

PERMANENT COURT OF INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE CONVENES

TERMED NEW MILESTONE IN WORLD'S PROGRESS TOWARD PEACE.

JOHN BASSETT MOORE REPRESENTS AMERICA

Meetings Are Held in Great Hall of Justice at The Hague.

THE HAGUE, Feb. 15.—The peace palace which during the war was labeled "dome of bankruptcy" was the scene today of the inaugural session of the permanent court of international justice, the cornerstone of the league of nations. The event was hailed by adherents of pacifist ideals as a new milestone in the evolutionary progress of the world toward peace.

At the opening session the judges were to take the oath to fulfill their offices "honorably, faithfully, impartially and conscientiously" in their future sittings they are expected not only to clear up such doubtful points of international law as may come before them, but also to create laws whenever their need is apparent.

The first meeting was held in the great hall of justice.

Members of the court represent 15 nationalities and eastern and western worlds. The judges in accordance with the law creating the court, possess the "qualifications required in their respective countries for appointment to high judicial offices," or are "jurists of recognized competence in international law."

The representatives of the United States is John Bassett Moore and the others present for the meeting are: The president, or chief justice, Bernard Cornelius Johannes Loder, Holland; Dr. Raafael Altamira y Creva, Spain; Commendatore Dionisio Anzilotti, Italy; Viscount Robert Finlay, Great Britain; Dr. Max Huber, Switzerland; Dirlik Nyholm, Denmark; Dr. Vorosen Oda, Japan; and Dr. Andre Weiss, France.

The judges and deputy judges have at their disposal two panels of technical assessors to advise them on points arising in labor and transit questions. There are no Americans on either panel.

NINE MEN ARE HELD IN THEATER TRAGEDY

Verdict That Collapse Was Due to Faulty Designing and Construction.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—The nine men ordered held by the grand jury in a verdict returned by a coroner's jury in connection with the Knickerbocker theater disaster January 28, which resulted in the deaths of 93 lives, were given an opportunity to appear at the district attorney's office today to give bond. They were not taken into custody when the verdict was returned last night and District Attorney Peyton Gordon said they would be permitted to remain at liberty under \$5,000 bond each. He said the case probably would be presented to the grand jury which is now in session, by the last of this week.

Based on the testimony of scores of witnesses at the inquest which began nearly a week ago, the verdict of the coroner's jury found that the collapse of the roof of the motion picture theater was due to faulty designing and construction and inadequate supervision and inspection. Among those ordered held for the grand jury were R. G. Geary, architect for the building; J. M. Ford, engineer, who designed the roof structure; Morris Hauber, building inspector when the theater was constructed; and Frank L. Wagner, the builder.

NEWPORT NEWS COMPANY GETS LEVIATHAN CONTRACT

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—The contract for reconditioning the giant liner Leviathan was formally awarded by the shipping board today to the Newport News Shipbuilding and Drydock company.

The Boston navy yard, while leasing out on the contract award for the reconditioning of the liner, will come in at the wind-up, as when the contractors finish their part the Leviathan will steam to the Boston navy yard, where she will go in dry dock and have her hull painted. The cost of this will be \$151,000, which is included in the total cost of \$2,250,000.

GRIEVING OVER DEATH OF WIFE MAN SUICIDES

ST. PETERSBURG, FLA., Feb. 15.—Grieving over the recent death of his wife, George E. Greenleaf, aged 58, police inspector in Malden, Mass., committed suicide by slashing his throat with a pen knife during the playing of a wedding march by a band at a local park last night.

AMERICAN MANAGER OF MEXICAN RANCH IS SHOT TO DEATH

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—Charles Burrow, also known as Charles Miller, American manager of a ranch near the city of Monterrey, Mexico, was shot to death by unidentified persons February 1, the state department was advised today in a dispatch from American Consul Bowman at Monterrey.

The department has instructed Consul Bowman and the embassy at Mexico City to request the proper Mexican authorities to apprehend and punish the persons responsible for the crime.

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 15.—Three men were killed and one wounded in a series of connected shootings at Puebla yesterday. Bitterness existing between the state government and independent political factions caused the affair.

