Women of the flats who own prop erty in that district are to be advis ed to hold their premises after the general vacating ordered by Sheriff Hawkins takes place February 1. Property is usually sold to the wo-men there on the installment plan. men there on the installment plan, some of the houses costing many times the actual value of the property. Failure to make a payment deprives the woman of the house and all that she has faid on it. Many of the women are said to have made payments of as much as \$2500 on small houses and to still owe on them, and stand a charge to lose if they are stand a charce to lose if they are ordered away. 


