

League Accomplishments Cited

NINTH ARTICLE—THE PEACE TREATY IN THE VIEW OF TODAY
BY JAMES M. COX, EX-GOVERNOR OF OHIO

The makers of the treaty of Versailles did not regard it as a perfect instrument. It was impossible to do some of the things at the time which in the interest of a permanent peace were deemed essential. The average critic of the treaty is so blinded by partisanship that he gives no thought to the many difficulties that surrounded the conference.

Certainly no one believed it possible that America would abandon the labor of readjustment. The moral responsibility was quite as binding as it was during the war. If civilization was imperiled by a military autocracy, the destruction of the menacing institution was but the first part of the world task.

America struck the determining blow at the crucial hour in the war and afterward abandoned not only the victors but the vanquished as well.

Half the troubles attendant upon the present European situation have come from the overhanging bliter of the peace treaty. It was America that spoke the terms upon which arms were laid down. She not only rendered a great service to mankind when she did it, but she assumed the moral obligation to see that the truth was kept.

To one who wants to reflect upon the facts, it is apparent that the peace treaty was but preliminary to a program of international justice. Unquestionably, the potential figures at the peace table regarded the pact as only a beginning, recognizing that it was necessary to create at the earliest possible moment a working base.

Treaty Merely Preliminary Step.

General Smuts, the South African statesman, stated at the time, "I have signed the treaty not because I consider it a satisfactory document, but because it is necessary to close the war. . . . Nothing could be more fatal than the continuance of this state of suspense. . . . The months since the armistice was signed have perhaps been as upset, unsettled and ruinous to Europe as the previous four years of war."

"I do not wish to find fault with the work done. I feel that in the treaty we have not yet achieved the real peace to which our peoples were looking. The real work of

whether General Smuts, for instance, would have signed the treaty.

Four years have elapsed and the truth of his observations is apparent. It remains to be seen whether another four years must come and go before the possibilities of the league of nations are realized in America.

Article Ten May Be Changed.

Article 10, which aroused so much controversy in America, did not receive as much notice in Europe. In fact, students of the covenant have been surprised that it occasioned such a man's nest here. Doubtless, Lord Robert Cecil had in mind American objections to article 10 when he recently proposed an amendment to the constitution which provides that if force is invoked in restraint of an aggressive or only continental soldiers shall be used.

The general belief, although it is not urged against Lord Cecil's suggestion, is that the league in all probability will never have to go beyond the measure of an economic boycott. In support of this is cited the Albanian episode.

The Albanians are a little people who have from time immemorial lived on the southern coast of the Atlantic sea. Until the Balkan wars of 1912-13, they were subject to the Turkish empire. Many of them became Mohammedans, because under Turkish law no Christian could own land or carry arms.

In 1912, when Turkey was finally driven out of the Balkans, the great powers created Albania into an autonomous principality. A German prince was sent to govern the country. Before the work of consolidation was completed, the war of 1914 began. The German prince fled and chaos was general.

Various armies fought on her soil. When peace came, there were Serbs, French, Italians and Greeks in occupation. The appeal to a peace conference for the status of a separate state would have been brought by Lord Robert Cecil of England and Mr. Lowell of Canada. They said: "If we reject this little state, a people of 2,000,000, the result will be a very strong national instinct, they will resist because invaders are trying to dismember them and

wars have started from smaller causes."

It was made a sovereign state, but the little country had no established frontiers. It asked the council of the league to establish them.

Economic Boycott Saves War.

While it was engaged in this, the Serbian troops occupied what was beyond Albanian territory. This occasioned uneasiness in Italy because of Albania's strategic position on the Adriatic sea. The situation was serious. The British government asked for an emergency meeting of the council of the league, suggesting the use of economic boycott. The meeting was held within a week.

In the interim, the Serbian exchange had fallen on the London market. Negotiations for a Serbian loan were dropped. The Serbian troops immediately withdrew from Albania.

