WORLD COURT

ONE MILLION AND HALF INCREASE IN COTTON GINNED TO OCT. 18

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—Cotton ginned prior to October 18 amounted to 8,345,044 running bales, counting 125,457 round bales as half bales, and including 8,394 bales of American-Egyptian and 2,152 bales of Sea Islands. To that date in 1922 ginnings were 6,744,552 running bales, counting 104,099 round bales as half bales, including 14,212 bales of American-Egyptian and 324 bales of Sea Islands.

M'ADOO FORCED TO CANCEL DATES ACCOUNT ILLNESS

DODGE CITY, KAN., Oct. 22.—William G. McAdoo, former secretary of the treasury, was unable to deliver his scheduled address here today because of illness. Mr. McAdoo's addresses at Syracuse, Kan., this afternoon and Denver tonight also were canceled upon the advice of his physician, who ordered complete rest.

BANDITS ROB ONTARIO BANK OF \$10,000 CASH

STOUFVILLE, ONTARIO, Oct. 22.—A band of cracksmen swooped down on this town today, breaking into the Standard Bank, drilled open the safe door and escaped with approximately \$10,000 in cash and a quantity of securities.

DAILY PRESS LEAGUE WILL MEET NOVEMBER 4

WACO, Oct. 22.—Members of the Texas Daily Press League will meet here on November 4, the last Saturday of the cotton season, according to President H. W. Crum, secretary of the Texas Cotton Palace association. The president of the league is Lowry Martin of Corsicana. D. W. Campbell of Hillbush is secretary.

LARGE AMOUNT COTTON IS HANDED BY COMPRESS

ELGIN, Oct. 22.—Quite a large amount of cotton is being handled through the local compress to be stored at Galveston, where it is being stored and shipped. The movement so far this season has been the steady in local history, there is very little cotton being held in this section.

RAILROAD EMPLOYES ARE CHARGED WITH VIOLATING U. S. COURT INJUNCTION

FORT SMITH, ARK., Oct. 22.—Twenty-two former employees of the Missouri Pacific and St. Louis-San Francisco railroads have been summoned to appear in United States district court here today to answer charges of violating of injunctions granted the railroads during the shopmen's strike, forbidding interference with the operation of trains. The men are charged with two specific violations of the provisions of the injunction order.

THREE ACCUSED IN JACK BERGEN CASE ACQUITTED BY JURY

HACKENSACK, N. J., Oct. 22.—George W. Harrington, Scullion and Alice Thornton were acquitted of the murder of Jack Bergen, movie actor, by a jury here today.

SHOT TO DEATH WHEN HE FAILS TO SURRENDER

HOLTON, KAN., Oct. 22.—Shot by a posse of citizens of Hoyt, a little town 13 miles south of here, on the morning of October 20, James O. Marshall, 42, a Jackson county farmer, was shot dead today when he refused to surrender. Four bullets, probably fired by as many men in the posse, entered Marshall's body.

EXPORTS OF FOOD AND FOOD PRODUCTS DECLINE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—Exports of food and food products last month showed a falling off in value as compared with September, 1921. Exports made public today by the commerce department placed the value last month at \$74,306,252 as against \$94,254,798 the same month of the year before.

MANDAMUS PROCEEDINGS BY 'COTTON BELT' ROAD

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—Mandamus proceedings were instituted today in the District of Columbia by the Interstate Commerce Commission to compel the Interstate Commerce Commission to permit access to certain records of the commission desired by the company in connection with the valuation of its property.

IRISH CONSTITUTION IS FINALLY ADOPTED

ARGUE HEARING ON INJUNCTION BEFORE STATE SUPREME COURT; CORSICANA JURY IS STILL OUT

CORSICANA, TEXAS, Oct. 22.—No decision has been reached as yet today by the jury which is delimiting the injunction proceedings to restrict the sale of liquor in Corsicana. The jury is still out on their deliberations. The case went to the jury at 2 o'clock yesterday.

NEW LOW RECORD BY FRENCH FRANS ON N. Y. MARKET

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—French francs were quoted in this market today at 705 cents, a new low record for the year. The par value of the franc is 19 cents each.

