COURT BILL HAS PASSED S. SENATE

MEASURE WAS BROUGHT UP TO-DAY BY SENATOR CULBERSON AND FAVORABLE ACTION WAS SECURED IN UPPER HOUSE

Bill Will No: Likely Fare So Well In the Lower Branch of Congress and It is Not Expected to Finally Pass

The bill to make a federal court town of Wichita Falls has completed part of its legislative journey, passing the Senate this morning, according to advices received early this afternoon. Judge Carrigan received the following

Today's message caused considerable quiet gratification among Senator Culberson's friends here, as answering campaign charges that he was unable to attend to his senatorial duties.

UMEROUS CHANGES FROM ORIGINAL BILL BEING CONSIDERED IN EFFORT TO REACH AN EARLY

MAY-CUT THE TAX

Bill Proposes to Abolish Stamp Tax on Various Kinds of Commercial Paper to Raise That on Munitions Profits of Manufacturers.

Washington, Sept. 7. Conferees on the emergency revenue bill struck out the Phelan amendment to empower the president to retaliate against citizens of belligerent nations which interfere with the United States mails. The arguments which prevailed in the conference was that it might work great hardships to Americans in foreign countries by count

er retaliation. The conference also abandoned the Chamberlain amenument to probibit admission of Pacific salmon or half admission of Pacine salmon or nate but through a foreign country except when spawned from an American port. This, it was decided, might de-velop a commercial war with Canada and bring about retaliation against American esast asheries.

Cnierces on the revenue bill were at work early today, but no assurance existed that their report would be sub mitted before tomorrew, or that congress could adjourn before Saturday.


