



STAND ON TREATY  
WILSON'S CALL  
TO DEMOCRATS

In Telegram President Says  
Honor of National in  
Party's Hands

WASHINGTON, May 9.—A call to the democratic party to go into the campaign standing foursquare in favor of the treaty of Versailles and against the senate's reservation, was issued tonight by President Wilson in a telegram to Oregon democratic leaders, made public by the White House.

Declaring that the party had "the honor of the nation" in its hands, the president said that the Lodge reservation was "utterly inconsistent with the role of world leadership which the United States must assume."

The telegram was in response to the following message from G. E. Hamaker of Portland, Ore., chairman of the Multnomah county democratic central committee:

"Primary election May twenty-first. Please wire whether you consider it important to nominate candidates pledged to ratify Versailles treaty without Lodge reservations."

Text of President's Reply  
The reply of the president follows: "I think it imperative the party should at once proclaim itself the uncompromising champion of the nation's honor and the advocate of everything that the United States can do in the service of humanity."

Text of the president's telegram:  
"The League of Nations is the hope of the world. As a basis for the armistice, it was authorized by all the great fighting nations to say to the enemy that if he was to obtain his peace, he must accept the terms of the League of Nations."

The chief motives which led us to enter the war will be defeated unless that covenant is ratified and acted upon with vigor. We cannot in honor whitewash it down or weaken it as the republicans in the senate have proposed to do. If we are to exercise the kind of leadership to which the founders of the republic looked forward and which they depended upon their successors to establish, we must do this thing with courage and undisturbed determination."

N. Y. DEMOCRATS TO  
OPPOSE WILSON AND  
FAVOR WET PLANK

NEW YORK, May 10.—Evidence is accumulating that New York, with the biggest delegation in each of the two major national conventions, will work along divergent lines in the selection of presidential nominees. According to the best available information, New York's 53 republican delegates will play safe and "ride the winner," while the state's ninety democratic representatives will endeavor to throw a few monkey wrenches into the machinery of various candidates from the state.

The democratic delegation under the unit rule, obviously will be more amenable to "discipline" than their republican brethren, who may cast their ballots individually. The democratic delegates apparently will be dominated by a majority who will insist on going two things.

Select an approved "wet" or at least "damp" candidate.  
Oppose President Wilson's leadership of the party.  
It is understood that the present plan is for New York to cast its first ballot for Governor Alfred E. Smith. Until the recent conference of democratic delegates in Albany, it was believed the second and subsequent ballots would go to Governor Edwards of New Jersey.

Now, however, it is said to be the intention of the state leaders to inaugurate a boom for Vice President Marshall on the second ballot, hoping thus to embarrass the candidacy of William G. McAdoe and through him the present administration.

If the Marshall boom does not show the desired strength, the New Yorkers are expected to throw their support to Governor James Cox of Ohio. The entire bloc of republican delegates from New York is scheduled to vote for Nicholas Murray Butler on the first ballot. According to a general understanding, it will continue for him until a definite "break" comes when it will swing to the candidate who is the obvious choice.

Republican state conventions were being held today in Illinois and Wyoming. In the former state eight delegates at large will be chosen. They are almost certain to be instructed for Governor Frank O. Lowden. Wyoming probably will select an unattached delegation.

Democrats also are holding conventions in those states to pick a like number of delegates. Their representatives from both states are expected to be unpledged.

TEXAS CHRISTIAN MISSIONARY CONVENTION AT GALVESTON  
GALVESTON, TEX., May 10.—The thirty-fourth annual convention of the Texas Christian Missionary society opened here this morning. A school for evangelists, which opened May 4 and closed May 8, brought many delegates to the city in advance of the regular convention opening. The society includes church missionary societies, Christian Women's board of missions, educational societies and Sunday school organizations.

PROHIBITION ISSUE  
IN PRIMARY IN  
ALABAMA TUESDAY

BIRMINGHAM, ALA., May 10.—Democratic voters of Alabama in the primary tomorrow will nominate two candidates for United States senator, presidential electors, delegates to the national convention in San Francisco, a national committeeman, several state officials and a number of county and local officers. Prohibition has been made an issue in the campaign for the nominations for senator. Of the four candidates for nomination as the successor to the late Senator Bankhead, former Governor O'Neal has declared for a change in the federal prohibition amendment to permit the sale of light wines and beers while the three other candidates, Representative J. Thomas Hefflin, Capt. Frank White and Ray Kushton, defended the prohibition amendment.

In the other race for the nomination to the senate are Senator Underwood, who seeks re-election; L. B. Musgrove, who has received the endorsement of union labor and a faction of the Anti-Saloon League, and Judge Samuel D. Weakley.

Out of the latter centers, there came labor leaders against Lloyd Hooper, campaign manager for Senator Underwood, a newspaper syndicate and several daily newspapers, in which the complainants sought to prohibit the publication of an advertisement in the interest of the senator's candidacy.

