Two Blacks Who are Found in Dug-out are Fired Upon but one Makes Getaway—Girl is Delirious This Morning

While his victim, in her delirium, still struggles to escape him, the negro who yesterday morning assaulted the Clay county girl...

PAUL WAPLES IS VICTIM OF AUTO ACCIDENT TODAY

STATE DEMOCRATIC CHAIRMAN COLLIDED WITH AUTO IN FRONT OF HOME

HAD MANY INTERESTS

Millionaire Banker, Capitalist and Railroad Director, Automobile Struck on Track in Front of Approaching Street Car

By Associated Press. Fort Worth, Tex., Nov. 16.—Paul Waples, chairman of the state democratic executive committee, president of the Waples Lumber Company and millionaire banker and capitalist was killed this morning in front of his country home near Handley station on an overpass street which collided with the Waples automobile.

The only other occupant of the car, John Nienga, the chauffeur was buried 30 feet below escaped injury. Waples died in the debris of the smashed automobile, never regaining consciousness and living only twenty minutes.

The car was on its way to Handley station when it struck the overpass. The crossing is only a few feet in front of his home. The car was bound for Fort Worth from Dallas and was crowded.

Waples saw the approaching overpass and called to the chauffeur; the latter however, was unable to stop the automobile before it rolled on the track. It had come to a full stop before being hit. The intention was to get into the street car, however, passengers suffered slight injuries.

Besides being president of the grocery company, Waples was a director of the American Exchange and National Bank of Dallas, a director in the Frisco and Lockland railroad, in the Hartman-Lane Lumber Company, the Tator Tobacco Company and chairman of the board of directors of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram.

Colonel Waples has always been interested in politics but not as an office holder, always steadfastly refusing to run for office. However he had been chairman of the state democratic committee for four years, had been a member several times before being made chairman and was one of Governor Ferguson's first supporters. He was actively identified with Colonel's campaign for governor but not for senator.

He was born in Missouri 56 years ago and came to Texas in 1876. He leaves no children and few surviving relatives. His wealth is estimated at more than \$1,000,000.

BEGIN EVIDENCE IN CASE AT HENRIETTA

Sister of Defendant Testifies For State in Trial of Alfred Smith

Taking of testimony started today at Henrietta in the case of Alfred Smith, the Clay county youth charged with murder in connection with the killing of his father, W. G. Smith, at Deer Creek in the southern part of Clay county last July.

This morning's witnesses included a daughter of the slain man, physicians who were called and officers who went to the scene. It was expected that the state would rest its case this afternoon. The jury was completed late Wednesday, two days being consumed in the selection of it.

FOSTER INDICTED BY HENRIETTA JURY

Bill is Returned Against Archer County Man Brought Here For Safe Keeping

W. H. Foster, who was arrested in Archer county last week on a warrant charging assault, following an attack upon a young woman and who was brought to Wichita Falls Saturday for safe keeping when the situation at Archer City became rather tense, was taken to Henrietta yesterday and was indicted there on a charge of rape.

Foster was brought to this city after some residents of Archer county had assumed a threatening attitude toward him, and officers there considered it unsafe for him in Archer City. His examining trial had been set for last Saturday, but was waived, bond being fixed at \$5,000.

The indictment in Clay county for an offense committed in Archer county is an unusual procedure but one which the law permits in cases of this kind, as any county adjoining Archer or in the same judicial district would have jurisdiction in a rape case. It is understood, Foster has not tried, but bond, but that he has engaged counsel. He denies his guilt.

BELIEVE THIS CITY CONTRIBUTED FIRST

Amount Raised Here for Campaign Deficit Probably Earliest Received by Committee

Wichita Falls' contribution of about \$120 toward wiping out the \$200,000 deficit in the campaign fund was the first in Texas, and perhaps the first in the country, it is believed here. The national committee wanted 300 cities to undertake to raise \$100 each, which would amount for \$300,000 of the deficit.

