Baird firemen answered a call to help the Hatchett family put out the blaze which had gotten a pretty good start. The ef-forts of the rural unit manned by local firemen, and the Hatchett's and their neighbors succeeded in containing the blaze after it had destroyed some 80 to 100 acres of prime grass. Buster and others who were fighting the blaze, came across a dead buzzard at a point it was determined the fire started - under a highline owned by one of the major power companies. The big bird had flown into the power lines and was electrocuted. His feathers were set afire, and as he fell to the ground, the blaze was started. The Hatchett family is very grateful to all who helped them in fighting the fire.
