## WOMEN NOT TO LOSE PROPERTY

HAVE BEEN ADVISED TO RESIST EFFORTS TO EVICT IF THEY OWN HOUSES

### LAWSUITS UNLIKELY

Not Believed Those Figuring in Deals Would Care to Face Publicity

Women of the flats who own property in that district are to be advised to hold their premises after the general vacating ordered by Sheriff Hawkins takes place February 1. Property is usually sold to the women there on the installment plan, some of the houses costing many times the actual value of the property. Failure to make a payment deprives the woman of the house and all that she has laid out for it. Many of the women are said to have made payments of as much as \$2500 on small houses and to still owe on them, and stand a chance of being evicted if they are ordered away. Sheriff Hawkins is authority for a statement that one woman has paid as much as \$3500 for a five room house on a lot 50 and still owes money on the place.

The one bad feature which made Sheriff Hawkins hesitate to close the place is the fact that the women may lose the money which they have put into their property. He was afraid that the property would revert under the contracts of sale to the vendors, some of whom are said to be business and professional men; and a few active in church circles. But after investigation he is of the opinion that if the women retain possession of the property, even if the vendors are willing to brave publicity and sue for the property, the women will win out. Sheriff Hawkins bases his opinion on a statute which bars action for the collection of notes against property which is to be used for disorderly house purposes. It is estimated that actions to recover possession of property in the flats may also lead to investigation of the sale and if irregularities in the sale can be uncovered, prosecutions for renting property for immoral purposes may be brought. Officers declare that many of the contracts of sale are really not valid sales, but merely an evasion of the law against renting property for that purpose.

## THEFT OF SEVERAL AUTOS UNCOVERED

Two Women Questioned Here Tell of Wholesale Traffic in South Texas Towns

While questioning two local women with a view of securing evidence for a white slave raid, an officer obtained a statement from one of them with which it is expected to bring about the conviction of two men for organized and wholesale automobile thefts in South Texas cities. These men known by several aliases are being held in Dallas on a burglary charge, pending the investigation of their suspected operation on the automobiles. According to the woman's statement the two men, with whom the women were living, although not married to them, stole two automobiles in Houston and drove to San Antonio where the cars were disposed of. Two more machines were stolen at San Antonio and sold at El Paso. After stopping in El Paso a while the party returned to Houston where two more cars were stolen and one disposed of in New Orleans and the other in Dayton on the way back. After making the statement the woman expressed fear for her personal safety if she was to give a public place of safety outside the county. The other woman, who admitted that she knew the facts of the case, refused to make a statement. The statement was obtained from the first woman on a representation that the other had made a statement of the affair.

## POLL AUTOMOBILE MEMBERS ON BONDS

Committee's Appeal to Quality Also Asks For Expression as to Proposed Issue

Post cards enclosed in the letters sent out by the Motor Club to Wichita county automobile owners urging the payment of their property and poll taxes in preparation for the proposed good roads bond issue on which the recipient will record his views in regard to the issue will in effect amount to a straw vote of the automobile owners of the county on the proposition.

As there are in excess of 2000 automobiles in the county each of whom is a person of no inconsiderable influence with his friends and neighbors, it is believed that a favorable vote on their part will almost assure the success of the bond issue. The letter follows:

"To the Automobile Owner Addressed, Wichita County, Texas. Dear Sir: How would you like to drive your car over paved highways? This is what we are planning for you, as it is the intention of the Wichita County Motor Club to call for an election during this year to vote bonds for the purpose of constructing a system of durable, hard surface roads which will serve 85 per cent of the population of the county.

"Have you paid your property tax and poll tax? You must attend to this at once, if you are to voice your sentiments by registering a vote in the coming bond election. It is our earnest desire that the taxes be paid by not only the automobile owners but by all farmers and business men as well, so please bear this in mind and see that not only your taxes are paid but that your neighbor also pays his.

"The Wichita County Motor Club was organized for the promotion of the interests of all automobile owners. It is the purpose of the club to see that the proper traffic ordinances are passed and enforced, to prosecute those who are guilty of stealing members' cars or any tools or accessories and for the purpose of attending to the many other matters of importance which may arise from time to time. The dues in this club are only \$5 per year which price includes a high colored radiator emblem for use on a member's car together with membership card.
