HSUN WON'T SEND TROOPS HOME; KUN PREPARING TO SEND HIS TROOPS TO PEKING—CLASH SEEMS IMMINENT

By Associated Press. Tientsin, China, July 5.—A military clash in China is imminent. The troops of Peking are showing signs of opposition to General Chang Hsun's dictatorship under the guise of a democracy. At the same time the troops of Tsao Kun, military governor of the province of Chihli, are mobilizing and preparing to proceed to Peking.

160 DOCTORS ACCEPTED FOR MEDICAL CORPS

Dallas, Texas, July 5.—Dr. E. W. LYDD GEORGE PLEASED WITH AMERICAN PARTICIPATION

Paris, July 5.—The Matin publishes an interview with General Lydd George, who contradicted emphatically a suggestion that Great Britain was only half pleased with France's entry into the war. The French writer said there were persons in this country who permitted themselves to be persuaded, no doubt by German propaganda, that England favored the idealism and passion for justice of America as it would be felt when the time came for peace.

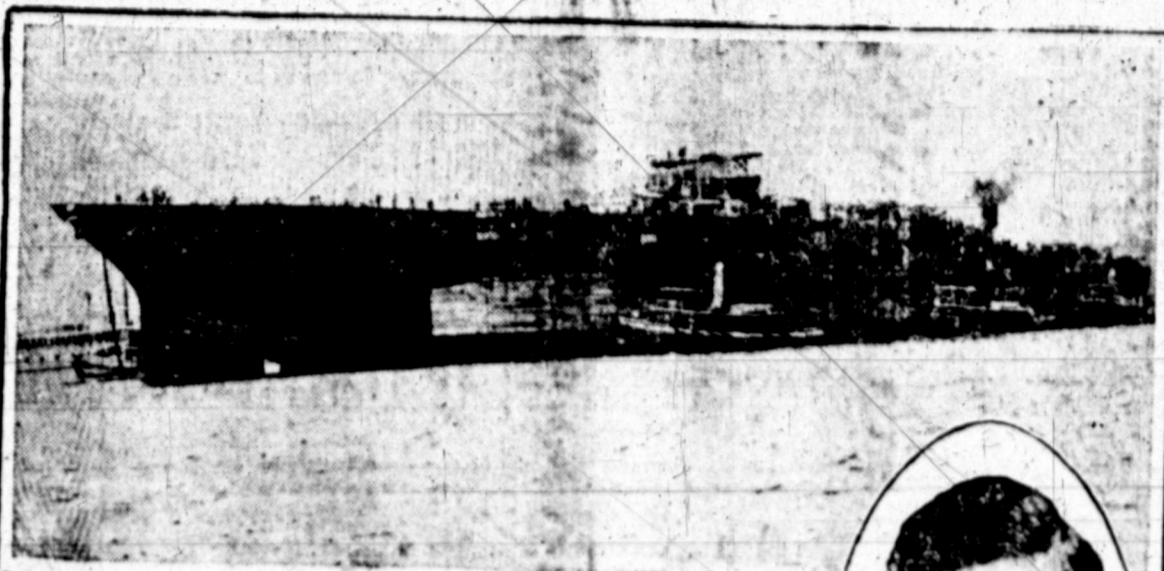
MARINES CARRY EMERGENCY RATION TO FIGHTING LINE
