An organization known as the "American Committee on the High Cost of Living" has recently come into being in New York, the headquarters at 320 Broadway. Literature explaining the object of the organization has been sent out all over the country to such people as are likely to be interested. such people as are likely to be interested, and the Chamber of Commerce here is the recipient of two pamphlets dealing with the work.

It is proposed to enroll fifty thous-

It is proposed to enroll fifty thousand members at once, with the profess ed object of passing the Kelly Bill through Congress. According to the pamphlets, the bill empowers the president to requisition all natural resources, such as coal, oil, steel, timber, and water power, and to sell the products at cost.

Purchase Price.

The present owners of these resources shall be paid for their equipment, but nothing for "the inherent or site value, of any natural resource in land, nor for the inherent value of power in

nor for the inherent value of power in navigable and non-navigable streams, nor for good-will, nor for other intangible elements."

The bill, according to the literature

The bill, according to the literature distributed, provides the only effective method to reduce the price of coal, steel, gasoline, oil, timber, and other natural resources. Half a billion dollars has been appropriated for paying the owners of title of such natural resources and plant and equipment, and two and a half million dollars has been appropriated for the administration of the act.
