis to "face up to their differences and realize that they only have one future, and that's a future together," Rice said at the Asia-Pacific summit in Vietnam. "They don't have a future if they try and stay apart."

In southern Iraq, coalition forces searched for four Americans and one Austrian missing since Thursday when their Kuwait-based security convoy was hijacked, said U.S. Embassy spokesman Michael McClellan.

Islamic Companies, a previously unknown group, claimed responsibility for the kidnapping, according to an Iranian-run Arabic-language satellite news station. It said the group released a videotaped message saying it was holding the five men and demanded the withdrawal of U.S. forces from Iraq and the release of all prisoners being held there.

Also Saturday, Britain's Treasury chief Gordon Brown, who is expected to replace Prime Minister Tony Blair as Britain's leader next year, made an unannounced visit to Iraq to meet with Iraqi officials and British soldiers. In an interview with Al-Jazeera TV Friday, Blair said British forces will remain in Iraq to fight the country's insurgents and militias as long as Iraq's government wants them to.

Those comments were echoed by Brown on Saturday.

"We are committed to supporting the Iraqis in building a democratic nation which brings security and prosperity to its people and plays a full part in the region and the world economy."

Britain has about 7,200 troops in southern Iraq, mostly stationed in and around Basra.

Brown also was using the trip to announce \$190 million of increased reconstruction aid to Iraq from the British government over the next three years.

# Wait for Playstations turns violent

HARTFORD, Conn. — Two armed thugs tried to rob a line of people waiting for the new PlayStation 3 game system to go on sale early Friday and shot one man who refused to give up his money, authorities said.

In Sullivan, Ind., a man was in critical condition after emergency surgery for a stab wound after he and a friend tried to rob two men of consoles they waited 36 hours in line to buy, police said.

Nationwide, short supplies of the PS3 and strong demand led to long lines of buyers, some waiting for days outside stores. Once the doors opened Friday, they pushed and shoved their way to the shelves in several cities to get at the limited supply. Two people were arrested in Fresno, Calif., after a crowd trampled people in a parking lot.

It was about 3 a.m. when the two gunmen in Putnam, a town of about 9,000 residents in northeast Connecticut, confronted 15 to 20 people standing outside a Wal-Mart store and demanded money, said State Police Lt. J. Paul Vance.

"One of the patrons resisted. That patron was shot," Vance said.

Vance said the gunmen fled after shooting Michael Penkala, 21, of Webster, Mass., in the chest and

shoulder. Penkala was in stable condition at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center in Worcester, Mass., with injuries not believed to be life-threatening, Vance said.

Police were searching for the suspects, both believed to be in their teens, Vance said. He said one was wearing a ski mask and brandishing a handgun, and the other had what appeared to be a shotgun.

About 30 miles away, another shopper was beaten and robbed of his new PlayStation 3 just minutes after he bought it at a store in Manchester, police said.

The shopper told police five men surrounded and beat him as he left the Shoppes at Buckland Hills.

Police Sgt. Chris Davis said the attackers pushed one of their cohorts out of the car as they drove away. That man, a 17-year-old from Windsor, was charged with robbery, larceny, assault and breach of peace.

Four other teenagers were arrested, and more arrests were expected, police told WTNH-TV late Friday.

Andrew Templeton, 20, and David Wiggins, 28, of Sullivan, Ind., were assaulted by two teens after waiting for 36 hours at a Super Wal-Mart, police said.

They were unloading their PlayStation 3s from their car when

two teens approached them carrying a chain and a tire iron and demanding their consoles, said Sullivan Police Chief David Story.

A fight broke out. Wiggins' nose was broken, and he stabbed one of the attackers, Dylan Moss, 19, police said. Moss was in critical condition after surgery, officials said.

Sullivan County Prosecutor Bob Springer said he plans to charge Moss and accomplice Dustin Fagg, 19, with felony robbery.

Elsewhere, two men wearing black ski masks and sunglasses made off with five consoles after holding two employees at gunpoint at an Englewood, Ohio, video game store Thursday night, police said.

A Pennsylvania teenager was also robbed of his new PlayStation by a man who tapped on his car window with a handgun in Allentown, police said.

In Lexington, Ky., someone fired BB pellets from a passing vehicle at people waiting outside a Best Buy store, according to WKYT, whose own reporter said she was among four people grazed while she interviewed buyers in line.

Police fired a talcum powder ball at the ground outside a Target store in Henrico, Va., to get the attention of an unruly crowd of about 350 people.

# Israeli leader urges tougher stance

RAMALLAH, West Bank — Israel should ignore moderate Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas, wipe out the Hamas leadership and walk away from the U.S.-backed "road map" peace plan, Israel's new deputy prime minister, Avigdor Lieberman, said Saturday.

Prime Minister Ehud Olmert forged an alliance with Lieberman, one of Israel's most divisive politicians, last month to shore up his shaky coalition. The appointment of Lieberman as minister of strategic affairs raised concern that Olmert's government, weakened by the summer's war in Lebanon, would freeze all peace efforts.

Olmert's spokeswoman, Miri Eislin, had no comment Saturday on Lieberman's latest remarks laying out his views on the conflict with

Palestinians. Palestinian negotiator Saeb Erekat, a top Abbas aide, said Lieberman is stuck in the past and that his ideas "are a recipe for the continuation of bloodshed, violence, extremism and hatred between the two sides."

In an interview with Israel Radio, Lieberman proposed a series of measures, based on what he said is his belief that the Palestinians are not interested in setting up their own state, but rather in destroying Israel.

Israel must walk away

from interim peace deals, the so-called Oslo Accords, and from the U.S.-backed "road map" plan, which envisions the establishment of a Palestinian state alongside Israel in several stages, he said.

"A continuation of Oslo, of the road map ... will lead us to another round of conflict, a much more bloody round, and in the end to an even deeper deadlock, and it threatens our future," he said.

He dismissed Abbas, elected president in 2005, as an ineffective leader

and said he should be ignored, in favor of closer coordination with the Jordanian government about the fate of the West Bank.

"We have a reliable partner there which is Jordan," he said. "We have to coordinate with Jordan. We have to say that Abbas is simply not relevant ..."

# Scarecrow teaches tolerance

Did you ever ask yourself why the Witch of the West was so wicked? Do you think it might be because she was green?

Everyone recognizes the witch with the green skin as the Wicked Witch of the West in the film "The Wizard of Oz," a Thanksgiving favorite televised each year.

We travel with Dorothy, a heartless tin man, a cowardly lion and a brainless scarecrow to the Emerald City to find the Wizard. On the way, they are confronted by the Witch, who is really ticked off because Dorothy's house just landed on her sister.

In 1900, L. Frank Baum wrote the story on which the film is based, "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz." Ninety-five years later, author Gregory Maguire explored the story from the Witch's point of view. His novel "Wicked: The Life and Times of the Wicked Witch of the West" is replayed in a hit Broadway musical.

Maguire makes the Witch human by christening her Elphaba, a name he derived from Baum's initials. He gives her a family that includes her sister, Nessa, who becomes the legendary Wicked Witch of the East. But no one else shares Elphaba's green skin, and as she grows up, people treat Elphaba as an oddity because she is different from everyone else.

At school, Elphaba meets Glinda, a good witch who learns to look past her skin color as they become lifelong friends. She falls in love with a prince named Fiyero, who sometimes masquerades as a scare-

crow - the same scarecrow who accompanies Dorothy to the Emerald City. Together, Elphaba and Fiyero fight injustice in the land of Oz - the kind caused when you judge someone harshly because they are different from you.

This past Thursday, Nov. 16, was set aside by the United Nations as the International Day for Tolerance. Make a scarecrow like the one from Oz to remind you that it's never a good idea to judge a book by its cover - or people by the color of their skin. I found directions for this craft at <http://crafttown.com> on the Web and modified them for our use.

- Supplies you will need:
- 2 ounces fancy flat natural raffia.
  - Small plastic pumpkin.
  - Miniature straw hat.
  - Twine.
  - Scissors.
  - Low-temp glue gun.
  - Cloth scraps for clothing.
  - Black markers.

Fold raffia in half. Force the pumpkin over the top of the fold. Use glue to secure.

Make facial features on the pumpkin with a marker. Glue a few pieces of raffia on top for hair and glue on the hat.

Separate and tie off the raffia into four equal sections.

Fold pieces of fabric in half and cut simple shapes for a shirt and pants. Glue seams together around the arms



and legs. Reposition the twine holding the arms and trim.

## Odds and Ends

SYDNEY, Australia (AP) — An American caught 116 tossed grapes in his mouth in three minutes in what he hopes will become a Guinness World Record, according to his publicity team.

Steve Spalding, 44, of Dallas, set a personal record for endurance grape catching, using his mouth to catch 1,203 grapes thrown from a distance of 15 feet over half an hour, publicist Deanna Brown said.

No Guinness World Records officials were present at Spalding's grape-gobbling attempt, carried out Thursday in Australia overlooking Sydney's iconic Opera House.

But Brown said observers had filmed Spalding's attempt and would be submitting forms to Guinness officials in the hopes of creating a record for speed grape catching — the most grapes caught in the mouth in three minutes. No such record currently exists, she said.

Guinness World Records has no offices in Australia. The organization could not be reached for comment.

GAINESVILLE, Fla.

(AP) — A small black object that was found on the bottom of a woman's sport utility vehicle, prompting three blocks to be evacuated, wasn't a bomb after all.

It was a Global Positioning System, said Sgt. Stephen Maynard of the Alachua County Sheriff's Office.

A temporary shelter was set up at the Queen of Peace Church to house 45 people who had been evacuated early Friday, while authorities investigated for more than two hours.

After learning the woman and her husband were going through a divorce, detectives discovered that the woman's husband had hired a private investigator. He admitted attaching the tracking device to the woman's SUV, Maynard said.

Bomb technicians used a robot to confirm the box was a GPS, he said.

The names of the woman and her husband were not released.

# When love blossoms in the nursing home

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Jayne Porter and Raymond Brooks think they met in their retirement home breakfast room about three weeks ago. Sparks flew.

What was it exactly? Was it the way Brooks, 91, pushed Porter, 92, in her wheelchair?

"We don't know why," Brooks admitted. What he does know is this: These two residents of a long-term care unit at John Knox Village connected "right off the bat."

Intimacy happens, even at long-term care facilities. And when it does, what a tangled web it can weave.

Care-center employees haven't always looked kindly on elderly people having romantic feelings — and acting on them. Family members who have the same reservations also have the power to short-circuit nursing-home romances, and have been known to do so.

Then there are the logistics. Double rooms, the standard in long-term care facilities, pose the same issues they do in college dormitories. And sometimes, nursing-home residents need help just getting in and out of bed.

Because of those factors and more, intimacy "has always been a touchy issue that tends to get swept under the carpet," said Marynell Hendricks, director of family education at Garden Terrace at Overland Park, Kan.

The complications are such that the Kansas City-based Center for Practical Bioethics, at the urging of some local long-term care facilities, convened a panel a year ago to debate the issues. From that

came a set of voluntary guidelines, recently issued, emphasizing the need for care centers to establish a written policy, to train staff, and to protect vulnerable residents, particularly those with dementia.

