

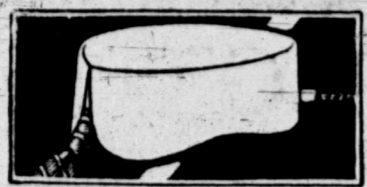
ARMY OFFICER MAY BE HERE NEXT WEEK

NO REPORTS HERE OF TAMPERING WITH WIRES Reports of tampering with the wires of the Katy, whose telegraphers are now on strike, find no echo along the Northwestern or Henrietta division of the Katy, according to local officials. Precautions to guard against danger from this source have been taken, however, by officials of the road. No wire tapping was mentioned in the reports, the tampering consisting of cutting wires and obstructing them in such a way as to put them out of commission, as for instance throwing a balling wire across the line, thereby stranding the current, by which simply means a line can be put out of commission for over 24 hours.
