

"That is our demand, to which we cling, and we cannot imagine what argument from the American side would be effective against it."

In President Wilson's message to congress of December 4, 1917, no passage can be found in textual agreement with the quotation in the cabinet statement. The quotation appears to be a condensation of the wrong passage in the message in question.

propose for its outcome only that which is righteous and of irreproachable intention for our foes as well as for our friends. The cause being just and holy, the settlement must be of like motive and quality. For this we can right, but for nothing less noble or less worthy of our traditions."



WASHINGTON, May 21.—President Wilson has cabled his approval of a plan submitted by Secretaries Redfield and Wilson for the relief of the NEW electric railway systems of the country now in the hands of receivers or threatened with insolvency. The lines affected are those in New York, Providence, Buffalo, New Orleans, Denver,

Fort Wayne, St. Paul, Spokane and Chattanooga.
