



El Paso, Tex., Sept. 25.—Three important events of an international character that will have a direct and of the United States will be held bere from October 14 to 19 inclusive. Tuey are: The International Irriga-tion Congress, the International Farm Congress and the International Soil Products Exposition which lasts until October 24.

In connection with these meetings there will be the dedication on October 14 by President Wilson of the great Elephant Butte Dam, one of the greatest irrigation structures and projects in the world. Immediately after these ceremonies which are to take place at the dam, President Wilson comes to El Paso where he probably will speak at the congress that

night.
This will be the twenty-third aunual meeting of the international trrigation Congress and it will be the second time that it has met here. The tentative program begins with the dedication of the Elephant Butte Dam. The congress has before it for discussion many important subjects regarding irrigation in both the United States and Mexico. It is probable that one of the meetings will be held across the international border at Juarez, Mexico.

### PANAMA FEARING U. S. OCCUPATION

Earnest Efforts Being Made to Relieve Tension in National

Associated Press Mail Correspondence.
Primme.—With American occupation a godin before which all Panama politicians stand aghast, earnest offers are being made to relieve the tension which developed recently in the National Assembly, and which threatened to cause the intervention of the American authorities.

When the assembly convened 19 of the 33 deputies were of the government party and 14 of the opposition. For each deputy there is an alternate and the constitution provides that "in the absence of a deputy, whether accidental or permanently."
Its atternate may vote in his place.
The alternates of three of the government deputies were in sympathy with the opposition. The coup consisted of keeping those three deputies away from the assembly and vot ing their alternates in their places. This was accomplished by getting two of them drunk and by having the attorney of another insist that it was ecessary to make a trip to the country to view the estate with a series delays which kept them out till ght. During the absence of the three the balance of power in the assembly shifted to 17 opposition to 16 government votes and the opposition was able to elect the presiding officer, who has great power in the conduct of legislation.

When the majority of the assembly inderstood the coup they declared the proceeder illegal and the result oid. They based their charge on nterpretation of the constitution to the effect that the alternate could not be accepted in the assembly with out written acknowledgement written acknowledgement from principal, and that the alternates hot been duly accredited. The had hot been duly accredited. The opposition maintained that every requirement had been met and that the election was perfectly legal. The point at issue is the legality of the voting of the alternates, and this is the point on which adjustment will have to be made to prevent the entry of the United States. 
