LEASING IS ACTIVE IN ARCHER COUNTY; WATCH DEEP TEST

Special to The Times. ARCHER CITY, March 17.—The Z. C. Scott No. 1, test well, 12 miles southeast of Archer City, is reported drilling at between 800 and 900 feet and naturally they expect to strike the first sand, the Miller, in the course of a few days. This is a 4,000-foot test, and is being watched with interest by representatives of all the big developing companies, as well as by the speculator who holds leases in this section. The geologists claim the possibilities of this well peculiarly interesting in that they pronounce it assuredly on the Pennsylvania strata running from Runnels county, Texas, to Tulsa, Okla.

E. H. H. GREEN HAS LEASED 100 SECTIONS IN SOUTHWEST TEXAS

Special to The Times. EASTLAND, TEX., March 17.—Renewed interest in the territory in the southwestern part of Eastland county is caused by the report that the Brown well of the Barnsdale Oil Company has developed a heavy pressure of smoky gas, indicating a fairly good sand, at 2380 feet. It is seven miles southwest of Cisco and some operators figure it may be properly classified as in the newly discovered Goss field.

Reports from the Sinclair well on the Gaines tract in Brown county are very favorable. Since the well was drilled in an effort has been made to go on through the oil sand. Each day the production has been increased. The owners are very optimistic and feel that the Brown county pool has been located.

E. H. R. Green of New York, formerly of Terrell, has leased 100 sections of Val Verde county land in the Whitehead Hill, pasture, 50 miles south of Sonora, and has contracted to drill five wells. A standard derrick has been erected and a water pipe has been laid five miles. Two freight trucks are in operation hauling material to the site of the first well, which is to be spudded within a few days.

QUICK-ACTION MEETING OF ARCHER CITY PEOPLE

A quick-action call meeting of our citizens was held Friday at the Powell Land office regarding the different offers being made to drill a well, especially two recent offers—one to drill 2,000 feet for 1,000 acres of lease and the lease of 300 town lots with a \$5,000 forfeit by the company to commence work inside of 60 days. The other proposition is for a 4,000 foot or more test, \$5,000 forfeit, 1500 acres of land adjoining the city in a body.

The result of the meeting was the appointment of Chas. Abercrombie to get the leases on land and lots, and accept the 4,000 foot people. If the leases can be secured, if that is found impossible the 2,000 foot men are to be contracted with.—Archer County News.

MRS. H. T. CANFIELD DIES SUNDAY NIGHT AT DAUGHTER'S HOME

Mrs. H. T. Canfield, for many years a resident of Wichita Falls, died Sunday night at the home of her daughter, Mrs. John Prescott, in Kansas City, according to a message received this morning by her grand-daughter, Mrs. Earl Clayton. Mrs. Canfield has been in Kansas City about a month, going to her daughter there after she had recovered to a certain degree from an illness that has kept her confined to her home for the past three months. Funeral arrangements have not yet been made, the message stated, but would be wired later. It is supposed that she will be buried in Riverside cemetery, this city, beside her husband, who died July 17, 1916. The Canfield family was one of the oldest and most influential in Wichita Falls, for a number of years Mr. Canfield held the local postoffice and he was an extensive property holder. Both Mr. and Mrs. Canfield were prominent in the work of the Presbyterian church of the city, practically since the organization of the church, and their many friends will be much grieved to hear of the death of Mrs. Canfield, which follows that of her husband by a little less than three years. In 1915 Mr. and Mrs. Canfield celebrated their golden wedding anniversary, and both were then remarkably vigorous but shortly after this Mr. Canfield's health began to fail.

There are surviving Mrs. Canfield, her daughter, Mrs. Prescott, four grandchildren, the two Misses Prescott of Kansas City, Mrs. Earl Clayton of this city, and Lieutenant Edson Jalonick, with the American Expeditionary Force, in France, 52nd Division, for the past year. Two great grandchildren, Helen and Jean Clayton of this city.

LACK OF FOOD.

FINAL APPEAL BEING MADE

Chairman Duke Makes Special Trip
to El Paso and Iowa
Park Today.

By Associated Press.
NEW YORK, March 16.—
Thousands of men, women and
children are starving to death
in Caucasus, according to the
first report from Dr. James L.
Barton, chairman of the Com-
mission recently sent to that
region by the American Com-
mission for Relief in the Near
East, received at headquarters
today.

"There is no bread anywhere,"
said the report. "The Govern-
ment has not a pound. There
are 45,000 people in Bvirian
wholly without bread and the or-
phanages and troops all through
Bvirian are in dire condition."
"There is not a dog, cat,
horse, camel or any living thing
in all the Igdar region. We saw
refugees women stripping the
flesh from a dead horse with
their bare hands today."
"Another week will score ten
thousand lives lost. For heav-
en's sake hurry."

Wichita Falls campaign for its
quota of the Armenian and Syrian
Relief Fund has not closed. Yester-
day, W. R. Duke, the publicity cam-
paign manager, who has also been
managing practically every detail of
the campaign, had fully decided to
close the drive, even if the county
was short, as it had dragged and the
response seemed so little in compar-
ison to the effort expended. But the
foregoing Associated Press dispatch
which tells of starving men, women
and children, with the possibility of
tens thousands of lives lost during
the coming week, decided him to
keep the drive up and to make an-
other effort to secure the \$25,000
which has been asked from this
county.

People are starving, they are eating
dead animals. There is no bread or
food of any sort save that which
America sends. The need could not
be greater, nor could the duty of all
Americans be plainer. Wichita Falls
and Wichita county was asked for
\$25,000 out of the great plenty which
this section has. Less than \$22,000
has been subscribed after weeks of
work. The \$3,000 deficit would mean
life to hundreds of these people of
the Near East, and the plea is made
that this amount be made up.

Mr. Duke went to El Paso and Iowa
Park in the interests of the drive to-
day. H. C. Cooper of Burkburnett
was here conferring with J. A. Kemp
concerning the drive today, and it is
expected that in the next few days
the towns in the county, outside Wich-
ita Falls, will send in large additions
to the few hundred dollars that they
monthly voluntary subscriptions are
asked from Wichitans, additional
subscriptions from those who have
given, but who are able to give
more, and subscriptions from those
who have not yet contributed.

WHY COFFEE IS HIGHER

There are several contributing reasons why coffee is higher. At the beginning of
the war in Europe there was a large stock of coffee in Brazil—who produces
eighty percent of the coffee of the World. Europe used two thirds of the World's coffee
supply and America one third. After war was declared in Europe their markets were
closed and America was Brazil's only outlet. So notwithstanding higher freight rates
and production costs we were enabled to buy coffees at little advance over pre-war costs.
After America entered the war the food administration restricted the importation of
coffee and we were forced to use up the surplus usually carried here—and now Brazil is
giving us just enough for our immediate wants—which together with the fact that
Europe's Coffee pot was empty and must be replenished—puts Brazil in the saddle. Then
the frosts last August so damaged the coffee trees that we are due to have a short
crop for at least three years—so there seems no immediate prospect for cheaper coffee—
YET COFFEE IS STILL THE CHEAPEST commodity that enters into human con-
sumption—A pound makes thirty cups.
