AUSTIN, TEX., July 2.—Senator Strickland of Anderson insisted in the Texas Senate today while the Strick

Strickland of Anderson insisted in the Texas Senate today while the Strickland resolution requesting the Washington government that a state of war existed between two factions in Northern Mexico was under consideration, that General De Rosey Cabell, commander of the Southern Department, and General Erwin were ordered out of Juares by General Gonzales, the Mexican commander.

In order to corroborate his former statements as to the Juarez incident on June 15, Senator Strickland sent up and had read what purported to be an exact translation of the incident, made by one Mike Gerlado. This translation, Senator Strickland said, reached him today from El Paso, and he did not know who Gerlado was. This statement proceeded to give the details of the incident leading to the meeting of the American commander with the Mexican commander at Juarez in which the latter is quoted as having given the American a specified time in which to leave Mexican territory, "In this statement do you seek to discredit General Cabell?" asked Senator Hertsberg of Bextar.

"I still think General Gonzales ordered General Cabell and General Erwin out of Juarez," replied Senator Strickland. The latter then proceeded that the regular army has not treated the national guard fairly and that "West Pointers believe they are supermen."

CONGRESS ACTS ON **ALL APPROPRIATIONS** AND TAKES RECESS

WASHINGTON. July 2.—Although Presidential approval cannot be secured until President Wilson reaches here from Paris, no embarrassment to government departments from lack of funds is expected as a result of the action of congress last night in acting on all appropriation bills needed by the various agencies of the government for the new fiscal year that began yesterday.

After being in session until midnight the House and Senate finally reached agreements on bills that have been in dispute for weeks. 

Arena Cost \$150,000.

Built at a cost of \$150,000, the structure includes 1,750,000 feet of lumber and hundreds of kegs of nails and boits, the combined weight of which runs into many hundreds of tons. In addition to the 80,000 spectators who can be scatch comportably there is can be seated comfortably there is standing room for close to 20,000 more standing room for close to 20,000 more so that the total capacity approaches the 100,000 mark. Four times the size of the Reno fight stadium, it measures over 600 feet across and the furtherest seat is just 290 feet from the center of the ring. There are 24 miles of seats and the grade or rise is such that the face of each spectator will appear just above the rene tator will appear just above the head of the person in front giving the effect of a sea of faces when viewed from

Great as was the care with which the arena has been constructed, at-tention has been fairly lavished up-on the ring in which the heavyweight championship of the world will be contested. It will be five feet above the floor of the stadium. Each side of the square, measured along the ropes, is exactly 20 feet and the extension outside the ropes two feet The flooring consists of a two inc thick planking with a top layer of inch closely matched planks laid in cross-tections. This fighting foundation is supported by the heaviest kind of posts and beams until there is not posts and beams until there is not a quiver when several 200 pound men plunge around on the structure. Over the ring flooring has been spread heavy felt padding one inch thick and atop of this a canvas ring covering which it is claimed is the heaviest ever used for such a purpose. Over 20 feet square, it contains but two seams and will be stretched through especially constructed evelets placed especially constructed eyelets placed eight inches apart. It will be dressed with lampblack and 24 pounds of resin after being put into position, which will not be until one hour or so before Willard and Dempsey appear. For the preliminary bouts an old canvas will be used and the felt underneath

will be used and the felt underneath covered with oil clothing in order that no water may seep through.

Support Eight Stories.

The ring posts will rise on the extreme corners of the platform and will be clamped to the floor by especially made metal collars in addition to being sunk into huge blocks, two and a half feet below the arena floor proper. From the posts, turn buckles will extend to the ring ropes 18 inches inside the posts. The top rope will measure four and a half teet from the floor and is one and a half inches in diameter. The lower ropes will be one and a half feet apart and all will be wound with heavy canvas banding. It is the claim of the contractors and builders that the ring and its foundation would support an eight-story building.

BOLSHEVIKI LIBERT DESCRIBED AS 17

By FRANK TAYLOR

(United Press Staff Correspondent)
NEW YORK, July 2.—That Russia under the dictatorship of the underdog is not exactly a land of liberty is one of the first discoveries of the foreigner visiting Moscow.

The bolsheviks like to call Russia the "free communistic republic." As a matter of fact, there are no laws, as they are known in other lands. But in their place there are several million manifestos, or proclamations, that have been issued by various soviets.

Nobody knows just how many there are, nor has anybody taken trouble to write them all down. Any soviet can issue manifestos, and all of them are prolific in exercising the privilege. Usually new manifestos are posted up on walls or are published in some paper.

If you act contrary to one of these

If you act contrary to one of these manifestos and a commissaire catches you—a commissaire is a bolshevik ofyou—a commissaire is a bolshevik official—a tribunal settles your case.
The tribunal is made up of three bolsheviks. It bothers not about either
laws or manifestos, there being none
of the former and too many of the
latter. The tribunal simply decides
what it thinks ought to be done to
you, which may be anything from
pardon for killing a man, to being
shot at sunrise for stealing a loaf or
bread, and it is done—that is bolshevik justice.

vik justice.
In soviet Russia, you are entirely at liberty, according to the bolsheviks. However, you cannot do any of the following things.
You cannot be at large without a permit to live issued by the commissaires. You need that for the right to breath.

You cannot buy a pair of socks, a shirt or any kind of clothes or merchandise. It is forbidden for stores to sell or people to buy merchandise. They are supposed to wait until it is

They are supposed to wait until it is issued.

It is forbidden to leave town, or travel anywhere, except on official husiness. Individuals cannot go from othe town to another on private business or because they want to travel.

You cannot rent a room or move into a new house, unless the commissaire assigns you to new quarters. You have to go where he says. Hotels do not exist. They are confiscated for headquarters.

It is forbidden to quit your tob it.

It is forbidden to quit your job, if you do not like it. You are considered an enemy of the government if you