FINANCIAL MANAGER OF COLORADO-UTAH MINES SURRENDERS TO POLICE

CHICAGO, Oct. 22.—George E. Orr, financial manager here for the Colorado-Utah Mines Holding company, surrendered to police today on a charge of embezzling \$152,000 in securities on a contract with Charles Hanover, president of the concern. Orr's lawyer declares the securities are in his possession and being held as a lien until the courts have passed on a five-year contract entered into by Hanover, employing Orr at a salary of \$1,500 a month. Orr's counsel says the contract was approved by Hanover's attorneys at the concern's Kansas City office.

EXTRA PANEL OF 100 JURORS IS DRAWN FOR TRIAL OF HERRIN CASE

MARION, ILL., Oct. 22.—An extra panel of 100 petit jurors was drawn today for the trial of the Herrerin case. The trial is in connection with the Herrerin case, in which 22 men met death on the streets of Marion, Ill., on the morning of November 21, 1918. The regular panel of 30 already has been drawn and will be called over to Sheriff Melvin Thaxton. The extra panel which was ordered by Circuit Judge Hartwell, however, will be delivered to special deputies for service.

RETURN TO COURTROOM AFTER VISITING CANYON

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 22.—Sessions of the third trial of Arthur C. Birch for the murder of J. B. Belton-Kennedy were resumed today in court here. Birch was shot on the streets of Beverly Glen and Santa Monica canyons. It was at the former suburb that Birch was shot on the streets as he was returning to his summer cottage and it was at the latter that the state contends Birch threw into the sea the shot which killed Belton-Kennedy. The young broker was slain.

TEXAS RANKERS TAKE OVER POLICE AUTHORITY MARSHALL WEDNESDAY

MARSHALL, TEXAS, Oct. 22.—Dallas rankers under Captain W. W. Aldrich took over all police authority in Marshall today under provisions of the proclamation by Governor Clegg Monday extending open law over the entire city. The city police force is superseded and the sheriff's department will operate only outside the city.

WARRANT FOR ARREST OF HUNGARIAN LEADER OF SOVIET GOVERNMENT

GENEVA, Oct. 22.—A warrant for the arrest of Bela Kun, former head of the Hungarian soviet government, which was dominant in Hungary for a short time after the war, was issued today by the federal police department. Bela Kun is reported to be in hiding in Switzerland with a false Swiss passport made out in the name of "Adler."

SWEETWATER FIRE DAMAGE IS \$30,000; TWO FIREMEN HURT

SWEETWATER, TEXAS, Oct. 22.—Damage to property under Captain W. W. Aldrich's supervision at \$30,000 this morning. The fire was said to have originated from a water heater in the Boyd & Fox barber shop. The damage extended to the jewelry store of John R. Cox and the Sweetwater Dry Goods company. D. R. Rude, fireman, was overcome and killed, and Ed Patterson, another fireman, was cut by flying glass.

OATH OF OFFICE ADMINISTERED TO BRITISH CABINET

LONDON, Oct. 25.—The cabinet of Prime Minister Andrew Bonar Law was sworn in at Buckingham palace this morning. As a result of the taking of the oath of office the members of the cabinet began to function as the new government immediately. Nowhere in the London press this morning is any special enthusiasm shown for Mr. Bonar Law's choice, although the unionist papers, as might be expected, are calmly appreciative. The fact that eight of the new ministers held office under the Lloyd George administration deprived the editorial writers of an opportunity for speculating upon their possible achievements, and the tenor of the editorials suggests that the commentators are awaiting disclosure by the premier of his full powers, which he is expected to outline at Glasgow tomorrow. It is assumed that all of yesterday's appointees will be members of the cabinet except perhaps Attorney General Douglas Moe, Hogg and the lord advocate, W. A. Watson, and there may be further cabinet appointments. The unionist political writers believe many of the minor secretaries and minor posts will not be filled until after the election. Ministers of the resigned Lloyd George government this morning attended a privy council in Buckingham to surrender their seals and portfolios. Winston Spencer Churchill, former secretary for the colonies, owing to his illness, sent his seals by proxy.