This advertisement declared in effect that labor union leaders and supporters of Mr. Musgrove were advocates of social equality between the white and negro races. After obtaining an injunction which prohibited publication of the advertisement, Musgrove supporters went upon the stump and denied the charges, which had an injunction suit directed by certain leaked out despite the action of the court.

During the final days of the campaign, William J. Bryan spoke in five cities in support of the prohibition candidate and against Senator Underwood and former Governor O'Neal. The Nebraskaan declared in each of his speeches that the prohibition question was still a live issue and he entreated his audience to vote against Underwood and O'Neal, whom he characterized as the leaders of the "wet" forces in this state.

Vigorous protests from O'Neal whom he opposed and Judge Weakley, whom he supported. Both claimed Bryan is the paid agent of the Anti-Saloon League and resented his "interference" in Alabama politics.

**The Story of Modern Bread Making—Chapter XI**

**The Fermenting Room**

**P**ROPER fermenting of doughs is one of the processes in the modern bakery which especially demands expert knowledge.

In the fermenting room the temperature of the air and the humidity are under absolute control. In the far corner of the room is shown the humidifying machine, which continually pumps washed air of a temperature of 80 degrees into this room, through the air ducts.

This air has a humidity of 70 degrees, whereas the average humidity of the air is only 30 degrees. Wet air prevents the surfaces of the doughs from drying and hardening during the 5-hour fermenting period.

The temperature of each dough is taken at regular intervals. At the proper time comes the "punching" process, to expel the waste gases and incorporate fresh air in their place, a process which assists the flavor and texture.

If the fermenting period is too short the gluten in the dough will not be properly expanded by the carbonic acid gas, and the result will be a small, heavy loaf.

If over-fermentation takes place the finished loaf will be marked by sourness and crumbliness.

Under and over-fermentation are common occurrences in home kitchens and unsanitary bakeries.

BOUNTED RAINS FALL THROUGHOUT WICHITA DISTRICT

West Texas and Southwest Oklahoma was visited with heavy rains Sunday afternoon and Sunday night, making the third general rain to visit this section during the past week. Reports received at the local offices of the Wichita Valley railway show that rain fell along the entire route of that road beginning at Abilene and extending to Byers. Rain also visited that section of the state between Stamford and Spur along the route of the Stamford and Northwestern railway.

Rainfall at various points along the Wichita Valley railway was as follows: Byers, heavy; Petrolia, heavy; Holiday, heavy; Seymour, two inches; Bonerton, one inch; Gorse, two inches; Weisart, one-half inch; Haskell City, one inch; Stamford, one-half inch; Anson, one and a half inches; Sagerton, one-half inch; Stranston, three-fourths of an inch; Peacock, one inch; Spur, one inch; Jayton, three-fourths of an inch; Aspermont, three-fourths of an inch. Heavy rains fell over large areas of southwest Oklahoma extending as far as Forgan. Rain was general over the line of the Fort Worth and Denver from Childress to Fort Worth. Traffic is not being held up due to washouts or storms, railway officials say. Rain began falling in Wichita Falls and vicinity about 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon and continued until about 6 o'clock. Rainfall here totaled approximately three-fourths of an inch. No damage is reported from wind or hail. The rain was general throughout the county.

### SCHOOL EXHIBIT TO BE HELD MAY 14 AT HIGH SCHOOL

Friday, May 14, the annual exhibit of the Wichita Falls public schools will be held at the high school, from two o'clock in the afternoon to 10 o'clock at night. This exhibit has become one of the biggest events in the school life, and one which is looked forward to by both the children and their parents, and the announcement that it is to be held bespeaks a large attendance. The exhibit for this year will be much larger, it is stated, than for previous years, keeping pace with the growth of the schools and every department of the school will be represented.

Features of the exhibit will be doll houses which the primary grades have made; the clay modeling, paper construction work, and the toys made by the junior high school, and the basketry, weaving and oil and water color work by the high school pupils. The other grades will have the usual art exhibit. The exhibit of the art department as a whole will be unusually splendid, Miss Robertson, the head of the department, stated.

Several special entertainments will be provided during the afternoon and evening. Commencing at 7:30, a spelling contest, or series of contests, will be held, one for each grade, in which spellers from the various ward schools will participate. At 8 o'clock the grade schools will present a program in the auditorium, the numbers to include folk games, songs and readings.

The evening program will have music provided by the junior high schools and numbers by The Boys Club, the Girls Club, the Spanish Club, the Latin Club, and the Speaking Club, all activities of the high school. There will also be a style show, the sewing class members wearing dresses and hats they have made themselves.

### HEARING OF APPLICATION FOR RECEIVER POSTPONED

Hearing on the application for a receiver for certain holdings of the Texas United Oil company, brought by W. F. Naber et al, was postponed until Monday forenoon at 10 o'clock by Judge Edgar Scarry of the 78th district court Monday when certain material witnesses failed to appear. Application for a receiver came in the defendants' answer and cross petition to the original petition of the Texas United Oil company against Naber et al in which cancellation of a certain contract and judgment for \$85,000 is sought.