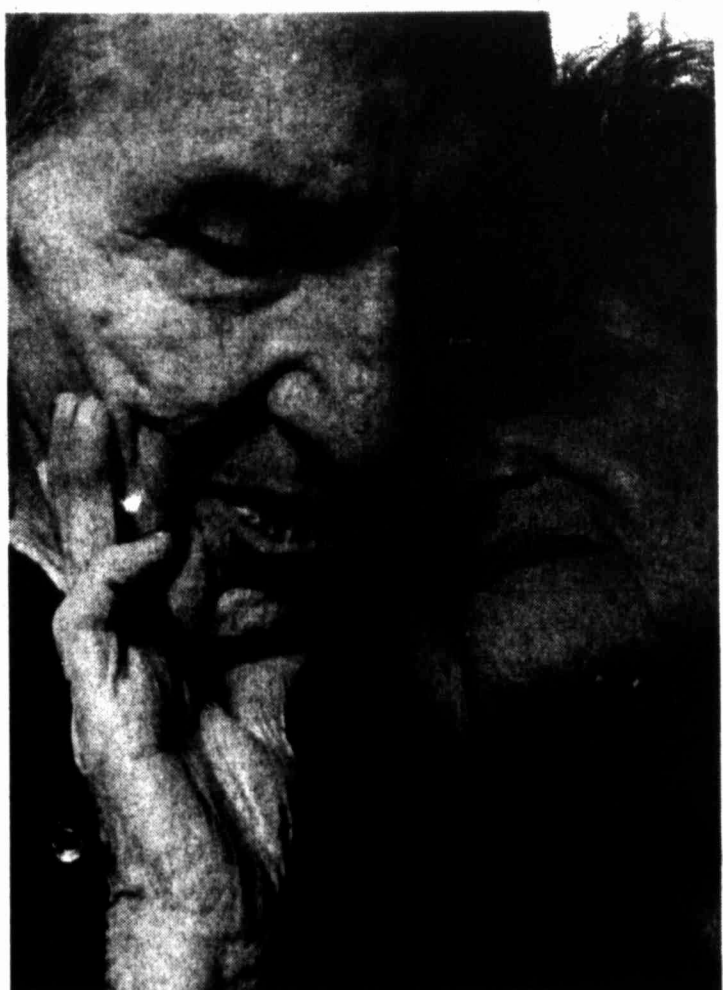
But perhaps the most fundamental point in the report is that the desire for physical intimacy is perfectly normal among people until the day they die, and should be respected.

Although many people seem to consider sexuality and other forms of physical intimacy the exclusive prerogative of the young — and possibly those in midlife — Carol Scott said, "No matter what our age, sexual expression is a part of being human." She's Missouri's long-term care ombudsman and was a member of the bioethics center's panel.

In fact, a survey of 250 residents in 15 Texas nursing homes found that 8 percent of them said they'd had sexual intercourse in the preceding month, and 17 percent more were wishing they had. In a separate study cited in the journal *Clinical Geriatrics*, 90 percent of 63 physically dependent nursing-home residents said they'd had sexual thoughts, fantasies and dreams.

When those thoughts turn to action in the fish-bowl environment of a long-term care facility, the results can be more intriguing than reality television.

Hendricks related the amorous adventures of a single man living in a facility, she once ~~map~~ ~~shouldn't~~ ~~said~~. John Carney, vice president of aging and end-of-life issues for the bioethics center. When romances

for regular visits. At the same time, the nursing-home staff noticed the man sitting and holding hands with a woman who lived in the same facility.

"It became an issue for our staff who felt they needed to say to him, 'What about this other person?'" Hendricks said. "They lost sight of the fact that this was an adult male who was able to make choices."

The morals and values of nursing-home personnel can bear heavily on such scenarios — but Carney, vice president of aging and end-of-life issues for the bioethics center. When romances

dard in long-term care facilities, pose another hurdle to those who might wish to spend a little private time together. It means asking the staff for time in a private room.

Compounding issues of morality is the possibility of litigation. Nursing homes are obligated to both respect the privacy and dignity of their residents, and, at the same time, to protect them. And what if someone is injured in the course of an intimate encounter?

Although nursing homes tend to act out of fear of lawsuits or sanctions from regulatory agencies, they needn't, said Daniel Reingold, president and chief operating officer of the Hebrew Home in New York. At his urging, his staff has taken an innovative approach to the matter.

Facilities can protect themselves by making a written policy, training their staff, communicating with residents' families, and ensuring the safety of vulnerable residents, he said.

Where romance and intimacy are concerned, Reingold sees his role mostly as one of enabler.

"We lose so many things as we age," he said. "Vision, the sense of smell, mobility. Intimacy and touching are the last pleasurable things an elderly person gives up. What made us look into it was the notion that we need to preserve that pleasure."

"To see a 90-year-old woman acting like a teenager in love," he said.

"How cool is that?"

When it comes to elder intimacy, the Hebrew Home in New York is acutely sensitive and "out there," says Daniel Reingold, its president and chief operating officer.

When the staff there learns of a coupling in the works, they don't wait for residents to ask for a private room. They make a point to relocate one of the partners to a private room if both partners are in shared rooms.

Reingold said that at the 1,000-resident facility, he currently knows of half a dozen, perhaps a dozen, people who are "exhibiting outward sexual behavior." To Reingold, it's not disconcerting — it's thrilling.

A decade ago, he and his staff began to seriously ponder the issue and how they might best serve their residents. He decided it required some attention when "a staff member came to me and said, 'Mr. So-and-so and Mrs. So-and-so are having sex. What should I do?'"

Reingold's response: "Tiptoe out and close the door."

Five or six years ago, policies were instituted. Training began.

Reingold remembers the staff being "incredibly appreciative. They said, 'Now we know what to do.'"

Very often, that's nothing at all. The policy at Hebrew Home is grounded "in the understanding that this is a resident right," Reingold said. "Anything that people might do at home, they're allowed to do here."

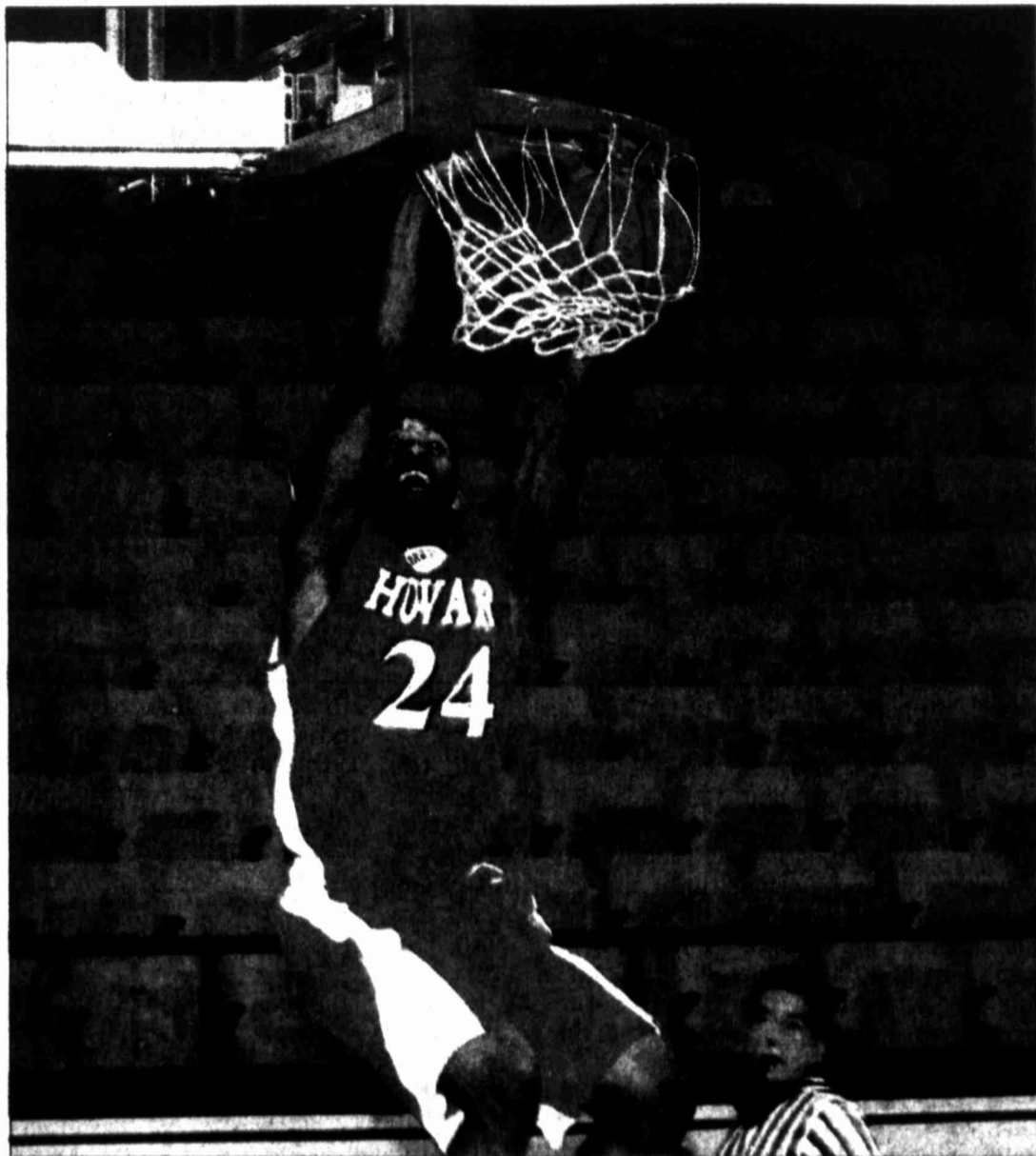

# Hawks dismantle Thunderbirds

## Howard Hawks thrive in 95-62, win over Mesa Community College

The Hawks wasted little time separating themselves from the Mesa Thunderbirds when the two teams took the court in Friday night action. Howard guard Terrence Hill led the way by scoring 11 of his team-high 19 points in the first half, and after trading opening baskets, the Hawks (6-0) never trailed and never rattled on their way to a 95-62, victory at Dorothy Garrett Coliseum.

Hill's athletic ability and shooting touch was more than the traveling T-Birds could handle, as his 9-of-13 shooting night slapped Mesa (0-2) with its second straight loss.

Brandon Sampay, the 6-foot-8 sophomore from California, did it on both ends of the court and just missed another double-double with 16 points and 9 rebounds on the night. Sampay was six of nine from the floor and four of six from the charity line as he dominated the paint.

After an early time out by Mesa, the T-Birds hit a 3-pointer to cut the

Hawks lead to 9-7, but that led to a 11-0 run for the Hawks, and Mesa could have warmed up the team bus.

They would get no closer.

Coming off the bench and lighting up the coliseum was the shooting guard from Dallas, Catrell Currie. A freshman, Currie, led the Hawk's bench as they outscored Mesa 31-19 and he finished second in scoring with 16 points.

David Burroughs kept the T-Birds' score respectable as the 6-5 sophomore showed his touch around the basket by hitting six of nine 3-pointers.