BUSINESS IN EUROPE LATIN-AMERICA AND FAR EAST IMPROVING

NEW YORK, Oct. 25.—Business in Europe, Latin-America and the far east is steadily on the upgrade and, with few exceptions, is better the world over, delegates to the convention of the American export association were told today by Dr. Julius Klein, director of the United States bureau of foreign and domestic commerce. The convention which opened today will continue through tomorrow.

DEATH SENTENCE IN H. HUGHES CASE IS AFFIRMED BY COURT

AUSTIN, Oct. 25.—The death sentence given H. Hughes by the Brewster county district court for the killing of G. Rogers at Alpine, Texas, was affirmed by the state court of criminal appeals today. Hughes admitted the killing as a result of a dispute between the two men. Rogers was found dead in a cattle-car at Alpine.

LIFE SENTENCE CASE IS REVERSED AND REMANDED

AUSTIN, Oct. 25.—The 99 year sentence given Sidney Harper by the Uvalde county district court for the killing of his infant child was reversed and remanded by the state court of criminal appeals in an opinion handed down today. Harper was charged with killing his child and burying it at Utopia, Texas. The court held that the child died of suffocation.

DISMISS APPEALS IN DEATH PENALTY CASES

AUSTIN, Oct. 25.—Three cases in which death penalties had been assessed by lower courts were dismissed by the court of criminal appeals today, two because the defendants escaped jail, and the third because of the death of the defendant. The cases of Diego Garga of Live Oak county and Newt de Silva of Jefferson county were dismissed because of escape, and that of George Killough, McLennan county, because of Killough's death. All three were convicted of murder.

'Lightheaded Girls' Should Keep Out of 'Dark' Automobiles

MEMPHIS, TENN., Oct. 25.—Seven hundred delegates to the twelfth annual convention of the national league of compulsory education officials last night were told by Wm. L. Bodine, superintendent of compulsory education in Chicago, some pertinent facts about the advantages and shortcomings of the public schools of America. "The public school is the humanitarian as well as the academic factor in our national life," Mr. Bodine declared. "God could not allow all His angels to leave Heaven. That is why He put teachers on earth to care for children. And that is why so many teachers are women. I believe in teaching the household arts and cooking classes. A 'bad' cook can spoil a 'good' man. Many a 'good' looker is a 'poor' cooker." "A woman nowadays declares she can fill the vocations of men; she can do everything a man can do except desert her child. And wife desertion is one of the greatest causes of truancy. "There was a time when mothers raised their girls in these days of the defendant, incorrigible 'flapper' some girls try to raise their mothers. "There is an increase in delinquency among girls. Devils creep while parents sleep. 'Lightheaded girls' ought to keep out of 'dark' automobiles."

Verdict Against Standard Oil Co. Saves \$6,500,000

NEW YORK, Oct. 25.—A jury in the supreme court yesterday emerged from a haze of compound interest figures for 22 years and gave a verdict to E. B. Smathers, owner of the property at 15 Broadway, against the Standard Oil company of New York, tenant by which Smathers, his heirs, executors or assigns will be saved \$6,500,000 in the period. The suit rested on whether quarterly rental of \$22,500 should be paid by the Standard Oil company on the first day of each quarter, which Smathers contended was stipulated in the lease. The Standard Oil company argued that the lease, which provides for a rental of \$24,750,000 for the 22 years, did not say anything about quarterly payments in advance and that Smathers was not entitled to rent until the end of each quarter. "Mathematicians got busy and figured that if the Standard Oil could maintain its argument, Smathers would lose the equivalent of six per cent on \$2,500, or \$2,750 a year. Total loss of interest for 22 years was given as \$27,250, then when the expert computed the steadily increasing amount on the six per cent basis, the \$2,500,000 apparently impressed the jury.

AUSTIN, Oct. 25.—The eighteenth annual convention of the Texas Library association opened here today for a three day session with librarians from various parts of the state in attendance. Golf Takes Place Of Liquor Parties Says Candy Man

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 25.—Golf is exceeding liquor as a commercial asset to business, according to Vincent L. Price, president of a candy manufacturing company here. "Golf is a commercial asset and has taken the place of liquor," he said. "Where a salesman would entertain a customer with rounds of high balls in the days before prohibition, he now is establishing friendly relations on the golf course with prospective buyers."

