The "Dreadnought," a suitable name for it, is made of flexible rubberized material in one piece, including the shoes, and is impervious alike to atmosphere and water. It is fitted with a detachable Ining padded with the silky kapok, the best and most practical material for obtaining buoyancy in water known to modern science and which, when properly, packed in a durable cloth, retains its buoyancy indefinitely.

The shoes are of ordinary size, but the soles are constructed of a pliable, high gravity, special composition rabber, each shoe weighing 212 pounds, thus between them taking up a good part of the weight of the whole suit, which is about 14 pounds, or as much as the average heavy overcoat. The weight and gravity in the soles, combined with the extreme buoyancy of the who! suit, keep the wearer in an upright position, with high above the water, indefinitely, evethough he were to become unconscious through fright or exhaustion.

the water or of the air about. For instance, in the course of a rigid test conducted by order of Assistant Secretary of the Navy Franklin D. Roosevelt, at the U. S. Naval Operating Base (Naval Air Station), at Key West, Fla., a navy lieutenant while piloting his scaplane in motion, put on the suit in 50 seconds and then jumped into the water, landing easily on his feet. Had this happened many miles out at sea he could have stayed affoat for hours, or until receiving assistance, or, nearer shore, he could, of course, have walked in.

In connection with this, at another test held at the Government Naval Base off Rockaway Beach. New York, the "Dreadhought" again triumphed when Lt. Lief of the U.S. Navy standing in water of great depth, and clad in the suit, held for some time an anchor weighing 60 pounds, which is equivalent to the weight in water of 12 persons. This demonstrates more than the mere feat successfully accomplished. It means that a lifeguard, wearing this suit, can without the assistance of a boat, save the lives of as many persons as can at one time cling to him.

Our airmen, whether in airplane, scaplane or dirigible balloon, are already using the "Dreadnought" extensively, overcoming as it does the extreme cold incident to high altitude, as well as the discomfort and exposure of the water, and thus adding safety and comfort to the thrilling joy of their occupation.

These precautions are particularly valuable in the case of land planes acting in conjunction with the Coast Artillery, as frequently happens. The target is generally placed as far as 20 miles out at sea, the firing being regulated by the land planes, which fly over the target and signal to the artillery. In event of accident, such as a motor failure, the plane could keep afloat only 15 minutes, leaving the men 20 or more miles out at sen to float until picked up.

Porter is a discharged marine having served with a marine unit in Asia during the World war. He said that his home is in lowa.

Blackie Harris, convicted highwayman, waived his rights of appeal and

received sentence late Wednesday. Sentence was pronounced by Judge Weldon before whom the defendant had been convicted on a charge of robbery by firearms and his punishment assessed at 20 years confinement in the state penitentiary.

Following the pronouncing of sentence, Harris asked Judge Weldon to recommend that he be pardoned at the
