

SCHOOL AND PAYING BONDS TO BE VOTED

Elections Will Be Held Tomorrow And Large Majority For Issues is Expected

Ronds for two important public improvements, paved streets and school buildings, are to be voted up-on tomorrow by the taxpayers of on tomorrow by the taxpayers of Wichita Falls and the Wichita Falls independent school district. The paving bond issue is \$40,000 and that for the schools is \$65,000.

While no opposition to either bond

issue has been apparent, and there is little doubt that both will carry by the substantial majorities that by the substigutal majorities that are usually recorded in such elections, officials are anxious for a large a vote as possible. It is easier to sell bonds where the majority is large and an indorsement as near Is large and an indersement as hear by unanimous as possible is desired. Neither bond—issue will result in any increase over the present tax rate, it is pointed out. The polls will open at 8 o'clock and close at 7; the saloons will remain closed throughout the day

There will be two voting boxes in the paving bond election, but all voters in the school bond election will cast their ballots at the city hall. Taxpayers who vote at the court house box, and who wish to vote for both bond issues, must vote for the paying bonds at the court house and then go to the city, hall box to vote for the school bonds:

BELIEVE CAPTURE OF VERDUN CERTAIN

Most Germans Confident Fortress Will Evenutally Fall, In Spites

Berlin, May 22.—Germans regard he fall of Verdun as one of the cer tainties of this war. They have, how ever, no extravagant ideas; that the taking of the French citadel will re-sult in the collapse of the afties. Despite unnouncement of Paris and London that the German offensive at Verdun has ended definitely in defeat the German lines continue to draw more tightly about the formers. No such rapid gains as in the early days of the offensive have been made, nor are they expected. But the steady nibbring process is slowly wearing away the French defense northwest of Ver-

It is confidently believed here that the whole of the French works centering about Hill 304 and Dead Man's Hill will be in German hands before

Exactly how many men are now en gaged on each side at Verdûn is at present a mystery. Seven weeks ago the French strength was estimated at about 350,000 by Argentine and Swiss military observations with the Crown Prince's army. The size of the German army could not be esti-mated, but it was stated that it was perhaps two?or three times as large as the proposed new American stand-ing army.

Everything is moving systematically. There is less excitement at the front than in the cafe-debating societies in Berlin, where some ardent conversationalists can figure out, just how Verdun's capture will be the turning point of the war. They may believe it, but they would be unable to vaccinate that idea on the Crown Prince's army who are doing the fight-

While well-informed Germans do not believe that Verdun's fall will by any means bring the end of the war, they means bring the end of the war, they are convinced that such constant hammering at the French, while the Austrians are pushing their way into-Italy and the British and Russians are be ing held firmly by the Germans. bringing them nearer a final victory.

The diary of a member of the party which took the Jack London pictures in the South Sea Islands furnishes interesting insight into what was encountered there. These pictures are to be shown at the Wichita Theatre this week, for three days, starting tomorrow. An except from the diary follows:

While looking for an opening between the little Islands, a canoe with two occupants paddled off from one of the Islands and we let them aboard: It was certainly a surprise to see Polynesians again, instead of the Solomons. These men were big shown by the letters A and B.

Then we were taken to see the King, who was squafting on a mat in the center of a large grass house, his half dozen wives seated around. We shook hands and with the trader as interpreter. and with the trader as interpreter Jack made the king a present of col Jack made the king a present of colored called and some tobacco, and then told the king that he must give us a hundred cocoanuts in return. The old king started to say no until Jack made if to take back the presents, when the king hastily ordered the cocoanuts to be sent aboard. We went on through the village until we came to the graveyard and it was the most remarkable graveyard I have ever seen. The graves lay so close together that there was scarcehave ever seen. The graves lay so close together that there was scarcely room for a tombstone. At the outer edge of the graveyard were three wooden crosses that marked the graves with pride, and later on he showed us his three living wives. He informed us that if one of them didn't make copra better, he might find it necessary to make a cross for ind it necessary to make a cross for and I believe he meant it.

On going back to the traders house we noticed a Solomon Islander work-ing around the place. When we ask ed why this native was so-far away from home, we learned that he had been recruited about five years be-fore to work on a plantation for the trading company and had been put at this lagoon to prevent him from getting away. Those who have read Jack London's story "Mauki" will understand for this native was the original of that interesting character We lay at this lagoon for nearly week. I got a great deal of coral all colors. I saw trees of coral 20 feet high and wonderful gardons of it, through which parrot colored fish swam in and out. After piling the cockpit full of green cocoanuts that he king's subjects had selected for prepared to leave

We then sailed out of the lag and headed west, with a large croof natives following us in to canoes. We were clear of the lands by sundown, and Jack set course for another lagoon that reported some two hundred miles farther west, and the watches were set with confidence of a perfect night's rest. Just enough wind was blowing to keep the sails full, and there was scarcely a ripple on the water. During my watch, I was lazily smoking and steering at the Tota wheel. Everyone else was asleep on dec and I was only enough awake to keep the Spark's head on the course when I heard a slight rustling on the water ahead which increased in volume until it rose into the unmistak-able roar of a reef. Hastily bring the vessel up into the wind, I arous-ed all hands and after a good look at the reef, Jack ordered the Snark at the reef, Jack ordered the Snark about, and until morning we beat back and forth. When daylight came we were in sight of another lagoon that looked like Ontang, Java in minature. We had no trouble in getting inside the reef and sailed five niles across the lagoon to the largest island, and dropped anchor. In no time at all our decks were crowdno time at all our decks were crowded with hig, brown Polynesians who while they speared healthy fellows, seemed absolidly devoid of intellect. We tried hard to get some spears, but the natives refused to sell, no matter what we offered. There were about fifty of them; soon they began chanting a weird kind of song. We chanting a welrd kind of song. We found that this was in honor of their king, who was on his way out to us king, who was on his way out to us. Shortly a canoe finer than the rest came alongside and the old bewhiskered king, a fine old chap with nose rings and ear rings, came over the side. We received a shock, for his body was covered with tattooed designs of guns. The old fellow ordered the natives to the stern of the ed the natives to the stern of the boat and advancing, made us a speech of welcome. We tried to get his king spear, a beautifully carved weapon, designed to catch a victim going or coming, but he would not part with it. Of course we were expected to make the king a present. More in the spirit of a jest than anything else Mrs. London gave him an old night gown of hers.