The plaintiff's application for cancellation of a contract entered into with the defendants is based on alleged fraudulent representations on the part of the defendant whereby the plaintiff were induced to purchase the leasehold privileges to two acres of the south three acres of block 11, Tidwell's subdivision of block 36, Red River Valley Lands. The plaintiff seeks judgment for \$85,000 which, it is alleged, has been paid as a part of the \$200,000 as agreed in the contract. Cancellation of the remaining \$115,000 and a judgment for the \$85,000 is sought on the grounds that the two-acre tract does not come up to specifications as stated by the defendants.

In their cross-petition the defendants seek judgment of \$115,000 against the Texas Oil company, asserting that this amount is due them as a result of the original contract and further pray for the appointment of a receiver for the two-acre tract in block 36, declaring that the oil producing value of the tract is being seriously damaged due to negligence on the part of the plaintiff.

### KNICKERBOCKER TO GIVE MERINO-ANGORA BANQUET

Tuesday night at the First M. E. Church South, corner Tenth and Lamar, a banquet will be held which has been designated as a "Merino and Angora" affair, by Dr. H. D. Knickerbocker, the "ring master." Two hundred men will be present, the church members entertaining the non-church members, and Dr. Knickerbocker makes the following announcement, regarding the affair which promises to be unique:

"Of course, everybody knows that Merinos are sheep and Angoras are goats. The big stag party we are giving Tuesday night at our church is being given by the sheep to the goats, in other words, members of the church to non-members.

"Besides a program of bright and witty speeches, I am offering a Methodist yellow-legged chicken with a blue ribbon around its neck as a special prize in the story-telling contest. ### HOBBY CALLS LEGISLATURE TO MEET ON MAY 20

AUSTIN, May 10—Gov. W. P. Hobby issued a proclamation Saturday calling a special session of the 36th legislature to convene on Thursday, May 20, at 10:00 o'clock a. m.

Three subjects are submitted by the governor in the call for the consideration of the lawmakers. First: legislation which will make it possible to

establish zones in which the growing of cotton shall be prohibited; to the end that federal quarantine against interstate shipment of Texas cotton may be prevented; second: "to make provisions for maintaining the public schools and educational institutions of Texas during the next scholastic term"; third: to make appropriations necessary to cover deficiencies in the state government.

The right is reserved by the governor to submit additional subjects during the session.

### LOCAL BAKERIES TO ADVANCE BREAD PRICES WEDNESDAY

On Wednesday, May 12, a raise in the price of bread will take place, according to the announcements of several local bakeries. The new price not to exceed 15 cents a loaf to retail consumers. Bakeries now charging 13 cents a loaf will raise their price to 15 cents a loaf. One bakery now selling bread at 10 cents a loaf announces a raise to two for twenty-five cents.

The raise is made necessary, it is stated, because of the increased price of both flour and sugar. Flour is selling at \$1.50 a barrel, a recent increase by the mills, owing to the increase in the price of wheat. Wheat is costing \$3.25 a bushel at the terminal markets, according to information from the Wichita Falls Mill & Elevator company. Sugar on present contracts is costing \$29.50 a hundred pounds, according to today's wholesale quotations. Some of the local wholesale houses, however, are still delivering sugar at 18 cents a pound, these being contracts made in March for May delivery. The price of sugar has gone still higher over the \$29.50 price, it was stated Monday by representatives of wholesale houses, putting the wholesale price a little over \$30 a hundred.

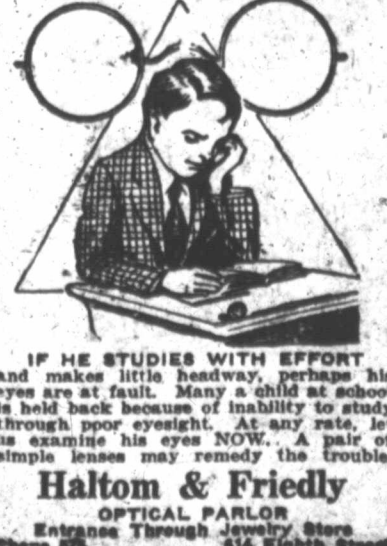

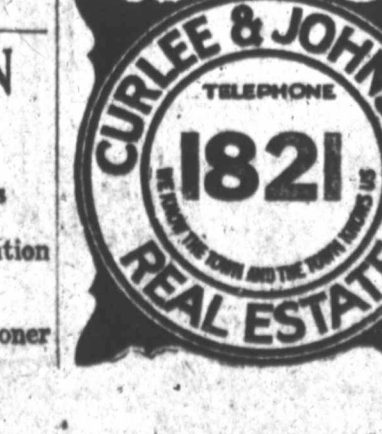