The league directed a commission consisting of impartial persons, one from Finland, one from Norway, one from Luxembourg, to report on the withdrawal of the invaders, a specific date having been fixed. Before the time elapsed, the commission wired the council that withdrawal had taken place. A commission of experts is now establishing the frontiers.

Albania's independent existence has been recognized by all the great powers who have sent diplomatic representatives to Tirana, the capital. Albania has asked the league for expert advisers in economic financial and other matters. A system is being perfected which establishes a method of taxation, a central bank and the creation of currency.

There are two lessons from this: First, that the economic boycott was sufficient to avert war, and second, that the small nations of the earth trust the League of Nations as an impartial organization having no financial or territorial policy concealed in the background.

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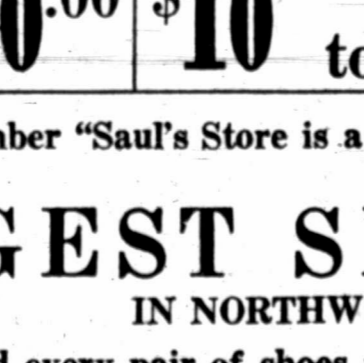

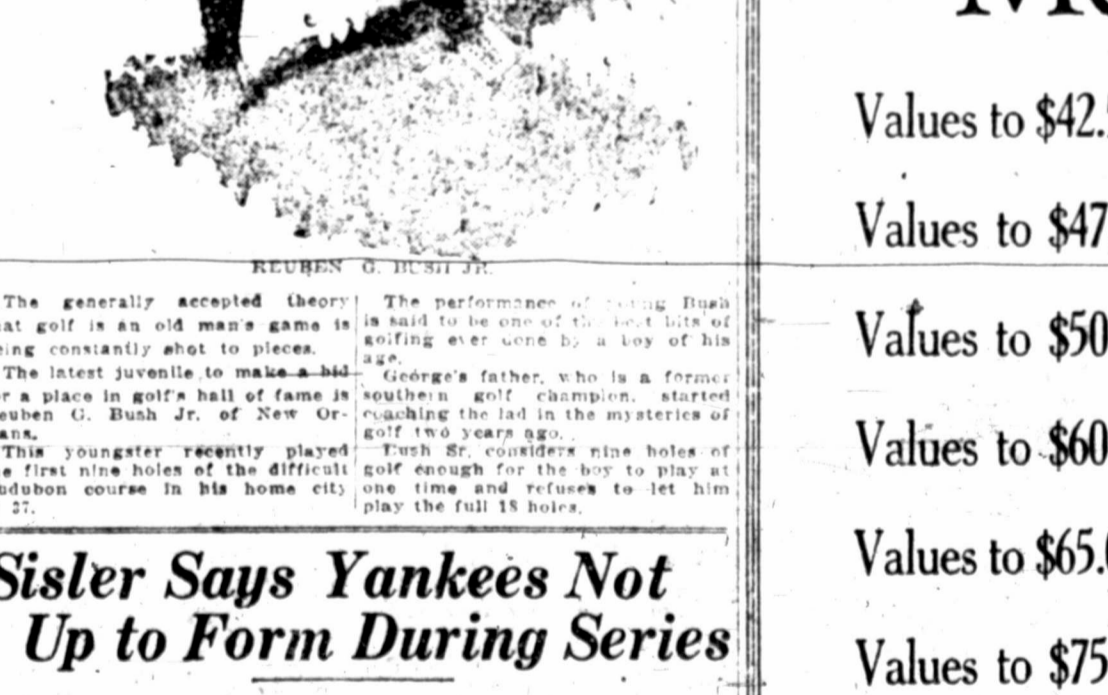
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Athletic Park Not to be Closed Against Football As Previously Declared

