Most of the thousands of dead bodies that have been found dumped across Baghdad and other cities in central Iraq in recent months have been of victim who were tortured and then shot to ed militia killers often have used electric drills on their captives' bodies before killing them. The bodies are fre quently decapitated.

"Cars" continued Pixar's winning streak at the box office, racking up nearly $\$ 250 \mathrm{M}$ in the US alone. However, in terms of the film itself, after the high
points of the studio's recent efforts - "Finding Nemo" and "The Incredibles" - "Cars," while fun and entertaining for the most part, seems some what
ifornia to face off in a race

On the way to California in his ultra-modern trailer, an accident occurs and Lightning finds himself stranded in the mid-

Voice work is enjoyable, with Wilson nicely capturing the character's change over the course of the film. If anything, I think this is the most heart I can remember in a performance from Wilson.
Bonnie Hunt ("Monsters Inc."), not quite her usual brilliantly deadpan self, of fers up a pleasing performance and plays off of Wilson better than I'd expected. Keaton, Newman, Cheech Marin and others offer terrific supporting performances. Sadly, Larry the Cable Guy does, in fact, utter "Get 'Er Done" for the millionth time. Still, I had trouble get ting past the fact that the story seems thinner than the studio's prior efforts. which made the film feel a little too long. That said Pixar has definitely raised the bar high with their past efforts like "Nemo" While I had issues with "Cars", I still thought the movie had heart and some of the emotional moments definitely got to me. This is lesser Pixar, but it's still darn entertaining stuff that finishes way ahead of the competition.
