## INCREASE IN WAGES FOR RAILROAD MEN TOTALS 65 MILLION

WASHINGTON, April 11.—Wage ad 'wances aggregating \$65,000,000 were credered today by Director General Hines for four hundred thousand rail road engineers, firemen, trainman and conductors in both passenger and vages orders last year was \$538,000, or the brotherhood men. conductors in both passenger and treight service—members of the big four railway brotherhoods—retroactive since January 1, 1919. 