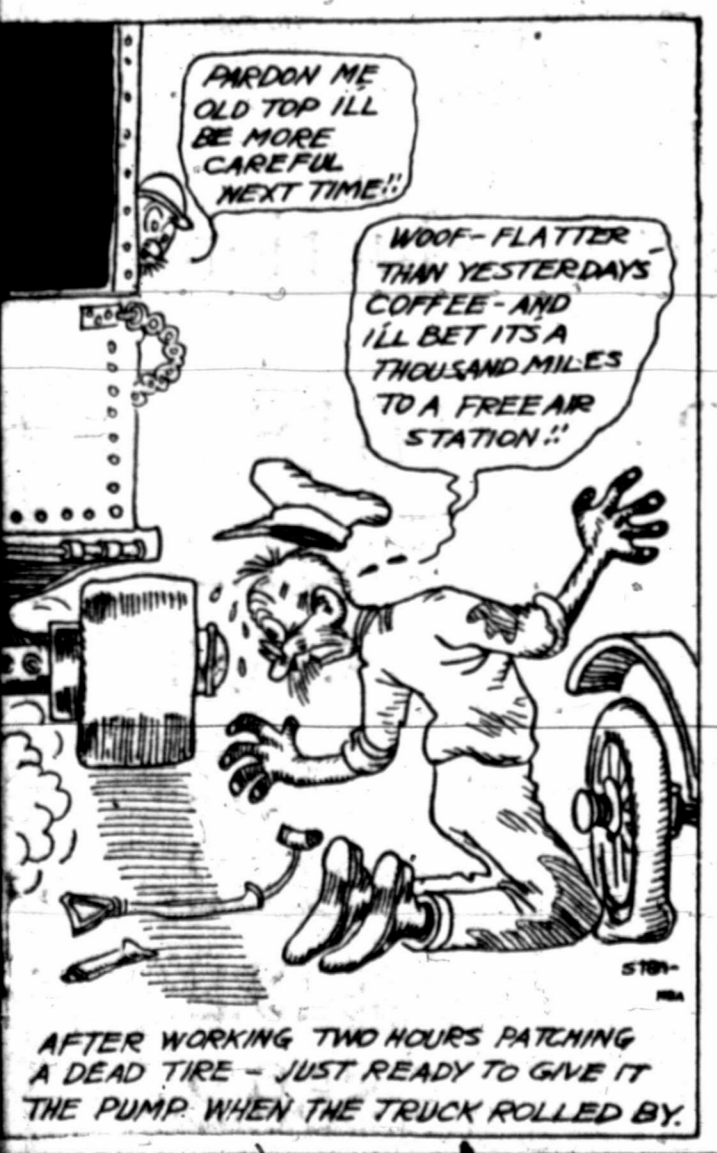

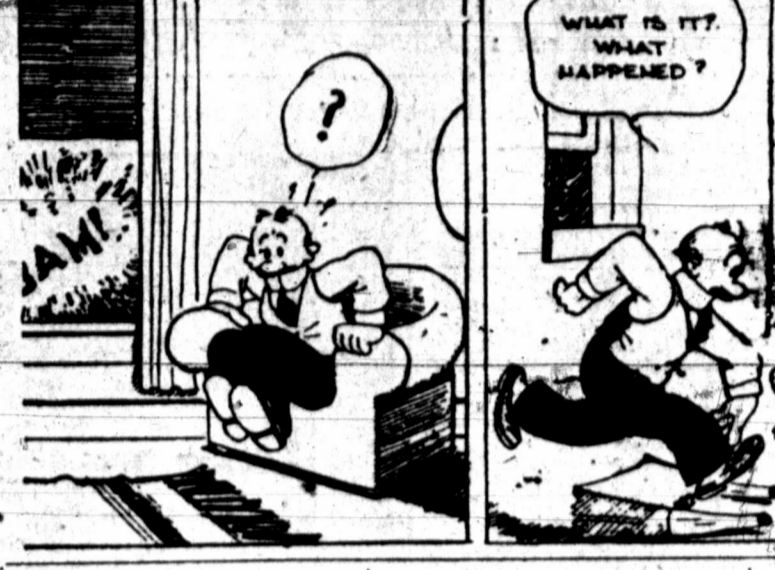