"Our game last night had nothing to do with the loss here tonight," Mesa coach and former NBA star Alton Lister said after the game. "We have four of our guys out and not dressed right now. We came in here with eight freshman tonight and that's tough, especially against a talented and tough team like Howard. I was really

## NCAA's loss, Schembechler passes

ANN ARBOR, Mich. — Bo Schembechler, who became one of college football's great coaches in two decades at Michigan, died Friday after taping a TV show on the eve of the Wolverines' No. 1 vs. No. 2 showdown with perennial rival Ohio State. He was 77.

"This is a tremendous shock and an irreplaceable loss," University of Michigan president Mary Sue Coleman said at a news conference at Providence Hospital in Southfield, where the coach died.

Schembechler collapsed at the studios of WXYZ-TV in the Detroit suburb and was taken by ambulance to the hospital. His death at 11:42 a.m. was confirmed by Mike Dowd, chief investigator for the medical examiner's office in Oakland County.

Police were sent to the station about 9:25 a.m. along with the city's fire department and escorted the ambulance, Southfield police spokesman John

Harris said.

"It was probably not a heart attack; it just stopped working," Dr. Shukri David said.

Schembechler had a heart attack on the eve of his first Rose Bowl in 1970 and another one in 1987. He had two quadruple heart-bypass operations, and doctors implanted a pacemaker to regulate his heartbeat after he became ill during a taping at WXYZ on Oct. 20.

During a news conference this week to discuss Saturday's big game, Schembechler said the device covered about half his chest and doctors still were adjusting it.

Schembechler said he did not plan to attend the game in Columbus, Ohio, and that he didn't travel to road games anymore.

"This is an extraordinary loss for college football," Ohio State coach Jim Tressel said in a statement.

"Bo Schembechler touched the lives of many people and made the game of football better in every way. He will always be

both a Buckeye and a Wolverine and our thoughts are with all who grieve his loss."

The seven-time Big Ten coach of the year compiled a 194-48-5 record at Michigan from 1969-89. Schembechler's record in 26 years of coaching was 234-65-8.

Schembechler's Wolverines were 11-9-1 against the Buckeyes. But fans in both states generally agree the rivalry's prime years were 1969-78, when Schembechler opposed his friend and coaching guru, Woody Hayes. Michigan prevailed in those meetings, going 5-4-1.

"It was a very personal rivalry," Earle Bruce, who succeeded Hayes as coach, once said. "And for the first and only time, it was as much about the coaches as it was about the game."

"Bo and Woody were very close because Bo played for Woody at Miami of Ohio, then coached with him at Ohio State. But their friendship was put on hold

when Bo took the Michigan job because it was the protege against mentor."

In their first matchup, Schembechler's team pulled off a startling upset, winning 24-12 to deny No. 1 Ohio State its second consecutive national championship. The victory came a year

after the Buckeyes embarrassed Michigan 50-14.

Thirteen of Schembechler's Michigan teams either won or shared the Big Ten championship. Fifteen of them finished in The Associated Press Top 10, with the 1985 team finish

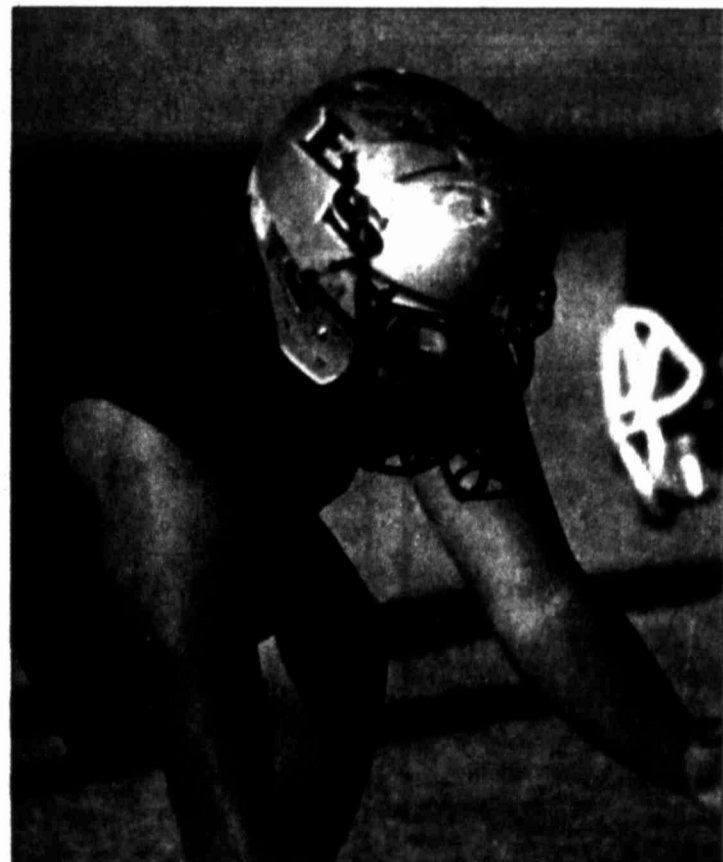

As a two-year starter for Holt and the Steers, Woodard will tell you that his best game was the playoff loss in El Paso last year. It was a game that he said he walked off the field knowing that there was nothing left in his

ing No. 2.
Seventeen of Schembechler's 21 Michigan teams earned bowl berths. Despite a .796 regular-season winning percentage, his record in bowls was a disappointing 5-12, including 2-8 in Rose Bowls.

The mythical national championship eluded Schembechler, but he said that never bothered him.

"If you think my career has been a failure because I have never won a national title, you have another thing coming," Schembechler said a few weeks before coaching his final game. "I have never played a game for the national title. Our goals always have been to win the Big Ten title and the Rose Bowl. If we do that, then we consider it a successful season."

His last game as Wolverines coach was a 17-10 loss to Southern California in the 1990 Rose Bowl. One week later, Schembechler — who also had been serving as Michigan athletic director since July 1988 — was named president of the Detroit Tigers.

Schembechler's signature moment as athletic director probably came in March 1989, when basketball coach Bill Frieder accepted a job at Arizona State on the eve of the NCAA tournament.

An angry Schembechler declared, "A Michigan man will coach Michigan, not an Arizona State man." He refused to accept Frieder's 21-day notice and named assistant Steve Fisher as interim coach.

The Wolverines went on

to win the national championship by beating Seton Hall 80-79 in overtime.

Schembechler's tenure as Tigers president was less rewarding.

Schembechler fired beloved broadcaster Ernie Harwell after the 1991 season. Harwell was brought back two years later.

Schembechler hired extra coaches for every farm team, upgraded all the facilities and introduced football-style strength and conditioning programs.

But those moves bore little fruit at the big-league level. The Tigers' last winning season was in 1993 until they advanced to the World Series this season.

Tigers owner Tom Monaghan fired Schembechler as Tigers president the day before he sold the team to Mike Ilitch in August 1992 — and 13 days before Schembechler's wife, Millie, died at age 63 of adrenal cancer. Bo Schembechler sued, claiming Monaghan had broken a contract the Domino's Pizza owner had jotted down on a napkin. They settled out of court in 1994.

Schembechler was an intense disciplinarian and his gruff persona belied his devotion to his players, both during and after their playing days in Ann Arbor.

"He preached the team from day one, and it's still being taught now," offensive guard Reggie McKenzie, who played for Schembechler from 1969-71, said when he was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003.

McKenzie said Schembechler's iron hand almost prompted him to quit. But, he said: "I

learned to beat him by doing it the right way every time, all the time. That's the attitude we had at Michigan."

While Schembechler loved coaching, he was less enamored with some other aspects of college football. In his 1989 book "Bo," co-written with Detroit Free Press sports columnist Mitch Albom, Schembechler decried drugs, sports agents and the pressures of recruiting.

"Recruiting is the worst part of college football," he wrote. "I no longer look forward to it. I can't wait until it's over. It makes me feel like a pimp."

Schembechler was born April 1, 1929 in Barberton, Ohio. He graduated in 1951 from Miami of Ohio and earned a master's degree in 1962 at Ohio State, where he served

until 1953 as a graduate assistant under Hayes.

After serving in the Army, Schembechler held assistant coaching jobs at Presbyterian College in 1954 and Bowling Green in 1955, then joined Ara Parseghian's staff at Northwestern in 1958 before returning to Ohio State as an assistant to Hayes.

Schembechler was hired as head coach at Miami in 1963, winning two Mid-American Conference titles in six seasons. In 1969, he took over a Michigan program that had posted six losing seasons over the previous 11 years. He did not have a losing season at either school.

Schembechler worked as an ABC Sports football broadcaster and analyst in 1991-92 and was a popular motivational speaker for many years.

Schembechler was inducted into the Miami University Hall of Fame in 1972, the State of Michigan Sports Hall of Fame in 1989, the

University of Michigan Hall of Honor in 1992, the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame in 1993 and the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame in 1993.

# No. 19 Texas escapes St. John's upset bid

NEW YORK — Kevin Durant has had a pretty impressive start to his college career. Texas coach Rick Barnes has a different view.

"Kevin hasn't played well yet," Barnes said after the 6-foot-9 swingman scored 29 points to lead the 19th-ranked Longhorns to a 77-76 victory over St. John's Friday night in the third-place game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. "He is progressing well. In practice he's our best inside scorer and he has a terrific midcourt game. He is 200 miles from where he was two weeks ago. He's special."

Durant, who had 10 rebounds, has scored at least 20 points in every game for Texas.

"I'm surprised I'm getting so much play," he said. "This is a close-knit group and they get the ball to me and have a lot of confidence in me."

The one getting the ball to him most is fellow freshman D.J. Augustin. The point guard had 17 points, including Texas' last five of the game, and seven assists.

"It's a huge advantage for Durant to be playing with Augustin," Barnes said.

The Longhorns (3-1) were able to win a close one after losing 63-61 to Michigan State in the semifinals on a driving basket by Drew Neitzel with 2.4 seconds to play. This time, they weren't assured of the win until Anthony Mason Jr.'s long 3-point attempt with 1 second left bounced off the rim.

"We made mistakes coming down the stretch," Barnes said, "but the freshmen are fearless. I have confidence in them." Augustin gave Texas the lead for good

at 75-73 with two free throws with 1:55 to play. His driving scoop shot after he stole the ball from Lamont Hamilton made it 77-73, but he missed the free throw to complete the three-point play.

Eugene Lawrence's three-point play with 31 seconds left brought St. John's (2-2) within one point. Justin Mason, another of the freshmen who see extensive time for Texas, missed the front end of a 1-and-1 with 16 seconds left, but all St. John's could manage on its final possession was the long 3 by Mason.

"We got a good test," Augustin said. "We tried to make plays."

Avery Patterson had 22 points for St. John's and was 6-for-11 from 3-point range.

The Red Storm led 45-44 at halftime, a far cry from the 58-21 deficit they faced after 20 minutes in their 92-60 semifinal loss to Maryland.

"It was a lot better than last night. We didn't respond to the level of play against Maryland," Red Storm coach Norm Roberts said. "I can sleep a lot better tonight than I did last night."

The second half was one of swings for both teams, and Texas had the first one, opening with a 12-0 run as St. John's came up empty on its first eight possessions.

Augustin started the run with a driving basket and capped it with a 3.

St. John's used a 10-0 run to tie the game at 60 with 10:36 to go, then went on a 7-0 spurt capped by Patterson's last 3 of the game to go up 69-64 with 7:13 left.

