### FALL OF CONSTANZA **BLOW TO ROUMANIA**

Seaport Used as Gateway By Russian Troops Coming to Aid in Fighting

Special to The Times. Washington, Oct. 24—Constanza, the Roumanian seaport which fell into the hands of the central powers, advancing through Dobrudja, on Monday, is a gateway of much importance to the Roumanians, and its fall will prove a decided blow to them, acording to a bulletin issued today by the National Geographic Society. "Until hostilities began in 1914 Constantza was the transfer point for the extensive passenger service from London, Paris, Brussels, Berlin, Vienna and Buda-pest to Constantinople and the Near East. - Millions of dollars have been spent un the harbor and docks of Constantza since the town became a Rouman ian possession by the Treaty of Berlin which transferred the Dobrudja province to this country. The principal improvements were begun in 1896, "Constantza, or Kustendje, with its wide clean streets, its numerous mosques, synagogues and churches, occu-pies the site of the ancient Tomi, To mis or Tombs, the metropolis of the Euxine. 