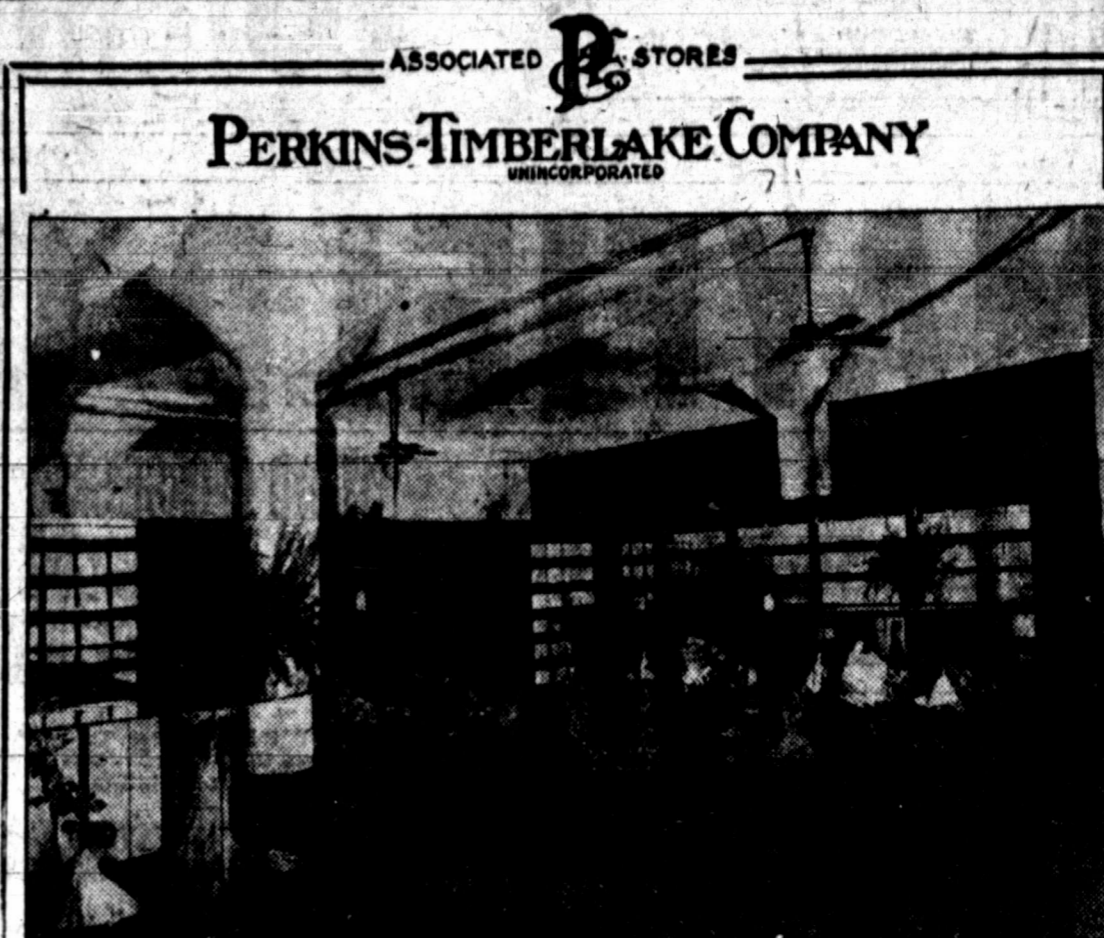
SLOW STEADY RAIN IS REPORTED AT ABILENE

BIG CULVERTS FOR SOUTH SIDE CANAL NEARLY FINISHED

Excavation is now under way at the diversion dam, for the main canal head-gate, through which the water will pass from the lake into the canal. The canal will reach the lake through the bluff on the east side of the river, and a considerable amount of excavation will be required.

Work has been resumed on concrete structures at the storage dam and on the various canal structures. The Blackberry creek culvert is completed, and the canal practically finished through the lowlands at that point; the Camp culvert, a similar structure, is nearly finished.