Durant finished 5-for-6 from 3-point range and his last one capped a 7-2 run that tied the game at 71 with 4:28 to go.

A.J. Abrams added 12 points for Texas, which was 10-for-18 on 3s at Madison

Square Garden, one night after going 7-for-26.

renal floor where Maggie was one of my patients. By coincidence, I later moved from Dallas to Big Spring. Maggie's mother had been told that I was moving to West Texas, and to my surprise, she was the second patient to come see me in our new practice.

Although very stable, Maggie does require close medical attention every day. Kidneys not only play a major role in maintaining blood pressure and balancing electrolytes, they also impact hormone production, bone growth and blood cell growth.

As a result, Maggie takes many different medications, which include blood pressure medications, thyroid medications, iron, appetite stimulants and weekly injections to stimulate blood cell growth.

Furthermore, children with end stage renal disease generally do not grow well and have poor appetites. This must be aggressively managed because their growth and physical size is an important factor in being a candidate for a kidney transplant. Therefore, Maggie requires even more calories than other children.

She receives the majority of her nutrition through an NG tube — a tube from her nose to her stomach to give feedings through a pump.

Still, her growth is inadequate.

The overall goal for Maggie is to be managed with medications and dialysis until she is physically big enough and stable enough to be a candidate for a

kidney transplant. This may not be feasible until she is 4 to 5 years of age. Even after being placed on the transplant list, the wait for an appropriate "match" kidney can be years. Furthermore, after a kidney transplant, many complications can arise, ranging from difficulties due to immune suppression therapy, to infection and rejection of the

new organ. Despite the many difficulties along the way, a successful transplant can certainly happen. Many children have undergone this long process and now have a functioning kidney, making it all worthwhile.

Maggie's family finds ways to keep their lives as normal as possible. They continue working each day, although they must be prepared for frequent doctor visits for "small" things. They had become accustomed to making trips to Dallas every three or four weeks.

However, recently Maggie's peritoneal dialysis has not been working effectively. She has required a "step-up" in her dialysis. She now must travel to Dallas once per week for hemodialysis as well as continue the PD each night.

Let us celebrate the human spirit, as well as determination and "plain-old" stubbornness sometimes necessary for survival. Every day, Maggie tolerates tube feedings, dialysis, injections and multiple medications. Yet, look at her smile. Surely we have something to learn from her.

Furthermore, please give a moment's thought to becoming an organ donor. Although your gift won't directly benefit this child, there are many other adults and children waiting on long donor lists. You may never realize the life that can be saved by your gift.

**A**s a pediatrician, I have the joy and honor of caring for precious little lives. I believe that I witness "small" miracles daily. I'd like to share the story of one particular patient, whose name is Maggie.

Maggie will be celebrating her second birthday in a few weeks, on Dec. 2. She is a Howard County resident. She has End Stage Renal Disease. She was born that way. She was born with "dysplastic" kidneys, which essentially means that she had two tiny kidneys that did not work. Why? Many times medicine doesn't have answers to these tough questions. Rather we must continue our research while attempting to treat the problem.

Maggie was born in Odessa. However, her condition became critical soon after birth and she was flown to a pediatric ICU at Children's Medical Center in Dallas. Without kidneys

functioning to filter blood, remove waste, balance electrolytes and maintain blood pressure, this condition can quickly be fatal. Therapies must be started immediately to do some of the work of the kidneys.

The main way to accomplish this is through dialysis. In infants and small children, this can be done through the abdominal wall. So, by the time she was four days old, Maggie had her first catheter placed in her peritoneum (a membrane covering the abdominal wall) to begin peritoneal dialysis (PD). This allows waste products and extra fluid to pass from the abdominal cavity through the membrane (peritoneum) into the catheter. This fluid is removed each night. This process is quite complex and requires a team of subspecialty physicians, surgeons, nurses, etc. to manage. Thus, Maggie spent the first 2-1/2 months of her life in the Dallas hospital, undergoing multiple surgeries, catheters, replacements, etc. Meanwhile, her family was taught how to operate the equipment to perform PD at home. The procedure itself takes about 12-14 hours. Since

then, this PD procedure has been done every single night — just part of her life.

This is where I first met Maggie. She was three weeks old. I was in my final year of pediatric residency at Children's Medical Center of Dallas. During the New Year's holiday, the interns were given a few days off and I just happened to be covering on the

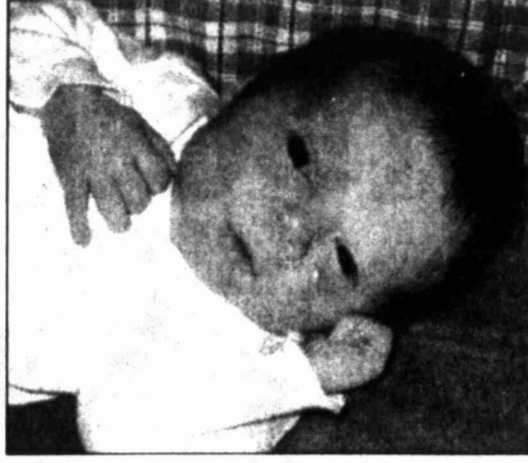

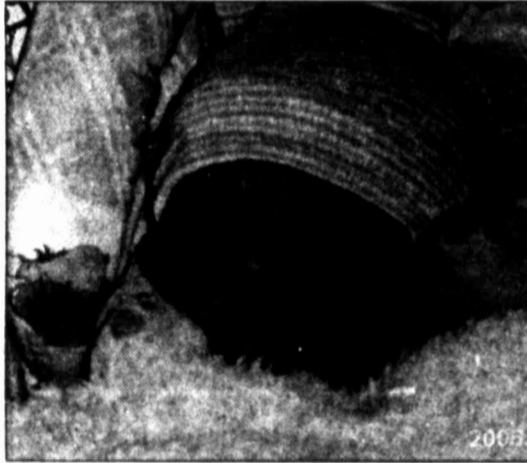

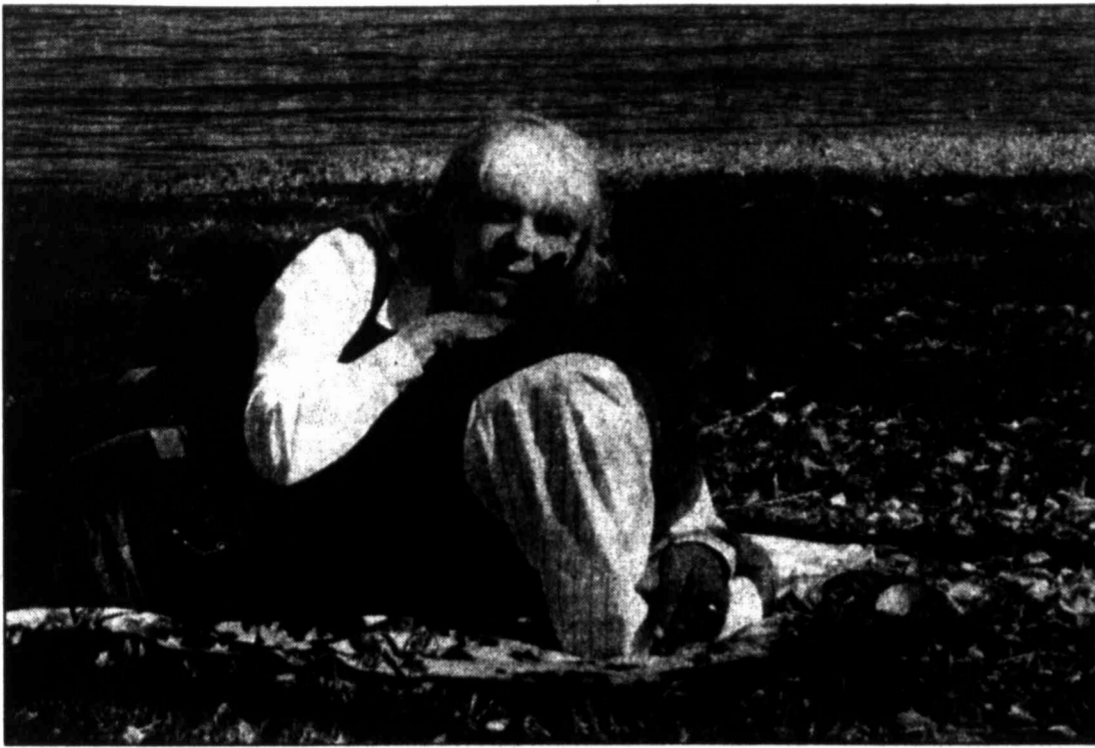

### Critics: Atmos trying to bill customers for pipe costs

AUSTIN (AP) — Atmos Energy Corp. wants to replace miles of dangerous plastic pipe that a predecessor natural gas utility left under Northern Texas homes and businesses and is now trying to unfairly bill customers by sneaking those costs into a rate hike, critics say.

The Texas Railroad Commission ruled in 2004 that the company — not its customers — must pay for the new pipe.

But opponents say Dallas-based Atmos is using an accounting maneuver to mask those

costs — reported to be \$88 million — in a rate case pending before a panel of administrative law judges in Austin. If approved by state regulators, the charge to customers would be about \$9 million per year, or about 50 cents a month on a typical heating bill.

According to evidence during the 2004 rate case, Lone Star Gas, the predecessor utility to Atmos, first learned about the pipe's problems in the early 1970s, but it remained in the ground. Five people have died and at least five have been

injured in fires and explosions associated with the pipe known as Poly 1.

"It was incredibly dangerous because it was subject to breaks and gas leakage, which would cause explosions. There were a number of those over the years ... and the shareholders of Atmos should not get a windfall (from it)," said Geoffrey

Gay, an attorney representing Fort Worth and other municipalities opposing Atmos.

But Atmos denies trying to include the Poly 1 expenditures and says its opponents have misinterpreted the accounting in its pending rate case. Those funds are for accounting and depreciation purposes, spokesman

Rand LaVonn said.

The panel of administrative law judges is hearing evidence related to the Poly 1 issue and others related to the Atmos rate request. It will eventually make a recommendation to the three-member Railroad Commission.

Atmos also has been criticized for including what opponents call extravagant items in the rate filing: bills topping \$800 per night for executives to stay at a five-star New York hotel; a \$700-plus bill for limousine service; thousands of dollars in meals at Dallas

restaurants; and expensive office furniture — including a set of \$2,000 chairs. State law allows utilities to pass on legitimate business expenses to ratepayers.

The company wants to increase rates by about \$63 million annually, or about \$4 per month on a typical bill. A coalition of cities wants to decrease rates by more than \$30 million annually, which could equate to \$5 in savings on a typical monthly bill.

The Railroad Commission is expected to make a final decision next year.

#### Ex-Enron execs get reduced jail time

HOUSTON (AP) — Two former Enron executives whose cooperation with prosecutors helped bring convictions for the architects of the biggest scandal in U.S. corporate history received sharply reduced sentences Friday.

Michael Kopper, once the top aide to Enron chief financial officer Andrew Fastow, received three years and one month in prison Friday. Mark Koenig, Enron's former investor relations director, was sentenced to 18 months.

