R. C. Miller Discusses Causes, Effects and Remedy-Sheriff's

A forceful sermon upon the divorce evil its causes, effects and remedies was delivered at the First Baptist Church Sunday night by Rev. R. C. Miller, the pastor. In the course of his sermon, 4r. Miller praised Sheriff Hawkins for that officer's decision to close the flats and said all good citizens would support the move.

Dr. Miller declared that divorces are sometimes justified, but that the extent of the evil in this country made divorce an American weakness, the pointed out that while England had only 800 divorces in 1915 and Canada only 20, there were 16,000 in the United States.
