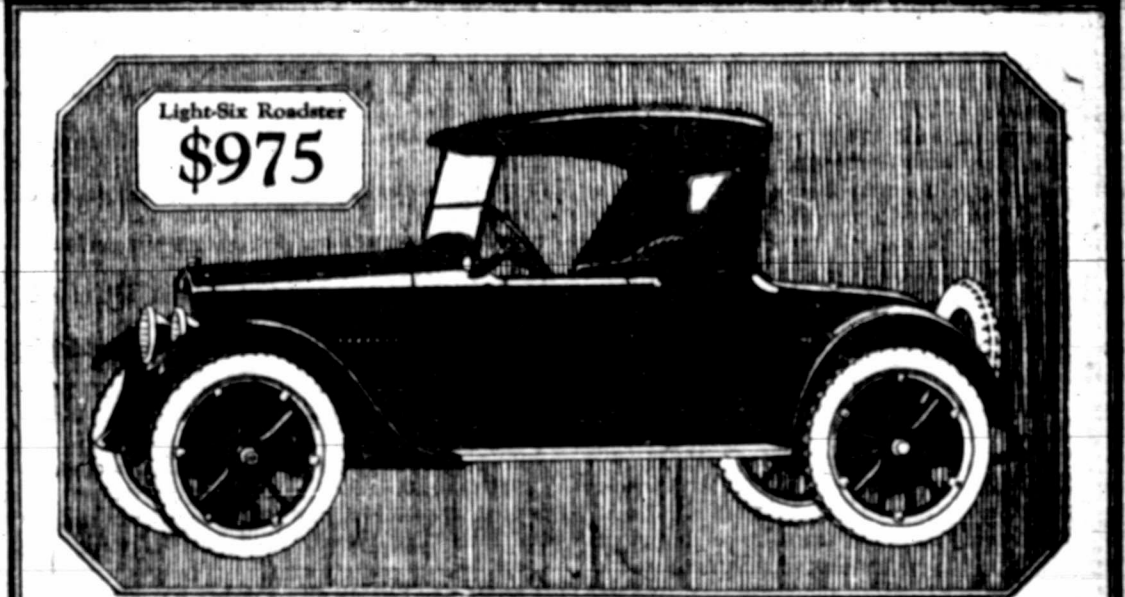

MASONS PAY TRIBUTE TO THEIR DEPARTED MEMBER, J. S. MILLICAN, WEDNESDAY

No more loving tribute could have been paid anyone than was paid the deceased Masonic Brother J. S. Millican by Dr. Powers of the First Baptist church on Wednesday afternoon, and not only the evidence of the appreciation of his life by Dr. Powers, but evidenced by the score of friends and Masons who attended the funeral. The services were held under the auspices of Wichita Falls lodge 655 A. F. & A. M., of which the deceased was a member, also the Knights Templar and Order of the Eastern Star, of which he was also a member.

Brother Millican was an exemplary Mason, loved by all. Even during his long spell of illness he would attend meetings under trying conditions. Beautiful floral pieces emblematic of the Masonic bodies, together with many other beautiful pieces, were a splendid evidence of loving loyalty to this man and friend.

Brother Millican was 45 years of age. He has been a resident of the state of Texas for the past 40 years and a resident of Wichita Falls for the past 14 years. He left a family of several daughters and one son. Dr. Powers paid this tribute: "I have known Brother Millican since I came to the city. He was associated with me in church work for some years until his health called him. I learned to know him as no other member of this church. During those years he was with me every day. I have been in his home in the homes of his children. His

wife was taken from him just a little while before I came here. He was never the same man. After she was taken his heart turned in the direction of his children. Those of them who were already Christians, he wanted to be better Christians. Those who were not he prayed with the pastor to win them to Jesus Christ.

"Brother Millican was a good Mason. He loved Masonry; he loved his brother Masons. I know about Masonry he taught me. He would come into my study from work and teach me Masonry."

"There are two kinds of Masons. There is the Mason who is in the outer shell, who just knows the ritual, who is not a Mason at heart, who knows the signs and mysteries. Brother Millican was a Mason in his heart. No man ever had a white lambkin apron and wore it with more worthiness in this town than Brother J. S. Millican, and I want to say to you Masons who do not wear your apron in truth for your family, children, wife and neighbors, you are unworthy to bear the name. Brother Millican wore that apron and kept it spotless in his life for his fellow men."

"So far as I know he was square with his brother Masons, square in the world, square with his brethren in the church, square with his neighbors. I would like to say this to you Masons who may not be Christians. You cannot live up to Masonry unless you know Jesus Christ. Brother Millican loved his church and put that above all else. To you children, your father died in the Lord. His heart's desire was that you become a noble and faithful Christian man and woman. That was the high aim of his life. He died trusting in Jesus and if you want to meet him in glory, give your heart and service to the Lord and some day you will meet your father in that land where there is no sickness and no sorrow. The young die, the old die and there is just one way to die triumphantly and that is to die in the Lord."

Brother Millican, loved by all, will be greatly missed, but our loss is his Father's wonderful gain.

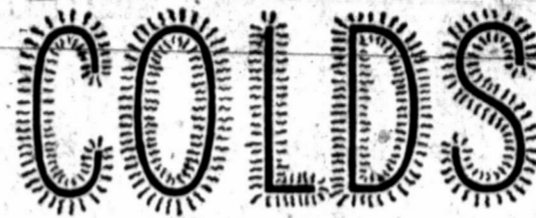
