





This situation was relieved by Wil-

son's visit here.

There remained some apprehension In the peace proceedings should be so cut and dried that France and England would run the whole show, which none but the blindest Tory here desires. It would ultimately prove fatal to the government of both countries if their representatives afternied to as to the government of both countries if their representatives attempted to assume even a limited world dictatorship. With America taking a position at least equal to that of either of the other two principal parties and accepting responsibilities for the justice and stability of the world's peace, any such misadventure is impossible.





Although no official action was taken in the matter of the petition filed by the water company, asking for permission to raise the existing rates, at the meeting of the city council last night, the question was discussed freely and it was the opinion of the council that the books of the company should be sudied and e company should be audited and their records show that a raise in rates is necessary then the proposed increase should be granted. When the question was first sprung at the meet question was first sprung at the meeting last night, Mayor Marlow at once deciated that if a raise was granted, such action would be taken without his vote, but later he agreed that the proper step to take would be to have an auditor, employed by the city, go over the books of the water company, in order that the facts as to the company receipts and earnings might. ny's receipts and earnings might arirved at whether, or not their

be arirved at whether, or not their petition is granted.

Must Provide Supply,

Both Mayor Marlow and Alderman McFall were strong in their statements that if an increase is granted, there must be ample assurance and guarantee that the water company will be able to furnish sufficient water the city and only during the will be able to furnish sufficient water for the city, not only during the present year but in the future. Members of the council expressed beliefs that within a few years Wichita Falis would be a city of fffty thousand population, and that steps must be taken now to insure water. The question of the city voting bonds and buying the water works was also discussed. The petition asking for a raise in rates was filed with the city council by the water company several weeks by the water company several weeks ago. The matter had been discussed at former meetings of the council but last night was the first time it had been given much consideration by a full board.

full board.

Audit is Favored.

It was admitted by all members of the council that the question of water supply for the city is a serious proposition and that any steps taken in the matter should be done so only after careful investigation was made. In favor of this point, Alderman McFall held up for an audit of the company's records, Members of the council have gone over the records of the company, it was stated last night, but the complicated conditions of the books made it impossible for unfabooks made it impossible for unfa-miliar persons to grain much information by merely looking over the fig-ures. Johnson, manager of the Majestic, acting as spokesman for the other theaters, told the council that a censorship board as proposed, would kill the moving picture business of the city. He explained that theater exhibitors pay high prices for the pictures shown here, and that in most cases they are paid for before arriving, and with a censorship board sitting here that would first see the picture, and in the event it was condemned, would mean the loss of several hundred dollars, in some cases, as well as the loss of the entire day for the theater.