Antonio Moro, independent deputy, was shot and wounded by Tranquilino Alonso, a government adherent, after a dispute in the main plaza in the city over the election of a new board of directors.

UNIVERSITY GRADUATE IS PLASTERER'S HELPER IT PAYS MORE MONEY

NEW YORK, Feb. 15.—Observing that common laborers are paid more in the United States than many university graduates, Dominick Simone, Ph. D., L. L. D., formerly an inspector of schools in Italy, selected a job as plasterer's helper shortly after his arrival here, he told Magistrate Conway in the Long Island police court yesterday.

TWO GREAT SWINE PROMOTION SHOWS AT CHILDRESS FAIR

WILL HAVE CO-OPERATION OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATIONS.

DUROC FUTURITY SHOW HAS \$600 PREMIUMS

Fair is Scheduled to Be Held From September Thirteenth to Sixteenth.

CHILDRESS, TEXAS, Feb. 15.—At a recent meeting of the Rotary club of Childress, a visiting speaker declared that the Childress State fair was either the second or third best livestock and agricultural fair in Texas. This distinction has been brought about by a systematic effort to bring the local show up to a standard that will merit the recognition of national breed and livestock associations and the success that has been attained is remarkable.

For the 1922 Childress State fair, which is to be held September 13, 14, 15, 16, two great swine promotion shows are to be held, with financial and advertising assistance from the National Duroc Record association and the Poland China Breed Promotion committee.

The Duroc Free-for-All Futurity show, which is the only one granted in Texas at the present time, carries premiums of \$600, divided equally for fall pigs, farrowed after September 1, 1921, and for spring pigs farrowed on or after March 1, 1922. Premiums will be divided into eight places for boars, sows and litters. A minimum of 25 nominations will be secured for this futurity show. It will not prevent the exhibitors from showing in the State Futurity show at Dallas.

The Poland China Promotion Pig show carries \$400 for spring pigs only, and is divided into ten places for boars, sows and litters, requiring a minimum of 25 nominations. This will also cover a large district, and will attract entries from all parts of north and west Texas.

Thus, in addition to the regular premiums for the swine department, the Childress State fair has appropriations granted for \$1,000 in futurity and promotion shows.

CHICAGO, Feb. 15.—Church and the movies were named as twin cures for martial ill by Judge John F. Haas, when Joseph Novick was arrested on complaint of his wife that he violated the Volstead act too frequently.