The contribution from this city, which was raised in a few hours in spite of the fact that nearly \$1200 had already been given by Wichita county before the election, was secured Tuesday and Democratic Treasurer Marsh was notified to that effect. Tuesday evening, Texas Committeeman Poindester suggested to the democrats of his home town, Cleburne, that it could be fitting for them to make Cleburne the first city to come forward with its \$100, but some hours previous to that, Wichita Falls \$100 was already on its way to Washington. County Chairman R. E. Huff having forwarded it on the afternoon train after notifying Mr. Marsh that it was coming.

Should Wichita Falls prove to be the first city to give its quota it would be a substantial tribute to both the genuineness of the brand of democracy of this city and to the city's right now methods of doing things.

Poker, Craps, Pool and Other Intellectual Pursuits Are Discovered There

Altus, Okla., Nov. 16.—The Farmers' Literary and Athletic Club, a club organized for the uplift of the horny handed sons of toil, and which is located on the second floor of the Bickley building, was the scene of the most successful raid of many years Tuesday night. Quietly this club has been organized and put into operation the past month, and from reliable sources has paid the officials many hundred dollars a day from the very start. The literary end of the club was only in a stage of incubation at the time of the raid, and the athletic end was developed into a full grown monster. Two crap shooting games with a green cloth annex was the favorite form of developing muscles. The exercise was a good one, but came mighty high—star poker came in for a good play, as did the old form of draw—Pool tables entered the scene. Those that arrived early to take their exercise but had to quit on account of lack of funds. Two spotters were used in bringing this notorious club to justice and to them belongs the credit of the completeness of every detail of the raid. Everything was planned out several days ago, by the county authorities; a diagram of the main room was drawn and in the diagram were shown the exact location of every gambling device, lights, chairs, main desk and in fact every piece of furniture in the club room. The signals of the club were used by the officers as their signals; for instance, the club's signal of an approaching officer was one long buzz, which sounded under the main desk and was operated by the first door man. At this signal the club cleaned up, read magazines, discussed the foreign policy, and played pool. The officers used the same signal, and by the time the two spotters had been members for about a week before the raid, had

Her brother-in-law heard her cries just as she reached home and she was quickly brought into the house. She was in a fainting condition and several minutes elapsed before she could be revived. In the meantime Ashford had seized his shotgun and gone out to seek her assailant.

Wednesday morning after the girl had recovered from her experience of the night before, officers went to the barn the second attack was made. Her story told after she had been found in the thicket and brought back home was that the negro seized and gagged her before she had a fair realization of what was transpiring and before she could make any outcry.

The girl regained consciousness while the negro was still carrying her away and began to struggle. She wrenched herself away and endeavored to walk back toward the house, but was unable to run and the negro seized her again. Her red sweater, which was found by the searchers, was torn off in this struggle.

The negro remained with the girl after the assault and sitting near her until she was able to get up. He had stalked her from day to day, awaiting his chance and how, while hiding in the barn, he had heard her and the officers talking the night before. The girl was still bound and gagged and unable to make any outcry.

Other than the marks made by the egg in her mouth, a bleeding nose and a mass of cockle burrs in her hair she showed little evidence of abuse other than that caused by the accomplishment of the black brute's purpose. When found she had retained an unconsciousness, but revived soon after being brought to her home.

Miss Leah LaFayette was about 22 years of age, and an unusually attractive and popular girl. Her family have lived in this county for many years, at present being tenants on the farm of C. C. Bunnenburg of this city. She was well known in Wichita Falls, having worked in a few of the stores, and her name was well known to the people of the city.

Although the members of the LaFayette family were greatly alarmed by the attack of Tuesday night, neither they nor any of the officers summoned to the scene had any thought that the negro would dare to come near the premises again and it did not occur to anyone to look in the barn, where the negro remained during the night and where he made his second attack yesterday morning.
