That ripe olives in glass have been the cause of a number of fatal cases of poisoning is shown by the recent investigations of the bureau of chemistry, of the depart-ment of agriculture. The only case in which a tin container ap-pears to have been involved was caused, not by olives so much, but by a relish containing minoed ripe olives. The trouble, the specialists say, is due to defects in the methods of packing, pickling and process-ing the olives. When packed in glass, the ripe olives are usually sterilized at rhout the tempera-ture of boiling water—a tempera-ture of boiling water—a tempera-ture of boiling water be poisonous "bacillus botulinus" and the toxin which it produces. The growth of these-bacilli does not appear to be due to the act that glass jars or containers are used, but simply because these jars are not heated to a sufficiently high point. There is no connection whatever between the poison and light—as might be imagined by reason of the fact that only glass containers have held poisoned olives. The bacilli would develop just the same in tin containers, but, as there is no danger of breakage in tin, there is usually no hesitancy on the part of the packer about applying a sufusually no hesitancy on the part of the packer about applying a suf-ficient degree of heat. The fact that all cases of olive-

poisoning have developed from one batch of bottled olives appears to prove that only in exceptional cases are even olives in glass for dangerous and, while the govern-ment experts have warned the public to be careful, they have added that there is no reason whatever to suspect all ripe olives simply because a few have proven injurious.







Reconsideration of the Parnell bill exempting municipal and other pub-lic bond issues from state taxation, the enactment clause of which was stricken out in the house of the legis-lature Monday, is being taken up now by the house, with a good prospect for final passage, according to a mes-sage received here Thursday morning from Porter Whaley, general manager of the West Texas Chamber of Com-merce, who is in Austin in the in-terest of the bill. Failure of the bill for passage on the previous occasion is attributed to

Failure of the bill for passage on the previous occasion is attributed to the belief entertained by some of the members of the legislature that the legislation would be unconstitutional, without the first submission of a con-stitutional amendment. It is under-stood here, however, that a recen: decision along somewhat similar lines has since been brought to the atten-tion of the members of the house which inclines them to the belief that the measures will be constitutional. Passage of the bill means much to the city of Wichita Falls, Wichita county, the Wichita county school dis-tricts, and every similar district in the state which has voted bonds for improvements and now finds that the bonds can not be marketed outside improvements and now finds that the bonds can not be marketed outside the state save at a prohibitive dis-count. The bonds can not be mar-keted within the state under the present taxation, which makes their acquisition prohibitive. Texas being one of the very few states in the union to tax such securities, the act has simply resulted in driving Texas bonds to other states, and the state of Texas has never derived any bene-fit from the measure. A flood of messages from individ-uals, chamber of commerce, public of ficials and individual citizens is being sent members of the legislature urg-
