We passed through tunnels all the way but the most exciting was passing through the Pennsylvania tube.

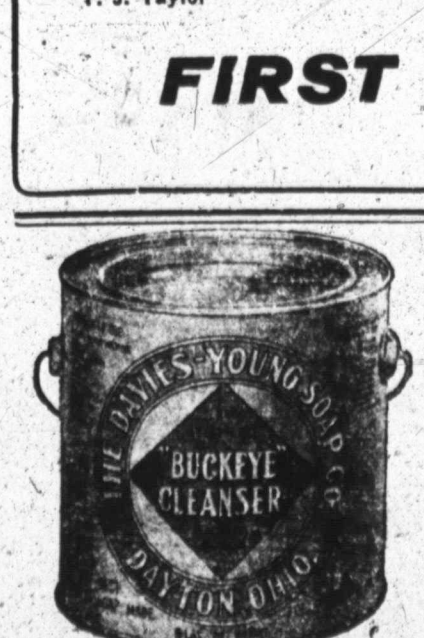

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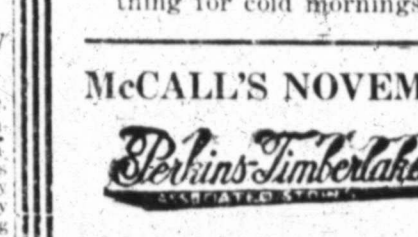

TOTAL OF \$900,000 SUBSCRIBED FOR LIBERTY LOAN BONDS HERE, NOT INCLUDING SMALLER TOWNS
