

NEGRO SHOOTS

FIRED LAST NIGHT NEAR 11TH AND OHIO

Broke Away-Negro Makes Successful Getaway.

Another instance of the many out breaks on the part of the lawless negro element here was aftorded in the bold holdupund shooting of W. H. Norris, a Clay county farmer, near the corner of Eleventh and Ohio, within two blocks of rae police sta-tion at a few minutes after ten last night. Mr. Norris, returning from night. Mr. Norris, returning from a visit to a friend was coming toward town on Ohio when he was halted by a negro in front of Morgan's feed store and ordered to devate his hands. The negro approached on his left side and grasped him with his left hand as he ordered him with his left hand as he ordered him to balt Mr. Norris attempted to break away and the negro shot him in the left side of the neck inflicting only a flesh wound, but narrowly missing the night. wound, but narrowly missing the jugular vein. The left side of his face was rather severely powder

face was rather severely powder burned Succeeding in breaking away the wounded man was probably ten feet from his assailant when the negro fired again, this time hitting bits in the left forearm about half way between the wrist and eibow, the bullet passing between the two bones but not breaking either of them.

Constable Will Allen, Deputy Harold Buster and Night thef McDonald who were at the station at the time of the holdup, ran immediately toward the sound of the shots and met Norris on his way to town, but the negro had executed a disappearance before the officers got there, and a quick search of the adjoining premises failed to show anyone. The officers returned to the station and questioned Norris about the appearance officers returned to the station and questioned Norris about the appearance of his assailant, getting a fairly good description. Mr. Norris said that he got a fairly good look at the man on account of his being out lined in the light at the corner of Eleventh and Ohio. 
