NEW REPORT OF AUSTRIAN PEACE MOVE

Paris, April 16.—A semi-official statement has been issued in Vienna declaring that Austria desires peace with the Russian people and that there is no real obstacle to this aim, according to a Zurich dispatch to the Radio agency.

The dispatch quotes a statement issued by a semi-official press bureau in Vienna in which it is said the Austro-Hungarian monarchy has taken note of the recent declaration of the Russian provisional government that it does not seek foreign territory but desires a durable peace founded on the rights of peoples to dispose of themselves.

The statement says the Austro-Hungarian government is inspired by the same desire.





War prices for flour continue to soar, and this week Wichitans are paying \$3.25 to \$3.50 and upwards for 50-pound sacks that cost \$2.85 and \$3 a week ago.
