RESIGNATION RUSSIAN WAR MINISTER CAUSE **ANXIETY BY ALLIES**

Apparently Means That Dissolution of Provisional Government Has Begun

While military interests continue to center in the great battle on the French front where the British are slowly but steadily pressing the Germans back, the political situation in Russia is demanding increasing attention and is causing added concern among all the allied nations.

Under the continued harrassing force of the radical elements of Petrograd the provisional government which has held Russia together, at least in semblance, since the overthrow of the old regime now shows signs of breaking up.

The first gap in the government's lines was created yesterday when Guchkoff, the minister of war and marine, handed in his resignation.

The entire significance of Guchkoff's resignation has not yet devoloped but it may prove that his step was taken to compel the radicals either to take their share of the responsibility of the government or cease interference with government

In the other theaters of war the only incident of moment is in Austrian reports of a great artillery bombardment on the Ionzo front. This may mean that the long inactivity of Gen. Cadorna is about to be broken.






