FORMER PREMIER AGAIN IN FAVOR

Associated Press Mail Correspondence. Shanghai, China.—Tang Shao yi, who was first premier of the Chinese republic, but incurred the displeasure of Yuan Shi kai and had been out of favor for a period of four years, has again loomed big in Chinese affairs.

Associated with Tang Shao yi, in the present effort to direct the reorganization of the Chinese government, are Dr. Sun Yat sen, the first provisional president of the Chinese republic, and Premier Pan Chi ju.

Tang Shao yi's home on Range Road in this city is a large European house surrounded by a walled garden bright with tropical flowers.

Under the republic the same tactics were followed. Soldiers from the provinces and the Manchus were quartered upon the southern provinces just as in the Manchus days.

TALK "BAD CHECKS"

An Appropriation of \$40 Was Made for Prizes for Declamation Classes.

Discussion of the "bad check" question made today's session of the Rotary club a very interesting one, numerous speakers talking on various phases of this subject. Attendance was unusually good, being near the 100 mark.

The discussion of the bad check question was led by Orville Bullington, who said that the law against bad checks was practically a dead letter as it was almost impossible to get a conviction under it. Among those taking part in the discussion were J. S. Maxwell, E. Stanley Field, J. J. Colonna, W. M. McGregor, C. W. Snider, E. W. Nicholson, J. H. Martin, M. E. Stevens and E. G. Hill. More care in cashing checks for strangers, and more publicity for those whose checks are not paid by the banks, were urged by the speakers.

The Rotarians voted an appropriation of \$40 in prizes for the boys who are members of declamation classes in local schools. The prize was at first offered for public school pupils, but was changed to apply to all declamation pupils.

Secretary Johnson of the Chamber of Commerce urged that the Rotarians take part in the Vernon excursion and a committee consisting of J. W. Talbert, J. J. Colonna, and Jack Shelton was named to get up a three Rotary delegation. Short talks on behalf of the Wichita County Motor club were made by C. W. Reid and J. M. McFall.

At a meeting of the club directors previous to the luncheon twelve members who have missed four consecutive meetings without excuse were dropped from the membership rolls, but by special dispensation will be allowed to rejoin if they do so promptly.

COMMISSION STILL DISCUSSING BORDER

New London, Conn., Sept. 14.—American members of the international commission, meeting here today, were occupied with the Mexican conference in investigating the cause and effect of Mexican mining decrees and in advising with Major General Piles as to the military situation on the border. There

is little prospect that the joint commission will return to the formulation of a border protocol until the American members have reached a tentative agreement among themselves as to the wisest course to pursue. It was indicated today that questions of real estate and other taxes in Mexico, as they affect American property holders, will be looked into by the joint commission when its examination of the mining taxes has been completed.

PLEA OF LABOR MEN DISMISSED BY JUDGE

New York, Sept. 14.—The pleas of Frank S. Minnett, former attorney general of Ohio and Jacob C. Taylor, president of Labor's National Peace Council, that prejudicial conduct by government prosecutors brought about their indictment here were dismissed today by United States Judge Hand. Minnett and Taylor and others were accused of violating the Sherman law by fomenting strikes in munition works and on ocean steamship piers.

PERCENTAGE OF SICK IN GUARD IS LOW

Washington, Sept. 14.—Reports from the Southern department to the week ending Sept. 9, received today by the war department, show the percentage of sick among the national Guardsmen on the border to have been 1.91, with three deaths, one each from appendicitis, dysentery and gastric ulcers.

BETTING IS 10 TO 7 ON HUGHES AGAINST WILSON

New York, Sept. 14.—Offers of ten to seven on Hughes against Wilson and ten to seven that the republicans will carry New York state, were posted in Wall street after the election returns from Maine had been scanned. Some money was offered on Wilson at one to two.

TEMPLE CUTS WATER RATES 30 PER CENT

Temple, Tex., Sept. 14.—At a meeting of the city water commissioners a new schedule of rates to be charged private consumers was agreed upon to become effective October 1, reducing rates more than 30 per cent.

JUDGE REFUSES TO QUASH INDICTMENTS

Duluth, Minn., Sept. 14.—Judge Peckler, in district court today, rejected the motion to quash the indictments against the nine Industrial Workers of the World, held for the murder of Deputy Sheriff J. W. Myron at Bawabok. The prisoners will enter their pleas tomorrow to the indictments.

PROHIBITION SPECIAL SUFFERS BLOCKADE

Spokane, Wash., Sept. 14.—Their itinerary disarranged when a rock slide blocked the railroad last night, J. Frank Hanley and Dr. Ira Landreth, prohibitionist candidates for president and vice president, were compelled to abandon their campaigns in central Washington today.

SISTER OF PRESIDENT IS GROWING WEAKER

New London, Conn., Sept. 14.—Mrs. Anna Howe, President Wilson's sister, who is gravely ill here, was reported to have grown weaker today. The physician's bulletin said: "Mrs. Howe had a comfortable night, but shows more weakness in the last 24 hours."

INCREASE IN CASES OF INFANTILE PARALYSIS

New York, Sept. 14.—Report on infantile paralysis for the 24 hours ending at ten a. m. today shows an increase over the low record of the previous day. There were 36 new cases and eleven deaths, as against 31 new cases and nine deaths for the previous day.

MAKING HARD FIGHT AGAINST FOREST FIRES

Santa Francisco, Sept. 14.—Federal and state forestry officials and hundreds of volunteers were making every effort today to conquer several forest fires burning over several thousand acres of timber and farm lands along the Central California coast. A stand was being made at the beginning of the giant redwood forest against the largest fire in the Santa Cruz mountains.

PRESIDENT DISPOSES OF MASS OF BUSINESS

Long Beach, N. J., Sept. 14.—President Wilson today disposed of a mass of official business which accumulated here during his trip to the bedside of his sister, Mrs. Anna Howe, who is ill at New London, Connecticut. He also discussed the political situation with Secretary McAdoo. Several hours were occupied in signing commissions and other executive papers.

CONNECTICUT PLANS TO VOTE GUARDSMEN

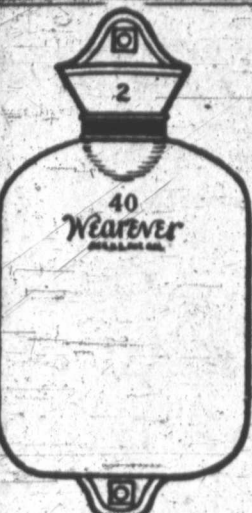
