THE WAGSTAFF LAW, the Oil and Gas Conservation Statutes of Texas; under which oil and gas production is regulated under conservation standards. This act is a model for all other states.
THE WAGSTAFF LAW, the Act regulating the Sale and Leasing of the Public School Lands. This act placed the leasing on sealed competitive bids and has brought hundreds of millions of dollars into the school fund, and at the same time has protected the rights of West Texas land owners.
THE WAGSTAFF LAW, the first Act creating the Big Bend Park, which was later taken over by the National Government and is now one of the principal 'Parks of America.
THE WAGSTAFF LAW, providing for the payment of Confederate Pensions during the depression, by borrowing from the operating fund of the State Highway Commission. (This act, proposed by Judge W. R. Ely, then Chairman of the Highway Commission, and passed through the legislature by Bob Wagstaff, prevented the starvation of the old Confederate veterans).
Never before or since has any member of the Texas Legislature been the author of, and put on the statute books, so much important legislation. To meet the problems now confronting our national government, this district should be proud to
