

COTTON FIRE SCHEDULE

A POLICE PROBLEM

Austin, Tex., Aug. 21. The new cotton schedule recently issued by the state fire insurance commission has become legally effective. This takes the place of the old schedule which has been in force for some time. The new schedule raises the standard for cotton risks and lowers the ratio of loss, which nitimately means a reduction in rates. means a reduction in rates.

An important feature of the new schedule is the material reduction

made on the insurance of small cotton warehouses. On those with a capacity for six hendred bales, the reduction is nearly 100 per cen. A reduction of ten per cent is also made in the final insurance rate on cotton stored in bonded warehouses under the supervision of the state warehouse and marketing department.



Preparations Under Way to Supply Substitute For Natural

Plans for an oil pipe line to transport fuel oil to local manufacturing con-cerns that will not be supplied with natural gas after October 1, are under way here, it became known today. The

plans are as yet merely tentative.

The plan is for the factories affected The plan is for the factories affected to form a company to construct the pipe line, which would be supplied either by one of the refineries in this county, or direct from the field; the line would run to tanks at each of the plants in question. It is understood that a proposition for getting oil from the Panhandle refinery, and running the line from that plant, is under consideration.

The factories in question would ge their oil at a low rate and the plan is considered to have many advantages. The first cost would be considerable, as the construction of four or five miles of three-inch line, with the nec essary pumps, tanks and other equip-ment, would be considerable.