Prosecutors had asked that Kopper and Koenig be given reduced sentences for their cooperation in helping to convict Enron founder Kenneth Lay and former chief executive Jeffrey Skilling.

The men were sentenced separately by U.S. District Judge Ewing Werlein Jr.

#### Texas unemployment unchanged

AUSTIN (AP) — The state's unemployment rate remained steady at 4.8 percent although the state added 27,900 nonagricultural jobs in October, the second-largest gain of the year, the Texas Workforce Commission reported Friday.

The commission said the jobless rate remained at its lowest level in five years. The number of working Texans rose to just over 11 million in October, but statewide unemployment also increased.

## An explanation of third party billing from the BBB

**Q:** My phone bill for last month is double what it usually is. There are a lot of "extras" that I don't understand. Where did they come from?  
**A:** How often do you pay bills without examining the charges? It may be a costly habit. Whether it's an intentional scam or an honest mistake, a careful look at your bills can uncover errors. Mistakes happen, even in the most efficient computerized systems, and most reputable companies will be quick to make corrections to billing errors. The extra charges may be what are known as Third Party Billings.

**Q:** What are "Third Party

Billings"?  
**A:** Third Party Billings often crop up on phone bills from your local service. These charges are not from your phone company, but are from billing services or companies that are using the phone company as a billing agent. Look for unexpected, unexplained, or unauthorized charges, usually from unknown companies.

**Q:** Why does the phone company allow these piggyback charges from outside businesses?  
**A:** When the government broke up the Bell System, one of the lesser-known points of the deregulation agreement was to allow this arrangement.

Speaking to a lot of telephone reps in the years since — especially those who handle billing complaints — they wish that wasn't part of the deal. A bunch of scams have surfaced through the court-mandated service, and consumers tend to blame the phone company, which isn't fair. The phone company is obligated to submit the billing, but most understand the typical scams that surface from time to time and are pretty quick to "forgive" the charges.

**Q:** What are these charges?  
**A:** Some unscrupulous companies, involved in a practice called "cramming," load unauthorized charges for unwanted

Internet or pager services, voice mail, caller ID, call waiting, toll-free or collect-call numbers, or any number of other products and services onto bills. Many frustrated consumers who don't even own computers are shocked to find ISP charges on their phone bills. Look for unauthorized changes of your long distance carrier — "slamming" can easily be blocked by calling your telephone company to prevent comment from switching your service. Unwary customers who are quick to pay the total of their bills without examining the various charges keep these scammers in business.

**Q:** None of the unfamiliar charges add up to more than a few dollars. How does the scammer make money at this?  
**A:** It's not the amount, it's the volume. Charging only two dollars to two thousand customers will net a lot of money if the bills are paid by the unwary. Smaller amounts are less conspicuous, too, and less likely to be noticed by people as they casually write their checks for the month. You're less likely to notice a three-dollar jump in your phone bill than an additional fifty bucks, aren't you?

## Horse owners urged to implement best management practices

Texas equine producers, veterinarians and livestock health officials have become increasingly concerned about Equine Viral Arteritis (EVA), which has been detected in New Mexico and Utah this year. A viral disease of horses, donkeys, and other equine animals, EVA causes mares to abort, can cause mild to severe respiratory disease in some horses and may also cause some stallions to become chronically infected and shed the virus in semen.

While some infected

equine exhibit no signs of disease, owners should be alert and notify their accredited private veterinarian if horses or foals develop signs of EVA, including fever, depression, diarrhea, coughing or nasal discharge, or swelling of the legs, body or head. Laboratory testing is necessary to confirm a diagnosis, as other equine diseases can present sim-

ilar clinical signs. EVA is not currently a reportable disease in Texas, said Dr. Bob Hillman, Texas' state veterinarian and head of the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC). However, he urges veterinarians and horse owners to report suspected and confirmed cases of EVA to the TAHC.

Horses can be infected by inhaling the equine arteritis virus, through natural service of a mare by a carrier stallion, artificial insemination of a mare with semen from a carrier stallion, or by being exposed to bedding or other objects contami-

nated with the virus. Stallions that shed the equine arteritis virus in their semen can infect unvaccinated mares, causing a respiratory disease and abortion. Acutely infected horses spread the infection to other horses via the respiratory route. A pregnant mare may also be infected through contact with acutely infected horses. Cleaning and disinfection of stalls, trailers and equipment can reduce the risk of EVA exposure.

Know the EVA status of stallions, semen shipments and mares before they are introduced onto

your farm. Consult your accredited private veterinarian about vaccination protocols for brood mares, stallions and colt foals, and ensure that good biosecurity measures are followed, said Dr. Hillman.

If you are shipping breeding horses out of state, check to determine the entry requirements of the receiving state and allow time to comply with any testing, vaccination or isolation requirements. Many breeding farms have implemented "best management" practices, testing and vaccination procedures to prevent the

introduction or spread of EVA. Before delivering mares to farms for breeding, owners should contact the facility managers to determine what testing and vaccination procedures must be met.

Although only supportive treatment can be provided, most affected mares, geldings or sexually immature stallions will eliminate the virus and recover, said Hillman. Sexually mature stallions, however, can become carriers of the disease and shed the virus for long periods. Shedding stallions should

# Wait and see ...

## Cotton forecast promising but far short of last year's

**N**ot surprisingly, the quality of this year's cotton crop depends on where you live — or farm — but the only thing you're likely to hear other than that is "only time will tell."

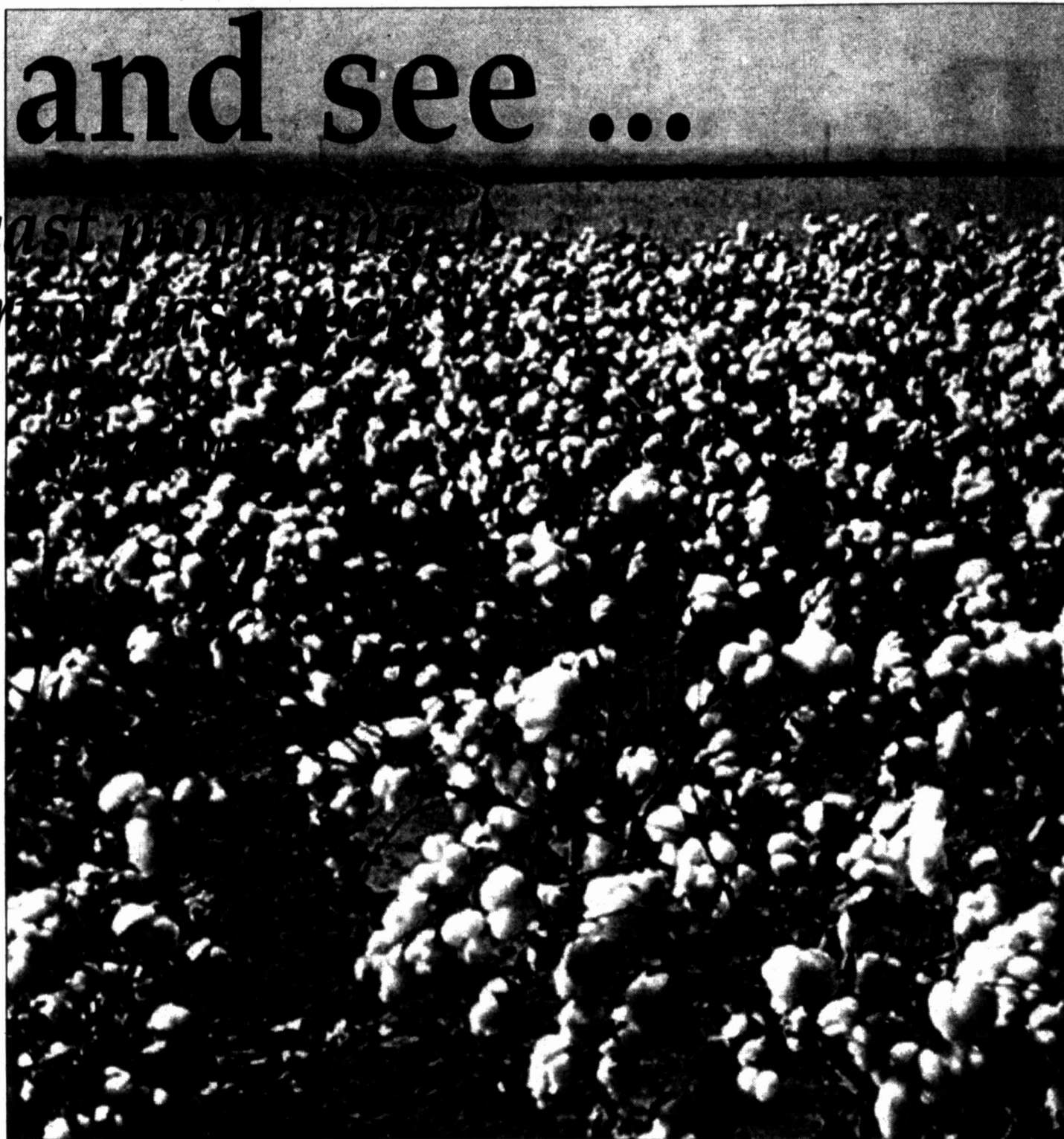
Coming on the end rows of last year's record crop, the 2006 version will be down — way down. But that doesn't mean it won't be a decent one.

"Some people are going to think I am crazy, but I think we will probably have 50 to 55 percent of what we had last year. Only time will tell," said Tommy Yeater, Cooperative Extension agent for Howard County. Fifty to 55 percent is in the high range, because many gins are forecasting a fourth to a third. And some are predicting much less.

In northwestern Howard County, a person can drive for miles without even realizing they are in cotton country. The outlook is bleak at best, and that's not going to change.

Yeater thinks, however, that the area around Coahoma and Sand Springs could be on par with last year — for dryland cotton, at least.

# Dryland Agriculture:

## Book takes a world view of increasing competition for fresh water supplies

AMARILLO — Growing competition for diminishing fresh water supplies worldwide, coupled with an expanding population, will drive demand for improved dryland agriculture technology, said a Texas Agricultural Experiment Station researcher.

To capture what is being done in the realm of dryland agriculture and where research is needed, Dr. Bill Payne of Amarillo, Experiment Station plant physiologist, joined forces with more than 50 other contributors to write the second edition of *Dryland Agriculture*. The publication is one of several monographs published by the American Society of Agronomy (<http://www.agronomy.org>).

The book, which includes 22

chapters filling more than 900 pages, took six years write and edit. In addition to helping write, Payne edited the book with Dr. Paul Unger, retired soil scientist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture-Agricultural Research Service at Bushland, and Dr. Gary Peterson, head of the soil and crop sciences department at Colorado State University.

"Agriculture has changed tremendously, as have its priorities, in the past 20 years," Payne said. "For example, the word sustainability was almost unknown when the first edition came out in 1983. Additionally, today's economy is much more global, which has had profound effects upon agricultural production. There definitely was a need for the book to be updated."

An example of changing agriculture as reflected in the new book is

the evolution of no-till systems, which is among the greatest

See advancements in dryland agriculture, he said.

While the exact definition and practice of no-till may vary from country to country depending on machinery, the basic idea is to not disturb the soil and to protect it by leaving crop residue in the field.

