### NOTES ARE SENT

Going to All Belligerent Countries Today—Address Says Peace Can Be Based on Victory for Either of Groups Now at War

Washington, Jan. 22.—President Wilson, in a personal address to the Senate today, laid down the question of whether the United States should depart from its traditional policy of isolation and no entangling alliances, and take part in a world league to preserve peace, after the war.

No such history-making event, with such far-reaching possibilities to the United States, probably ever had been staged in the Senate chamber. Shattering precedents of more than a century, the president, regarding the Senate, with its treaty-making power, as his counsellors in foreign affairs, explained why he believed the time had come for the world to know America's position and discuss the underlying causes on which he believed a permanent peace of the world can be maintained.

While President Wilson was speaking directly to the senators, after the manner of Washington, Madison and Adams, his address was in the hands of all foreign governments, or on its way to them.

In the background of the fundamental proposition of whether the United States should after Washington and carried out by a long line of presidents, was the possibility, that out of some such league of nations might come a way to end the present war.