These culverts carry the canal across low ground, and although they cost about \$20,000 each, that expense is well worth the result if the canal were built along the diversion route around the creek bottom. The canal is many feet above the ground level at both crossings, and the completed canal resembles a section of railway embankment. The culverts serve three purposes: first to carry the ditch across low ground; second, to provide drainage for the creek, and third, to provide spillways for surplus water, which is drained out of the canal into the creek beds.

PECAN CROP TO BE SHORT THIS YEAR; YIELD NEGLIGIBLE

The pecan crop in northwest Texas this fall will be next to nothing at all, according to reports from throughout the section. It will be the lightest crop this section has ever gathered.

T. B. Noble, head of the company which handles most of the crop in northwest Texas, said Wednesday that the yield would be too small to attempt to handle. Adverse weather and insect pests combined to lower production, it is said. In normal seasons, Wichita Falls ships several score carloads of pecans from the surrounding country. Young and Jack counties furnish a big part of the crop.

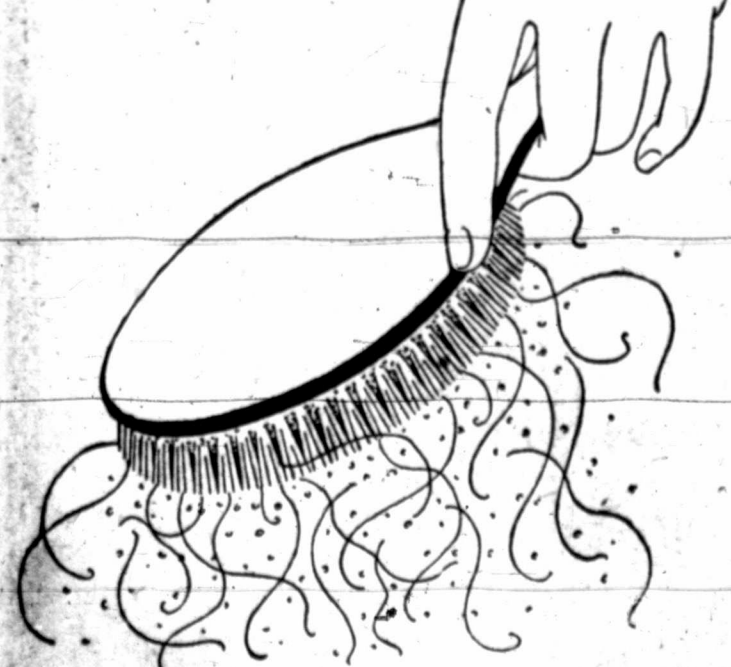

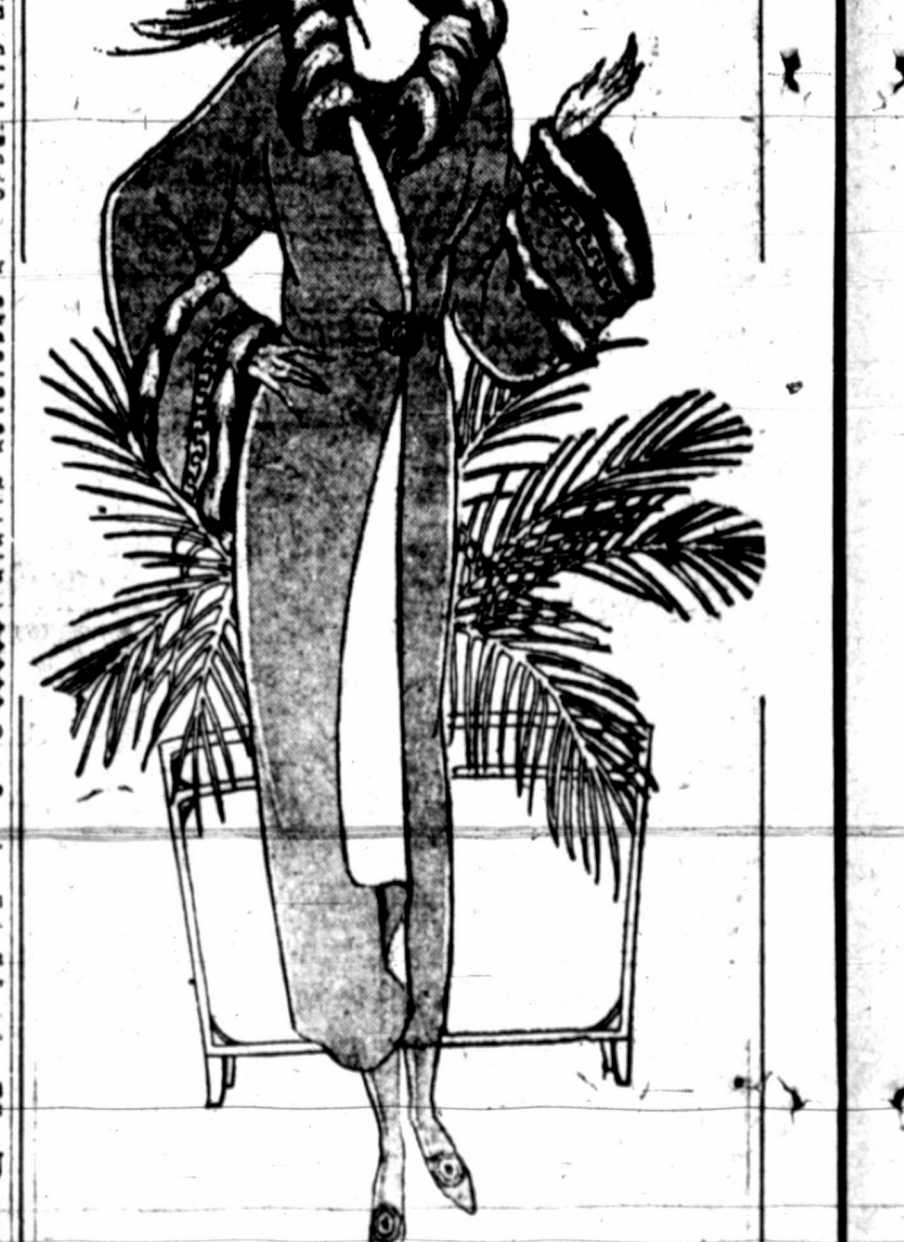