"This not only conserves soil, but it conserves water," Payne said.

However, no-till raises new issues of disease and pest management, changes in soil temperature and planting times, and most especially, it can complicate weed control, he said.

The first edition of *Dryland Agriculture* also only addressed U.S. conditions. A major improvement in the second edition, Payne said, is that it covers dryland agri-

culture throughout the world.

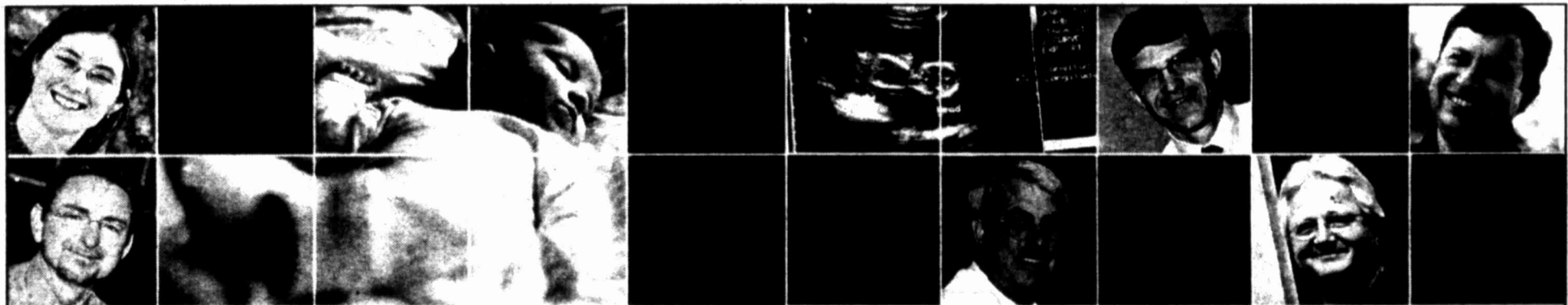
Greater understanding of the important differences and commonalities of different dryland farming systems is important because of the growing importance of dryland agriculture and the fact that global food supply is increasingly interconnected, he said.

The new international emphasis is critical to the book's importance, Payne said.

"There is growing competition for diminishing supplies of fresh water among countries and different sectors of society," he said. "This is occurring not just in the High Plains, but throughout the world. China and especially India are dependent on food production from finite aquifers."

Many aquifers and other sources of freshwater are being depleted at

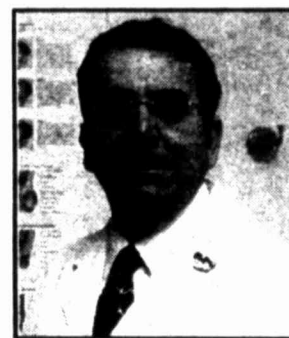

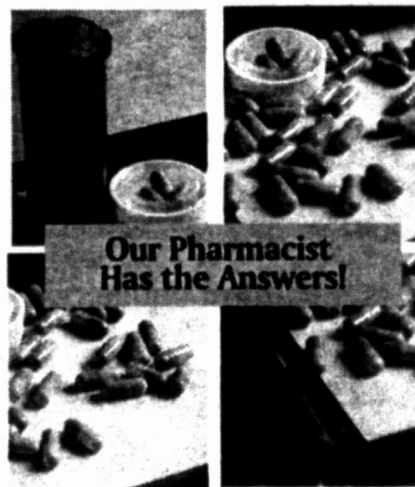
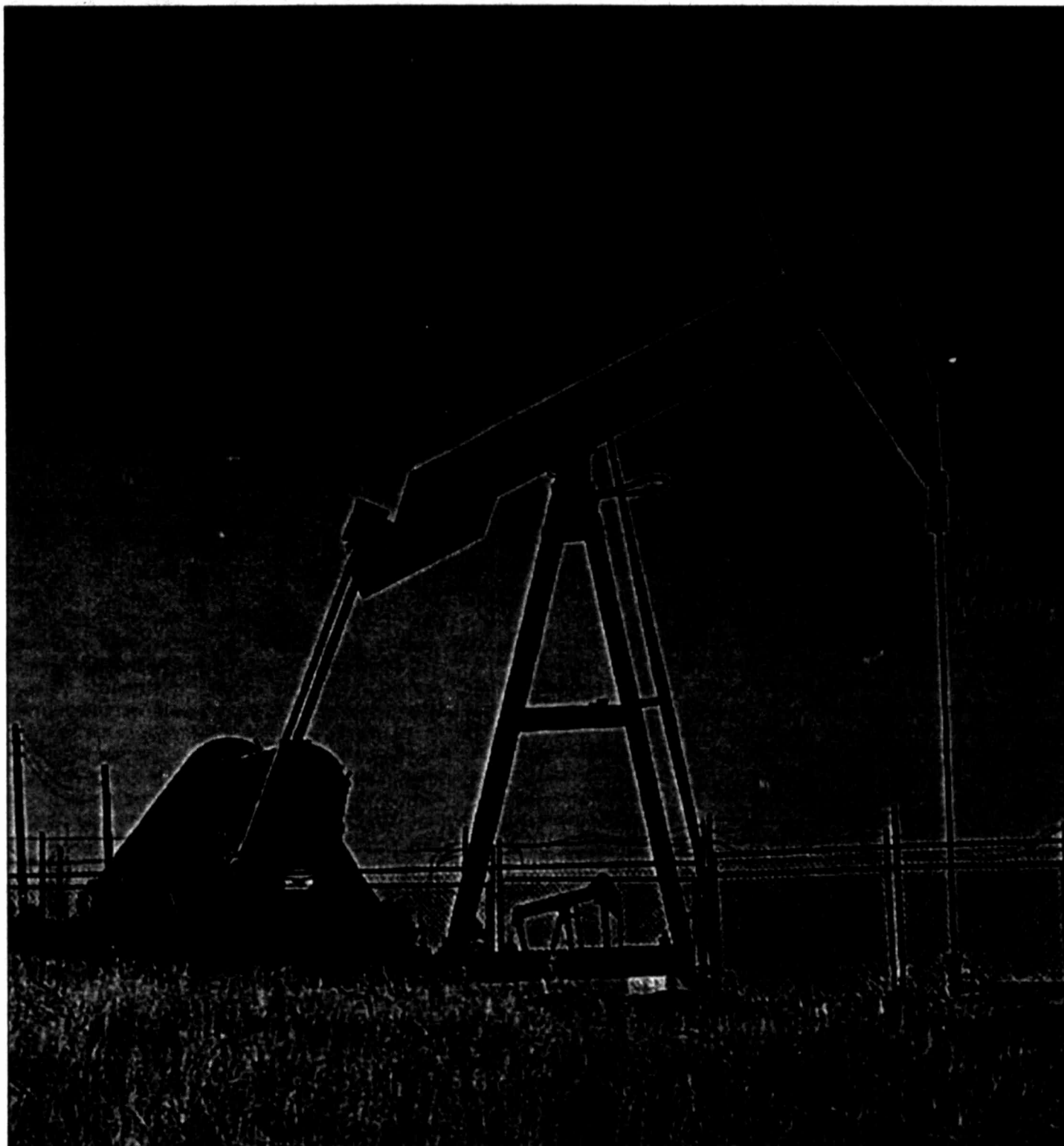
**A**nother oil boom is officially taking place in the Permian Basin, but virtually nobody in the oil business is willing to use that term.

"Everyone's trying to be cautious talking about the 'B' word these days," said Ben Shepperd, executive vice president of the Permian Basin Petroleum Association. "But there's really no question that's what's happening. Nobody's using the word, but everywhere you go in this area, you see people driving brand new 1-ton or 3/4-ton diesel trucks ... that's a pretty good sign that things are good in the oil fields these days."

Indeed. While oil prices have dipped a little in the last 30 days to 60 days, Shepperd noted that 2006 has been a record year for oil drilling in the Permian Basin.

"In the last couple of months we've had 1,700 rigs drilling across Texas," Shepperd said. "And average daily production here in the

# Gasoline prices:

## Where can we expect them to be in the future?

**T**he perfect storm. Perhaps no better term applies to what happened to the gasoline refining and marketing business in 2005. And it was a storm that had

At least that's take Joe Conciencie, Alon USA vice president of refining and transportation and Big Spring Refinery manager, has on the events that led to record high gas prices that seemed to continue through the summer of 2006.

"Nobody would have predicted what happened in 2005," Conciencie explains. "It was the most unique year in my 35 years in the business. The price of crude when from about \$35 or \$40 a barrel to \$75 a barrel; news about the Iraq war sent prices to a premium; and we had two hurricanes that both threatened and hit the largest concentration of refineries in the United States."

In other words, in a business where the effects of supply and demand are perhaps most dramat-

ic, virtually every factor that could lead to increased gasoline prices came together at almost the exact same instant. The result was striking with gasoline prices spiking above \$3 per gallon virtually everywhere.

Those gasoline prices have since returned closer to the \$2 per gallon level and many across the country wonder what's next.

Will gasoline prices go back to the \$3 level or soar even higher? Or will the continue to retreat below \$2 a gallon?

Nobody knows for sure, but Conciencie doubts either of those scenarios is truly likely.

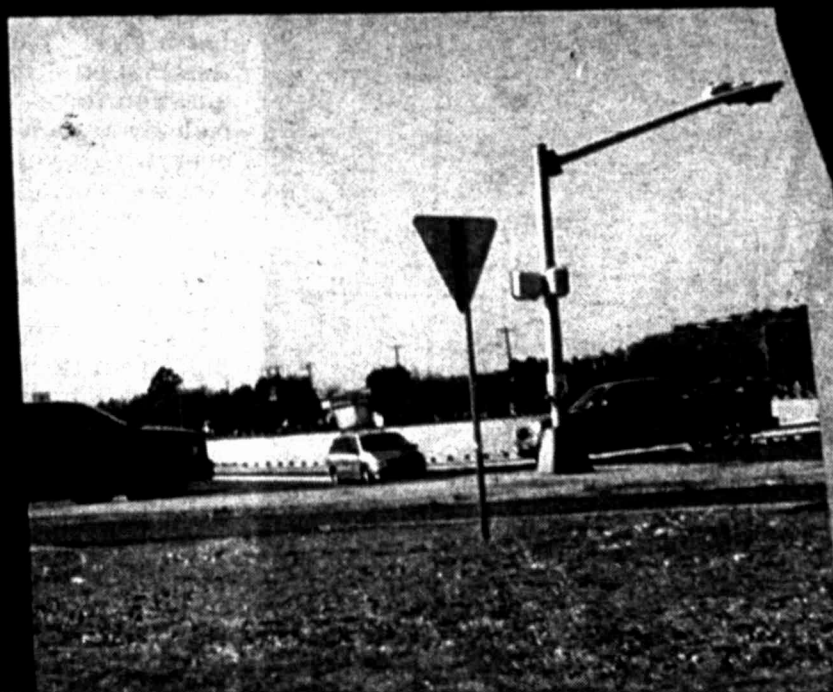
"In some ways people were over-reacting and that psyche stayed on throughout this summer," Conciencie said. "Prices have gone down from around \$3 a gallon to \$2. We're slowly easing back into the equilibrium price of crude and gasoline. But we're probably going to have to go through another cycle — another winter and summer — without another major jolt to the system to really see where the equilibrium price really is."