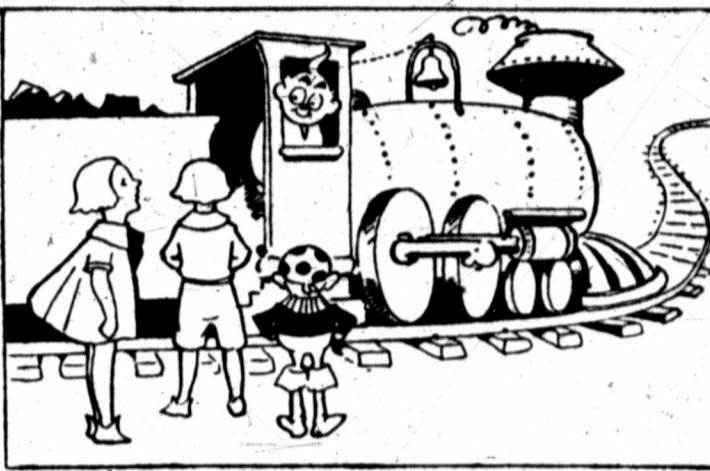

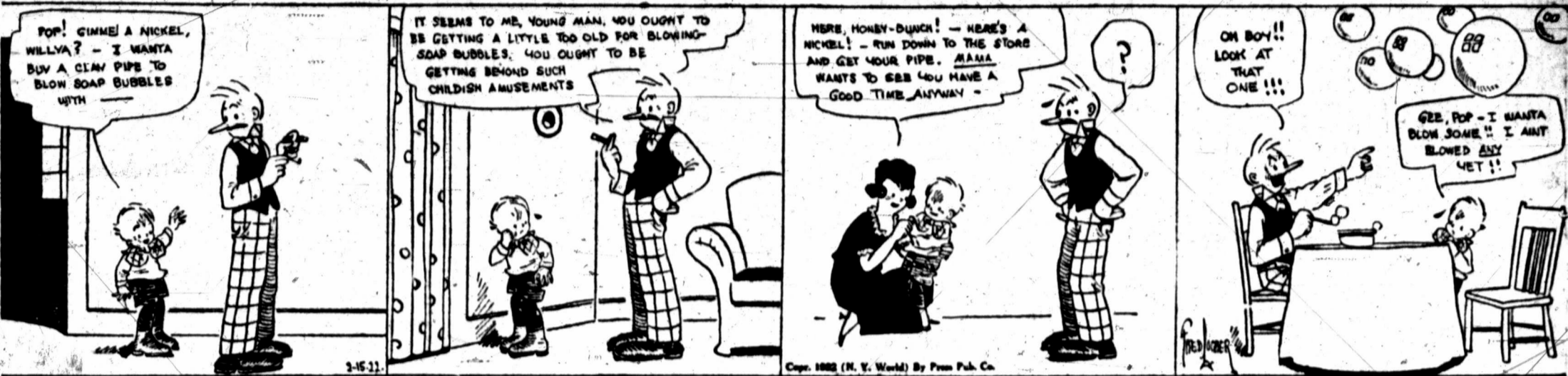

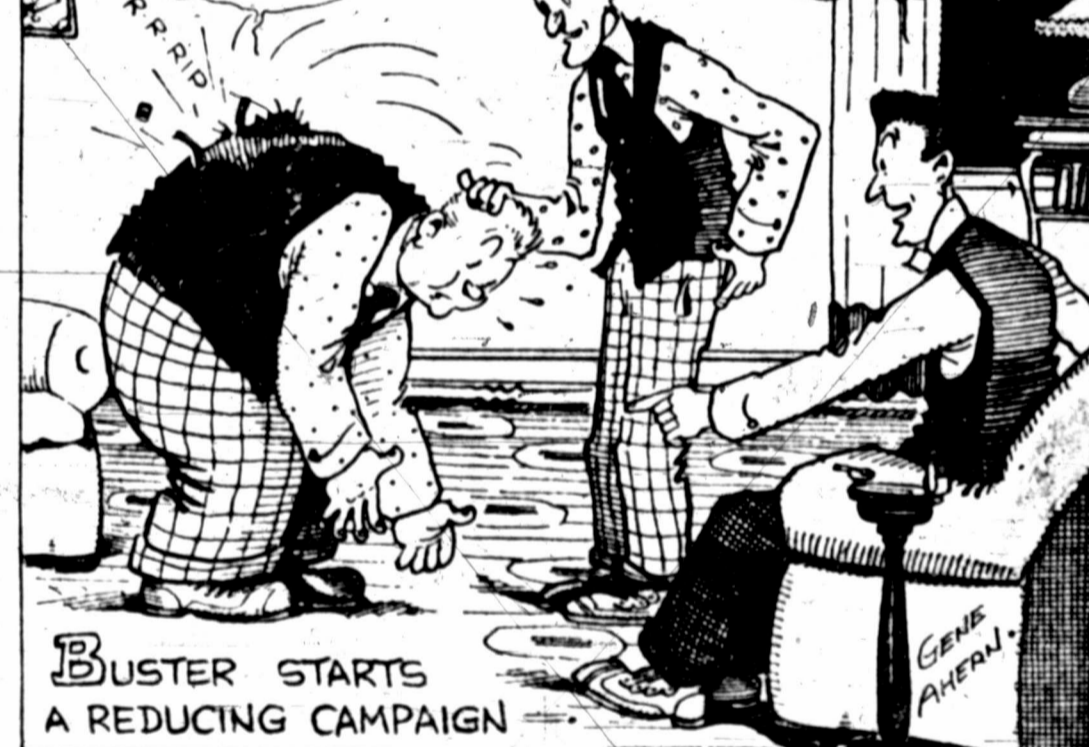
