A little bit of local history is being erased as the Pierce Construction Company erects homes in the 900 block on Walnut Street.

Perhaps the last remaining evidence of a much-travelled road, which led to Friona's main business district in the early days was being blotted out, as foundations were run for move-in houses to be erected on the block.

Back before the days of paving, this main road to Friona coming into town from the east followed more nearly the parallel of the railroad. It made a fairly sharp turn at the Pete Buske property on the eastern edge of the city, and headed directly toward the Santa Fe Continental Grain - Maurer Machinery vacinity.

The "road", which started out as a wagon trail, was still plainly visible as one examined "Block 28" of the original town of Friona this week. You see a depression about the width of a wagon, or an automobile, running crosswise of the block. The depression is about six or eight inches deep.

It isn't two-lanes wide either, mind you -- just one. The trail was in use back in the days when there wasn't much danger of meeting anyone on the road, and folks weren't geared fast enough to worry about passing anyone.

As one old timer put it "You didn't even have to follow the trail. There were no obstacles to keep you from no cutting across the country any direction you wanted to go." All there was to Friona at the time consisted of a few businesses located on what is now the southernmost two blocks of Main Street.

At one time, in the early days of the town, a cemetery was located just off the road, not too far from the block described above, where the building is taking place.

There never were but a few graves located there, how ever. Town leaders realized that if Friona ever grew, this would be too close to the town for a cemetery, and so when a family donated land for use as a cemetery, it was located at the present cemetery location.

All of the graves at the old cemetery plot were moved, with permission of the kinsmen, except for one grave of a young boy, whose parents had moved.