However, predicting the future price of energy is at best very difficult, Conciencie admits.

"The only thing that's a constant is that there's no shortage of crude

# Moore Board continuing search for new executive

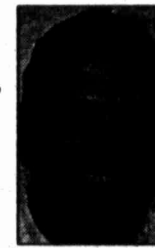

Following the departure of long time executive director Kent Sharp, Moore Development for Big Spring Inc. continues the search for someone to take the helm.

The board of directors for Moore Development — which began the search more than a month ago when Sharp announced he would be leaving for a similar position in Gainesville — has whittled the list of applicants for the agency's executive director position from 14 applications down to seven.

"We have received 14 applications," said Board President Larry McLellan. "Originally we talked about 13 applications, but we had one that called in for the job but I don't think we ever actually received that person's application."

Having already done extensive advertising within the economic development community since Sharp announced he was leaving, McLellan said he's not sure if the group will be able to settle on one of the seven applications they are considering or whether they will

have to advertise a second time.

"That's sort of up in the air right now," said McLellan. "What we felt like we should do is take a closer look at the seven (applications) we have and see if we're impressed with them, or if they can impress us as far as moving to Big Spring and taking over the executive director's position."

"We would certainly like to interview as many as possible and be able to scrutinize those appli-

cants as well as possible, but it doesn't seem like we're getting very many applications right now. I'm not sure if it's the time of the year with the holiday season coming up or not."

McLellan said the board hasn't received many applications over the past several weeks, possibly due to the onset of the holiday season.

"We haven't received any more since our last meeting, so I'm not really sure what the likelihood of getting more is," said McLellan. "I feel like we're making some headway. We've gone from 14 to seven, so we have a list to work with now."

has been pretty constant ... something on the order of 2 or 3 percent traditionally," he explained. "That's pretty much a reflection of usage. For years people have talked about better efficiency, but the effects of efficiency improvements have really just led to increased usage. Populations are growing which means there's more usage and demand. So year after year there's slow growth in energy usage."

While Conciene says he expects that worldwide the industry should come into refining balance in the next three to five years, he

doesn't think the U.S. will ever be self-sufficient in refining capacity.

And while it's clear the oil industry has plans to build new refineries both in the U.S. and around the world, Conciene says there's virtually no chance new inland refineries will be built.

"We don't have a problem refining our domestic production of crude," he explained. "Where we lack refining capacity is taking care of the oil that's coming into our ports from outside the country."

What's more, Conciene explained that not only the number of inland refineries, as well as their level of production, are basically determined by the markets they serve.

None of the crude oil produced in

the Permian Basin is refined on the Texas Gulf Coast. The Big Spring refinery, along with those in El Paso; Border; Artesia, N.M.; and another in Oklahoma process all the oil produced in West Texas.

However, that does not mean the Big Spring refinery will be operating at current levels in the future.

"We're already looking at in late 2008 or by early 2009 increasing our capacity to about 75,000 barrels a day," he said, noting that the refinery currently refines about 70,000 barrels each day. "We don't have a great deal of room to increase our production, simply because we're basically at the limit of our facility's design capabilities. We're capable of serving our marketing area well for some time to come, and there's no real

avenue for substantial growth to other areas, so there's not likely to be a major expansion here at this plant. Like all inland refineries, we're sized by our market."

When discussing the retail price of gasoline, Conciene said he wanted to make one thing clear. "The price of gasoline at my rack for all branded customers is the same," he explained. "So it the price for my non-branded customers ... that's the same for all of them. What our customers decide to set their prices is up to them. That's a business decision they have to make. That's their business."



## Texas' retail electric market is working... ...it's the Price-to-Beat that is causing problems

Competition and retail choice are working in the Texas electric market. Instead of celebrating this success, critics are blaming retail electric providers for problems caused by the increasingly dysfunctional, legislatively-mandated Price-to-Beat.

The Price-to-Beat was originally the regulatory price at which existing (default) providers had to sell their electricity. Meanwhile, it was hoped that new providers could earn a profit selling electricity at a lower price.

By the time 2006 rolled around, it was clear there was no longer any need for the Price-to-Beat.

Competition, not regulations, now keeps prices low. Texas consumers are able to choose from up to 41 different plans offered by as many as 18 providers, with over 60 percent of residential customers having exercised identifiable choice.

Fortunately, the Price-to-Beat is set to expire on Jan. 1, 2007. But it isn't going down without a fight.

For instance, the Price-to-Beat is serving as a psychological price floor, more than likely keeping prices higher than they would be otherwise.

Additionally, since changes in

the Price-to-Beat are limited to two per year, it has distorted market prices and added uncertainty in the marketplace at a time when natural gas prices have been changing rapidly.

While natural gas prices rose by an average of 49 percent between April and November, 2005, political factors led to no increase in the Price-to-Beat during this time. So default providers were not able to recover their increased costs. In other words, for eight months many consumers avoided paying the costs incurred by the increase in natural gas prices.

However, if a default provider had pockets deep enough to ride this out, it could actually use the Price-to-Beat to gain a competitive advantage over a new, smaller provider which must raise its prices to cover costs—or go out of businesses.

So not only is the Price-to-Beat poorly designed for today's market, the political intervention in the market it accommodates further harms competition and consumers.

Despite these problems, the market is already beginning to look past the Price-to-Beat as industry participants anticipate its demise. Default providers are preparing for an increase of competition against each other as well as against the new providers which have sprung up under the Price-to-Beat.

A number of new rate plans have been announced designed to attract and retain customers after

termination.

Some new plans facilitate risk-sharing, like one that closely tracks the market price of gas. Others offer greater certainty if customers pay for it, such as a plan that offers price protection from changes in the cost of natural gas.

Many critics, however, can't see past the Price-to-Beat.

Despite the discounts and new offerings, the main question being asked of default providers is why they haven't lowered their Price-to-Beat — with the threat of stronger price controls looming if they don't do so soon.

Markets are always competitive except when the government interferes with them.

Imposing price controls is guaranteed to harm the burgeoning competition in the electric market and dash the expectations of all

market participants—retailers, producers, investors and consumers.

Texas is about to become the first state in the country to operate an electric market where the vast majority of prices are deregulated.

We are also the national leader when it comes to telecom deregulation and tort reform. This is why Texas was recently rated the second best business climate in the nation.

If we want to stay on top, more deregulation — not price controls — is the only way to go.

Over in Martin County, expectations aren't as high as Yeater's, but there is a chance to have a decent crop, officials say.

"That big, open fall has helped us make more cotton than we thought we would. Still, it is not as good as we would have liked to have," explained Lee Howard, Cooperative Extension agent for Martin County. "The lack of moisture all season long has really hurt."

The absence of a good planting rain for most of the area led cotton experts to expect a poor crop. For much of the Crossroads, that turned around and crops did "make," though a drive through the area still shows plenty of empty fields that were turned over or cotton that has yet to mature.

"It's pretty much a regular year," said Howard. "It's a fourth up to maybe a third of last year's crop."

At Big Spring Gin, workers had processed 2,200 bales near mid-week but were optimistic about more coming in.

"I'd say we are expecting between 15,000 to 20,000 said Renee

Beall, bookkeeper.

That pales, of course, in comparison to last year, when the Big Spring Gin turned out a little more than 50,000 bales.

"A lot of it got planted late, so it's really all up in the air still right now," said Beall. "What we are getting is coming back really good grades, so that's positive."

At the Co-op Gin in Ackerly, some 10,240 bales had been processed with a forecast of 12,000 to 15,000, according to Irma Leal, secretary. If so, that would be about a third of last year's numbers.

Flower Grove, seven miles west of Ackerly, had processed 7,355 and was expecting to finish out at about 10,000 bales.

"That's down, but closer to normal than 50,000 bales," secretary Shelly Hightower said jovially, speaking of last year's record-breaking crop.

Normal, if there is such a thing in the farming industry, is about 25,000 bales at Flower Grove, officials there said.

At the Co-op Gin of Big Spring, the 20,000 bales officials anticipate ginning this year is good news.

"We feel lucky," said Julie Bartlett, secretary. "We're pleased with that."

Bartlett can readily supply the number of bales processed at the gin last year — 39,823. Like most other area gins, it was a record. However, 20,000 is also strong for a gin that shut down for three years not very long ago.

Despite expecting a decent bale count, the going is a bit slow right now.

"We've ginned 5,450 bales. It's been dragging. We've had to quit a couple of times because we have run out of cotton," Bartlett explained.

Only time will tell.

Elsewhere:

- Tarzan Gin has processed 11,300 bales, according to Linda Wiebe, secretary, and is forecasting between 18,000 and 22,000 for the season.

- Knott Co-op has ginned 3,000 and expects to gin another 4,500, for about 7,500.

- Glasscock County Co-op has ginned about 26,800, said Marie Pechacek, office manger. A forecast was unavailable.

- Farmer's Co-op Gin in Stanton has ginned 3,522 bales. No forecast available.

- Farmer's Co-op Association No. 2, formerly Mustang, has ginned 2,750. No forecast available.

an unsustainable rate, Payne said. Yet the world has become complacent about food availability. In the 1950s and 1960s, people were aware of the presence and consequences of mass starvation due to low agricultural productivity. But more recently, agricultural research in the U.S. and especially developing countries has received less and less financial support.

"Imagine the economic and political consequences if one-third of the world's population were exposed to an unreliable and diminishing food supply," Payne said.

"What a lot of people don't seem to realize is that a disproportionate amount of our world food supply relies on irrigated agriculture, which in turn depends on shrinking availability of fresh water."

As an example, India faced massive starvation in the 1950s and is now food sufficient, in large part due to irrigated agriculture, Payne said. But India is poised to pass China as the most populous country in the world, while rapidly depleting its aquifers, rivers and streams.

"Televisions are a very hot item this year," said Jody Swinney, owner of the local Sears. "There have really been some big advancements over the past year, and there's really a three-way tie between LCD, DLP and Plasma televisions. The old analog units are quickly becoming outdated, so much that a lot of people are hoping theirs will go out so they can get a new one."

Permian Basin and across the state is way up from a year ago. Our average daily production in September was 882,757 barrels a day ... that's about 160,000 barrels a day more than we were producing at this time last year."

Not surprisingly, drilling companies throughout the region are reporting shortages in both material and manpower, as a result.

"Good hands and drill pipe are hard to come by ... they're at a pre-

mium right now," Shepperd acknowledged. "An if you can locate a drilling rig, you need to lock it down quick."

With West Texas Intermediate, the benchmark in crude oil, selling at \$58.55 per barrel in mid November and the prospect of a rollback in OPEC production in the near future, Shepperd says business in the West Texas oil fields should be brisk for some time to come.

That does not, however, mean consumers necessarily need to worry about a drastic rise prices at the gasoline pump, Shepperd said.

"Given our supply situation, I don't expect gasoline prices to rise dramatically anytime soon," he said. "Prices went down last month just because supplies began to get restocked. The industry's crude reserves are in pretty good shape now, so barring some kind of catastrophe, it think prices are going to be pretty stable."

