WICHITA FALLS WELL FORTIFIED

FORTUNATELY SITUATED AS TO FOOD SUPPLY IN THE EVENT OF RAILROAD STRIKE.

SPECULATION

stense Interest is Mainifested and Fublic Anxiously Awaits Result of Negotiations.

Few communities in the country can face the threatened railroad strike, from a food standpoint, with more equanimity than Wichita Falls, which has ample supplies of the three prime necessities—meat, flour and fuel—to meet her needs for many weeks. With an enormous smount of flour and wheat in storage here, tenof thousands of cattle within easy driving distance, and not dependent upon rail shipments of coal for fuel, this city is probably better off than any other in the Southwest.

while hope has not been abandoned that a strike will be averted both the railroad officials and the railroad employes are proceeding on the idea that a strike is certain. Local trainmen are counting the number of trips they still have to make before the strike order becomes effective, and some of them have only one or

It has become known that the rallroads will endeavor to draft their other employes for train service, but with what success remains to be seen.

with their cause; the railroad officials on the other hand, assert that both shop and office employes in large numbers will be available for train

If a strike comes, the situation in the Southwest will be more serious than in other sections of the country, where there are always a number of non-protherhood trainmen available for service. In New York and Pennsylvania there are probably enough such trainmen to man the necessary. such trainmen to man the necessary trains, but the railroads in that secon will probably use them all.

Wichitans away from home at summer resorts are proceeding home to day, not caring to be away from their families in case of an extended strike. The Wichita Fill & Elevator for Company has called in all its salesmen and other local concerns are already putting limits on the shipments to customers with a view to distributing lavailable supplies as generally as posavailable supplies as generally as pos

Trainmen stationed here are pre-Trainmen stationed here are prepared for a period of idieness, according to some members of the orders, who point out that business has been brisk on the railroads for several months past, and that steady work has been the rule for nearly all employes. They say that the men have been saving as much money as possible ever since the possibility of a strike became apparent, and that there is little reason to expect any distress before the strike ir settled. Members of the brotherhoods make no secret of the fact that they expect the strike to be a very brief one, some putting 36 hours as the maximum. Others take a less optimistic view, predicting a strike of 30 days or longer.

There was no confirmation to be had today of a report that strike-breaking trainmen had already been stationed at all division points, including Wichita Falls, in anticipation of Monday's tieup. Trainmen said they did not believe any appreciable number of strike breakers were available in this section. There are some evidences however that the report is well founded. well founded.

Just how complete the tieup will he, if it comes at all, is something that cannot be estimated in advance. Railroad officials say that passenger schedules will be maintained and that cannot fraight trains will run to me. schedules will trains will run to prevent any distress; the brotherhood members do not believe that a complete tieup will be effected but they declare that it will be near enough complete for the pinch to be severely felt. That the railroads anticipate a tieup of considerable proportions is indicated by the embargo which has been declared upon perishable freight shipments for next Monday.

That Wichita Falls is well prepared so far as her food supply is concerned, is indicated by estimates of the meat and flour that would be available. There are from 40,000 to 50,000 head of cattle within easy driving distance of this city, from which the meat supply could be drawn. Than amount of wheat in storage here is estimated at 500,000 bushels, with probably as much more within easy reach. There is a large amount of flour in storage here, but not enough for any extended period.

This does not mean that the effect of the strike upon the food situation will not be felt at all. Such things as potatoes, fruit, sugar and cashed goods would become scarce within a very few says after the strike order went into effect, but there would be plenty of the prime necessities to last a long time. Prices might be increased, and the diet afforded would have little variety and the situation would result in much discomfort, but it would be far better than in those cities that are entirely dependent upon the railroads for whatever food that the

It is not generally realized that the average city lives upon a very narrow margin of supply of food. A city such as Dalbas, for instance, would be in against it hard within two or three days, if the strike were ordered, as the supply of necessities in that city is dependent almost entirely upon what the railroads bring.
