Stock men have been gaying \$40 to \$42 per ton for feed of this kind, and while such a price would have been prohibitive at one time: the prevailing ligh prices for beef cattle enable ranchmen to meet the higher cost. A year ago cotton seed meal was about ten-dollars a ton cheaper than at present.