INTEREST AROUSED BY LONDON SPEECH OF VISCOUNT GREY

By Associated Press. LONDON, Oct. 24.—Considerable interest has been aroused by Viscount Grey's allusion in his address at Bradford last night to France having been "let down" by her allies since the world war.

"Before we criticize France's actions," he said, "let us realize the facts. When peace was concluded France had two agreements, one with Great Britain and one with the United States that she would have the full support of Britain and America if attacked in the future by Germany."

"These were not included in the treaty of Versailles but they were as much a part of the peace as the treaty of Versailles. They made an enormous difference to France. They are gone. I admit it was not the fault of Lloyd George's government that they went but it does not make it any better for France whose fault it was."

"The great deal of trouble there has been with France since peace is due to the fact that the whole peace must have been a different aspect in her eyes when those two great safeguards, whereby the most of her so greatly relied, disappeared. If these agreements still existed they would secure France now and for a decennium hence."

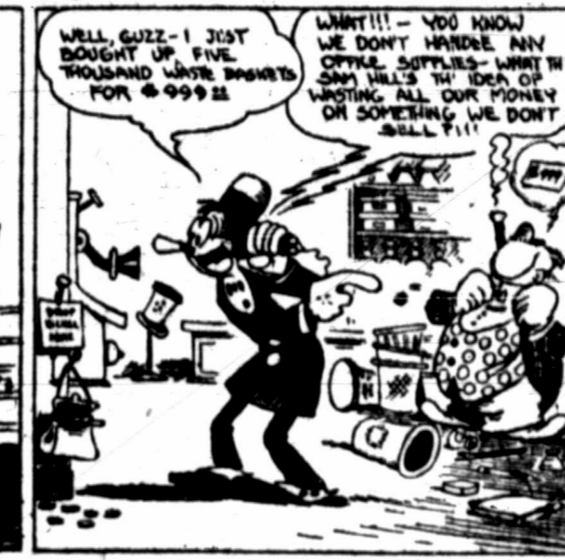