West Texas is not the only area experiencing a boom. Drilling and production of oil and gas is increasing throughout the state according to statistics from the Texas Railroad Commission (RRC).

The RRC issued a total of 1,424 original drilling permits in September 2006. The September total included 1,181 permits to drill new oil and gas wells, 59 to re-enter existing well bores and 184 for re-completions. Permits issued in September 2006 included 246 oil, 369 gas, 769 oil and gas, 29 injection and 11 other permits.

The latest RRC statistics on well completions show that operators reported 356 oil, 650 gas and 26 injection completions in September, compared to 261 oil, 680 gas, 13 injection completions in September of 2005.

# Middle-East a hot topic for Hollywood films

Stephen Gaghan struck gold five years ago when he penned the screenplay for "Traffic," one of the most important films of the new millennium. Now he repeats the trick, this time as writer and director of *Syriana*, an equally ambitious and no less successful examination of the oil industry.

With deft strokes, he paints a huge canvas populated by spies, executives, sheiks and day laborers, all of them chasing after the power and influence that stems from controlling the world's precious supply of energy. It's overwhelming in its scope, tying together countless threads and hidden corners into a single all-encompassing vision.

The results demand much from the audience — attention, thoughtfulness and the ability to think critically and question what lies beneath the surface of the action. But for those willing to devote themselves to the effort, the film returns the investment tenfold.

I was a little surprised that Warner Bros. decided to bring out "Syriana" in high definition. When I saw the picture in a theater, I thought it looked intentionally soft, dull, grainy, gritty and whatnot to give it a more realistic texture and feeling, not the kind of image that necessarily would benefit from the greater clarity of HD.

But Warners appear to be transferring all of their new releases to HD-DVD, so who am I to question. The movie itself is certain-

ly worthy of the best treatment, and when I watched it at home, the high definition made it look a whole lot better than I had remembered it from the big screen.

the laws of the jungle. We see it from several key perspectives.

Bob Barnes (George Clooney, "Oceans 11," "From Dusk Till Dawn") is a devoted CIA agent, with extensive knowledge of the Middle East and a will-

ingness

ny that signs a shifty deal for rights in Kazakhstan, and is immediately targeted by Connex for a merger. Bennett Holiday (Jeffrey Wright, "Casino Royale," "Lady in the Water") is a lawyer charged with investigating the merger to see if it passes U.S. laws.

Byran Woodman (Matt Damon, "Dogma," "Good Will Hunting") is a reform-minded energy executive who becomes allies with Nasir after a tragic accident on the prince's estate. And seemingly unnoticed beneath them all is Wasim (Mazhar Munir), a Pakistani oil worker who loses his job and falls under the influence of a charismatic recruiter with big plans and a need for martyrs.

Director Stephen Gaghan gives all of these figures reasonable motivations, driven by personal ideology yet impacted by the practical needs of reality. Each has their own agenda — selfish in many cases, but also embracing their own particular morality — that slowly but surely entangles them in increasingly compro-

mised positions.

At times, the big picture is submerged beneath their personal perceptions, and though we never lose track of why they're behaving the way they do, their part in the larger puzzle can be difficult to spot.

Yet *Syriana* is always internally consistent and its inner workings, though enigmatic at times, never violate the tenets of logic. Gaghan's direction lacks the formalistic tics of Steve Soderbergh's in "Traffic," utilizing straightforward blocking and the expected fly-on-the-wall view typical of movies like this. But it works because it doesn't add any undue complexity to a drama already challenged by multiple plot threads and constant cross-cutting. The nuts-and-bolts action stays clear and illuminates — with careful, methodical precision — the grander vision that Gaghan is trying to express.

And it's a pretty grim vision. Darwinism runs rampant, fueled by staggering amounts of money and an unspoken need to grab what you can before the pumps run dry. America engages in nation building

without the slightest sense of how to go about it, driven only by the need to keep gas prices low. Middle Eastern rulers pocket the cash and live lives of grotesque luxury while their citizens are starving beneath them.

Even reformers feel the pull of forces beyond their control, and their efforts to make things better come at a disastrous price. Everyone is accountable for the problem in some way or another. Certainly, the West takes its share of lumps — and we, the consumers who fill up at the pump every day, are the film's unindicted co-conspirators — but the mess goes beyond a single culture or administration. It's built into the very fabric of modern civilization, a piece of darkness engendered by an imperfect world.

The system is dysfunctional because so much is at stake, and ethics become a luxury that no one can afford. "Corruption," as one character puts it, "is why you and I are prancing around in here instead of fighting over scraps of meat out in the street." As long as we need gas to run our cars or power our generators, it will not change. And as supplies slowly dwindle, the film assures us, it will only get worse.

The name "Syriana" is fictional and, in fact, the movie never mentions it. The word is a "portmanteau... two meanings packed up into one word" as Lewis Carroll described it. I suppose the title is supposed to remind us of the Middle Eastern region of Syria and Iran and everything in between and around them.

The cast is first-rate, but I want to draw special attention to Siddig, little known outside the ranks of Star Trek fans. Since leaving that franchise, he has charted a brave and very admirable course for him-

self, consistently choosing roles that illuminate Middle Eastern characters in complex and interesting ways.



It couldn't have been easy to ferret them out amid the one-note cabbies and evil terrorists, but his perseverance pays off in this, his most thoughtful and detailed performance to date. Nasir is a benevolent man with grand plans for his emirate, but his position — like all the others in the film — holds dark undercurrents, which Siddig develops alongside his character's brighter aspects without diminishing either side, giving the film a strangely appropriate moral compass.

The bulk of the credit, however, goes to Gaghan, who knows this subject inside and out, and who brings remarkable expertise to its depiction on-screen. Like "Traffic," Syr-

iana is a vital roadmap to a very important issue, using the power of cinema to convey it in a visceral — though often challenging

edition, including the documentary "Weaving Reality into Drama" and "A Conversation with Matt Damon." The documentary

provides the actor's point of view on the politics, or as he says the non-politics, of the film. The extras wrap up with thirty-three scene selections (but no chapter insert); a widescreen theatrical trailer; and English, French, and Spanish spoken languages and subtitles. As usual, the HD-DVD played perfectly from beginning to end; it contains pop-up menus and a zoom-and-pan feature; and WB house it in a small Elite Red HD case.

This is how agenda filmmaking is supposed to work, respecting its audience enough to stimulate their minds, rather than telling them what to think. Syriana never presumes to solve the problem, nor does it provide comforting answers. It simply shines a light in the right place, illuminating its corners and defying us to look away. The results are indelible, resonant, and deeply troubling, a statement that only the most foolish would dare dismiss.

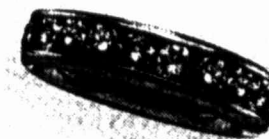

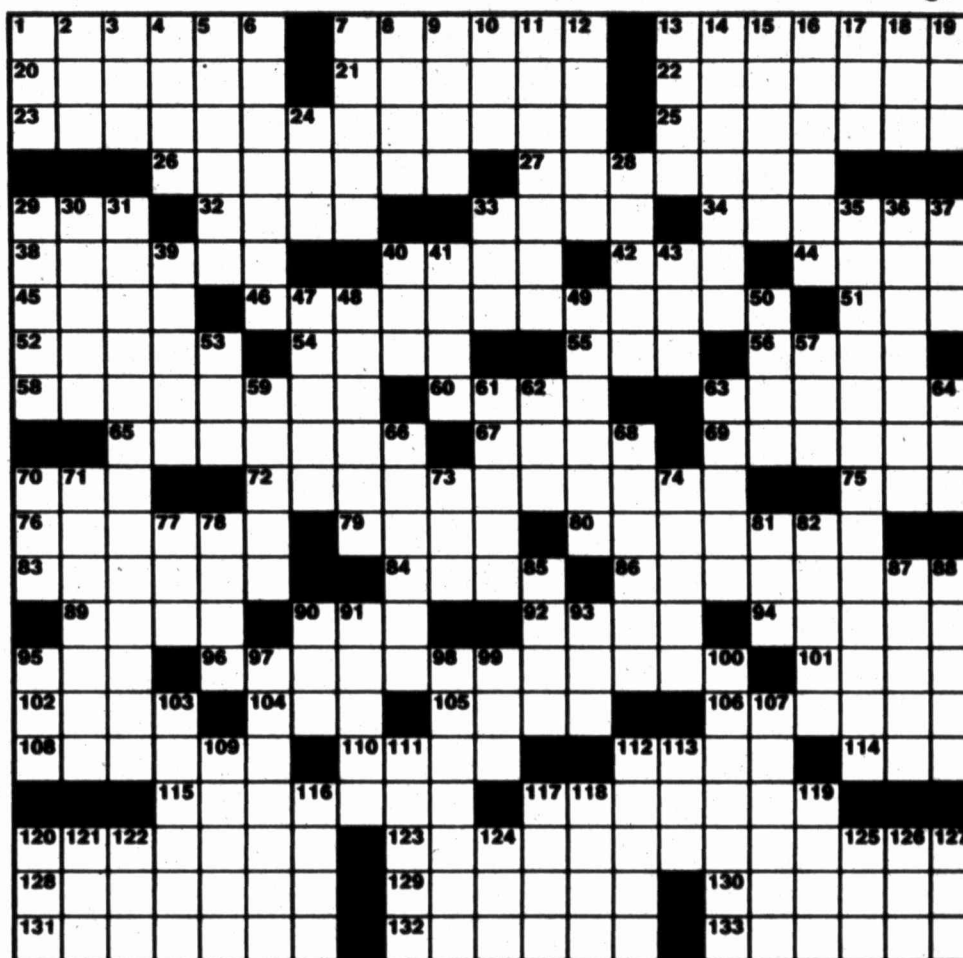

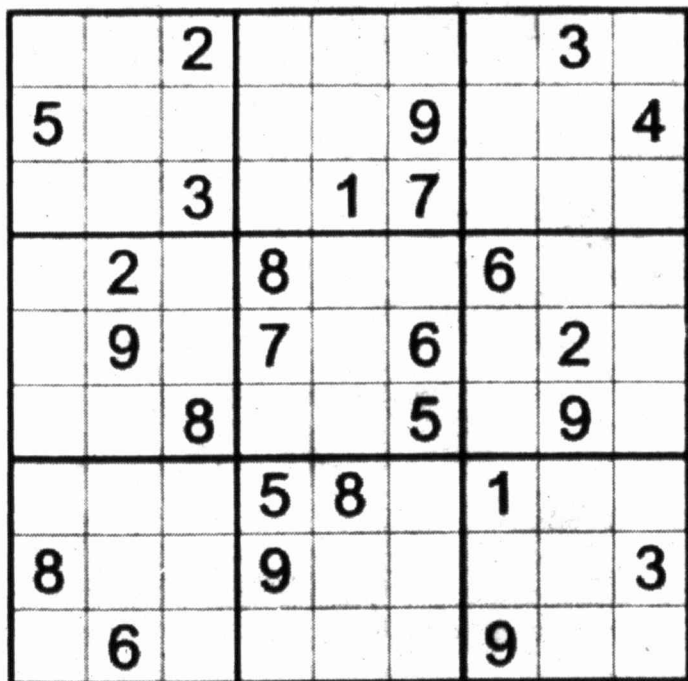
