

NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC LEADER MAIGNS REPUBLICAN PARTY IN NOTE SPEECH AT NASHVILLE

NASHVILLE, TENN., Dec. 28.—Declaring that the "time has come when patriotic citizens and democrats should indulge in plain talking," Judge Cordell Hull, chairman of the democratic national committee, in his first public speech since election to that office, last night reviewed the republican administration of national affairs since March, 1921, and contrasted this with the "unparalleled achievements" of the democrats in the previous eight years.

The address was delivered to a dinner given by the state democratic executive committee in honor of Chairman Hull and attended by party leaders from every part of the state.

It was accepted generally as the opening of the congressional election campaign by the new chairman, who went into the public questions which he said now faced the government, and explained the attitude which his party would take on them.

Further relief for farmers, adequate aid for veterans, reductions of taxes to compensate for the "panic conditions" now obtaining and a remedy for the situation resulting from the flood of tax exempt securities, were among the issues outlined by the new chairman for the democratic party.

"The burden of our public debts should be adjusted so as not to be oppressive to the American taxpayer, laboring under panic conditions. The states, rather than the federal government, should be urged to deal by uniform policy with the growing evil of local tax exempt securities."

Under republican leadership, the chairman said, American foreign commerce has slumped six billion dollars in the last 12 months, and an "almost vertical slump in prices in America from 30 to 50 per cent, and in purchasing power of farm products of 60 per cent, quickly followed."

"The democratic party," he said, still holds to its belief in a tariff for revenue only, for economy in governmental expenditures, for "equal rights to all and special privileges to none."

"The recent democratic administration has not yet received credit for its many great accomplish-

ments," he said. "But whatever its defamers may say in the future even to the school children, will soon learn that in 1912 our national wealth was \$17,000,000,000 and in 1920, when the republican administration was chosen, it was \$39,000,000,000. In 1912 our foreign trade was \$2,500,000,000 and in 1920 it was \$3,500,000,000. A year after the war the value of manufactured goods exported in one month equalled the amount exported in an entire year under Taft's administration."

MAHATMA GANDHI POLICY ENDORSED

Resolution Adopted By Committee
Of Indian Nationalist
Congress.

AHMEDABAD, BRITISH INDIA, Dec. 28.—The resolution adopted by the special committee of the Indian nationalist congress yesterday favoring continuation of Mahatma Gandhi's policy of non-violence included a clause declaring Gandhi the sole executive authority of the movement with full powers over the congress and its organization. It provides, however, that neither Gandhi nor any of his successors to the leadership be authorized in case they are arrested to conclude peace with the government without the previous sanction of the congress.

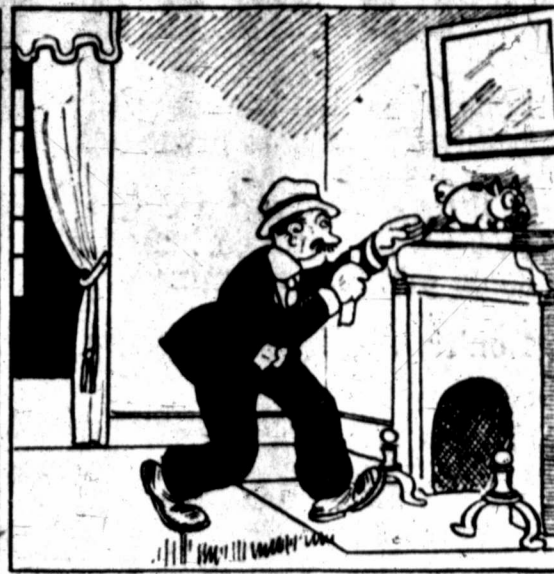
