## "SUB" S-5 SINKS WHEN INTAKE VALVE FAILS TO PERFORM

REVEALED IN OFFICIAL REPORT  
MADE BY COMMANDER OF  
DESTROYER.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4.—A naval court of inquiry will be called at once to investigate the accident to the submarine S-5. Secretary of the Navy Daniels announced today.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 4.—The battleship Ohio, with her chain fast to the submarine S-5, lay today close to the spot where the submarine floundered helplessly beneath the Atlantic for nearly four hours.

Attempts to tow the submarine inside the breakerwater at the Delaware Capes had proved futile.

Through this hole they thrust a pole, a sailor's white undershirt tied to it, and a signal of distress, which were seen by the steamship Albatross, the first vessel to pass, 27 hours later.

Members of the crew of a destroyer which arrived at the Philadelphia navy yard after having been at the scene of the accident, declared the accident was due to negligence on the part of a member of the crew of the S-5. Officers would say nothing, referring inquiries to Washington.

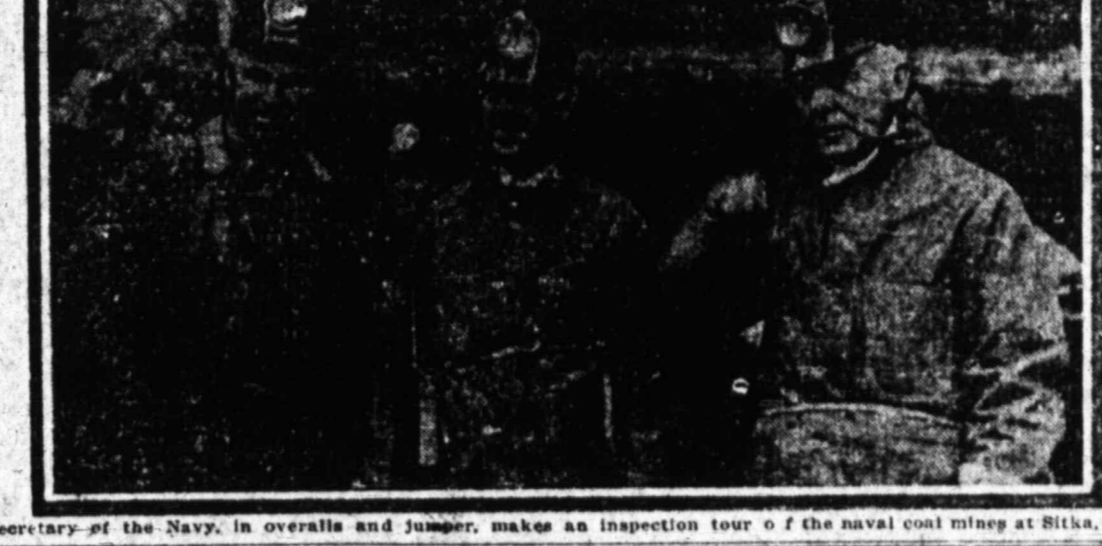

PLAN FOR COLLECTING LARGE SUM OF MONEY

CHICAGO, Sept. 4.—Governor Cox, the democratic presidential nominee, discussed the republican "slush fund" investigation here with E. H. Moore, his convention manager, who is scheduled to present a report to the senate committee next week.

Moore talked briefly with Cox in the governor's private car which remained in Chicago less than two hours. Together they went over the information Moore plans to give the senate committee Tuesday, to help discover evidence which Moore says will prove conclusively Cox's charge that the republican national organization set out to collect a "corruption fund" of \$12,000,000 or \$18,000,000 to "buy an underdog on the government."

## Contents of Circular

Under the heading "Chairman and executive committee," the circular says: "I am chairman of the campaign fund widely known and of considerable influence. 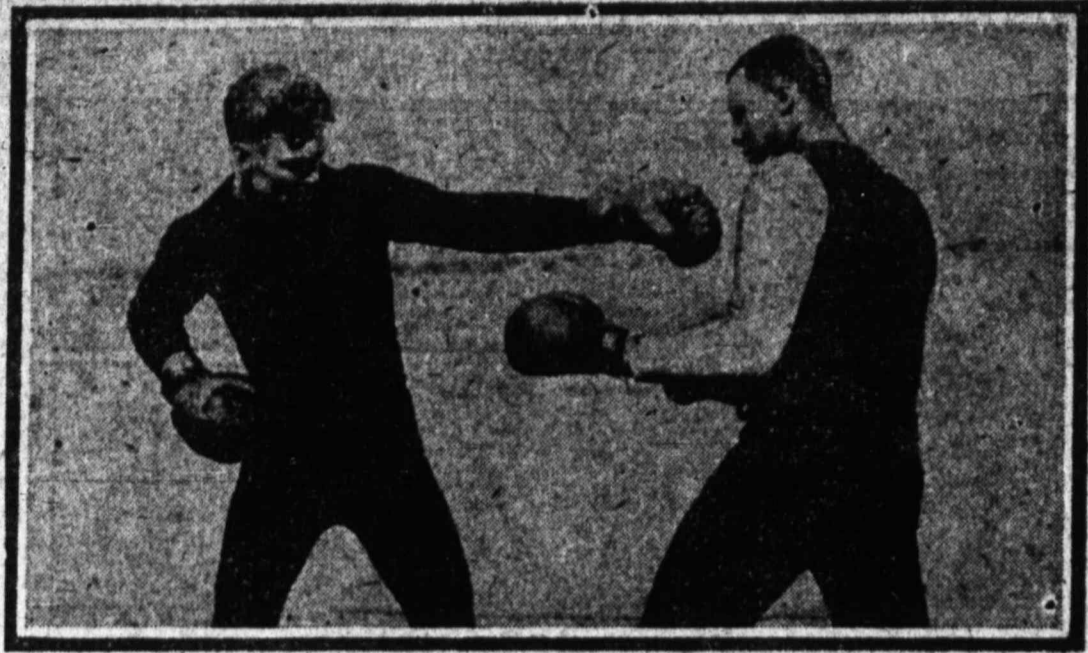
